## #NookNotes

- Alaska comes into this match having fell in its first four contests of the 2024-25 season, including dropping two overtime decisions against Penn State in the season-opener (3-4) and on the road at Michigan Tech (1-2).
- Chase Dafoe and Matt Koethe lead the Nanooks in points, with the two forwards having notched a goal and assist for two points this season.
- Braden Birnie, Luke Johnson and Matt Hubbarde are Alaska's other goal scorers this season, netting one goal apiece.
- Alaska is yet to record a power-play goal this season after their .206 power-play percentage placed them 29th in the nation a season ago.
- The Nanooks have allowed two shorthanded goals to their opponents this season, with Penn State's Braedon Ford and Reese Laubach scoring while down a man in both of Alaska's contests against the Nittany Lions.
- The Nanooks and Fighting Irish square off for the first time since the 2022-23 season when the two teams played each other twice at the turn of the year. Alaska took the first match via a 3-2 decision on December 31, 2022. Chase Dubois netted two goals for the Nooks, while Karl Falk scored the game-winner at the 18:56 mark of the second period. Alaska fell in the next matchup the following day by a final of 2-0.
- Alaska holds a 16-29-3 record vs. Notre Dame since the 1994-95 season.
- Graduate transfer Nicholas Grabko has started three of Alaska's four games between the pipes. He has posted a save percentage of .887 for the Nooks in his contests in goal, while 2.61 goals-against average puts him 40th nationally.

## Fun Facts

- Nanooks play-by-play, Bruce Cech (pronounced Check), enters his 36th season as the voice of the Nanooks.
- This will be the 75th season of Nanook hockey, with the first coming all the way back in 1925-26. They did not join the Division I ranks until the 1984-85 season. They've been in the Great West Hockey Conference (1985-88), CCHA (1994-2013) and most recently WCHA (2013-2020).
- The Nanooks and Fighting Irish square off for the first time since the 2022-23 season when the two teams played each other twice at the turn of the year. - Chase Dafoe ranks 20th in the nation in faceoff wins, posting 36 for the season. William Lawson-Body ranks behind him in 25th with 34.
- Dafoe and Koethe lead the Nooks with two points this season, both collecting a goal and an assist in four games.
- Carson Reed leads all Nooks in blocks so far, as the freshman defenseman has seven this season.

## Meet the Opponents - Notre Dame Fighting Irish

- The Fighting Irish are coming into the weekend having won their first two contests of the season. They began 2024-25 with a trip to Upstate New York, taking down St. Lawrence 4-1 and Clarkson 5-2. They are holding their home opener this weekend against the Nanooks.
- Notre Dame ranks third nationally in power play percentage, going 3/7 on the power play for a mark of 42.9%. They are tied for sixth in scoring defense, allowing 1.5 goals per game, while tying for seventh in scoring offense with 4.5 goals per game.
- Their netminder duo of Owen Say and Nicholas Kempf have split the two games in goal. Say started their season-opener, allowing one goal and making 32 saves vs. St. Lawrence. Kempf took over the following game against Clarkson, letting in two while stopping 30 Golden Knight shots. Say's save percentage of 97% is the second-best mark in the nation.
- Justin Janicke and Cole Knuble are tied for eighth in the nation in points per game, with the two forwards tallying a mark of two per game. Knuble has netted three goals thus far, including a two-goal outing against the Saints. His three-goal, one-assist weekend earned him Big Ten First Star of the Week honors. His three goals tie him for fifth-most in the nation.
- The Fighting Irish come in ranked #18 in the latest USCHO poll released on October 14, jumping two spots from their previous place at #20. They also come in at 18 in the USA Hockey poll.

## Last Time Out

The Nanooks are coming off a pair of 2-1 losses at Michigan Tech last weekend. The first matchup saw the Nanooks drop their second overtime loss of the season to the Huskies. MTU's Max Koskipirtti kicked off the game with a goal 15 seconds into the first. After the 1-0 advantage for MTU, the Nanooks eventually tied things up 14:39 into the second period. Matt Koethe tallied his first goal of the season after a Kyle Gaffney faceoff win. The alternate captain to alternate captain connection was the equalizer but also acted as the lone goal for the Nanooks. Alaska managed to overcome a strong MTU attack late that saw two goals called off due to a high-sticking and reviewed offside call, but ultimately fell in the overtime period as Elias Jansson netted the winner. Nicholas Grabko had a strong showing in net for the Nanooks, posting 26 saves on the night, including 10 in the third period to help force the extra time.

In Saturday's contest, all of the scoring came in the first period, as 3:30 into the first, Stiven Sardarian scored the opener for Tech, making it 1-0. 13 minutes later, Chase Pietila tallied the game-winner, making it 2-0 Huskies. Alaska managed to get one back on a Chase Dafoe goal 18:29 into the first, but unfortunately, that was it for scoring. Matt Rickard picked up his first point with an assist and Carson Reed added a point with an apple. Alaska saw only one power-play opportunity on the night; they went 0-1. MTU went 1-2; their second goal of the night came on the man-advantage. The Nanooks outshot MTU 30-18.

## Looking Ahead

- The Nanooks continue their road schedule in two weeks with a trip to Upstate New York to take on Clarkson. Puck drop is set for 7 p.m. ET. / 3 p.m. AKT on Friday, November 1 and Saturday, November 2.
- They return to Fairbanks on December 6 with a matchup against Augustana, which will see the team officially return to the Carlson Center.

## Head Coach Erik Largen



Head coach Erik Largen enters his seventh year as the Nanook hockey bench boss in 2024-25. The Fairbanks-native and former Alaska goaltender became the program's 10th head coach on April 30, 2018. At the time of his hiring, he was the youngest NCAA Ice Hockey head coach at 31 years of age. He first joined the Nanooks bench in August 2016 when former head coach Dallas Ferguson brought him on as an assistant coach. He served in that same position a year later, 2017-18, under interim head coach Lance West. With Largen on the bench as an assistant and head coach, the Nanooks made the WCHA playoffs each season (16-20) and captured the coveted Alaska Airlines Governor's Cup each season. He now leads the team into their first independent season since the 1993-94 season.

In his first season at the helm, Largen led Alaska to a 12-21-3, 12-14-2 WCHA record that included keeping the Governor's Cup and knocking-off then-ranked #4 Minnesota State 1-0 at home in the Carlson Center. The 'Nooks traveled to Northern Michigan for the first round of the 2019 WCHA Playoffs where they fell in two games. The next season, the Nanooks returned to the Carlson Center and finished above .500 for the first time since 2014-15. With a 16-15-5, 14-9-5 WCHA record, they also hosted the first round of the 2020 WCHA Playoffs, their first time hosting since the 2013-14 season. They fell to Bowling Green in two games. Largen's second season on top led to the Nanooks first win against Michigan Tech in 16-games, a 4-0 victory over then-ranked #9/8 Penn State and their first victory in program history against Arizona State. His third season was canceled due to COVID-19. His fourth season, the 2021-22 season, was played as an independent. This was the Nanooks' first season in the independent Division I ranks since the 1993-94 season. Alaska went 14-18-2 in their first year out of a conference, and featured a three-game win streak against RPI to end the 2021 home-schedule before tying #8/8 Denver on the road and defeating #8/8 Minnesota on the road. The 'Nooks went 3-0-1 against independent rival Arizona State. After Dec. 10, 2021, the Nanooks finished their season 12-6-2. On July 28, 2022, Erik Largen signed a four-year extension to remain the head coach of the Nanooks hockey program through the 2025-26 season.

In the 2022-23 season, the Nanooks saw their best season since 2001-02 in terms of victories. Alaska posted a 22-10-2 Independent record and finished 17th in the Pair-Wise rankings, missing out on the NCAA Hockey Tournament by one place. After starting 5-7-2 in the first two months, the Nanooks exploded for a 17-3-0 record from Dec. 9, 2022 on. In that span, the 'Nooks swept UAA 6-0 in the season series to grab their 12th-straight Alaska Airlines Governor's Cup, they grabbed a 3-2 win at #19/17 Notre Dame on Dec. 31, 2022 and picked up a 3-1 win at #1/2 Denver - their first-ever win in Magness Arena. In the final 12 games of the season, the Nanooks posted an 11-1-0 record to finish 22-10-2, their most wins since Guy Gadowsky led the 01-02 Nanooks to a 22-12-3, 15-10-3 CCHA record.

Under Largen this season, Matt Radomsky was named the Hockey Commissioners Association December Goaltender of the Month. Largen was also named a Spencer Penrose Award Finalist and was named the 2022-23 Everything College Hockey Coach of the Year. On April 12, 2023 Largen signed a new five-year extension to stay with the Nanooks through the 2027-28 season. In his first season after his

new extension, Largen posted the Nanooks' second-consecutive winning season with a 17-14-3 record. Alaska opened the year with six games against nationally-ranked opponents, resulting in wins at No. 9/10 Michigan Tech and No. 20/18 St. Cloud State. Their momentum carried into a sweep of in-state rivals, UAA and Stonehill.

upping their win-streak to five, the longest of the season. Coach Largen led Alaska to their 13th-straight Alaska Airlines Governor's Cup with a pair of road wins at UAA. In Dec. 2023, Alaska played in their first-ever Great Lakes Invitational and took home third with a GLI Third-Place Game victory over Ferris State. To end the season, the Nanooks won three-straight with a road win at Augustana and a sweep of Stonehill.

Prior to joining the Alaska Nanooks hockey staff, Largen spent the 2015-16 season as head coach for the Marian University hockey team, an NCAA Division III program located in Fond du lac, Wisconsin. In his inaugural season as bench boss, Largen led the Sabres to an 18-7-3 season overall and a 15-4-1 mark in Northern Athletics Collegiate Conference play.

Largen brings a variety of coaching experience to the table, with stints in the United States Hockey League, the North American Hockey League and the Minnesota Junior Hockey League. Largen also served as the assistant coach for the Fairbanks Ice Dogs from 2009-2011. During his tenure, the Ice Dogs were the Robertson Cup runners-up in 2010 and claimed the championship in 2011. Largen is also featured on the College Hockey Honor Roll in the Fairbanks Hockey Hall of Fame and has been instrumental in organizing many community events that the Alaska Nanook hockey team participates in.

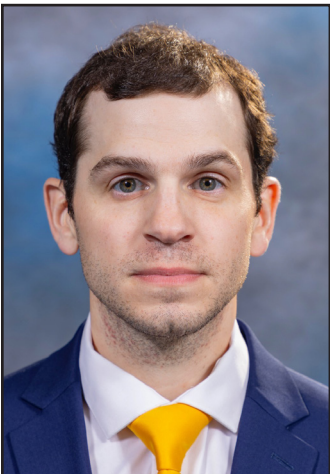

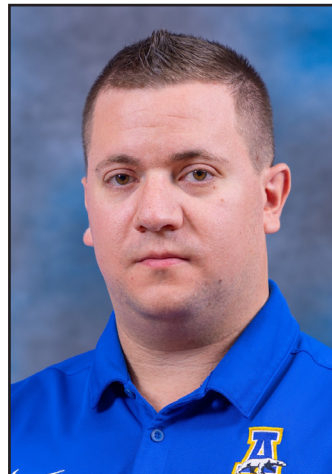

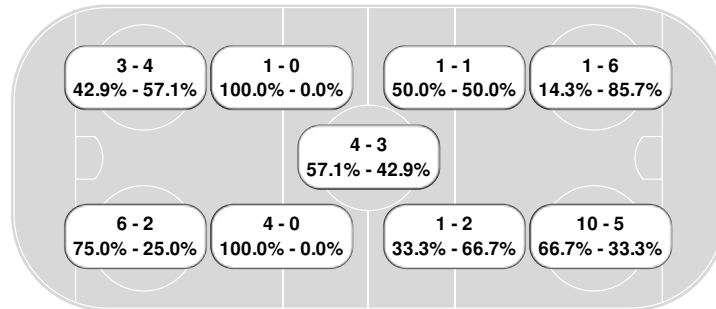
