Alcorn Notes

- Alcorn won its 16th conference championship in school history and the third in the last five years. The Braves are the five-time defending SWAC East Division champions.

- The Braves played in the Black College National Championship against North Carolina A&T. It was Alcorn's second appearance in the Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl. The Braves trimmed a 17-3 deficit to 24-22 when a controversial two-point conversion call didn't go their way and ended up being the difference. The Braves outgained the Aggies 451-324 in total offense including a large advantage of 328-38 on the ground.

- Alcorn became the first-ever institution to host a SWAC Championship game, and also the first school to play in five consecutive SWAC title games. The Braves defeated Southern 37-28 after shutting out the Jaguars 10-0 in the fourth quarter.

- The Braves outscored the opposition 102-42 in the fourth quarter on the year.

- Junior quarterback Noah Johnson, the SWAC Offensive Player of the Year, was named the SWAC Championship Offensive MVP. Johnson was one of four finalists for the HBCU Player of the Year award and one of 25 finalists for the Walter Payton Award, distributed to the best player in FCS. Additionally, Johnson was one of four finalists for the C Spire Conerly Trophy which was awarded to the best player in the state of Mississippi.

- Alcorn dominated the All-Conference teams and won three of the individual awards. Fred McNair won Coach of the Year, Johnson earned Offensive Player of the Year and junior running back De'Shawn Waller was tabbed the Newcomer of the Year. Alcorn won three individual awards (Coach, Offensive and Newcomer) in the same season for the first time since 1992 when Steve McNair won Offensive, Marcus Hinton won Newcomer and Cardell Jones won Coach.

- Of the league-leading 12 All-Conference honorees from Alcorn, 10 were named to the First-Team. It was the most First-Team selections for the Braves since 1977. Along with Johnson and Waller on the First-Team were offensive linemen Chris McCrea, Kevin Hall and Mustaffa Ibrahim, defensive linemen Terry Whittington and Sterling Shippy, linebacker Solomon Muhammad and defensive backs Javen Morrison and Qwynnterrio Cole. Alcorn was represented on the Second-Team by offensive lineman Deonte Brooks and tight end Jaquaveon Boles.

- The Braves earned six HBCU All-Americans including three offensive linemen. The selections included McCrea, Hall, Ibrahim, Waller, Whittington and Cole. In addition to the six selections, Johnson and Muhammad were tabbed as Honorable Mentions. Alcorn's six HBCU All-Americans were the most in school history since the award started in 2014. The Braves tied for the most selections of any school this year with North Carolina A&T.

- Shippy earned a spot on the AFCA All-America Second-Team. The leader of the Alcorn defense, Shippy was named a Team Captain in 12 of 13 games. He played a big role in the Braves leading the nation in both sacks and tackles for a loss. Shippy ended the year with 38 tackles, 8.0 sacks and 14.5 tackles for a loss.

- Waller was named to the STATS FCS All-America Third-Team. He started the season as the No. 3 running back on the depth chart and became a starter in the seventh game of the season. He ended with 1,215 rushing yards and 12 touchdowns. Waller finished eighth in the nation

in rushing yards per game (121.5 ypg), 15th in total rushing yards, 19th in all-purpose yards per game (133.0), 19th in rushing yards per carry (6.5), 20th in rushing TD's, 23rd in scoring (7.8 pg) and 25th in total touchdowns (13).

- Cole was named to the HERO Sports Sophomore All-America Team. He catapulted to the top of the Alcorn tackles list with a team-high 77. Cole also recorded 4.5 tackles for a loss, three interceptions a forced fumble and recovered a fumble. Like Waller, Cole started low on the depth chart and had to work his way into the top spot. He only started in seven games at various defensive back positions including both cornerback and safety.

- The Alcorn defense ranked first in the FCS in both sacks per game (4.0) and tackles for a loss per game (9.5). The defense was also third in the country in rushing (91.2 ypg), eighth in total defense (291.4 ypg), 10th in red zone defense (.714), 18th in scoring defense (21.5 ppg), 22nd in third down percentage defense (.324) and 24th in interceptions (14).

- The Braves held the opposition to three points or less three times. The defense didn't allowed a touchdown in four games (against Prairie View A&M, the only touchdown came on a special teams play).

- Alcorn led the SWAC in total offense (473.3 ypg), total defense (291.4 ypg), scoring defense (21.5 ppg), rushing (285.8 ypg), rushing defense (91.2 ypg), interceptions (14), sacks (4.0 s/pg), tackles for a loss (9.5 tfl/g), first downs (23.2 pg), fewest first downs allowed (16.2 pg) and time of possession (32:42).

- In three seasons, Johnson ranks eighth all-time in school history in touchdown passes (30), ninth in passing yards (4,018) and 10th in rushing yards (1,867). This year, he threw for 2,207 yards and 15 touchdowns, and rushed for 1,080 yards and 11 touchdowns. Johnson ranked third in the nation in rushing yards per carry (7.5) and 16th in completion percentage (.621).

- Waller rushed for at least 100 yards in seven of the last eight games including the SWAC Championship where he tallied a game-high 177 yards and three touchdowns. He broke loose for an 83-yard touchdown run which was the second-longest in the history of the SWAC Championship game. Waller followed it up by running for a game-high 167 yards in the Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl.

- Junior kicker/punter Corey McCullough very quietly had a historic season. He tied the school's all-time record for field goals made with 34. He has one season remaining to pull ahead of Wilfredo Rosales who made 34 field goals from 1977-80. Additionally, McCullough tied his own single-season school record of 17 made field goals this year.

- Morrison led Alcorn in interceptions for the third consecutive year. He has 10 on his career with four this year including one in the SWAC Championship. Morrison ran back his second career pick-six earlier this season against Grambling State.

- Junior linebacker Brelion Hollis was tabbed the SWAC Championship Defensive MVP. He led the Braves with seven tackles including 0.5 sacks. Alcorn sacked SU quarterback Ladarius Skelton six times. Hollis also wrapped-up a game-high 10 tackles in the Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl.

- Whittington was nationally recognized on Oct. 22 when he won FCS Defensive Player of the Week. He also won HBCU National Player of the Week and SWAC Defensive Player of the Week honors. Whittington notched career-highs of 15 tackles, 6.0 tackles for a loss, 4.5 sacks and a forced fumble in a 33-26 win over Grambling State. He came close to the single-game school record of 5.0 sacks set by Bryant Mix in 1995 against Texas Southern.

- The Braves are 13-0 when leading at halftime over the last two seasons.

- Alcorn finished 5-1 at home this year and is 79-53 all-time in Jack Spinks-Marino Casem Stadium after 27 seasons.

- The Braves ended at No. 2 in the HBCU Poll. They also received 127 votes in the FCS Top-25.

- Alcorn won 10 SWAC Player of the Week awards for the second straight year. Whittington, Hollis and Morrison won Defensive Player of the Week. Waller won Newcomer of the Week three times. Johnson and junior Raidarious Anderson each won Offensive Player of the Week. McCullough and senior Johnathon Hauer have earned Special Teams Player of the Week.

- The Braves went 5-0 against teams from the SWAC West Division this year and are 14-2 against SWAC East Division opponents over the last four seasons.

PREVIOUS GAMES

- The Braves trailed Southern 28-27 in the SWAC Championship game when McCullough nailed a 41-yard field goal to give them a 30-28 lead with 11:31 left in the fourth quarter. The Braves put the game away with a 14-yard touchdown run by Waller with 3:47 remaining. Alcorn outgained the Jaguars 518-347 in total offense including 370-123 in rushing. The Braves improved to 38-27-2 all-time against SU and have won six of the last seven meetings.

- Despite Alcorn and Southern both having 6-1 SWAC records, the Braves held the tiebreaker for home field after winning the regular season match-up 20-3. The Braves spoiled Southern's Homecoming. Alcorn limited the Jaguars to just 139 yards of offense, including 76 passing and 63 rushing yards. Cole registered a pick-six.

- Alcorn clinched both home field for the title game and the SWAC East Division after blanking Jackson State in the second half for a 24-3 victory. The go-ahead touchdown came on the opening series of the second half on an eight-yard run by senior P.J. Simmons. The Braves also scored on a 47-yard reception by freshman Juan Anthony and a 31-yard pick-six by junior Taurence Wilson. The Braves out-gained the Tigers 394-195 in total offense, including a 217-92 edge in rushing. Alcorn also controlled the clock with a 35:06-24:54 advantage in time of possession.

- The Braves gave New Mexico State a scare after cutting a 35-7 deficit to 38-35 with 10:43 remaining in the fourth quarter. Waller ran for 137 yards and two touchdowns. Johnson threw for 316 yards and four touchdowns.

- Alcorn defeated Prairie View A&M 27-13 to improve to 42-15 in the all-time series. The Alcorn defense did not allow a touchdown, and the Braves outgained PVAMU 512-235 in total yards and 249-61 in rushing.

- In the win over Grambling State, the Braves scored the game-winning touchdown with 12 seconds left on a pass to senior Chris Blair. Alcorn sacked the Tigers eight times.

- The Braves posted a 35-26 victory over Alabama A&M to spoil their second of three Homecomings. Alcorn broke a 10-10 tie at half with an explosive second to win its fifth straight over AAMU. Johnson ran for the longest touchdown in school history with a 92-yarder. It broke De'Lance Turner's 88-yarder against Miles College last season.

- The Braves dropped a five-overtime marathon against Alabama State 28-25. Alcorn held an edge of 530-240 in total yards and 408-85 in rushing. The Braves had a chance to win at the end of regulation, but a 28-yard field goal attempt was no good, wide-right. It was the first five-overtime game in FCS since Oct. 4, 2014 between Davidson and Dayton.

- Alcorn opened conference play with a 56-20 win over Mississippi Valley State on Sept. 22. The Braves held a 665-200 edge in total yards and 462-22 in rushing. Simmons rushed for a career-high 210 yards and a touchdown. The Braves won their sixth straight game over the Delta Devils and lead the all-time series 45-15-1. Alcorn has outscored MVSU 318-78 over the last six games.

- The Braves tallied a 27-15 victory over Texas Southern in a non-conference game. Alcorn raced out to a 27-0 halftime lead which was too much for the Tigers to overcome. The Braves posted their seventh straight win over TSU in the series. Anderson turned in a career game with eight catches for 168 yards and a touchdown. He accounted for more-than half of Alcorn's passing yards in the win.

- In Alcorn's home-opener, the team broke a Jack Spinks-Marino Casem Stadium scoring record by defeating Louisiana College 78-0. It was the second-most lopsided score in school history, only behind a 101-0 victory over Paul Quinn in 1967. Alcorn won its home opener for the sixth year in a row.

- The Braves opened the 2018 season at Georgia Tech. Alcorn forced three turnovers in the game as Hollis and freshman Keyron Kinsler scooped up fumbles, while Wilson grabbed an interception.

COMING INTO THIS YEAR

- Johnson took over the starting role at quarterback after seeing significant playing time over the last two seasons. He led the team in scoring in 2016 with 60 points after throwing for 1,116 yards and 11 touchdowns, and rushing for 440 yards and 10 touchdowns. Last season, Johnson threw for 782 yards and four touchdowns, and rushed for 333 yards and six touchdowns.

- Alcorn made a splash hire over the summer with the addition of quarterbacks coach Pat White. WVNews reported that White is arguably the best quarterback to ever play at WVU. He's a two-time Big East Player of the Year winner and was a Heisman candidate in both 2007 and 2008. The superstar quarterbacked the Mountaineers to a 42-9 record in four years. White and Alcorn's offensive coordinator Ryan Stanckek were teammates at WVU from 2004 to 2008, playing on four winning bowl teams. It included BCS victories in the 2006 Sugar Bowl and the 2008 Fiesta Bowl. Stanckek was an offensive lineman that blocked for White.

- White was inducted into the WVU Sports Hall of Fame earlier this season. He was not present for his induction when the Mountaineers hosted Kansas State since he was with the Braves at MVSU. White's brother Coley was be present on his behalf.

- The Braves promoted Stanckek to offensive coordinator and Cedric Thornton to defensive coordinator during the offseason. Stanckek previously worked as both the run game coordinator and offensive line coach at Alcorn, while Thornton was the Braves linebacker coach.

NOTABLE ALUMNI

- Alcorn is the alma mater of the legendary Steve "Air II" McNair who led the Tennessee Titans to four playoff appearances as the starting quarterback including Super Bowl XXXIV. He was selected to three Pro Bowls and was All-Pro and Co-MVP in 2003. McNair was the 1994 Walter Payton Award winner for the best player in NCAA DI-AA. Steve is the younger brother of Alcorn head coach Fred "Air" McNair.

- Alcorn graduate Donald Driver was inducted into the Green Bay Packers Hall of Fame in July 2017. He is Green Bay's all-time leader in both receptions (743) and receiving yards (10,137).

- Leslie Frazier, who ranks second all-time in school history and sixth in the SWAC with 20 interceptions, was inducted into the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame in August 2017. Frazier served as head coach of the Minnesota Vikings from 2010 to 2013 and currently works for the Buffalo Bills as the defensive coordinator.

- Roynell Young was named one of 25 finalists for the Black College Football Hall of Fame. Young, who played from 1977-79, ranks second all-time in school history with 20 interceptions. He helped the Braves capture the 1979 SWAC Championship. Young was the 23rd pick in the 1980 NFL Draft, becoming the first-ever Brave to be selected in the first round. He played for the Philadelphia Eagles from 1980-88 and played in Super Bowl XV.

- De'Lance Turner was signed to the Baltimore Ravens practice squad after the 2018 NFL preseason and was signed to the roster in Week 2. He led Baltimore running backs with 7.2 yards per carry in preseason and broke loose for a huge 65-yard touchdown run against the Miami Dolphins. At Alcorn, Turner rushed for 1,357 yards in 2017 which was the second-most in the FCS. It broke a single-season school record of 1,286 set by Rodney Thomas in 1998.

- Alcorn has had 53 student-athletes play in the NFL including 33 draft picks. Six Alcornites played at least 10 seasons (Donald Driver, Jimmie Giles, Steve McNair, Lawrence Pillars, Torence Small and Dave Washington).

FRED MCNAIR

Head Coach (Third Season) • Seventh Season at Alcorn • Alcorn '92

Fred McNair was named Alcorn State University 21st head football coach on February 2, 2016. He brought the Braves to the SWAC title game in his first two seasons at the helm after winning the SWAC East Division title outright both years.

McNair, who was previously the quarterbacks coach, is entering his sixth year as a member of the Alcorn football staff. McNair began his college football career as a wide receiver at Alcorn State University in 1986 before moving to quarterback his junior season. After the switch, McNair went on to finish fifth in Division 1-AA in passing efficiency his senior year and was named to the All-SWAC second team in 1989. He received his bachelor's in 1992 and furthered his education with a master's in 1996 from Alcorn State University.

McNair is responsible for turning Alcorn quarterback John Gibbs Jr. into a force on the field. Under the tutelage of McNair, Gibbs passed for 2,482 yards and 21 touchdowns and rushed for 1,006 yards in 2014. In 2013, Gibbs passed for 2,567 yards and 21 touchdowns. He also rushed for 455 yards. This past season, after Gibbs went down with an injury in the middle of the season, Lenorris Footman stepped in and found success because of McNair's coaching methods. Footman rushed for 1,023 yards and 11 touchdowns and passed for 1,106 yards and 14 scores.

He was hired as head football coach, athletic director, and teacher at Collins High school in April 2011. The CHS Tigers made it to the

second round of the 2011 3A football playoffs. During the summer months, he works as a football camp director for Mercedes Lewis in Long Beach, California; Jerrius Norwood in Brandon, Mississippi; Brett Favre and Adailus Thomas, both in Hattiesburg, Mississippi. He is also a Dixie Youth baseball coach and commissioner in Covington County as well as a youth football coach. If that is not enough, McNair is also a motivational speaker at churches, schools, and social events throughout Mississippi. He is definitely a man on the move with a vision seeking anyone that he can help.

In addition, McNair coached at Millsaps College in Jackson, Mississippi for four years. During his tenure at Millsaps, they won two Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference (SCAC) Championships. In June 2009, McNair was hired as a teacher and coach at Mt. Olive High School. He was the offensive coordinator for the Mt. Olive Pirates. The Pirates won the 1A State Football Championships in 2009 and 2010.

Upon McNair's retirement from the Arena Football League (AFL), he held various records. He is a seasoned AFL veteran (Albany 1993-95); Florida (1996-00); and Carolina (2000-01). He holds almost all passing records, including passing yards in a season (3,269 in 1999), passing touchdowns in a season (60, 1998), passing touchdowns in a game (8, four times) and passing yards in a game (362, 2000). McNair also holds all of Carolina's passing records and became the 13th quarterback in AFL history to surpass the 10,000-yard career passing mark (vs. Carolina in 2000).

McNair was ranked in the top eight in the AFL in all-time passes attempted, passes completed and passing yards. Over his eight-year career, McNair completed over 57 percent of his passes, while throwing for 16,591 yards and 291 touchdowns. McNair had a career season in 2001, setting career highs with 3,271 yards, 63 touchdowns, 434 attempts, 282 completions, a 65.0 competition percentage and a 118.16 quarterback rating. He is the original "Air McNair" and is the brother of the late Tennessee Titans quarterback and 2003 Co-Most Valuable Player, Steve "Air II" McNair.

McNair and his wife, Barbara, reside in Collins with their son, Ahkeem.

JACK SPINKS-

MARINO CASEM STADIUM

In its 27th season, Jack Spinks-Marino Casem Stadium was constructed by architect Cooke Douglass Farr Lemons and opened in 1992. It has a playing surface of natural grass with a capacity of 22,500. The stadium is also the home of the Alcorn State soccer program.

John Robert "Jack" Spinks (Aug. 15 1930 - Sept. 29, 1994) played five seasons in the NFL. He was the first Brave to play in the NFL and was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1952.

Marino Casem was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2003. He coached Alcorn to four Black College National Championships and seven SWAC titles. Casem also served as the athletic director at Alcorn from 1966-1986. After that, he served for many years on the NCAA's Football Rules Committee and Executive Committee. Casem has also been inducted into the SWAC Hall of Fame, Alcorn Hall of Honor and Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame. He's received the National Football Foundation's Outstanding Contribution to Amateur Football award and the Football Writers Association Citation of Honor.

ALCORN'S COMEBACK FALLS JUST SHORT AT AIR FORCE RESERVE CELEBRATION BOWL

A controversial failed two-point conversion attempt ended up being the difference Saturday as the Alcorn State University football program nearly erased a 17-3 deficit, but fell 24-22 to North Carolina A&T in the 2018 Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl at Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

Alcorn (9-4, 6-1 SWAC) trailed 24-16 when junior Noah Johnson electrified the stadium with a 59-yard touchdown run through the middle to pull the Braves within two points of NC A&T (10-2, 6-1 MEAC) in the fourth quarter.

On the point-after attempt, Johnson connected with junior Chris Blair along the right side of the endzone as he caught the ball and dragged a foot inbounds. However, the play was ruled incomplete and was upheld after a replay review.

After the game, SWAC Coach of the Year Fred McNair said he was not given an explanation as to why it was ruled incomplete.

For the contest, the Braves outgained the Aggies 451-324 in total offense including a large advantage of 328-38 on the ground. Junior De'Shawn Waller, the SWAC Newcomer of the Year, rushed for a game-high 167 yards.

Junior quarterback Noah Johnson, the SWAC Offensive Player of the Year winner, ran for 120 yards and two touchdowns. He also threw for 128 yards, including five completions and 75 yards to freshman Juan Anthony.

ALCORN WINS 2018 SWAC CHAMPIONSHIP WITH BIG FOURTH QUARTER

Down by one headed into the fourth quarter, the Alcorn State University football program scored the final 10 points of the game to win the 2018 SWAC Championship 37-28 over Southern on Saturday at Jack Spinks-Marino Casem Stadium.

The go-ahead score was a 41-yard field goal by junior Corey McCullough with 11:31 left. The Braves (9-3, 6-1 SWAC) put the game away with a 14-yard touchdown run by junior De'Shawn Waller with 3:47 remaining.

Junior quarterback Noah Johnson, the 2018 SWAC Offensive Player of the Year, was named the 2018 SWAC Championship Offensive MVP after the game. He threw for 135 yards on 18-of-25 passing, and rushed for 147 yards and two touchdowns against the Jaguars (7-4, 6-1 SWAC).

The SWAC Championship Defensive MVP was honored to junior Brellon Hollis. He led the Braves with seven tackles including 0.5 sacks. Alcorn sacked SU quarterback Ladarius Skelton six times and junior Terry Whittington had 1.5.

Alcorn outgained SU 518-347 in total offense including 370-123 in rushing. Waller, the 2018 SWAC Newcomer of the Year, ran for a game-high 177 yards and three touchdowns including an 83-yard score.

Johnson connected with eight different receivers in the air. Senior Dayall Harris hauled in a team-high six receptions for 50 yards.

ABOUT ALCORN STATE UNIVERSITY

Alcorn is the oldest public historically black land-grant institution in the United States and the second-oldest state-supported institution of higher learning in Mississippi. Alcorn University was founded in 1871 as a result of the people of Mississippi's efforts to educate the descendants of formerly enslaved Africans. It was named in honor of the sitting governor of Mississippi, James L. Alcorn.

Alcorn is situated in Claiborne County, seven miles west of Lorman, 80 miles south of the capital city of Jackson, 45 miles south of Vicksburg, and 40 miles north of Natchez. The site was originally occupied by Oakland College, a school established by Presbyterians in 1828; the state of Mississippi purchased the Oakland campus for \$40,000 and named it Alcorn University. Hiram R. Revels resigned his seat as a United States senator to become the University's first president. The state legislature provided \$50,000 cash annually for the University's first 10 years to support its establishment and overall operation. Additionally, 30 acres of land were sold for \$188,928; Alcorn received three-fifths of the proceeds, or \$113,400. This funding was used for Alcorn's agricultural and mechanical components.

Initially, the institution's three major study components were the four-year college track, the two-year college track, and the three-year graded track. Students spent the morning, from seven o'clock until noon, in classes. In the afternoon, they worked in various University shops for eight cents per hour. Room and board, including laundry, cost about \$5 a month.

In 1878, Alcorn University became Alcorn Agricultural and Mechanical College. The college was exclusively for males at first, but eventually women were admitted. A dormitory for women was built in 1902. Over time, facilities increased from three historic buildings to more than 80 structures. The original purchase of 225 acres of land grew to a campus of more than 1,700 acres.

In 1974, Alcorn Agricultural and Mechanical College became Alcorn State University. Governor William L. Waller signed House Bill 298, granting this status. Alcorn has thrived by continuously accomplishing dynamic goals and objectives despite limited resource allocations from the state. By the early 1990s, Alcorn's



physical plant and academic programs evolved into a more diversified University. The student population is now representative of more than 65 counties, more than 30 states, and at least 18 foreign countries. The University provides an undergraduate education that enables students to successfully pursue work in graduate and professional schools, engage in teaching, and enter other professions.



As Mississippi recognized the importance of educating all citizens, Alcorn has gained status and importance. From the original eight faculty members in 1871, the University has grown to more than 800 faculty and staff. The student body has increased from 179 students to more than 4,000 students with varied ethnic backgrounds. Although early graduates of Alcorn had limited horizons, today's graduates are successful in their chosen professions, and many are outstanding entrepreneurs. Throughout Alcorn's history, the leadership and faculty remained committed to enhancing the institution's image and to attracting young people whose interest is the pursuit and receipt of a quality education. Over the decades, "the college that excelled against great odds" has become one of the leading universities in the nation. Alcorn State University operates divisions with degree programs in more than 50 areas, including the bachelor's, master's, and educational specialist degrees.

The collaborative strength and contributions of Alcorn's past 18 presidents during its more than 140 years of existence have enabled the institution to excel. On March 4, 2014, the Mississippi Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning voted unanimously to appoint Dr. Alfred Rankins Jr. as Alcorn State University's 19th president. President Rankins' background and vision are strategically aligned with Alcorn's history and tradition. He is poised to expeditiously move Alcorn State University to the next level of excellence.
