#### AKRON TO FACE FLORIDA ATLANTIC IN BOCA RATON BOWL

Akron will face Florida Atlantic in the Cheribundi Tart Cherry Boca Raton Bowl on Tuesday, Dec. 19, at 7 p.m. at FAU Stadium.

ESPN will televise the game with **Clay Matvick** (play-by-play), **Kirk Morrison** (analyst), and **Cole Cubelic** (sideline) calling the game.

The Zips' radio broadcast will air on the Akron-IMG Sports Network [SportsRadio 1350 AM (WARF) in Akron (flagship), 1420 WHK in Cleveland, 1440 WHKZ in Warren/Youngstown] with **Steve French** calling the action, **Brad Detwiler** providing analysis, and **Joe Dunn** with sideline report. The pregame show starts one hour prior to kickoff. A free audio stream is available at SportsRadio1350.com, iHeart Radio, and TuneIn.com/Akron Zips.

ESPN Radio will also provide a national broadcast with **Steve Levy** (play-by-play), **Desmond Howard** (analyst), and **Paul Carcaterra** (sideline) calling the game.

Under the guidance of sixth-year head coach **Terry Bowden**, Akron stands 7-6 overall following a 45-28 loss to Toledo in the MAC Championship game on Dec. 2. UA returns 57 lettermen, including 15 starters. The Zips utilize a spread offense and a 4-3 defense.

Senior RB **Manny Morgan** (Naples, Fla.) is the team's leading rusher with 393 yards and four touchdowns on 99 carries. Under center, redshirt freshman **Kato Nelson** (Hollywood, Fla.) is 61-of-125 for 909 yards and eight touchdowns. Redshirt senior WR **Tra'Von Chapman** (Cincinnati, Ohio) is the top receiver with 50 receptions for 456 yards and two touchdowns. Defensively, junior LB **Ulysees Gilbert III** (Ocala, Fla.) leads the Zips with 128 tackles, five sacks, five hurries, four break-ups, three interceptions, and a fumble recovery. Junior WR **Kwadarrius Smith** (Orlando, Fla.) is the Zips' scoring leader with seven touchdowns for 42 points.

# GAME 14 at FAU | BOCA RATON BOWL

In the NCAA stats, Akron is No. 2 in interceptions (19), No. 7 in defensive touchdowns (4), No. 16 in turnover margin (0.77), and No. 25 in red zone defense (0.776). Individually, junior DB Jordan George (Dayton, Ohio) is No. 8 in interceptions (5), while junior LB Ulysees Gilbert III is ranked No. 18 in total tackles (9.8). Junior WR **Kwadarrius Smith** is No. 10 in yards per reception (21.35).

#### **AKRON'S BOWL HISTORY**

Since jumping to Division I-A (FBS) in 1987, the Zips have made just two prior bowl appearances. The 2005 squad, under head coach J.D Brookhart, won the 2005 Mid-American Conference championship (with a 31-30 victory over Northern Illinois) and advanced to the Motor City Bowl at Ford Field in Detroit. The Zips, who finished the season at 7-6 overall (5-3 MAC, East Division champions), fell to Memphis 38-31 on Dec. 26, 2005.

In 2015, under head coach **Terry Bowden**, Akron made its second bowl appearance and captured its first FBS bowl victory with a 23-21 win over Utah State in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

Prior to 1987, the Zips played Division I-AA (from 1980 to 1986) and Division II (from 1974 to 1979) football. Additional postseason play included the 1968 Grantland Rice Bowl [Louisiana Tech 33, Akron 13], the 1976 Division II Playoffs [Akron 27, UNLV 6], Knute Rockne Bowl [Akron 29, Northern Michigan 26 (ot)], Pioneer Bowl [Montana State 24, Akron 13]; and the 1985 Division I-AA Playoffs [Rhode Island 35, Akron 27].

#### **SCOUTING FLORIDA ATLANTIC**

The Owls, under the guidance of first-year head coach **Lane Kiffin**, stand 10-3 overall after a 41-17 win over North Texas in the Conference USA Championship game on Dec. 2. FAU went a perfect 8-0 in conference play. Florida Atlantic returns 31 letterwinners, including 16 starters, to its up tempo offensive and multiple defensive schemes.

Sophomore RB **Devin Singletary** is FAU's top rusher with 1,796 yards and the national leader with 29 touchdowns on 275 carries. Junior QB Jason Driskel is 166-of-253 for 1,977 yards and 13 touchdowns. Freshman WR Willie Wright is the top receiver with 586 yards and four touchdowns on 49 receptions. Defensively, junior LB Azeez Al-Shaair has 134 tackles, 8.5 TFL, four break-ups, four hurries, and a forced fumble.

In the NCAA stats, Florida Atlantic No. 1 in interceptions (20), No. 6 in rushing offense (283.2), No. 7 in turnover margin (1.00), No. 9 in first downs (311), No. 9 in red zone offense (0.932), and No. 9 in scoring offense (39.8). Sophomore RB Devin Singletary is No. 1 in rushing touchdowns (29) and scoring (13.8), No. 4 in rushing yards (1,796), and No. 4 in rushing yards per game (138.2). Junior S **Jalen Young** is No. 1 in total interceptions (7) and No. 3 in interceptions per game (0.5).

#### **OPPONENT BOWL HISTORY**

The Owls are making their third bowl appearance in their 17-year history. FAU played in the 2007 New Orleans Bowl [W, 44-27 vs. Memphis], the first year the Owls were eligible to participate in an FBS bowl, and in the 2008 Motor City Bowl [W, 24-21 vs. Central Michigan]. FAU is 2-0 in bowl play.

#### **AKRON-FAU CONNECTIONS**

Akron has 29 players from the state of Florida, including 12 from the greater South Florida area that were high school teammates with some of the Owls.

Florida Atlantic has no players from the state of Ohio.

#### **AKRON AGAINST CONFERENCE USA**

Over the years, Akron has faced six teams from Conference USA. Since Division I FBS play began in 1987, Akron is 5-9 against C-USA teams. The most recent contest was Akron's 65-38 win at Marshall on Sept. 17, 2016.

#### **AKRON STAFF IS BOWL EXPERIENCED**

Strolling the Akron sidelines this fall is a very experienced coaching staff. Led by sixth-year head coach **Terry Bowden**, the Zips' coaching staff boasts 143 combined bowl appearances, including 34 bowl appearances by defensive coordinator Chuck Amato alone. All of the Zips' coaches are former college football players.

#### **FOUR ZIPS EARN ALL-MAC HONORS**

Four Akron football players earned Mid-American Conference honors for 2017. Earning first-team All-MAC recognition for the second consecutive year was junior LB **Ulysees Gilbert III**. Sophomore DB **Alvin Davis, Jr.** (Fort Lauderdale, Fla.) garnered second-team All-MAC honors. Redshirt senior WR **Tra'Von Chapman** and redshirt junior DE **Jamal Davis II** (Canton, Ohio) were third-team All-MAC honorees.

RB **Warren Ball** earned a master's degree in education/sport science.

Six Zips started the season with their bachelor's degrees in hand already: RB **Warren Ball** (sports industry), WR **Tra'Von Chapman** (sport management), OL **Nick Fazio** (mechanical engineering), LB **Andrew Hauser** (sport management), QB **Robbie Kelley** (business management), and TE **Mykel Traylor-Bennett** (organizational supervision). Coney, OL Stephen Ericksen, OL LaVonne Gauthney, P/K Zach Gingerich, WR Kevin Gladney, LS Hayden Grover, S Zach Guiser, LB Andrew Hauser, CB Mikee Hayes, LB Tony Jones, DE Michael Kish, OL Jovann Letuli, OL Cedric McCoy, DE Deon'Tae Moore, RB Manny Morgan, OL Xavier Quigley, WR Austin Wolf, QB Thomas Woodson, and WR Anthony Young.

This is the second five-year graduating class to play under head coach **Terry Bowden** at Akron. During their collegiate careers, they've been a part of the re-building process, helping the Zips to at least five wins each of the last four seasons. The 2017 seniors may become just the second class to graduate with a winning record in FBS play. They currently stand 25-24 over the last three-plus season [2014: 5-7; 2015: 8-5, 2016: 5-7; 2017: 7-5]. Four of the seniors have already earned their undergraduate degrees and are pursuing master's degrees.

The Zips became bowl eligible for the second time in three seasons, a program first. With the win over Kent State, the Zips claimed their third MAC East title and their first since 2005, as well a third consecutive Wagon Wheel victory.

Individually, the Zips have re-written the record books and climbed the career charts while racking up weekly honors. Off the field, they've represented UA in the community with several activities, including game week visits to Akron Children's Hospital. Congratulations, Seniors!

#### LAST GAME

The University of Akron football team could not overcome a 28-0 halftime deficit and fell to Toledo, 45-28, in the 2017 Mid-American Conference championship game before 16,225 fans on Dec. 2 at Ford Field.

For the Zips, Nelson went 8-of-18 for 177 yards and two touchdowns, while Woodson was 5-of-14 for 35 yards. Smith led the receivers with 114 yards and a touchdown on three receptions, while Morgan led the rushing efforts with 51 yards and a touchdown on 11 carries. Gilbert and George led Akron with 10 tackles apiece.

For the Rockets, Woodside, the Player of the Game, went 23-of-37 for 307 yards and four touchdowns.

   The Zips stand 1-3 overall at Ford Field (1-1 in MAC Championship games, 0-1 in 2005 bowl game).
- Redshirt freshman QB Kato Nelson started the game. He went 8-of-18 for 177 yards and two
  touchdowns.
- Junior DB Jordan George (Dayton, Ohio) intercepted the ball in the fourth quarter, leading to
  a UA touchdown on the very next play. It was George's sixth interception of his career and his
  fifth this season.
- Redshirt junior QB **Robbie Kelley** (Springfield, III.) threw a five-yard touchdown pass in the fourth guarter, his second as a Zip.

#### THE ZIPS ARE UNDEFEATED

This season, Akron has an undefeated record in games when leading at the half (7-0), when scoring 30+ points (4-0), in games decided by 3 points of less (2-0), when holding the opponent to nine points or less (2-0). The Zips are also undefeated when wearing blue jerseys (5-0) and gold helmets (2-0). Conversely, Akron has not won a game when trailing at the half (0-6).

#### **BANQUET HONORS**

Prior to departing for the 2017 Cheribundi Tart Cherry Boca Raton Bowl this week, the University of Akron football program celebrated the 2017 season with its annual awards banquet on Dec. 10 at Quaker Station in downtown Akron.

Senior WR **A.J. Coney** (Orlando, Fla.) was named the outstanding offensive performer and special teams player of the year, while junior LB **Ulysees Gilbert III** was named the outstanding defensive performer for the second consecutive season.

Junior P **Nick Gasser** (Liberty Township, Ohio) was selected as the special teams player of the year.

Seniors Coney, RB **Warren Ball**, and S **Zach Guiser**, who were selected as team captains for the 2017 season by their teammates, earned the coaches' captain's award.

#### **SEASON-ENDING INJURIES**

Senior TE/WR **Mykel Traylor-Bennett** suffered a knee injury in the spring game and missed action this fall. He plans to return next season.

- The players elected seniors RB **Warren Ball,** WR **A.J. Coney**, and S **Zach Guiser** as team captains for the 2017 season.
- Six of Akron's 2017 opponents Penn State (Rose), Troy (Dollar General), Western Michigan (Cotton), Toledo (Camelia), Miami (St. Petersburg), and Ohio (Dollar General) participated in bowls in 2016.
- Seven of Akron's 2017 opponents—Penn State (Fiesta), Iowa State (Liberty), Troy (New Orleans), Western Michigan, Toledo (Dollar General), Ohio (Bahamas), and Buffalo—were bowl eligible this fall.

# **OFFENSE**

#### **NELSON TAKES OVER AT QUARTERBACK**

Three-star recruit **Kato Nelson** (Hollywood, Fla.) redshirted last year while learning under three-year starter Thomas Woodson. At No. 6 Penn State, Nelson saw action in the second half. He went 1-of-2 for 11 yards while leading all Zips in rushing with 39 yards on nine carries. In the 52-3 win over Arkansas Pine Bluff, Nelson was 1-of-3 for six yards. Against lowa State, he went 2-for-4 for 53 yards while rushing for eight yards. In the MAC win at Bowling Green, Nelson went 1-for-1 for 15 yards and rushed for 27 yards. In the win over Ball State, he was 1-of-1 for 38 yards while rushing for 11 yards. In his first collegiate start at Miami, Nelson went 19-of-38 for 218 yards and a touchdown. He also rushed for 12 yards and a touchdown. Both touchdowns were career firsts. In his second career start in as many weeks, Nelson went 22-of-38 for a career-high 322 yards and career-best four touchdowns while guiding the Zips to a 37-34 win over Ohio to stay atop the MAC East standings. In the 24-14 win over Kent State, Nelson went 6-of-20 for 69 yards and a 25-yard touchdown pass while guiding the Zips to the MAC East title. In the MAC Championship game against Toledo, Nelson started the game. He went 8-of-18 for 177 yards and two touchdowns.

In nine games, Nelson is 61-of-125 for 909 yards and eight touchdowns. He has rushed 81 times for 177 yards and a touchdown.

Senior QB **Thomas Woodson** returned to lead the Zips for the fourth consecutive season following off-season shoulder surgery. He started the first nine games before Nelson took over. In the season opener at No. 6 Penn State, Woodson went 12-of-23 for 71 yards. With his 71 yards, Woodson moved up to No. 4 on UA's career chart in passing yards, surpassing Kyle Pohl (5,128 yards). He is also No. 3 in career passing TDs (39). In the 52-3 win over Arkansas Pine Bluff, Woodson went 15-of-20 for 166 yards and a touchdown. He also rushed for 16 yards. Against lowa State, he went 25-of-40 for 240 yards and two touchdowns. With his two passing TDs, Woodson moved into second place on Akron's career list for passing touchdowns with 42, surpassing Luke Getsy (2005-06) who had 41. At Troy, Woodson went 20-of-40 for 268 yards and a touchdown. In the MAC win at Bowling Green, Woodson rushed for an 11-yard touchdown in the third quarter to give UA a 27-23 lead. The rushing TD was the fourth of Woodson's career and his first since 2015. Woodson went 13-of-24 for 168 yards and two touchdowns. In the win over Ball State, he threw for 211 yards and two touchdowns on 17-of-30. In the win at Western Michigan, Woodson went 13-of-24 for 127 yards and a touchdown. At Toledo, he went 18-of-33 for 205 yards and two touchdowns. In the win over Buffalo, Woodson went 21-of-29 for a season-high 286 yards and three touchdowns en route to MAC Player of the Week honors. Woodson was suspended for the Miami and Ohio games for a violation of team rules. He did not play against Kent State. In the MAC Championship game against Toledo, Woodson saw his first action since the win against Buffalo. He finished 5-of-14 for 35 yards.

After 10 games, Woodson is 159-of-278 for 1,777 yards and 14 touchdowns. With his 286 passing yards in the win over Buffalo, Woodson moved into second place on the Akron career list. He now has 6,864 passing yards, surpassing **James Washington** (1997-00) who had 6,699 yards. Woodson stands No. 2 in career passing TDs (53).

Redshirt junior **Robbie Kelley** (Springfield, Ill.) competes as a graduate student after earning his degree in three years at Quincy (Ill.) University. The three-time Academic All-Great Lakes Valley Conference honorse earned second-team All-Conference honors last fall after going 185-of-319 for 2,701 yards and 23 touchdowns in his first season as a starter. At No. 6 Penn State, Kelley went 0-of-2 in his only series of action. In the 52-3 win over Arkansas Pine Bluff, he was 1-of-2 for 25 yards. Kelley saw action in the fourth quarter against Ball State, but threw no passes. At Toledo, Kelley went 5-of-7 for 86 yards and a touchdown, his first as a Zip, a career-long 47-yard pass to WR Kwadarrius Smith in the fourth quarter. In the MAC Championship game against Toledo, Kelley threw a five-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter, his second as a Zip.

In six games, Kelley is 11-of-20 for 182 yards and two touchdowns.

# **GAME 14 at FAU | BOCA RATON BOWL**

Redshirt sophomore **Nick Johns** (Leesburg, Va.), a three-star JUCO recruit, spent the 2016 season at Northwestern Oklahoma A&M Junior College. He went 178-of-306 for 2,243 yards and 16 touchdowns in 10 games. At No. 6 Penn State, Johns played one series, going 1-of-2 for four yards. Since the lowa State game, he has seen action on the kickoff return unit.

#### **BALL SUFFERS SEASON-ENDING INJURY**

Hopes were high as running back **Warren Ball** returned to the Zips' line-up this fall as a redshirt senior, earning a sixth year from the NCAA. The transfer from Ohio State had played behind NFL Draft picks **Ezekiel Elliott** (Dallas) and **Carlos Hyde** (San Francisco). The captain suffered a broken ankle at Bowling Green and will miss the rest of the season.

In five games, Ball rushed for 332 yards and four touchdowns on 75 carries.

#### **FAMILIAR BACKFIELD**

Senior **Manny Morgan** (Naples, Fla.), who finished second in rushing in 2016 with 417 yards on 81 carries, had three carries for 13 yards at No. 6 Penn State. In the win over Arkansas Pine Bluff, Morgan had four carries for 10 yards. In the MAC win at Bowling Green, he had 11 carries for 50 yards. In the win over Ball State, Morgan rushed for 43 yards on eight carries. In the win at Western Michigan, he led the rushers with 53 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries. His one-yard rushing touchdown on a direct snap in the second quarter was his second career touchdown and his first score this fall. At Toledo, Morgan had nine carries for 15 yards. In the win over Buffalo, he had 16 yards on six carries. At Miami, Morgan was the Zips' top rusher with 41 yards on 10 carries. Morgan led the Zips with 14 carries for 55 yards and a touchdown in the win over Ohio. In the win over Kent State, he had 46 yards and a touchdown on 11 carries. In the MAC Championship game against Toledo, Morgan led the Zips with 51 yards and a touchdown on 11 carries.

After 13 games, Morgan is the top rusher with 393 yards and four touchdowns on 99 carries.

Junior **Van Edwards** (Cape Coral, Fla.) moved into a starting role in 2016 after Ball went down. He was the Zips' top rusher with 492 yards and three touchdowns on 100 carries in 2016. At No. 6 Penn State, he had five carries. In the win over Arkansas Pine Bluff, Edwards rushed nine times for 47 yards and a touchdown. Against Iowa State, he had four carries for 16 yards. In the MAC win at Bowling Green, Edwards led the rushers with 14 carries for 70 yards and a touchdown. In the win over Ball State, he had 19 yards on seven carries. In the win at Western Michigan, Edwards rushed 13 times for 38 yards. At Toledo, he led the Zips with nine carries for 25 yards. At Miami, Edwards had a 13-yard reception. In the win over Ohio, he had four carries for 21 yards. In the win over Kent State, Edwards led the Zips with 55 yards on nine carries. In the MAC Championship game against Toledo, he had 46 yards on 10 carries.

After 13 games, Edwards has 343 yards and two touchdowns on 94 carries.

In just his second game, the win over Arkansas Pine Bluff, redshirt sophomore RB **Deltron Sands** (Fort Lauderdale, Fla.) saw significant action. He finished third in rushing with seven carries for 38 yards and his first collegiate touchdown. In the win over Ball State, Sands put UA ahead 14-3 in the second quarter with his 32-yard touchdown run. The TD was his second on the season. He led the UA rushers with six carries for a career-high 52 yards. At Toledo, Sands had three carries for 10 yards. In the win over Buffalo, he was the top rusher with seven carries for a career-high 70 yards. At Miami, Sands made his first appearance in the starting line-up. He left the game in the first quarter with a season-ending injury. In 10 games, Sands had 173 yards and two touchdowns on 25 carries.

#### **NEW RECEIVING CORPS**

With the graduation of senior All-MAC honoree **JoJo Natson** and junior All-MAC **Jerome Lane**'s early departure to the NFL, the Zips' receiving corps have re-loaded.

Senior **Austin Wolf** (Lebanon, Ohio) returned as the most experienced receiver. He finished 2016 third in receiving, behind Lane and Natson, with 36 receptions for 550 yards and five touchdowns.

Wolf missed the first two games with a minor injury. He saw limited action against lowa State. At Troy, Wolf returned to the starting line-up for the first time this fall. He led the receivers with six receptions for 71 yards. In the MAC win at Bowling Green, Wolf scored his first touchdown of the season on a 43-yard pass from Thomas Woodson. It marked Wolf's first touchdown this season and the ninth of his career. Wolf finished the game with three receptions for 68 yards. In the win over Ball State, he put UA on the scoreboard in the first quarter with a 24-yard touchdown reception. It marked the 10th TD of his career and his second this fall. Wolf finished with four receptions for 57 yards. At Toledo, he had four receptions for 44 yards. In the win over Buffalo, Wolf scored on a 41-yard pass to put Akron ahead in the second quarter. He finished with two receptions for 52 yards. At Miami, Wolf had three receptions for 45 yards. In the win over Ohio, he had five catches for 57 yards, including a 23-yard touchdown reception. In the win over Kent State, Wolf had a 15-yard reception. In the MAC Championship game against Toledo, he had two receptions for 41 yards and a touchdown.

In 11 games, Wolf has 450 yards and five touchdowns on 30 receptions.

Redshirt senior **Tra'Von Chapman** (Cincinnati, Ohio) moved from throwing the ball to catching the ball during spring drills. In nine games (with three starts) at quarterback in 2016, Chapman was 54-of-117 for 700 yards and five touchdowns while rushing 48 times for 195 yards and four touchdowns.

In his new role, Chapman led all receivers with three catches for 10 yards at No. 6 Penn State. In the win over Arkansas Pine Bluff, he led the receivers with five receptions for 55 yards. Against Iowa State, Chapman led the receivers with a career-high eight receptions for 53 yards. At Troy, he had four receptions for 30 yards. In the MAC win at Bowling Green, Chapman had two receptions for 23 yards. In the win over Ball State, he had 23 yards on three receptions. In the win at Western Michigan, Chapman had a 14-yard reception. At Toledo, he caught a 17-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter. The TD was Chapman's first as a receiver (this season). At No. 6 Penn State, Coney made two receptions for 25 yards. In the win over Arkansas Pine Bluff, he scored his first TD of the season and second of his career with a 15-yard pass. Against Iowa State, Coney had four receptions for 52 yards. At Troy, he had three receptions for 35 yards. In the MAC win at Bowling Green, Coney caught a four-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter to put UA on the scoreboard. It was the third touchdown of his career and second this season. Coney led the UA receivers with five receptions for 42 yards and a touchdown. In the win over Ball State, Coney led the receivers with six receptions for 90 yards. # **SPECIAL TEAMS**

#### O'LEARY LEADS KICKING UNIT

Redshirt junior **Tom O'Leary** (Tucker, Ga.) continued to kick for the Zips. After securing the job last fall, he went 10-11 in field goals and 39-of-42 in extra points for 69 points in 12 games. He kicked off 46 times for 2,644 yards (57.5 avg.) with six touchbacks.

In the victory over Arkansas Pine Bluff, O'Leary went 6-for-6 on extra points and nailed a 34-yard field goal in the second quarter. Against lowa State, O'Leary made two extra points to extend his streak to 38 consecutive makes. After making a 27-yard field goal in the first quarter at Troy, O'Leary had his first miss, shanking a 34-yard attempt to end the first half. He converted two extra points. In the MAC win at Bowling Green, O'Leary went 4-of-5 in extra points. The miss on his second attempt snapped a streak of 41 consecutive makes. In the win over Ball State, O'Leary converted a 48-yard field goal in the second quarter, a career long. He also made four extra points. In the win at Western Michigan, O'Leary tacked on two extra points. At Toledo, he made three extra points. In the win over Buffalo, O'Leary made three extra points.

O'Leary has scored 35 points. He has made 26-of-27 extra points and three field goals.

Senior **Zach Gingerich** (Bellefontaine, Ohio) will compete for kicking duties. He made his first extra point in the win over Arkansas Pine Bluff.

#### **GASSER TO PUNT**

Junior **Nick Gasser** (Liberty Township, Ohio) returns to punt for the Zips. In 12 games last fall, Gasser punted 59 times for 2,226 yards (37.7 avg.) with 16 fair catches and 22 landing inside the 20. He kicked off 14 times for 753 yards (53.8 avg.) with two touchbacks.

In the season opener at No. 6 Penn State, Gasser) punted a career-high 11 times for a career-high 435 yards. He averaged 39.5 yards. In the win over Arkansas Pine Bluff, he kicked off nine times for 551 yards (61.2 average). Against Iowa State, Gasser punted seven times for 279 yards, averaging 39.9 yards. He also kicked off three times for 160 yards (53.3 average). At Troy, Gasser punted five times for 229 yards, averaging a career-best 45.8 yards. His long of 56 yards, which landed on the Troy threeyard line, was a career long. In the MAC win at Bowling Green, Gasser kicked off six times for 347 yards, averaging 57.8 yards. In the win over Ball State, he kicked off six times for 366 yards (61.0 average) and punted six times for 270 yards (45.0 average), including a career long 59-yard punt. In the win at Western Michigan, Gasser kicked off three times for 133 yards (44.3 average). He also punted seven times for 253 yards (36.1 average) with a long of 47 yards. At Toledo, Gasser punted four times for 173 yards (43.2 average), including a long of 53 yards. He also kicked off four times for 194 yards (48.5 average). In the win over Buffalo, Gasser kicked off four times for 241 yards, averaging 60.2 yards. He also punted four times for 167 yards, including a 52-yard long punt, for a 41.8 average and no returns. His first punt of the game landed on the four-yard line for the start of UB's drive. Gasser earned MAC Specialist of the Week honors for the second time. At Miami, he punted six times for 274 yards (45.7 average) and kicked off three times for 178 yards (59.3 average). In addition to kickoffs and punting, Gasser took over placekicking duties against the RedHawks. He missed a 31-yard field goal attempt on UA's opening drive but converted two extra points. In the win over Ohio, Gasser nailed his first field goal, a 19-yard chip-shot to put Akron on the scoreboard in the first quarter. He also had four extra points while punting seven times for 277 yards (39.6 average), including long punt of 50 yards. Gasser also kicked off seven times for 414 yards, averaging 59.1 yards. In the win over Kent State, Gasser made a 45-yard field goal in the first quarter. It was his second field goal and his longest to date. His 45.9 punting average and five punts inside the 20 were both career highs. Gasser also kicked off four times for 225 yards (56.2 average) and punted eight times for 367 yards (45.9 average). Two of Gasser's kickoffs and three punts landed within the five-yard line, giving the Golden Flashes more than a 90-yard trek to the end zone. In the MAC Championship game against Toledo, Gasser kicked off four

At No. 6 Penn State, Edwards had three returns for 64 yards, including a long of 24 yards. Against Iowa State, he had a 23-yard return. At Toledo, Edwards had three returns for 66 yards. He averages 21.9 yards per return. In the win over Buffalo, he had two returns for 51 yards, including a 28-yard return. At Miami, Edwards had three kickoff returns for 54 yards. In the win over Ohio, he had five returns for 82 yards. In the win over Kent State, Edwards had two kickoff returns for 35 yards.

Redshirt sophomore RB **Deltron Sands** (Fort Lauderdale, Fla.) had a kickoff return for 13 yards at No.6 Penn State. In the win over Arkansas Pine Bluff, ha had a 27-yard return. # **ON THE SIDELINES**

#### **BEST MAC START**

Opening the 2017 season with three consecutive wins in Mid-American Conference play was a first for Akron. While the Zips had opened MAC play with two wins seven times ['92, 93, 01, 07, 08, 14, 16] since joining the league in 1992, winning three consecutive MAC games to open this season was a first in program history.

#### **AKRON'S MAC CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY**

Akron earned the 2017 MAC East title and a spot in the 2017 MAC championship game with its win over Kent State in the regular-season finale. Since joining the MAC in 1992, Akron has won the MAC East three times (2000, 2005, 2017). UA has only played in the MAC Championship game once (2005).

In 2005, Akron participated in its first MAC Championship game, claiming a 31-30 victory over Northern Illinois.

#### THERE IS NO PLACE LIKE HOME

Akron concluded its ninth season in 2017 on campus at InfoCision Stadium – Summa Field. The Zips have a 23-31 record at the venue (5-1 in 2017). The 30,000-seat stadium features 17 suites, state-of-the-art video board, and 80,000 square feet of academic space used daily by all University students. Additionally, the Sport Science and Wellness Education Department conducts classes on two levels, and the University's Alumni Association resides there as well.

#### **GIVING BACK**

The University of Akron football team has been know for visiting Akron Children's Hospital *EVERY* Friday before home games, but over the summer, the Zips stepped up their outreach to the community. Projects included landscaping and gardening at the Haven of Rest homeless shelter; cleaning kennels, organizing storage, and walking dogs at the One-of-a-Kind Pet Rescue; and volunteering at various summer camps for kids.



#### TAYLOR NAMED TO 2017 PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME CLASS

Former University of Akron defensive end **Jason Taylor** (1993-96) was one of seven honorees inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2017.

Taylor was one of the NFL's top pass-rushers for 15 seasons. Drafted in the third round by the Miami Dolphins in 1997, he played 13 seasons with Miami, and one season each with the Washington Redskins, and the New York Jets. A six-time Pro Bowl selection and four time 1st or 2nd team All-Pro, Taylor was named the NFL Defensive Player of the Year in 2006, and also named the Walter Peyton Man of the Year in 2007.

Taylor holds the sixth all-time career sacks record with 139.5 sacks, is the all-time leader in fumble return touchdowns with six, while his 246 fumble return yards are the second highest total in NFL history. With nine career defensive touchdowns scored, he is also the all-time leader in that category for defensive linemen.

As a Zip, Taylor earned first-team All-MAC honors as a senior in 1996. He was named the team's defensive MVP as a junior. In 1996, he was awarded the team's Harry "Doc" Smith Award and the Akron Touchdown Club trophy as the outstanding lineman. Taylor is Akron's all-time career leader in sacks (21) and stands second on the Zips' charts for career tackles for loss (41.0) and sacks in a season (10). Taylor was inducted into Akron's Ring of Honor in 2004 and the UA Sports Hall of Fame in 2007.

The Dean of all Mid-American Conference coaches with 171 career wins, Akron's Terry Bowden is in his sixth season in 2017 at the helm of the UA program. He was named the Zips' 27th all-time head coach on Dec. 22, 2011, but is just the seventh person to hold the position since 1960.

Owning a 171-105-2 record over a 24-year collegiate coaching career, Bowden ranks sixth nationally among active Division I head coaches in career wins (171).

Bowden has been responsible for miraculous turnarounds almost everywhere he has coached and has once again done it at The University of Akron.

In 2016, Bowden led UA to a 5-7 overall record, finishing just one play away from backto-back bowl appearances. The Zips won their second consecutive Wagon Wheel (and third in last four years) over rival Kent State. Akron led the MAC in punt returns (17.53) which also ranked third nationally.

Sophomore linebacker Ulysees Gilbert III and redshirt senior punt returner JoJo Natson, Jr., earned first-team All-Mid-American Conference honors. Natson also garnered second-team All-MAC honors at wide receiver. Junior wide receiver Jerome Lane and redshirt sophomore placekicker Tom O'Leary were third-team All-MAC honorees.

For just the second time in program history (and first time since 1980), an Akron Zip earned Academic All-America honors. Junior safety Zach Guiser was a first-team selection, while redshirt senior captain James Turner was a second-team honoree.

In 2015, Bowden guided the Zips to an 8-5 overall record and a second-place finish in the MAC (5-3) East en route to the program's first winning season and bowl appearance since 2005. Ranked No. 2 nationally by Phil Steele as the Most Improved Team, Akron captured its first-ever bowl victory in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) era (since 1987) with a 23-21 win over Utah State in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl on Dec. 22. UA won the 500th game in program history with a 35-14 victory at Louisiana on Sept. 26, 2015, while closing out the season with five consecutive wins. The Zips shut out rival Kent State, 20-0, in the home finale to regain possession of the coveted Wagon Wheel. The eight wins on the season were the most in the FBS era.

In 2014, Bowden guided the Zips to a 5-7 overall for the second consecutive season. With 10 victories over the last two seasons, the Zips totaled more wins than the previous three seasons combined.

In 2013, Bowden led UA to its highest win total since 2008 by going 5-7 overall and 4-4 against the MAC, as well as ending the year by winning three straight and four of its last five games. The Zips went 3-3 at home, including a 31-29 win over Toledo in the season finale and a 16-7 victory over neighborhood rival Kent State to regain possession of the coveted wooden Wagon Wheel.

In 2012, Bowden ushered in a spread offense that resulted in an aerial attack responsible for a school-record and MAC season-high 30 passing touchdowns.

Bowden, who served as a studio analyst and color commentator with ABC Sports' college football for 10 years, was the head coach at Auburn from 1993-98 and spent the three seasons prior to coming to Akron at Division II North Alabama. Bowden was an assistant coach at Akron in 1986 under then Zips' head coach Gerry Faust.

Bowden is a member of one of the most famous and successful college football coaching families. His father, Bobby Bowden, turned Florida State into a national champion and his 377 collegiate wins rank second in Division I history.

As a student-athlete at West Virginia, Bowden lettered two years as a running back (1977-78), held a 3.65 grade-point average in accounting, the highest GPA on the football team, and graduated Magna Cum Laude. He did post graduate work at Oxford University in England, and earned a Juris Doctorate from the Florida State School of Law in 1982, while a graduate assistant coach with the Seminoles.

Bowden, 61 (born Feb. 25, 1956), married Audrey Renner in June 2016. Together, the couple has five daughters (Tera, Jordan, Erin, Cori and Jamie Bowden), three sons (Terry Bowden, Jr., Danny and Drew Renner), and a grandson Skyler.





AKRON, Ohio – The University of Akron football team captured the 2017 Mid-American Conference East Division title on the strength of a 24-14 victory over rival Kent State while claiming its third consecutive Wagon Wheel victory at InfoCision Stadium–Summa Field on Tuesday night.

With the win, Akron improved to 7-5 overall and 6-2 in league play. The Zips will play for the 2017 MAC Championship. Kent finished the season at 2-10 overall and 1-7 in MAC play.

Also with the win, Akron earned one point for the Crystal Clinic Orthopedic Wagon Wheel Challenge, bringing the overall tally to 3.5 to 1.5 in the Zips' favor.

The Zips wasted no time entering Kent State territory as redshirt freshman QB Kato Nelson used seven plays to travel 75 yards for Akron's first score. The drive lasted 3:16, and started with a three-yard rush by senior RB Manny Morgan. Nelson followed with a 12-yard strike to senior WR A.J. Coney and a 24-yard rush of his own, entering the Golden Flashes' side of the field at the 36-yard line.

The Zips' offensive efforts were led by Nelson, completing six passes for 69 yards, which included the 25-yard touchdown pass to Booker. Junior RB Van Edwards, Jr., carried most of the load on the ground, posting 6.1 yards per carry on nine touches and 55 total yards. Morgan followed with 46 yards and added a touchdown, while Nelson rounded out the ground attack with 21 yards.

DETROIT -- The University of Akron football team could not overcome a 28-0 halftime deficit and fell to Toledo, 45-28, in the 2017 Mid-American Conference championship game before 16,225 fans on Saturday at Ford Field.

Akron fell to 7-6 overall, while the Rockets improved to 11-2 overall. Both teams now await bowl berths which will be announced on Sunday afternoon.

Akron started the game with the ball but was forced to punt. Toledo went three-and-out on its opening drive

On its second drive, Toledo jumped on the scoreboard first. UT's Danzel McKinley-Lewis returned a punt 48 yards to the 17. On the next play, Diontae Johnson caught a 27-yard pass from QB Logan Woodside, the MAC Offensive Player of the Year, to go ahead 7-0.

Redshirt senior QB Thomas Woodson replaced starter Kato Nelson for a series in the first quarter, his first action since the win over Buffalo (Oct. 28).

He took over under center on last drive of the first quarter.

With 1:54 to go, the Rockets' Jameson Vest missed a 33-yard field goal attempt. UT led after the first quarter, 7-0.

In the second quarter, junior LB Brian Bell (Valdosta, Ga.) recovered a fumble on the 37. The recovery set up a field goal attempt for the Zips, but Nick Gasser's 42-yard attempt was blocked by Childress, who returned the ball 36 yards to the 34.

Toledo took advantage of the turnover with a twoyard rushing touchdown by Terry Swanson to take a 14-0 lead.

The Rockets went ahead 21-0 as Johnson scored again, this time on a five-yard reception.

With 2:41 to go in the first half, first-team All-MAC LB Ulysees Gilbert III intercepted a Woodside pass and returned it 25 yards. The Zips could not get into the red zone and were forced to punt.









On their final drive of the half, the Rockets began its drive on the three and marched the ball 97 yards to the end zone as Jon'Vea Johnson caught a 27-yard touchdown with eight seconds on the clock. Toledo led at intermission, 28-0.


In the third quarter, Vest converted a 47-yard field goal to give UT a 31-0 edge.

Akron finally got on the scoreboard with 30 seconds to go in the quarter. RB Manny Morgan took a direct snap and marched seven yards into the endzone.

The Zips opened the fourth quarter with an interception by junior DB Jordan George. UA scored on the next play as Woodson hit senior WR Austin Wolf with a 29-yard touchdown reception. UT led 38-14 with 14:38 remaining in the game.

On Toledo's next drive, senior DL Ibrahima Camara forced a fumble, recovered by junior DB Darian Dailey, and the Zips took over on the 42. Nelson fumbled the ball on the next play, returning the ball to Toledo.

The Rockets scored on the next play with a 54-yard pass to Swanson to go ahead 45-14.






Akron finished the game with two more scores. Nelson connected with junior WR Kwadarrius Smith on a 44-yard touchdown pass with 6:09 to go.






The Zips though could draw no closer as two more Bradshaw scores in the fourth quarter sealed the Bulldog win.



Akron head coach Jim Dennison's trademark running attack was true to form as the Blue and Gold racked up 419 yards on the ground, while the defense held the Rebel runners to only eight yards and controlled the game.

The Zips got on the board first, taking the opening kickoff down to the Vegas 7-yard line where Jim Embick split the uprights with a 24-yard field goal for a 3-0 Akron lead.

UNLV had its only point production on the afternoon on the ensuing kickoff when 5-6, 143-lb. freshman Ken Bowls took the Embick kick in the endzone and returned it 100 yards for the Rebel touchdown. UNLV led 6-3 after the extra point attempt missed.

The Zips regained the lead for good later in the first half when quarterback Marty Bezbatchenko scampered 43 yards for a touchdown.

Bezbatchenko closed out the scoring in the fourth quarter when he hit senior wide receiver Glenn Evans from 14 yards for the Akron touchdown.



AKRON, Ohio- History between the Zips and Wildcats added another chapter during the semifinal round of the 1976 NCAA Division II Playoffs- named the Knute Rockne Bowl as the teams played in the first overtime game in the history of NCAA football playoffs.

Riding a six-game winning streak against NMU in series history, the Zips were down by 10 points before the Akron rushing machine began to roll. With 2:48 remaining in the first quarter, junior halfback Dave Axner took a Marty Bezbatchencko hand off on the right side and sprinted 56 yards to the end zone.

Akron took the lead in the closing minutes of the half when Axner hit paydirt again for six yards to help the Zips to a 14-10 lead entering the locker room.

NMU scored on its first drive of the second half but missed a two-point conversion.

In the fourth quarter, Axner scored his third TD of the day on a 3-yard run. The Zips, too, missed on a two-point try, leaving them with a 20-16 lead. NMU reclaimed the lead after a QB fumble on the Akron 1-yard line, and OL Roy Brown recovered for the score.

Down by three points with 3:29 left on the clock, UA had one final shot. Starting on their own 29vard line, the Zips drove the ball to the NMU 18yard line where kicker Jim Embick split the uprights with:01 left to tie the contest at 23-23 and send it into overtime.

With each team trading a series from the opponent's 15-yard line, the Zips won the toss and elected to defend. They pushed the Wildcats back to the 23-yard line where they hit a field goal. The UA offense then took over and ran three rushing plays to move the ball to the 1-yard line where Bezbatchenko went over the goal line on a quarterback keeper to seal the victory.



WICHITA FALLS, Texas— It was windy and bitter cold in Wichita Falls when the Zips met No. 1 Montana State for the NCAA Division II National Championship.

The day was made for the ground game and ball control offenses, and the opponents did not disappoint.

UA entered the contest averaging 251.2 yards per game rushing, while MSU ranked first in the nation with 287.5 yards per game on the ground.

The teams played through a scoreless tie through the first quarter and most of the second. MSU finally broke the ice with a 5-yard TD pass to cap a 51-yard drive with 5:47 remaining in the half. The Bobcats scored again with :27 left to take a 14-0 lead at intermission. Montana State controlled the ball for 19:09 in the first half and had 12 first downs compared to 10:51 and two first downs for UA.

The Bobcats added a field goal in the third quarter to take a 17-0 lead before Akron took advantage of a MSU mistake. Charles Parnell recovered a Bobcats fumble at the MSU 30-yard line. Akron got on the board five plays later when Dave Axner ran in from 3 yards out with 1:33 left in the third.

UA caught another break early in the fourth quarter when senior Louis Formen intercepted a MSU pass and set the Zips up at the Bobcats 25-yard line. Quarterback Marty Bezbatchenko finished the three-play drive with a 22-yard touchdown pass to Glenn Evans.

The Montana State defense, however, took matters into its own hands by shutting the Zips down, while the offense added one more touchdown for the final 24-13 score.

While the Zips fell 11 points shy of a National Championship, the 1976 team provided countless exciting memories for Akron fans for years to come.

KINGSTON, R.I.— With a come-from-behind 17-14 victory over Austin Peay to finish the regular season at 8-3, Akron headed to battle the Rhode Island Rams in round one of the NCAA I-AA playoffs, marking the Zips' first playoff showing since the move to Division I.

The Zips' powerful running attack had a few question marks entering the game. Junior tailback Mike Clark, who averaged 148 yards per game through the first seven contests, had been hampered by a sprained ankle and totaled only 115 yards in the last three games. Although Akron fell to the Rams, 35-27, Clark came through in style, churning out 172 yards and a touchdown.

After a scoreless first quarter, Rhode Island got on the board with a three-yard touchdown pass and extra point to take a 7-0 lead. After the Rams drove to the UA 17-yard line on their next possession, the Akron special teams took over. A Rams' field goal attempt was blocked by freshman Gary Tyler and returned 77 yards for a touchdown. Rhode Island scored again to hold a 14-7 edge at halftime.

URI jumped out to a 14-point lead midway through the third quarter. Akron mounted another comeback as defensive lineman Steve Rafac intercepted a Tom Ehrhardt pass and returned it 16 yards for a touchdown.

The next Akron score came when Clark capped off a 55-yard drive with a 1-yard over the middle leap into the endzone. Clark rushed for all 55 yards of the three-play drive, including a gallop of 53 yards.

The two teams traded scores once again with tail-back Anthony Green hitting paydirt for the Zips early in the fourth quarter. The extra point attempt was blocked, however, leaving the Rams with a 29-27 lead and the eventual victory.

DETROIT (AP) -- The Akron Zips won the first conference title in school history and berth in the Motor City Bowl -- and hope they earned some national attention.

Luke Getsy threw a 36-yard touchdown pass to Domenik Hixon with 10 seconds left to give Akron a 31-30 victory over Northern Illinois on Thursday night in the Mid-American Conference championship game at Ford Field.

"This is a huge moment, not just for our football program, but for our athletic department and our university," Zips coach J.D. Brookhart said. "This was the best three-hour advertisement you could ask for, because we are still in the building phase of this program."

The Zips (7-5) overcame a national conference championship-game record 270 yards and two touchdowns by Huskies tailback Garrett Wolfe.

"In the fourth quarter, if I could have broken one more tackle or made one more move, maybe we could have gotten the first down we needed," he said. "We lost the game, so it doesn't matter how many yards I had."

Akron's winning drive started on its own 19 with 1:41 left and no timeouts. The Zips drove into Northern Illinois (7-5) territory and Hixon beat Adriel Hansbro down the middle of the field and grabbed Getsy's pass deep in the end zone.

"We were two yards short of the first down that would have ended the game," Northern Illinois coach Joe Novak said. "We couldn't make the play when we needed one, and they did."

The Zips had never won a football title in any conference, dating to their joining the Ohio Athletic Conference in 1915.

Wolfe had 42 carries and easily broke the previous MAC title-game record of 188 yards, set by Toledo's Chester Taylor in 2001, and the 2-year-old national record of 235 yards, set by Kansas State's Darren Sproles.







Akron took a 3-0 lead on their first possession on Jason Swiger's 47-yard field goal, the longest in MAC title-game history until Nendick's kick three quarters later.

The teams then traded short rushing touchdowns, as Kennedy put Akron up 10-0 with a 3-yard run. Wolfe made it 10-7 with a 1-yard dive.

Swiger narrowly missed a 46-yard field goal attempt. Nendick tied the game at 10 with a 21-yarder.


The score was tied at 10 at halftime.


Wolfe raced 62 yards to the Zips 20 midway through the third, then scored his second touchdown on a 12-yard burst.

After a fumble, the Huskies made it 24-10 when Dan Nicholson hit Sam Hurd at the goal line with a 19-yard scoring pass.

The Zips rallied and cut the margin to 24-17 on a 3-yard run by Brett Biggs with 13:53 remaining.

Chris Nendick pushed Northern Illinois' lead back to 10 points with a championship game-record 52-yard field goal. But Getsy countered with a 7-yard draw for a touchdown that pulled the Zips within three, 27-24.





Nendick's third field goal, a 46-yarder, made it a sixpoint game with 3:28 to go.


Akron drove to the Northern Illinois 33, before Getsy's pass bounced off the hands of Dennis Kennedy and was intercepted by linebacker Phil Brown.


Northern Illinois went three-and-out, forcing Akron to use all three timeouts, but the Zips got possession and Getsy drove for the winning score.

"It was an unbelievable finish," Brookhart said. "We found a way to go 80 yards."

Getsy was 30-of-50 for 413 yards, and Hixon had eight catches for 144 yards.

The game was as wild as the teams' first meeting, which Akron won 48-42 in overtime on Sept. 24.

DETROIT (AP) - DeAngelo Williams lived up to the

Williams set an NCAA record with his 34th 100yard rushing game and scored three touchdowns, leading Memphis to a 38-31 victory over Akron in the Motor City Bowl.

Williams ran for 233 yards on 30 carries and finished his career with 6,021 yards rushing - trailing only Ron Dayne, Ricky Williams and Tony Dorsett in Division I-A history - and an NCAA-record 7,568 all-purpose yards.

The Tigers (7-5) took a 21-point lead with 3:09 left, but needed to recover an onside kick with 55 seconds left to seal the win after Luke Getsy threw his fourth touchdown pass to cut the lead to seven points.

Akron (7-6) made a good showing in its first Division I-A bowl game after scoring 21 fourth-guarter points to beat Northern Illinois in the Mid-American Conference championship game.

Getsv was 34-for-59 for a Motor City Bowl-record 455 yards, and tied Chad Pennington's mark for passing touchdowns in the bowl's nine-year history. Jabari Arthur broke Randy Moss's bowl record with 180 yards receiving, scoring twice on eight receptions.

The Tigers led by 10 at halftime after scoring on three straight drives, then pulled away in the second half with three TDs and a field goal in four drives before nearly collapsing in the final minutes.

It was a wild finish - with 46 points scored in the final 15:46 – after Akron led 3-0 midway through the first quarter. The teams combined for 1,018 yards of offense.

Williams broke the 100-yard mark in the third quarter when he ran up the middle and bounced to the outside on an 18-yard carry.

After Getsy threw a 72-yard TD pass to Brett Biggs early in the fourth quarter to cut Akron's deficit to 23-17, Williams showed his speed and power.





He burst through a small hole in the middle of the line and sprinted for a 67-yard gain to set up his 2-yard, linemen-dragging TD for his third score, tying the bowl record.

Williams, who finished seventh in voting for the Heisman, was taken out of the game midway through the fourth quarter while Memphis was driving for its 38-17 lead.

He finished four rushing yards short of the Motor City Bowl record set by Northwestern's Jason Wright against Bowling Green in 2003.





BOISE, Idaho-The Akron Zips claimed their first FBS bowl win in school history with a 23-21 defeat of Utah State at Albertsons Stadium on Tuesday afternoon before a crowd of 18,876.

Finishing on a five-game winning streak, Akron improved to 8-5 overall, the most wins in a season since moving into FBS play in 1987.

Senior PK Robert Stein was named the bowl's Most Valuable Player. He finished with 11 points on the day (three field goals and two extra points) en route to becoming Akron's career scoring leader.

Sophomore QB Thomas Woodson went 14-of-29 for 168 yards and was the Zips' leading rusher with 47 yards on 16 carries. He also had a 14-yard TD reception.

In the air, senior WR Andrew Pratt led Akron with a career-high nine receptions for 94 yards.

Defensively, sophomore S Zach Guiser had nine tackles, while senior LB Dylan Evans and Jatavis Brown had eight tackles each.

On the opening drive, the Zips' defense showed its strength as senior NT Cody Grice and junior DE Se'Von Pittman sacked QB Chuckie Keeton for a loss of eight, forcing the Aggies to punt.

Akron scored on its next possession, driving 56 yards to the endzone. The Zips used a trick play as iunior WR Tyrell Goodman passed the ball 14 yards to Woodson for the score. Stein tacked on the extra point, giving Akron a 7-0 lead with 10:38 to go in the first quarter.

In the second quarter, both teams threw a pick. Woodson was first, followed by Keeton five plays later as senior CB Kris Givens recorded his second interception of the season, stopping an Aggies' scoring drive on the six.

Givens struck again on the next defensive drive. He broke up a pass in the endzone on third-and-eight. On fourth down, the Aggies lined up for a fake field goal and turned the ball over on downs after a rush for a loss of seven yards.







With 2:53 remaining in the first half, Stein nailed a 33-yard field goal to give the Zips 10-0 advantage.


Following the kickoff, Utah State took three plays to drive the field, including a career long 61-yard run by Devante Mays, to score a nine-yard touchdown from Myers to Brandon Swindall.

On their next drive, the Aggies made back-to-back first downs to the 32. Akron's Brown forced a fumble, recovered by senior Rodney Coe who ran it back 56 yards to the 12 with four seconds on the clock. Stein then converted a 29-yard field goal, giving the Zips a 13-7 lead at intermission.

On the opening drive of the third quarter, Utah State took its first lead, 14-13, following a seven-play 64-yard drive that ended with a 19-yard touchdown pass from Myers to Hunter Sharp.

Akron rebounded with an eight-play, 40-yard drive that gave the Zips a 20-14 lead following a two-yard touchdown run by senior RB Donnell Alexander.

Stein added a 46-yard field goal in the fourth quarter, giving UA a 23-14 lead, while becoming Akron's career scoring leader.





With 1:12 remaining in the game, Utah State scored its final touchdown on a two-yard pass. The Zips ran the clock down to six seconds. Utah State's final attempt of the game was incomplete, sealing the Zips' victory.




