2019 Notes

- The Braves will play their home opener against Mississippi College on Saturday. Alcorn has won six straight home openers, and is 16-11 all-time in openers at Jack Spinks-Marino Casem Stadium. The Braves carry-over a three-game home winning-streak from last year.
- Saturday marks the first-ever meeting between Alcorn and MC. The Braves have won 12 straight games against non-Division I opponents. Last season, Alcorn defeated Louisiana College 78-0, which set stadium records for most points scored and largest margin of victory.
- The 99th season of Alcorn football began with a trip to Southern Miss last weekend. The Braves won the time of possession battle 34:07-25:53. Alcorn's touchdown came on a 15-yard sprint up the middle by senior De'Shawn Waller, which cut the deficit to 13-7 with 10:43 left in the third quarter.

- In the season-opener, senior Corey McCullough became the school's all-time leader in most field goals made with 35. The record-setting kick came on a 44-yarder in the third quarter. McCullough surpassed the mark of 34 held by Wilfredo Rosales from 1977-80. McCullough made 17 in both his sophomore and junior seasons, both of which were single-season records at Alcorn. He was named to the FCS Punter of the Year Watch List in the preseason and handles both the kicking and punting duties.

- Also in the career record book, senior quarterback Noah Johnson ranks fifth all-time in passing completions (354), seventh in passing yards (4,166), eighth in touchdown passes (30) and 10th in rushing yards (1,867). Last season, Johnson ranked third in the nation in rushing yards per carry (7.5) and 16th in completion percentage (.621).

- The Braves are ranked No. 3 in the national HBCU Poll. They are also receiving 48 votes in the FCS Top-25.

- Alcorn was picked to win the SWAC East Division in the 2019 Preseason Poll. The Braves are the five-time defending SWAC East Division champions and the reigning SWAC Champions. Alcorn returns eight starters on offense and seven on defense.

- The Braves landed 14 student-athletes on the SWAC Preseason All-Conference Teams. The list included Johnson who was named the SWAC Preseason Offensive Player of the Year, and senior linebacker Solomon Muhammad who was tabbed the SWAC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year.

- Both Johnson and Waller were inked to the Walter Payton Award Watch List, which goes to the best offensive player in FCS. Johnson was the 2018 SWAC Offensive Player of the Year and SWAC Championship Offensive MVP, while Waller was the 2018 SWAC Newcomer of the Year. Johnson and Waller were the only student-athletes from the SWAC on the list.

- Additionally, Waller and Johnson were ranked No. 1 and 2, respectively, in the Top-5 Players to Watch in HBCU by BOXTOROW

- Muhammad grabbed a spot on the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List, which goes to the best defensive player in FCS. He was the only student-athlete from the SWAC on the list.

- Four Braves earned FCS Preseason All-America Honors. Senior offensive lineman Kevin Hall was named to the HERO Sports First-Team, while Johnson and Waller were on the HERO Sports-Third Team. Waller was also tabbed to the STATS FCS Second-Team, and Muhammad was on the Third-Team.

- Alcorn landed six student-athletes on the HBCU Preseason All-America Team. The list included Johnson, Waller, Hall, Muhammad, senior offensive lineman Mustaffa Ibrahim and junior defensive back Qwynnterio Cole.

- Fred McNair, the reigning SWAC Coach of the Year winner, is in his fourth season as head coach. The Braves have won the SWAC East Division and played in the SWAC Championship all three years under McNair. He carries a 16-7 SWAC record.

- Waller was named the Top Running Back in the SWAC by HBCU Gameday preseason. He began 2018 as the No. 3 running back on the depth chart and worked his way into the starting roll. Waller rushed for at least 100 yards in seven of the last eight games including the SWAC Championship where he tallied a game-high 177 yards and three touchdowns. He broke loose for an 83-yard touchdown run which was the second-longest in the history of the SWAC Championship game. Waller followed it up by running for a game-high 167 yards in the Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl. He ended with 1,215 rushing yards and 12 touchdowns. Waller finished eighth in the nation in rushing yards per game (121.5 ypg), 15th in total rushing yards, 19th in all-purpose yards per game (133.0), 19th in rushing yards per carry (6.5), 20th in rushing TD's, 23rd in scoring (7.8 pg) and 25th in total touchdowns (13).

- Last year, the Alcorn defense ranked first in the FCS in both sacks per game (4.0) and tackles for a loss per game (9.5). The defense was also third in the country in rushing (91.2 ypg), eighth in total defense (291.4 ypg), 10th in red zone defense (.714), 18th in scoring defense (21.5 ppg), 22nd in third down percentage defense (.324) and 24th in interceptions (14).

- Alcorn led the SWAC in total offense (473.3 ypg), total defense (291.4 ypg), scoring defense (21.5 ppg),

rushing (285.8 ypg), rushing defense (91.2 ypg), interceptions (14), sacks (4.0 s/pg), tackles for a loss (9.5 tfl/g) , first downs (23.2 pg), fewest first downs allowed (16.2 pg) and time of possession (32:42).

- The Braves outscored the opposition 102-42 in the fourth quarter in 2018.
 - Junior defensive back Qwynnterio Cole was named to the 2018 HERO Sports Sophomore All-America Team. He catapulted to the top of the Alcorn tackles list with a team-high 77. Cole also recorded 4.5 tackles for a loss, three interceptions a forced fumble and recovered a fumble. Like Waller, Cole started low on the depth chart and had to work his way into the top spot. He only started in seven games at various defensive back positions including both cornerback and safety.
 - Known as a lockdown defender, senior defensive back Javen Morrison has led Alcorn in interceptions for three consecutive years. He has 10 on his career including one in the 2018 SWAC Championship.
 - Johnson, Waller, Muhammad, Morrison and Cole were all named to the Black College Hall of Fame Player of the Year Watch List. They were five of the 48 players included overall.
 - Senior linebacker Brelion Hollis was tabbed the 2018 SWAC Championship Defensive MVP. He led the Braves with seven tackles including 0.5 sacks. Alcorn sacked SU quarterback Ladarius Skelton six times. Hollis also wrapped-up a game-high 10 tackles in the Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl.
 - The Braves are 13-0 when leading at halftime since 2017.
 - Alcorn is 79-53 all-time in Jack Spinks-Marino Casem Stadium after 27 seasons.
 - Alcorn won 10 SWAC Player of the Week awards in back-to-back seasons.
 - The Braves are 14-2 against SWAC East Division opponents over the last four seasons, and went 5-0 against teams from the SWAC West Division last year.
 - Alcorn promoted three coaches during the offseason. Cedric Thornton was elevated to Associate Head Coach and remains the Defensive Coordinator. Elliott Wratten was promoted to Offensive Coordinator after serving on the coaching staff since 2016. Ryan Busz is now full-time as the running backs coach after previously working as a graduate assistant.
 - WVNews reported that Alcorn QB coach Pat White is arguably the best quarterback to ever play at West Virginia University. He's a two-time Big East Player of the Year winner and was a Heisman candidate in both 2007 and 2008. The superstar quarterbacked the Mountaineers to a 42-9 record in four years. White was inducted into the WVU Sports Hall of Fame last season.
- NOTABLE ALUMNI**
- Alcorn is the alma mater of the legendary Steve "Air II" McNair who led the Tennessee Titans to four playoff appearances as the starting quarterback including Super Bowl XXXIV. He was selected to three Pro Bowls and was All-Pro and Co-MVP in 2003. McNair was the 1994 Walter Payton Award winner for the best player in NCAA DI-AA. Steve is the younger brother of Alcorn head coach Fred "Air" McNair.
 - Alcorn graduate Donald Driver was inducted into the Green Bay Packers Hall of Fame in July 2017. He is Green Bay's all-time leader in both receptions (743) and receiving yards (10,137).
 - Leslie Frazier, who ranks second all-time in school history and sixth in the SWAC with 20 interceptions, was inducted into the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame in August 2017. Frazier served as head coach of the Minnesota Vikings from 2010 to 2013 and currently works for the Buffalo Bills as the defensive coordinator.
 - Roynell Young was named one of 25 finalists for the Black College Football Hall of Fame.

Young, who played from 1977-79, ranks second all-time in school history with 20 interceptions. He helped the Braves capture the 1979 SWAC Championship. Young was the 23rd pick in the 1980 NFL Draft, becoming the first-ever Brave to be selected in the first round. He played for the Philadelphia Eagles from 1980-88 and played in Super Bowl XV.

- Alcorn has had 54 student-athletes play in the NFL including 33 draft picks. Six Alcornites played at least 10 seasons (Donald Driver, Jimmie Giles, Steve McNair, Lawrence Pillars, Torence Small and Dave Washington). Most recently, Sterling Shippy signed with the Indianapolis Colts as an undrafted free agent in 2019.

2018 SWAC Coach of the Year

After three seasons, Fred "Air" McNair has coached the Braves to three SWAC East Division titles and the 2018 SWAC Championship. McNair brought his team to the 2018 Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl after earning SWAC Coach of the Year honors.

He is the original "Air McNair" and the older brother of the late Tennessee Titans quarterback and 2003 Co-Most Valuable Player, Steve "Air II" McNair.

He became the first SWAC Coach of the Year winner at Alcorn since Cardell Jones in 1992.

In 2018, McNair's squad earned 12 All-Conference selections including 10 on the First-Team, six HBCU All-Americans, a STATS FCS Third-Team All-American and a HERO Sports Sophomore All-American. Additionally, he coached Noah Johnson to the SWAC Offensive Player of the Year honor and De'Shawn Waller to SWAC Newcomer of the Year.

McNair's defense ranked first in the FCS in both sacks per game (4.0) and tackles for a loss per game (9.5). The defense was also third in the country in rushing (91.2 ypg), eighth in total defense (291.4 ypg), 10th in red zone defense (.714), 18th in scoring defense (21.5 ppg), 22nd in third down percentage defense (.324) and 24th in interceptions (14).

Alcorn led the SWAC in total offense (473.3 ypg), total defense (291.4 ypg), scoring defense (21.5 ppg), rushing (285.8 ypg), rushing defense (91.2 ypg), interceptions (14), sacks (4.0 s/pg), tackles for a loss (9.5 tfl/g), first downs (23.2 pg), fewest first downs allowed (16.2 pg) and time of possession (32:42).

In June 2018, McNair was awarded the Key to the City in his hometown of Mount Olive, Mississippi.

McNair was named Alcorn's 21st head football coach on Feb. 2, 2016. He previously worked at as the quarterbacks coach for three seasons.

McNair began his college football career as a wide receiver at Alcorn State University in 1986 before moving to quarterback his junior season. After the switch, McNair went on to finish fifth in Division 1-AA in passing efficiency his senior year and was named to the All-SWAC second team in 1989. He received his bachelor's in 1992 and furthered his education with a master's in 1996 from Alcorn State University.

McNair is responsible for turning Alcorn quarterback John Gibbs Jr. into a force on the field. Under the tutelage of McNair, Gibbs passed for 2,482 yards and 21 touchdowns and rushed for 1,006 yards in 2014. In 2013, Gibbs passed for 2,567 yards and 21 touchdowns. He also rushed for 455 yards. This past season, after Gibbs went down with an injury

in the middle of the season, Lenorris Footman stepped in and found success because of McNair's coaching methods. Footman rushed for 1,023 yards and 11 touchdowns and passed for 1,106 yards and 14 scores.

He was hired as head football coach, athletic director, and teacher at Collins High school in April 2011. The CHS Tigers made it to the second round of the 2011 3A football playoffs. During the summer months, he works as a football camp director for Mercedes Lewis in Long Beach, California; Jerrius Norwood in Brandon, Mississippi; Brett Favre and Adailus Thomas, both in Hattiesburg, Mississippi. He is also a Dixie Youth baseball coach and commissioner in Covington County as well as a youth football coach. If that is not enough, McNair is also a motivational speaker at churches, schools, and social events throughout Mississippi. He is definitely a man on the move with a vision seeking anyone that he can help.

In addition, McNair coached at Millsaps College in Jackson, Mississippi for four years. During his tenure at Millsaps, they won two Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference (SCAC) Championships. In June 2009, McNair was hired as a teacher and coach at Mt. Olive High School. He was the offensive coordinator for the Mt. Olive Pirates. The Pirates won the 1A State Football Championships in 2009 and 2010.

Upon McNair's retirement from the Arena Football League (AFL), he held various records. He is a seasoned AFL veteran (Albany 1993-95); Florida (1996-00); and Carolina (2000-01). He holds almost all passing records, including passing yards in a season (3,269 in 1999), passing touchdowns in a season (60, 1998), passing touchdowns in a game (8, four times) and passing yards in a game (362, 2000). McNair also holds all of Carolina's passing records and became the 13th quarterback in AFL history to surpass the 10,000-yard career passing mark (vs. Carolina in 2000).

McNair was ranked in the top eight in the AFL in all-time passes attempted, passes completed and passing yards. Over his eight-year career, McNair completed over 57 percent of his passes, while throwing for 16,591 yards and 291 touchdowns. McNair had a career season in 2001, setting career highs with 3,271 yards, 63 touchdowns, 434 attempts, 282 completions, a 65.0 competition percentage and a 118.16 quarterback rating.

JACK SPINKS- MARINO CASEM STADIUM

In its 28th season, Jack Spinks-Marino Casem Stadium was constructed by architect Cooke Douglass Farr Lemons and opened in 1992. It has a playing surface of natural grass with a capacity of 22,500. The stadium is also the home of the Alcorn State soccer program.

John Robert "Jack" Spinks (Aug. 15 1930 - Sept. 29, 1994) played five seasons in the NFL. He was the first Brave to play in the NFL and was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1952.

Marino Casem was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2003. He coached Alcorn to four Black College National Championships and seven SWAC titles. Casem also served as the athletic director at Alcorn from 1966-1986. After that, he served for many years on the NCAA's Football Rules Committee and Executive Committee. Casem has also been inducted into the SWAC Hall of Fame, Alcorn Hall of Honor and Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame. He's received the National Football Foundation's Outstanding Contribution to Amateur Football award and the Football Writers Association Citation of Honor.

ALCORN'S COMEBACK FALLS JUST SHORT AT AIR FORCE RESERVE CELEBRATION BOWL

A controversial failed two-point conversion attempt ended up being the difference Saturday as the Alcorn State University football program nearly erased a 17-3 deficit, but fell 24-22 to North Carolina A&T in the 2018 Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl at Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

Alcorn (9-4, 6-1 SWAC) trailed 24-16 when junior Noah Johnson electrified the stadium with a 59-yard touchdown run through the middle to pull the Braves within two points of NC A&T (10-2, 6-1 MEAC) in the fourth quarter.

On the point-after attempt, Johnson connected with junior Chris Blair along the right side of the endzone as he caught the ball and dragged a foot inbounds. However, the play was ruled incomplete and was upheld after a replay review.

After the game, SWAC Coach of the Year Fred McNair said he was not given an explanation as to why it was ruled incomplete.

For the contest, the Braves outgained the Aggies 451-324 in total offense including a large advantage of 328-38 on the ground. Junior De'Shawn Waller, the SWAC Newcomer of the Year, rushed for a game-high 167 yards.

Junior quarterback Noah Johnson, the SWAC Offensive Player of the Year winner, ran for 120 yards and two touchdowns. He also threw for 128 yards, including five completions and 75 yards to freshman Juan Anthony.

GOLDEN EAGLES BREAK FREE FROM BRAVES IN SECOND HALF

A touchdown early in the third quarter had the Alcorn State University football program threatening for an upset, but Southern Miss was able to shake-off the Braves in a 38-10 final on Saturday at M.M. Roberts Stadium.

The Braves (0-1) trailed 13-0 at half when they came out and scored on a 10-play, 75-yard drive that was finished by a 15-yard touchdown run by senior De'Shawn Waller. It cut the deficit to 13-7.

However, on the ensuing drive, USM (1-0) scored on a 55-yard touchdown bomb on a 3rd and 17 play, which ultimately changed the course of the game. The Golden Eagles then started pulling away late in the third quarter.

Senior kicker/punter Corey McCullough became the school's all-time leader in made field goals. In the third quarter, he drilled a 44-yarder which was the 35th of his career.

Waller finished with 51 yards and a touchdown. Senior Noah Johnson threw for 143 yards on 17-for-31 passing. Senior Chris Blair recorded 67 receiving yards.

The Braves won the time of possession battle 34:07-25:53.

ABOUT ALCORN STATE UNIVERSITY

Alcorn is the oldest public historically black land-grant institution in the United States and the second-oldest state-supported institution of higher learning in Mississippi. Alcorn University was founded in 1871 as a result of the people of Mississippi's efforts to educate the descendants of formerly enslaved Africans. It was named in honor of the sitting governor of Mississippi, James L. Alcorn.

Alcorn is situated in Claiborne County, seven miles west of Lorman, 80 miles south of the capital city of Jackson, 45 miles south of Vicksburg, and 40 miles north of Natchez. The site was originally occupied by Oakland College, a school established by Presbyterians in 1828; the state of Mississippi purchased the Oakland campus for \$40,000 and named it Alcorn University. Hiram R. Revels resigned his seat as a United States senator to become the University's first president. The state legislature provided \$50,000 cash annually for the University's first 10 years to support its establishment and overall operation. Additionally, 30 acres of land were sold for \$188,928; Alcorn received three-fifths of the proceeds, or \$113,400. This funding was used for Alcorn's agricultural and mechanical components.

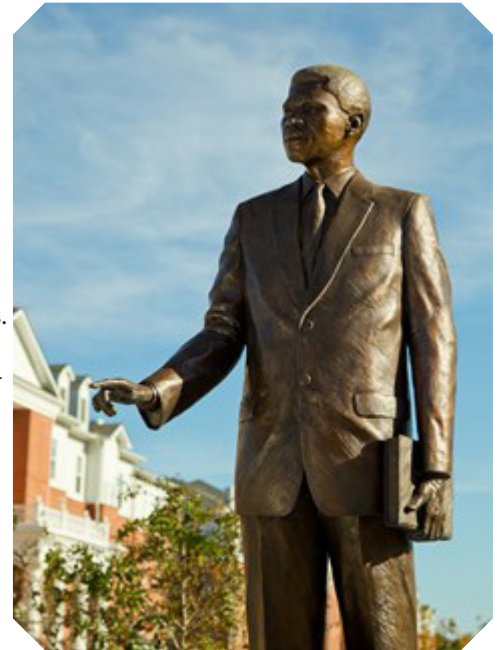
Initially, the institution's three major study components were the four-year college track, the two-year college track, and the three-year graded track. Students spent the morning, from seven o'clock until noon, in classes. In the afternoon, they worked in various University shops for eight cents per hour. Room and board, including laundry, cost about \$5 a month.

In 1878, Alcorn University became Alcorn Agricultural and Mechanical College. The college was exclusively for males at first, but eventually women were admitted. A dormitory for women was built in 1902. Over time, facilities increased from three historic buildings to more than 80 structures. The original purchase of 225 acres of land grew to a campus of more than 1,700 acres.

In 1974, Alcorn Agricultural and Mechanical College became Alcorn State University. Governor William L. Waller signed House Bill 298, granting this status. Alcorn has thrived by continuously accomplishing dynamic goals and objectives despite limited resource allocations from the state. By the early 1990s, Alcorn's



physical plant and academic programs evolved into a more diversified University. The student population is now representative of more than 65 counties, more than 30 states, and at least 18 foreign countries. The University provides an undergraduate education that enables students to successfully pursue work in graduate and professional schools, engage in teaching, and enter other professions.



As Mississippi recognized the importance of educating all citizens, Alcorn has gained status and importance. From the original eight faculty members in 1871, the University has grown to more than 800 faculty and staff. The student body has increased from 179 students to more than 4,000 students with varied ethnic backgrounds. Although early graduates of Alcorn had limited horizons, today's graduates are successful in their chosen professions, and many are outstanding entrepreneurs. Throughout Alcorn's history, the leadership and faculty remained committed to enhancing the institution's image and to attracting young people whose interest is the pursuit and receipt of a quality education. Over the decades, "the college that excelled against great odds" has become one of the leading universities in the nation. Alcorn State University operates divisions with degree programs in more than 50 areas, including the bachelor's, master's, and educational specialist degrees.

The collaborative strength and contributions of Alcorn's past 18 presidents during its more than 140 years of existence have enabled the institution to excel. On March 4, 2014, the Mississippi Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning voted unanimously to appoint Dr. Alfred Rankins Jr. as Alcorn State University's 19th president. President Rankins' background and vision are strategically aligned with Alcorn's history and tradition. He is poised to expeditiously move Alcorn State University to the next level of excellence.
