GATORS, TOMCATS KICK OFF 2017 SEASON

Allegheny opens its 122nd season of Gator football at local non-conference rival Thiel College under the lights at Alumni Stadium in the first Thursday night game in Gator history. This week's game kicks off B.J. Hammer's second season at the helm of the Gators, and his squad welcomes back 35 letterwinners from last year's cam-



paign, including 19 players who made at least three starts. This marks the fourth straight season that the Gators and Tomcats face off on opening day, with Thiel winning each of the last three meetings. The Gators are searching for their first season-opening win since the 2012 season, while they last defeated Thiel in week one of the 1997 season by a 45-19 count.

FOR OPENERS

This week, Allegheny opens its 122nd season of football. The Gators will be looking for their first opening day victory since 2012, when the Gators posted a come-from-behind 17-14 victory at conference foe Wooster. This marks the fourth straight season in which Allegheny faces Thiel in the season opener, with the Tomcats winning each time. Dating back to the 1990 campaign, Allegheny is 10-16-1 in week one, with a pair of those wins coming against Thiel, including a 61-13 decision in 1996, and a 45-19 win a year later. In all, the Gators and Tomcats have faced off in the season opener 13 times, with Thiel holding a 9-4-1 edge in those meetings.

WELCOME BACK

A total of 61 players return to the Gator roster from a season ago, including 36 letterwinners and 19 players who started at least two games. The Gator returners accounted for 97 percent of the team's rushing yards a season ago, 90 percent of its passing yards, and 60 percent of its receiving yards. Defensively, this year's returnees accounted for 63 percent of last year's tackles, 76 percent of last year's quarterback sacks, and 62 percent of last year's tackles for loss.

HEALTHY RETURNS

In 2016, current senior Jake Wilson established a new NCAA Division III record for kick return yards in a season, amassing 1,268 on 54 tries, good for an average of 23.7 yards per return. Wilson, who earned All-North Coast Athletic Conference honors for his performance, tallied five kick returns over 40 yards, including a career-high 76-yarder in last year's season opener with Thiel, the third-longest recorded by an North Coast Athletic Conference player on the season. Wilson, who also added 34 punt return yards on the season, led all NCAC players with an average of 144.7 all-purpose yards per game.

PASS IT ON

Junior quarterback Logan Lee appeared in all 10 games last season, starting nine, and threw for 1,608 yards and 14 touchdowns. The 14 touchdowns ranked fourth in the North Coast Athletic Conference, and were the most for a Gator signal caller in a single season since T.J. Salopek threw for 19 scores in 2010. Lee led a Gator passing game that showed a propensity for the big play, as he had six completions of 45 yards or longer, and four of 70 yards or longer.

'A' FOR ALEX

Last season, current sophomore Alex Victor hauled in 34 passes for 554 yards with eight touchdowns. He ranked third in the NCAC in both touchdown receptions and yards per catch (16.3), and was the recipient of three of the five longest pass plays recorded in the NCAC last season. In week four at Kenyon, Logan Lee and Victor hooked up for an 85-yard touchdown. Three weeks later against DePauw, Victor and Lee teamed up for touchdowns of 86 and 74 yards, as Victor finished the day with 219 receiving yards, the second most in a game in Allegheny history. His eight touchdown grabs last season were the most for an Allegheny player since 2010, when Terry Hartford also hauled in eight scores. The last time a Gator had more than eight touchdown receptions in a season was in 2006, when Dallas Robinson grabbed 11.

AT A LOSS

The 2016 Gator defense totaled 69 tackles for loss, their most in a single-season since 2010. Ten players on the 2017 opening day roster recorded at least 1.5 TFLs a season ago, led by sophomore Jahnaaman Boone, who totaled 10.5 stops behind the line of scrimmage, including a team-best 5.0 quarterback sacks. Junior Marcus Davenport accounted for 9.0 TFLs last season, while senior Freddy Ruiz tallied 6.5 and junior Colten Buzard 5.5.

OH BROTHER

Three sets of siblings are included on this year's roster, including junior linebacker Vito Antinozzi and sophomore offensive lineman Dominic Antinozzi, junior running back Tyler Balla and freshman defensive back Chase Balla, and junior quarterback Logan Lee and freshman defensive lineman Grayson Lee.

UP NEXT

Next Saturday, the Gators will open North Coast Athletic Conference play with a 5 p.m. twilight game against Wooster at Frank B. Fuhrer Field. Last season, the Gators and Fighting Scots met in a wild week two matchup in Ohio, Wooster prevailed 49-40 in a game that featured 1,009 yards of total offense and two lightning delays that totaled more than three hours.

ALLEGHENY vs. THIEL - THE SERIES

THE SERIES: This week marks the 76th all-time meeting between the Gators and Tomcats, two non-conference rivals separated by just 25 miles. The Gators hold a 38-32-5 edge in the series, but the Tomcats have owned the play as of late, winning each of the past three meetings, all of which were on opening day. Allegheny's last win in the set came in the 1997 season-opener, by a 48-19 score. The series has been one of streaks, as prior to the Gators' current three-game losing skid against Thiel, Allegheny defeated the Tomcats six straight times between 1987-97. The Gators longest losing skid against Thiel came 1953-57, when they dropped five straight meetings.

LAST MEETING: On Sept. 3, 2016 in front of a capacity crowd under the lights at Frank B. Fuhrer Field, the visiting Tomcats jumped out to a 14-0 first quarter lead and a 21-0 advantage at the half, and then held off a strong second half by the Gators to win 44-21. The Tomcats took advantage of the big play, with four of their five touchdowns covering 20 or more yards. Allegheny amassed 22 first downs to Thiel's 20, but the Tomcats rode a solid ground game, amassing 297 of its 405 yards of offense on the ground, including touchdown runs of 40 and 10 yards by Payton Hicks. Tyler Balla led the Gators with 113 rushing yards on 21 carries, including a fourth quarter 10-yard

touchdown run, while teammate Logan Lee threw third quarter touchdown strikes to Ben Bachik and Alec Hutchin. Allegheny junior Jake Wilson entered the record books in the loss, gaining a school-record 223 yards on kick returns, highlighted by a career-high 76-yarder late in the first quarter.

HEAD COACH B.J. HAMMER

Second Season

BJ Hammer was named the 34th head coach in Allegheny football program history on January 4, 2016.

In his first season at the helm, Hammer saw a pair of his players earn All-NCAC honors, including senior John McFarland and junior Jake

Wilson. McFarland ended his career as one of the most prolific tight ends in program history, and hauled in 48 catches for 552 yards. Wilson established an NCAA Division III record with 1,268 kick return yards, averaging 24.5 yards per try, and breaking off five returns of 50 yards or longer. As a team, the Gator offense saw an increase of an average of 9.0 points and 83 yards per game from the 2015 season, while the team's pass defense ranked in the top five of the NCAC.

Hammer arrived at Allegheny after spending five seasons as the defensive coordinator at fellow North Coast Athletic Conference member Wabash College. There, he led a defensive unit that consistently ranked among NCAA Division-III's best. During his five-year tenure, the Little Giants posted a record of 51-7, making three appearances in the NCAA Division-III playoffs and winning NCAC championships in 2011 and 2015. He mentored the NCAC Defensive Player of the Year in four of his five seasons as defensive coordinator, while 22 Wabash defenders were First Team All-NCAC honorees, and four were named All-America.

In 2015, the Little Giants finished 12-1, including a perfect 8-0 in the NCAC, and advanced to the third round of the NCAA playoffs. Hammer's defense ranked third nationally with 26 interceptions, fourth in rushing defense (72.2 yds/g), fifth in total defense (240.9 yds/g), and seventh in quarterback sacks (42). Eight Little Giant defenders earned All-NCAC honors, including six First Team selections, highlighted by defensive tackle Tyler McCullen, who was named the NCAC Defensive Player of the Year and a D3Football.com All-American. Wabash ended the year ranked seventh in both the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and D3Football.com Top 25 polls.

In 2014, Hammer was named a Division-III Coordinator of the Year finalist after his unit led Division-III in rushing defense (66.3 yds/g) and quarterback sacks (4.6 sacks/g), while ranking third in total defense, fifth in tackles for loss, and 12th in scoring defense. Little Giant linebacker Cody Buresh was named the NCAC Defensive Player of the Year and All-America

by both D3Football.com and the AFCA.

The 2013 Wabash defense led the nation in total defense (220.7 yds/g), fumbles recovered (19), and turnover margin (+24), while placing second in tackles for loss (11.6 TFL/g) and rushing defense (63.1). In 2012, the Little Giants placed eighth nationally in scoring defense and 10th in rushing defense, while linebacker CJ Gum earned the NCAC Defensive Player of the Year award for a second straight season.

In his first season as the Wabash defensive coordinator, the Little Giants ranked fifth in the nation in rushing defense (78.1 yds/g), 11th in scoring defense (12.9 pts/g), and 12th in total defense (249.4 yds/g), while they paced the NCAC in every defensive statistical category. In addition to Gum being named the conference's top defender, linebacker AJ Akinribade was named NCAC Newcomer of the Year.

Prior to his five-year tenure at Wabash, Hammer spent eight seasons on the football staff at Whittier College. After working as the Poets' defensive coordinator from 2003-05, Hammer was promoted to head coach, a position he held from 2006-10. Posting a 12-33 overall record, Hammer rebuilt a program that had just 13 players on its roster in 2003 to one that averaged a roster size of over 100. Thirty Whittier players were named All-Southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SCIAC), while the Whittier defense ranked second in the conference in total defense in 2006, and its rushing offense ranked second in the SCIAC in both 2009 and 2010.

Before his stint in California, Hammer spent the 2002 season as the linebackers coach at Heidelberg College, after beginning his coaching career in 2001 as the outside linebackers coach at Wabash.

Hammer graduated from Wabash in 2001, and is regarded as one of the top defenders to ever suit up for the Little Giants. He graduated as the school's record holder for tackles for loss in a game (five), season (23), and career (58), as well as single-season sacks (15), while he is tied with younger brother Blair as the Little Giants' all-time record holder in career sacks with 27.5. Team captain in 2000, Hammer was a two-time All-American and three-time All-Conference honoree, and was named the 2001 Pete Vaughn Award, which is given annually to the top Wabash senior athlete as voted upon by the athletic department.

A native of Carmel, Indiana, Hammer and wife Emily are the parents of daughters Layla and Ellie, and son William.

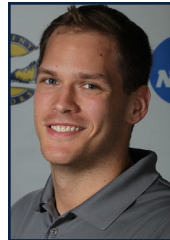
