APP STATE STORYLINES

- App State, which took over first in the Sun Belt's East Division with a sold-out home win vs. previously unbeaten Coastal Carolina, has a homecoming matchup with ULM, a winner of two straight games.
- Officially 4-0 at home with two Thursday games and one Wednesday game, App State leads the 130-team FBS at 105.4 percent attendance relative to capacity. The 31,604 average at 30,000-seat Kidd Brewer Stadium leads the Sun Belt's second-place average by nearly 7,500. The only other FBS schools at 100-plus percent are Michigan (100.4 percent), Utah (100.3) and Georgia (100.0).
- Since App State joined the Sun Belt in 2014, the Mountaineers are 51-10 against teams from the league (28-4 at home). Their 83.6 winning percentage vs. league foes since they joined the FBS level ranks fifth nationally behind Ohio State (93.9), Alabama (91.3), Clemson (89.7) and Oklahoma (85.9).
- App State's 79.8 win percentage (68-17) since 2015 is No. 6 nationally behind Alabama (86-7, 92.5%), Clemson (83-10, 89.2%), Ohio State (74-9, 89.2%), Oklahoma (75-12, 86.2%) and Georgia (69-17, 80.2%).
- Bednarik candidate **D'Marco Jackson** leads the Sun Belt at 9.7 tackles a game (68 total), is No. 3 at 1.3 tackles for loss per game (9.0 total) and is No. 7 at 0.7 sacks per game (4.0 total). **Demetrius Taylor** (23.5 career sacks) and **Nick Hampton** (12.5 career sacks) also have 4.0 sacks this season.
- Quarterback **Chase Brice** leads the Sun Belt at 262.9 passing yards per game following a 347-yard effort against Coastal Carolina, with **Malik Williams** (10 catches for 206 yards) and **Corey Sutton** (113 yards) giving App State a pair of 100-yard receivers for the third time in the last five games.
- Nate Noel** leads the Sun Belt in rushing (635 yards, 90.7 per game), and **Cameron Peoples** is No. 1 with 10 rushing TDs even though he missed two straight games before scoring twice against CCU.
- Super senior WRs **Thomas Hennigan**, **Malik Williams** and **Corey Sutton** are all among the top eight in school history in both receiving yards (No. 4-Hennigan; No. 6-Williams; No. 8-Sutton) and receiving TDs (No. 5-Sutton; No. 6-Hennigan; T-No. 8-Williams). Another super senior, **Jalen Virgil**, is top 20 in TDs.
- Thomas Hennigan** is tied for No. 1 in school history with 208 career catches — **Andrew Peacock** had 208 from 2010-13. Among active, full-time FBS players, Hennigan ranks No. 3 in career catches.
- Chandler Staton** hit a 24-yard field goal as time expired in last week's 30-27 win against Coastal Carolina, giving him 55 career field goals to tie **Bjorn Nittmo** (1985-88) for No. 1 in school history.

During a standard week with a Saturday game, App State will have Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday media availabilities.

Head coach Shawn Clark's appearances on the weekly Sun Belt coaches teleconference are Mondays from 11:30 a.m. ET until approximately 11:37 a.m.

After his appearance on the Sun Belt call, Clark will be available for an interview with in-person media members as well as out-of-town reporters via Zoom. He will be followed by interviews with select student-athletes (contingent on their availability). Media members interested in participating should contact Joey or Bret by the end of the day Sunday to receive further information for that week's interviews.

During standard weeks, practices on Tuesdays and Wednesdays will be open to approved media members.

If you plan to attend one or both practices, communicate those plans and submit specific interview requests to Joey or Bret by 9 a.m. on Tuesday (for Tuesday's practice) and 9 a.m. on Wednesday (for Wednesday's practice). If you have more than one person from your organization planning to attend, the name of each attendee needs to be shared in advance.

Per University policy, face coverings are required in all indoor campus locations. Inside and outside, face coverings and six feet of social distancing will be required for media members who have not been vaccinated. Face coverings while outside are optional for media members who have been fully vaccinated.

Media members will be permitted to watch practice from the West stands of Kidd Brewer Stadium. If weather moves the team into the Sofield Indoor Facility, media will not be allowed to watch practice. Post-practice interview plans for those days will be communicated with media members who have requested interviews in advance.

Practices are closed to the public.

Media attending practice are forbidden from reporting (e.g. tweeting, blogging, etc.) on anything until after the post-practice interviews have been conducted. This includes media who leave practice early. No videos or photos can be taken during practice without prior permission from the App State strategic communications office.

GAME DAY PROCEDURES

Per University policy, face coverings are required in all indoor campus locations, including the Kidd Brewer Stadium press box as well as the media interview room in the new north end zone facility.

Additionally, to ensure a safe environment for App State's student-athletes, coaches and staff, media members working on the sideline (photo/video) or conducting postgame interviews in the media interview room will need to provide proof of vaccination in order to work in those spaces.

MORE STORYLINES

- App State's impressive crowd support to start the 2021 season most recently included 31,061 fans at the Wednesday night win against Coastal Carolina — it's the biggest regular season crowd of the 115 FBS games played on a Tuesday or Wednesday since App State joined the Sun Belt in 2014, with the second-place total being 25,211 fans at Troy for South Alabama's 2017 visit. Pitt's home game against UConn on a Wednesday in 2011 — a decade ago — drew a crowd of 40,219 fans.
- A Thursday season opener vs. ECU in Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium was officially an App State home game that drew 36,752 fans, the Kidd Brewer Stadium debut vs. FCS-level Elon drew 30,224, and a Thursday home game vs. Marshall included a crowd of 28,377.
- Shawn Clark** was the only first-year FBS head coach in 2020 to win nine-plus games. At 15-5, his 75.0 winning percentage is tied for No. 8 among current FBS coaches and No. 1 among current G5 coaches.
- App State is one of 12 schools to finish in the top 26 of AP Poll voting in each of the last three years. Four teams have at least nine wins in each of the last six years: App State, Alabama, Clemson and Oklahoma.
- The Mountaineers opened Sun Belt play with a 45-16 win at Georgia State, as App State built a 45-9 lead and the first-team defense allowed only three field goals. The Panthers pulled within 14-9 midway through the third quarter before App State went on a 31-0 run over roughly the next 12 minutes.
- On Oct. 12, App State trailed 27-13 with a first down inside Louisiana's 35-yard line late in the third quarter, but the Ragin' Cajuns scored the final two touchdowns in a 41-13 victory.
- On Oct. 20, App State erased a 14-0 deficit with two TDs in a span of 42 seconds — helped by **Michael Hughes'** one-hop onside kick to **Milan Tucker** — and the Mountaineers limited Coastal to 55 rushing yards — 208.5 below its season average — on 29 attempts in the 30-27 win.
- App State returned 10 defensive starters, seven offensive starters and 80 percent of the letterwinners from 2020, including 14 super seniors taking advantage of the extra year of eligibility granted by the NCAA. Those 14 players have now combined to play 538 games for App State and make 353 starts.
- Last year was App State's 36th straight season (seven in the Sun Belt, 29 in the SoCon) with a league record of .500 or better. Among current FBS programs, counting seasons before and after any transitions, it's the longest streak by 14 years — Clemson, Oklahoma and Boise State are at 22 in a row.
- App State led in-state FBS programs in wins during each of the last three seasons and at least tied for the most wins among in-state FBS programs during each of the last six seasons.
- App State posted a combined record of 33-6 from 2018-20 with three different head coaches, three different offensive coordinators and three different defensive coordinators in those three seasons.
- App State's defense has ranked in the top 21 nationally in fewest points allowed in each of the previous four years under four different coordinators, and the offense has ranked top 16 in the country in rushing yards per game in each of the last three years under three different coordinators.
- In his 25th season as an App State assistant, **Dale Jones** is in Year 2 as the defensive coordinator after the Mountaineers ranked among the national leaders in scoring defense (16th, 20.0 points) and total defense (17th, 328.8 yards) in 2020. Offensive coordinator **Frank Ponce** came back after serving as the Mountaineers' co-offensive coordinator (passing game)/QB's coach from 2013-18. **Shawn Clark** worked with Ponce as App State's co-offensive coordinator (run game) from 2016-18.
- App State has eight team captains: WR **Thomas Hennigan**, OL **Baer Hunter**, LB **D'Marco Jackson**, OL **Cooper Hodges**, DL **Demetrius Taylor**, P **Xavier Subotsch**, LB **T.D. Roof** and DL **Caleb Spurlin**.
- Thomas Hennigan**, **Caleb Spurlin** and **Xavier Subotsch** have played in all 59 of App State's games since the start of 2017. Hennigan's FBS-record 58 starts to date broke the FBS record of 57 each by Clemson OL **Mitch Wyatt** and Alabama OL **Ross Pierschbacher** from 2015-18. The old school record of 55 belonged to CB **Jerome Touchstone** (2004-07, with three straight FCS titles).
- In 2019, App State became the first Sun Belt team AND the first FBS team in North Carolina history to win 13 games in a season (13-1). Programs in North Carolina have posted an 11-win season at the FBS level a combined 10 times, and App State accounted for three of those in its first six FBS seasons.
- App State has the Sun Belt's most-followed Instagram, Facebook, Twitter, YouTube and TikTok accounts among football programs. It ranked No. 2 among G5 programs (behind just UCF) and No. 42 in the FBS in social media interactions in 2020.

OFFENSE

- App State was the only FBS team in 2020 with 500-yard rushing seasons from at least four players, and three of them are on the 2021 roster: **Cameron Peoples**, **Nate Noel** and **Daetrich Harrington**. They had yet to all play together in the same game this season before the Coastal Carolina game, when the trio combined for 186 rushing yards on 35 attempts (5.3 yards per carry).
- RB **Daetrich Harrington** returned to the lineup at Louisiana on Oct. 12 after tearing the ACL in his right knee for the second time in his college career at Texas State on Nov. 7, 2020. He tore it in the spring of 2018 (returning nine months later to play at Georgia State in Game 10), suffered a foot injury that forced him to miss the last six regular-season games in 2019 (before returning for two postseason wins) and led the Sun Belt with 595 yards in the first six games of his injury-shortened 2020.

- **Cameron Peoples** scored three first-half TDs against Marshall, and **Nate Noel** rushed for 104 of his 187 yards during the fourth quarter, when App State turned a 30-21 deficit into a 31-30 win. Noel had gains of 11, 14, 41 and 22 yards on the final drive, smartly going down short of the end zone in the final two minutes to prevent Marshall from possibly regaining possession with an eight-point deficit.
- **Cameron Peoples** and **Nate Noel** both went over 100 yards in the season-opening win vs. ECU, and they officially ranked as the top two rushers in the Sun Belt before Peoples' recent absence.
- **Chase Brice** had a single-game high of 279 passing yards in his first three FBS seasons and has eclipsed that four times in his first seven games for App State. In addition to his 347 yards against Coastal Carolina, he threw for 293 yards (Elon), 283 yards (Marshall) and 326 yards (Georgia State, three TDs) to go along with 259 yards against ECU.
- App State has four super senior receivers in **Thomas Hennigan**, **Corey Sutton**, **Malik Williams** and **Jalen Virgil**. They've combined for 597 career catches for 8,041 receiving yards and 63 touchdowns.
- In addition to being tied for first in school history with 208 career catches, **Thomas Hennigan** is No. 4 with 2,675 receiving yards and No. 6 with 18 TD receptions. **Malik Williams** has climbed to No. 6 in school history in both career catches (175) and receiving yards (2,111), while **Corey Sutton** is No. 8 with 1,979 career receiving yards (on 125 catches).
- **Corey Sutton**, a Mayo Clinic Comeback Player of the Year candidate after he missed 2020 to fully recover from a 2019 knee injury, has eclipsed 100 yards in four of the last five games, including a streak of three straight. He had 21 catches for 361 yards and two TDs in a streak with 128 yards vs. Elon, 127 yards vs. Marshall (career-high 10 catches) and 106 yards vs. Georgia State.
- Despite sitting out last year, **Corey Sutton** has the second-most receiving TDs (21 in just 29 games) among Sun Belt players in FBS play since the start of 2018. After catching a career-high 10 passes for 127 yards vs. Marshall and dragging his back foot in bounds on a fourth-quarter TD grab that ranked No. 1 on SportsCenter's top plays, he had a 79-yard TD at Georgia State and a 28-yard TD against CCU.
- With 11 plays of more than 40 yards in his career, **Jalen Virgil** is No. 4 overall (No. 1 among offensive skill position players) on "The Freaks List" from The Athletic, marking the fourth straight year he's been named one of the most-gifted athletes in college football. At Miami, he scored on a 100-yard kickoff return for the second time in a span of four games (adding to one at Georgia Southern late in 2020).
- On the midseason honor roll for the Joe Moore Award, App State's new-look offensive line includes All-Sun Belt pick **Baer Hunter**, who moved to center during the spring after starting 31 straight games at right guard, right tackle **Cooper Hodges** (All-Sun Belt pick who now has 32 career starts) and left tackle **Anderson Hardy** (three starts there in 2020). **Isaiah Helms** occupies the right guard spot as a Western Carolina transfer, while **Damion Daley** and **Luke Smith** have both performed well at left guard. Hunter, Daley and Smith all began their college careers as defensive linemen.
- **Cooper Hodges** leads the line with 45 knockdown blocks, followed by **Isaiah Helms** (36) and **Baer Hunter** (32). Running behind the "Bulls," App State has ranked among the nation's top 25 rushing teams in all seven of its FBS seasons: No. 6 in 2020 (264.9 yards), No. 16 in 2019 (231.4), No. 14 in 2018 (240.3), No. 22 in 2017 (223.6), No. 10 in 2016 (250.9), No. 6 in 2015 (271.5) and No. 18 in 2014 (241.8).
- **Cameron Peoples** capped a 1,124-yard rushing season in 2020 with 317 yards and five touchdowns in the Myrtle Beach Bowl. He set the NCAA single-game bowl record for rushing yards (Georgia Tech's P.J. Daniels had 307 in the 2004 Humanitarian Bowl), broke the school record for single-game rushing yards (**Armanti Edwards** had 313 in a 2007 FCS semifinal win), tied the NCAA bowl record for rushing TDs and tied the school record for rushing TDs (**John Settle** also had five vs. Davidson in 1986).
- **Cameron Peoples** arrived at the 2020 Myrtle Beach Bowl needing 193 yards to give App State a 1,000-yard rusher for the ninth straight year, and that streak is now the longest among current FBS programs. The second-longest active streak of three seasons is shared by Minnesota and Buffalo.

DEFENSE

- **Jerry Moore** is App State's winningest head coach with a 215-87 record in 24 seasons. Through 24 years as an App State assistant, many alongside Moore, defensive coordinator **Dale Jones** has been part of 226 wins. He coached at Louisville with **Scott Satterfield** in 2019 following a 23-year run at App State, where he was the defensive coordinator from 2010-12 and co-defensive coordinator in 2018.
- A preseason All-American (honorable mention) from PFF College as well as a member of the watch lists for the Walter Camp Player of the Year, Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Ted Hendricks Award, **Demetrius Taylor** increased his career total to 23.5 sacks with 1.5 vs. Coastal Carolina and 2.0 at Georgia State. He is No. 5 among active FBS players and tied for No. 5 in school history in career sacks.
- **D'Marco Jackson** had a career-high 14 tackles against Marshall less than a week after becoming the first FBS player since 2014 and first-ever Sun Belt player to record at least 13 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks in the same game (against Elon). In 2020, he was the only FBS player with at least 90 tackles (91), 6.5 tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks, two interceptions and eight passes defended (he had six PBUs), leading him to be called one of the nation's most versatile players by ESPN.
- **D'Marco Jackson** was named the Sun Belt's defensive player of the week after posting nine tackles, one sack, one interception, one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry — all in the first three quarters — against Georgia State. The play gained 2 yards or less on seven of his tackles.

- With a sack in each of the first three Sun Belt games (among 5.0 TFLs), OLB **Nick Hampton** has 4.0 sacks, 7.5 tackles for loss and 34 tackles this year, contributing to his 12.5 sacks and 20.5 TFLs in 31 games since the start of the 2019 season.
- **T.D. Roof** posted 2.0 sacks among seven tackles from his OLB position in his first career start at Miami, leading to him being named the Sun Belt's Defensive Player of the Week by The Draft Network, and he added a 90-yard INT return from the visiting end zone in the win against Elon. He came up with five big tackles in the win against Coastal Carolina, including three on the Chants' 10 fourth-quarter plays.
- **Caleb Spurlin**, who paired a blocked field goal with a career-high seven tackles at Miami, had 1.5 sacks against Coastal Carolina and was the lead blocker on two rushing TDs vs. Marshall, is on the watch list for the Paul Hornung Award because of his versatility. Last season, he was the only FBS player (and just the third since 2000) with at least 2.5 sacks and two receiving TDs in the same year. He has provided the lead block as a fullback/H-back on five rushing touchdowns in his career.
- Strong safety **Kaiden Smith** started every game in 2020, returned for a sixth year as a super senior, suffered a torn Achilles tendon during an April 15 spring practice but returned less than six months later as a starter at Georgia State, then had a team-high 10 tackles at Louisiana. **Caleb Spurlin** gave up his captain's spot for the Georgia State game to let Smith have it while playing close to his hometown.
- **Shaun Jolly** received All-America recognition in each of his first two years as a starting cornerback, with PFF College naming him a second-team All-American to end a five-INT campaign in 2019 (with two INTs vs. Georgia State) and Phil Steele naming him an Honorable Mention All-American in 2020. He had a tone-setting interception on the second play of this year's Georgia State game.
- Based on a Wins Above Average metric from PFF College, linebacker **Brendan Harrington** was named the fifth-most valuable defender in college football in 2020, and he recorded two sacks in the 2021 opener before adding half a sack against Marshall. Last season, he had 48 tackles, a team-leading four interceptions that produced 95 return yards, six pass breakups, 4.0 tackles for loss and four QB hurries.
- **Steven Jones Jr.** intercepted a pass at Louisiana, increasing App State's INT total to 108 since 2015. That's tied for second place nationally (with Iowa and San Diego State) behind just Alabama's 112.
- With the 108 INTs since the start of 2015, four DBs who attended App State were with NFL franchises at the start of training camp: **Shemar Jean-Charles** (Packers draft pick, after leading the nation in PBUs and being a first-team All-American in 2020), **Josh Thomas** (Bills), **Doug Middleton** (Panthers) and **Tae Hayes** (Cardinals). Jean-Charles is the only departed starter from the 2020 defense.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Assistant **Brian Haines** again directs a unit with returning starters at kicker (**Chandler Staton**), punter (**Xavier Subotsch**), long snapper (**Christian Johnstone**) and holder (**Clayton Howell**).
- Sun Belt Special Teams Player of the Week **Chandler Staton** has a league-record 404 career points. With 55 career field goals, he's approaching the Sun Belt record of 60 by Idaho's **Austin Rehkov** from 2014-16. Staton trails only RB **Kevin Richardson** (444 points from 2004-07) on App State's scoring list.
- **Chandler Staton**, who hit a 45-yard FG to turn a 30-28 deficit into a 31-30 lead with 5:45 left in the Marshall win, added a 48-yard FG at Georgia State and hit the game-winner as time expired against Coastal Carolina, is 11-for-11 on field goals this season and 20-for-22 from 40-49 yards in his career.
- True freshman **Michael Hughes** executed an onside kick, recovered by **Milan Tucker**, against Coastal Carolina. That helped App State score two touchdowns in the span of 42 seconds.

APP STATE RECORD AT KIDD BREWER STADIUM SINCE 2003: 106-19

In addition to boasting one of the most picturesque settings for college football, Kidd Brewer Stadium also stakes claim to being one of the toughest venues in the nation.

Early in its 60th season in the venerable venue, which opened as Conrad Stadium on Sept. 15, 1962, App State boasts a 260-77-5 record.

With a 4-0 home record that includes three midweek games so far in 2021, App State's average home attendance of 31,604 gives the Mountaineers a lead of more than 7,000 fans per game over the Sun Belt's second-place average.

The construction of the \$50 million north end zone facility and installation of new turf has given The Rock a new look, as the end zone facility opened for fans before the Nov. 14, 2020 game vs. Georgia State. On Sept. 18 of this year, Hall of Fame coach Jerry Moore was honored with a plaza and statue in his name before a Boone opener that drew an above-capacity crowd of 30,224 fans.

The facility houses a new football locker room, weight room, offices and team areas, as well as 1,000 club level seats, athletic training spaces, retail and dining service facilities.

App State led the Sun Belt in home attendance in 2016, 2017 and 2019, averaging 25,787 fans in Boone during the 2017 season and 23,806 during a 13-1 season in 2019.

Kidd Brewer Stadium's seating capacity is 30,000, and Wake Forest's visit to Boone in 2017 attracted a record crowd of 35,126. The record was broken just one year after Miami's visit to The Rock drew a crowd of 34,658.

Kidd Brewer Stadium is part of the of the Mark E. Ricks Athletics Complex. Thanks to philanthropic funding through A Mountaineer Impact, the video board display in 2017 increased to three times the size of the previous board.

SHAWN CLARK

Less than four years after coming back to Boone to coach at his alma mater, Shawn Clark not only became App State's head coach, but he began his tenure with a record-breaking bowl victory and a nine-win debut season.

Clark was hired as the 22nd head football coach in App State history on Dec. 13, 2019 and improved his career record to 10-3 by capping a 9-3 season in 2020 with a Myrtle Beach Bowl championship. He was the only first-year FBS head coach in 2020 to win at least nine games.

His five-year contract runs through the 2024 season, and he made his official head coaching debut while leading the Mountaineers to a 31-17 victory against UAB in the 2019 R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl eight days after his introductory press conference. Ranked 18th in the final Amway Coaches Poll, App State went 13-1 to become the first Sun Belt team and the first FBS team from North Carolina to win 13 games in a season.

In 2020, while playing in the nation's No. 5-ranked league, App State was one of 13 teams nationally with at least nine victories. It was the outright leader in wins by an FBS program in North Carolina for the third straight year.

Working for title-winning programs at Louisville and Eastern Kentucky before being part of a bowl win for Big Ten member Purdue and coaching at Kent State, Clark has been a vital part of App State's historic success. He played at App State from 1994-98 and had served as an assistant in Boone since 2016.

In each of Clark's four seasons coaching App State's offensive line, with the Mountaineers earning four straight Sun Belt titles, the line ranked in the top 25 nationally in both rushing yards per game and fewest sacks allowed.

Clark graduated from App State with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice in 1998 and earned a master's degree in education from Louisville in 2003.

His wife, Jonelle, was a standout softball student-athlete at Eastern Kentucky and was inducted into ECU's Athletics Hall of Fame in 2008. The Clarks have two children: a daughter, Giana, and a son, Braxton.

GAME NOTES

App State won its season opener for the third straight year. It was the first season-opening win away from Boone since 2010 (42-41 at Chattanooga).

The Mountaineers improved to 20-12 all-time against the Pirates and snapped ECU's six-game winning streak in the series. This was the first matchup with both teams playing at the FBS level.

App State claimed its seventh straight victory over an in-state opponent, dating back to 2018.

The matchup was the Mountaineers' first against a team from the American Athletic Conference since App State joined the Sun Belt in 2014.

With their 64th win since the start of the 2015 season, the Mountaineers have the fifth-most in the country during that span behind only Alabama (80), Clemson (79), Ohio State (69) and Oklahoma (68).

App State had eight players make their Mountaineer debuts: true freshmen Michael Hughes, Deshawn McKnight and KaRon White; and transfers Chase Brice, Madison Cone, Isaiah Helms and Donte Small.

Making the first starts of their App State careers were QB Chase Brice, RG Isaiah Helms and senior SS Nick Ross.

The announced attendance of 36,752 officially set an App State record for the largest crowd at a "home" game in school history. The largest crowd in Kidd Brewer Stadium history remains 35,126 for the 2017 Wake Forest game.

App State had a pair of 100-yard rushers in its season opener (126 by Nate Noel, 100 by Camerun Peoples) for the second straight season.

Ten different players caught a pass, matching the 2020 season high that came in a road win vs. Texas State.

Mountaineers Envelop ECU in Uptown Charlotte

CHARLOTTE, N.C. — Country music star and App State alum Luke Combs was in town for his upcoming performance at The Rock, with fans filling Kidd Brewer Stadium for his highly anticipated concert.

Consider his song-leading cameo in a triumphant App State locker room at Bank of America Stadium a memorable warmup.

"I'm pretty parched right now," App State head coach Shawn Clark said to open his postgame press conference. "Had a chance to sing with Luke Combs in the locker room, so I enjoyed that."

No App State hearts were broken by how the home team looked in its 2021 debut.

Playing at the home of the NFL's Carolina Panthers, the Mountaineers had mayo-flavored mojo on their side as they went on a roll to claim a big lead and post a 33-19 victory against East Carolina of the American Athletic Conference. A record-setting crowd of 36,752 was on hand as App State used a 33-3 run to build a 33-9 lead in the Duke's Mayo Classic.

Chase Brice was nearly flawless through three quarters, throwing for 259 yards with touchdowns to Thomas Hennigan (114 receiving yards) and Corey Sutton, who each increased their career totals to 18 TD catches apiece. A new-look offensive line paved the way for two App State backs to surpass 100 rushing yards, as Nate Noel had 126 on 15 carries and Camerun Peoples scored twice on a 14-carry, 100-yard night.

Defensively, Ryan Huff came up with a key interception and the Mountaineers had four sacks, including two from Brendan Harrington. Nick Hampton and Tim Frizzell had back-to-back sacks leading up to Huff's pick and D'Marco Jackson led App State with eight tackles.

A 68-yard pass to Hennigan set up a third-quarter TD to Sutton, Noel had a 46-yard run to set up Peoples' second TD, and App State had an opportunity to increase the lead from 33-9 to 40-9, as Anderson Castle recovered a fumbled kickoff following big hits from Logan Dublin and Tyler Bird, but the team's lone turnover was an end-zone interception.

GAME NOTES

App State lost for the first time against a "Power Five" opponent since a 45-38 overtime defeat at No. 9 Penn State that started the 2018 season. The Mountaineers defeated both North Carolina and South Carolina in 2019.

In App State's last seven games against Power Five teams, the two Miami games are the only ones that didn't come down to the final play having a chance to win or tie the score, but the go-ahead score did come in the final two minutes of this game.

With Jalen Virgil's 100-yard kick return, App State scored a non-offensive touchdown in its fourth straight try against a Power 5 opponent. The others were Darrynton Evans' kick return at Penn State in 2018, Demetrius Taylor's scoop-and-score at North Carolina in 2019 and Nick Ross' pick six at South Carolina in 2019.

The Mountaineers fell to 0-8 against top-25 ranked opponents since moving up to FBS in 2014. The program's lone win against a top-25 team remains the historic upset of No. 5 Michigan in 2007.

This was App State's first game in the state of Florida since visiting the Gators in 2010 and just the second in the last 58 years.

Making the first starts of their App State careers were DB Madison Cone and OLB T.D. Roof

Malik Williams secured his 11th career touchdown reception on a 3-yard catch that gave the Mountaineers a 23-22 lead with 5:40 left in the game. The touchdown capped three straight connections from Chase Brice to Williams that made up 50 of the 80 yards in the scoring drive.

The App State defense racked up eight tackles for loss and held the Hurricanes to 5 of 16 on third downs.

App State Rallies Late, Falls Short Vs. #22 Miami

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. — App State's visit to Miami turned into a track meet.

The speed of Jalen Virgil, a ball-hawking defense and the Mountaineers' entire team stood out on a steamy south Florida night against the high-powered Hurricanes, but 22nd-ranked Miami used a 43-yard field goal from Andres Borregales with 2:04 left to erase a one-point deficit and claim a 25-23 victory at Hard Rock Stadium.

Trailing 22-17 midway through the fourth quarter, App State (1-1) delivered an eight-play, 75-yard touchdown drive, highlighted by Chase Brice's deep completion to Malik Williams for a 41-yard gain to the Miami 9. A 6-yard catch by Williams then set up his 3-yard, go-ahead touchdown in the back of the end zone with 5:48 remaining.

The Hurricanes (1-1) answered with a 10-play, 55-yard drive to move back ahead, and App State advanced to its own 43-yard line before a fourth-and-6 pass fell incomplete with 55 seconds left.

"Very proud of our football team," App State head coach Shawn Clark said. "It's a hard, fun fact — in 24 hours, the sun's going to come up and we'll make App Nation proud when we get back to The Rock next Saturday. Looking forward to seeing all our fans next Saturday. Again, sorry we couldn't get it done, but very proud of our guys' effort."

Just like he did nine months ago, Virgil turned a deficit into a lead with a 100-yard kickoff return. Brice threw for 199 yards, and Camerun Peoples' 95-yard rushing performance included a 28-yard touchdown.

D'Marco Jackson led App State's defense with 10 tackles, T.D. Roof posted 2.0 sacks and Caleb Spurlin added a blocked field goal to go along with his seven stops.

App State's defense came up big in the first half, as Miami's first nine points came from a 6-yard touchdown drive after a turnover and a safety resulting from a special teams miscue.

The Mountaineers' special teams bounced back, with Spurlin's blocked field goal following the 100-yard return from Virgil.

App State Handles Elon In Front Of Sellout Crowd

BOONE, N.C. — A rainbow descended toward Kidd Brewer Stadium's new north end zone facility.

With an above-capacity crowd of 30,224 gathered for App State's first Boone-based home game with no crowd-size restrictions in 651 days, a 44-10 victory against Elon included a rich mix of gold and black at the end of The Rock's rainbow — along with a throwback white logo.

T.D. Roof's 90-yard interception return set up a third-quarter TD that gave the Mountaineers (2-1) a 27-3 lead on a day they honored Hall of Fame coach Jerry Moore by unveiling a statue and dedicating a plaza bearing his name. Black helmets with colorful stripes and white 'A' logos even paid tribute to Moore's first team in 1989.

Thirty-two years later, Moore was on hand as one of his mid-90s stars, Shawn Clark, coached in a full Kidd Brewer Stadium for the first time.

"We have the best fans in college football who are very passionate," Clark said. "It was exciting to come back to The Rock in our new \$50 million complex with a sold-out crowd. Our fans were here, they were behind us, and we appreciate that."

D'Marco Jackson delivered a career-high three sacks among his career-high 4.5 tackles for loss and career-high 13 stops to lead a stout defense. He's the first FBS player since 2014 and the first Sun Belt player ever with at least 13 tackles, 4.5 TFLs and 3.0 sacks in the same game.

Offensively, quarterback Chase Brice had a rushing touchdown to go along with a 19-of-25 passing effort for 293 yards and one more touchdown. Malik Williams produced the first score with a 47-yard touchdown on his way to a career-high 123 receiving yards on four catches, and Corey Sutton caught seven passes for 128 yards.

Roof's end-zone interception return off a tipped pass set up the first of two touchdown runs from Camerun Peoples, who finished with 80 yards on 11 rushes, and Nate Noel contributed 73 yards on 17 carries.

Chandler Staton's 45-yard FG with 5:45 left was the latest in the game an App State field goal turned a deficit into a lead since Zach Matics' game-winning, walk-off field goal of the 2015 Camellia Bowl against Ohio.

App State moved to 38-12 all-time in games on ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPNU.

The announced attendance of 28,377 was the largest Thursday crowd in the history of Kidd Brewer Stadium. Among non-Saturday games, a Friday night visit from Wofford in 2008 (on Halloween night) drew 30,931 fans.

App State's offense racked up a season-high 566 total yards on 93 plays, while gaining a school-record 39 first downs. The previous record for first downs in a game was 36 against Jacksonville in 2010.

With 78 rushing yards and three touchdowns, RB Camerun Peoples increased his total to 13 rushing scores over his last five games dating back to the 2020 bowl victory.

In the fourth quarter alone, QB Chase Brice completed all five of his pass attempts for 86 yards and Nate Noel had 104 rushing yards on nine carries.

WR Corey Sutton had a career-high 10 catches for 127 yards and his 19th career touchdown catch, which moves him past teammate Thomas Hennigan for sole possession of fifth in the school record books.

Thomas Hennigan became just the fourth App State player to amass at least 200 career catches. He moved into third place in school history by increasing his career total to 201, passing DaVon Fowlkes (200 from 2001-04).

OLB Jalen McLeod had a career-high 2.0 TFLs and his first sack of the season among his four tackles.

App State Rallies To Top Marshall In Rivalry Game

BOONE, N.C. — After a timely touchdown from App State's Camerun Peoples late in the first half, a fired-up Shawn Clark pumped his left fist, flexed from a squat position and engaged in a friendly tussle with lineman Cooper Hodges before slapping the right tackle on the helmet.

You think that score and this game meant something to the Mountaineers' head coach, a 1998 graduate of App State?

Chandler Staton hit a go-ahead field goal from 45 yards out with 5:45 left, and the defense made a key stand before Nate Noel's open-field running clinched a 31-30 victory over longtime rival Marshall in front of 28,377 fans at a rocking Kidd Brewer Stadium.

Last year, in the first matchup with both teams as FBS programs, Marshall claimed a 17-7 win in Huntington, W. Va.

"It wasn't a revenge game," Clark said. "It was a reckoning game. Revenge is emotional. A reckoning is something you go out and put to bed."

The biggest crowd for a midweek game at Kidd Brewer Stadium gave the Mountaineers a lift as they climbed out of a nine-point hole and erased a fourth-quarter deficit in a win for the first time since midway through the 2017 season at Idaho.

Following Staton's field goal, Marshall moved into App State territory, but D'Marco Jackson and Jalen McLeod made the hits on a 6-yard loss after Brendan Harrington quickly disrupted the rushing attempt. Caleb Spurlin's second-down pressure forced a throwaway, and a third-down incomplection led to a punt that gave App State possession at its own 8 with four minutes left.

Noel had gains of 11, 14, 41 and 22 yards on the final drive alone, smartly going down short of the end zone in the final two minutes to prevent Marshall from possibly regaining possession with an eight-point deficit. He finished with a career-high 187 yards on 20 carries.

"I kind of felt like it was a little (too) easy," Noel said of his path to the end zone. "I remembered the situation and knew to fall."

GAME NOTES

App State won its seventh straight Sun Belt opener and has started 4-1 on the season for the fourth straight year.

This was App State's 50th win versus a Sun Belt team since joining the league in 2014. The only programs in the country with more intraconference wins in that span are Ohio State, Alabama, Clemson and Oklahoma.

This was App State's 29th road win since moving up to the FBS ranks in 2014. That's tied with Clemson, Ohio State and Oklahoma for second-most nationally behind Boise State's 30 during that span.

App State moved its record to 8-0 against Georgia State, winning each year since 2014.

Super senior WR Thomas Hennigan set the program record with his 56th career start. He had been tied with Jerome Touchstone (CB from 2004-07).

Chase Brice completed 20 of 28 passes for a season-high 326 yards with three touchdowns and no picks. He is App State's first 300-yard passer since Zac Thomas passed for 326 against Troy in 2019.

Corey Sutton caught four passes for 106 yards, including a 79-yard TD. It was Sutton's third straight 100-yard receiving game. His 20th career touchdown catch makes him one of five receivers in school history with 20 or more.

Malik Williams had a game-high seven catches (for 93 yards), including a 33-yard TD that was his third of the year and the 13th of his career.

The Mountaineers' first-string defense did now allow a TD in the game.

Kaiden Smith made an impressive return from a spring practice Achilles injury to start the game at safety.

Explosive Second Half Carries App State Past GSU

ATLANTA, Ga. — Shaun Jolly coming up with a timely interception. Corey Sutton finding the end zone. App State going on a big run. Just like in 2019, the Mountaineers put on a show at Georgia State. Jolly's tone-setting interception just two plays into the Sun Belt opener was one of three picks for App State in a 45-16 victory, and Chase Brice had three TD passes while throwing for 326 yards. Sutton's four catches for 106 yards included a 79-yard score for App State (4-1, 1-0) moments after the Panthers (1-4, 0-1) pulled within 14-9 midway through the third quarter, starting a run of 31 straight points in roughly 12 minutes to increase the margin to 45-9, with three field goals accounting for all of Georgia State's scoring to that point. "We had to come out and regroup in the second half," App State head coach Shawn Clark said. "A lot of credit goes to our kids. Our defense had 'Havoc' plays and got turnovers. Our offense capitalized on them." Two years ago, with App State going on a 49-0 run in a 56-27 win in Atlanta, Jolly scored a touchdown on one of his two interceptions and Sutton scored three times during an eight-catch, 173-yard performance. Jacob Huesman's 5-yard TD pass to Miller Gibbs, Christian Wells' 80-yard touchdown following a short throw from Brice and Anderson Castle's 22-yard touchdown run all came in an explosive four-minute stretch. Malik Williams also caught a touchdown pass from Brice, and Nate Noel's 23-yard TD capped the drive that followed Jolly's interception. Tim Frizzell added his first career interception with help via a Brendan Harrington pressure, and D'Marco Jackson intercepted a pass that was tipped by Steven Jones Jr. Demetrius Taylor accounted for two of App State's four sacks, with Jackson and Nick Hampton recording one apiece.

App State's record in games on ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPNU dropped to 38-13.
With his 57th career start, super-senior WR Thomas Hennigan tied the FBS record (not including specialists) shared by Clemson OL Mitch Wyatt (2015-18) and Alabama OL Ross Pierschbacher (2015-18).
Hennigan caught two passes for 25 yards and is now one catch shy of tying App State's all-time career receptions record of 208 held by Andrew Peacock (2010-13).
Graduate transfer QB Chase Brice scored a rushing touchdown for the second time this season.
The Mountaineers did not convert a third-down attempt on 11 tries, but went 3-for-3 on fourth-down attempts.
This was the first time the App State defense allowed more than 30 points to the opposing offense since the 2019 Sun Belt Championship Game (a 45-38 App State win against Louisiana), snapping an 18-game streak.
Junior OLB Nick Hampton recorded his third sack of the year, moving his career total to 11.5.
Senior CB Steven Jones Jr. hauled in his third career interception.
In his second game back from a spring Achilles injury, super-senior DB Kaiden Smith posted a game-high 10 tackles.

App State Drops Cross-Divisional Road Game

LAFAYETTE, La. — App State suffered its first Sun Belt Conference loss of the season, falling 41-13 on the road against West Division leader Louisiana in a nationally televised Tuesday night game.

Kaiden Smith led the Mountaineers (4-2, 1-1) with 10 tackles, and Nick Hampton had one sack.

Steven Jones Jr. came up with App State's biggest play of the night in the second quarter, making a leaping interception in the corner of the end zone to prevent Louisiana from adding on to a 20-3 lead as the Ragin' Cajuns (5-1, 3-0) consumed more than seven minutes with a 13-play drive toward the end zone.

Returning from a second ACL tear to play for the first time in 11 months, Daetrich Harrington gave the Mountaineers a spark with a 9-yard carry on the second play of the next series. Christan Horn's 14-yard reception moved App State inside the 20, and Chandler Staton's 27-yard field goal in the final minute of the half cut Louisiana's lead to 14.

The Ragin' Cajuns took control with a 21-point first quarter, scoring TDs on drives of 75 and 87 yards before a fumble recovery created a short field for a third touchdown drive. The only points that App State mustered during that stretch came from a 31-yard field goal by Staton.

The Mountaineers received the ball to open the third quarter, but an interception return inside the App State 20 set up a touchdown run.

App State responded with a 12-play touchdown drive that included conversions by Henry Pearson (14-yard catch on a fourth-and-10 pass from the Louisiana 37) and Malik Williams (8-yard reception on a fourth-and-2 pass from the Louisiana 15). Chase Brice reached the end zone on a 7-yard keeper midway through the quarter.

The Mountaineers advanced to the Louisiana 32 with an opportunity to trim a 14-point deficit in half, but a sack contributed to that series stalling. A punt from Xavier Subotsch went out of bounds at the 2-yard line, backing up the Ragin' Cajuns, but they sealed the game with a 13-play, 98-yard touchdown drive that took nearly eight minutes.

Game-Ending FG Lifts App State Over #14 Chants

BOONE, N.C. — Sellout crowd. Ranked opponent. And a field flooded with fans after a tiebreaking, game-winning kick. Chandler Staton's 24-yard field goal as time expired lifted App State to a dramatic 30-27 win against No. 14 Coastal Carolina on a Wednesday night in front of an ESPN2 audience and 31,061 fans at Kidd Brewer Stadium. Since App State's 2014 move to the Sun Belt, it was the largest crowd for any college football game on a Tuesday or Wednesday. "I'm so proud of this team and everyone involved in our organization," App State head coach Shawn Clark said. "This is a great win for our university and for this program." With the Chanticleers (6-1, 2-1) as the highest-ranked FBS team to ever visit The Rock, the Mountaineers (5-2, 2-1) posted their second-ever win against a ranked opponent — and first since the 34-32 win against Michigan in 2007, when App State was an FCS program. Malik Williams caught a career-high 10 passes for a career-high 206 yards and Corey Sutton added 113 yards on six catches. Chase Brice threw for a career-high 347 yards and two TDs, and Staton's game-ending kick was his 55th career field goal — tying Bjorn Nittmo's school record. Defensively, the Mountaineers limited Coastal to 55 rushing yards — 208.5 below its season average — on 29 attempts. Nick Hampton and Demetrius Taylor (3.0 TFLs) recorded sacks on consecutive plays bridging the final two quarters, Caleb Spurlin and Taylor both finished with 1.5 sacks, and D'Marco Jackson led the team with 11 tackles. App State overcome an early 14-0 deficit, using an onside kick involving Michael Hughes and Milan Tucker to score two TDs just 42 seconds part. App State's defense came up huge in the fourth quarter, forcing three Coastal punts, the last one being fair-caught by Thomas Hennigan at the App State 38 with 3:53 remaining. Brice had back-to-back throws of 16 and 19 yards to Williams to get the Mountaineers in scoring range. With time on its side and timeouts lacking for the Chanticleers after a third-and-1 conversion to the 11 with less than two minutes remaining, App State milked the clock to set up a storm-inducing kick executed with a snap from Christian Johnstone and hold by Clayton Howell.
