THE MATCHUP

- ◆ Alabama A&M and Alabama State meet in the 83rd edition of the Magic City Classic
- ◆ Alabama State will be seeking its third straight win over AAMU
- ◆ Bulldogs head coach Connell Maynor will be seeking his fifth win in the annual rivalry game

INSIDE THE NUMBERS

- ◆ Wide receiver Keenan Hambrick needs 15 receptions to reach 100 for his collegiate career
- ◆ Wide receiver Jacolby Hewitt is 148 yards shy of reaching 1,000 for his career
- ◆ Quarterback Xavier Lankford has appeared in 34 career games and has thrown for 2,517 yards
- ◆ Quarterback Aveon Smith needs 10 yards rushing to reach the 1,000 mark for his collegiate career
- ◆ Tight end DJ Nelson is quietly approaching 500 career yards, needing just 2 to eclipse the mark
- ◆ Offensive lineman Carson Vinson will play in his 39th career game as an offensive lineman
- ◆ Defensive lineman Dorian Wesley is approaching 50 total tackles...Needing 5 to reach the mark

LANKFORD WINS QUARTERBACK BATTLE

- ◆ In the first five games, Alabama A&M had played all five quarterbacks, including three splitting time
- ◆ Xavier Lankford emerged as the starter after back-to-back performances against Jackson State and Bethune-Cookman
- ◆ Lankford earned the SWAC's Co-Offensive Player of the Week honor after throwing for 315 yards, with one passing touchdown and three running touchdowns in a 56-12 homecoming win over Bethune-Cookman

SERIES HISTORY

- ◆ Alabama A&M and Alabama State will be meeting for the 88th time
- ◆ The Hornets won the inaugural meeting, 30-0, in 1924
- ◆ The Bulldogs are 6-4 in the last 10 meetings with their rivals, but are looking to snap a two-game skid to ASU

SCOUTING THE OPPONENT

- ◆ Much like AAMU, Alabama State will enter the game off an open week as the Hornets dismantled Mississippi Valley State, 54-17
- ◆ The Hornets rebounded for their homecoming loss with the win over MVSU, where Alabama State rallied from a 14-0 deficit in outscoring the Delta Devils, 54-3
- ◆ ASU rolled over 459 total yards and held MVSU to 50 rushing yards on 39 attempts, averaging 1.3 yards per carry

PRACTICES

During a typical Saturday game week, media may interview players and coaches immediately following practice on Tuesday. Practice is generally closed to the public. Anyone hoping to observe practice should contact AAMU Athletics Communications in advance. Failure to do so may result in an individual's removal from the venue. During regular season practices, unless otherwise noted, still and television photographers will be allowed to shoot stretching and select periods.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

All media members will be provided with access to game notes via aamusports.com. At the quarter breaks and halftime, quickie stats will be printed and distributed. Following the game, a complete postgame statistics package will be distributed via email and will contain a scoring summary, final team statistics, final individual statistics, complete play-by-play, drive charts for both halves, halftime statistics, defensive statistics and substitution chart.

Live in-game statistics will be available via Sidearm Sports.

INTERNET

Wireless Internet is available in the press box at Louis Crews Stadium. Members of the Athletics Communications staff will be available to assist you. There is no access fee.

WEEKLY MEDIA AVAILABILITY

Head Coach Connell Maynor will be available to the media every Tuesday at 11 a.m. CT during the season with the exception of AAMU's bye week. Players will be made available at the discretion of the coaching staff.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Requests for official working media credentials should be directed to the AAMU Athletics Communications Office. All requests should be received no later than noon, four days prior to the game. Visit the media page at aamusports.com to request credentials online.

Traditional media (newspapers, radio and television) are credible and consider standard media and will be approved. Those covering the Bulldogs through various other outlets (podcasts, facebook, instagram and youtube) are not acceptable forms of media and their credential requests will be denied.

Season credentials will be available for pickup prior to the first game. Credentials may be picked up on gameday at the media will call located at Louis Crews Stadium.

On gameday, media should park on the East Side of Louis Crews Stadium and enter through Gate 8.

SCOUTING PASSES

Professional scouts may obtain credentials through AAMU's Athletics Communications Office. Scouts will be issued seating in the press box on a space-available basis.

SIDELINE PASSES

Alabama A&M University follows NCAA guidelines regarding media representatives on the sidelines. Photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot between the 25-yard lines and the goal lines on both sidelines and behind the restraining line in the end zone.

When referring to Alabama A&M University, please only use the terms **ALABAMA A&M** or **AAMU**. Please refrain from acronyms of the name **A&M**, **Bama A&M** or **AAM**. In addition, Alabama A&M plays in the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC).

HISTORY AT A GLANCE

In 1920, athletic officials from six Texas HBCUs – C.H. Fuller of Bishop College, Red Randolph and C.H. Patterson of Paul Quinn College, E.G. Evans, H.J. Evans and H.J. Starns of Prairie View A&M, D.C. Fuller of Texas College and G. Whitte Jordan of Wiley College – met in Houston, Texas, to discuss common interests. At this meeting, they agreed to form a new league, the SWAC.

Paul Quinn became the first of the original members to withdraw from the league when it did so in 1929. When Langston University of Oklahoma was admitted into the conference two years later, it began the migration of state-supported institutions into the SWAC. Southern University entered the ranks in 1934, followed by Arkansas AM&N (now the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff) in 1936 and Texas Southern University in 1954.

Rapid growth in enrollment of the state-supported schools made it difficult for the church-supported schools to finance their athletics programs and one by one they fell victim to the growing prowess of the state-supported colleges. Bishop withdrew from the conference in 1956, Langston in 1957 and Huston-Tillotson (formerly Samuel Huston) in 1959, one year after the admittance of two more state-supported schools: Grambling College and Jackson State College.

The enter-exit cycle continued in 1961 when Texas College withdrew, followed by the admittance of Alcorn A&M (now Alcorn State University) in 1962. Wiley left in 1968, the same year Mississippi Valley State College entered. Arkansas AM&N exited in 1970 and Alabama State University entered in 1982.

Arkansas-Pine Bluff (formerly Arkansas AM&N) rejoined the SWAC on July 1, 1997, regaining full-member status one year later. Alabama A&M University became the conference's tenth member when it became a full member in September, 1999 after a one year period as an affiliate SWAC member. Most of the former SWAC members that have left the conference are currently a part of the Red River Athletic Conference of the NAIA.

Current championship competition offered by the SWAC includes competition for men in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor track, outdoor track & field and tennis. Women's competition is offered in the sports of basketball, bowling, cross country, golf, indoor track, outdoor track & field, soccer, softball, tennis and volleyball.

THE MISSION AND PURPOSE OF THE SWAC

The Southwestern Athletic Conference, Inc. (the "SWAC", the "Conference") is organized exclusively for the purpose of encouraging, promoting, advancing, and conducting intercollegiate sports activities and other recreational and not-for-profit activities among the members of the Conference. Its purposes are:

- To uphold the principles of institutional control of, and responsibility for all collegiate sports conducted by the members of this organization in conformity with the Constitution and Bylaws hereof;
- To stimulate and improve intercollegiate athletic sports;
- To comply with satisfactory standards of scholarship and amateur standing and good sportsmanship;
- To preserve and maintain the collegiate athletic records of the members of the Southwestern Athletic Conference, and make them available upon request;
- To cooperate with other amateur athletic organizations in the promotion and conduct of intercollegiate athletic contests;
- To maintain fiscal management; and
- To legislate through Bylaws or Resolutions on subjects of general concern to the membership.

The members of the conference are committed to the philosophy of maintaining intercollegiate athletics as an integral part of the overall educational program. 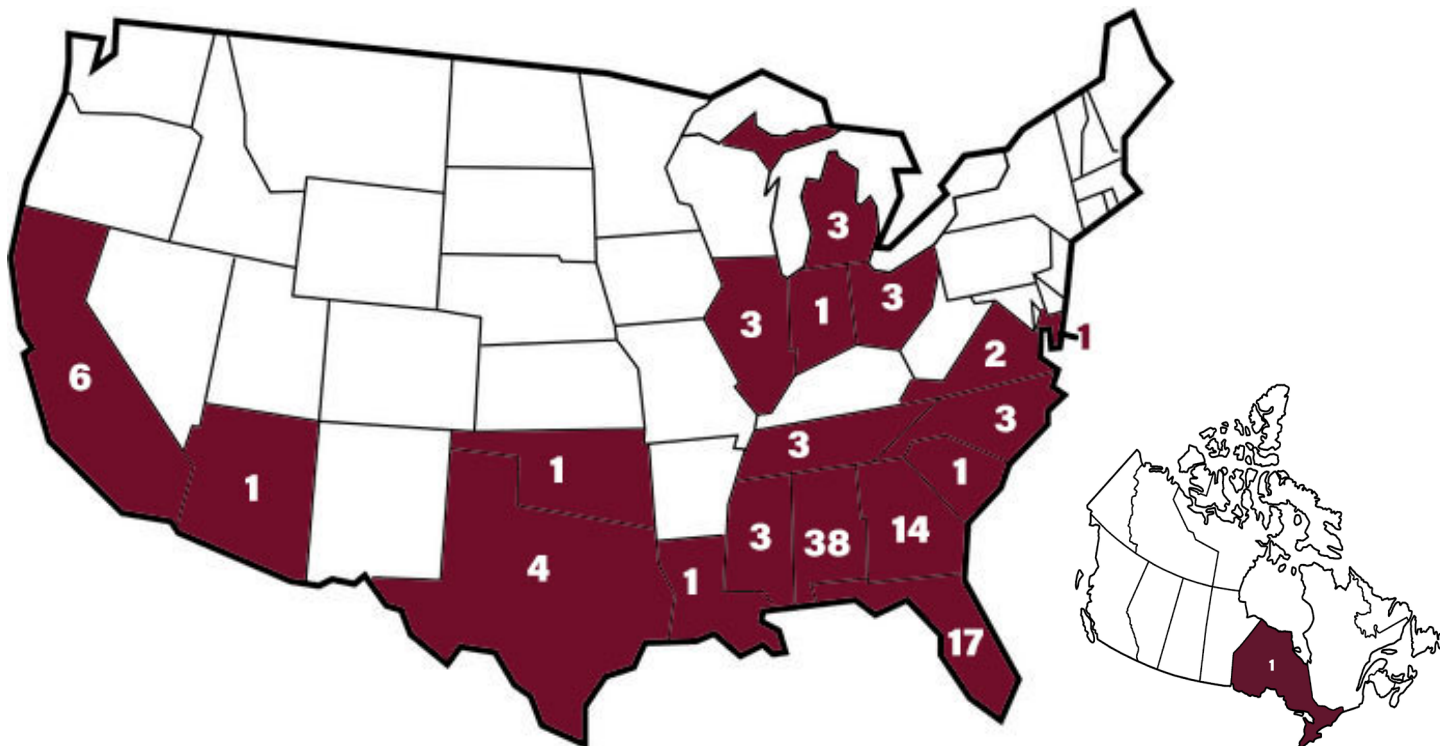

North Carolina A&T State, 1995

One of the most successful coaches over the past two decades, Maynor was named head coach at Alabama A&M on January 16, 2018, bringing with him an extensive background at both the collegiate and professional levels as a player and coach.

Upon his hiring that included being part of 10 championship teams with six of those rings coming as a player and four as a coach. He currently enters the 2024 season with a 99-57 (.634) overall record as a head coach in 14 years at three institutions.

Since taking the reins of the Bulldogs in 2018 Maynor has compiled an 34-26 record, 24-17 mark in the Southwestern Athletic Conference and accomplished things no other coach has at Alabama A&M.

During the 2023 season, Maynor's Bulldogs finished a 5-6 record, including 3-5 in conference play.

Alabama A&M picked up early season victories over Lane College and Arkansas-Pine Bluff, and a 58-3 lopsided victory over Tuskegee during Homecoming in front of a record attendance crowd of 26,391 at Louis Crews Classic.

The Bulldogs struggled down the stretch, going 2-4 over the final two months, ending the season with a 30-21 victory over Mississippi Valley State.

Maynor's squad had numerous postseason honors as four players were named to the All-SWAC Postseason team, including return specialist Terrell Gardner, who received a First-Team selection. Running back Donovan Eaglin, defensive lineman Zareon Hayes and defensive back Emari Pait were selected to the All-SWAC Second Team.

The Bulldogs struggled in 2022 in a bit of a rebuilding year, starting 0-3 on the season with losses to UAB, Troy, and Austin Peay.

Despite the slow start, A&M won three straight conference games to start the month of October, however fell down the stretch, including the first loss in the Magic City Classic under the watch of Maynor.

After the tremendous spring season, Maynor and his squad went 7-3 during the fall, starting with a three-game win streak to start the year with a home win over South Carolina State, Bethune-Cookman on the road, and Tuskegee in the Gulf Coast Challenge. After a trio of SWAC losses over the next three games, the Bulldogs finished strong to win the last four for the 7-3 mark.

The Spring 2021 season saw him add to not only his personal championship ring collection but to that of his players as he guided Alabama A&M to a perfect 5-0 record and 3-0 league mark, accomplishing three impressive milestones in one fell swoop on May 1.

That day would see a thrilling 40-33 victory over No. 25 Arkansas-Pine Bluff that delivered the first SWAC Championship in 15 years (and second in program history), the first undefeated season since the 1966 season 53 seasons prior and the first ever Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) National Championship for the program.

Those accomplishments earned him a spot as one of 16 national finalists for the Eddie Robinson Award as the nation's top FCS coach but were fueled by the efforts of the players he recruited.

Headlining that group was quarterback Aqeel Glass as he was named Player of the Year by the Black College Football Hall of Fame, BOXTOROW and the SWAC – all program firsts. He was also a finalist for the prestigious Walter Payton Award as the top player at the FCS level. Those would also be honors that Glass would duplicate in Fall 2021, finishing ninth in the Payton voting.

The accolades from that championship season also included a Division I Era program record 11 All-SWAC selections with seven on the First-Team.

It was also a season marked by 12 All-Americans between postseason and preseason honors, headlined by the first American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) honoree as sophomore wide out Abdul-Fatai Ibrahim was named to the Second-Team. That honor made him just the fourth in program history, second in the DI Era and first since 2007.

He was also among six BOXTOROW postseason All-Americans and four preseason honorees for that organization. Additionally, junior defensive end Marcus Cushine became the first player in 29 years to earn College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-District and All-America recognition for his work on the field and in the classroom.

Ibrahim would join those ranks in Fall 2021 as he became just the fourth football player to earn CoSIDA Academic All-District honors, doing so out of a district that features schools from Alabama, South Carolina, Georgia and Florida.

The Spring 2021 season marked a steady improvement for the program from a 6-5 overall record and 5-2 mark in the SWAC in 2018 and 7-5 and 4-3 records, respectively, in 2019. The 2018 campaign also represented the first winning season for the program since 2012.

Most recently, the Fall 2021 campaign would see the Bulldogs go 7-3 overall, see the team earn AFCA Minority Offensive Staff of the Year and offensive coordinator Duane Taylor be named to that role for the National Football League Player's Association (NFLPA) Collegiate Bowl at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, California.

In just four seasons at the helm, Maynor has delivered 31 All-SWAC honors with 17 of those being First-Team selections. A total of 21 of those came in 2020 and Spring 2021 with five, including four First-Team, in Fall 2021.

Maynor came to The Hill following four seasons as head coach at Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) member Hampton from 2014-17.

In that time he posted a 20-25 overall record that included a pair of winning seasons, the program's first since 2011. The first of those was a 2015 campaign that saw a 6-5 overall record and 5-3 mark in the MEAC and those records would be repeated in his final season with the Pirates in 2017.

He would pick up his first victory as a Division I head coach with a 34-30 decision over Miles on September 20, 2014 and also delivered the program's first shutout in five years, and his first at the DI level, with a 23-0 win over Delaware State that first season.

In those four years he also produced 32 All-MEAC performers over three teams, including seven on the First-Team. Those would come with seven in 2014 (two First-Team), 10 in 2015 (4), eight in 2016 (1) and seven in 2017.

An established program builder, Maynor inherited a program that went 1-10 against a DI schedule the year before his arrival and immediately turned things around.

That first season would see the Rams deliver a sterling 8-2 record that would be the beginning of a 45-6 stretch over that four-year span and one that would include an incredible 29-2 mark in the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA).

In 2011 Maynor lead WSSU to a 13-1 overall record, a CIAA Championship with a perfect 8-0 record and a berth in the NCAA Division II Semifinals before taking even further in 2012. That year would see them earn a second straight league championship with a 14-1 record before falling in the national championship game.

The 2013 season would make for a third consecutive CIAA title behind a 10-2 overall record and 7-0 mark in league play. It would culminate in a third straight NCAA appearance and include a home 27-20 victory over Slippery Rock in the opening round.

Among the accomplishments over that stretch were a

pair of HBCU National Championships in 2011 and 2012, two Super Region One titles and a bevy of personal accolades.

The latter included CIAA Coach of the Year honors in 2011 and 2012, BOXTOROW HBCU Coach of the Year, Pigskin Club of Washington, D.C. CIAA Coach of the Year, Black College Sports Page BAAD Team Coach of the Year and Don Hansen Football Gazette Super Region One Coach of the Year. He was also named the 2011 Sheridan Broadcasting National HBCU Coach of the Year.

No stranger to success in the CIAA, Maynor spent a decade in the league as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Division II Fayetteville State.

In that time, he helped lead FSU to four CIAA title game appearances, three of them resulting in championships in 2002, 2003 and 2009.

Additionally, he worked with All-CIAA quarterback selections in the first two of those seasons and his offense led the league in rushing offense, total offense and scoring in 2008. That offense also ranked No. 13 in the country in points per game and helped lead the Broncos to 64 wins in his time in Fayetteville.

A veteran of 12 seasons in the Arena Football League (AFL), Maynor played for seven teams and threw for 9,285 yards and 160 touchdowns against just 33 interceptions.

A versatile player, he concluded his AFL career as the only individual to play quarterback, wide receiver, linebacker and serve as a kick return specialist and is the only player to throw for more than 5,000 yards, accumulate at least 500 yards receiving (795), 400 rushing yards (642) and 400 yards in kick returns (465).

His best season would come in 2003 when he posted career-highs in every passing category, going 235-of-400 for 3,167 yards with 54 touchdowns and only 10 interceptions.

Over the course of his 13-year professional career Maynor was part of four AFL World Championship teams, going back-to-back with the Tampa Bay Storm in 1995 and 1996 and twice with the Orlando Predators in 1998 and 2000. The latter would see him earn Arena Bowl Most Valuable Player honors with a 41-38 victory over the Nashville Kats.

In 2012, as part of the league's Silver Anniversary celebration, he was named as one of the league's 25 greatest quarterbacks.

Following his prolific playing career, Maynor transitioned into the professional ranks for coaching, moving up stairs to the offensive coordinator role with his final team, the Philadelphia Soul of the Arena Football League.

In that role he guided the Soul to first place statistical rankings in scoring offense (62.0 ppg), touchdowns (132), touchdown passes (102) and red zone efficiency (85-percent) in 2008. That effort led to Philadelphia claiming Arena Bowl XXII as they held off a furious comeback by the San Jose SaberCats for a 59-56 victory.

Prior to his impressive coaching career, Maynor starred at quarterback at Winston-Salem State in 1987 under William "Bill" Hayes, leading the team to a CIAA Championship and earning All-CIAA honors after passing for 1,071 yards.

He would then follow Hayes to North Carolina A&T where he would proceed to become the first Aggie to be named MEAC Offensive Player of the Year, doing so in back-to-back years in 1990 and 1991. Maynor also earned All-MEAC First-Team honors in each of those seasons while leading A&T to the league championship in 1991.

That year he led the club to a 9-2 record while throwing for 1,527 yards, 18 touchdowns and only five interceptions and rushing for 288 yards and eight more scores. It also marked the second straight season that the Aggies posted a nine-win season.

Over the course of his three seasons he accounted for 58 touchdowns with 39 coming through the air and 19 on the ground, a number that currently ranks third in the program's history. Additionally, his 141.82 career passing efficiency rating is the best in Aggie history, as is his .561 completion percentage.

As a result of his stellar collegiate and professional playing and coaching careers, Maynor has been inducted into both the MEAC and NC A&T Halls of Fame. The Aggies honored him in 2014 while the MEAC inducted him into their ranks in 2020.

Additionally, he has appeared on the silver screen, serving as Jamie Foxx's stand-in for the movie Any Given Sunday (1999) and did stunt work in the blockbuster Remember The Titans (2000).

Maynor holds a Bachelor of Arts in Recreation Administration earned from North Carolina A&T in 1995.

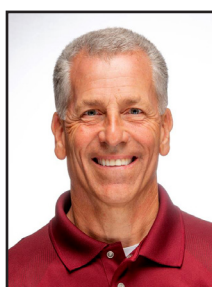

ALABAMA A&M OPENS SEASON WITH ROAD LOSS TO AUBURN

AUBURN, Ala. | The Alabama A&M University football team opened its season on Saturday night and could not recover from three early quick scores as the Bulldogs fell, 73-3, to Auburn at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn (1-0) needed just four plays on the opening drive as Jarquez Hunter scored on a 34-yard touchdown run as the Tigers capped a 70-yard drive in just 47 seconds.

After an Alabama A&M punt, Payton Thorne connected with KeAndre Lambert-Smith for 67 yards as the Tigers extended the lead to 14-0 with 12:47 remaining in the first quarter.

The Bulldogs unable to move the ball were forced to punt on their second possession as Thorne found a streaking Cam Coleman for 44 yards as Auburn pushed the advantage to 21-0 with 11:39 left in the period.

Alabama A&M (0-1) had a chance to score on its third possession as Cornelious Brown IV got a great bounce off an Auburn defender as Keenan Hambrick caught the deflection for a 56-yard completion as he was dragged down at the Tiger 1. However, a penalty backed the Bulldogs up and had to settle for a 29-yard field goal attempt by Christian Silverstein as the kick was wide right.

Auburn put the final touches of the quarter with exactly two minutes remaining in the first as Lambert-Smith caught a 4-yard pass from Thorne as the Tigers increased the margin to 28-0.

The Tigers got a 32-yard field goal by Towns McGough and Thorne connected with Perry Thompson for a 70-yard score to extend the lead to 38-0 with 10:10 remaining in the second.

The Bulldogs broke the shutout with six minutes in the first half as Austin McCready booted his first-ever field attempt, a 43-yarder - as Alabama A&M closed the gap to 38-3.

Auburn tacked on one more score right before the break as the Tigers took a commanding 45-3 lead into the half.

The Tigers cruised in the second half, scoring 14 points in the third and added one final score in the fourth for a 73-3 victory.

"I'm just happy for the players," Maynor said. "One hundred wins means I am probably getting old, been coaching a long time. But I had a lot of great coaches and a lot of great football players to make it to 100 wins. It ain't just me. It's always the staff and the players."

Alabama A&M (1-1) forced Kentucky State to punt on its first possession and the Bulldogs went to work, scoring on its opening drive, going 59 yards in 12 plays and taking just over four minutes off the clock.

AAMU used a balanced offense in scoring its first touchdown of the season, mixing in four passes and eight rushes as Xavier Lankford scored on a 1-yard keeper to camp the drive and give the Bulldogs a quick 7-0 lead with 9:38 remaining.

It didn't take long for the second Bulldog score of the night as AAMU started at the KSU 43 after a Thorobred punt.

Cornelious Brown IV found a wide-open Duke Miller down the left sideline for a 38-yard score as the Bulldogs pushed the lead to 14-0 with 6:36 left.

Alabama A&M took advantage of a Kentucky State turnover and marched 60 yards in six plays as Jacoby Hewitt caught an 8-yard touchdown pass from Brown as the Bulldogs increased their advantage to 21-0 just five seconds into the second quarter.

After stopping the Thorobreds on fourth down, the Bulldogs went right back to work, taking more than four minutes off the clock as Barry White caught a 20-yard touchdown pass from Aveon Smith to complete the 72-yard drive as Alabama A&M stretched its lead to 28-0 with exactly two minutes left in the half.

The Bulldogs took the opening kickoff of the second half, mixing the run and pass as Brown connected with Ryan Morrow for an 18-yard touchdown as AAMU extended its advantage to 35-0 with 12:47 remaining.

Alabama A&M put the game out of reach midway through the third quarter as Brown threw his fourth touchdown of the night, a 16-yard pass to Miller, capping a 9-play, 89-yard drive as the Bulldogs pushed the margin to 42-0 with 8:17 left in the period.

AAMU added a Kolten Nero 4-yard touchdown run with just over 10 minutes to play, extending the margin to 49-0.

Kentucky State (0-2) got into the scoring column midway through the final period as Jaun Gainious found Jaden Hale for eight yards as the Thorobreds trailed, 49-7, with 7:15 remaining.

SMITH SPARKS BULLDOGS IN HOME VICTORY

THE HILL | Aveon Smith came off the bench to provide a spark as the junior quarterback threw one touchdown pass and ran for another as the Alabama A&M University football team pulled away in the fourth quarter to defeat Georgetown College, 24-16, on Saturday night at Louis Crews Stadium.

AAMU's defense was put to the test on the opening kickoff as Georgetown moved the ball with a mix of passes and runs. The Tigers drove 54 yards in nine plays as Drew Rader's 40-yard field goal attempt was wide left as the Bulldogs took over with 9:54 left in the first period.

Alabama A&M (2-1) went right to work after the missed field goal as the Bulldogs went 67 yards in eight plays to grab the first score of the game.

Ryan Morrow picked up a first down on a 20-yard rush and Xavier Lankford connected with Keenan Hambrick for 34 yards, setting up the Bulldogs at the GC 18. However, the Tigers' defense forced a stop as Austin McCready booted a 27-yard field goal as AAMU grabbed a 3-0 advantage with just under six minutes to play in the quarter.

Georgetown (1-2) answered on its next drive as Gehring Slunaker connected with Jamarcus Robinson for a 34-yard completion and two plays later, the pair connected again, this time a 31-yard touchdown strike, capping a 5-play, 75-yard drive as the Tigers took a 7-3 advantage with 3:05 remaining.

Back came Alabama A&M as the Bulldogs picked up a fourth-down conversion on the 10-play, 75-yard drive as Donovan Eaglin rumbled 11 yards up in the middle for the score as AAMU grabbed a 10-7 lead just 15 seconds into the second quarter.

Georgetown responded by driving to the AAMU 18 as the Bulldogs forced the Tigers to attempt a 35-yard field goal. This time Rader's kick hit the right upright with 10:06 left.

On the next ensuing Bulldog drive, Cornelious Brown IV picked up a 38-yard gain on second down, but was picked off by Justin Richardson on the very next play, turning the ball over to Georgetown at the Tigers 42 with 9:12 remaining.

After forcing a Georgetown punt, Alabama A&M started its drive backed up at its own 2. The Bulldogs marched 89 yards in 12 plays but was forced to attempt a field goal. McCready's 27-yard field goal attempt was blocked and returned to the AAMU 41 with just over two minutes to play in the half.

A turnover led to three points as Georgetown tied the game at 10 with exactly 10 minutes left in the third.

The Tigers were forced to punt on their first possession of the second half but Myles Parker fumbled the ball and was recovered by Ryan Burke at the AAMU 37. However, the Bulldog defense didn't bend, forcing a field-goal attempt. Rader's 39-yard kick was good, tying the game at 10.

Alabama A&M answered with a scoring drive of its own and breaking the 10-all tie.

The Bulldogs marched 75 yards in 10 plays, taking more four minutes off the clock as Aveon Smith ran 31 yards untouched for the score as AAMU took a 17-10 lead with 3:26 remaining in the third.

Georgetown got a big completion from Slunaker to Clayton Davis, 56 yards, on its next offensive series, setting up another Rader field goal after a Cortez Andrews sack. Rader's 33-yard field goal split the uprights, cutting the Bulldog lead to 17-13 with eight seconds left.

Alabama A&M got some distance as the Bulldogs completed a 6-play, 75-yard drive as Smith connected with DeQuadrion Welch for 19 yards as AAMU stretch the advantage to 24-13 with 12:48 remaining.

ALABAMA A&M DROPS ROAD TILT TO AUSTIN PEAY

CLARKSVILLE, Tenn. | The Alabama A&M University football team fell behind early and could not recover as the Bulldogs fell, 59-16, to Austin Peay on Saturday night at Fontera Stadium in the final tune up game before opening Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) play next week in Tallahassee, Fla. against Florida A&M.

Alabama A&M (2-2) got the ball to begin the game, but on the very first play from scrimmage, Cornelious Brown IV was picked off by Sammy Anderson Jr. at the AAMU 31 and returned it eight yards.

Austin Peay (1-3) took advantage of the turnover as the Bulldog defense stepped up a forced a 41-yard field goal by Carson Smith as the Governors grabbed a 3-0 advantage with 13:33 remaining in the opening quarter.

Back came Alabama A&M as the Bulldogs put together an 8-play, 44-yard drive as Austin McCready booted a career-best 48-yard field goal, tying the game at 3 with just over nine minutes to play in the first.

The Governors got a great return by Romon Copeland Jr. on the kickoff and Austin Peay took advantage of a short field. Four plays after the return, Copeland hauled in a 10-yard touchdown pass from Austin Smith, breaking the tie and giving the Govs a 10-3 lead with 7:24 remaining.

On the very next offensive possession, Jesse Johnson III scooped up a fumble by Aveon Smith and returned in 21 yards for the score as Austin Peay extended the lead to 17-3 with 6:44 left.

Alabama A&M was forced to punt on its next possession as McCready booted a 55-yard bomb, but Copeland found the seam and returned it 82 yards for the score as the Govs stretched their lead to 24-3 with 4:48 remaining.

After stopped the Bulldogs on fourth down, Austin Peay needed just one play as La'Ve'll Wright went straight up the middle for a 53-yard touchdown run, pushing the margin to 31-3 with just over 12 minutes left in the half.

Wright added his second touchdown score with 1:53 remaining in the second on a 6-yard touchdown scamper, capping a 12-play, 95-yard drive as Austin Peay took a commanding 38-3 lead into the break.

The Governors opened the third quarter strong as Wright went 62 yards up the middle for his third score on the night as Austin Peay extended its lead to 45-3 with 14:52 left in the period.

Austin Peay put the game out of reach with 4:10 left as Kaden Williams capped a 7-play, 46-yard drive, stretching the advantage to 52-3 with 3:10 remaining.

Alabama A&M responded with a 13-play, 79-yard drive as Brown connected with Donovan Price on a 7-yard touchdown pass, trimming the deficit to 52-9 as the extra point was blocked with 13:29 left.

Austin Peay responded with a 75-yard drive as Corey Richardson found the left side and darted 13 yards into the end zone for the touchdown as the Govs increased the lead to 59-9 with 8:41 remaining.

RALLY COMES UP SHORT AT GULF COAST CHALLENGE

MOBILE, Ala. | Xavier Lankford threw for 245 yards, with four touchdowns (three passing, one rushing) as the Alabama A&M University football team nearly rallied from a 28-point deficit in falling short, 45-38, to Jackson State in a Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) game in the Gulf Coast Challenge on Saturday at Ladd-Peebles Stadium.

Alabama A&M (2-3 overall, 0-1 SWAC) trailed by as many as 28 points (38-10) entering the half, but held Jackson State to just one touchdown over the final two quarters. Meanwhile, the Bulldogs nearly pulled off the rally, scoring 28 points before the Tigers picked up a first down with under two minutes to play to seal the win.

Jackson State (4-2, 2-0) took the opening kickoff, going 75 yards in six plays as Irv Mulligan scored on a 6-yard touchdown run up the middle as the Tigers grabbed a quick 7-0 lead with 12:17 remaining in the first quarter.

Alabama A&M quickly establish the game plan early on by running the football despite not picking up a first down on the opening series as the Bulldogs went three-and-out.

JSU got a 44 punt return by Travis Terrell Jr., and three plays later, Mulligan found the endzone for his second score, a 10-yard touchdown scamper as the Tigers pushed the lead to 14-0 with 9:13 left.

The Bulldogs put together a nearly seven minute drive on their next series, going 54 yards in 13 plays as Austin McCready booted a 34-yard field goal, closing the gap to 14-3 with 2:20 remaining.

However, on the ensuing kickoff, Terrell, who came into the game ranked inside the top five in FCS returns, broke loose for a 96-yard kickoff return as the Tigers stretched their advantage to 21-3, with just over two minutes to play.

Jackson State continued to flex its muscle in the opening half, this time Joanes Fortilien hauled in an 12-yard touchdown pass from Jacobian Morgan as the Tigers extended the margin to 28-3 with just under 13 minutes left in the second.

Alabama A&M responded with a time-consuming drive as Lankford punched in a 1-yard run, cutting the deficit to 28-10 with 5:54 remaining.

However, Jackson State added two more scores before halftime as Fortilien caught an 18-yard touchdown pass and Gerardo Baeza booted a 23-yard field goal as the Tigers took a 38-10 lead into the break.

Alabama A&M converted a huge fourth down play as Donovan Payne caught a 20-yard touchdown from Lankford, capping a 12-play, 67-yard drive as the Bulldogs trimmed the margin to 38-17 with just under 10 minutes to play in the third.

However, Jackson State answered as I Spencer broke past the AAMU secondary and hauled in a 58-yard touchdown from Morgan as the Tigers extended the advantage to 45-17 with 6:44 left.

The Bulldogs continued to play from behind as Dion Nelson Jr. capped an 11-play, 90-yard drive with a 7-yard touchdown reception, cutting the margin to 45-24 with 1:14 remaining in the third.

A 12-yard Lankford touchdown to DeQuadrion Welch continued the comeback attempt with just under 11 minutes to play as AAMU closed the gap to 45-31.

DJ Moffett's 4-yard touchdown run capped a 95-yard drive in 12 plays with 2:46 remaining, but the Bulldogs never got the ball back as Jackson State ran out the clock.

LANKFORD'S FOUR TOUCHDOWN'S CARRY BULLDOGS TO WIN

THE HILL | Xavier Lankford rushed for three touchdowns and threw for another as the Alabama A&M University football team ended a two-game losing streak on Saturday with a 56-12 Homecoming victory over Bethune-Cookman in a Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) game at Louis Crews Stadium.

Alabama A&M (3-3 overall, 1-1 SWAC) took the opening kickoff and wasted little time putting points on the board. The Bulldogs, aided by a 40-yard completion to Keenan Hambrick, as Lankford punched in a 2-yard touchdown, capping an 8 play, 73-yard drive as AAMU grabbed a quick 7-0 lead with 11:31 remaining in the first quarter.

The Bulldogs doubled their lead, nearly going the length of the field to push the advantage to 14-0, with just over 12 minutes remaining in the half. Alabama A&M went 94 yards in 13 plays, taking 5:46 off the clock, as Lankford scored on a 2-yard keeper to extend the margin.

Bethune-Cookman (0-6, 0-2) answered with a 10-play, 68-yard drive as Cam Ransom scored on a 15-yard touchdown run, cutting the deficit to 14-6 as the extra point was blocked with 7:05 left in the second.

Back came the Bulldogs, going 88 yards as Lankford found a wide open DeQuadron Welch down the left sideline for a 44-yard touchdown as Alabama A&M stretched the advantage to 21-6 with 2:44 remaining in the half.

Alabama A&M took advantage of a BCU miscue on the ensuing kickoff as the ball bounced off Amarie Jones and Mohamed Bakyoko recovered the ball at the Wildcat 30. On the very next play, Donovan Eaglin broke free for a 30-yard touchdown run as AAMU extended the advantage to 28-6 with 2:34 left.

The Wildcats had an opportunity to chip away at the deficit as Ransom tossed a 49-yard touchdown pass to Omari Stewart, but the score was wiped away as Bethune-Cookman was flagged for offsides. Instead of the score, BCU was forced to punt the football on its first series of the second half.

Alabama A&M responded with a 6 play, 72-yard drive as Bulldog offensive lineman Christian Anderson got his first career touchdown when he recovered an Eaglin fumble in the endzone, stretching the advantage to 35-6 with 9:13 remaining in the third.

With the Bulldogs drive, Lankford was picked up by Johnny Harris III, who went 91 yards down the left sideline for the pick six. However, the extra point was no good as the Wildcats trailed, 35-12, with 5:12 left.

Alabama A&M answered with a 9 play, 68-yard drive as Lankford rushed for his third touchdown of the day, a four-yard score, as the Bulldogs increased the lead to 42-12 with 1:30 remaining in the period.

AAMU put the game away early in the final quarter as Ryan Morrow capped a 75-yard drive with a 2-yard touchdown run as the Bulldogs stretched the advantage to 49-12 with just over 13 minutes to play.
