QUICK HITS

- » ACU was unsuccessful on a pair of early 4th-and-goal situations at Tulsa, and lost 35-7. ACU was 5-of-15 on third downs, and 1-of-4 on fourth downs. TU converted 8-of-19 third downs and was 4-for-4 on fourth downs.
- » ACU trailed 10-0 at halftime against Tulsa, which is the first time in Keith Patterson's 37-game era the Wildcats were shut out in a first half.
- » The Wildcats remain ranked No. 16 in the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 this week. They have been nationally ranked for 14 straight weeks.
- » This game between ACU and SFA is one of just two Top 25 FCS matchups this week. The other game is No. 2 South Dakota State at No. 3 Montana State on Saturday at 7 p.m.
- » ACU is coming off the best season of its Division I era (since 2013). The Wildcats earned their first conference title since 2010, and won their first FCS playoff game.
- » QB Stone Earle made his return start at ACU last week at Tulsa. Earle began his college career at ACU (2020-21) and played in 9 games over two seasons. He then transferred to UNT (2022-23) and Marshall (2024). Earle returned to ACU in January.
- » Saturday is the ACU home debut of new OC Graham Harrell, who has spent the past 9 seasons as an OC of FBS programs. Harrell's brother played at ACU, and his parents are also ACU graduates.
- » Today's game vs. SFA was originally scheduled for Week 3, but was flipped when TCU's opener at North Carolina was moved to Monday for a national TV audience.

- » Prevent an 0-2 start which has not happened since the COVID season of 2020. The other 0-2 starts of the Div. I era were in 2014, 2016, and 2017.

LAST TIME OUT

- ACU had two great chances to take an early lead at Tulsa, but came up short on 4th-and-goal on back-to-back drives. Both times QB Stone Earle kept the ball, but was unable to cross the goalline.
- Following those two drives, ACU's offense struggled with five punts on four 3-and-outs.
- The Wildcats' final drive found the endzone with an 11-yard run by Earle on 4th and 2.
- Excluding the 5 sacks on Earle, he ran the ball well. On his 12 designed carries, Earle gained 75 yards.
- Redshirt junior LB Rashon Myles, Jr., made his first career start and led ACU with 11 tackles.

TOP 25 MATCHUP

- ACU is 6-10 all-time as an FCS program against Top 25 opponents, including a 3-5 mark at Wildcat Stadium (opened in 2017).
- The Wildcats went 3-2 vs. Top 25 teams in 2024, including a win vs. No. 5 Central Arkansas which was ACU's highest ranked victory since 2009 in the program's Div. II era.
- ACU entered the national rankings in week 2 of 2024 after narrowly losing to Texas Tech in overtime. The Wildcats have not dropped out of the Top 25 since (14 consecutive weeks).
- More ranked opponents loom on ACU's schedule this year with UIW, Tarleton State, and Southern Utah currently in the Top 25 of one or both of the major FCS polls. Austin Peay, Central Arkansas, West Georgia and Eastern Kentucky all received votes for a national poll this week.

HISTORIC 2024 SEASON

- The 2024 season was ACU's best season in 15 years, and its best of the Division I era.
- The Wildcats won the United Athletic Conference, and were awarded a home game in the first round of the FCS Playoffs where they defeated Northern Arizona, 24-0.
- In round two, ACU led at North Dakota State 17-3 in the second quarter, before losing to the eventual national champions.
- ACU last won a conference title in 2010 (Lone

Star Conference, NCAA Division II), and last earned a postseason victory in 2008 -- a record-shattering 93-68 win vs. West Texas A&M.

NEW YEAR, NEW OC

- ACU has a new offensive coordinator for the fifth straight season as West Texas legend Graham Harrell was hired in January.
- Harrell was a star QB at Texas Tech, and will be inducted into the Tech Ring of Honor on Oct. 25 during ACU's open week.
- He will also be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame on Dec. 9.
- After his NFL career, Harrell began coaching in college.
- He spent the past 9 seasons as an OC at the FBS level at UNT, USC, West Virginia, and Purdue (2016-2024).

HARRELL'S ACU ROOTS

- While Harrell attended Texas Tech, nearly all of his family went to ACU. His parents, Sam ('79) and Kathy ('80), and youngest brother, Clark ('11), all graduated from ACU. Sam and Clark both played football for the Wildcats.
- Sam Harrell was inducted into the Big Country Athletic Hall of Fame in 2024, and is part of the ACU Sports Hall of Fame class of 2025 as a Lifetime Achievement Award recipient. ACU's Hall of Fame induction is Oct. 31.

WHERE THERE'S A WILL

- Will Shaffer has become the face of the ACU football program with his outstanding play in 2024 resulting in All-America honors from four different media outlets.
- Shaffer has been named to the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List, which goes to the top FCS defensive player.
- He also volunteers with All Kind Animal Initiative, which operates Abilene's animal shelter.

ROLLING STONE ROLLS BACK TO ABILENE

- Starting QB Stone Earle returned to ACU in January after spending two seasons at UNT and one year at Marshall.
- Earle played at ACU during his first two col-

lege seasons in 2020 and 2021.

- In 2020, he played much of the finale at Virginia, and then grabbed the starting job for the following season.
- Earle started the first 7 games of 2021 before an injury took him out. He returned to start one more game that season. He threw for 1,216 yards, 13 TD and just 4 INT.
- This year, Earle beat out BYU transfer Cade Fennegan, and three-year ACU letterman Quayde Hawkins during fall camp.

RUNNING BACK STABLE

- HC Keith Patterson said during fall camp he would not blink an eye no matter which of ACU's five running backs enter the game.
- Jordon Vaughn and Rovaughn Banks, Jr. are returning players, while B.K. Jackson (East Texas A&M), E.J. Wilson (Temple), and La'James White (Kansas State) transferred in.
- Vaughn, a tall, powerful runner, had 19 carries for 94 yards last year. Banks, who is smaller and faster, was injured for part of the 2024 season and ran for 125 yards with 2 TD.

THE PORTAL GIVETH, & THE PORTAL TAKETH

- Although ACU lost some of its best players to FBS programs in the transfer portal, the Wildcats have restocked with 25 FBS transfers.
- Four of those transfers come from Texas Tech, meaning they saw ACU nearly upset the Red Raiders last season (DB Javeon Wilcox; DB Sammy Morris IV; DL Isaiah Crawford; and OL Kaden Carr).
- Seven other players transferred from fellow FCS schools, or Division II or JUCO programs.
- After the 2023 season, ACU only had two players transfer to the FBS level.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

- ACU's four team captains were elected by their teammates and announced at a team dinner in late August.
- LB Will Shaffer, DL Kaghen Roach and TE Jed Castles were far-and-away the highest vote-getters. DB T.J. Marshall was the fourth team captain selected by his peers.
- Marshall transferred to ACU in 2022 and has

played in 30 games, mostly on special teams.

- HC Keith Patterson was a two-time captain when he played at East Central University (Okla.). In a speech to his players, he called it the highest honor of his athletic career.

MEN OF TROY

- ACU's two coordinators -- OC Graham Harrell and DC Nick Holt -- each held the same positions at USC, one of the most storied programs in college football.
- Harrell was the Trojans' OC from 2019-21 and helped them reach the Pac-12 Championship Game in 2020.
- Holt had two stints coaching at USC, and was the DC from 2006-08 where the Trojans had incredible success. USC went 34-5 over the three years with three consecutive Rose Bowl victories.

PRESEASON UAC POLL

- The Wildcats were picked to finish 2nd in the Preseason UAC Coaches Poll.
- Tarleton State is the league favorite, according to the poll. TSU received eight first-place votes, while ACU received the one remaining.
- ACU was picked 6th in the 2024 preseason poll, and defeated each of the five teams picked ahead of them on their way to winning the UAC title with a 7-1 conference record.

PRESEASON ALL-UAC

- Four ACU players were named Preseason All-UAC as voted upon by the league's coaches.
- LB Will Shaffer was picked as the Preseason UAC Defensive Player of the Year. Shaffer led the UAC with 123 tackles last season.
- TE Jed Castles, DL/LB Chris Wright, and DB Dorian Plumley were also named Preseason All-UAC selections.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA

- Will Shaffer (1st Team) and Kaghen Roach (3rd Team) were both named preseason all-America by Stats Perform FCS & FCS Football Central.
- The pair combined for 19.5 TFL and 5 sacks in 2024.

UNITED ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

HISTORY OF THE UAC

- In 2021, the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) and Atlantic Sun Conference (ASUN) first joined forces.
- The alliance allowed the seven football teams - three ASUN and four WAC members - to have an automatic qualifier (AQ) spot into the FCS Playoffs for the champion of the combined leagues.
- Initially known as the ASUN-WAC Challenge, the alliance was re-branded as the United Athletic Conference before the 2023 season.
- In 2025, the UAC has the same nine members for the second consecutive year - five from the ASUN and four from the WAC.
- In 2026, the WAC will rebrand as the UAC for all sports and include the current UAC members except for Utah Tech and Southern Utah who are moving to the Big West Conference.

HIGH FIVE

- Four Wildcats were named to the Preseason All-United Athletic Conference teams -- led by Preseason Defensive Player of the Year LB Will Shaffer, who was unanimously voted for the award.
- TE Jed Castles, DL/LB Chris Wright, and DB Dorian Plumley were also named Preseason All-UAC.




