## APP STATE STORYLINES

- App State's last scheduled home game of 2020 pits the Mountaineers against Louisiana, which has clinched the Sun Belt's West Division title and a spot in this year's Sun Belt Championship Game. The league's first two league title games were App State-Louisiana matchups in Boone, with the Mountaineers winning 30-19 in 2018 and 45-38 last season (after building a 42-17 lead).
- App State will recognize its seniors before the final home game on the 2020 schedule — this season doesn't count against their eligibility, so the 2021 team can include players who return and are seniors again next year. Fifth-year seniors among the 25 players being recognized have gone 50-12 in Boone.
- This will be App State's third game of the season on the primary ESPN channel, a school record, and it will be the school-record seventh regular-season national TV appearance. Last year, while going 13-1, App State set school records with five national TV appearances in the regular season and seven total.
- App State is 35-10 all-time in games on ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPNU, including a 4-1 mark this year.
- This week's matchup is believed to be the latest kickoff time in Kidd Brewer Stadium history and only the second post-Thanksgiving home game in Boone with a kickoff time of 8 p.m. or later. On Dec. 7, 2007, with a Friday night kickoff time of 8 p.m., App State won 55-35 against Richmond in an FCS semifinal as Armanti Edwards rushed for 313 yards with a listed temperature of 42 degrees.
- App State has won 19 of its last 20 games played in November or December (it lost Nov. 21 at Coastal).
- App State, which was originally scheduled to face Louisiana in an Oct. 7 league opener that was postponed for COVID-related reasons, will be playing the Ragin' Cajuns for the sixth time overall and fifth time at Kidd Brewer Stadium in a span of three years, two days. They squared off in a 2017 regular-season finale, met twice in Boone in 2018 and followed a 2019 regular-season game in Lafayette with a second straight Sun Belt Championship Game showdown at The Rock.
- After App State's game at No. 15 Coastal Carolina was its first against a ranked Sun Belt team, the visit from No. 20 Louisiana marks the first time hosting a nationally ranked Sun Belt squad or top-20 FBS squad. This is the first year that App State has faced multiple top-25 ranked opponents (at the time of the matchup) since 2016. More details on the Louisiana series are on pages 3, 22 & 23.

During a standard week with a Saturday game, App State will have Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday media availabilities.

Head coach Shawn Clark's appearances on the weekly Sun Belt coaches teleconference are Mondays from 11:30 a.m. ET until approximately 11:37 a.m.

After his appearance on the Sun Belt call, Clark will be available for a Zoom call with media members, and he'll be followed by Zoom interviews with select student-athletes (contingent on their availability). Media members interested in participating should contact Joey or Bret by the end of the day Sunday to be included on an email that includes the Zoom link. Interviews will be done remotely, so media members should not come to the Mark E. Ricks Athletics Complex on Monday.

During standard weeks, practices on Tuesdays and Wednesdays will be open to approved media members.

If you plan to attend one or both practices, communicate those plans and submit specific interview requests to Joey or Bret by 9 a.m. on Tuesday (for Tuesday's practice) and 9 a.m. on Wednesday (for Wednesday's practice). If you have more than one person from your organization planning to attend, the name of each attendee needs to be shared in advance.

No reporters will be allowed on the sidelines, and media members must wear face coverings while watching practice from the stands in a socially distanced manner. **NO VIDEOS OR PHOTOS CAN BE TAKEN DURING PRACTICE.**

Media attending practice are forbidden from reporting (e.g. tweeting, blogging, etc.) on anything until after the post-practice interviews have been conducted. This includes media who leave practice early.

Post-practice interviews will select coaches and players will be conducted via Zoom. More details on attendance and interview protocols will be shared with individuals who plan to attend a 2020 practice for the first time.

**GAME DAY PROCEDURES**

At home games, a check-in post will be set up for credentialed media members to receive their game credential and conduct a health check. In order to maintain a safe environment, media members must pass the health check in order to enter the stadium.

Credentialed visitors will be required to wear face coverings and keep them on the entire time they are in Kidd Brewer Stadium. Visitors with press box access (seventh floor) must stay on that level throughout the entirety of their stay — they are not allowed to go up and down in the building.

Bathrooms on the seventh floor will be available. With safety measures and social distancing in mind, a media meal will not be served, but cold drinks will be available. We encourage credentialed visitors to bring food and permitted drinks (no alcohol) in bags that can be checked upon stadium entry.

Media members will remain in the press box for postgame Zoom interviews with Coach Clark and select players.

**STORYLINES (CONTINUED FROM PAGE 1)**

- App State's 61-14 record and 81.3 win percentage since the start of 2015 is No. 5 nationally behind just Clemson (77-6, 92.8%), Alabama (74-6, 92.5%), Ohio State (65-7, 90.3%) and Oklahoma (64-12, 84.2%).
- App State is 48-6 in its last 54 games vs. Sun Belt teams since the 2014 FBS jump. Since 2014, the Mountaineers' 85.7 winning percentage (48-8 overall) against league foes is No. 4 nationally behind Ohio State (93.3%, 56-4), Clemson (91.8%, 56-5), and Alabama (91.8%, 56-5).
- Shawn Clark**, who was App State's OL coach from 2016-19, made his regular-season debut as the Mountaineers' head coach on Sept. 12. He was named head coach on Dec. 13, 2019 — eight days before he led App State to a 31-17 bowl victory against UAB in New Orleans. He served as the offensive coordinator under interim head coach **Mark Ivey** during a 45-13 bowl win against Middle Tennessee in 2018 and was also the assistant head coach on **Elijah Drinkwitz's** staff in 2019.
- For the sixth straight week, App State has received Amway Coaches Poll votes, moving up to an unofficial spot of No. 31 with 33 points. It had received AP votes in 23 straight weeks prior to beating Campbell, and it was ranked No. 23 going into the Marshall game on Sept. 19, marking its 10th week as a ranked FBS program since 2018.
- The Mountaineers are 0-6 vs. ranked teams since joining the FBS in 2014, with losses to No. 12 Clemson in 2015, No. 9 Tennessee (OT) in 2016, No. 25 Miami in 2016, No. 15 Georgia in 2017, No. 9 Penn State (OT) in 2018 and No. 15 Coastal Carolina this year. The program's lone win against a ranked team was the historic 34-32 victory over No. 5 Michigan in 2007.
- In 2020 matchups of a Sun Belt East team vs. a West team, the East is 14-3 with three close losses (Louisiana won 20-18 over Georgia Southern and 34-31 in OT over Georgia State; Arkansas State won 59-52 vs. Georgia State).
- App State seniors **Noah Hannon** (center), **Thomas Hennigan** (receiver), **Caleb Spurlin** (defensive end) and **Xavier Subotsch** (punter) have played in 49 career games. Hannon has started all 49 games that App State has played since he enrolled, and Hennigan has started 48 of 49.
- The only previous App State players with at least 50 career starts are CB **Jerome Touchstone** (55 from 2004-07), CB **Justin Woazeah** (54 from 2004-07), OL **Victor Johnson** (51 from 2016-19), LB **D.J. Smith** (50 from 2007-10) and OL **Scott Suttle** (50 from 2004-07). Hannon can join Touchstone and Smith as only the third App State player with 50 consecutive starts.
- App State has six team captains this year: seniors **Zac Thomas** (QB), **Noah Hannon** (C), **Thomas Hennigan** (WR), **Demetrius Taylor** (DE), **Elijah Diarrassouba** (DE) and **Shemar-Jean Charles** (CB).
- Last year, App State became the first Sun Belt team AND the first FBS team in North Carolina history to win 13 games in a season (13-1). Programs in North Carolina have posted an 11-win season at the FBS level a combined 10 times, and App State accounted for three of those in its first six FBS seasons.
- Of the FBS programs that began playing games in September, App State was the last one to play a conference game. The first two scheduled Sun Belt games against Louisiana (Oct. 7) and Georgia Southern (Oct. 14) were postponed due to COVID-19 positive tests/contact tracing. Going from Sept. 26 to Oct. 22, the 26 days between games beat the previous program record of 21 (four times).

**OFFENSE**

- Zac Thomas** (30-5 as a starter) is No. 2 in active FBS QB wins behind Clemson's **Trevor Lawrence** (32-1) and tied with **D.J. Campbell** (30-17) for No. 3 in career wins by an App State starting quarterback. Last week, in a 47-10 win against Troy, Thomas tied his career high of four touchdown passes while completing 22 of 29 attempts (with no interceptions) for 279 yards.
- App State, Army and Georgia Southern are the only FBS teams with 100-yard rushing games from five different players this year. The Mountaineers' quintet is made up of RBs **Daetrich Harrington** (injured), **Cameron Peoples**, **Marcus Williams Jr.**, and **Nate Noel**, plus QB **Zac Thomas**.
- Zac Thomas'** 66 career TD passes rank third in school history. The top two totals belong to **Taylor Lamb** (90 from 2014-17) and **Armani Edwards** (74 from 2006-09). Thomas' 6,565 career passing yards rank fourth in school history, and he is No. 4 in school history with 7,827 yards of total offense.
- Starting defensive end and short-yardage fullback/H-back **Caleb Spurlin** is the only FBS player with multiple sacks (2.5) and receiving touchdowns (two) this season. A former walk-on who has played in 49 games, he had a 1-yard TD reception at Texas State and a 2-yard TD reception against Troy.
- Thomas Hennigan** has moved up to No. 5 in school history with 2,148 career receiving yards and is 4 yards away from passing **Bob Agle** (2,151 yards from 1965-68) for fourth place. Hennigan is No. 5 with 168 career catches (fourth-place **Rick Beasley** had 178 catches from 1978-80), and Hennigan is No. 7 with 16 career TD catches (**Dexter Jackson** and **Corey Sutton** are tied for fifth with 17 TDs).
- The Mountaineers have an FBS-leading 159 career starts from their offensive line. App State has rushed for at least 300 yards in four games, and its 256.4 season average is No. 7 nationally (or No. 3 among FBS teams with more than four games played this year).

- App State returned four of five starters from the 2019 line (including three rising seniors in **Noah Hannon**, **Baer Hunter** and **Ryan Neuzil** to go with sophomore **Cooper Hodges**), and another senior (**Cole Garrison**) has started all nine games as a tackle for first-year line coach **Nic Cardwell**. Cardwell, who played tight end at App State, was on the Mountaineers' staff from 2008-14 and 2017-18.
- Starting OT **Cole Garrison** has been accepted into UAB's medical school after his 513 ranked in the top 13 percent of MCAT scoring. A native of Pinson, Ala., the exercise science major (with minors in psychology and chemistry) is scheduled to graduate in December and attend medical school with a desired specialty in either orthopedics (sports medicine) or trauma. He has played in 46 career games.
- In each of its first six FBS seasons, App State ranked in the top 25 in rushing yards per game AND fewest sacks allowed. **Shawn Clark** was the line coach for the last four years, including 2018 and 2019 seasons when the group was recognized as a top-15 FBS line by the Joe Moore Award. The 2020 team currently ranks 33rd nationally with 1.67 sacks allowed per game.
- Running back **Cameron Peoples** made his first career start at Coastal Carolina and set career highs for carries (27) and rushing yards (178), then had a 63-yard TD run on his second carry of a 10-rush, 95-yard game in another start against Troy last weekend. He leads the team with 639 rushing yards, or 44 more than **Daetrich Harrington**, who has missed the last three games because of injury.
- Marcus Williams Jr.**, **Daetrich Harrington** and **Cameron Peoples** entered this season as three backs with noteworthy experience, but they've combined to miss seven games between them this season. True freshman **Nate Noel** has been the primary backup to Peoples in the last two games, rushing 11 times for 46 yards at Coastal Carolina and 12 times for 80 yards against Troy.
- Daetrich Harrington** was leading the Sun Belt in rushing yards per game (99.2) and rushing touchdowns (seven) through App State's first six games. **Marcus Williams Jr.** started the season opener before missing the next two games, and he also missed the Coastal Carolina game.
- In breaking down the 100-yard rushing games, **Daetrich Harrington** (211 yards) and **Nate Noel** (131) reached the century mark vs. Campbell after **Marcus Williams Jr.** (117) and **Cameron Peoples** (102) did the same thing vs. Charlotte. Williams and Peoples didn't play vs. Campbell, and Harrington followed the Campbell game with 137 yards vs. Arkansas State. At ULM, with **Zac Thomas** rushing for 109 yards, Williams had 103, and Harrington rushed for 113 at Texas State.
- App State seniors **Thomas Hennigan**, **Malik Williams** and **Jalen Virgil** rank No. 2, No. 6 and No. 13 among the active Sun Belt receivers with at least 1,000 career receiving yards. Virgil is a track standout listed at No. 3 overall and No. 1 among offensive players on The Athletic's "Freaks List" for 2020.
- Malik Williams** has caught 13 passes for a team-leading 252 yards over the last three games, with a career-high 113 yards on seven catches against Troy following games in which he had a 62-yard catch against Coastal Carolina and a 55-yard catch against Georgia State. Those are career-long receptions.
- First-year offensive coordinator **Tony Petersen** often says it's App State's offense, not his offense. The Mountaineers have had a 1,000-yard rusher in each of the last eight seasons — a streak that trails only the 11 straight years from Boise State. **Darrynton Evans** rushed for 1,480 yards in 2019.
- Despite being behind talented backs like **Marcus Cox**, **Jalin Moore** and **Darrynton Evans** earlier in his career, **Marcus Williams Jr.** entered 2020 as one of three active Sun Belt players with at least 500 rushing yards in each of the last three seasons, including 652 yards in 2019. **Cameron Peoples** suffered a season-ending knee injury during a 17-yard run in the 2019 opener, after he had rushed for a 63-yard touchdown as a redshirting true freshman in the 2018 bowl game.
- Redshirt freshman **Christian Wells**, who made his first career start against Arkansas State on Oct. 22, had TD catches covering 46 and 20 yards in a three-reception, 80-yard performance. He followed that up with a 37-yard touchdown at ULM on Oct. 31 and caught another TD pass at Coastal Carolina.

DEFENSE**

- **Jerry Moore** is App State's winningest head coach with a 215-87 record in 24 seasons. In 24 years as an App State assistant, many alongside Moore, defensive coordinator **Dale Jones** has been part of 219 wins. He coached at Louisville with **Scott Satterfield** in 2019 following a 23-year run at App State, where he was the defensive coordinator from 2010-12 and co-defensive coordinator in 2018.
- **Shemar Jean-Charles** and **Shaun Jolly** form the nation's No. 1 FBS cornerback duo, according to PFF College, and fellow cornerback **Steven Jones** returned an interception 34 yards for a touchdown against Troy. App State leads the nation by allowing its opponents to complete only 48.3 percent of its passes, and it averages 6.9 passes defended per game (No. 3 overall in the country, No. 2 among teams with more than one game).
- **Shemar Jean-Charles** has been named ESPN's No. 3 breakout player in 2020 (behind BYU QB **Zach Wilson** and Alabama QB **Mac Jones**). Jean-Charles' 14 PBUs are three ahead of the second-best FBS total this season, and he's tied for first place with 15 passes defended in nine games (he picked off a pass at Texas State, and Texas State's Jarron Morris had 15 passes defended in 12 games).
- App State has an FBS-best 98 interceptions since the start of 2015, and it ranks No. 5 overall in 2020 with a pass efficiency defense rating of 100.2. It has 51 PBUs and 11 INTs so far this season, including three picks apiece from safety **Ryan Huff** and outside linebacker **Brendan Harrington**.
- **Shaun Jolly**, PFF College's highest-graded returning Group of Five defender, was named a preseason All-American by seven publications after intercepting five passes (with two pick-six TDs) in 2019.
- **Demetrius Taylor** has 19.5 career sacks, including 6.0 in six Sun Belt games this season: 2.0 vs. Arkansas State, 1.0 at Texas State, 1.5 vs. Georgia State and 1.5 vs. Coastal Carolina. He has 7.0 TFLs in the last three games and has moved up to 10th place on the all-time sacks list for App State.
- Following the departures of 2019 leading tacklers **Akeem Davis-Gaither** (OLB drafted in the fourth round by the Bengals) and **Jordan Fehr** (ILB who spent time in camp with the Vikings), ILB **Trey Cobb** has 59 tackles in eight games and 8.5 tackles for loss this season. ILB **D'Marco Jackson** leads the team with 64 tackles and was named PFF College's National Defensive MVP of the Week after recording nine tackles, one sack, two TFLs, two PBUs and one fumble recovery vs. Georgia State.
- For the year, **D'Marco Jackson** also has two interceptions, six PBUs, four QB hurries and 4.5 TFLs. In App State's six league games, he has totaled 44 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, two interceptions, five PBUs, 1.5 sacks and one fumble recovery.
- OLB **Brendan Harrington**, a high school DB who is starting in **Akeem Davis-Gaither's** old spot, has picked off three passes, scored on a 49-yard return at Texas State and broken up five more passes.
- Several seniors have emerged for the Mountaineers. **Kaiden Smith**, a first-year starter at safety, is No. 3 on the team with 45 stops. OLB **Tim Frizzell** totaled 2.5 sacks in the first two league games and has made five of his six career starts in the last five games. DE **Caleb Spurlin**, a first-year starter and former walk-on, has 2.5 sacks this year, and he even has a pair of goal-line TD catches in an H-back/fullback role.
- Safeties coach **Mark DeBastiani** coached defensive tackles at App State from 1995-96, when **Shawn Clark** was a player in Boone, and cornerbacks coach **James Rowe** worked with DeBastiani at Florida in 2015. Defensive line coach **Robert Nunn** was the head coach at Georgia Military College with **Dale Jones** working as his defensive coordinator from 1992-95, and Nunn spent the previous 19 seasons in the NFL, notably winning a Super Bowl ring as the Giants' defensive line coach to conclude the 2011 season. **Cortney Braswell** spent last season at Louisville with Jones and learned from him when he was a high school head coach bringing teams to Boone for summer camps.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

- Assistant **Brian Haines** arrived from Ohio and directs a unit with returning starters at kicker (**Chandler Staton**), punter (**Xavier Subotsch**), long snapper (**Christian Johnstone**) and holder (**Clayton Howell**).
- **Chandler Staton** is second in Sun Belt history with 324 career points and needs just three points to overtake Arkansas State's **Brian Davis** for the Sun Belt career record. Staton has made 10 of his last 12 FG tries, including a 3-for-4 effort at Coastal Carolina and a 2-for-2 showing against Troy.
- In the school record books, **Chandler Staton** is up to No. 5 in career points (324), tied for No. 3 in career field goals made (41) and No. 2 in career extra points made (201).
- **Xavier Subotsch**, a candidate for the Ray Guy Award, ranks No. 3 in the Sun Belt in net punting average (40.7). With only 11 of his 26 punts being returned, App State has allowed only 16 return yards this season. The averages of yards allowed per return (1.45) and punt return yards allowed per game (1.8) lead the Sun Belt while also ranking in the top 20 nationally.
- **Steven Jones** has had kickoff returns of 41 and 36 yards in the last three games.

## APP STATE RECORD AT KIDD BREWER STADIUM SINCE 2003: 103-18

In addition to boasting one of the most picturesque settings for college football with App State's campus and the natural beauty of the High Country serving as a backdrop, Kidd Brewer Stadium also stakes claim to being one of the toughest venues in the nation.

In its 59th season in the venerable stadium, which opened as Conrad Stadium on Sept. 15, 1962, App State boasts a 257-76-5 all-time record at home.

With the construction of the \$50 million north end zone facility, removal of the track and installation of new turf, The Rock has a new look in 2020, as the end zone facility opened for fans before the Nov. 14 game vs. Georgia State. There are also plans to honor Hall of Fame coach Jerry Moore with a plaza and statue in his name.

The facility will house a new football locker room, weight room, offices and team areas, as well as 1,000 club level seats, athletic training spaces, retail and dining service facilities.

App State led the Sun Belt Conference in home attendance in 2016, 2017 and 2019, averaging 25,787 fans in Boone during the 2017 season, 23,351 fans per regular-season home game in 2018 and 23,806 fans per home game during a 13-1 season in 2019.

Kidd Brewer Stadium's seating capacity is 30,000, and Wake Forest's visit to Boone in 2020 attracted a record crowd of 35,126. The record was broken just one year after Miami's visit to The Rock drew a crowd of 34,658.

Kidd Brewer Stadium is part of the of the Mark E. Ricks Athletics Complex. Thanks to philanthropic funding through A Mountaineer Impact, the video board display in 2017 increased to three times the size of the previous board.

# SHAWN CLARK

Less than four years after coming back to Boone to coach at his beloved alma mater, Shawn Clark not only became App State's head coach, but he began his tenure with a record-breaking bowl win.

Clark was hired as the 22nd head football coach in App State history on Dec. 13, 2019.

His five-year contract runs through the 2024 season, and he made his official head coaching debut while leading the Mountaineers to a 31-17 victory against UAB in the 2019 R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl eight days after his introductory press conference. Ranked 18th in the final Amway Coaches Poll of the season, App State went 13-1 to become the first Sun Belt team and the first FBS team from North Carolina to win 13 games in a season.

Clark has helped lead record-setting runs to conference titles and bowl victories, not just at App State, where he played from 1994-98 and had served as an assistant since 2016, but also in four other leagues during his two decades of college coaching experience.

Working for championship-winning programs at Louisville and Eastern Kentucky before being part of a bowl win for Big Ten member Purdue and coaching at Kent State, Clark has also been a vital part of App State's historic FBS success.

Overseeing talented, hard-working offensive lines, he followed a December 2018 coaching change involving college teammate Scott Satterfield's departure for Louisville by excelling as an aggressive offensive play-caller in a 45-13 bowl victory against Middle Tennessee. With valuable experience at his disposal, Clark was promoted to assistant head coach before the 2019 season with Elijah Drinkwitz in his first year as a college head coach.

In each of Clark's four seasons coaching App State's offensive line, with the Mountaineers earning four straight Sun Belt Conference titles while compiling a 43-10 record in that span, the line ranked in the top 25 nationally in both rushing yards per game and fewest sacks allowed. The unit was recognized by the Joe Moore Award as one of the nation's top 15 offensive lines in 2018 and 2019, and all five starters on the 2019 line received All-Sun Belt Conference recognition.

An offensive lineman in college, Clark was a two-time All-American (1996 and 1998) and three-time all-conference selection (1995, 1996, 1998) for teams that went a combined 45-16 during his first five years in Boone. In fact, as a player during the 12-0 start in 1995 and a coach for the 2019 team that has set a single-season record for wins by an FBS program in the state of North Carolina, Clark has been part of the two App State teams to post 11 regular-season victories.

Clark graduated from App State with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice in 1998 and earned a master's in education from Louisville in 2003.

His wife, Jonelle, was a standout softball student-athlete at Eastern Kentucky and was inducted into ECU's Athletics Hall of Fame in 2008. The Clarks have two children: a daughter, Giana, and a son, Braxton.

Clark began his college coaching career at Louisville in 2001 and has been part of six teams that won at least nine games.

In 2016, the Mountaineers led the Sun Belt in rushing offense (250.9 yards per game to rank No. 10 nationally as well as No. 2 in Sun Belt history) and ranked 16th nationally in sacks allowed. The Mountaineers led the Sun Belt in both rushing yards and fewest sacks in 2017, as they allowed only eight sacks (No. 2 nationally) and averaged 223.6 rushing yards per game to rank 22nd nationally.

The 2018 team ranked 14th nationally in rushing yards per game (240.3) and 20th nationally with only 18 sacks allowed. Vic Johnson was the only senior starter on an offensive line that helped the 2019 team rank 16th nationally at 231.4 rushing yards per game and tied for 17th with only 18 sacks allowed.

By defeating Louisiana in the 2019 Sun Belt Championship Game, App State joined Clemson and Oklahoma as the only FBS programs with an active streak of at least four straight league titles.

- App State, Army and Georgia Southern are the only FBS teams with five different players posting 100-yard rushing games this year: Harrington (three times), Peoples (twice), Williams (twice), Noel (once) and QB **Zac Thomas** (once)
- Peoples made his first career start at Coastal Carolina and set career highs for carries (27) and rushing yards (178), then had a 63-yard TD run on his second carry of a 10-rush, 95-yard game in a start against Troy on Nov. 28
- Peoples has been named to the watch list for the

Mayo Clinic Comeback Player of the Year Award

- Peoples suffered a season-ending knee injury on a 17-yard run in the 2019 opener, after he had a 63-yard TD as a redshirting true freshman in the 2018 bowl game
- Williams is one of three active Sun Belt players with at least 500 rushing yards in each of the previous three years
- Harrington, who has missed the last three games because of injury, averaged 99.2 rushing yards (595 total) and scored seven rushing TDs in the first six games
- In the last two games, Noel rushed 11 times for 46 yards at Coastal Carolina and 12 times for 80 yards against Troy. Another true freshman, converted LB **Anderson Castle**, had a 49-yard run against Troy

**App State, Thomas Lead Way in Preseason All-Sun Belt Honors**

NEW ORLEANS – App State amassed a league-high seven first-team selections, including preseason offensive player of the year **Zac Thomas**, as the Mountaineers were picked to win both division and conference titles in the preseason All-Sun Belt football honors announced by the league.

Preseason all-conference awards were voted upon by the Sun Belt's 10 football head coaches and selected media representatives.

App State, which claimed a fourth straight Sun Belt title in 2019 and has won each of the first two Sun Belt Championship Games, was named the overall favorite for the league after the Mountaineers received nine of 10 first-place votes in the East Division. Louisiana registered seven first place-votes in the West Division.

App State's 10 selections on the two All-Sun Belt teams tied for the league lead, and it accounted for nearly one-third of the 22 spots reserved for first-team offensive and defensive players.

The first-team selections were **Thomas** (QB), **Corey Sutton** (WR), **Noah Hannon** (OL), **Baer Hunter** (OL), **Cooper Hodges** (OL), **Demetrius Taylor** (DL) and **Shaun Jolly** (DB). **Thomas Hennigan** (WR), **Ryan Neuzil** (OL) and **Shemar Jean-Charles** (DB) are part of the second team.

Thomas, the Sun Belt's offensive player of the year in 2018 and PFF College's first-team All-Sun Belt quarterback in 2019, accounted for 35 touchdowns (28 passing) and 3,158 total yards (2,718 passing) last season.

Hannon, Hunter, Neuzil and Hodges are returning starters for an offensive line that helped App State rank in the top 20 nationally in both rushing yards per game and fewest sacks allowed, while Sutton and Hennigan are tied for fifth and seventh, respectively, on the school's career touchdown receptions list.

Defensively, Taylor and Jolly are both candidates for a pair of national defensive player of the year awards, while Jean-Charles joins Jolly in forming one of the nation's top cornerback tandems.

With a combined three touchdowns from Taylor and Jolly in 2019, App State tied for the FBS lead by scoring six times on defense.

The 2019 defense ranked in the top 30 nationally in touchdowns scored, third-down conversion percentage, turnovers forced, interceptions, sacks, pass efficiency defense, scoring defense, tackles for loss yardage, yards allowed per play, total defense, rushing TDs allowed, fumble recoveries, rushing defense and TDs allowed.

### SEASON SUPERLATIVES

The Mountaineers became the first Sun Belt team and the first FBS team from the state of North Carolina to win 13 games.

App State became the first Sun Belt team to conclude a season in the Top 25 and claimed the top spot among FBS teams from North Carolina for the second straight year.

App State became the first FBS program to win five bowl games in each of its first five bowl-eligible seasons.

App State tied Ohio State for the third-best winning percentage among FBS teams, behind just LSU (15-0) and Clemson (14-1).

App State's 54-12 overall record in the last five seasons is the fifth-best mark in the country during that span, trailing just Clemson, Alabama, Ohio State and Oklahoma.

The Mountaineers finished as a statistical champion or co-champion in two categories: sole possession of first with a fourth-down conversion percentage of 81.3 and tied with Illinois for the FBS lead with six defensive touchdowns.

App State was the first Group of Five program to have two players picked in the 2020 NFL Draft, as running back Darrynton Evans went to the Tennessee Titans in the third round and linebacker Akeem Davis-Gaither was picked by the Cincinnati Bengals to open the fourth round.

App State led the nation in road wins en route to the only 6-0 road record by FBS teams. It built a 27-10 lead in a 34-31 win at North Carolina, which had a 56-yard field goal blocked by Davis-Gaither as time expired in Chapel Hill, and the Mountaineers won 20-15 at South Carolina.

App State set Sun Belt records for single-season points (543) and touchdowns (73).



App State became just the fifth program in major college football history to send its fifth-year seniors out with five bowl wins and four conference titles, joining Nebraska (1969-73), Alabama (1975-79), Florida State (1991-95) and Marshall (1998-2002).

App State ranked No. 7 nationally and No. 1 among G5 programs with an average scoring margin of plus-17.5 points per game against FBS competition. The Mountaineers had a balanced team that ranked No. 9 nationally in scoring offense (38.8 points), No. 21 in scoring defense (20.0 points) and tied for No. 2 with five blocked kicks.

The fifth-year seniors finished their careers with a 7-0 postseason record that included two wins in the Sun Belt title game. Fourth-year seniors were on teams that went 43-10 with a Sun Belt title every season.

With 13 wins, App State tied for the second-highest total by a Group of Five team since the Sun Belt was established in 2001. Boise State had a G5-record 14 wins in 2009.

App State set a program record for fewest turnovers committed in a season with nine and tied the program's single-season record for lost fumbles by losing only three.

In all six of its FBS seasons, App State has ranked in the top 25 nationally in rushing yards per game (No. 16 at 231.4 in 2019) and fewest sacks allowed (tied for No. 17 with 18 in 2019).

App State set a program record with seven national television appearances in 2019.

App State led the Sun Belt in attendance for the third time in the last four years.

Akeem Davis-Gaither led App State's defense with 11 tackles, including 2.5 stops behind the line of scrimmage, and Noel Cook added eight stops. Defensive end Demetrius Taylor had a sack, a fourth-down stop on a goalline stand and a quarterback hurry to force a three-and-out.

Louisiana moved into field goal range early in the third quarter before George Blackstock blocked the 42-yard attempt, which was returned 11 yards by Josh Thomas.

After Chandler Staton's tiebreaking field goal, the defense allowed a total of 7 yards on nine plays while forcing three straight three-and-outs.

App State extended its winning streak to 11 games, which is the nation's third-longest active streak behind Clemson (20) and Ohio State (12).

The Mountaineers moved their all-time record against the Ragin' Cajuns to 7-0, including a 3-0 mark in Lafayette.

App State improved to 36-6 in Sun Belt Conference play (and 36-4 in its last 40 games in league play). The Mountaineers improved to 17-4 in Sun Belt road games.

Since 2015, App State improved to 16-0 in games in which it had more than a week to prepare. LSU is second in the country with a 10-0 record in those situations since 2015, and the 16-0 record doesn't include App State's four bowl wins.

With a 19-play, 97-yard TD drive that lasted 10 minutes, 11 seconds, it was App State's first 10-minute scoring drive since the Mountaineers moved up to the FBS level in 2014. Previously, the longest scoring drive by time as an FBS program lasted 8:49 — a 15-play, 93-yard TD drive against Idaho in 2015.

App State Wins Defensive Slugfest at Louisiana

LAFAYETTE, La. — Appalachian State remained undefeated by showing its grit and putting together a timely, clock-consuming touchdown drive to cap a defensive slugfest.

In a nationally televised matchup of two of the nation's highest-scoring teams, the Mountaineers pulled out a 17-7 victory at Louisiana.

App State (5-0, 2-0 Sun Belt) held a three-point lead when it regained possession at its 3-yard line with 12:06 remaining. Two fourth-down conversions prolonged a 19-play, 97-yard touchdown drive that took 10 minutes, 11 seconds off the clock — the program's longest scoring drive since it moved up to the FBS level.

Zac Thomas scored his second touchdown of the night when he made a leaping high-step into the end zone to end a 7-yard bootleg keeper around left end with 1:55 remaining, and the Mountaineers could begin celebrating when a fourth-down pass from the Ragin' Cajuns (4-2, 1-1) fell incomplete in the final minute.

"That drive said a lot about our offense, and we owe it all to our defense," Thomas said. "They played lights-out, and we owed it to them for keeping us in the game. That was our payback to them for a great job that they did."

With Thomas' first 7-yard touchdown run giving App State an early lead and Chandler Staton's 40-yard field goal breaking a third-quarter tie, the Mountaineers held Louisiana more the 37 points below its scoring average.

The lengthy fourth-quarter drive continued thanks to Thomas' 4-yard strike to Thomas Hennigan on a fourth-and-4 pass from the UL 38. The Mountaineers then faced a fourth-and-5 situation from the Louisiana 25 with less than three minutes left, and Corey Sutton drew a penalty for pass interference near the end zone to extend the series.

"We're always going to attack success," App State head coach Eliah Drinkwitz said. "We're never going to fear failure. I knew if I put the ball in our best players' hands, we were going to get it done."

App State totaled 196 rushing yards, or 73 more than Louisiana, which was averaging 314.0 rushing yards per game entering the ESPN2 contest.

### GAME NOTES

App State won a Sun Belt Conference title for the fourth straight year and is 2-for-2 in winning the Sun Belt Championship Game. Oklahoma won its fourth straight Big 12 title, and the only other FBS program with four straight titles at this point is Clemson, which won its fifth straight ACC title.

App State became the first in-state FBS program or Sun Belt program to post a 12-win season. Of the 10 instances of an in-state program winning 11 games in a season, App State is responsible for three of them (in the Mountaineers' six FBS seasons). App State is responsible for three of the four 11-win seasons in Sun Belt history.

App State posted its G5-leading fourth win this season against a team ranked in the top 45 of ESPN's FPI (Football Power Index). It's the only ranked G5 team with two wins over P5 teams (both on the road) or three road wins over ESPN FPI top 50 teams.

App State is 43-7 in its 50 games against Sun Belt teams, and it improved to 8-0 in the series with Louisiana.

Since the 2015 season began, App State is No. 5 nationally in win percentage (81.5) and tied for No. 5 in total wins with its 53-12 record. The win total trails only Clemson (68-4), Alabama (65-6), Ohio State (61-6) and Oklahoma (60-9), with Georgia sitting at 53-15.

App State fifth-year seniors Akeem Davis-Gaither, Desmond Franklin, Victor Johnson, Collin Reed and Josh Thomas finished their careers at The Rock with a 27-4 home record.

App State increased its season total to 69 touchdowns to tie the Sun Belt's single-season record. Arkansas State also had 69 in 2015.

No. 21 App State Secures 4th Straight League Title

BOONE, N.C. — Another Ring Game at The Rock. And a repeat champion. App State claimed its fourth straight league title and celebrated a Sun Belt Championship Game victory on its home field for the second straight year thanks to a 45-38 win against Louisiana.

Three early touchdowns from belt-winning MVP Darrynton Evans gave the 21st-ranked Mountaineers a 21-0 lead late in the first quarter, and captain Josh Thomas' first career interception return for a touchdown accounted for one of three turnovers forced by a senior on App State's defense. The Mountaineers led 42-17 late in the third quarter and maintained at least a 14-point lead until the Ragin' Cajuns cut into a 45-31 deficit on a touchdown pass with 1:19 remaining.

By prevailing in the first-ever matchup of Sun Belt teams with double-digit wins, App State (12-1) became the first FBS program from the state of North Carolina and the first Sun Belt program to post a 12-win season.

Evans added a second MVP belt to his collection with 162 all-purpose yards against the Ragin' Cajuns (10-3) and the three scores (58-yard catch, 8-yard run, 5-yard catch) that increased his season total to 23.

Zac Thomas' two TD throws contributed to his 174 total yards, including 143 through the air, and the Mountaineers got scoring runs of 25-plus yards from both Marcus Williams Jr. (78 rushing yards) and Daetrich Harrington (team-high 89 yards) as they rushed for 267 yards as a team.

Defensively, in addition to Josh Thomas' pick-six, E.J. Scott recovered his own forced fumble to trigger the early outburst and Desmond Franklin recovered a fumble forced by Noel Cook. Akeem Davis-Gaither recorded a team-high 10 tackles and Demetrius Taylor added his seventh sack of the season.

**GAME NOTES**

App State won its 20th game in the last 21 outings dating back to the 2018 season. The only other FBS team with a 20-1 record in its last 21 games is Clemson.

The Mountaineers are 14-0 in their last 14 season openers played at home dating back to 1974.

Eight players made their Mountaineer debuts: true freshmen Anderson Castle, Ronald Clarke, Christian Horn, redshirt-freshman Ryker Casey and transfers Zac Crosby, Damion Daley, T.D. Roof and Tristan Walliser.

Making the first starts of their App State careers were sophomore OLB Brendan Harrington and senior SS Kaiden Smith.

App State is now 3-0 against Charlotte in the series, including a 45-9 win in Charlotte in 2018 and a 56-41 victory in Boone in 2019.

Head coach Shawn Clark won his home head coaching debut. His first game as head coach was a 31-17 triumph against UAB in the 2019 R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl.

The Mountaineers intercepted two Charlotte passes. From 2015-19, App State's 87 interceptions were the second-most among FBS teams behind San Diego State's 91.

Marcus Williams Jr. ran for 117 yards, and Cameron Peoples added a career-high 102. It was the first game with two App State 100-yard rushers since the 2018 Coastal Carolina game (Darrynton Evans 159, Marcus Williams Jr. 103).

Senior WR Thomas Hennigan caught five passes for 120 yards and a touchdown. He hauled in his 15th career touchdown to move him into sole possession of seventh place in the school record book.

Rushing Game Explodes in Season-Opening Win

BOONE, N.C. — Not many fans. No shortage of rain. Some first-game mistakes.

None of that prevented a resilient and resourceful App State team from opening a late-starting 2020 season with a 35-20 home victory against Charlotte.

Holding an eight-point lead in the closing minutes, the Mountaineers' defense made two impressive stands, including one inside the 20-yard line to set up the game-clinching touchdown drive. With App State taking over following a fourth-down stop with 5:03 left, Marcus Williams Jr. put together runs of 34 and 22 yards before Daetrich Harrington scored on a 15-yard run with 1:15 remaining.

When senior safety Kaiden Smith intercepted a pass at the App State 22 with 32 seconds left, the celebration for head coach Shawn Clark's first regular season win could commence in a mostly empty Kidd Brewer Stadium — because of state COVID-19 guidelines that limit outdoor gatherings to a maximum of 50 spectators, only a small number of physically spaced parents of App State juniors and seniors could attend.

"We had the motto today, and all camp, of no excuses," said Clark, who was named App State's head coach eight days before its 2019 bowl win capped a 13-1 season. "It didn't matter if there were no fans in the stands, four inches of water, three turnovers — it didn't matter. I can't say enough about our players and this program."

On a rain-soaked afternoon at The Rock, the Mountaineers totaled 308 rushing yards, including 117 from Williams and a career-high 102 from Cameron Peoples. They scored once apiece, and Harrington scored twice in the fourth quarter of his 60-yard outing. Zac Thomas' 204 passing yards included a 51-yard touchdown pass to Thomas Hennigan, who made five catches for 120 yards.

Trey Cobb led App State's defense with eight tackles, including 1.5 for loss, and Shemar Jean-Charles had four pass breakups to go along with eight stops. Brendan Harrington gained 46 yards on an interception return after picking off mobile quarterback Chris Reynolds.

App State is 55-13 since the start of the 2015 season, giving the Mountaineers the nation's fifth-most wins in that period of time.
App State had won its last seven games against opponents from Conference USA. That streak included back-to-back New Orleans Bowl wins against Middle Tennessee (2018) and UAB (2019), as well as three wins against in-state foe Charlotte.
App State's first two opponents have completed only 22 passes in 55 attempts. The Mountaineers entered Saturday with the nation's second-best defensive pass efficiency rating.
Junior linebacker Trey Cobb recorded a career-high 14 tackles, topping his previous high of eight in last weekend's season opener.
Shemar Jean-Charles followed an opener in which he broke up an FBS-leading four passes by breaking up two more against the Thundering Herd.
Senior safety Kaiden Smith posted a career-high 10 tackles. His previous high was six in the 2019 win at North Carolina.
Junior cornerback Shaun Jolly had seven tackles to tie his career high, previously accomplished last season against Louisiana in the Sun Belt Championship Game.
App State quarterback Zac Thomas eclipsed 5,000 career passing yards in the first half. He moved from 10th in App State history to No. 8 with his 5,262 career yards, leapfrogging Randy Joyce (5,114 from 1981-84) and Pat Murphy (5,141 from 1965-68).
Graduate transfer Zac Crosby made his first two catches in an App State uniform, gaining 6 yards apiece.

Nonconference G5 Winning Streak Ends at Marshall

HUNTINGTON, W.Va. — App State's impressive winning streak against Group of Five programs from outside the league ended, as Marshall pulled out a 17-7 home win in front of 12,050 fans.

After a highlight-reel touchdown grab by Jalen Virgil helped tie the game to conclude App State's first drive of the day, Marshall (2-0) kept the high-powered and 23rd-ranked Mountaineers (1-1) from scoring again, even though they advanced inside the Thundering Herd's 10-yard line on their first two fourth-quarter possessions.

App State had won its last seven games against Conference USA opponents since falling to Southern Miss in the Mountaineers' third-ever FBS game in 2014.

The loss snapped a 12-game winning streak against Group of Five conference teams from outside the Sun Belt. UMass, an FBS independent, defeated the Mountaineers in 2017.

The win propelled the Thundering Herd to No. 25 in the AP Top 25. Marshall, moving forward from an 8-5 season in 2019, took the lead for good on Shane Ciucci's 29-yard field goal with 2:28 left in the first half and extended its advantage on quarterback Grant Wells' 12-yard keeper for a touchdown with 4:44 remaining in the third quarter.

A lost fumble on a fourth-and-1 pass for 41 yards to the Marshall 5 early in the fourth quarter and a missed 26-yard field goal with 2:54 left allowed the Thundering Herd to maintain a 10-point advantage.

App State quarterback Zac Thomas completed 22 of 38 passes for 268 yards. Camerun Peoples rushed for a team-high 57 yards on 12 carries with the Mountaineers missing two offensive starters.

Marshall opened the game with a 51-yard touchdown drive, scoring on a 2-yard run from Brenden Knox, and App State responded with an 11-play, 85-yard touchdown drive that lasted more than five minutes.

Backed up to the 11 for a first-and-goal snap, Thomas lofted a pass toward the left side of the end zone, and the ball descended beyond the defender's reach, into the hands of Virgil. He secured possession and managed to drag his feet inbounds as he fell to the turf.

Ciucci's short field goal late in the first half, forced by Shemar Jean-Charles' end-zone breakup, was the only other scoring in the first half. Daetrich Harrington had a 76-yard TD run overturned by a replay that determined his knee touched the ground near the line of scrimmage.

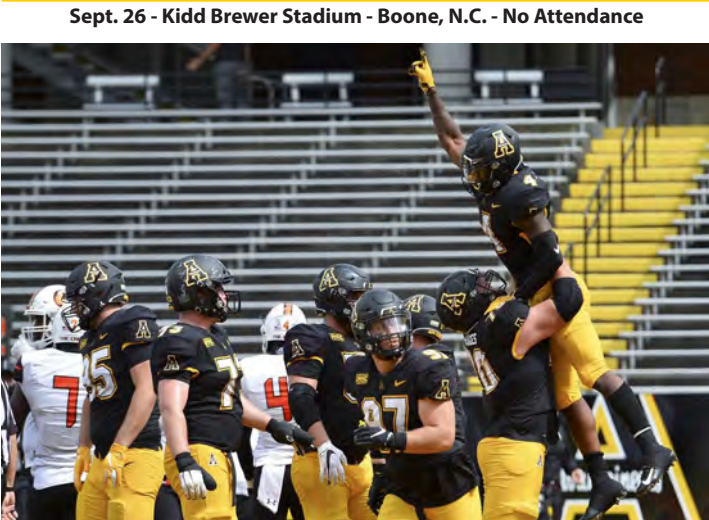

Bouncing back from the previous loss at Marshall, App State has won 12 of its last 13 games after a loss dating back to 2015.

The Mountaineers have won 21 of their last 23 games and 26 of their last 29 games, dating back to the 2018 season.

App State improved to 3-0 all-time versus Campbell, including wins in 1931 (20-6) and 2014 (66-0).

It was the Mountaineers' sixth straight win against a team from North Carolina and 10th straight against a team from the Carolinas (NC and SC combined).

App State improved to 5-1 against FCS opponents since the Mountaineers moved up to the FBS ranks, including five straight victories.

First-time starters were Damion Daley (TE), Dashaun Davis (WR), Jake Henry (WR) and Jalen McLeod (OLB).

Several players made their App State debuts, including August Drews, Jackson Greene, Peter Hennigan, Sean Horton, Jalen McLeod, Nate Noel, Luke Smith, Mike Smith and Eli Wilson.

Even with a shorthanded roster, the App State offense clicked off season highs with 52 points, 535 total yards and 404 rushing yards. It was the team's most points and total yards since last year's 56-27 win at Georgia State. The 404 rushing yards were the most since a 2018 win over Gardner-Webb.

The last player with 200+ rushing yards in a game was current Tennessee Titans RB Darrynton Evans last year against Charlotte.

Two App State players rushed for more than 100 yards for the second time this year.

Run Game Overwhelms Camels in Shorthanded Win

BOONE, N.C. — With App State’s veterans working to execute a revised game plan while also assisting young teammates in new roles, a shorthanded but motivated squad overcame a slow start to dominate the last three quarters of a 52-21 win against Campbell.

A determined offensive line — sometimes with as many as seven linemen on the field at one time — led the way as App State (2-1) rushed for 404 yards even though it was missing several skill position starters. One day earlier, App State and AppHealthCare announced that contact tracing had identified 18 players who are quarantining due to exposure to one of three active cases of confirmed COVID-19, with all three cases recovering in isolation.

Daetrich Harrington had career highs of 32 carries for 211 yards and four rushing touchdowns, the most by a Mountaineer since Armanti Edwards against Furman in 2009. True freshman Nate Noel added 131 yards and one touchdown on 14 carries.

App State’s defense shut out Campbell (0-3) from early in the second quarter until the closing minutes of the fourth, enabling the Mountaineers to turn a 13-7 deficit into a 52-13 lead.

“We knew if we were going to win this football game that we were going to put it in the hands of our offensive line and our running back, Daetrich,” said first-year head coach Shawn Clark, who coached App State’s offensive linemen from 2016-19. “I know those guys very well. I recruited all of them up front, and I have a lot of trust in those guys. And they told me, ‘Coach, run the ball and we’ll win.’”

With Thomas Hennigan as the only starting receiver available, nine of Zac Thomas’ 12 completions went to teammates who entered the game with no career catches, highlighted by Dashaun Davis’ six receptions on six targets.

A shortage of available tight ends also translated to offensive linemen Damion Daley and Anderson Hardy appearing frequently as blocking tight ends with jersey numbers in the 90s.

## App State Makes Statement in League-Opening Win

BOONE, N.C. — Zac Thomas delivered a 60-yard touchdown run in addition to tying his career high of four touchdown passes, Daetrich Harrington broke loose on a long touchdown while rushing for 137 yards and the defense put up a dominant first-half showing as App State rolled to a 45-17 victory against Arkansas State at The Rock.

Playing for the first time in 26 days, after the first two scheduled Sun Belt Conference games were postponed until December, App State (3-1, 1-0) began pursuit of a fifth straight league title by building a 31-7 halftime lead against the high-scoring, pass-happy Red Wolves (3-3, 2-2) in a nationally televised Thursday night game on ESPN.

“Our guys like to compete, and that was the message today — go compete to see where we are as a program,” coach Shawn Clark said.

With 2,100 fans in attendance based on 7-percent capacity guidelines in Kidd Brewer Stadium, there was plenty to cheer about. For the second straight meeting, the Mountaineers held Arkansas State to less than 20 points, something that’s happened only two other times to the Red Wolves in the last three regular seasons — against Alabama and Georgia.

D’Marco Jackson made two interceptions in the end zone to end a pair of scoring threats, Tristan Walliser forced an errant pitch while disrupting an unsuccessful fake punt and App State’s six sacks came from Demetrius Taylor (two), Tim Frizzell, Caleb Spurlin, Trey Cobb (part of his 3.5 TFLs) and a combo effort from Shaun Jolly and George Blackstock.

Offensively, Thomas rushed for a career-high 82 yards on seven attempts and completed 16 of 23 passes for 216 yards, with two of his TD passes finding first-time starter Christian Wells.

## App State Runs Wild While Going to 2-0 in Sun Belt

MONROE, La. — App State's running game was scary good.

The Mountaineers took an early lead and cruised to a 31-13 win against the ULM Warhawks behind a bruising offensive line and a steady rotation of backs on Halloween afternoon.

In the storied program's 1,000th game, Zac Thomas and Marcus Williams Jr. ran for 109 and 103 yards, respectively, while Thomas also threw a pair of touchdowns to Christian Wells and Malik Williams.

The defense from App State (4-1, 2-0 Sun Belt) picked off three passes, including two by free safety Ryan Huff, and held the ULM offense to just 222 total yards. The Warhawks could not get much going other than a second-quarter touchdown drive and a touchdown pass on the final play against App State's reserves.

Despite throwing an interception on App State's first offensive drive – on an incredible catch by ULM's Josh Newton who scraped the ball off the back of Wells in the end zone – the Mountaineers responded by scoring touchdowns on their next two drives for a 14-0 lead at the end of the first quarter. A dominant rushing attack led to a 1-yard score from Camerun Peoples and then Williams Jr.'s 48-yard sprint in which he broke a couple of tackles for the long score.

ULM (0-7, 0-4 Sun Belt) responded to cut the lead to one score at 14-7, but App State dialed up a perfect flea flicker to retake a 14-point advantage at 21-7. Thomas handed off to Daetrich Harrington, who lateraled back to Thomas before he threw a strike to a leaping Wells in the end zone between two defenders for the 37-yard touchdown.

Defense was the name of the game in the second half, as both sides clamped down tighter on their opponents' scoring threats. Thomas' 35-yard bomb to Malik Williams was the lone score of the third quarter, while Chandler Staton tacked on a 38-yard field goal at the beginning of the fourth to give App State a 31-7 advantage.

App State improved to 46-5 in its last 51 games against Sun Belt teams and 22-4 in Sun Belt road games since the 2014 FBS jump. Since 2014, the Mountaineers' 86.8 winning percentage (46-7 overall) against league foes is No. 4 nationally behind Ohio State (93.2%, 55-4), Clemson (91.7%, 55-5) and Alabama (91.5%, 54-5).

Zac Thomas improved to 28-4 as a starter and is No. 2 in active FBS QB wins behind Clemson's Trevor Lawrence (31-1). He threw three touchdown passes and no INTs.

With three touchdown passes, Zac Thomas increased his career total to 60 and moved from fourth place to third in school history, overtaking Richie Williams (59 from 2002-05). The top two totals in school history belong to Taylor Lamb (90 from 2014-17) and Armanti Edwards (74 from 2006-09).

First-Time TDs Highlight App State's Win at Texas St.

SAN MARCOS, Texas — A day of eye-catching firsts contributed to App State moving forward with no Sun Belt Conference losses on its record.

Building a lead with first-time touchdowns from a trio of players, the Mountaineers remained unbeaten in league play with a 38-17 victory at Texas State.

App State (5-1, 3-0) led 24-10 at the break thanks to first-half scores on a 32-yard catch from tight end Miller Gibbs, a 49-yard interception return from linebacker Brendan Harrington and a 1-yard reception from part-time fullback Caleb Spurlin, a starting defensive end.

Shemar Jean-Charles' third-quarter interception at the App State 9-yard line preceded a 91-yard TD march from the Mountaineers, capped by Zac Thomas' third touchdown pass of the day, a 9-yard connection with Jalen Virgil. Camerun Peoples closed the scoring on his 32-yard touchdown run with 5:59 left against the Bobcats (1-8, 1-4).

Daetrich Harrington accounted for 113 of App State's 258 rushing yards, and Thomas completed 18 of his 27 passes for 168 yards with no interceptions. He hooked up with 10 different receivers while moving into third place on App State's list for career touchdown passes (increasing his total to 60) and fourth place for career total offense (7,157 yards). On special teams, Chandler Staton made his only field goal try, a 33-yard attempt with 15 seconds left in the first half.

Demetrius Taylor and Jalen McLeod contributed sacks to help lead a defense that benefited from a career-high 11 tackles by D'Marco Jackson, who added 1.5 tackles for loss and two pass breakups. The Mountaineers forced two turnovers, limited Texas State to four conversions on 12 third-down tries and no conversions on three fourth-down attempts — all in the second half. Those stops were made on snaps from the App State 28, the Texas State 47 and the App State 19.

### GAME NOTES

App State's 60-13 record and 82.2 win percentage since the start of 2015 is No. 5 nationally.

App State improved to 47-5 in its last 52 games vs. Sun Belt teams since the program jumped to FBS in 2014. Since 2014, the Mountaineers' 87.0 winning percentage (47-7 overall) against league foes is No. 4 nationally.

The Mountaineers have won their last 18 games played in November or December. This was the 11th straight November/December home win, and App State improved its FBS home record in those months to 14-1.

This is the second straight year and fifth time in the last six years that App State has won its first four Sun Belt games.

Zac Thomas improved to 29-4 as a starter, which is No. 2 in active QB wins behind Clemson's Trevor Lawrence (31-1). Thomas was hit late out of bounds in the fourth quarter and had to be wheeled off the sideline with App State down 13-10.

App State has won all seven games it has played against Georgia State, dating back to 2014. The Mountaineers have allowed a total of 73 points to the Panthers (10.4 average per game).

This was App State's first win when scoring less than 20 points since last year's 17-7 road victory at Louisiana.

App State held the Sun Belt's No. 2 scoring offense (36.7 average entering the game) to 13 points and just three in the second half.

The Mountaineers' swarming defense registered nine TFLs, three sacks, a season-high nine pass breakups and a season-high three forced fumbles. The Mountaineers entered the game ranked No. 2 in the nation with 7.7 passes defended per outing.

### Thomas, Huesman Lead Late Rally In Win Over GSU

BOONE, N.C. — Fifth-year senior Jacob Huesman finished off a fourth-quarter touchdown drive in relief of injured starting QB Zac Thomas to give App State its first lead, and it remained unbeaten in Sun Belt Conference play with a 17-13 victory against Georgia State.

App State (6-1, 4-0) lost Thomas to an injury when he was hit near the sideline on a quarterback keeper midway through the final quarter. Huesman, Thomas' classmate and housemate, directed the offense for the final six plays of a march that covered 77 yards on 11 plays.

He completed a 12-yard pass to Camerun Peoples on his first play and added a 14-yard completion to Thomas Hennigan on a third-and-8 throw to the Georgia State 22. Peoples' 10-yard touchdown run with 4:55 left, followed by Chandler Staton's extra point, produced the Mountaineers' first lead of the game at 17-13.

"At the end of the day, these are the types of things you have to prepare for, whether you're a freshman or a senior like myself, a fifth-year guy, a backup quarterback," Huesman said. "You just have to be ready and be ready all the time. When your number is called, it's time to go."

After Peoples' touchdown, Nick Hampton and Demetrius Taylor teamed up for a sack that helped produce a punt by Georgia State (3-4, 2-4), and the Mountaineers ran the final 3:32 off the clock in the first game at Kidd Brewer Stadium with fans in the newly opened north end zone facility.

Trey Cobb led App State's defense with 11 tackles, while D'Marco Jackson had nine stops, one sack, two tackles for loss, two PBUs and one fumble recovery. Taylor finished with 1.5 sacks among his 3.5 tackles for loss, and Caleb Spurlin forced the fumble on Jackson's recovery, which set up the Mountaineers' only first-half points.

Huesman completed three of four passes for 33 yards after taking over for Thomas, who completed 16 of 22 passes for 146 yards with one touchdown. He was wheeled off the field into an ambulance not far from where the Mountaineers scored.

"It was all precautionary and he had feeling in all of his extremities," said App State head coach Shawn Clark, who later revealed that Thomas had been released from the hospital and was doing fine.

App State Suffers 1st League Loss At No. 15 Coastal

CONWAY, S.C. — Coastal Carolina claimed a first-place showdown with visiting App State, winning 34-23 at Brooks Stadium.

In a game with five lead changes, App State (6-2, 4-1) moved ahead for the final time on Chandler Staton's 45-yard field goal with 11:47 left. The Mountaineers remained ahead 23-21 until Reese White scored on a 3-yard run for the 15th-ranked Chanticleers (8-0, 6-0) with 2:24 left, and D'Jordan Strong's 38-yard interception return for a touchdown on a fourth-and-20 pass from deep in App State's own territory in the final 90 seconds sealed the outcome.

Camerun Peoples rushed for a career-high 178 yards with one touchdown on a career-high 27 carries, including 20 first-half carries that produced 171 of his yards, as App State outgained Coastal Carolina both on the ground and through the air. Peoples became the first back to rush for at least 100 yards against the Chanticleers this season.

Staton matched his career high of three field goals with two kicks of 44-plus yards and Demetrius Taylor accounted for 1.5 of App State's four sacks while posting 3.0 tackles for loss, but Coastal Carolina remained unbeaten on the strength of several big plays.

With the Chanticleers on the verge of retaking the lead in the fourth quarter, quarterback Grayson McCall reached for the end zone on a keeper from the 6 and had the ball knocked loose by Kaiden Smith. App State teammate Nick Hampton fell on the ball in the end zone for a crucial touchback with the Mountaineers clinging to a two-point edge.

Shortly after a 33-yard pass to the CCU 36 was wiped out by offsetting penalties, with a holding following a flag for defensive offsides, Coastal Carolina regained possession with an interception near midfield and put together a 10-play, 49-yard TD drive that took 4:35 off the clock

McCall accounted for three touchdowns while passing for 200 yards and rushing for 69 more. App State held the Chanticleers to 169 rushing yards on 34 carries, including 15 first-half rushing yards on 14 attempts.

App State Starts Fast in Blowout Win Over Trojans

BOONE, N.C. — App State bounced back in emphatic fashion, bolstering its overall record and establishing several individual ones in a 47-10 home win against Troy in Kidd Brewer Stadium.

Zac Thomas tied his career high of four touchdown passes while throwing for 279 yards, App State (7-2, 5-1) finished with 554 total yards thanks to 275 more on the ground and Steven Jones returned an interception 34 yards for an early touchdown to highlight a defensive effort that limited the Trojans (4-5, 2-3) to 231 total yards and 125 passing yards — 177 below their season average. Of their 106 rushing yards, 47 occurred on the game's final drive.

A week after suffering their first league loss, the Mountaineers possessed sizable advantages in total yards (225-25) and first downs (11-0) by the time they had built a 28-0 lead one play into the second period. "They came in and really performed well today," coach Shawn Clark said. "When people counted us out, we came right back for the fight."

Thomas posted four TD passes for the fourth time — including each of the last two games against Troy. The four touchdown grabs in the game came from Malik Williams (career-high 113 receiving yards), Thomas Hennigan (now No. 5 in school history in career receiving yards), Henry Pearson and Caleb Spurlin (the only FBS player with multiple sacks and receiving TDs this season).

After the Mountaineers posted their first of four straight three-and-out stops, Camerun Peoples found a third-and-1 hole and ran free for a 63-yard touchdown with Troy's defense crowding the line of scrimmage.

Thomas completed all four of his pass attempts for 69 yards on App State's next drive, with a 15-yard touchdown strike to Williams. Three plays into Troy's next series, Jones stepped in front of a short pass and returned his first career interception for another touchdown.
