GATORS, TIGERS TO FACE OFF IN INDIANA

The Allegheny Gators enter the home stretch of the 2017 season, as they'll make the long trek to Greencastle, Indiana to face off against DePauw University on Saturday afternoon. The Gators are coming off of a 44-35 comeback Homecoming victory over Kenyon. In the win, Allegheny roared back from a 28-19 deficit midway through the third quarter. The Gator offense rolled up 485 yards, led by quarterback Logan Lee's 324 yard, 5-touchdown performance. Defensively, Allegheny totaled five sacks, capped



off with Colten Buzard's sack in the end zone that resulted in a safety on Kenyon's final offensive play of the game. DePauw was knocked from the ranks of the unbeaten and into second place in the NCAC in its most recent action, a 52-6 loss to NCAC-leading Wittenberg last Saturday. Wittenberg limited DePauw to just 211 yards of total offense, and forced four DePauw turnovers. The Gators will be looking for their first win over the Tigers since a 22-20 triumph in October 2012, as DePauw has won each of the past four meetings between the teams.

AIRING IT OUT

In last week's win over Kenyon, Allegheny junior quarterback Logan Lee completed 19 of 30 passes for 324 yards and five touchdowns. He became the lone player in program history to twice throw for five touchdowns in a single game, after also doing so on Sept. 30 against Hiram, while is now just one of three Gators to throw for 300 yards in a game twice in a season, joining T.J. Salopek, who did so in 2009, and Jimmy Savage in 2006. His 22 touchdown passes this season rank second in the North Coast Athletic Conference and 10th in NCAA Division III, while it is already second all-time in a single season in program history. Lee enters the DePauw contest with 4,330 career passing yards, sixth all-time in Allegheny history.

BLITZING BUZARD

In the Kenyon win, junior defensive end Colten Buzard recorded seven total tackles, including 1.5 sacks, highlighted by an unassisted sack in the end zone for a safety on the Lords' final offensive play of the day. Buzard has 9.0 sacks on the season to lead the North Coast Athletic Conference and rank third in all of NCAA Division III. His 9.0 sacks are already the most in a single season by an Allegheny player since Corey Belaney recorded 9.5 in the 1998 campaign. Buzard is on the verge of becoming one of just six players in team history to post at least 10 sacks in a season.

NOT A BAD START

On Allegheny's opening play from scrimmage last week, sophomore Alex Victor took an endaround handoff and sprinted 75 yards untouched for a touchdown to give the Gators a 6-0 lead just 90 seconds into the game. The 75-yard run was a career-long for Victor, while it was the longest rush by an Allegheny player since Kyle Geiser ran for a 79-yard score on Nov. 8, 2003. Victor has been involved in the Gators' four longest plays from scrimmage this season, as he also owns receptions of 85, 67, and 65 yards, all of which went for touchdowns. Of his 19 career touchdowns (17 receiving/2 rushing), 11 have covered at least 25 yards.

VICTOR'S CLIMBING THE RANKS

In addition to his 75-yard run, Victor also made a pair of touchdown receptions, as well as a catch on a successful two-point conversion try. In 16 games played, Victor already has 17 career touchdown catches, good for third all-time in program history. He has nine touchdown catches on the season, tied for the North Coast Athletic Conference lead and also third most in a season in program history, while his 10 total touchdowns this year rank second in the NCAC.

ON THE OFFENSIVE

Through its first seven games of the 2017 season, Allegheny is averaging 33.7 points and 442.1 yards of total offense per game. Since 2000, the Gators ended the season averaging over 30 points and 400 yards of total offense just three times, with the last coming in 2006 (30.3 pts/414.4 yds). The highest offensive output over the span came from the 2000 squad, which averaged 39.2 points and 479.3 yards per game.

NEW POSITION? NO PROBLEM

In the Gators' win over Kenyon, junior Tristan Rhoades made four catches for 102 yards. It marked his third 100-yard receiving game of the season, and increased his receiving yardage to 563 on the season, good for sixth in the NCAC. A co-captain, this is Rhoades' first season as a receiver, after spending the past two seasons as a safety on the Gator defense.

CAPTAIN GATORS

Joining Rhoades as a team captain this season are senior linebackers Travis Thomas and Freddy Ruiz and senior offensive lineman Andrew Murphy.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

The 2017 Allegheny football roster features three sets of brothers, including junior running back Tyler Balla and freshman safety Chase, junior quarterback Logan Lee and freshman brother Grayson, and junior linebacker Vito Antinozzi and sophomore offensive lineman Dom.

UP NEXT

Next Saturday, Nov. 4, the Gators will wrap up the home portion of its 2017 schedule with a 1 p.m. Senior Day bout with Wabash College at Frank B. Fuhrer Field. The Gators will then close out the 2017 regular season on Nov. 11 at Oberlin.

LAST MEETING

MEADVILLE, Pa. (Oct. 15, 2016) - Allegheny freshman Alex Victor turned in a historical performance, but the DePauw offense was too much for the Gators, as the Tigers picked up a 69-21 win in Meadville.

Victor made seven catches for 219 yards, including touchdown receptions of 74 and 86 yards, becoming the first Gator in 48 years to eclipse the 200-yard receiving mark. Gator quarterbacks Logan Lee and Jon Nigro combined to throw for a season-high 365 yards, but were done in by three interceptions, while the Allegheny ground game was unable to get on track, amassing just 11 rushing yards. DePauw jumped out a 21-0 lead just nine minutes into play, and extended it to 35-7 at the end of the quarter, and never looked back. Chase Sadler caught four touchdown passes for the Tigers, while Matt Hunt completed 10 of 12 passes for 176 yards, and Jason Kirchoff ran for 171 yards. DePauw out-gained Allegheny 661-376.

HEAD COACH B.J. HAMMER

Second Season

BJ Hammer was named the 34th head coach in Allegheny football program history on January 4, 2016.

In his first season at the helm, Hammer saw a pair of his players earn All-NCAC honors, including senior John McFarland and junior Jake

Wilson. McFarland ended his career as one of the most prolific tight ends in program history, and hauled in 48 catches for 552 yards. Wilson established an NCAA Division III record with 1,268 kick return yards, averaging 24.5 yards per try, and breaking off five returns of 50 yards or longer. As a team, the Gator offense saw an increase of an average of 9.0 points and 83 yards per game from the 2015 season, while the team's pass defense ranked in the top five of the NCAC.

Hammer arrived at Allegheny after spending five seasons as the defensive coordinator at fellow North Coast Athletic Conference member Wabash College. There, he led a defensive unit that consistently ranked among NCAA Division-III's best. During his five-year tenure, the Little Giants posted a record of 51-7, making three appearances in the NCAA Division-III playoffs and winning NCAC championships in 2011 and 2015. He mentored the NCAC Defensive Player of the Year in four of his five seasons as defensive coordinator, while 22 Wabash defenders were First Team All-NCAC honorees, and four were named All-America.

In 2015, the Little Giants finished 12-1, including a perfect 8-0 in the NCAC, and advanced to the third round of the NCAA playoffs. Hammer's defense ranked third nationally with 26 interceptions, fourth in rushing defense (72.2 yds/g), fifth in total defense (240.9 yds/g), and seventh in quarterback sacks (42). Eight Little Giant defenders earned All-NCAC honors, including six First Team selections, highlighted by defensive tackle Tyler McCullen, who was named the NCAC Defensive Player of the Year and a D3Football.com All-American. Wabash ended the year ranked seventh in both the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and D3Football.com Top 25 polls.

In 2014, Hammer was named a Division-III Coordinator of the Year finalist after his unit led Division-III in rushing defense (66.3 yds/g) and quarterback sacks (4.6 sacks/g), while ranking third in total defense, fifth in tackles for loss, and 12th in scoring defense. Little Giant linebacker Cody Buresh was named the NCAC Defensive Player of the Year and All-America

by both D3Football.com and the AFCA.

The 2013 Wabash defense led the nation in total defense (220.7 yds/g), fumbles recovered (19), and turnover margin (+24), while placing second in tackles for loss (11.6 TFL/g) and rushing defense (63.1). In 2012, the Little Giants placed eighth nationally in scoring defense and 10th in rushing defense, while linebacker CJ Gum earned the NCAC Defensive Player of the Year award for a second straight season.

In his first season as the Wabash defensive coordinator, the Little Giants ranked fifth in the nation in rushing defense (78.1 yds/g), 11th in scoring defense (12.9 pts/g), and 12th in total defense (249.4 yds/g), while they paced the NCAC in every defensive statistical category. In addition to Gum being named the conference's top defender, linebacker AJ Akinribade was named NCAC Newcomer of the Year.

Prior to his five-year tenure at Wabash, Hammer spent eight seasons on the football staff at Whittier College. After working as the Poets' defensive coordinator from 2003-05, Hammer was promoted to head coach, a position he held from 2006-10. Posting a 12-33 overall record, Hammer rebuilt a program that had just 13 players on its roster in 2003 to one that averaged a roster size of over 100. Thirty Whittier players were named All-Southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SCIAC), while the Whittier defense ranked second in the conference in total defense in 2006, and its rushing offense ranked second in the SCIAC in both 2009 and 2010.

Before his stint in California, Hammer spent the 2002 season as the linebackers coach at Heidelberg College, after beginning his coaching career in 2001 as the outside linebackers coach at Wabash.

Hammer graduated from Wabash in 2001, and is regarded as one of the top defenders to ever suit up for the Little Giants. He graduated as the school's record holder for tackles for loss in a game (five), season (23), and career (58), as well as single-season sacks (15), while he is tied with younger brother Blair as the Little Giants' all-time record holder in career sacks with 27.5. Team captain in 2000, Hammer was a two-time All-American and three-time All-Conference honoree, and was named the 2001 Pete Vaughn Award, which is given annually to the top Wabash senior athlete as voted upon by the athletic department.

A native of Carmel, Indiana, Hammer and wife Emily are the parents of daughters Layla and Ellie, and son William.

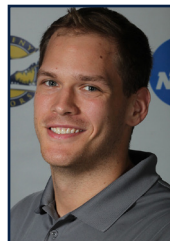
