### OPENING KICK

► Jackson State and Alabama A&M have met 28 times in school history with Jackson State leading the series 16-12, including 7-6 at home. The Tigers have also won three of the four meetings at a neutral site.

► Jackson State has won the last four meetings between the two teams, including the last three that have been played in Mobile.

► **Ahmad Miller** turned in the second-best rushing performance of the season against Hampton in the season opener with 180 yards against Hampton. He was even with Joshua Dye of Southern Utah, while Eastern Illinois quarterback Cole LaCrue rushed for nation's best 193 yards. He followed that up with another 100-yard rushing performance against Southern in his last outing - rushing for 101 - after seeing limited action against Tuskegee.

► After sitting out against Tuskegee and having two weeks off, **JaCobian Morgan** responded with 337 yards through the air and a pair of touchdowns against Southern in the Tigers' last outing. He was named the SWAC Offensive Player of the Week and HBCU National co-Player of the Week.

► Jackson State was named the FCS HBCU National Team of the Week after its win over Southern after racking up over 500 yards of total offense and outscoring Southern 28-0 over the final 30:05 of the game.

► The Tigers had three receivers rack up 90-plus yards in the win over Southern led by **Nate Rembert** with 102 yards on five receptions. He was joined by **Jameel Gardner Jr.** with seven receptions for 96 yards and **Ja'Naylon Dupree** with 93 yards on five receptions. Both Rembert and Dupree had touchdown receptions in the win.

► **Kam Sallis** recorded his first career interception at Jackson State on the goal line to end a Southern threat, leading to the longest scoring drive of the season for the Tigers to close the half. Jackson State went 97 yards to end the half with a 51-yard touchdown reception from Dupree with just five seconds remaining.

► 350 days... that was the span between losses for Jackson State following the game at Southern Miss on Saturday [Sept. 6]. Prior to that game, Jackson State last loss on Sept. 21, 2024 on the road before reeling off 10 consecutive victories to close out 2024 and extended the streak to 11 after the 2025 season opener. Although the winning streak may be over for consecutive wins, they maintain the 11-game streak against FCS opponents.



T.C. Taylor is in his third season as the head coach of his alma mater. He has a 22-7 record through his first two-plus seasons, including going 12-2 in 2024 and claiming the school's first-ever Celebration Bowl victory on its way to an HBCU National Championship.

OFFENSIVE NOTEBOOK

MORGAN NAMED SWAC OFFENSIVE POW, NATIONAL POW

► **JaCobian Morgan** was named the SWAC Offensive and HBCU National co-Player of the Week after leading Jackson State to a 38-13 victory over Southern.  
► Morgan finished with 337 yards passing with two touchdowns and no interceptions.

LOCKHART NAMED SWAC NEWCOMER OF THE WEEK

► **Jared Lockhart** was named the Southwestern Athletic Conference [SWAC] Newcomer of the Week after his performance against Tuskegee.  
► The freshman completed 15-of-21 passes for 254 yards, and added a 21-yard touchdown pass to **Jameel Gardner Jr.** in the second quarter. He also added 44 yards on the ground on 12 carries and a pair of touchdowns in his first collegiate start and first collegiate game in a 30-0 victory over Tuskegee.

ANOTHER 200-YARD DAY ON THE GROUND

► Jackson State turned in another 200-yard day on the ground with 266 yards against Tuskegee, rushing for three touchdowns.  
► The Tigers used nine different ball carriers in the win over Tuskegee.  
► Jackson State currently ranks fourth in the nation in rushing offense at 249.3 yards per game. They trail Delaware State [280.0], Tennessee Tech [271.7], and UTRGV [263.7] through the first three weeks of the season.

MILLER HAS CAREER DAY AGAINST HAMPTON

► **Ahmad Miller** ran his way to Offensive MVP honors at the Hope Labor Day Classic and co-HBCU National Player of the Week honors (BOXTOROW) with his performance against Hampton on just 12 carries.  
► Miller scored a pair of touchdowns on runs of two and 76-yards, with both coming in the fourth quarter to put the game way for the Tigers.He finished the day with 180 yards on 12 carries, averaging 15.0 yards per carry - all career-highs.

PILING UP THE YARDS IN LAST GAME

► Jackson State racked up 522 yards of total offense, the most since a win over Mississippi Valley State in 2022, against Tuskegee.  
► They answered that with 534 yards against Southern to top the previous mark from the prior game.

PAIR NAMED TO WALTER PAYTON WATCH LIST

► Stats Perform has announced a 30-player preseason watch list for the 2025 Walter Payton Award, presented annually to the national offensive player of the year in Division I FCS college football with a pair of Jackson State student-athletes named to the list.  
► **JaCobian Morgan** continues to add to his preseason award by earning a spot on the Preseason Watch List. The two-time Preseason Offensive Player of the Year, Morgan finished last season with 2,051 yards through the air on 150-of-234 passing, finishing the season 10-1 as a starter, including 10 consecutive wins. He also threw 19 touchdown passes with just eight interceptions, finishing with a 64.1 completion percentage. He also rushed for 225 yards and four touchdowns. Morgan completed the season ranked nationally in several categories including passing efficiency [13th/157.9], points responsible for [16th/164], passing yards per completion [17th/13.72], passing touchdowns [24th/21], completion percentage [31st/0.637], points responsible for per game [35th/11.7], passing yards [43rd/2.236], passing yards per game [69th/159.7], completions per game [80th/11.64], and rushing touchdowns [98th/6].  
► Meanwhile, he was joined on the list by **Travis Terrell Jr.**, a highly-decorated player last season including being named the Freshman of the Year by the SWAC and Phil Steele. He was ranked among the best in the nation in returns, leading the nation in kick returns for touchdowns with two. He also ranked in the top five nationally in three other categories, including third in punt returns [16.7], fourth in combined kick returns [851], fifth in kickoff returns [30.6], and 36th in all-purpose yards [108.08]. The sophomore also ran the ball 459 yards on 75 carries with four touchdowns, and also caught 15 passes for 95 yards on the offensive side of the ball. Terrell was named First Team All-SWAC this season and earned four selections on the Phil Steele all-conference team, while also earning a pair of Preseason All-American teams.  
► Jackson State is one of just four schools with two players named to the Preseason List including Illinois State, South Dakota, and Stephen F. Austin.

MORGAN NOT BAD AS A STARTER

► Quarterback **JaCobian Morgan** is not bad as a starter after he is finished 10-1 as a starter last season for the Tigers, with his only loss coming against ULM. The graduate student rotated in as the starter the first four games of the season in 2024 before getting the reins following the Grambling State [Sept. 21] contest.  
► This season, Morgan is 15-4 as a starter (undefeated in SWAC play) and has been starting since his freshman season at Syracuse, only the seventh quarterback to start at quarterback for the Orange.

DAVENPORT AND CHRISTON JOIN LOADED RUNNING BACK ROOM

► **Donerio Davenport** and **Kenan Christon II** join the Jackson State running back room after transferring in. Davenport comes from Louisiana Tech through Texas State, while Christon comes from San Diego State through USC.

- The duo has combined to rush for 1,067 yards with Christon rushing for 1,082 yards and Davenport 565 yards in their careers.
- They join a room that returns most of its core from last season with the exception of **Irv Mulligan**, the SWAC Offensive POY.

EVERYONE HAS TO BE READY TO GO IN THE BACKFIELD

- Jackson State has scored six touchdowns this season, all on the ground through the first two games.
- **Ahmad Miller** leads the way with three touchdowns on the ground [two against Hampton], **Emari Matthews** has a pair, and **Donerio Davenport** has one touchdown on the ground.

MILLER AMONG THE NATION’S ELITE

- Ahmad Miller is among the nation’s best through the first three games of the season, ranking among the nation’s best in several categories.
- The redshirt sophomore is 12th in rushing yards per game [94.3], 13th in rushing yards [283], 19th in rushing touchdowns [3], and 34th in total touchdowns [3].

IF THE NAME SOUNDS FAMILIAR, IT’S BECAUSE IT IS

- If the Miller name sounds familiar, it should... Ahmad is the younger brother of current CFL star Aubrey Miller, a former linebacker at Jackson State who made his own name with postseason honors each year as a Tiger.

OFFENSIVE LINE HAS ADJUSTED IN THREE GAMES

- **Isaiah Villaneuva** moved to center to start the season after working most of camp at guard, shifting **Dequarious White** to a starting spot at guard.
- White missed the Southern Miss game, moving **Brian Williams Jr.** into the starting lineup alongside Villaneuva. Both he and **D’Andre Townes-Blue** left the Southern Miss game early, forcing more changes into the line including **Almetris Smith** coming in at center and shifting Villaneuva back to guard.

LET’S ALL SHOOT FOR 100 YARDS

- Three difference receivers went over 90 yards in the Tigers’ win over Southern in the Tigers last game.
- **Nate Rembert** finished with 102 yards and one touchdown on five receptions, while **Ja-meel Gardner Jr.** finished with 96 yards on seven receptions and **Ja’Naylon Dupree** with 93 yards on five receptions with a touchdown.

LOTS OF YARDS BETWEEN THREE WIDEOUTS TO START ‘25

- Three receivers on the Jackson State roster this season combined for 132 receptions for 2,017 yards and 18 touchdowns, with the lone Tigers’ receiver on the list returning from last year - **Joanes Fortilien** finishing with 37 receptions for 565 yards and a team-high 11 touchdowns.
- He is joined by a pair of transfers in **Shemar Savage** from Prairie View A&M and **Nate Rembert** from Mississippi Valley State. Savage finished last season with 25 receptions for 414 yards and three touchdowns, while Rembert finished with 70 receptions for 1,038 yards and four touchdowns.

SAVAGE HAS A STORY TO TELL

- **Shemar Savage** gained an extra year of eligibility this season after playing in the HBCU Legacy Bowl following his final season at Prairie View A&M. However, he earned a waiver after a junior college year and not being informed he had the extra year... but his story is not on the field.
- Savage is pursuing his dream of becoming an NFL player but had a journey filled with abuse and neglect growing up. Savage has found a place of love, kindness, and football with people in his life and Jackson State.
- Savage suffered through abuse as a youngster and was taken in by the Hayes family where he stayed for two years. He went back home to family, living with his grandmother before becoming homeless at 15 years old.
- He was taken in by his high school coach, Andrew Jones before moving on to live with teammate Toa Taua who had a stellar career at Nevada. Savage moved on again after the demands on Taua’s family, and that’s where he found himself with his guidance counselor Lana Huyck.
- Savage made his debut for Jackson State against Hampton in the season-opener Hope Labor Day Classic, hauling in one reception for seven yards in the win.

HIGH SCHOOL TEAMMATES REUNITE AT JACKSON STATE, YEAR TWO AS TIGERS

- **Tyquan Henderson** and **JaCobian Morgan** will be on the field for the second time this season in a Jackson State uniform after both transferred back home - Henderson from Southern Miss and Morgan from Syracuse - after a stellar high school career.
- The duo played together at Canton High School before getting on the field last year. They hooked up 14 times for 283 yards in 2024 with one touchdown.

HIGH SCHOOL TEAMMATES STAY TOGETHER - TRAVIS TERRELL JR. AND BRIAN WILLIAMS

- **Travis Terrell Jr.** and **Brian Williams** have continued their careers together at Jackson State after playing together in high school at

### SIX OFFENSIVE PLAYERS NAMED TO BCFHOF PRESEASON WATCH LIST

► The Black College Football Hall of Fame [BCFHOF] announced the 2025 Watch List for the Black College Football Player of the Year Award with Jackson State leading the way with six players on the list.

► The Watch List is composed of 50 players from different HBCUs with the SWAC leading the way with 18 selections.

► Jackson State is represented on the list by wide receiver **Joanes Fortilien**, tight end **Marvin Landy**, quarterback **JaCobian Morgan**, wide receiver **Nate Rembert**, wide receiver **Shemar Savage**, and offensive lineman **D'Andre Townes-Blue**.

## DEFENSIVE NOTEBOOK

### DOESN'T HAPPEN OFTEN BUT DID IN THIS CASE

► Jackson State pitched its first shutout under head coach T.C. Taylor in a 30-0 victory over Tuskegee at the W.C. Gorden Classic, and it was also the first shutout since 2022 against Southern [Oct. 29].

► The Tigers held Tuskegee to just seven first downs in the win and 24 yards rushing on 20 carries. The Golden Tigers barely made it over 100 yards of total offense, finishing with 109 yards on 40 plays.

► The most glaring stat of the day is that Tuskegee made it past the 50-yards line just two times, with one of those coming courtesy of a personal foul.

### HARGON MAKES THE MOST OF FIRST START

► J'Cori Hargon made the most of his first start at Jackson State in the W.C. Gorden Classic, earning Defensive MVP honors on the day.

► He finished with six total tackles and a tackle for loss in the win.

### QUARTERBACK TURNED DEFENSIVE END HAS CAREER DAY IN OPENER

► **Quincy Ivory**, a former quarterback who started his career at Mississippi Valley State, had a career day for Jackson State in his debut in the Hope Labor Day Classic.

► Ivory earned Defensive MVP honors in the game after recording eight tackles, including four solo from his defensive end position. But that wasn't the biggest stat line as he finished with 3.5 tackles for loss and a pair of sacks.

► Not to mention, he recovered a fumble and forced a fumble in the win.

### IVORY DOES IT AGAIN... THIS TIME AGAINST SOUTHERN MISS

► **Quincy Ivory**, who had a career day in the opener, did it again against Southern Miss in the first road game of the season with 10 total tackles including a pair of solo.

► He also added another sacks and 1.5 tackles for loss.

### RANKING AGAINST THE NATION'S BEST

► **Quincy Ivory** ranks among the nation's best through the first three games of the season. He is ranked seventh in the nation in sacks, and second in the SWAC, with 1.00 per game. He ranks just behind Ckelby Givens of Southern [1.63] who has played four games.

► He also ranks fourth in tackles for loss and second in the SWAC.

### HAWKINS NAMED TO AENEAS WILLIAMS WATCH LIST AND SHOWS WHY

► The Oklahoma Sports Hall of Fame (OSHO) released the fourth annual Aeneas Williams Award Preseason Watch List that includes Jackson State senior defensive back **Shamar Hawkins** and 14 other of the nation's best defensive backs in Historically Black Colleges and Universities [HBCU] Division I football.

► He has shown why through the first two games with 14 total tackles including eight against Southern Miss.

► The preseason watch list is selected by a screening committee in partnership with DraftHBCUPlayers and the Paycom Jim Thorpe Award. This list is not final, and players who have outstanding seasons may be added to the semifinalists and finalists lists as the the season progresses.

► He was named to the list after a season in which he played in 14 games with five starts in the defensive backfield. The senior finished the year with 49 tackles, including 33 solo stops, while also recording 4.5 tackles for loss and three sacks. Hawkins intercepted a pair of passes and recorded one pass breakup. The senior recorded six or more tackles four times, including a career-high eight against UAPB [Nov. 2].

► The list includes Diego Addison [South Carolina State], Herman Brister III [Southern], Jadon Carter [Morgan State], Blake Davis [Grambling State], Wayne Favors III [Delaware State], Aaron Harris [North Carolina A&T], Johnny Harris III [Bethune-Cookman], Hawkins, Kahleef Jimmison [Norfolk State], Horacio Johnson [Southern], Keane Lewis [Alabama State], Twillie Lovette [Alabama State], Malcolm Reed [North Carolina Central], Jameel Sanders [Florida A&M], and Jarod Washington [South Carolina State].

► The Aeneas Williams Award is presented by the Chickasaw Nation and awarded to the best defensive back in Historically Black Colleges and Universities [HBCU] Division I college football based on performance on the field, athletic ability and character.

► This award was established in 2022 and serves as the first of its kind in HBCU history in honor of its namesake, Southern University walk-on and Pro Football Hall of Famer, Aeneas Williams. The contribution of HBCUs to the landscape of college football and the NFL has forever left an impact on the game. HBCUs hold an incredibly rich athletic tradition, tied to the game of football, that continues to exemplify the culture of these schools for over the past century.

### B.J. WASHINGTON BACK TO PREVIOUS FORM

► **B.J. Washington** looks to be back to his previous form before the 2023 injury through the first three games of this season.

► He has 23 total tackles and 0.5 tackle for loss in three games including nine tackles [four solo] and a pass breakup on the road against

Running back **Ahmad Miller** returns after missing the majority of the season after being injured early, and **Tyquan Henderson** [wide receiver] returns after suffering a season-ending injury at Bethune-Cookman.

WHAT'S IN A NAME? DON'T GET CONFUSED THIS SEASON

► There are three players on the 2025 Jackson State football roster but only two are related ... and they are two of the biggest players on the team. **Quaveon Davis** and **Xavion Davis** are related and attended Lewisville [Texas] High School and call Port St. Lucie [Fla.] home. Quaveon tips the scale at 6-8 and 330 pounds, while brother Xavion comes in at 6-4, 365 pounds. The non-related Davis is linebacker **Jamarion Davis** who comes in at 6-0, 200 pounds and calls Fort Pierce [Fla.] home.

► **Travis Terrell Jr.** and **Ethan Terrell** played in two different states with Travis playing in Atlanta [Ga.] at Creekside High School and Ethan at Lewisville (Texas) High School - alongside the Davis brothers.

► There are five different variations of Cam/Cameron/Kam this year including **Cameron James** [offensive line], **Cameron Onyebuagu** [wide receiver], **Camden Hardy** [defensive back], **Kam Sallis** [defensive back] and **Kam Evans** [linebacker].

► And don't forget about **Shamar Hawkins** [defensive back] and **Shemar Savage** [wide receiver].

THIRD & FOURTH DOWN CONVERSIONS STAND OUT FOR JACKSON STATE

► Jackson State ranks among the best, both offensively and defensively, in the nation in third-down conversions and fourth-down conversions through the first three games this season.

► Offensively, the Tigers rank 21st in third down conversions [0.455] and second in the SWAC; while leading the country in fourth-down conversions [1.000]. Meanwhile, defensively they rank 15th in third-down conversion defense [0.292] and first in the conference; while ranking 23rd in fourth-down conversion defense [0400] and fourth in the conference.

STREAKING TIGERS - A COUPLE STAND OUT

► Today marks the first game in October under head coach **T.C. Taylor**, however the Tigers are 6-1 in two years under Taylor.

► Jackson State has won its last 10 games against Southwestern Athletic Conference [SWAC] opponents dating back to last season, and have won its last 11 games against FCS competition.

# T.C. TAYLOR

**NAMED HEAD COACH OF HIS ALMA MATER IN 2023, TAYLOR QUICKLY LED JACKSON STATE TO ITS THIRD SWAC CHAMPIONSHIPS IN FOUR YEARS IN 2024. HE ALSO LED THE TEAM TO ITS FIRST CRICKET CELEBRATION BOWL CHAMPIONSHIPS AND THE HBCU NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP. TAYLOR WAS NAMED THE SWAC COACH OF THE YEAR BY HIS PEERS FOLLOWING THE SEASON.**

One of the most accomplished players in Jackson State football history, T.C. Taylor has risen to lead his alma mater as the 22nd Head Coach of the Tigers. A former JSU quarterback and record-setting wide receiver, Taylor officially took over the program following the 2022 Celebration Bowl and has quickly cemented his legacy as a transformative leader.

Taylor has been an integral part of Jackson State’s football resurgence since joining the staff in 2019. He coached tight ends and wide receivers during an era that saw the Tigers post a dominant 23-3 record from 2021–2022, including back-to-back Southwestern Athletic Conference [SWAC] titles and undefeated regular seasons.

In his second season as head coach in 2024, Taylor led the Tigers to a 12–2 record and captured the HBCU National Championship with a commanding 28–7 win over South Carolina State in the Cricket Celebration Bowl. Under his leadership, JSU claimed the SWAC East Division and SWAC Championship titles, with running back Irv Mulligan earning SWAC Offensive Player of the Year honors. That season, the Tigers produced 32 All-Conference selections (SWAC and Phil Steele), 15 All-Americans, and 8 postseason all-star participants. Taylor was named HBCU Legends Coach of the Year and earned widespread postseason recognition for his accomplishments.

Taylor’s teams have also stood out statistically. In 2024, JSU ranked top 10 nationally in several NCAA categories including red zone offense [2nd], team defense [4th], scoring offense [5th], and scoring defense [6th]. The Tigers finished the season ranked in over 30 key statistical categories, demonstrating elite performance on both sides of the ball.

In his debut season as head coach [2023], Taylor guided Jackson State to a second-place finish in the SWAC East Division. The Tigers led the conference in total offense [389.4 ypg] and finished top three in both rushing and passing, while also ranking among the SWAC’s best in total defense and scoring.

As an assistant coach, Taylor played a pivotal role in developing one of the most explosive wide receiver units in the conference. From 2021–2022, he coached standouts such as Malachi Wideman, Keith Corbin, Dallas Daniels, and Shane Hooks—several of whom earned All-SWAC and All-American honors. During the abbreviated Spring 2021 season, Daylen Baldwin led the SWAC in receiving yards [540] and touchdowns [7]. Prior to the 2022 season, Taylor was selected for the prestigious NFL Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship with the Tennessee Titans.

A native of McComb, Mississippi, Taylor enjoyed a stellar playing career at Jackson State from 1998 to 2001. After beginning as a quarterback, he transitioned to wide receiver, where he set the JSU single-season record with 84 receptions for 1,234 yards and 11 touchdowns in 2001. He earned NCAA Division I-AA Third-Team All-America honors from The Sports Network and First-Team Black College All-America recognition from Sheridan Broadcasting. He was also the runner-up for the 2001 Conerly Trophy, awarded to Mississippi’s top college football player, finishing behind Eli Manning.

Following his playing career at JSU, Taylor signed with the New England Patriots as a rookie free agent in 2002. He went on to win a World Bowl championship with the Frankfurt Galaxy in NFL Europe and participated in the 2003 preseason with the Detroit Lions before an injury ended his professional playing career.

Before returning to Jackson State, Taylor built a strong coaching résumé, including successful stints at:

- North Carolina Central [2014–2018] – Offensive Coordinator/QBs Coach. Guided the Eagles to three MEAC championships and the 2016 Celebration Bowl. Coached 28 All-MEAC players, five All-Americans, and helped QB Malcolm Bell become a finalist for Black College Football Player of the Year.
- Texas Southern [2012–2013] – Wide Receivers Coach & Recruiting Coordinator.
- Coahoma Community College [2005–2011] – Offensive Coordinator. His offenses consistently ranked in the top five among Mississippi JUCOs.

Taylor earned his bachelor’s degree in Health, Physical Education, and Recreation from Jackson State in 2005. He is married to his wife, Dawn, and they are the proud parents of two sons, Tre and Tylan.

**JACKSON, Miss.** | **Ahmad Miller** scored a pair of fourth quarter touchdowns and earned Offensive MVP honors in a 28-14 victory over Hampton at the Hope Labor Day Classic on Saturday extending the nation's longest streak to 11 games.

With the game tied at 14-all in the fourth quarter, Jackson State (1-0) used a 12-play, 82-yard drive to take a one-score lead on a two-yard from Miller. The Tigers got back on the board just 92 seconds later on a one-play drive ending with a 76-yard touchdown run by Miller to take a 28-14 lead with just four minutes remaining in the game. Miller finished the game 180 yards on just 12 carries and the two touchdowns. Hampton (0-1) took an early lead on a three-yard touchdown run for its only lead of the game, and tied the game in the fourth-quarter on a 30-yard touchdown pass.

**JaCobian Morgan** finished the day 15-of-30 for 143 yards, connecting with five different receivers on the afternoon. **Joanes Fortilien** led the way with five receptions (eight targets) for 43 yards, while **Nate Rembert** finished with four receptions (five targets) for 31 yards. **Ja'Naylon Dupree** added three receptions (six targets) for 41 yards, and **Jency Riley Jr.** returned after a season-ending injury last season to finish with two receptions for 21 yards.

Defensively, **Quincy Ivory** was named Defensive MVP after finishing with eight tackles, including four solo. He also finished with 3.5 tackles for loss, two sacks, and a forced fumble. Meanwhile, **B.J. Washington** finished with eight tackles, **Reid Pulliam** added seven tackles, **Shamar Hawkins** added six, and **Carmelo Jones** finished with five in the win.

**Donovan Warren** punted the ball seven times, averaging 41.7 yards per punt.

**JACKSON, Miss.** | Jackson State used a dominant defensive effort to get back on track with a 30-0 victory over Tuskegee in the W.C. Gorden Classic on Saturday at Veterans Memorial Stadium, the first shutout since Oct. 29, 2022 for the Tigers.

Jackson State (2-1) allowed Tuskegee to cross the 50-yard line just two times, one ending with a punt in the first and the second a blocked field goal by **Kazarius Bowie** to keep the shutout intact. They Tigers held Tuskegee (2-1) to 24 yards rushing on 20 carries - an average of 1.2 yards per carry - and seven total first downs. They also held the Golden Tigers to 85 yards passing, and just 109 yards of total offense on 40 plays on the afternoon.

**Quincy Ivory** led four players with five-plus tackles on the day with seven and two tackles for loss, while Defensive MVP **J'Cori Hargon** finished with six total tackles and a tackle for loss earning the start. **Reid Pulliam** and **Kam Sallis** each recorded five tackles in the win.

Meanwhile, Offensive MVP **Jared Lockhart** made his debut for Jackson State with his first collegiate start, accounting for three touchdowns. The freshman finished 15-of-21 for 254 yards and a touchdowns, throwing one interception and being sacked just once. He also ran 12 times for 44 yards and a pair of touchdowns on the day, before **Parker Stofa** came in and recording his first career touchdown.

**Ahmad Miller** led Jackson State with 69 yards rushing on eight carries, while **Donerio Davenport** added 58 yards on nine carries and **Travis Terrell Jr.** 51 yards on six carries. **Kobe Paul** led Jackson State with 75 yards receiving on five receptions, and **Jameel Gardner Jr.** added four receptions for 85 yards. **Ja'Naylon Dupree** hauled in a pair of receptions for 57 yards for a Jackson State team that finished with 522 yards of total offense on 72 total plays. The Tigers finished with 266 yards rushing on 50 carries - averaging 5.3 yards per carry - and passed for 256 yards.

**BATON ROUGE, La.** | Jackson State went over the 500-yard mark of total offense in its Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) opener, a 38-13 victory over Southern at A.W. Mumford Stadium on Saturday night.

Jackson State (3-1, 1-0 SWAC), winners of its last 11 games against conference competition dating back to last season, piled up 538 total yards of offense with 197 yards rushing and 337 yards passing in the win. **JaCobian Morgan** led Jackson State offensively with 337 yards on 21-of-32 passing with two touchdowns, hitting three receivers for 90-plus yards including **Nate Rembert** for 102 yards on five receptions with one touchdown - an 82-yard fourth quarter touchdown. **Jameel Gardner Jr.** finished with 96 yards on seven receptions, and **Ja'Naylon Dupree** finished with 93 yards on five receptions for Jackson State.

**Ahmad Miller** led the rushing attack with 101 yards on 14 carries, his second game over 100 yards this season; while **Travis Terrell Jr.** finished 55 yards on 11 carries and a touchdown. Meanwhile, **Donerio Davenport** scored a pair of touchdowns for the Tigers. Jackson State fell behind early to Southern after a muffed punt in the first quarter before scoring the game's first touchdown late in the first to take the lead. After Southern took a 13-10 lead with five minutes to play, Jackson State used a 51-yard touchdown reception from Dupree to take the lead (17-13) with just five seconds remaining in the first half and never looked back. **Ashton Taylor** led the defense with seven tackles including six solo with a sack and tackle for loss, while **Jeremiah Williams** finished with five. **Kam Sallis** finished with five tackles and an interception, while **Quincy Ivory** recorded a sack.
