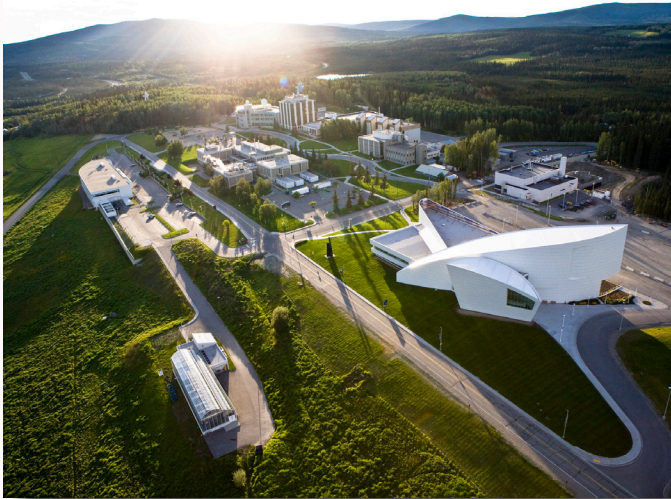

The University of Alaska Fairbanks campus is located 160 miles south of the Arctic Circle, 65 degrees north latitude. It sits atop a hill just a few miles west of downtown Fairbanks, Alaska's second-largest city, and looks south over the immense Tanana Flats to the Alaska Range, home of the continent's tallest peak, Mount McKinley.

The hill where UAF now stands was once part of a federal Agricultural Experiment Station. In 1915, the U.S. Congress approved money and transferred a piece of land from this station to establish a school of higher education. With a federal land

grant, the institution began as the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines. Two years later, the Alaska Territorial Legislature added funding and, in 1922, when construction of the first building was completed, the college opened its doors to students. In the first year, a faculty of six offered 16 classes to a student body of six. Commencement the following year consisted of a single graduate.

Today, UAF is the flagship campus of Alaska's statewide university system. It is a Land, Sea and Space Grant university with branch campuses and extension centers that serve communities throughout the western, northern and central regions of the state. UAF's College of Rural and Community Development geographically serves nearly two-thirds of the state, representing more than 160 villages, and is committed to providing education to all Alaskans, particularly Alaska Natives.

As the state's only doctoral degree-granting institution, UAF is Alaska's research hub, with its scientists attracting millions of research dollars each year in fields as diverse as global climate studies, cultural anthropology, biomedicine and arctic engineering. It is home to multiple research centers and institutes that house scientists studying some of the world's most compelling questions. UAF's location in Interior Alaska provides easy access to glaciers, permafrost, the Pacific and Arctic oceans, and the elements of a subarctic climate. Accordingly, several research centers and academic departments focus their scholarly work on specific problems of the North.

This research-rich environment allows UAF's more than 9,000 students to learn alongside leaders in their major fields and participate in hands-on projects as both undergraduate and graduate students. At the same time, UAF's curriculum emphasizes the importance of a strong liberal education foundation, resulting in students who graduate prepared not only to enter the workforce but also to be active participants in our world community. UAF offers 161 graduate and undergraduate degrees and 25 certificates in 115 disciplines. Each year, UAF awards degrees and certificates to nearly 1,000 students, who hail from across the country and world. The University of Alaska Fairbanks is accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities.

In addition to its academic and research mission, the campus is a center of cultural, artistic, recreational and social activity in the community and state. It hosts the annual Festival of Native Arts and the Fairbanks Summer Arts Festival, as well numerous concerts, art exhibits and theatrical productions throughout the year. Academic departments and clubs often sponsor guest lectures open to the public and the campus is home to the UA Museum of the North, a natural history museum that attracts nearly 100,000 visitors each year. The university's athletic teams, the Nanooks, enjoy strong support from the community, and the campus' extensive trail system is a draw for outdoor enthusiasts in all seasons. As one of Fairbanks' largest employers, UAF's presence has a positive effect on the local economy. UAF faculty, staff and students also contribute their time and effort to Fairbanks organizations as volunteers, mentors, coaches and supporters. The result is a university fully engaged in the community it serves.



The 2009-10 season looks promising for the combined ten Nanook varsity teams—volleyball, cross country, swimming, men and women’s basketball, ice hockey, rifle, and skiing.

Several Nanook competitors earned All-American recognition during 2008-09 in hockey, rifle and swimming.

One All-American, goalie Chad Johnson, proved to be one of the strongest goaltenders in the nation setting new all-time records. For the year, he finished first in the NCAA in save percentage (.940), and first in goals-against average (1.66), en route to winning CCHA Goaltender and Player of the Year Award.



With ten national titles under their belt, the rifle team continues to add All-Americans to their roster. Although they fell short of the title in 2009, finishing fourth during the 2009 NCAA Rifle National championships, four shooters achieved All-American status. For the second straight year, junior shooter Patrik Sartz earned First Team All-American in smallbore and Second Team All-American in air rifle, while Cody Rutter captured the same accolades for the first time. Billy Galligan and Layne Lewis earned Honorable Mention in smallbore. The Nanooks return every shooter next season in search for their fourth national championship in five years.

UAF swimmers went against the clock this past season and two seniors posted new records for the books. Mariya Pavlovskaya had the best results in Nanook history with her 7th place finish in the 400 IM during the 2009 Swimming Championships. Mar Brunet swam a school record in the 200-yard backstroke with the time of 2:04.06 in the prelims, and qualified 9th in the finals. Brunet set two lifetime bests in the 100 and 200 backstroke, and left Houston as a two-time All-American performer.

The women’s basketball team fought with a season plagued with injuries in 2008-09. They ended up capturing the Harris Shelton Spirit of Competition Award for their refusal to quit, leaving the team with three initial players to finish the season.

The person in charge of supervising athletics at the University of Alaska Fairbanks, Forrest Karr, will oversee Nanook athletics for his sixth year. A graduate of the University of Wisconsin Law School and the University of Notre Dame and its hockey program, he began leading the department in July 2005, after working for one year as Assistant AD for Compliance.

During Karr’s time as director, the Nanooks have crowned five NCAA champions, including three consecutive national titles for the rifle team and two individual national titles for skier Marius Korthauer at the 2008 NCAA Skiing Championships and shooter Patrik Sartz at the 2008 Rifle Championships. In addition, men’s skier Einar Often was the male recipient of the 2008 NCAA Division II Sportsmanship Award. Under Karr’s leadership, the department hosted the 2007 NCAA Rifle Championships, which set an NCAA attendance record.



Karr has guided the implementation and growth of the women’s swimming program and is responsible for directing the renovation of the E.F. Horton rifle range.





The University of Alaska Fairbanks Department of Athletics has taken a great deal of pride in the success of its student-athletes in the classroom. It was another successful year for the Blue and Gold as two Alaska Nanook programs were recognized with national team academic awards and 18 individual student-athletes made their respective academic all-conference squads.

The Nanooks achieved their highest cumulative grade-point average ever in the 2008-09 academic year with a 3.25 department average.

Senior standout Trevor Hyatt, a Rhodes Scholar and a Hockey Humanitarian nominee, was named a Lowe's Senior Class Second Team All-American and has been named to the Academic All-American First Team in the At-Large Division by ESPN The Magazine, as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America. Hyatt, who maintained a perfect 4.0 grade-point average all four years, graduated in May with honors from Alaska and earned a degree in civil engineering. In addition to his humanitarian accolades, Hyatt was a three-peat on the CCHA All-Academic team, named UAF's Civil Engineering Student of the Year, and was honored as the winner of the Joel Wiegert Award, which recognizes UAF's outstanding graduating senior man.

The Nanook women's scholar athlete of the year, Elisabeth Habermann of cross country and skiing, was named the Intercollegiate Athletics Council Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Habermann, a dual sport athlete, was a solid contributor to both teams this season. In the classroom, the chemistry major has a 3.92 GPA.

The men's and women's cross country team finished with nine student-athletes on the GNAC All-Academic team.

The Nanook volleyball team also pounded the books, and was one of 39 Division II teams to earn the American Volleyball Coaches Association Team Academic Award for having a team GPA over 3.30.



The women's basketball team landed five players on the Academic All-Conference Team, led by Grace Milliken who was one of three players to have a perfect 4.0 GPA.

The women's swim team repeated its academic prowess, earning team all-academic honors for the second straight season.

Others recognized with national all-academic honors included women's swimming's Courtney Nichols and rifle's Taylor Beard, Cody Rutter, William Galligan, Layne Lewis and Jace Bures.

For the year, we are proud to say that 70 out of the 116 Nanook athletes maintained a 3.0 or B average through two semesters (60 percent of the department's student-athletes).

Built in 1990 with public funds, the 4,324-seat home of Alaska Nanook hockey features an Olympic-size sheet of ice measuring 200' by 100'. The University of Alaska Fairbanks is one of two schools (Northern Michigan being the other) in the CCHA with an Olympic-size sheet. The Carlson Center offers prime viewing from the 2,300 theatre seats and additional bleacher-style seats bordering the upper level sidelines. The Carlson Center is Northern Alaska's premier entertainment, sports and meeting facility. Capabilities of

the center range from hockey games to concerts, trade shows to circuses, and conventions to arena football and extreme wrestling.

Alaska hockey has had the privilege of competing in the Carlson Center for their home games during the past 18 years. Originally built in 1990, the impressive facility can seat up to 4,324 fans, and features an Olympic-size sheet of ice measuring 200' by 100'. The University of Alaska Fairbanks is one of two schools (Northern Michigan being the other) in the CCHA with the larger sheet of ice.

Located in the heart of Fairbanks, on the banks of the famous Chena River, the Center is Northern Alaska's premier entertainment, sports and meeting facility via Airport Way and Webber Street. Prime viewing is available from the 2,300 theatre seats and additional bleacher-style seats bordering the upper level sidelines.

The arena is not only limited to holding hockey events, but is able to have concerts, trade shows to circuses, and conventions to arena football and extreme wrestling. The parking lot consists of 1,600 spaces.

By working with the Fairbanks North Star Borough, athletic director Forrest Karr helped push the creation of a four-sided video scoreboard that is hung in the center of the arena. It provides instant replays and a unique viewing experience of hockey action with a 360 degree ProAd supplemental video, giving video stills and scrolling graphics for attendees.

Teams are also outfitted with spacious locker rooms as the facility contains two star dressing rooms, two double locker rooms, and a show office for any additional needs.

Since its inception in 1971-72, the CCHA has grown in stature from a collection of fledgling hockey programs to the most respected conference in the nation on the ice, off the ice and behind the bench.

#### **National Tournament**

CCHA teams have accounted for 18 of the 65 NCAA Frozen Four participants from 1992-2008. Eight different CCHA teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament in the 1990s: Bowling Green, Lake Superior, Miami, Michigan, Michigan State, Northern Michigan, Ohio State and Western Michigan. Ferris State, Miami, Michigan, Michigan State, Nebraska-Omaha, Notre Dame and Ohio State have been involved so far in the new millennium.

The 12 current CCHA teams have combined to win nine of the last 25 NCAA Championships: Bowling Green (1984), Michigan State (1986, 2007), Lake Superior (1988, 1992, 1994), Northern Michigan (1991) and Michigan (1996, 1998).

#### **Hobey Baker Memorial Award Winners**

Six CCHA players have received the Hobey Baker Memorial Award which has been presented to the top player in U.S. college hockey since 1981: Bowling Green forward George McPhee (1982), Michigan State forward Kip Miller (1990), Bowling Green forward Brian Holzinger (1995), Michigan forward Brendan Morrison (1997), Michigan State goaltender Ryan Miller (2001), and most recently, Michigan forward Kevin Porter (2008).

CCHA players have combined for 157 All-American honors, including 82 First-Team selections. Bowling Green defenseman Ken Morrow was the CCHA's first First-Team All-American in 1978. Since college hockey expanded to four conferences in 1984-85, Michigan's Brendan Morrison is the only player to have been named to the First Team for three consecutive seasons (1995, 1996, 1997).

#### **The NHL Draft**

Fifteen CCHA players from seven of its member schools were selected in the 2008 NHL Entry Draft, including one first-round draft pick.

#### **Beyond the CCHA**

More than 70 former CCHA players have gone on to careers in coaching or management at the junior, collegiate and professional levels. Two current general managers in the National Hockey League played in the CCHA: Washington's George McPhee (Bowling Green) and Atlanta's Don Waddell (Northern Michigan).

# DALLAS FERGUSON

Former Nanook defenseman Dallas Ferguson was named the eighth head coach of his alma mater on May 15, 2008, following four years of service as an assistant coach for the Blue and Gold.

A former Nanook defenseman and team captain, Ferguson led his Alma Mater back to national prowess during the 2008-09 campaign en route to winning the CCHA Coach of the Year and coaching Johnson to become Player of the Year.

Ferguson's squad far exceeded expectations, finishing fourth in the CCHA after being picked to finish 11th in the 12-team conference in the preseason. The feat tied the program's best regular-season CCHA finish, and the 34 points in the league standings set an all-time high through 17 years of association with the Michigan-based league.

The Wainwright, Alberta native has coached thirteen Nanooks who have gone on to professional hockey careers, including NHL rearguard Jordan Hendry of the Chicago Blackhawks and, 2008 CCHA Offensive Defenseman of the year and first team All-American, Tyler Eckford, who began his pro career with the New Jersey Devils organization in the fall of 2008.

Prior to his tenure at Alaska, Ferguson spent two years as the assistant coach for the Fairbanks Ice Dogs Junior A hockey team of the North American Hockey League.

As an athlete, Ferguson enjoyed a four-year professional hockey career following his collegiate playing days in Fairbanks. He was a four-year letterwinner for the Nanooks (1992-96) and ranks 21st on Alaska's career scoring list. He finished his career with 104 points (17g, 87a) and was a three-time recipient of the Shawn Chambers Top Defenseman Award. A proven leader, Ferguson was an alternate captain as a junior and voted the team captain as a senior.

Off the ice, Ferguson earned his bachelor's degree in business administration with an emphasis in management and organization from UAF.

Following his college career, he played four years professionally. He split his rookie pro year with the Alaska Gold Kings of the West Coast Hockey League and the Richmond Renegades of the East Coast Hockey League. Ferguson played in 15 games for the Gold Kings, notching a goal and 13 assists, and finished the 1996-97 season with the Renegades, compiling a goal and two assists in 18 games.

Ferguson spent the next three seasons with the Anchorage Aces (formerly the Gold Kings) of the WCHL. In his time with the Aces, Ferguson amassed 55 points in 144 games, as well as six points in 18 playoff games.

Ferguson and his wife live in Fairbanks with their two daughters.

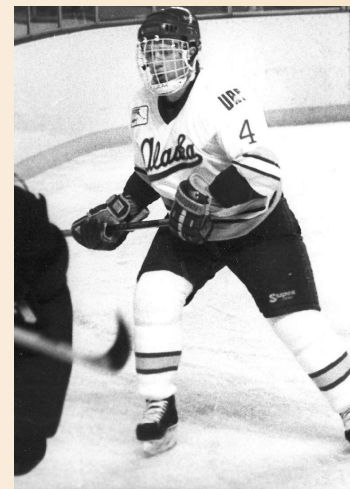

## LANCE WEST

Lance West enters his second season as a Nanook assistant hockey coach.

The Penticton, British Columbia native brings thirteen years of hockey related experience, including nine years at the NCAA Division I level, to his role with the Blue and Gold.

Prior to making the move to Fairbanks, West served as an assistant coach at his alma mater, the University of Alabama-Huntsville League, for seven consecutive seasons (2000-07). As an assistant coach for the Chargers, West shared responsibility for developing and documenting team procedures, recruiting, practices, scheduling non-conference games, fund raising, travel, and video. While at UAH, West was also a health and physical education instructor (2002-07).

He helped mentor the Chargers squads that won two College Hockey America regular season championships, made four conference championship games, and one NCAA tournament appearance during his final season (2006-07).

It marked his second stint with the UAH coaching staff as he had previously served as a volunteer assistant for the Chargers from 1996-1998, when the Chargers captured two Division II National Championships (1996 & 1998).

Prior to his coaching days, West was a four-year letter winner for the Chargers from 1991-95. The offensive-minded center amassed 43 goals and 65 assists for 108 points in 106 games (1.02 ppg) in his collegiate playing career and currently sits 20th on UAH's All-Time Scoring Leaders list. As a senior, he was voted team captain and received the UAH hockey team's Coaches Award.

He earned his Bachelor of Science degree in biology, minor in chemistry and Class B Teaching Certification from UAH.



## BRIAN MEISNER

Brian Meisner continues to be a part of the Alaska coaching staff for his second season as assistant coach with the Nanooks.

The Cloquet, Minnesota native served as an assistant coach for the University of Connecticut of the Atlantic Hockey Association during the 2007-08 season, following a 10-year campaign in junior hockey. He was the head coach and general manager of the Wichita Falls Wildcats (Texas) of the North American Hockey League, where he coached Nanook forward Adam Cardwell. Beginning in 2004, he was a major contributor to the revitalization of the team after it had folded under previous ownership. During his tenure with Wichita Falls, he recorded a 148-114-26 record while developing more than 20 players who advanced to Division I hockey programs and placing twice as many at the Division III level.

Meisner also spent two seasons as the head coach/general manager of the Wichita Falls Rustlers (2002-04) and one season leading the Butte Irish (2001-02). With the Rustlers, Meisner led the team to a Junior A expansion record 43 wins in the first season after improving the Irish's record by 18 wins (21-28-7). For his effort with both teams, he was awarded the American West Hockey League Coach of the Year distinction for two consecutive seasons.

## DR. CARY S. KELLER

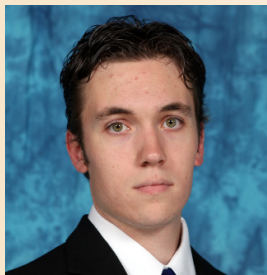

The former Nanook defenseman and four-year assistant coach is the third first-year coach to get the award in the past 34 years. Ferguson also mentored the Nanook's first CCHA Player of the Year, senior goaltender, Chad Johnson. He surpassed expectations, leading the team to a fourth place finish in the CCHA after being picked to end 11th in the 12-team conference.



**Big Skates to Fill** – Now that standout Chad Johnson has graduated, the goaltending position will be a large priority for the Nanooks this season. Sophomore Scott Greenham and rookie Steve Thompson will take on a hefty responsibility at the net. Similar to Johnson at 6-2, 186 pounds and catching left, Greenham played in five games during his freshman year. He earned Goalie of the Week after two shut out performances against Connecticut and Mercyhurst. Freshman Thompson also joins the roster at 6-3 and 195 pounds. The Anchorage native enters the season with two USHL Goalie of the Week Awards and three seasons of junior hockey under his belt.

**Goal Rush** – The Alaska Nanooks play host for the second annual Brice Alaska Goal Rush Tournament on Oct. 16 in the Carlson Center. After Anchorage rivals grabbed the title last year, the Nooks look to redeem themselves. history that the Nanooks competed in the Detroit stadium.

**Balancing Act** – The Nooks were able to clutch the number four spot in the conference despite maintaining a 1.94 goals per game average. However, Alaska tips the scale when comparing defensive skills, ending second in the nation. The Nanooks hope to find more of a balance this upcoming season.

**Seeing Double** – The Knelsen and Molle brothers will play their last Nanook season as duos. The Knelsens have made an impressive pair of forwards as Dion comes into his senior year as the team's top scorer, while Brandon Knelson enters his last year ranked third on the team for assists. Dustin Molle will be completing his final year of athletic eligibility while his brother, Bryant, enters his junior season. Both Molle defensemen appeared in all 39 games last year.

**Sprung from Canada** – While last season's squad had the most American skaters Alaska has had in a decade (15), the roster continues to be dominated by Canucks (17) to American skaters (10) this year.

n **March 21, 1980** – The Nanooks earn their first collegiate win in their first season as a NCAA program with an 8-4 victory over Stanford at the Pepsi invitational Hockey Tournament in Seattle Washington.

n **October 1987** – Former Alaska defenseman Shawn Chambers becomes the first Nanook hockey alumnus to skate in the National Hockey League with the Minnesota North Stars. He appeared in 19 games scoring one goal and eight points.

n **March 12, 1994** – Despite falling in a 4-3 loss to Miami University, Alaska's Tavis MacMillan and Dean Fedorchuk finish the season with 74 points apiece to share the NCAA scoring title.

n **October 19, 1995** – Alaska plays its first game as an official member of the Central Collegiate Hockey Association against the University of Notre Dame.

n **March 8, 2002** – For the first time since joining the CCHA, the Nanooks host a playoff series in Fairbanks. They continue to make history that weekend by sweeping the Ferris State Bulldogs for their first post-season series win and by earning their first trip ever to Joe Louis Arena for the CCHA Super Six tournament.



n **March 19, 2005** – With a 3-2 victory over Michigan State University in the Super Six's consolation game, Alaska finishes third in the tournament for its highest ever post-season finish.

n **December 31, 2005** – A 3-0 shutout over the Alaska Anchorage Seawolves clinches the Nanooks fifth consecutive Alaska Airlines Governor's Cup title.

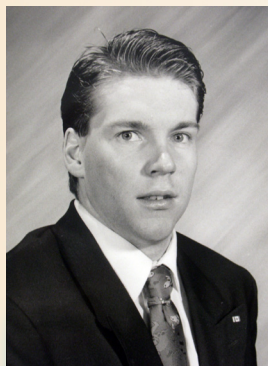
#### At the Carlson Center

n **October 11, 2003** – Alaska Airlines Governor's Cup Game 2: After letting a pair of one-goal leads slip away in the first and second periods, the Alaska Nanook tailed for the UAA Seawolves for the first time in the contest with 10:23 remaining in the game. Despite peppering UAA's net-minder Kevin Reiter with shot after shot, the Blue and Gold still trailed with under a minute left in the game. After a key timeout with 19:25 left on the clock, the Nanooks pulled goalie Keith Bartusch in favor of an extra forward, allowing Ryan Campbell to even the tally just seven seconds later (19:32). The surge of energy and offense did not stop there as Cory Rask netted the game-winning goal at 19:42 and then with less than one second on the clock (19:59) Ryan Lang sealed the deal with an empty-netter to win the game 5-3.

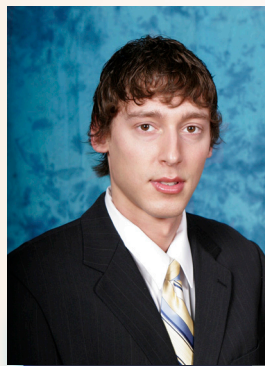
n **November 28, 1992** – Alaska led No.1-ranked Maine (with Hobey Baker winner Paul Kariya) 4-2 half way through the contest. The Nanooks were ultimately upset 6-4 by the Great Alaska Face-off champions, who also were crowned that year's NCAA Champions and only lost one game all year. Hockey alumnus and former assistant coach Wade Klippenstein (a senior during the 1992-93 season) said it was the loudest he had ever heard the Carlson Center get.

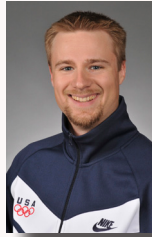
When the University of Alaska was established in 1917, the basketball team was nicknamed the Polar Bears, which seemed appropriate because the animal is largely known for their stealthy hunting abilities and size (adults range anywhere from 880-1,500 pounds).

A majority of the polar bear population is found in the Arctic Circle, and the bear has served as a primary source of food for Inuit villages within Alaska. After 1963, UAF's official mascot became known almost exclusively as the Nanook, after the Inupiaq word for polar bear, "nanuq."



As a variety of talented and hard-working individuals filter through the Nanook athletic program, Alaska decided it was time to honor and preserve the memory of the men and women who have brought honor and distinction to UAF through their outstanding contributions in both intercollegiate athletics and community involvement. A committee started accepting nominations in January 2008 and four finalists were announced in the fall. Now the Hall consists of ten total members.

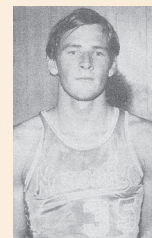

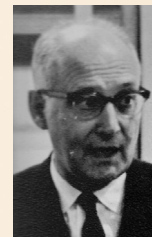

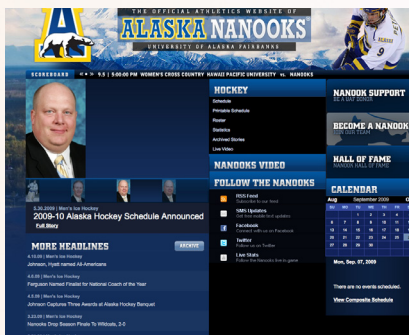
