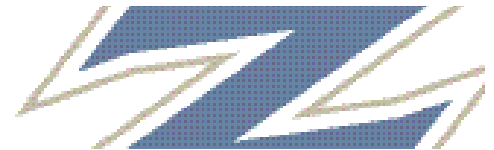

WHAT'S AHEAD

The Akron men's basketball program continues its 118th season of hoops with the fourth annual North-east Ohio Coaches vs Cancer Doubleheader on Saturday, Nov. 10, at the Wolstein Center hosted by Cleveland State. The action begins with Akron playing Youngstown State at 4:30 p.m. Second year head coach **John Groce** leads the Akron basketball program into battle with a newly assembled cast. Groce led the Zips to a win in the season debut as the Zips defeated Cedarville 70-50 at the JAR.

The Northeast Ohio Coaches vs. Cancer Doubleheader is scheduled to air on ESPN3 as **Al Pawlowski** will call the action and **Pat Vuyancih** provides analysis. Fans can also follow the action on GoZips.com via Live Stats or by Zips' radio. The Zips' radio broadcast will air on the Akron-IMG Sports Network SportsRadio 1350 AM (WARF) in Akron (flagship) with **Steve French** calling the action and **Joe Dunn** providing analysis. The pregame show starts 30 minutes prior to the contest. The free audio stream is available at SportsRadio1350.com, iHeart Radio, and TuneIn.com/Akron Zips.

THE AKRON-YOUNGSTOWN STATE SERIES

Saturday's matchup marks the 89th meeting in series history between Akron and Youngstown State, and first-ever for a Groce coached squad. Akron holds a 57-32 all-time series advantage that started during the 1937-38 season -- the Zips claimed the first meeting 23-16. In Youngstown, the Penguins hold a slight edge with a 23-22 record, while in Akron the Zips established a healthy 35-9 edge. Akron are winners in six of the last seven meetings. The two teams last met on Nov. 12, 2017 at the Beeghly Center, where YSU recorded an 90-82 victory.

SCOUTING THE PENGUINS

Dropped their season opener on the road against PITT, 69-53. The Penguins attempted half of their shots from beyond the 3-point arc (8-of-38) while only shooting 21-percent from deep. From the floor YSU was 18-of-67 (.269).

The Penguins had nine players touch the scoring column with only one player reaching double figures as Kendale Hampton collected 15 points. He buried four of his 10 3-point attempts and attempted only one shot from 2-point range, 4-of-11 overall. Hampton added four rebounds and a steal. Michael Akuchie followed with nine points and four rebounds. Naz Bohannon led YSU on the glass, pulling down 10 rebounds and adding three points.

Defensively, Youngstown limited its opponent to scoring 69 points on 49.1 percent shooting from the field and 18.2 percent from downtown with two made 3-pt FGs. The Penguins caused 16 turnovers (16 tpg) while collecting nine steals (9 stl/g) and six blocked shots (6 blk/g). On the glass, YSU was tied 44-44 for an even +0.0 margin.



SEASON TICKET INFORMATION

Season tickets are now on sale for the 2018-19 campaign, with ticket packages starting at just \$75 with the option of adding women's basketball season tickets for \$30.

Also available is a \$175 Alumni All-Sports plan that includes season tickets for all of our ticketed sports (men's and women's basketball, football, men's and women's soccer, and volleyball).

Akron faculty and staff may purchase Upper Reserved season tickets for \$175 and Lower Reserved for \$260 plus an applicable Z-Fund commitment. The Zips also offer a family plan allowing two adults and two children season tickets for \$210.

Flexible payment plans are available and each package purchased includes a parking pass.

OLOJAKPOKE RETURNS TO ACTION

After having his 2017-18 campaign cut short due to season ending heart surgery, junior frontcourt specialist Emmanuel Olojakpoke returned to action. EMan played 13 minutes in Akron's season opener, scoring two points while causing havoc in the paint. Olojakpoke grabbed four rebounds, blocked two shots and had one steal.

SENIOR LEADER OPENS SEASON WITH A DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Senior guard/wing Jimond Ivey started the season off right by recording a double-double in Akron's first appearance of the season. Ivey scored 12 points and grabbed 11 rebounds. He lead the Zips on the glass, pulling down 10 defensive rebounds and grabbing one offensive board. From the floor, Ivey used a 4-of-6 performance from the floor and a 4-of-6 showing from the free throw line for the 12 points.

BANKS LEADS ZIPS IN DIVISION I DEBUT

Junior college transfer Channel Banks (Las Vegas, Nev.) buried 4-of-6 attempts from beyond the 3-point arc in Akron's season/home opener against Cedarville. He led the squad in scoring with 15 points while shooting 67-percent from downtown and an overall 71.4 percent (5-of-7) showing from the floor.

LOREN CRISTIAN JACKSON DID NOT MISS A BEAT

Transfer guard Loren Cristian Jackson didn't show any signs of rust as sophomore transfer from Long Beach State led the Zips offense and was second in scoring in the opener. He tallied 14 points in the 70-50 win over Cedarville. HE grabbed a second best seven rebounds while dishing out two assists. Jackson connected with four long range buckets on seven attempts for a 57.1 percent showing from beyond the arc.

STARTING THE SEASON OFF RIGHT

The Zips are 72-46 (.610) all-time in season openers with a 58-12 (.829) home record and 14-34 (.292) on the road. Since the 2004-05, UA is 10-5 (.667) when opening the season, standing 7-1 (.875) at home, 3-4 (.429) on the road and 2-0 (1.000) under head coach John Groce. In addition, Akron owns a 97-21 (.822) home-opening record and 32-4 (.888) at Rhodes Arena. The Zips have been winners in the last 17-of-18 home opening games. Akron is 18-8 in MAC openers, 10-1 at home since joining the league in 1992. Over the last 15 seasons, the Zips are 11-4 in MAC openers and 7-1 at home. Akron has won the last 7-of-8 MAC openers.

BEST START TO A SEASON

The 2015-16 Akron Zips started the season with a 3-0 winning streak. The three consecutive wins to open the season marks the best start in the Division I era of Akron men's basketball history. In addition, the 13-2 start was the best opening to a season in Akron basketball's Division I era, while the Zips win over the Arkansas Razorbacks marked the fifth consecutive season the Zips posted a win over a Power Five Conference opponent.

HOME SWEET HOME

Akron went 12-4 at Rhodes Arena in Groce's first year as head coach. He became the third Akron coach since 1940 to win his first six home games in the first season as head coach. The Zips rattled off seven straight wins at the JAR before falling in the MAC home opener to Buffalo. The Zips set the all-time longest home winning streak record at Rhodes Arena with 30 consecutive wins during the 2015-17 seasons, replacing the 26-game run the Zips made during the 1985-87 seasons under head coach Bob Huggins. The streak ranked No. 2 in the NCAA. In 34 seasons at the JAR, the Zips own a 394-124 (.761)all-time record, and in the last 14 seasons, Akron has posted a 187-30 (.862) record at the JAR.

GROCE DEBUTS WITH A WIN

Zips' head coach John Groce has spent over two decades on the sidelines of a basketball court as a coach and enters his 11th season as the lead man, and secondt at Akron. On April 6, 2017, Groce was named the 22nd head coach in Akron Basketball history. On Nov. 11, 2017, Groce and the Zips accomplished something that has only been done 10 times in Akron's history, debuting a coaching career with a win. Akron defeated Cleveland State 67-57 in Groce's Akron coaching debut to become the first coach since the 1984-85 season to win their initial game.

In fact, the last coach to start his Akron career with a win was Bob Huggins during the 1984-85 season against Western Illinois, 64-57. Prior to Huggins, six coaches were unsuccessful in accomplishing that feat since Thomas Dowler did so in 1939-40 against Franklin, 34-25.

THE LEBRON JAMES SHOE DEAL AND NIKE APPAREL

Since June 2008, the Akron men's basketball program has been partnered with Nike under which the Zips' shoes, game uniforms, warm ups and accessories are licensed under the Nike and LeBron James Trademarks.

The Zips are just one of three college programs in the country that are partnered with the LBJ line of Nike equipment, the others are Ohio State and Duquesne. Akron rocks six pairs of LBJ kicks in three different styles all customized to Akron Basketball.

The Akron Zips men's basketball team has six different uniforms, including four new looks for the 2018-19 season. Akron will continue to sport the grey set of uniforms modeled after the Team USA uniforms, which were new for 2017-18. The Grey uniforms feature the script Akron on the chest in blue outlined in the university gold. The numbers are depicted the same way which matches the blue piping that outlines the uniform. The shorts feature the Z-logo on both sides of the leg and are piped with the blue. Akron also had a new set of purple uniforms last season that are worn as a tribute to former coach and director of operations Dan Peters.

For 2018-19, the Zips will showcase new home and away, whites and blues, with combinations that brings back the gold. Both sets feature the script Akron across the chest in gold with the white set accented by blue outlines and piping, while the blues are outlined in white. The pants feature the Z-Logo on one leg and script Akron on the opposite side. Also, the Roo-Head debuts on the waistband. Speaking of Gold, Akron's "Gold Standard" uniforms are back. Yes, Akron will be rockin gold uniforms once again. The Team USA inspired uniforms feature the script Akron in blue across the chest with the Roo-Head on the sides of the shorts. The waistband features the Z-Logo.

The final uniform is a Fear The Roo uniform that is anthracite (dark grey) as the base color. Those are all the details we can divulge at this time.

UP NEXT

Akron will return to James A. Rhodes Arena for their third game of the season against Chicago State on Friday, Nov. 10 at 7 p.m. The Zips will then depart for the Cayman Islands Basketball Classic on Saturday to play Clemson in Game 1 on Monday, Nov. 19 at 11 a.m. ET.



WHAT IS A ZIP?

• One of the unique nicknames in collegiate athletics belongs to The University of Akron.

• Originally Zippers, athletic director Kenneth "Red" Cochrane officially shortened the nickname to the Zips in 1950. Twenty-five years earlier a campus-wide contest had been conducted to choose a nickname for the University's athletics teams.

• Suggestions submitted by students, faculty, and alumni included GoldenBlue Devils, Tip Toppers, Rubbernecks, Hillbillies, Kangaroos, and Cheveliers.

• The winner, freshman Margaret Hamlin, received a prize of \$10 for Zippers, a \$6 pair of rubber overshoes and a brand name of the BF Goodrich Company.

• The evolution of Zippy, UA's mascot, began 40 years ago when the student council decided the University needed a mascot.

• "Zippy" the kangaroo was officially declared the school's mascot on May 1, 1953. The first known printed reference to the mascot as "Zippy" was a 1965 Zip football press brochure. The Buchtelite's first use of the name "Zippy" came Sept. 24, 1965, in an identification of a photo of the cheerleaders listing "Mascot - 'Zippy' - Charles Huettner."

• In 2007, Zippy was named the Capital One National Mascot of the Year.

During his 24-year coaching career, he led his teams to 19 postseason appearances, including two Mid-American Conference championships and a NCAA Sweet 16 appearance, while improving and sustaining success in the classroom at every institution.

Groce inherited a highly successful Akron Zips basketball program that is viewed as one of the top mid-major programs in the nation, and he is determined to keep moving the needle forward.

In his first season at the helm, Groce was faced with the daunting task of rebuilding a staff and a competitive roster, which was a success. However, mid-season injuries decreased the size of the active roster and altered the style of play. Despite those setbacks, Akron made the adjustments and advanced to the quarterfinals of Mid-American Conference Tournament in Cleveland, Ohio for the 14th straight year.

Prior to joining the Zips, Groce was head men's basketball coach at the University of Illinois for five seasons. During his tenure at Illinois, he led the Illini to an average of 19 wins per season along with postseason appearances in three of his first four years in Champaign, owning a 95-75 record.

He arrived at Illinois after four seasons as head coach at Ohio University, where he led the Bobcats to an 85-56 overall record as well as Mid-American Conference Tournament titles and NCAA Tournament appearances in 2010 and 2012.

Ohio was the story of the 2012 Tournament, advancing to the Sweet 16 as a No. 13 seed with victories over No. 4 seed Michigan followed by No. 12 seed South Florida. The Bobcats made a strong push for the Elite Eight before falling to No. 1 seed North Carolina in overtime in the regional semifinal. It marked just the second time in Ohio's school history and first since 1964 that the Bobcats won multiple games in the NCAA Tournament. Ohio finished the 2012 season with a school-record 29 wins and was known for its pressure defense, ranking second nationally in turnover percentage and third in steals percentage.

Groce has a total of 24 years in the coaching profession and has been part of teams that have made 19 postseason appearances. His record in 15 years as an assistant was an impressive 349-156, giving him a combined record of 511-273.

Groce earned his first head-coaching job at Ohio following four seasons on Thad Matta's staff at Ohio State from 2005-08, the first two as assistant coach and last two as associate head coach. During Groce's time in Columbus the Buckeyes amassed a record of 105-35, advanced to the NCAA Championship game in 2007 and second round in 2006, claimed back-to-back outright Big Ten Championships in 2006 and 2007 and won the NIT in 2008. Groce played a key role in recruiting many of the top players at Ohio State and was named Rivals' 2006 National Recruiter of the Year.

In all, Groce spent eight years as an assistant under Matta. Prior to his time at Ohio State, Groce served three years on Matta's staff at Xavier from 2002-04 and one season at Butler in 2001. The Musketeers went 78-23 and made three straight NCAA appearances, advancing to the second round in 2002 and 2003 and the Elite Eight in 2004. Xavier also won consecutive Atlantic 10 titles in 2002 and 2003. Butler, meanwhile, went 24-8 and won a conference crown in 2001 while also advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Groce entered the Division I coaching ranks as a member of Herb Sendek's staff at North Carolina State from 1997-2000. The Wolfpack went 73-58 overall and advanced to the NIT in each of the four seasons Groce was in Raleigh, including a trip to the semifinals in 2000.

Groce got his start in coaching as an assistant at his alma mater, Taylor University in Upland, Indiana. Groce spent three years on Paul Patterson's staff from 1994-96, helping lead the Trojans to a 69-32 record and a pair of trips to the NAIA national tournament. Groce played for Patterson for three years from 1991-93 before making the transition to a student assistant role as a senior. Taylor compiled a 90-16 record and made three trips to the NAIA Tournament during Groce's playing career, including a 1991 Final Four appearance during his freshman season.

Groce, 46, earned a bachelor's degree in mathematics from Taylor in 1994. He and his wife, Allison, have two sons, Conner and Camden, and a daughter, Cate.

Ford enters his 11th season on Groce's staff and second year at Akron. Ford spent five years as an assistant at Illinois and four seasons at Ohio under Groce.

At Illinois, Ford helped lead the Fighting Illini to a 95-75 overall record with four postseason appearances, including a berth to the NCAA Tournament in 2013. At Ohio, the coaching duo led the Bobcats to an 85-56 overall record from 2008 to 2012. During that span, Ohio won two Mid-American Conference championships with two NCAA Tournament appearances, including a run to the Sweet Sixteen in 2012.

Prior to arriving in Athens, Ford served three years as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator on Larry Hunter's staff at Western Carolina (2006-08). He was promoted to associate head coach in the spring of 2008. During his tenure at Western Carolina, he was responsible for recruiting two eventual Southern Conference Defensive Players of the Year in Brigham Waringer (2010) and Richie Gordon (2011) as well as SoCon Freshman of the Year Harouna Mutombo (2009).

Ford began his coaching career as the head varsity coach at Jackson High School in Jackson, Ohio, spanning four seasons (2002-05). Before entering the coaching profession, Ford was a standout player at Ohio, starting all four years (1998-01). He led the Bobcats in 3-point field goals as a junior and senior. Ford's 166 career 3-pointers and 310 career assists currently rank seventh and eighth, respectively, in the Bobcats' program history.

"Dustin is very talented in all areas," Groce said. "We have been together for almost a decade now, and with that comes an understanding of what it takes to be successful and the processes that are involved for us to move our program forward. He not only has great familiarity with Akron, but with the MAC in general having played and coached in the conference previously. In addition Dustin grew up in the state and has established deep relationships throughout Ohio that will be beneficial to our program."

In his second year at Akron, Fulford is one of the more seasoned coaches on the staff. Prior to being hired at Akron, Fulford spent three seasons as an assistant at Missouri. He broke into the college ranks with Mizzou after building one of the nations most successful prep school programs in the country.

In 2009, Fulford founded Huntington Prep. in Huntington, W.Va. In five seasons as head coach, Fulford recorded a 139-18 overall record that included three consecutive seasons ranked inside the nation's Top 10 and a season with a No. 22 ranking (2010-11; 25-3 overall). The 2013-14 team finished No. 3 in the nation with a 29-5 record, the 2012-13 team posted a 30-3 overall mark with a No. 7 ranking, while the 2011-12 squad went 28-2 with a No. 5 finish. During his tenure at Huntington Prep., Fulford produced NBA prospects Andrew Wiggins and Gorgui Dieng of the Minnesota Timberwolves, as well as, Stefan Jankovic of the Miami Heat.

Fulford also spent time as the head coach for Mountain State Academy (2006-09) and as an assistant at Mountain State University (1997-2000). As head coach of Mountain State Academy, he posted an 81-14 record over three seasons, and as an assistant at Mountain State University, he helped the NAIA powerhouse to an 84-16 mark.

"We are really excited about adding Rob to our coaching staff," Groce said. "I was able to develop a relationship with him when he was at Huntington Prep. Watching Rob recruit, coach his team in practices and games, interact with our coaching staff, and mentor his players left a strong imprint on me. While at Missouri, Rob once again positively impacted their recruiting efforts, their player development and the coaching of their team. His unique perspective of being in both arenas, prep school and college, will be a great asset to our program as these experiences bring multiple international and

Pridgen, an Akron, Ohio native, joined the Zips' staff in 2017-18 after eight seasons as an assistant at Robert Morris.

During his time at RMU, the Colonials posted a 157-118 overall record with five 20-plus win seasons and a 97-45 Northeast Conference mark. He helped lead the Colonials to back-to-back NIT appearances in 2013 and 2014, earning a pair of NEC regular-season titles. In addition, Pridgen made two trips to the NCAA Tournament after the Colonials won their seventh and eighth NEC Tournament Championships in 2010 and 2015.

Prior to Robert Morris, Pridgen spent three seasons as an assistant coach at alma mater Roanoke College, where he helped guide the Division III Maroons to an overall record of 54-27 with 17-plus wins in all three campaigns. In 2006-07, the Maroons made an appearance in the Old Dominion Athletic Conference Tournament championship game and posted an overall record of 17-11 that season, followed by marks of 18-9 (2007-08) and 19-7 (2008-09).

Pridgen started his coaching career as an assistant at Division III Mount Union (2003-04) before spending two seasons at Indiana University of Pennsylvania (IUP, 2004-06).

As a player, Pridgen ranks sixth all-time on the career scoring list at Roanoke after compiling 1,586 points. In addition, he owns career records for 3-pointers (228), 3-point field goal attempts (568) and free-throw percentage (.864). In Roanoke's single-game record book, Pridgen owns the record for 3-pointers made in a game with nine. He played his prep career at St. Vincent-St. Mary High School in Akron, Ohio.

"I have always admired Robby," Groce said. "Robby was a big part of Robert Morris' success on the court and on the recruiting trail over the last 8 years. He is a very good evaluator of talent and brings a variety of geographic areas and established contacts to our recruiting efforts. In addition, he will make a big impact in our player development area where he is a gifted and passionate teacher of the game. The fact that Robby is from Akron, Ohio and played at St. Vincent St. Mary High School makes this opportunity even more special for him and his family. He takes a great deal of pride in the City of Akron and the University."

After Ford left Muskingum for Kent State, Pittis joined the Mount Union staff as an assistant coach for the 2007-08 season.
