- ◆ Alabama A&M and Tennessee State meet in The Legacy Series for the second consecutive season
- ◆ Alabama A&M is seeking its second straight victory over Tennessee State
- ◆ The Bulldogs are looking to remain unbeaten at home
- ◆ Tennessee State is seeking its first win of the season after losses to Jackson State and Georgia
- ◆ The Tigers will be playing their second of three SWAC opponents this season (Jackson State, Alabama A&M and Florida A&M)

RUN GAME

- ◆ Alabama A&M looks to repeat the ground game output after Saturday's game against Miles
- ◆ The Bulldogs had more than 400 yards of offense against the Golden Bears, with nearly 300 coming on the ground
- ◆ Troy Bruce made an immediate impact, rushing for 145 yards on just 11 carries, averaging 13.2 yards per touch
- ◆ Troy Bruce was selected the SWAC TV Gatorade Player of the Game after the win over Miles

- ◆ Alabama A&M will play in five Classic games this season - The MEAC/SWAC Challenge, The Louis Crews Classic, The Legacy Series, The Gulf Coast Challenge and The Magic City Classic
- ◆ The Bulldogs were 2-2 in Classic games during the 2025 season, with victories in The Louis Crews Classic against Alcorn State and The Legacy Series against Tennessee State

SERIES HISTORY

- ◆ The game will mark the 25th time the two teams will meet
- ◆ Tennessee State is 15-9 all-time in the series, which dates back to 1973
- ◆ The Bulldogs are 7-3 in the last 10 meetings against the Tigers
- ◆ The two programs return to the series after a 15-year hiatus in 2025 with AAMU picking up a 23-21 victory in Nashville

PRACTICES

During a typical Saturday game week, media may interview players and coaches immediately following practice on Tuesday. Practice is generally closed to the public. Anyone hoping to observe practice should contact AAMU Athletics Communications in advance. Failure to do so may result in an individual's removal from the venue. During regular season practices, unless otherwise noted, still and television photographers will be allowed to shoot stretching and select periods.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

All media members will be provided with access to game notes via aamusports.com. At the quarter breaks and halftime, quickie stats will be printed and distributed. Following the game, a complete postgame statistics package will be distributed via email and will contain a scoring summary, final team statistics, final individual statistics, complete play-by-play, drive charts for both halves, halftime statistics, defensive statistics and substitution chart.

LIVE STATS

Live in-game statistics will be available via Sidearm Sports.

INTERNET

Wireless Internet is available in the press box at Louis Crews Stadium. Members of the Athletics Communications staff will be available to assist you. There is no access fee.

WEEKLY MEDIA AVAILABILITY

Head Coach Sam Shade will be available to the media every Monday at 10:30 a.m. CT during the season with the exception of AAMU's bye week.

Players will be made available at the discretion of the coaching staff.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Requests for official working media credentials should be directed to the AAMU Athletics Communications Office. All requests should be received no later than noon, four days prior to the game. Visit the media page at aamusports.com to request credentials online.

Traditional media (newspapers, radio and television) are credible and consider standard media and will be approved. Those covering the Bulldogs through various other outlets (podcasts, facebook, instagram and youtube) are not acceptable forms of media and their credential requests will be denied.

Season credentials will be available for pick-up prior to the first game. Credentials may be picked up on gameday at the media will call located at Louis Crews Stadium.

On gameday, media should park on the East Side of Louis Crews Stadium and enter through Gate B.

SCOUTING PASSES

Professional scouts may obtain credentials through AAMU's Athletics Communications Office. Scouts will be issued seating in the press box on a space-available basis.

SIDELINE PASSES

Alabama A&M University follows NCAA guidelines regarding media representatives on the sidelines. Photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot between the 20-yard lines and the goal lines on both sidelines and behind the restraining line in the end zone.

When referring to Alabama A&M University, please only use the terms **ALABAMA A&M** or **AAMU**. Please refrain from acronyms of the name **A&M**, **Bama A&M** or **AAM**. In addition, Alabama A&M plays in the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC).

Each week during the regular season, the SWAC will name an offensive, defensive, newcomer and special teams player of the week.

HISTORY AT A GLANCE

In 1920, athletic officials from six Texas HBCUs – C.H. Fuller of Bishop College, Red Randolph and C.H. Patterson of Paul Quinn College, E.G. Evans, H.J. Evans and H.J. Starns of Prairie View A&M, D.C. Fuller of Texas College and G. Whitte Jordan of Wiley College – met in Houston, Texas, to discuss common interests. At this meeting, they agreed to form a new league, the SWAC.

Paul Quinn became the first of the original members to withdraw from the league when it did so in 1929. When Langston University of Oklahoma was admitted into the conference two years later, it began the migration of state-supported institutions into the SWAC. Southern University entered the ranks in 1934, followed by Arkansas AM&N (now the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff) in 1936 and Texas Southern University in 1954.

Rapid growth in enrollment of the state-supported schools made it difficult for the church-supported schools to finance their athletics programs and one by one they fell victim to the growing prowess of the state-supported colleges. Bishop withdrew from the conference in 1956, Langston in 1957 and Huston-Tillotson (formerly Samuel Huston) in 1959, one year after the admittance of two more state-supported schools: Grambling College and Jackson State College.

The enter-exit cycle continued in 1961 when Texas College withdrew, followed by the admittance of Alcorn A&M (now Alcorn State University) in 1962. Wiley left in 1968, the same year Mississippi Valley State College entered. Arkansas AM&N exited in 1970 and Alabama State University entered in 1982.

Arkansas-Pine Bluff (formerly Arkansas AM&N) rejoined the SWAC on July 1, 1997, regaining full-member status one year later. Alabama A&M University became the conference's tenth member when it became a full member in September, 1999 after a one year period as an affiliate SWAC member. Most of the former SWAC members that have left the conference are currently a part of the Red River Athletic Conference of the NAIA.

Current championship competition offered by the SWAC includes competition for men in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor track, outdoor track & field and tennis. Women's competition is offered in the sports of basketball, bowling, cross country, golf, indoor track, outdoor track & field, soccer, softball, tennis and volleyball.

- To maintain fiscal management; and
- To legislate through Bylaws or Resolutions on subjects of general concern to the membership.

The members of the conference are committed to the philosophy of maintaining intercollegiate athletics as an integral part of the overall educational program. To this end, the conference believes in and subscribes to the fundamental principles of amateurism, institutional control, sound academic standards, financial aid, recruiting, and ethical conduct that governs intercollegiate athletics, and the enforcement of rules and regulations as adopted by the National Collegiate Athletic Association.

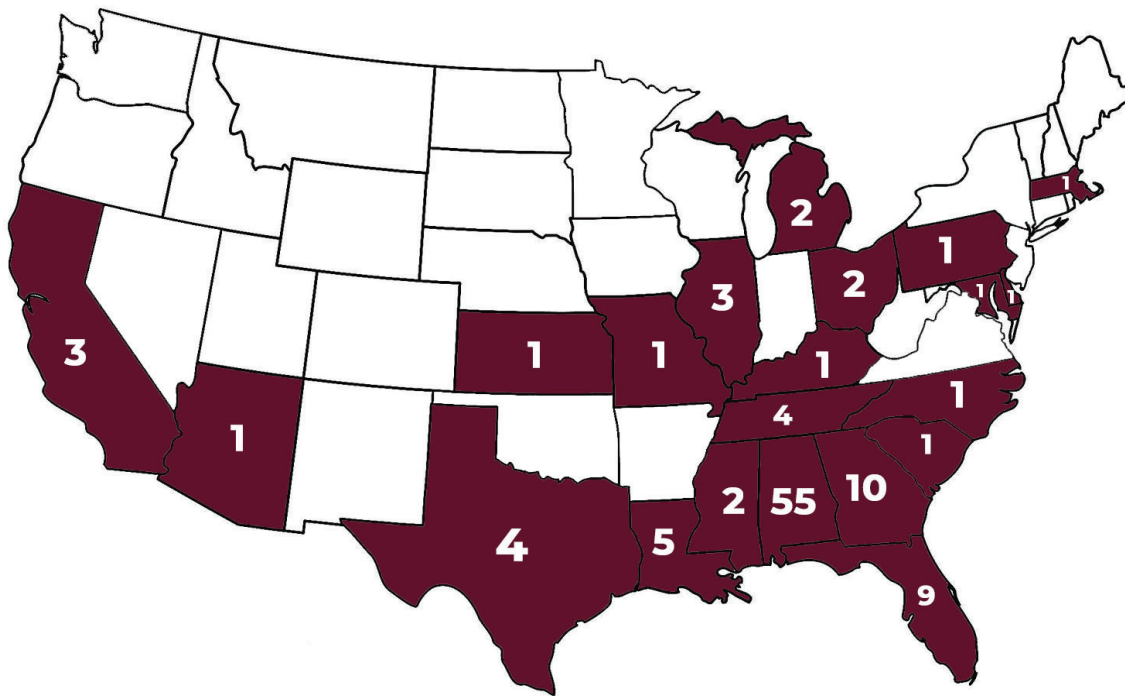

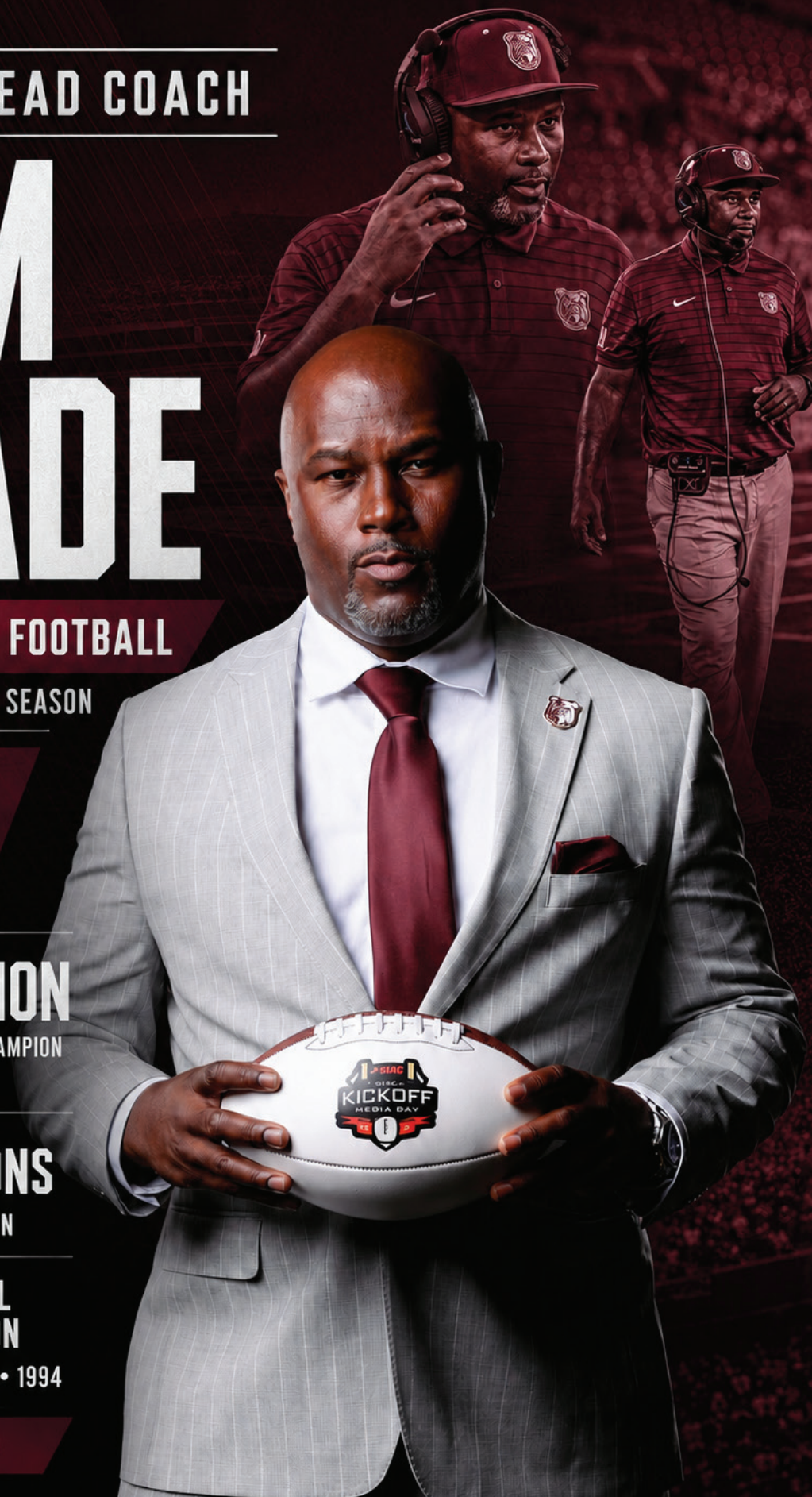

Sam Shade begins his second season as the head football coach at Alabama A&M University.

In his first season at Alabama A&M, Shade's team started strong after the season-opening loss to Arkansas. The Bulldogs reeled off victories over Alcorn State, Tennessee State and Lane to begin his first season 3-1. However, AAMU struggled the rest of the way, going 1-7 over the final eight games to finish 4-8 overall and 1-7 in Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) play.

Before coming to The Hill, Shade spent three seasons as the head coach at Miles College where he compiled an 18-15 overall record and a 15-7 mark inside the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC). In addition, his 2024 team won the conference title and reached the second round of the NCAA Division II playoffs, falling to top-ranked Valdosta State in the second round.

In 2023, the Golden Bears finished 7-3 overall, 6-2 in the SIAC. The season included the program's first win over Division I FCS opponent Alabama State and a 9.2 average margin of victory. It was a marked improvement over his first season in Fairfield, where Miles went 1-9 overall, 1-5 in the SIAC Western Division.

Shade came to Miles after spending two years as head football coach at Pinson Valley High School, where he won an Alabama High School Athletic Association Class 6A state championship in his first season in 2020.

Prior to coaching, Shade played eight years in the NFL for the Cincinnati Bengals (1995-98) and Washington Redskins

(1999-02). He was the Bengals' leading tackler in 1997 while ranking second on the team in 1998, and then he led the Redskins in 1999.

During his NFL career, his defensive coordinators included NFL Hall of Fame coach Dick LeBeau as well as Mike Nolan, Ray Rhodes and Marvin Lewis. In April 2000, Shade received the Redskins' Unsung Hero Award for commitment and community service involvement.

Shade played collegiately at Alabama, where he was a member of the Crimson Tide's 1992 national championship team and was named a team captain as a senior in 1994. He was selected by the Bengals in the fourth round of the 1995 NFL Draft.

Following his retirement from the NFL, Shade began his coaching career as a volunteer coach at Briarwood Christian School in Birmingham, Ala., from 2004-08 before spending eight years at Samford, coaching the secondary and special teams. He would then move to Georgia State, where he coached cornerback. His career would send him back to the NFL as an assistant special teams coach for the Cleveland Browns before returning home to coach at Pinson Valley.

Shade is a Birmingham native who attended Wenonah High School, where he was the recipient of the prestigious Bryant Jordan Scholar Athlete Award, given to the state's top student-athlete. He earned his bachelor's degree from Alabama in business administration and finance.

He and his wife Jacquetta have four children: sons Justin and Jacoby, and daughters Jaila and Jamya.
