



2025 D2CCA All-South Central Region Volleyball Team

PLAYER OF THE YEAR: Madi Parrish



Angelo State's Madi Parrish has been selected as the D2CCA South Central Region Player of the Year.

The senior outside hitter led the Rambelles to a 24-7 record (15-2 LSC) and their 12th LSC tournament championship. Parrish contributed in all areas for Angelo State, filling up the stat sheet each match. She has tallied 396 kills (3.70 per set, 3rd LSC), 41 aces (0.38 per set, 7th LSC), 459.5 (4.29 points per set, 2nd LSC), 287 digs, and a .254 hitting percentage on the year.

Parrish registered 17 double-doubles with the combo of kills and digs. She finished 21 matches with double-figure kills, and 17 with double-figure digs. The Saginaw, Texas native has an ace in nine consecutive matches, including posting five in five sets vs. DBU.

ASU earned the No. 3 seed and will play No. 6 Lubbock Christian in the first round of the 2025 NCAA DII South Central Regional Championships.

2025 D2CCA All-South Central Region Volleyball Teams Announced

PORTALES, N.M. - The Division II Conference Commissioners Association (D2CCA) announced the 2025 All-South Central Region Volleyball Teams today, with Angelo State University's Madi Parrish earning Player of the Year honors.

Parrish, a junior outside hitter from Saginaw, Texas, led the Rambelles to a 24-7 overall record and 15-2 mark in Lone Star Conference play, culminating in the program's 12th LSC tournament championship. The 5-foot-9 standout has been a statistical leader across multiple categories, recording 396 kills (3.70 per set, third in LSC), 41 service aces (0.38 per set, seventh in LSC), and 459.5 points (4.29 per set, second in LSC). She also contributed 287 digs while maintaining a .254 hitting percentage throughout the season. Parrish was most recently selected as the LSC Player of the Year and Offensive Player of the Year.

Parrish's versatility has been on display all season, registering 17 double-doubles. She recorded double-figure kills in 21 matches and double-figure digs in 17 contests. The junior has recorded a service ace in each of the last nine matches for the Belles. She also notched a season-high five aces in a five-set victory over DBU.

In addition to the player of the year award, the D2CCA recognized individual position award winners across the South Central region. Parrish was named Outside Hitter of the Year, while MSU Denver's Alyssa Boyte earned Middle Blocker/Hitter of the Year honors. Lubbock Christian's freshman Camdyn Sears was selected as Setter of the Year, and St. Mary's Alyssa Koehl received Libero/Defensive Specialist of the Year recognition.

The All-South Central Region First Team features seven student-athletes representing both the Lone Star Conference and Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference. CSU Pueblo's Caelyn Gunn, a 5-foot-10 senior outside hitter, and MSU Denver's Annika Helf, a 5-foot-10 senior outside hitter, earned first-team honors alongside Angelo State's Parrish.

The first team also includes two middle blockers: MSU Denver's Alyssa Boyte, a 6-foot sophomore, and West Texas A&M's Taytum Stow, a 6-foot-2 senior. Rounding out the first team are Lubbock Christian freshman setter Camdyn Sears (5-foot-8) and St. Mary's senior libero/defensive specialist Alyssa Koehl (5-foot-7).

The All-South Central Region Second Team features a strong contingent of outside hitters, including West Texas A&M's 5-foot-11 senior Currie Marusak, Adams State's 6-foot-4 senior Hadleigh Richardson, and DBU's 6-foot-1 junior Karly Wells.

Additional second team selections include UCCS junior middle blocker 6-foot-2 Nicole Martin, and Colorado School of Mines sophomore middle blocker Jenna McLaughlin, who also stands at 6-foot-2. CSU Pueblo's 5-foot-10 junior setter Elena Stankovic and Texas Woman's 5-foot-3 junior libero/defensive specialist Alyssa Rojo complete the second team honorees.

The South Central Region encompasses institutions from the Lone Star Conference and Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference. The D2CCA All-Region teams are voted on by sports information directors from schools in the region.

First team selections advance to the national ballot for All-America consideration. The D2CCA All-America teams will be announced later this month.
