#### THE AKRON-DUQUESNE SERIES

DU leads the all-time series, 8-1

The Dukes own an 8-1 record all-time over the Zips, winning six consecutive games since 2010. The Zips met Duquesne during the 2019-20 season as the Dukes posted an 88-63 win over Akron at the Jar.

#### **LAST TIME OUT**

The Zips dropped to 2-1 after falling to Youngstown State on the road, 57-55 on Monday, Nov. 15.

Redshirt senior Jordyn Dawson (Huntington, W Va.) led the Zips with a double-double scoring 19 points and grabbing 12 rebounds, while freshman Reagan Bass (Strongsville, Ohio) rounded out the double-figure scoring with 10 points and grabbed nine boards. Sophomore Annika Corcoran (Painesville, Ohio) contributed nine points.

The score remained knotted for three minutes before YSU knocked down a trio of three pointers that put the Penguins in control 55-49 with 1:45 left to play. The remainder of the game was a back-and-forth affair marked by clutch free throw shooting by the Zips. With 2.8 seconds remaining and down two, Ferrell was sent to the line to shoot a pair, but couldn't convert and YSU escaped with a 57-55 victory.

Akron shot 32.3 percent (20-of-62) from the floor and 19.2 percent (5-of-26) from beyond the arc, while YSU shot 32.2 percent from the floor and connected on 9-of-28 from three-point range. The Zips struggled from the charity stripe connecting on just 10-of-18 (55.6 percent).

#### THE 2021-22 CAMPAIGN

Head coach Melissa Jackson has many familiar faces on the roster for her fourth season at the helm. Jackson has gone on to capture 38 victories including owning the second-most wins by a head coach through three seasons in program history.

Senior Jordyn Dawson (Huntington, W.Va.), who averaged a team-high 15.9 points and 6.9 rebounds per contest a year ago en route to third-team All-Mid-American Conference accolades leads the returners. Akron will also be bolstered by the return of nearly its entire 2020-21 roster, including seniors Gabrielle Brown-Mitchell (Solon, Ohio)(4.2 ppg), Kendall Miller (Akron, Ohio)(5.5 ppg, 2.33 apg) and Colleen Neitzel (Rocky River, Ohio)(5.2 ppg, 3.9 rpg), junior Lonasia Brewer (Akron, Ohio) (10.3 ppg, 5.1 rpg) and redshirt sophomore Emma Tecca (Tallmadge, Ohio) (5.4 ppg), who all started in double-figure contests for the Zips.

Juniors Rachel Martindale (Pittsburgh, Pa.)(5.8 ppg) and Molly Neitzel (Rocky River, Ohio)(6.9 ppg, 3.5 rpg), redshirt sophomore Layne Ferrell (Franklin, Ohio)(5.5 ppg) and sophomore Alexis Stewart (Hamilton, Ontario) (2.9 ppg) added valuable contributions for Akron appearing in double-digit games last season.

Redshirt freshmen Alanna Carter (Mason, Ohio) and Sabhbh Edwards Murphy (County Clare, Ireland) each return after being sidelined for part or all of the campaign a season ago. Newcomers Reagan Bass(Strongsville, Ohio), Abby Carter (Geneva, Ohio), Annika Corcoran (Painesville, Ohio) and Zakia Rasheed(Avon, Ind.) round out the Akron women's basketball roster.

- The 2021-22 season marks the 48th season of competition for the Akron women's basketball program. - As a team, Akron ranks 21stth in the NCAA in defensive rebounds per game (32.0), 74th in rebounds per game (42.0), 36th in three-point FG made (18.0), 17th in fewest turnovers (9), and 40th in blocked shots per game (7.0), and 14th in fewest turnovers (36).

- The Zips rank 37th in FG percentage Defense (32.6), 44th in blocked shots per game (5.3)

- **Jordyn Dawson** led the Zips a year ago averaging a team-high 15.9 points and 6.9 rebounds per game en route to a third-team All-MAC accolade.

Jordyn Dawson is rated 6th in the NCAA in points per game (24.0) and 73rd in FG made (27), 18th in steals per game (3.67).

Akron owns a 30-17 mark under head coach **Melissa Jackson** when shooting 40 percent or better from the field, including a 2-0 record this season. When hitting at a 35-percent clip or better from beyond the arc, the Zips maintain a 21-14 mark, including a 0-1 record this season.

- Two different Akron players have scored in double figures this season led by Jordyn Dawson tallying

10 or more points in 3 contests this year. She is joined by **Reagan Bass** (2).

- Akron has connected on five or more three pointers in all three games this season, and 33 of its last 36 contests overall. The Zips hit on a season-high 13 triples in a 97-54 win over Slippery Rock, the best single-game effort for Akron since making 16 three pointers in the opening round of the 2018 Mid-American Conference Tournament on March 5, 2018.

#### **SCOUTING DUQUESNE**

The Dukes, stand 1-4 under the direction of 9th-year head coach Dan Burt after falling to in-state opponent Pitt, 69-64 on Saturday, Nov. 20. The Dukes had four players score in double figures with Fatou Pouye leading the way with 17 points. Megan McConnell added 14, while both Libby Bazelak and Tes Myers finished with 11 points.

Duquesne is averaging 60.2 points per game on 35.9 percent shooting (100-of-281) from the floor and 31.2 percent (39-of-125) from long range. The Dukes have three players averaging in double-figures led by Pouve (14.0), Myers (12.6) and McConnell (10.0). McConndell leads in rebounding averaging 6.4 boards per game.

Defensively, the Dukes have held their opponents to 67.6 points per game on 39.1 percent shooting from the floor and only 39 percent (32-of-108) from beyond the arc. DU has 89 turnovers while collecting 31 steals. On the glass, the Dukes have been out-rebounded by opponents, 198-188 for a -2 margin.

#### **MAC PRESEASON POLL**

The Zips under fourth-year head coach **Melissa Jackson**, were picked to finish 12th as a team in the 2020-21 Mid-American Conference Preseason Coaches poll. The Chippewas were followed by Ohio (128), Ball State (119), Buffalo (108), Eastern Michigan (94), Kent State (88), Toledo (71), Northern Illinois (42), Miami (41), Akron (39), Bowling Green (38) and Western Michigan (28).

Buffalo was picked the favorite to win the MAC Tournament Championship, followed by Ohio, BGSU, Ball State, and EMU also receiving votes.

#### **HOME COOKING**

Inside the friendly confines of James A. Rhodes Arena, the Zips have seen a lot of success over the course of the past 17 seasons. When playing on its home court, Akron owns a 110-72 record dating back to the 2004-05 campaign.

In 2020-21, Akron is 4-6 at the JAR, scoring 69.3 points per game, shooting more than 42 percent (.424) from the floor, averaging 33.5 rebounds per game, with assists on 157 baskets and owning a 1.1 assist/ turnover ratio.

Last season, she was a key player in Hiland's 28-1 record and claiming the Division III State Chámpionship.

Faith Stinson | 6'2, Forward

Stinson, a forward from Thornville, Ohio, is a three-year letterwinner at Sheridan High School. A two-time first team All-Ohio, first-team MVL, and first team Southeast District, she has garnered 982 points, 663 rebounds, and 208 blocks during her career. #### THE NUMBERS ON AKRON BASKETBALL...

Fueled by a program-best 14-4 league record, the Zips captured their first ever Mid-American Conference Tournament title and NCAA Tournament berth in 2013-14.

Akron has made seven postseason appearances in its history, six of which have come in the last 10 seasons. In addition to the NCAA Tournament in 2014, the Zips advanced to the WNIT in 2016, 2015, 2013 and 1999, and the Women's Basketball Invitational in 2010 and 2019.

The number of Akron players in the Zips 44 year history who have eclipsed the 1,000 career point milestone.

The number of wins Akron posted in 2013-14 and 2012-13, which is a program record. The 23 victories two years ago marked a nine-win turnaround from the previous season. 46.6 The number of points that Rachel Tecca and leaves Luburah combine to score per game as Hanna Luburgh combine to score per game as seniors in 2013-14. Together, the seniors make up the highest scoring duo in the country.

The Zips have placed a student-athlete on the All-MAC Academic Team 32 times, highlighted by Jessie Crooks (2004-07), Hannah Plybon (2014-17) and Megan Sefcik (2016-19) making the squad three seasons in a row. A record five student-athletes earned Academic All-MAC recognition in 2012-13.



Third Season at Akron

Fourth-year head coach Melissa Jackson enters the 2021-20 campaign after leading the Zips to a 7-14 overall record and an 4-14 mark in the Mid-American Conference action a season ago.

Since taking over, Jackson has gone on to capture a 38-43 overall record (as of March 3), including owning the most victories by a head coach through two seasons in program history and posting top-eight league finishes in back-to-back campaigns.

The Zips entered the 2019-20 campaign returning four starters, all seniors. Shayna Harmon, Haliegh Reinoehl and Caitlin Vari, started all 31 games for Akron as juniors, while Shaunay Edmonds earned the starting assignment 24 times.

The challenge for Jackson and her staff in year two was to continue the growth and development both on and off the court that her players established in her initial campaign as head coach. That was important for Jackson as the Zips' roster boasted six newcomers seeking to mesh with a talented core of upperclassmen.

Akron opened the season winning four of its first five games en route to going 7-4 in non-conference action. The Zips added their third tournament title under Jackson claiming the trophy at the 2019 Puerto Rico Clasico in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

Akron improved its conference ledger by one win on the year at 8-10 overall, doubled its road victory total from a year earlier and earned a home MAC Tournament game for the second consecutive season.

The Zips proved a challenging opponent for its MAC foes as Akron was involved in seven games decided by five points or less, and 13 by 10 or fewer points.

One of Akron's biggest wins came on Feb. 19, 2020, when the Zips sparked by a 24-point, 13-rebound effort from Reinoehl, took down Buffalo, the defending MAC Tournament champion, 69-63. The victory marked the first for Akron on the Bulls' homecourt since the 2014-15 campaign.

Reinoehl and Jordyn Dawson were tabbed as third- and honorable-mention All-MAC selections, while Edmonds and Reinoehl became the 18th and 19th Zips, respectively, to surpass the 1,000-point plateau.

Akron registered a 3.23 team GPA for the fall 2019 term, with Alyssa Clay, Harmon, Kendall Miller and Vari garnering Academic All-MAC accolades.

In her first season as head coach, Jackson led the Zips to a 16-15 overall record, a +7 win differential from the 2017-18 campaign, and a 7-11 Mid-American Conference mark. Akron secured a No. 8 seed in the 2019 MAC Championship Tournament and later participated in the 2019 Women's

Basketball Invitational, the teams second trip to the WBI since 2010 and first postseason tournament since 2016.

Throughout the 2018-19 season, Jackson secured her first head coach victory against North Carolina A&T (49-36), became the second head coach in program history to win the first three games of a debut season and first to do so in the Division I era, and cemented her name into the Zips history books as the all-time winningest first-year head coach with 16 victories.

The University of Akron Director of Athletics Larry Williams announced on June 27, 2018, that Jackson was selected as the head coach of the Akron women's basketball program.

Following her 10-year stint on the Zips staff that included six years as associate head coach, Jackson became the 10th head coach in Akron women's basketball history.



As the recruiting coordinator, Jackson was instrumental in bringing the Akron women's basketball program to the forefront of the MAC. Akron's 2013-14 senior class marked Jackson's first full recruiting class at Akron, and ended their careers as the all-time winningest class in school history with 74 victories over four years.

In 2015-16, two of her pupils, Anita Brown and Hannah Plybon, garnered All-MAC honors. Brown, who averaged 18.8 points, 6.7 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.3 steals per contest, while connecting at a 47.3 percent clip from the field en route to earning second-team all-conference accolades. Plybon turned in a breakout campaign in 2014-15 registering 13.2 points, 3.3 rebounds and 1.9 assists per game en route to earning third-team All-MAC honors. She set a then single-season school record for three pointers made with 97 and attempted the second-highest single-season total (260) in program history.

Jackson mentored five of the most prolific passers in Akron single-season history, Kacie Cassell, Megan Barilla, Ayla Guzzardo, Natasha Williams, and Shaunay Edmonds, while Cassell, Barilla, and Brown each rank in the programs top-ten for most assists in a career. Jackson's coaching on and off the court helped Cassell become the programs all-time assists leader during her four-year career (2010-14) with 688 total assists, while she also holds the top two spots for most assists in single-season history (2012-13, 2013-14).

From 2012-14, Jackson transformed Hanna Luburgh into one of the most feared shooting guards in the conference. Luburgh left the program as the fourth all-time leading scorer in school history with 1,634 points. She also set the single-season scoring record as a senior, posting a league-leading 734 points. The two-time all-conference and all-MAC Tournament selection ranked 13th in the country in points per game.

Also under Jackson's watch, Taylor Ruper earned All-MAC honors in 2012. During Ruper's career at Akron, Jackson helped to develop her into Akron's then all-time leading three-point shooter, and one of the best long-range shooters in the league. Four years later, Plybon under the guidance of

Jackson, became the new all-time three-point specialist and ended her career with a program-best 313 triples made, including 104 three-pointers made in 2015-16.

Jackson joined the UA staff after helping to guide the University of Delaware program to three postseason berths – including a trip to the NCAATournament in 2007 – in four seasons while in the same role from 2004-05 to 2007-08.

During Jackson's time at Delaware, the Blue Hens captured a Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) regular season championship in 2004-05, a pair of WNIT berths in 2005 and 2006, and earned an at-large bid to the Big Dance with a 26-6 record in 2007. Overall, UD posted a four-year record of 80-44 (.645) and won 71 percent of its conference games (51-21) during that stretch. Jackson, who worked primarily with the guards at Delaware, helped mentor 2007 WNBA draftee (No. 18 overall) and former Detroit Shock guard Tyresa Smith and a pair of CAA defensive players of the year in Smith ('06, '07) and Kyle DeHaven ('08). Jackson also played key roles in the recruitment of Jocelyn Bailey, a Top 100 player according to HoopGurlz.com in 2008, and Tesia Harris, the 14th-best swing guard in the nation according to the All-Star Girls Report in 2007.

Jackson played four seasons at the University of Richmond and earned a political science degree in May of 2004. She appeared in 50 career games as a guard with the Atlantic 10 Conference power and earned WNIT berths in both 2003 and 2004. Her '04 squad advanced to the semifinals.

A former All-State selection at Hazleton Area High School in Hazleton, Pa., Jackson is a member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and has participated in a number of charitable programs, including Habitat for Humanity, Helping Hands and Adopt a Grandparent.

Jackson and her husband, Drew, currently reside in Bay Village with their sons, Luke and Ben.
