APP STATE STORYLINES

- App State will play the 1,000th football game in program history when it hits the road to face ULM. The Mountaineers will be looking to improve to 45-5 in their last 50 games vs. Sun Belt opponents and 21-4 in their 25th conference road game since joining the Sun Belt in 2014.
- The Mountaineers opened their league schedule and ended a 26-day break between games with a 45-17 home victory against Arkansas State. App State had 12 tackles for loss, six sacks and two interceptions while holding the Red Wolves to no TD passes and 21.2 points below their average. App State's offense rushed for 305 yards, and QB **Zac Thomas** accounted for five total touchdowns.
- Zac Thomas** (26-4 as a starter) is No. 2 in active FBS QB wins behind Clemson's Trevor Lawrence (31-1). Thomas tied his career high of four TD passes and rushed for a career-high 82 yards, thanks in part to an electrifying 60-yard touchdown run, during the lopsided win against Arkansas State.
- App State's 57-13 record and 81.6 winning percentage since the start of the 2015 season is No. 5 nationally behind just Clemson (75-5, 93.8%), Alabama (71-6, 92.2%), Ohio State (62-7, 89.9%) and Oklahoma (61-12, 83.6%). App State, Clemson and Oklahoma are the only FBS programs that have won a conference title in each of the last four seasons.
- Going into its 1,000th game, App State has a 632-339-28 record since taking the field for the first time on Sept. 29, 1928. This is the Mountaineers' 91st overall season of football and seventh FBS season.
- Shemar Jean-Charles**, a senior, and junior **Shaun Jolly**, a preseason All-American, form the No. 1 cornerback tandem in the nation, according to PFF College. Jean-Charles leads the nation in PBUs (nine in just four games), and App State has an FBS-leading 92 interceptions since the start of 2015.
- App State's defense as a whole ranks among the FBS leaders in several categories, including passes defended per game (T-No. 1, 7.5), lowest completion percentage allowed (No. 2, 44.8%), passing efficiency defense (No. 5, 95.97) and red zone defense (No. 9, 64.3%). The only team allowing a lower completion percentage is Wisconsin, which played its first game Saturday and finished it at 36.4%.
- The Mountaineers' five starting offensive linemen have totaled 134 career starts — No. 2 nationally behind Virginia's 140. App State has rushed for 305 and 404 yards in its last two games.

During a standard week with a Saturday game, App State will have Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday media availabilities.

Head coach Shawn Clark's appearances on the weekly Sun Belt coaches teleconference are Mondays from 11:30 a.m. ET until approximately 11:37 a.m.

After his appearance on the Sun Belt call, Clark will be available for a Zoom call with media members, and he'll be followed by Zoom interviews with select student-athletes (contingent on their availability). Media members interested in participating should contact Joey or Bret by the end of the day Sunday to be included on an email that includes the Zoom link. Interviews will be done remotely, so media members should not come to the Mark E. Ricks Athletics Complex on Monday.

During standard weeks, practices on Tuesdays and Wednesdays will be open to approved media members.

If you plan to attend one or both practices, communicate those plans and submit specific interview requests to Joey or Bret by 9 a.m. on Tuesday (for Tuesday's practice) and 9 a.m. on Wednesday (for Wednesday's practice). If you have more than one person from your organization planning to attend, the name of each attendee needs to be shared in advance.

No reporters will be allowed on the sidelines, and media members must wear face coverings while watching practice from the stands in a socially distanced manner. **NO VIDEOS OR PHOTOS CAN BE TAKEN DURING PRACTICE.**

Media attending practice are forbidden from reporting (e.g. tweeting, blogging, etc.) on anything until after the post-practice interviews have been conducted. This includes media who leave practice early.

Post-practice interviews will select coaches and players will be conducted via Zoom. More details on attendance and interview protocols will be shared with individuals who plan to attend a 2020 practice for the first time.

GAME DAY PROCEDURES

At home games, a check-in post will be set up for credentialed media members to receive their game credential and conduct a health check. In order to maintain a safe environment, media members must pass the health check in order to enter the stadium.

Credentialed visitors will be required to wear face coverings and keep them on the entire time they are in Kidd Brewer Stadium. Visitors with press box access (seventh floor) must stay on that level throughout the entirety of their stay — they are not allowed to go up and down in the building.

Bathrooms on the seventh floor will be available. With safety measures and social distancing in mind, a media meal will not be served, but cold drinks will be available. We encourage credentialed visitors to bring food and permitted drinks (no alcohol) in bags that can be checked upon stadium entry.

Media members will remain in the press box for postgame Zoom interviews with Coach Clark and select players.

- **Shawn Clark**, who was App State's OL coach from 2016-19, made his regular-season debut as the Mountaineers' head coach on Sept. 12. He was named head coach on Dec. 13, 2019 — eight days before he led App State to a 31-17 bowl victory against UAB in New Orleans. He served as the offensive coordinator under interim head coach **Mark Ivey** during a 45-13 bowl win against Middle Tennessee in 2018 and was also the assistant head coach on **Elijah Drinkwitz's** staff in 2019.
 - **Jerry Moore** is App State's all-time winningest head coach with a 215-87 record in 24 seasons. In 24 years as an App State assistant, many alongside Moore, current defensive coordinator **Dale Jones** has now been part of 215 victories thanks to a strong defensive showing in the Arkansas State win. He served as an App State assistant from 1996-2018, went to Louisville in 2019 and is back in Boone.
 - App State has six team captains this year: seniors **Zac Thomas** (QB), **Noah Hannon** (C), **Thomas Hennigan** (WR), **Demetrius Taylor** (DE), **Elijah Diarrassouba** (DE) and **Shemar-Jean Charles** (CB).
 - The Mountaineers are back to receiving votes in both the AP Top 25 (six voting points) and Amway Coaches Poll (16 voting points). App State had received votes in 23 straight weeks of the AP poll prior to facing Campbell and building a 52-13 lead despite missing 20-plus players. App State was ranked No. 23 going into the Marshall game on Sept. 19, marking its 10th week as a ranked FBS program since 2018.
 - Last year, App State became the first Sun Belt team AND the first FBS team in North Carolina history to win 13 games in a season (13-1). Programs in North Carolina have posted an 11-win season at the FBS level a combined 10 times, and App State accounted for three of those in its first six FBS seasons.
 - During App State's historically successful FCS-to-FBS transition, the Mountaineers have posted a 5-0 bowl record in their first five postseason-eligible seasons and won four straight Sun Belt titles.
 - App State is one of only six FBS programs to have won nine-plus games in each of the previous five seasons. The other five were Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Ohio State and Oklahoma.
 - Of the FBS programs that began playing games in September, App State was the last one to play a conference game. The first two scheduled Sun Belt games against Louisiana (Oct. 7) and Georgia Southern (Oct. 14) were postponed due to COVID-19 positive tests/contact tracing. Going from Sept. 26 to Oct. 22, the 26 days between games beat the previous program record of 21 (four times).
 - Before schedule changes related to COVID-19, App State originally had nonconference games vs. Morgan State (home on Sept. 5), Wake Forest (road on Sept. 11), Wisconsin (road on Sept. 19) and UMass (home on Sept. 26). Now, with no Sept. 5 opener but the same eight Sun Belt opponents, App State has an 11-game schedule with nonconference games against Charlotte (home on Sept. 12), Marshall (road on Sept. 19) and Campbell (home on Sept. 26).
- OFFENSE**
- App State is currently No. 7 nationally in rushing yards per game (278.3) and No. 21 in fewest sacks allowed per game (1.25). In each of its first six FBS seasons, App State ranked in the top 25 nationally in rushing yards per game AND fewest sacks allowed. **Shawn Clark** was the line coach for the last four years, including 2018 and 2019 seasons when the group was recognized as a top-15 FBS line by the Joe Moore Award.
 - App State returned four of five starters from the 2019 line (including three rising seniors in **Noah Hannon**, **Baer Hunter** and **Ryan Neuzil** to go with sophomore **Cooper Hodges**), and another senior (**Cole Garrison**) has started all four games at left tackle for first-year line coach **Nic Cardwell**. Cardwell, who played tight end at App State, was on the Mountaineers' staff from 2008-14 and 2017-18.
 - App State, Army, Liberty and North Texas are the only FBS teams that have gotten a 100-yard rushing game from four different players this year. **Daetrich Harrington** (211 yards) and **Nate Noel** (131) reached the century mark vs. Campbell after **Marcus Williams Jr.** (117) and **Camerun Peoples** (102) did the same thing in the season opener vs. Charlotte. Williams and Peoples didn't play vs. Campbell, and Harrington followed the Campbell game with 137 yards vs. Arkansas State.
 - The only FBS players with at least four rushing touchdowns in a game this season are App State's **Daetrich Harrington** (four vs. Campbell), Texas quarterback Sam Ehlinger (four in a four-OT loss against Oklahoma), Southern Miss quarterback Tate Whatley (four vs. Liberty) and Alabama running back Najee Harris (five in a victory against Ole Miss).
 - **Daetrich Harrington's** seven rushing TDs this season rank 10th nationally and No. 1 in the Sun Belt.
 - **Zac Thomas** needs four TD passes to tie **Richie Williams** for third place in school history. Thomas is 363 passing yards away from overtaking **Jamal Londry-Jackson** (5,971) for fifth in school history.
 - First-year offensive coordinator **Tony Petersen** often says it's App State's offense, not his offense. The Mountaineers have had a 1,000-yard rusher in each of the last eight seasons — a streak that trails only the 11 straight years from Boise State. **Darrynton Evans** rushed for 1,480 yards in 2019 before becoming a third-round draft pick of the Tennessee Titans.

- App State returned seven primary starters from an offense that helped the 2019 team set Sun Belt records by scoring 73 touchdowns and 543 points. **Jalen Virgil**, who made five starts in 2019, is a track standout listed at No. 3 overall and No. 1 among offensive players on The Athletic's "Freaks List" for 2020.
- App State seniors **Thomas Hennigan**, **Malik Williams** and **Jalen Virgil** rank No. 1, No. 6 and No. 11 among the active Sun Belt receivers with at least 1,000 career receiving yards. Among active FBS receivers currently playing this fall, Hennigan is No. 11 with 149 career catches, No. 18 with 1,972 career receiving yards and No. 24 with 15 career TD catches.
- Despite being behind talented backs like **Marcus Cox**, **Jalin Moore** and **Darrynton Evans** earlier in his career, **Marcus Williams Jr.** entered 2020 as one of three active Sun Belt players with at least 500 rushing yards in each of the last three seasons, including 652 yards in 2019. **Daetrich Harrington** missed significant time because of injuries in 2018 (knee) and 2019 (foot) but still led the team with 89 rushing yards on just nine carries in the 2019 Sun Belt title game, while **Camerun Peoples** suffered a season-ending knee injury during a 17-yard run in the 2019 opener, after he had rushed for a 63-yard touchdown as a redshirting true freshman in the 2018 bowl game.
- Marcus Williams Jr.** (senior), **Daetrich Harrington** (junior) and **Camerun Peoples** (sophomore) rushed for a combined 279 yards and four TDs on 42 carries in the 2020 opener. Harrington had 15 carries, Williams was next with 14 and Peoples had 13.
- Marcus Williams Jr.** produced 117 yards while making his fifth career start against Charlotte, and **Camerun Peoples** posted a career-high 102 in what was just his fifth college game. They scored one touchdown apiece, and **Daetrich Harrington** had two fourth-quarter touchdown runs during a 60-yard day. Williams sat out the next two games, and Harrington made his first two career starts.
- True freshman **Nate Noel** posted the 131 rushing yards against Campbell in his first college game.
- Redshirt freshman **Christian Wells**, who made his first career start against Arkansas State on Oct. 22, had TD catches covering 46 and 20 yards in a three-reception, 80-yard performance. He caught a 17-yard touchdown pass while making a late appearance as a true freshman in the 2019 season opener, then played in two more games and made one more catch.
- Starting LT **Cole Garrison**, a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy that goes to the nation's top football scholar-athlete, has been accepted into UAB's medical school after his 513 ranked in the top 13 percent of MCAT scoring. A native of Pinson, Ala., the exercise science major (with minors in psychology and chemistry) is scheduled to graduate in December and attend medical school with a desired specialty in either orthopedics (sports medicine) or trauma. He has played in 41 career games.
- In addition to **Tony Petersen** and **Nic Cardwell** (who had been App State's tight ends coach in 2018 before spending last season at Louisville), **Brian Haines** is the new running backs coach/special teams coordinator. **Justin Watts** (tight ends/recruiting coordinator) and **Pat Washington** (wide receivers) are back in the same roles they filled during the 13-1 season.

DEFENSE

- App State's 3-4 defense is once again coordinated by **Dale Jones**, who coached at Louisville in 2019 following a 23-year run on App State's staff. He was its defensive coordinator from 2010-12 and served as co-defensive coordinator in 2018, when an App State team that went 11-2 ranked among the FBS leaders in scoring defense (No. 4, 15.5 points) and total defense (No. 6, 288.0 yards). He was the lone coordinator during a 45-13 bowl win against Middle Tennessee.
- Senior cornerback **Shemar Jean-Charles**, who leads the FBS with nine total PBUs, was named the national Defensive MVP of the Week by PFF College after he recorded a career-high four pass breakups, eight tackles and one forced fumble in the 35-20 win against Charlotte to open the season. He had two PBUs in each of the next two games.

- App State's 92 interceptions since the start of the 2015 season rank No. 1 at the FBS level, as Alabama and San Diego State are tied for second place with 91.
- **Shaun Jolly**, PFF College's highest-graded returning Group of Five defender, has been named a preseason All-American by seven publications. He intercepted five passes in 2019 and added eight PBUs, 45 tackles and 3.5 tackles for loss. He recorded a career-high nine tackles vs. Arkansas State.
- App State defensive end **Demetrius Taylor** and cornerback **Shaun Jolly** are on the preseason watch lists for both the Bednarik Award and Nagurski Trophy (honors for the nation's top defensive player).
- **Demetrius Taylor** recorded two sacks against Arkansas State, increasing his career totals to 15.5 sacks and 26.0 tackles for loss in 43 games for the Mountaineers.
- Following the departures of 2019 leading tacklers **Akeem Davis-Gaither** (OLB drafted in the fourth round by the Cincinnati Bengals) and **Jordan Fehr** (ILB who spent time in camp with the Minnesota Vikings), ILB **Trey Cobb** has a team-high 36 tackles through three games. ILB **D'Marco Jackson**, who is the top returning tackler from 2019 with 60, ranks second on the team with 27 stops.
- **Trey Cobb** recorded 3.5 tackles for loss against Arkansas State, and **D'Marco Jackson** came up with two interceptions in the end zone to account for the first two picks of his career.
- Senior safety **Kaiden Smith** posted a career-high 10 tackles at Marshall and added a team-high seven stops vs. Campbell. Junior safety **Ryan Huff** recorded his first career interception at Marshall.
- The defensive staff includes veterans and young coaches with ties to **Shawn Clark**, **Dale Jones** or each other. Safeties coach **Mark DeBastiani** coached defensive tackles at App State from 1995-96, when Clark was a player in Boone, and cornerbacks coach **James Rowe** worked with DeBastiani at Florida in 2015. Defensive line coach **Robert Nunn** was the head coach at Georgia Military College with Jones working as his defensive coordinator from 1992-95, and Nunn spent the previous 19 seasons in the NFL, notably winning a Super Bowl ring as the New York Giants' defensive line coach to conclude the 2011 season. **Cortney Braswell** spent last season at Louisville with Jones and learned from him when he was a high school head coach bringing his teams to Boone for summer camps.

SHAWN CLARK

Less than four years after coming back to Boone to coach at his beloved alma mater, Shawn Clark not only became App State's head coach, but he began his tenure with a record-breaking bowl win.

Clark was hired as the 22nd head football coach in App State history on Dec. 13, 2019.

His five-year contract runs through the 2024 season, and he made his official head coaching debut while leading the Mountaineers to a 31-17 victory against UAB in the 2019 R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl eight days after his introductory press conference. Ranked 18th in the final Amway Coaches Poll of the season, App State went 13-1 to become the first Sun Belt team and the first FBS team from North Carolina to win 13 games in a season.

Clark has helped lead record-setting runs to conference titles and bowl victories, not just at App State, where he played from 1994-98 and had served as an assistant since 2016, but also in four other leagues during his two decades of college coaching experience.

Working for championship-winning programs at Louisville and Eastern Kentucky before being part of a bowl win for Big Ten member Purdue and coaching at Kent State, Clark has also been a vital part of App State's historic FBS success.

Overseeing talented, hard-working offensive lines, he followed a December 2018 coaching change involving college teammate Scott Satterfield's departure for Louisville by excelling as an aggressive offensive play-caller in a 45-13 bowl victory against Middle Tennessee. With valuable experience at his disposal, Clark was promoted to assistant head coach before the 2019 season with Elijah Drinkwitz in his first year as a college head coach.

In each of Clark's four seasons coaching App State's offensive line, with the Mountaineers earning four straight Sun Belt Conference titles while compiling a 43-10 record in that span, the line ranked in the top 25 nationally in both rushing yards per game and fewest sacks allowed. The unit was recognized by the Joe Moore Award as one of the nation's top 15 offensive lines in 2018 and 2019, and all five starters on the 2019 line received All-Sun Belt Conference recognition.

An offensive lineman in college, Clark was a two-time All-American (1996 and 1998) and three-time all-conference selection (1995, 1996, 1998) for teams that went a combined 45-16 during his first five years in Boone. In fact, as a player during the 12-0 start in 1995 and a coach for the 2019 team that has set a single-season record for wins by an FBS program in the state of North Carolina, Clark has been part of the two App State teams to post 11 regular-season victories.

Clark graduated from App State with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice in 1998 and earned a master's in education from Louisville in 2003.

His wife, Jonelle, was a standout softball student-athlete at Eastern Kentucky and was inducted into ECU's Athletics Hall of Fame in 2008. The Clarks have two children: a daughter, Giana, and a son, Braxton.

Clark began his college coaching career at Louisville in 2001 and has been part of six teams that won at least nine games.

In 2016, the Mountaineers led the Sun Belt in rushing offense (250.9 yards per game to rank No. 10 nationally as well as No. 2 in Sun Belt history) and ranked 16th nationally in sacks allowed. The Mountaineers led the Sun Belt in both rushing yards and fewest sacks in 2017, as they allowed only eight sacks (No. 2 nationally) and averaged 223.6 rushing yards per game to rank 22nd nationally.

The 2018 team ranked 14th nationally in rushing yards per game (240.3) and 20th nationally with only 18 sacks allowed. Vic Johnson was the only senior starter on an offensive line that helped the 2019 team rank 16th nationally at 231.4 rushing yards per game and tied for 17th with only 18 sacks allowed.

By defeating Louisiana in the 2019 Sun Belt Championship Game, App State joined Clemson and Oklahoma as the only FBS programs with an active streak of at least four straight league titles.

- With Williams and Peoples out in Game 3, Harrington (211 yards) and Noel (131) helped App State amass 404 rushing yards. Harrington added 137 more in Game 4.
- Despite playing just four games, App State is tied with Army, Liberty and North Texas as the FBS co-leaders with four backs having 100-yard rushing games: Williams (117 vs. Charlotte) and Peoples (102 vs. Charlotte) did it Sept. 12
- Harrington (438 rushing yards) leads the Sun Belt and ranks 10th nationally with seven rushing TDs.
- The only FBS players with at least four rushing TDs in a game this season are Harrington (vs. Campbell), Texas QB Sam Ehlinger (four in a four-OT loss vs. Oklahoma), Southern Miss QB Tate Whatley (vs. Liberty) and Alabama RB Najee Harris (five vs. Ole Miss)
- Williams is one of three active Sun Belt players with at least 500 rushing yards in each of the last three seasons
- Harrington, who missed time in 2018 (knee) and 2019 (foot), had a team-high 89 yards in the 2019 SBC title game

App State, Thomas Lead Way in Preseason All-Sun Belt Honors

NEW ORLEANS – App State amassed a league-high seven first-team selections, including preseason offensive player of the year **Zac Thomas**, as the Mountaineers were picked to win both division and conference titles in the preseason All-Sun Belt football honors announced by the league.

Preseason all-conference awards were voted upon by the Sun Belt's 10 football head coaches and selected media representatives.

App State, which claimed a fourth straight Sun Belt title in 2019 and has won each of the first two Sun Belt Championship Games, was named the overall favorite for the league after the Mountaineers received nine of 10 first-place votes in the East Division. Louisiana registered seven first place-votes in the West Division.

App State's 10 selections on the two All-Sun Belt teams tied for the league lead, and it accounted for nearly one-third of the 22 spots reserved for first-team offensive and defensive players.

The first-team selections were **Thomas** (QB), **Corey Sutton** (WR), **Noah Hannon** (OL), **Baer Hunter** (OL), **Cooper Hodges** (OL), **Demetrius Taylor** (DL) and **Shaun Jolly** (DB). **Thomas Hennigan** (WR), **Ryan Neuzil** (OL) and **Shemar Jean-Charles** (DB) are part of the second team.

Thomas, the Sun Belt's offensive player of the year in 2018 and PFF College's first-team All-Sun Belt quarterback in 2019, accounted for 35 touchdowns (28 passing) and 3,158 total yards (2,718 passing) last season.

Hannon, Hunter, Neuzil and Hodges are returning starters for an offensive line that helped App State rank in the top 20 nationally in both rushing yards per game and fewest sacks allowed, while Sutton and Hennigan are tied for fifth and seventh, respectively, on the school's career touchdown receptions list.

Defensively, Taylor and Jolly are both candidates for a pair of national defensive player of the year awards, while Jean-Charles joins Jolly in forming one of the nation's top cornerback tandems.

With a combined three touchdowns from Taylor and Jolly in 2019, App State tied for the FBS lead by scoring six times on defense.

The 2019 defense ranked in the top 30 nationally in touchdowns scored, third-down conversion percentage, turnovers forced, interceptions, sacks, pass efficiency defense, scoring defense, tackles for loss yardage, yards allowed per play, total defense, rushing TDs allowed, fumble recoveries, rushing defense and TDs allowed.

GAME NOTES

App State won its 20th game in the last 21 outings dating back to the 2018 season. The only other FBS team with a 20-1 record in its last 21 games is Clemson.

The Mountaineers are 14-0 in their last 14 season openers played at home dating back to 1974.

Eight players made their Mountaineer debuts: true freshmen Anderson Castle, Ronald Clarke, Christian Horn, redshirt-freshman Ryker Casey and transfers Zac Crosby, Damion Daley, T.D. Roof and Tristan Walliser.

Making the first starts of their App State careers were sophomore OLB Brendan Harrington and senior SS Kaiden Smith.

App State is now 3-0 against Charlotte in the series, including a 45-9 win in Charlotte in 2018 and a 56-41 victory in Boone in 2019.

Head coach Shawn Clark won his home head coaching debut. His first game as head coach was a 31-17 triumph against UAB in the 2019 R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl.

The Mountaineers intercepted two Charlotte passes. From 2015-19, App State's 87 interceptions were the second-most among FBS teams behind San Diego State's 91.

Marcus Williams Jr. ran for 117 yards, and Camerun Peoples added a career-high 102. It was the first game with two App State 100-yard rushers since the 2018 Coastal Carolina game (Darrynton Evans 159, Marcus Williams Jr. 103).

Senior WR Thomas Hennigan caught five passes for 120 yards and a touchdown. He hauled in his 15th career touchdown to move him into sole possession of seventh place in the school record book.

Rushing Game Explodes in Season-Opening Win

BOONE, N.C. — Not many fans. No shortage of rain. Some first-game mistakes.

None of that prevented a resilient and resourceful App State team from opening a late-starting 2020 season with a 35-20 home victory against Charlotte.

Holding an eight-point lead in the closing minutes, the Mountaineers' defense made two impressive stands, including one inside the 20-yard line to set up the game-clinching touchdown drive. With App State taking over following a fourth-down stop with 5:03 left, Marcus Williams Jr. put together runs of 34 and 22 yards before Daetrich Harrington scored on a 15-yard run with 1:15 remaining.

When senior safety Kaiden Smith intercepted a pass at the App State 22 with 32 seconds left, the celebration for head coach Shawn Clark's first regular season win could commence in a mostly empty Kidd Brewer Stadium — because of state COVID-19 guidelines that limit outdoor gatherings to a maximum of 50 spectators, only a small number of physically spaced parents of App State juniors and seniors could attend.

"We had the motto today, and all camp, of no excuses," said Clark, who was named App State's head coach eight days before its 2019 bowl win capped a 13-1 season. "It didn't matter if there were no fans in the stands, four inches of water, three turnovers — it didn't matter. I can't say enough about our players and this program."

On a rain-soaked afternoon at The Rock, the Mountaineers totaled 308 rushing yards, including 117 from Williams and a career-high 102 from Camerun Peoples. They scored once apiece, and Harrington scored twice in the fourth quarter of his 60-yard outing. Zac Thomas' 204 passing yards included a 51-yard touchdown pass to Thomas Hennigan, who made five catches for 120 yards.

Trey Cobb led App State's defense with eight tackles, including 1.5 for loss, and Shemar Jean-Charles had four pass breakups to go along with eight stops. Brendan Harrington gained 46 yards on an interception return after picking off mobile quarterback Chris Reynolds.

App State is 55-13 since the start of the 2015 season, giving the Mountaineers the nation's fifth-most wins in that period of time.
App State had won its last seven games against opponents from Conference USA. That streak included back-to-back New Orleans Bowl wins against Middle Tennessee (2018) and UAB (2019), as well as three wins against in-state foe Charlotte.
App State's first two opponents have completed only 22 passes in 55 attempts. The Mountaineers entered Saturday with the nation's second-best defensive pass efficiency rating.
Junior linebacker Trey Cobb recorded a career-high 14 tackles, topping his previous high of eight in last weekend's season opener.
Shemar Jean-Charles followed an opener in which he broke up an FBS-leading four passes by breaking up two more against the Thundering Herd.
Senior safety Kaiden Smith posted a career-high 10 tackles. His previous high was six in the 2019 win at North Carolina.
Junior cornerback Shaun Jolly had seven tackles to tie his career high, previously accomplished last season against Louisiana in the Sun Belt Championship Game.
App State quarterback Zac Thomas eclipsed 5,000 career passing yards in the first half. He moved from 10th in App State history to No. 8 with his 5,262 career yards, leapfrogging Randy Joyce (5,114 from 1981-84) and Pat Murphy (5,141 from 1965-68).
Graduate transfer Zac Crosby made his first two catches in an App State uniform, gaining 6 yards apiece.

Nonconference G5 Winning Streak Ends at Marshall

HUNTINGTON, W.Va. — App State's impressive winning streak against Group of Five programs from outside the league ended, as Marshall pulled out a 17-7 home win in front of 12,050 fans.

After a highlight-reel touchdown grab by Jalen Virgil helped tie the game to conclude App State's first drive of the day, Marshall (2-0) kept the high-powered and 23rd-ranked Mountaineers (1-1) from scoring again, even though they advanced inside the Thundering Herd's 10-yard line on their first two fourth-quarter possessions.

App State had won its last seven games against Conference USA opponents since falling to Southern Miss in the Mountaineers' third-ever FBS game in 2014.

The loss snapped a 12-game winning streak against Group of Five conference teams from outside the Sun Belt. UMass, an FBS independent, defeated the Mountaineers in 2017.

The win propelled the Thundering Herd to No. 25 in the AP Top 25. Marshall, moving forward from an 8-5 season in 2019, took the lead for good on Shane Ciucci's 29-yard field goal with 2:28 left in the first half and extended its advantage on quarterback Grant Wells' 12-yard keeper for a touchdown with 4:44 remaining in the third quarter.

A lost fumble on a fourth-and-1 pass for 41 yards to the Marshall 5 early in the fourth quarter and a missed 26-yard field goal with 2:54 left allowed the Thundering Herd to maintain a 10-point advantage.

App State quarterback Zac Thomas completed 22 of 38 passes for 268 yards. Camerun Peoples rushed for a team-high 57 yards on 12 carries with the Mountaineers missing two offensive starters.

Marshall opened the game with a 51-yard touchdown drive, scoring on a 2-yard run from Brenden Knox, and App State responded with an 11-play, 85-yard touchdown drive that lasted more than five minutes.

Backed up to the 11 for a first-and-goal snap, Thomas lofted a pass toward the left side of the end zone, and the ball descended beyond the defender's reach, into the hands of Virgil. He secured possession and managed to drag his feet inbounds as he fell to the turf.

Ciucci's short field goal late in the first half, forced by Shemar Jean-Charles' end-zone breakup, was the only other scoring in the first half. Daetrich Harrington had a 76-yard TD run overturned by a replay that determined his knee touched the ground near the line of scrimmage.

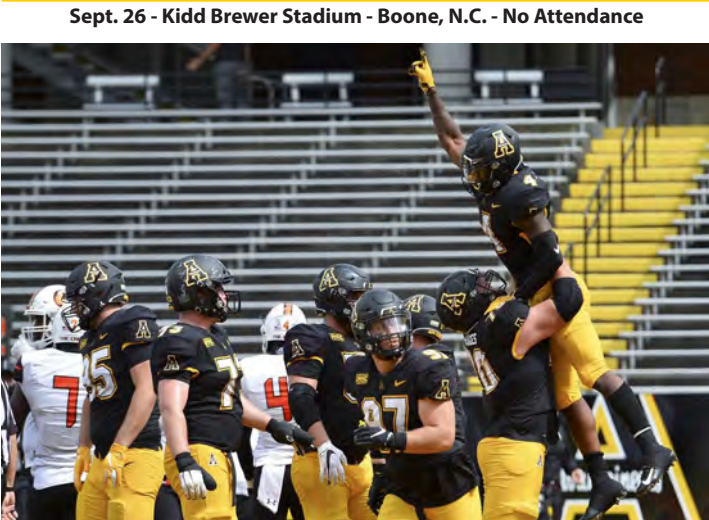

GAME NOTES

Bouncing back from the previous loss at Marshall, App State has won 12 of its last 13 games after a loss dating back to 2015.

The Mountaineers have won 21 of their last 23 games and 26 of their last 29 games, dating back to the 2018 season.

App State improved to 3-0 all-time versus Campbell, including wins in 1931 (20-6) and 2014 (66-0).

It was the Mountaineers' sixth straight win against a team from North Carolina and 10th straight against a team from the Carolinas (NC and SC combined).

App State improved to 5-1 against FCS opponents since the Mountaineers moved up to the FBS ranks, including five straight victories.

First-time starters were Damion Daley (TE), Dashaun Davis (WR), Jake Henry (WR) and Jalen McLeod (OLB).

Several players made their App State debuts, including August Drews, Jackson Greene, Peter Hennigan, Sean Horton, Jalen McLeod, Nate Noel, Luke Smith, Mike Smith and Eli Wilson.

Even with a shorthanded roster, the App State offense clicked off season highs with 52 points, 535 total yards and 404 rushing yards. It was the team's most points and total yards since last year's 56-27 win at Georgia State. The 404 rushing yards were the most since a 2018 win over Gardner-Webb.

The last player with 200+ rushing yards in a game was current Tennessee Titans RB Darrynton Evans last year against Charlotte.

Two App State players rushed for more than 100 yards for the second time this year.

Run Game Overwhelms Camels in Shorthanded Win

BOONE, N.C. — With App State’s veterans working to execute a revised game plan while also assisting young teammates in new roles, a shorthanded but motivated squad overcame a slow start to dominate the last three quarters of a 52-21 win against Campbell.

A determined offensive line — sometimes with as many as seven linemen on the field at one time — led the way as App State (2-1) rushed for 404 yards even though it was missing several skill position starters. One day earlier, App State and AppHealthCare announced that contact tracing had identified 18 players who are quarantining due to exposure to one of three active cases of confirmed COVID-19, with all three cases recovering in isolation.

Daetrich Harrington had career highs of 32 carries for 211 yards and four rushing touchdowns, the most by a Mountaineer since Armanti Edwards against Furman in 2009. True freshman Nate Noel added 131 yards and one touchdown on 14 carries.

App State’s defense shut out Campbell (0-3) from early in the second quarter until the closing minutes of the fourth, enabling the Mountaineers to turn a 13-7 deficit into a 52-13 lead.

“We knew if we were going to win this football game that we were going to put it in the hands of our offensive line and our running back, Daetrich,” said first-year head coach Shawn Clark, who coached App State’s offensive linemen from 2016-19. “I know those guys very well. I recruited all of them up front, and I have a lot of trust in those guys. And they told me, ‘Coach, run the ball and we’ll win.’”

With Thomas Hennigan as the only starting receiver available, nine of Zac Thomas’ 12 completions went to teammates who entered the game with no career catches, highlighted by Dashaun Davis’ six receptions on six targets.

A shortage of available tight ends also translated to offensive linemen Damion Daley and Anderson Hardy appearing frequently as blocking tight ends with jersey numbers in the 90s.

App State's 57-13 record since the start of the 2015 season produces a winning percentage of 81.4 that's fifth nationally behind just Clemson (74-5, 93.7), Alabama (70-6, 92.1), Ohio State (61-7, 89.7) and Oklahoma (60-12, 83.3).

Since 2015, App State improved to an FBS-best 25-0 in non-season-opening games in which it had more than a week to prepare.

App State improved its record to 26-4 with Zac Thomas as the starting quarterback. His 26 wins rank No. 2 among active FBS quarterbacks, behind just the 30 from Clemson's Trevor Lawrence.

App State improved its record to 10-4 on the primary ESPN channel and 33-9 in games on ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPNU.

The Mountaineers improved to 3-1 against Arkansas State since joining the league in 2014.

App State has earned at least one home win and one road win against all 11 programs that are currently in the Sun Belt or were in the Sun Belt when App State joined (Idaho, New Mexico State).

Hall of Fame coach Jerry Moore holds the program wins record thanks to his 215-87 record in 24 seasons as the Mountaineers' head coach. After being an assistant on staffs led by Moore and Scott Satterfield from 1996-2018, then returning to Boone this season for his 24th year, defensive coordinator Dale Jones has been part of teams that have gone 215-83 with him as an App State assistant.

App State held Arkansas State to 17 points and 368 total yards. The Red Wolves came into the game averaging 38.2 points per game and a Sun Belt-best 496 yards per outing.

App State Makes Statement in League-Opening Win

BOONE, N.C. — Zac Thomas delivered a 60-yard touchdown run in addition to tying his career high of four touchdown passes, Daetrich Harrington broke loose on a long touchdown while rushing for 137 yards and the defense put up a dominant first-half showing as App State rolled to a 45-17 victory against Arkansas State at The Rock.

Playing for the first time in 26 days, after the first two scheduled Sun Belt Conference games were postponed until December, App State (3-1, 1-0) began pursuit of a fifth straight league title by building a 31-7 halftime lead against the high-scoring, pass-happy Red Wolves (3-3, 2-2) in a nationally televised Thursday night game on ESPN.

“Our guys like to compete, and that was the message today — go compete to see where we are as a program,” coach Shawn Clark said.

With 2,100 fans in attendance based on 7-percent capacity guidelines in Kidd Brewer Stadium, there was plenty to cheer about. For the second straight meeting, the Mountaineers held Arkansas State to less than 20 points, something that’s happened only two other times to the Red Wolves in the last three regular seasons — against Alabama and Georgia.

D’Marco Jackson made two interceptions in the end zone to end a pair of scoring threats, Tristan Walliser forced an errant pitch while disrupting an unsuccessful fake punt and App State’s six sacks came from Demetrius Taylor (two), Tim Frizzell, Caleb Spurlin, Trey Cobb (part of his 3.5 TFLs) and a combo effort from Shaun Jolly and George Blackstock.

Offensively, Thomas rushed for a career-high 82 yards on seven attempts and completed 16 of 23 passes for 216 yards, with two of his TD passes finding first-time starter Christian Wells.

SEASON SUPERLATIVES

The Mountaineers became the first Sun Belt team and the first FBS team from the state of North Carolina to win 13 games.

App State became the first Sun Belt team to conclude a season in the Top 25 and claimed the top spot among FBS teams from North Carolina for the second straight year.

App State became the first FBS program to win five bowl games in each of its first five bowl-eligible seasons.

App State tied Ohio State for the third-best winning percentage among FBS teams, behind just LSU (15-0) and Clemson (14-1).

App State's 54-12 overall record in the last five seasons is the fifth-best mark in the country during that span, trailing just Clemson, Alabama, Ohio State and Oklahoma.

The Mountaineers finished as a statistical champion or co-champion in two categories: sole possession of first with a fourth-down conversion percentage of 81.3 and tied with Illinois for the FBS lead with six defensive touchdowns.

App State was the first Group of Five program to have two players picked in the 2020 NFL Draft, as running back Darrynton Evans went to the Tennessee Titans in the third round and linebacker Akeem Davis-Gaither was picked by the Cincinnati Bengals to open the fourth round.

App State led the nation in road wins en route to the only 6-0 road record by FBS teams. It built a 27-10 lead in a 34-31 win at North Carolina, which had a 56-yard field goal blocked by Davis-Gaither as time expired in Chapel Hill, and the Mountaineers won 20-15 at South Carolina.

App State set Sun Belt records for single-season points (543) and touchdowns (73).



App State became just the fifth program in major college football history to send its fifth-year seniors out with five bowl wins and four conference titles, joining Nebraska (1969-73), Alabama (1975-79), Florida State (1991-95) and Marshall (1998-2002).

App State ranked No. 7 nationally and No. 1 among G5 programs with an average scoring margin of plus-17.5 points per game against FBS competition. The Mountaineers had a balanced team that ranked No. 9 nationally in scoring offense (38.8 points), No. 21 in scoring defense (20.0 points) and tied for No. 2 with five blocked kicks.

The fifth-year seniors finished their careers with a 7-0 postseason record that included two wins in the Sun Belt title game. Fourth-year seniors were on teams that went 43-10 with a Sun Belt title every season.

With 13 wins, App State tied for the second-highest total by a Group of Five team since the Sun Belt was established in 2001. Boise State had a G5-record 14 wins in 2009.

App State set a program record for fewest turnovers committed in a season with nine and tied the program's single-season record for lost fumbles by losing only three.

In all six of its FBS seasons, App State has ranked in the top 25 nationally in rushing yards per game (No. 16 at 231.4 in 2019) and fewest sacks allowed (tied for No. 17 with 18 in 2019).

App State set a program record with seven national television appearances in 2019.

App State led the Sun Belt in attendance for the third time in the last four years.

In addition to boasting one of the most picturesque settings for college football with App State's campus and the natural beauty of the High Country serving as a backdrop, Kidd Brewer Stadium also stakes claim to being one of the toughest venues in the nation.

Early in its 59th season in the venerable stadium, which opened as Conrad Stadium on Sept. 15, 1962, App State boasts a 255-76-5 all-time record at home, including wins in 101 of its last 119 home games.

With the construction of the \$50 million north end zone facility, removal of the track and installation of new turf, The Rock has a new look in 2020. There are also plans to honor Hall of Fame coach Jerry Moore with a plaza and statue in his name outside the new facility.

The facility will house a new football locker room, weight room, offices and team areas, as well as 1,000 club level seats, athletic training spaces, retail and dining service facilities.

App State led the FBS Sun Belt Conference in home football attendance in 2016, 2017 and 2019, averaging 25,787 fans in Boone during the 2017 season, 23,351 fans per regular-season home game in 2018 and 23,806 fans per home game during a 13-1 season in 2019.

Kidd Brewer Stadium's seating capacity is 30,000, and Wake Forest's visit to Boone in 2017 attracted a record crowd of 35,126. The record was broken just one year after Miami's visit to The Rock drew a crowd of 34,658.

Kidd Brewer Stadium is part of the of the Mark E. Ricks Athletics Complex. Thanks to philanthropic funding through A Mountaineer Impact, the video board display in 2017 increased to three times the size of the previous board.
