GATORS TRAVEL TO HIRAM FOR NCAC CLASH

This week, Allegheny will make the short trek across state lines to face Hiram in an NCAC clash. The Gators are coming off of an impressive 25-17 home win over Ohio Wesleyan. Trailing 17-9 in the opening minutes of the third quarter, the Gators scored 16 unanswered points, which included a pair of Logan Lee touchdown passes, to pull away for the win. The Gator defense forced four OWU turnovers and totaled seven quarterback sacks in the victory. The Gators will be looking for a repeat of their success against Hiram from a season ago, as Allegheny gained 539 yards of total offense and posted eight quarterback sacks in a 57-40 victory on Sept. 30 under the lights at Frank B. Fuhrer Field.



Under third-year coach Henry Stanford, 1-2 Hiram enters the week searching for their first NCAC victory of the season. The Terriers have suffered a pair of lopsided defeats against the NCAC's Indiana schools, dropping a 41-17 decision to Wabash in the season opener, before falling 45-7 at DePauw last week. Through the first three weeks of the season, Hiram has showcased a strong rushing attack, gaining an average of 182.0 yards per game on the ground. Veteran quarterback Randy Tucker has completed 32 of 60 passes for 387 yards and three touchdowns, with all three going to sophomore D.J. Franklin. Tucker has also rushed for a pair of scores, while the tandem of Christopher Biddy and Chris Chester pacing the Hiram defense, as the former has a team-high 21 tackles, and the latter 20, including 7.5 for loss.

MEDIA INFORMATION

Interviews of Allegheny coaches and athletes shall be arranged through the school's office of athletic communications. On game days, locker rooms are closed to the media. Following the game, players will be available for interviews upon request once they are dismissed by the coaching staff. Due to extremely limited press box space, requests for press box and media credentials should be made to Jim Berger no later than 48 hours prior to each game.

MARCUS CAUSES MAYHEM: In last week's victory over Ohio Wesleyan, senior defensive end Marcus Davenport recorded eight total tackles, including 5.0 for loss and 2.0 sacks. The 5.0 TFLs mark a single game record for the Gators, and are the most in a game by a North Coast Athletic Conference player since week three of last season. For his week four performance, Davenport was named to the D3Football.com Team of the Week, a weekly honor roll that recognizes the top performers from across the nation at each position. He is the second player this season to earn the D3Football.com honor, joining wide receiver Alex Victor's week one selection. Davenport enters this week leading the NCAC in both sacks (4.5) and TFLs (9.0), while his average of 2.3 TFLs per game is eighth-most in NCAA Division III.

SOLID SACK TIME: Last week against Ohio Wesleyan, the Allegheny defense totaled seven quarterback sacks, with Marcus Davenport credited with 2.0, Bryan Lopez and Seth Warburton 1.5, and Kyle McGee 1.0. Through the first four games of the season, the Gator defense has totaled 17 sacks, good for second in the NCAC. Their average of 4.25 sacks per game ranks 15th in NCAA Division III.

GOING TO WAR(BURTON): In the win over Ohio Wesleyan, senior defensive end/outside linebacker Seth Warburton registered 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks, while adding both a forced fumble and fumble recovery. Through the first four games this season, Warburton has forced four fumbles, which leads all of NCAA Division III. He is the first Allegheny player to have four forced fumbles in a single season since Jon Olshock in 2000, while Warburton also ranks second in the NCAC with 8.5 TFLs, and fourth with 3.5 sacks.

RUN STOPPERS: Allegheny allowed just 48 rushing yards in the week four win against Ohio Wesleyan, the lowest amount surrendered by the team since Oct. 5, 2013, when they gave up 32, also against Ohio Wesleyan. Last week was the first time Allegheny yielded fewer than 100 rushing yards to an opponent since Sept. 24, 2016, when Kenyon ran for 84.

DON'T JINX IT: After going 2-for-2 on field goal attempts in the win over Ohio Wesleyan, senior Zach Bednarowicz is now a perfect 6-for-6 on three point tries this season. His two makes in the win measured 40 and 41 yards, with the former the longest for a Gator kicker since Ben Ziokowski's 42-yarder on Nov. 1, 2014 against Kenyon. Dating back to the beginning of the 2017 season, Bednarowicz has made nine of his last 11 tries, with five measuring 30 yards or longer.

CLIMBING THE RANKS: After throwing a pair of touchdown strikes in the week four win over Ohio Wesleyan, senior quarterback Logan Lee now ranks second all-time in Allegheny program history with 54 career touchdown passes, one shy of the program record set by Bubba Smith in 2003. Following last week's performance, Lee has 5,738 career passing yards, good for third in program history.

PICK PARTY: Following its two interception performance in last week's win over Ohio Wesleyan, the Gator defense has now totaled five picks on the season, which rank second in the NCAC. The five interceptions are the most in a season for the Gator defense since 2004, when they totaled eight on the year. Quentin Hunt, who tallied his second INT of the year against Ohio Wesleyan, is one of just three players in the NCAC with at least two interceptions this season. Hunt is one of four Gators with at least one pick this season, as Charles Ross, Zach Martin, and Bryan Lopez all have one apiece.

MR. CONSISTENT: Senior Tyler Balla ran for a season-high 175 yards in last week's win over Ohio Wesleyan, and enters the matchup with Hiram with a conference-leading 402 yards on the season. Balla has run for at least 65 yards in 12 of the team's last 14 games, and has topped the 100-yard plateau eight times, the most 100-yard rushing performances in a career for a Gator since Mario Tarquinio totaled 14 between 2003-06.

RHOADES THE SCHOLAR: On Wednesday, Allegheny senior receiver Tristan Rhoades was named a semifinalist for the prestigious William V. Campbell Trophy, awarded by the National Football Foundation for the top football scholar-athlete in the nation across all three NCAA classifications. A biology major and psychology minor, Rhoades carries a 3.62 grade point average, and enters this week's matchup with Hiram with 13 receptions for 162 yards and a touchdown, while he is also averaging 20.4 yards on seven kick returns.

CAPTAIN GATORS: Allegheny's five co-captains for the 2018 season include senior defensive tackle Marcus Davenport, senior receiver Tristan Rhoades, senior running back Tyler Balla, junior linebacker Corey Laskey.

UP NEXT: Following the Hiram meeting, the Gators will enter their bye week. The team is next scheduled to face off against Wittenberg on Saturday, October 13 at 1 p.m. at Frank B. Fuhrer Field.

ALLEGHENY vs. HIRAM - THE LAST MEETING

MEADVILLE, Pa. (Sept. 30, 2017) - Allegheny showcased a prolific offense and a timely defense to shrug off an early 13-point deficit and snap a three-game losing streak with a 57-40 victory over Hiram under the lights at Frank B. Fuhrer Field.

Logan Lee threw for 292 yards and five touchdowns, including three to Alex Victor, while Tyler Balla rushed for 193 yards, as the Gators scored their most points in a game since 1999 to drop the Terriers to 1-3.

Not to be overshadowed by the offense, the Gator defense also enjoyed a strong game, led by Marcus Davenport, who totaled 13 tackles, including 4.5 for loss and 2.5 sacks. In all, the Gators totaled eight sacks and forced three turnovers, including a late first quarter pick-six by Travis Thomas that turned the tide for the hosts.

In a frenetic first quarter, Hiram's Randy Tucker threw a pair of touchdown passes over the first 10 minutes to stake his team out to a 13-0 lead, but the Gators responded quickly. With 3:14 left in the quarter, Lee and Victor connected for their first score of the day, a 37-yard touchdown, before the first play of the Terriers' ensuing drive ended with Thomas' 35-yard interception return score to give Allegheny a 15-13 lead. The two-point margin wouldn't last, as Tucker threw his third touchdown pass of the quarter, a 35-yarder to Luther Fortson, with no time left on the clock to stake the Terriers to a 19-15 lead.

The second quarter belonged to the Gators, who scored 21 unanswered points behind Lee, who threw touchown passes of 67 yards to Victor and three yards to Austin French, while also running for a 20-yard touchdown, as Allegheny would lead 36-19 at the intermission.

The teams traded long touchdown passes in the third quarter, with Hiram's Randy Myers threw a 49-yard score to Moe Yarbrough, before Lee connected with Victor for a 65-yard touchdown that gave Allegheny a 43-27 lead at the end of the third.

Hiram scored twice in the fourth quarter, but were unable to pull any closer, as the Gators also found the end zone a pair of times, with a 57-yard pass from Rhoades to Victor, and a 10-yard Balla run to ice the game.

Balla's 193 yards were the most in a game for a Gator since 2006, while Allegheny's 539 yards of total offense were their most in a game since a 563-yard output in a 2009 win over Oberlin.

Last Time Out: Gators Take Down Battling Bishops

MEADVILLE, Pa. (Sept. 22, 2018) – A tenacious rushing attack and a stout defensive performance lifted Allegheny to a 25-17 victory over Ohio Wesleyan in North Coast Athletic Conference action at Frank B. Fuhrer Field.

Allegheny (2-2, 2-1 NCAC) senior Tyler Balla rushed for a season-high 175 yards and a touchdown, while the Gator defense forced four Ohio Wesleyan (1-2, 1-1 NCAC) turnovers and totaled seven quarterback sacks, as the Gators earned their first win over the Battling Bishops since 2010.

Trailing 17-9 early in the third quarter, the Gators scored two touchdowns in a six-minute span to re-gain the lead, and the defense made the advantage stand up, surrendering just 60 yards over the final 18 minutes of play.

The teams would trade scoreless possessions over the opening stages of a briskly-paced first quarter, before the Gators took advantage of Ohio Wesleyan's first offensive miscue. With just over six minutes left in the frame, Seth Warburton's sack forced OWU quarterback Kameron Smith to fumble, and Corey Laskey pounced on the loose ball to give the Gators possession at the OWU 25. The Battling Bishops' defense yielded just two yards over the next three plays, but Allegheny senior Zach Bednarowicz came on and buried a 40-yard field goal to put the hosts on top 3-0 with 5:07 left.

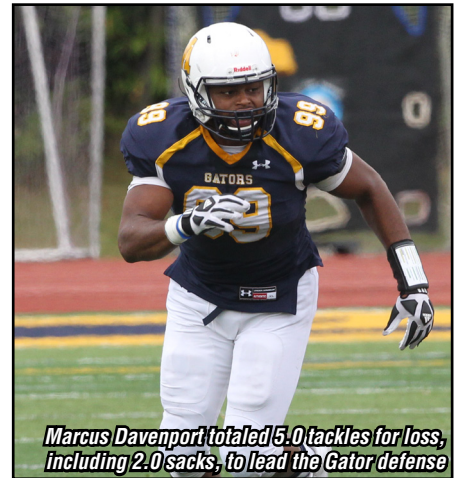
Just two plays after the field goal, Warburton yet again made a strip sack on Smith on the OWU 17, but this time, Allegheny couldn't cash in on the turnover, as on second-and-goal, the Battling Bishops' Alec Varteressian forced a fumble that was recovered by teammate Ryan Rubel at the five yardline.

The Battling Bishops used a pair of long gainers to escape the shadows of their own goal posts, with a 37-yard keeper from Smith followed by a 19-yard pass to Gabe Miller to move the ball to the Allegheny 37 to close the quarter. Another 19-yard pass, this time to Curtis Duren, pushed the ball inside the red zone, before an Allegheny pass interference penalty would set up first-and-goal from inside the three.

A pair of OWU rushes brought the ball to the one yardline, but on third and goal, Marcus Davenport burst through the line to throw Smith four a three-yard loss, and the Bishops had to settle for a 22-yard field goal from Gabe Philhower to tie the game at 3-all with 12:50 left in the half.

On the ensuing trip, the Gators rode the legs of Balla to mount an impressive 17-play drive that spanned over eight minutes. The veteran back ran seven times for 27 yards, while also catching a 12-yard reception, and capped off the trip with a one-yard touchdown plunge with 4:52 left in the half to put the hosts in front 9-3, which is how the score stood at halftime.

The Battling Bishops looked to seize the momentum out of the break. After Miller returned the opening kickoff 42 yards to midfield, OWU needed just two plays to take the lead, as Smith connected with Fields for a 48-yard touchdown strike to go up 10-9 just 80 seconds into the half.



Less than a minute later, the Bishops upped their lead. On the second play of the Gators' ensuing drive, Nick Heidel stepped in front of a Greer pass at the 11-yard line, and found the end zone untouched to push the lead to 17-9 with 12:43 remaining in the quarter.

The Gator offense then went to work. Logan Lee started the squad's next possession with a 12-yard pass to Tristan Rhoades, before connecting with Alex Victor for a 12-yard gain on third-and-nine to set up first down at the 50. A 16-yard run from Balla brought the ball inside the OWU 35, before Rhoades corralled a quick pass on the sideline, made a pair of defenders miss, and raced into the end zone. The two-point conversion try failed, but the Gators cut the gap to 17-15 with 9:59 to go in the quarter.

Allegheny's defense surrendered just three yards on OWU's next trip, and Lee and Balla would then lead the Gator offense on another productive drive. Taking over at their own 13, the trip began with a seven-yard run from Balla and an eight-yard completion to Victor. Two plays later, the Gators faced a third-and-three at their own 35, and Balla bruised his way up the middle for the required yardage. An 11-yard run from Balla brought the ball near midfield, before a 13-yard pass to Rhoades gave Allegheny first down on the OWU 36. Balla hauled in back-to-back screen passes from Lee to move inside the red zone, before the 11-play, 87-yard drive was capped off with a 17-yard touchdown pass from Lee to Bachik that put the Gators in front 22-17 with 3:50 left in the quarter.

Following another three-and-out from OWU, the Gators were in the midst of another lengthy drive to open the final stanza. Balla did the bulk of the work to start the drive, rushing five times for 27 yards, while another timely third down catch by Rhoades, this one for 18 yards, gave Allegheny a first down just inside the OWU 30. A dazzling one-handed grab from Jared Shaw moved the ball to the OWU 23, but the drive would then stall. Bednarowicz then pounded home a career-long 41-yard field goal with 9:50 left in regulation to give the Gators a 25-17 lead.

The Gator defense continued its stout performance down the stretch, forcing a punt and a turnover on downs on the Battling Bishops' next two possessions, before Charles Ross picked up his first career interception at the Allegheny 43 to quash OWU's third drive of the final quarter with 2:12 left to play.

Allegheny was able to milk a little more than a minute off the clock on its next trip, with OWU taking over at their own 20 with 1:07 left following a punt. After an 11-yard completion from Smith and a 21-yard run from Curtis Duren, the Battling Bishops had life, with first down a midfield. With just over six seconds left, Smith uncorked a long ball down the sideline, but it was picked off by Zach Martin at the 15-yardline as time expired, sealing the Gator win.

Balla finished with 214 all-purpose yards, as he hauled in five catches for 39 yards in addition to his 174 yards on the ground. Rhoades turned in a game-high 85 receiving yards on five grabs. Lee led the Allegheny passing attack, completing 13 of 18 passes for 154 yards and two TDs. Greer connected on four of eight tries for 35 yards.

For the game, the Gators nearly doubled-up the Battling Bishops in total offense, 398-205, while the Gator defense surrendered just 48 rushing yards.

Davenport led the Allegheny defensive effort, as he turned in five tackles for loss, including 2.0 sacks. McGee topped the Gators with 10 tackles on the day, including a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss, while Lopez, Warburton, and Laskey each made 2.5 tackles behind the line of scrimmage. The Gators' seven sacks were a season-high, and the most since posting eight on Sept. 30 of last season against Hiram.

ALLEGHENY COACHING STAFF



HEAD COACH B.J. HAMMER (3rd season)

B.J. Hammer was named the 34th head coach in Allegheny football program history on January 4, 2016.

After posting a 1-9 mark in his first season at Allegheny in 2016, the program's rebuilding took big strides in 2017, as the Gators finished 3-7 while posting prolific numbers on both sides of the ball. Offensively, Allegheny averaged 34.0 points and 449.6 yards per game, both of which were the Gators' most since 2002. Sophomore Alex Victor earned First Team All-NCAC honors after setting school records for receiving yards (1,037) and touchdowns (15), while Tyler Balla became the first Gator running back to earn All-NCAC laurels after rushing for 955 yards and 10 touchdowns. Quarterback Logan Lee also had a record-breaking season, setting new Gator single-season marks in nearly every passing category, including completions (214), yards (3,002), and touchdowns (33).

The 2017 Gator defense also saw a pair of All-NCAC recipients. Defensive end Colten Buzard set a new Allegheny single-season mark with 20.5 tackles for loss, while tying a 17-year old school record with 12.0 sacks. Defensive back Chase Balla became the first Gator rookie to earn All-NCAC honors since 2014, as he finished with a team-best 73 tackles while breaking up five passes.

In his first season at the helm, Hammer saw a pair of his players earn All-NCAC honors, including senior John McFarland and junior Jake Wilson. McFarland ended his career as one of the most prolific tight ends in program history, and hauled in 48 catches for 552 yards. Wilson established an NCAA Division III record with 1,268 kick return yards, averaging 24.5 yards per try, and breaking off five returns of 50 yards or longer. As a team, the Gator offense saw an increase of an average of 9.0 points and 83 yards per game from the 2015 season, while the team's pass defense ranked in the top five of the NCAC.

Hammer arrived at Allegheny after spending five seasons as the defensive coordinator at fellow North Coast Athletic Conference member Wabash College. There, he led a defensive unit that consistently ranked among NCAA Division-III's best. During his five-year tenure, the Little Giants posted a record of 51-7, making three appearances in the NCAA Division-III playoffs and winning NCAC championships in 2011 and 2015. He mentored the NCAC Defensive Player of the Year in four of his five seasons as defensive coordinator, while 22 Wabash defenders were First Team All-NCAC honorees, and four were named All-America.

In 2015, the Little Giants finished 12-1, including a perfect 8-0 in the NCAC, and advanced to the third round of the NCAA playoffs. Hammer's defense ranked third nationally with 26 interceptions, fourth in rushing defense (72.2 yds/g), fifth in total defense (240.9 yds/g), and seventh in quarterback sacks (42). Eight Little Giant defenders earned All-NCAC honors, including six First Team selections. Wabash ended the year ranked seventh in both the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and D3Football.com Top 25 polls.

In 2014, Hammer was named a Division-III Coordinator of the Year finalist after his unit led D-III in rushing defense (66.3 yds/g) and quarterback sacks (4.6 sacks/g), while ranking third in total defense, fifth in tackles for loss, and 12th in scoring defense. Little Giant linebacker Cody Buresh was named the NCAC Defensive Player of the Year and All-America by both D3Football.com and the AFCA.

The 2013 Wabash defense led the nation in total defense (220.7 yds/g), fumbles recovered (19), and turnover margin (+24), while placing second in tackles for loss (11.6 TFL/g) and rushing defense (63.1). In 2012, the Little Giants placed eighth nationally in scoring defense and 10th in rushing defense, while linebacker CJ Gum earned the NCAC Defensive Player of the Year award for a second straight season.

In his first season as the Wabash defensive coordinator, the Little Giants ranked fifth in the nation in rushing defense (78.1 yds/g), 11th in scoring defense (12.9 pts/g), and 12th in total defense (249.4 yds/g), while they paced the NCAC in every defensive statistical category. In addition to Gum being named the conference's top defender, linebacker AJ Akinribade was named NCAC Newcomer of the Year.

Prior to his five-year tenure at Wabash, Hammer spent eight seasons on the football staff at Whittier College. After working as the Poets' defensive coordinator from 2003-05, Hammer was promoted to head coach, a position he held from 2006-10. Posting a 12-33 overall record, Hammer rebuilt a program that had just 13 players on its roster in 2003 to one that averaged a roster size of over 100. Thirty Whittier players were named All-Southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SCIAC), while the Whittier defense ranked second in the conference in total defense in 2006, and its rushing offense ranked second in the SCIAC in both 2009 and 2010.

Before his stint in California, Hammer spent the 2002 season as the linebackers coach at Heidelberg College, after beginning his coaching career in 2001 as the outside linebackers coach at Wabash.

Hammer graduated from Wabash in 2001, and is regarded as one of the top defenders to ever suit up for the Little Giants. He graduated as the school's record holder for tackles for loss in a game (five), season (23), and career (58), as well as single-season sacks (15), while he is tied with younger brother Blair as the Little Giants' all-time record holder in career sacks with 27.5. Team captain in 2000, Hammer was a two-time All-American and three-time All-Conference honoree, and was named the 2001 Pete Vaughn Award, which is given annually to the top Wabash senior athlete as voted upon by the athletic department.

A native of Carmel, Indiana, Hammer and wife Emily are the parents of daughters Layla and Ellie, and son William. They reside in Meadville.
