**ROAD SHOW CONTINUES:** Central Oklahoma is back on the road once again this week, going to San Angelo, Texas to challenge former Lone Star Conference rival Angelo State.

Kickoff at 17,500-seat San Angelo Stadium is 2 p.m.

The Bronchos are 0-2 on the young season, while the Rams are off to a 2-0 start with back-to-back road wins.

**ABOUT THE SERIES:** Angelo State owns a 17-6-1 lead in a series that started in 1973 with the lone tie, a 7-7 stalemate in Edmond.

The Rams have won the last two meetings, with UCO's last win a 30-24 overtime victory on Sept. 16, 2006 in Edmond.

ASU holds a dominating 12-1 lead in San Angelo and has taken the last seven games there. Central's lone road win in the series was a 19-11 upset in 1988 for the school's first-ever LSC victory.

**LAST YEAR:** UCO's long tenure in the Lone Star Conference ended with a 49-35 season-ending loss at Angelo State last Nov. 13.

The Bronchos tied the game 35-35 in the third quarter, but ASU scored twice in the final 9:40 of the game to take the win. Quarterback **Ethan Sharp** was 27-of-47 passing for 240 yards and four touchdowns to lead UCO, while the Rams rolled up 510 total yards.

**LAST WEEK:** Southeastern Oklahoma scored the last 10 points of the game to rally past UCO 30-23 for its ninth win in the last 10 meetings between the two. The Savage Storm outgained the Bronchos 492-341 and held a staggering 43:34-16:26 advantage in time of possession.

**INDEPENDENCE, THEN MIAA:** Central Oklahoma will be competing as NCAA Division II independents in all sports this year after ending a 20-year association with the Lone Star Conference following the 2010-11 academic year.

UCO, which is still be eligible for post-season competition in all sports, will join the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association in 2012-13.

**ON THE AIR:** All UCO games will be broadcast live on 1340-AM "The Game" or www.1340thegame.com (click "listen live"). Also on IHeartRadio smart phone apps under Oklahoma City stations.

Veteran play-by-play man **David Garrett** calls the action, with former UCO All-American **John Fitzgerald** adding color commentary.

**TOUGH SCHEDULE:** UCO faces a rugged schedule in 2011, playing its first four games -- and six of the first seven -- on the road.

The Bronchos meet two teams in the pre-season NCAA Division II top 20 (No. 6 North Alabama in the season opener and No. 18 Washburn on Oct. 15) and also go to Cal Poly on Oct. 8 for their first game against a Football Championship Subdivision team since 2000.

Seven of UCO's 11 opponents finished .500 or better last year.

### BRONCHO NICKNAME

Bronchos was the nickname selected for Central Oklahoma in 1922 by Mrs. C.W. Wantland, wife of long-time football coach C.W. Wantland.

The name was chosen from a number of suggestions for the name of UCO's football team and became the nickname for all athletic teams at the school.

### UCO FOOTBALL TIDBITS

⇒ The Bronchos have won 31 conference/division championships.

⇒ UCO has won more games than any other Oklahoma college team besides the University of Oklahoma.

⇒ The Bronchos have won seven or more games in a season 38 times.

⇒ UCO has had seven Harlon Hill Trophy candidates: RB Tyrone Jones (1993), RB Joe Aska ('94), RB Reggie Donner ('98), WR Dee Dee Carter ('01), RB Jarrod Manoy ('03), QB Justin Allgood ('04) and RB Joshua Birmingham ('10).

⇒ The Bronchos have had 18 players drafted into the NFL and former star Keith Traylor won three Super Bowl rings during a 17-year career.

**THE COACH:** Tracy Holland is 13-22 in his fourth year at the UCO helm. Holland earned Lone Star Conference North Division Coach of the Year honors in 2008 after leading the Bronchos to the division title and a 7-4 record.

UCO is 8-8 in home games under Holland and 5-14 on the road.

**NEXT WEEK:** UCO plays its fourth straight road game to open the season next Saturday, traveling to Weatherford to take on old rival Southwestern Oklahoma.

**RUNNING SUCCESS LEADS TO WINS:** UCO usually wins when it rushes for 200-plus yards, owning a 21-5 record in the 2000s when doing that.

**BRONCHOS ARE YOUNG:** Central Oklahoma has 23 true freshmen, redshirt freshmen and sophomores on its depth chart -- 12 on offense (nine freshmen, two sophomores, one redshirt freshman) and 11 on defense (five sophomores, three freshmen, three redshirt freshmen, ).

Of the 79 players on the numerical roster, 50 are freshmen/sophomores and 29 are juniors/seniors.

Fourteen freshmen -- 11 true and three redshirt -- were among the 44 players who saw action last week against Southeastern Oklahoma.

**BIRMINGHAM'S BACK:** All-American running back Joshua Birmingham had a career low for carries (nine) for the second straight game last week against Southeastern Oklahoma, but he still rushed for 123 yards with an electrifying 73-yard touchdown in the third quarter that gave the Bronchos a short-lived 23-20 lead.

Birmingham added a team-high five receptions for 32 yards and also completed the first two passes of his career out of the wildcat formation for 16 yards.

The 73-yard scoring dash ranks as the 23rd-longest in UCO history and was Birmingham's fifth career TD run of 50-plus yards, adding to his own school record.

It was also the seventh 100-yard rushing outing in 13 career games for the sophomore star, who has caught at least two passes in every game.

Through two games, Birmingham has 21 carries for 167 yards (8.0/carry) and one TD along with 13 receptions for 87 yards (6.7/catch).

Birmingham was a second-team Daktronics All-America pick last year when he rushed for 1,250 yards and 18 touchdowns on 243 carries while also catching a team-high 49 passes for 384 yards and three TDs.

**ETHAN IS SHARP:** Junior quarterback Ethan Sharp completed 19-of-41 passes for 207 yards and a touchdown in the Southeastern Oklahoma loss.

It marked the first time that Sharp completed less than 50 percent of his passes in 12 games as UCO's starter. His 39-yard third-quarter scoring pass to Matt Jackson was the third-longest of his 26 career TD passes with the Bronchos.

Sharp has moved into ninth place on the school's career passing chart with 3,004 yards. He needs just 45 more yards to take over eighth.

**YOUNG RECEIVERS SHINE:** A group of young wide receivers played a big role once again last week, with four freshmen combining to catch 10 passes for 113 yards against Southeastern Oklahoma.

Steve Caldwell (54 yards) and Christian Hood (37) had four receptions apiece

to lead the youthful contingent. **Terrance Davis** (12 yards) and **Andy Mensah** (10) made one catch each and running back **Qua'Don Henderson** also got in the act with a 10-yard grab.

**Davis** is a redshirt freshman and the other four are true freshmen.

**Hood** is tied with running back **Joshua Birmingham** for the team lead in catches with 13 for 111 yards, while **Caldwell** has 12 receptions for a team-best 138 yards.

**TIME DISADVANTAGE:** UCO lost the time of possession battle in last week's loss to Southeastern Oklahoma by nearly 30 minutes, with the Bronchos holding the ball just 16:26 of the 60-minute contest.

UCO ran only 54 plays, gaining 341 yards (6.3/play). The Savage Storm racked up 492 yards in 92 plays (5.3/play).

The Bronchos had a pair of one-play touchdown drives in the second half, which helped SOSU own a huge 24:17-5:43 time of possession edge in the final two quarters.

**MEADOWS MOWS 'EM DOWN:** Junior safety **Keno Meadows** had another monster game last week, racking up a career-high 15 tackles (13 solo, two assisted) with 1.0 for loss and one pass broken up against Southeastern Oklahoma.

It was the second straight career-high tackle outing for **Meadows**, who opened the season with 13 tackles at North Alabama.

**Meadows** leads the team in total tackles (28), solo tackles (20) and tackles for loss (2.5).

**DOZIER GETS ANOTHER PICK:** Sophomore safety **Devoris Dozier** made his third interception of the young season last week, picking off a Southeastern Oklahoma pass and returning it seven yards to the SOSU 39 to set up a quick-strike UCO touchdown.

**Dozier**, who had two interceptions in the season-opener at North Alabama, added a career-high nine tackles (five solo, four assisted).

**CASON ROLLS ALONG:** Senior line backer **Tucker Cason** had a solid outing against Southeastern Oklahoma, finishing with eight tackles (three solo, five assisted).

**Cason**, who led the Bronchos in tackles each of the past two years (90 in 2009, 91 in 2010), has had 11 games with 10-plus tackles in his career. He has 217 career tackles (100 solo, 117 assisted).

**BLOCK THAT KICK:** UCO blocked two kicks in last week's loss to Southeastern Oklahoma, with junior **Brandon Williams** knocking down a second-quarter extra

point try and senior **Herbert Byrd** smothering a fourth-period field goal attempt.

**Williams'** block led to two points for the Bronchos, with senior **Terry Battle** picking up the ball and returning it for a defensive two-point conversion that trimmed SOSU's lead to 13-8.

It was UCO's first blocked field goal since 2008 and also the first defensive two-point conversion since 2008.

**NO RETURNS:** UCO's punt coverage has been outstanding through two games. Opponents have attempted just five returns in 17 punts so far, having lost two yards on those five tries.

Southeastern Oklahoma managed just one return for no yards on seven UCO punts last week.

**ABOUT THE KICKERS:** Both UCO kickers had stellar outings in last week's game at Southeastern Oklahoma.

Junior place-kicker **Chris Robbs** was 2-of-2 on field goals in addition to making his only extra point try. He hit a 22-yard field goal on the opening possession of the game to give the Bronchos a 3-0 lead and added a 36-yarder in the second period to cut SOSU's lead to 7-6.

**Robbs** is UCO's leading scorer with 11 points, having hit 3-of-4 field goals and 2-of-2 PATs.

Sophomore **Landon Greve** averaged 38.1 yards on seven punts with a long of 44 and had one downed inside the 20-yard-line. He's averaging 38.4 yards on 17 punts for the season.

**ABOUT ANGELO STATE:** Angelo State returned 13 starters from last year's 5-5 team and is off to a 2-0 start under first-year head coach **Will Wagner**, who helped lead Northwest Missouri to three NCAA Division II national championships during a long tenure as assistant coach.

The Rams scored 28 unanswered points to overcome a 42-21 fourth-quarter deficit and stun Chadron State 49-42 last week for their second straight road win to start the season. ASU routed Western State 35-12 in its opener.

**Blake Hamblin** completed 24-of-37 passes for 271 yards and four touchdowns in the Chadron State win, tossing three of those TDs in the fourth-quarter comeback.

ASU is averaged 413.5 yards a game (222.0 passing, 191.5 rushing) and giving up just 308.0 a contest (220.0 passing, 88.0 rushing).

**Hamblin** is 37-of-55 passing for 433 yards and five TDs. **Tristin Carter** leads the running game with 182 yards and two scores on 34 carries.

Defensive back **Alvin Johnson** tops the defense with 13 tackles.

⇒ **North Alabama 31, UCO 10 (Sept. 1 • Florence, Ala.)** - UCO hung tough most of the way against North Alabama before falling 31-10 to the No. 6-ranked Lions. The Bronchos led 3-0 in the first quarter, trailed just 14-3 at halftime and were down only 24-10 until UNA put the game away on a touchdown with 4:24 left to play. Quarterback **Ethan Sharp** hit 41-of-71 passes -- both school records -- for 351 yards and a TD to lead UCO.

⇒ **Southeastern Oklahoma 30, UCO 23 (Sept. 10 • Durant, Okla.)** - Southeastern Oklahoma scored the last 10 points of the game to rally past UCO 30-23 for its ninth win in the last 10 meetings between the two. The Savage Storm outgained the Bronchos 492-341 and held a staggering 43:34-16:26 advantage in time of possession.

⇒ **Angelo State • Sept. 17 • San Angelo, Texas** - ASU leads the series 17-6-1. The Bronchos travel to San Angelo for the second straight year.

⇒ **Southwestern Oklahoma • Sept. 24 • Weatherford, Okla.** - UCO leads the series 58-25-3. The Bronchos have played SWOSU more than any other opponent.

⇒ **East Central • Oct. 1 • Edmond** - UCO leads the series 59-18-4. It's Homecoming and the home-opener for the Bronchos, who have won five straight against the Tigers.

⇒ **Cal Poly • Oct. 8 • San Luis Obispo, Calif.** - First-ever meeting. UCO takes on its first Football Championship Subdivision opponent since 2000.

⇒ **Washburn • Oct. 15 • Topeka, Kan.** - First-ever meeting. The Bronchos play their final road game of the season against a future conference rival.

⇒ **Fort Hays State • Oct. 22 • Edmond** - UCO leads the series 6-0. It's the first meeting between the two future conference rivals since a 28-0 UCO win in 1995.

⇒ **Black Hills State • Oct. 27 • Edmond** - First-ever meeting. The Bronchos play a rare Thursday night home game.

⇒ **Northeastern State • Nov. 5 • Edmond** - UCO leads the series 44-24-2. The Bronchos lead 7-6 in the President's Cup battle, which started in 1998.

⇒ **Lindenwood • Nov. 12 • Edmond** - First-ever meeting. The Lions are moving to NCAA Division II and will be in the same conference with UCO next year.
