Akron returns home to InfoCision Stadium – Summa Field to host Marshall on Saturday, Sept. 20 at 2 p.m. ESPN3 will broadcast the game live online with **Michael Reghi** calling the action and **Jerod Cherry** providing color commentary.

The Zips' radio broadcast will air on the Akron-IMG Sports Network [SportsRadio 1350 AM (WARF) in Akron (flagship), 1420 WHK in Cleveland, 1440 WHKZ in Warren/Youngstown] with **Steve French** calling the action, **Brad Detwiler** providing analysis, and **Joe Dunn** with sideline reports. The pregame show starts at 1 p.m. ET. A free audio stream is available at SportsRadio1350.com.

Akron alum and former Marshall head coach **Jack Lengyel** (1971-74), who took over at Marshall following the tragic plane crash that killed the 1970 Marshall football team, will participate in the coin toss. Lengyel, who was portrayed by Matthew McConaughey in the movie *We are Marshall*, was instrumental in petitioning the NCAA to lift the ban on freshman players. Lengyel also served as an assistant coach at Akron in 1959 under **Joe McMullen**.

Under the guidance of third-year head coach **Terry Bowden**, the Zips stand 1-1 after a 21-3 loss at Penn State on Sept. 6. The 2014 Akron squad returns 48 lettermen, including 14 starters. The Zips utilize a spread offense and a 4-3 defense.

After two games, junior QB **Kyle Pohl** (Farmersville, Ohio) is the Zips' leading rusher with 56 yards on 17 carries. Junior RB **Jawon Chisholm** (Harrisburg, Pa.), follows with 51 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries. Under center, Pohl is 47-of-82 for 516 yards and four touchdowns. Redshirt freshman QB **Tommy Woodson** (Monroeville, Pa.) is 5-of-8 for 92 yards and a touchdown. Junior WR **Zach D'Orazio** (Avon Lake, Ohio) is the top receiver with nine catches for 98 yards. Defensively, senior LB **C.J. Mizell** (Tallahassee, Fla.) is the team leader with 18 tackles, including eight solo stops, and a fumble recovery.

In this week's national rankings, Akron is ranked among the nation's Top 10 in four categories, including No. 1 in turnovers lost (0.0), No. 1 in red zone defense (0.250), No. 4 in turnover margin (2.00), and No. 6 in scoring defense (10.5). Individually, junior P **Zach Paul** (Broadview Heights, Ohio) is No. 12 in punting (46.5). Senior LB **C.J. Mizell** and junior DL **Alfonso Horner** (Miami, Fla.) are tied at No. 14 in fumbles recovered (1). Junior QB **Kyle Pohl** is No. 26 in completions (23.50).

Marshall, under the tutelage of fourth-year head coach **Doc Holliday**, stands 3-0 after a 44-14 win over Ohio. The Thundering Herd return 14 starters to their multiple offense and multiple defense. Marshall is receiving votes in the national ranking (No. 35).

After three games, junior RB **Devon Johnson** is the Herd's top rusher with 379 yards and four touchdowns on 47 carries. Senior QB **Raheem Cato** is 52-of-90 for 953 yards and nine touchdowns. Redshirt junior WR **Davonte Allen** has 305 yards and two touchdowns on 13 receptions. Defensively, sophomore S **Tiquan Lang** and redshirt senior DB **Darryl Roberts** lead the Herd with 22 tackles each.

In the NCAA stats, Marshall is ranked No. 2 in total offense (620.3), No. 2 in blocked punts (1), No. 3 in passing efficiency (169.78), and No. 15 in rushing offense (286.7). Redshirt sophomore S **A.J. Leggett** is No. 1 in forced fumbles (1.00), No. 2 in interceptions (1.0), and No. 4 in solo tackles (8.0). Redshirt senior P/K **Justin Haig** is No. 18 in field goals (1.67). Junior RB **Devon Johnson** is No. 11 in rushing yards per carry (8.06), No. 12 in rushing yards (379), and No. 13 in rushing TDs (4).

**AKRON-MARSHALL CONNECTIONS**

Akron has two players from West Virginia on its roster, brothers senior FB **Jeff Allen** (Morgantown, W. Va./Morgantown HS) and sophomore FB **Christian Allen** (Morgantown, W. Va./Morgantown HS). Both brothers enrolled at Akron in 2012. At Morgantown HS, Christian was a two-time All-State honoree who helped the Mohigans to the state semifinals as a senior. Jeff, who played on the defensive line in addition to full back as a senior, was also a two-time All-State selection.

Marshall has just 10 players from Ohio on its roster — freshman DL **Ryan Bee** (Ashland, Ohio/Hillsdale HS), r-freshman OL **Cody Collins** (Trotwood, Ohio/Trotwood-Madison HS), freshman OL **Nate Devers** (Massillon, Ohio/Washington HS), junior WR **Jack Gammon** (Columbus, Ohio/Bishop Watterson), freshman LB **Kaleb Harris** (Creston, Ohio/Norwayne HS), r-freshman LB **Zach Higginbotham** (Cincinnati, Ohio/Country Day), r-freshman OL **Chris Huhn** (Pickerington, Ohio/Pickerington North HS), r-junior LB **D.J. Hunter** (Middletown, Ohio/Middletown HS), r-senior OL **Trevor Mendelson** (Dublin, Ohio/Dublin Jerome HS), r-freshman K **Nick Smith** (Plain City, Ohio/Alder HS).

back (1977-78) while maintaining a 3.65 grade-point average in accounting, the highest GPA on the football team. Holliday was a three-year letter-winner at linebacker at West Virginia (1976-78) and earned both a bachelor's degree (1979) and a master's degree (1981) from WVU. Holliday started his coaching career as a graduate assistant with the Mountaineers.

When Akron defensive coordinator **Chuck Amato** was the head coach at N.C. State (2000-06), **Doc Holliday** served as the associate head coach and wide receivers coach (2000-04). Also on Amato's staff at that time was current UA defensive line coach **Todd Stroud**, who served as the Wolfpack's director of strength and conditioning (1999-04) and associate head coach/defensive line (2004-06).

Marshall competed as a member of the Mid-American Conference (MAC) from 1953-69 and 1997-2004. The Thundering Herd now plays in Conference USA.

**AKRON-MARSHALL: THE SERIES**

Saturday's game is the 13th meeting between Akron and Marshall in series history which began in 1974 and the teams' eighth meeting since UA jumped up to FBS play. The Thundering Herd holds an 8-4 series edge.

In the teams' last meeting on Nov. 5, 2004, the Zips claimed a 31-28 win at the Rubber Bowl. QB Charlie Frye threw three touchdown passes and led Akron back from a 21-point deficit. PK Jason Swiger kicked a 43-yard field goal on the final play after Marshall's punter fumbled, giving the Zips a 31-28 win in MAC play on a Friday night.

The Zips have won two of the last three meetings. UA has never won on the road (0-6) against Marshall.

Marshall and Akron are scheduled to play again on Sept. 17, 2016, in Huntington, W. Va.

- Six of Akron's 2014 opponents—Marshall (Military), Pittsburgh (Little Caesars Pizza), Ohio (Beef 'O' Brady's), Ball State (GoDaddy), Bowling Green (Little Caesars Pizza), and Buffalo (Famous Idaho Potato)—participated in bowls in 2013.
- This is Akron's sixth season playing on-campus in InfoCision Stadium – Summa Field. The Zips have a 10-21 record at the venue (1-0 in 2014). The stadium opened in 2009.
- Only one Zips' alum is playing in the NFL this season. LB **Chase Blackburn** (2001-04) enters his 10th season in the pros and second season with the Carolina Panthers.

**AIRING IT OUT**

Akron's returning wide receivers rank among the nation's Top 10 corps in four categories. The Zips lead the nation with the highest percentage of receptions returning with 96.6.

Entering the season, the Zips ranked No. 5 with 371 career receptions. Washington State held the top spot with 546. In career receiving yards, UA stood No. 5 with 4,449. UCF was first with 7,164. In career receiving touchdowns, Akron was tied for eighth with 28. Washington State was first with 47.

**LAST GAME: PENN STATE 21, AKRON 3**

The Akron defense forced three turnovers, but the Zips were only able to convert them into three points as UA dropped a 21-3 decision at Penn State on Sept. 6

Akron picked off Christian Hackenberg twice and forced a fumble on the day, while the offense was without a turnover for the second-straight week. However, Penn State posted 425 yards of total offense.

The Zips finished with 277 yards of total offense, but went 1-of-3 in the red zone and 5-of-17 on third down.

QB **Kyle Pohl** finished the game going 24-of-46 for 208 yards. **Jawon Chisholm** led the Zips with 30 yards on seven carries. **Devonte Morgan** led the Zips with seven tackles.

Hackenberg led the Penn State air attack, connecting on 22-of-36 passes for 319 yards and three touchdowns to go with his two interceptions.

**POHL NAMED MAC EAST OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

Junior QB **Kyle Pohl** was named the Mid-American Conference Offensive Player of the Week for the East Division on Sept. 1.

In the 41-0 shutout victory over Howard, Pohl led the Zips with a career-high four touchdown passes on 23-of-36 passing for 308 yards. He threw three touchdown passes in the first six minutes of action, as each scoring drive was under 38 seconds. Pohl led all rushers with a career-high 48 yards on seven carries. Additionally, Pohl was named the MAC's Scholar Athlete of the Week on Sept. 3.

**WELCOME TO THE BIG HOUSE**

The Akron seniors are members of a distinct breed: during their collegiate careers, they have played games in four of the nation's Top 5 biggest college stadiums.

As freshmen in 2011, the Zips began their careers in Columbus, falling to the Buckeyes, 42-0, before 105,001 fans. In 2012, Coach Bowden's first season at Akron, the Zips traveled to Tennessee, falling 47-26 before a crowd of 81,719.

Last season, the Zips traveled to Ann Arbor and took on No. 11 Michigan. With 107,102 screaming fans, the Zips saw a fourth-and-goal play for the win come up short as the Wolverines pulled out a 28-24 win.

In their first road game this fall, the Zips faced Penn State in front of 97,354 fans.

**PRESEASON HONORS**

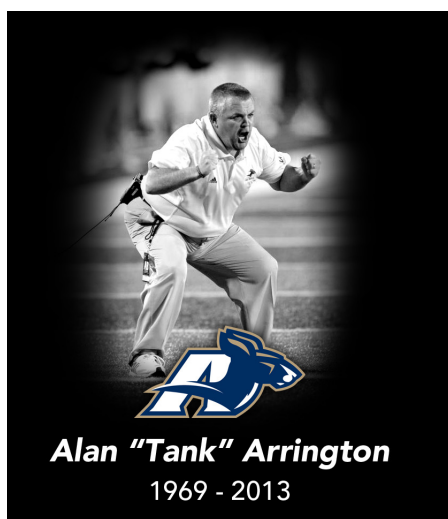

**WATCH LIST**

For the second consecutive year, junior P **Zach Paul** has been named one of 25 preseason candidates for the 2014 Ray Guy Award which honors the nation's top collegiate punter.

Last year, Paul was named third-team All-Mid-American Conference after averaging 42.9 yards per punt (65 punts), including 15 punts of 50-plus yards. He finished the season ranked sixth in the MAC and 30th nationally in punting average (42.9 ypp), while helping the Zips finish second in the MAC and 31st nationally in net punting as a team (38.18 ypp).

Paul also earned MAC East Division Special Teams Player of the Week on October 14 after averaging 45.7 yards per punt (nine punts) at Northern Illinois (October 12). He recorded one 60-yard punt, two touchbacks and two punts inside the NIU 20-yard line.

**HIGH EXPECTATIONS**

Akron was selected to finish second in the Mid-American Conference East Division this fall by the media behind Bowling Green. Following the Falcons and Zips were Ohio, Buffalo, Kent State, Miami (Ohio), and Massachusetts.

**POHL NAMED STARTING QUARTERBACK**

For the second consecutive year, junior QB **Kyle Pohl** handle duties under center. In 2013, he started all 12 games and was 225-of-402 passing for 2,438 yards and 14 touchdowns. He is the first quarterback to start in back-to-back seasons in the Bowden era.



In the opener against Howard, Pohl led the Zips with a career-high four touchdown passes on 23-of-36 passing for 308 yards. He threw three touchdown passes in the first six minutes of action, as each scoring drive was under 38 seconds. Pohl led all rushers with a career-high 48 yards on seven carries. For his efforts, he earned MAC East Offensive Player of the Week and Zips' Student-Athlete of the Week honors.

At Penn State, Pohl went 24-of-46 for 208 yards. After two games, Pohl is 47-of-82 for 516 yards and four touchdowns. He is the Zips' top rusher with 56 yards on 17 carries.

Backing up Pohl are senior **Nick Hirschman** (Los Gatos, Calif.) and redshirt freshman **Tommy Woodson** (Monroeville, Pa.). Hirschman played in three games last fall before suffering a season-ending injury. Woodson redshirted.

In the win over Howard, Woodson saw his first game action. He went 5-of-8 for 92 yards and a 40-yard touchdown pass to Austin Wolf.

**BORN TO RUN**

Senior RB **Jawon Chisholm** (Harrisburg, Pa.) is ready to cap off his senior season. As a junior last fall, the 6-1 back earned All-MAC honors and was the team's Offensive MVP after rushing for 869 yards and eight touchdowns while recording 12 career 100-yard rushing performances.

In the win over Howard, Chisholm rushed nine times for 21 yards and a touchdown. At Penn State, Chisholm led all rushers with 30 yards on seven carries.

After two games, Chisholm has 51 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries.

Junior RB **Conor Hundley** had 25 yards on five carries in the win over Howard. At Penn State, he had seven carries for 18 games.

After two games, Hundley has 43 yards on 12 carries.

**RECEIVERS ARE TOPS**

Akron's receiving corps return the top unit in the country (see extended note on p. 5). The top two from last season – junior **Zach D'Orazio** and sophomore **Fransohn Bickley** – return to the starting line-up. D'Orazio had 42 receptions for 567 yards and four touchdowns a year ago, while Bickley followed with 39 receptions for 407 yards and two TDs.

At Penn State, D'Orazio had 61 yards on five receptions. After two games, D'Orazio is the Zips' leading receiver with 98 yards on nine receptions.

At left tackle, junior **Quaison Osborne** (Hudson, Ohio) made his first collegiate start in the win over Howard. At left guard, junior **Dylan Brumbaugh** (Green, Ohio) started all 12 games at right guard in 2013.

At right guard, senior **Joe McNamara** (Pembroke Pines, Fla.), who transferred from Wisconsin after receiving his degree, saw action in all 12 games last year with six starts at left guard. At right tackle, redshirt junior **Isaiah Williams** (Cleveland, Ohio), who redshirted last season, had three starts on the defensive line in 2012.

Junior transfer **Tommy Brown** (Akron, Ohio) saw his first action as a Zip at Penn State. He played both right guard and right tackle.

In the 41-0 win over Howard, the O-line gave up no sacks.

**YOUNG & HUNGRY**

Akron offensive coordinator/QB coach **A.J. Milwee** (age 26, born Jan. 19, 1986) is the second-youngest offensive in the Football Bowl Subdivision behind Utah offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Brian Johnson, who is 25. **Defense**

**LINEBACKER U**

Akron's top three players are Sam, Mike, and Will; also known as senior **Justin March**, senior **C.J. Mizell**, and junior **Jatavis Brown**-- UA's starting linebackers.

As a sophomore last fall, Brown led UA's defense with 107 tackles, including 6.5 TFL and two sacks. March followed with 80 tackles, 4.5 TFL, and three interceptions. Mizell racked up 41 tackles, a team-best 7.5 TFL, and team-best 5.5 sacks.

In the 41-0 victory over Howard, Mizell tied his career-high with 10 tackles, including a career-best eight solo stops. He also recorded the first fumble recovery of his career with a six-yard return inside the red zone, setting up UA's second TD. At Penn State, Mizell had three tackles and a break-up.

After two games, Mizell is the Zips' top defender with 13 tackles, a fumble recovery, and a break-up.

March had five tackles and a forced fumble in the win over Howard. At Penn State, March had six tackles, including a TFL

After two games, March is tied for second in team tackles with 11 stops. He also has 2.0 TFL and a break-up.

Brown had five tackles, a TFL, and a break-up in the win over Howard. At Penn State, Brown had six tackles, including three solo stops and 1.5 TFL.

After two games, March is tied for second in team tackles with 11 tackles. He also has two break-ups and a forced fumble.

**DON'T MESS WITH CODY**

Junior DL **Cody Grice** (Akron, Ohio) has started every game of his collegiate career at nose guard for Akron (26 and counting). The 5-11, 283-lb. defender, who switched from full back to nose guard after redshirting his freshman season, has shaved his head this fall. Well, half of his head. The right side is clean-shaven; the left side is mean and unruly -- the way Grice plays.

Grice had two solo stops and a sack in the win over Howard. At Penn State, he had five tackles, and a sack for a loss of four yards.

**SECONDARY TO NONE**

Thanks to graduation, UA's secondary may pose the most questions this fall with three new starters. Seniors **Bre' Ford** (Bethel Park, Pa.) and **Devonte Morgan** (Cleveland Ohio) took over the starting nods at safety in the win over Howard.

At Penn State, Ford had three tackles and a 51-yard interception return.

Morgan led the Zips at Penn State with seven tackles.

Juniors **John Senter** (Huber Heights, Ohio) and **DeAndre Scott** (Frederick, Md.) handled corner duties. The defense held Howard scoreless. The shutout was UA's first since a 41-0 blanking of Morgan State (Sept. 12, 2009).

**BATTLE OF THE LEGS**

Junior K **Robert Stein** (Cincinnati, Ohio) returns for the Zips, but freshman **Tom O'Leary** (Tucker, Ga.) was listed ahead of him on the depth chart for the first two games. The team's leading scorer in 2013, Stein had nine field goals and went 29-of-30 in PAT for 56 points.

O'Leary had a workout in his collegiate debut. In the 41-0 win over Howard, the frosh converted five (of six) extra points (one was blocked). He attempted a 25-yard field goal.

Stein handled kickoff duties. In the win over Howard, he racked up 356 yards on six kickoffs (59.3 average) with two touchbacks and one out-of-bounds. At Penn State, Stein reclaimed his kicker status after O'Leary missed a 31-yard field goal. Stein made a 28-yard field goal, the Zips' only points in the game. He also kicked off twice for 130 yards (65.0 avg.).

**FIELD POSITION MATTERS**

Junior P **Zach Paul** (Broadview Heights, Ohio) has given the Zips good field position in their first two games.

In the win over Howard, he punted four times for 180 yards (45.0 average) with a long of 59 yard. Two landed inside the 20 and two were touchbacks. Paul also had a 65-yard kickoff.

At Penn State, Paul punted seven times for 331 yards, averaging 47.3 yards per punt. He gave the Zips vital field position at crucial times during the game. His long punt on the day was 62 yards. Two punts were inside the 20, and two were touchbacks. Akron remained in a tight game until 2:38 in the third quarter.

After two games, Paul punted 11 times for 511 yards (46.5 avg.). Four of his punts were longer than 50 yards, including a 62-yarder.

**On the Sidelines**

**THERE IS NO PLACE LIKE HOME**

Akron is in its sixth season on campus at InfoCision Stadium – Summa Field. The Zips have a 10-21 record at the venue.

The 30,000-seat stadium features 17 suites, state-of-the-art video board, and 80,000 square feet of academic space used daily by all University students. Additionally, the Sport Science and Wellness Education Department conducts classes on two levels, and the University's Alumni Association resides there as well.

**HOME GROWN TALENT**

The majority of the Akron squad hails from the state of Ohio, including 12 student-athletes from the Akron-Canton area alone. The second-most represented state is Florida with 17 Zips. The player that traveled the farthest to school is senior QB **Nick Hirschman** who calls Los Gatos, Calif., home.

**ZIPS LIVE COACH'S RADIO SHOW**

**WHAT IS A ZIP?**

One of the unique nicknames in collegiate athletics belongs to The University of Akron. Originally Zippers, athletic director Kenneth "Red" Cochrane officially shortened the nickname to the Zips in 1950. Twenty-five years earlier a campus-wide contest had been conducted to choose a nickname for the University's athletics teams.

Suggestions submitted by students, faculty, and alumni included Golden Blue Devils, Tip Toppers, Rubbernecks, Hillbillies, Kangaroos, and Cheveliers.

The winner, freshman Margaret Hamlin, received a prize of \$10 for Zippers, a \$6 pair of rubber overshoes and a brand name of the BF Goodrich Company.

The evolution of Zippy, UA's mascot, began 40 years ago when the student council decided the University needed a mascot.

"Zippy" the kangaroo was officially declared the school's mascot on May 1, 1953. The first known printed reference to the mascot as "Zippy" was a 1965 Zip football press brochure. The Buchtelite's first use of the name "Zippy" came Sept. 24, 1965, in an identification of a photo of the cheerleaders listing "Mascot - 'Zippy' - Charles Huettner."

In 2007, Zippy was named the Capital One National Mascot of the Year.

- **Zippy** is just one of five female-gendered college mascots in Division I athletics. Do you know the other four? (YoUDee, the Delaware Blue Hen; Mrs. Wuf of N.C. State; Lucy Lobo of New Mexico; and Wilma Wildcat of Arizona)
- Akron was the first school to jump from Division I-AA football (now called FCS) to I-A (now called FBS). The Zips made the move in 1987.
- Hall of Fame coach **John Heisman** coached football from 1893-94 for Buchtel College (Akron's original name). The Cleveland native went on to take Georgia Tech to the national championship in 1917. The Heisman Trophy, given to the nation's most outstanding college player, is named in his honor.

Terry Bowden is in his third season at the helm of the UA program. He was named the Zips' 27th all-time head coach on Dec. 22, 2011, but is just the seventh person to hold the position since 1960.

Last season, Bowden led UA to its highest win total since 2008 by going 5-7 overall and 4-4 against the MAC, as well as ending the year by winning three straight and four of its last five games. The Zips went 3-3 at home, including a 31-29 win over Toledo in the season finale and a 16-7 victory over neighborhood rival Kent State to regain possession of the coveted wooden Wagon Wheel.

Additionally in 2013, seven players were named All-Mid-American Conference, highlighted by first-team selection sophomore linebacker Jatavis Brown – the first Zip named to the first team since Bryan Wagner in 2011. Last year's squad also landed defensive lineman Nico Caponi, sophomore quarterback Kyle Pohl and sophomore kicker Robert Stein on the Academic All-MAC Team – the most for the program since 2006. Eight other student-athletes were awarded academic honorable mention.

In 2012, Bowden, serving as offensive coordinator, ushered in a spread offense that resulted in an aerial attack responsible for a school-record and MAC season-high 30 passing touchdowns. The offense, which was conducted in a hurry-up no-huddle style, was led by fifth-year senior transfer quarterback Dalton Williams, who set the program's single-season record for touchdown passes (25) and pass completions (326-for-522), while compiling the third most passing yards (3,387) in a season in school history.

Williams' arm was complimented by sophomore running back Jawon Chisholm's 953 yards rushing on the strength of 180 carries and senior receiver Marquelo Suel's team-high 820 receiving yards off 76 catches. Suel's receptions were the second most in a single season in program history and earned him a place on the All-MAC Team.

The UA offense finished 2012 ranked first in the MAC and 16th nationally in passing (312.8 ypg), and sixth in the league and 45th in the country in total offense (427.2 ypg). Akron's 5,126 yards of total offense ranked sixth in the MAC and 61st nationally, and was the second most in a season in program history, behind the 2003 squad's 5,643.

Other highlights of the 2012 season include redshirt freshman kicker Robert Stein being one of 38 student-athletes named to the Academic All-MAC Team. Additionally, 11 Zips earned academic honorable mention from the league. Fifth-year senior transfer linebacker Kurt Mangum was selected to compete in the NFL Players Association Collegiate Bowl after he led the squad with 110 tackles.

Bowden, who served as a studio analyst and color commentator with ABC Sports' college football for 10 years, was the head coach at Auburn from 1993-98 and spent the three seasons prior to coming to Akron at Division II North Alabama.

In his time at North Alabama, Bowden led the Lions to a 29-9 record and three consecutive playoff appearances. In 2011, the squad went 9-3 and advanced to the second round of the playoffs. He was named Gulf South Conference Co-Coach of the Year in 2009 when the team went 11-2 and

won the GSC championship and advanced to the quarterfinals of the playoffs. He followed that in 2010 by guiding the Lions to a 9-4 record and another trip to the playoffs.

As head coach of Auburn, he went 47-17-1 (73.4 winning pct.) and posted the best opening five-year run of any head football coach in school history. Also during his time with the Tigers, Bowden became the first collegiate coach in 50 years to win his 100th career game by his 40th birthday.

In his first season at AU, he became the first coach in Division I-A (now FBS) history to have an undefeated and untied season in his inaugural year at that level.

Prior to his stint at Auburn, Bowden built two programs from the ground up as head coach at Salem College (W.Va.) and Samford University (Ala.). When he took the job at Salem in 1983 he became the nation's youngest head coach in college football at age 26.

Inheriting a Samford program which had won just six games in three years prior to his arrival, Bowden led the Bulldogs to a 9-1 record his first year, tying the record for the best season in school history. The squad led the nation in total offense (523 yards per game) and scoring offense (51.7 points per game), both national Division III records. The team's 40 touchdown passes were also a national single-season record.

AKRON, Ohio – Behind an offensive attack led by junior QB Kyle Pohl, Akron had no trouble handling Howard in its season opener, cruising to a 41-0 victory at InfoCision Stadium – Summa Field.

The decisive win was Akron's first in a season-opening contest since 2007, when the Zips defeated Army 22-14.

Pohl finished the night 23-of-36 with 308 yards through the air and four touchdowns to help Akron rack up 506 yards and 24 first downs as a team. He threw touchdowns to three different receivers and tallied 48 yards rushing on seven carries.

One of Pohl's top targets, sophomore Mykel Traylor-Bennett, caught four passes for 89 yards and his two touchdowns, his first two TDs as a Zip.

C.J. Mizell recorded 10 tackles (eight solo) and a fumble recovery to lead the defense as the unit recorded its first shutout since a 41-0 triumph over Morgan State on Sept. 12, 2009.
