## APP STATE STORYLINES

- For the first time in program history, App State has opened a season with three straight games in which the crowds have exceeded 30,000 fans, and Game 4 (on ESPN) is another big one with former Southern Conference rival Marshall visiting Kidd Brewer Stadium for the first time in 25 years.
- App State has opened the season with games against teams from the AAC (33-9 lead in a decisive win against East Carolina before 36,752 fans in Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium), the ACC (led in the closing minutes of a 25-23 loss at No. 22 Miami in front of 45,877 fans) and the CAA (44-10 win against Elon in front of 30,224 fans — or the eighth-biggest crowd in Kidd Brewer Stadium history).
- App State's 65-16 record and 80.2 win percentage since the start of 2015 is No. 5 nationally behind just Alabama (82-6, 93.2%), Clemson (81-8, 91.0%), Ohio State (70-9, 88.6%) and Oklahoma (79-12, 85.4%).
- Shawn Clark** was the only first-year FBS head coach in 2020 to win nine-plus games. Four teams have won at least nine games in each of the last six seasons: App State, Alabama, Clemson and Oklahoma.
- This will be the 20th national TV appearance in the last 31 games for the Mountaineers, who are 37-12 all-time in games on ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPNU.
- App State and Marshall played as SoCon rivals every year from 1977-96, highlighted by a 24-14 home win for App State in 1994, when the Mountaineers were ranked No. 24 in the FCS poll and Marshall was No. 1, and a 10-3 road win in 1995, when the Mountaineers were No. 2 and Marshall was No. 3.
- Charleston, W.Va., native **Shawn Clark** attended George Washington High and was a four-year offensive line starter in his five years at App State from 1994-98, during the rivalry's heyday.
- The 44-10 win against Elon on Saturday included standout performances from LB **D'Marco Jackson** (first FBS player since 2014 and first-ever Sun Belt player with at least 13 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks in one game), QB **Chase Brice** (293 passing yards after going 8 of 8 for 179 yards in the first 16 minutes), WR **Corey Sutton** (128 receiving yards) and WR **Malik Williams** (123 receiving yards).
- App State's 2021 debut at Kidd Brewer Stadium on Saturday was the first game with no crowd-size restrictions at The Rock in 651 days, and the day included a pregame unveiling of the Jerry Moore Plaza, which includes a statue of the Hall of Fame coach **Jerry Moore**. He led App State to three straight FCS national titles and 10 conference titles while winning 215 games from 1989-2012.

During a standard week with a Saturday game, App State will have Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday media availabilities.

Head coach Shawn Clark's appearances on the weekly Sun Belt coaches teleconference are Mondays from 11:30 a.m. ET until approximately 11:37 a.m.

After his appearance on the Sun Belt call, Clark will be available for an interview with in-person media members as well as out-of-town reporters via Zoom. He will be followed by interviews with select student-athletes (contingent on their availability). Media members interested in participating should contact Joey or Bret by the end of the day Sunday to receive further information for that week's interviews.

During standard weeks, practices on Tuesdays and Wednesdays will be open to approved media members.

If you plan to attend one or both practices, communicate those plans and submit specific interview requests to Joey or Bret by 9 a.m. on Tuesday (for Tuesday's practice) and 9 a.m. on Wednesday (for Wednesday's practice). If you have more than one person from your organization planning to attend, the name of each attendee needs to be shared in advance.

Per University policy, face coverings are required in all indoor campus locations. Inside and outside, face coverings and six feet of social distancing will be required for media members who have not been vaccinated. Face coverings while outside are optional for media members who have been fully vaccinated.

Media members will be permitted to watch practice from the West stands of Kidd Brewer Stadium. If weather moves the team into the Sofield Indoor Facility, media will not be allowed to watch practice. Post-practice interview plans for those days will be communicated with media members who have requested interviews in advance.

Practices are closed to the public.

Media attending practice are forbidden from reporting (e.g. tweeting, blogging, etc.) on anything until after the post-practice interviews have been conducted. This includes media who leave practice early. No videos or photos can be taken during practice without prior permission from the App State strategic communications office.

**GAME DAY PROCEDURES**

Per University policy, face coverings are required in all indoor campus locations, including the Kidd Brewer Stadium press box as well as the media interview room in the new north end zone facility.

Additionally, to ensure a safe environment for App State's student-athletes, coaches and staff, media members working on the sideline (photo/video) or conducting postgame interviews in the media interview room will need to provide proof of vaccination in order to work in those spaces.

**MORE STORYLINES**

- App State is one of just 12 schools to finish in the top 26 of AP Poll voting in each of the last three years.
- App State led in-state FBS programs in wins during each of the last three seasons and at least tied for the most wins among in-state FBS programs during each of the last six seasons.
- App State returned 10 defensive starters, seven offensive starters and 80 percent of the letterwinners from 2020, including 14 "super seniors" taking advantage of the extra year of eligibility granted by the NCAA. Those 14 players have now combined to play 489 games for App State and make 316 starts.
- Before this season, the only current NFL stadium where App State had played was the Superdome — the Mountaineers posted New Orleans Bowl victories in 2018 and 2019 to contribute to the program's record-setting bowl record of 6-0 in six postseason-eligible FBS seasons.
- During the win over ECU in Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium, App State had two 100-yard backs (**Nate Noel** with 126 yards on 15 carries, **Cameron Peoples** with 100 yards on 14 carries), QB **Chase Brice** threw for 259 yards (all in the first three quarters), **Thomas Hennigan** followed a 34-yard TD with a 68-yard gain during his 114-yard night, **Corey Sutton** had a TD catch in a successful return from a 2019 injury and **Brendan Harrington** accounted for two of the team's four sacks.
- Against Miami, App State took a 23-22 lead on **Chase Brice's** TD pass to **Malik Williams** with 5:48 left, but the Hurricanes moved back ahead on a 43-yard field goal with 2:02 remaining. **Jalen Virgil** returned a kickoff for a 100-yard touchdown, **T.D. Roof** had two sacks, **Caleb Spurlin** paired a blocked field goal with a career-high seven tackles and **Cameron Peoples** rushed for 95 yards with a TD.
- App State posted a combined record of 33-6 from 2018-20 with three different head coaches, three different offensive coordinators and three different defensive coordinators in those three seasons.
- App State's defense has ranked in the top 21 nationally in fewest points allowed in each of the previous four years under four different coordinators, and the offense has ranked top 16 in the country in rushing yards per game in each of the last three years under three different coordinators.
- Early in his 25th season as an App State assistant, **Dale Jones** is back for Year 2 as the defensive coordinator after the Mountaineers ranked among the national leaders in scoring defense (16th, 20.0 points) and total defense (17th, 328.8 yards) in 2020. Offensive coordinator **Frank Ponce** is back after serving as the Mountaineers' co-offensive coordinator (passing game)/QB's coach from 2013-18. **Shawn Clark** worked with Ponce as App State's co-offensive coordinator (run game) from 2016-18.
- Last year was App State's 36th straight season (seven in the Sun Belt, 29 in the SoCon) with a league record of .500 or better. Among current FBS programs, counting seasons before and after any transitions, it's the longest streak by 14 years — Clemson, Oklahoma and Boise State are at 22 in a row.
- App State has eight team captains: WR **Thomas Hennigan**, OL **Baer Hunter**, LB **D'Marco Jackson**, OL **Cooper Hodges**, DL **Demetrius Taylor**, P **Xavier Subotsch**, LB **T.D. Roof** and DL **Caleb Spurlin**.
- **Thomas Hennigan**, **Caleb Spurlin** and **Xavier Subotsch** have played in every App State game since the start of 2017. With 54 career starts to date, Hennigan is tied for No. 2 in school history with cornerback **Justin Woazeah** (54 from 2004-07), behind only **Jerome Touchstone** (55 straight from 2004-07). The most career FBS starts on record by non-specialists are 57 apiece by Clemson OL **Mitch Wyatt** (2015-18) and Alabama OL **Ross Pierschbacher** (2015-18).
- In 2019, App State became the first Sun Belt team AND the first FBS team in North Carolina history to win 13 games in a season (13-1). Programs in North Carolina have posted an 11-win season at the FBS level a combined 10 times, and App State accounted for three of those in its first six FBS seasons.
- App State has the Sun Belt's most-followed Instagram, Facebook, Twitter, YouTube and TikTok accounts among football programs. It ranked No. 2 among G5 programs (behind just UCF) and No. 42 in the FBS in social media interactions in 2020.

**OFFENSE**

- **Cameron Peoples** (91.7 yards a game) and **Nate Noel** (83.3 yards a game) rank as the Sun Belt's No. 2 and No. 3 rushers, respectively. Peoples has 10 rushing TDs in his last four games.
- App State was the only FBS team in 2020 with 500-yard rushing seasons from at least four players, and three of them are back: RBs **Cameron Peoples** (at least 80 yards in each of the first three games this year), **Nate Noel** (126 yards on 15 carries in Week 1) and **Daetrich Harrington** (who missed the last six games of 2020 with a knee injury). App State, Georgia Southern and Army were the only FBS teams with 100-yard rushing games from five different players in 2020.
- **Cameron Peoples** capped a 1,124-yard rushing season in 2020 with 317 yards and five touchdowns in the Myrtle Beach Bowl. He set the NCAA single-game bowl record for rushing yards (Georgia Tech's P.J. Daniels had 307 in the 2004 Humanitarian Bowl), broke the school record for single-game rushing yards (**Armanti Edwards** had 313 in a 2007 FCS semifinal win), tied the NCAA bowl record for rushing TDs and tied the school record for rushing TDs (**John Settle** also had five vs. Davidson in 1986).
- **Cameron Peoples** arrived at the 2020 Myrtle Beach Bowl needing 193 yards to give App State a 1,000-yard rusher for the ninth straight year, and that streak is now the longest among current FBS programs. The second-longest active streak of three seasons is shared by Minnesota and Buffalo.

- Before throwing for 259 yards with two TDs (in three quarters) against ECU, passing for 199 yards at Miami and throwing for 293 yards against Elon, **Chase Brice** had played in 36 FBS games, taken more than 1,100 snaps and thrown for nearly 3,200 yards in college in combined stints at Clemson and Duke.
- **Thomas Hennigan**, a second-team Academic All-American in 2020, ranks No. 4 in school history with 192 career catches (No. 3 is 200), No. 4 with 2,461 career receiving yards (No. 3 is 2,960) and tied for No. 5 with 18 TD receptions (No. 4 is 22). Among active, full-time FBS players, he ranks No. 3 with his 192 career catches (behind just Ball State's **Justin Ball** with 274 and Missouri's **Keke Chism** with 202).
- Despite sitting out last year, **Corey Sutton** is still tied for the most receiving touchdowns among Sun Belt players since the start of the 2018 season. Adding in a touchdown catch in the 2021 opener, he has 18 TD catches in 25 games, and the co-leader with 18 TDs has played in 39 games during the same span.
- App State has four "super senior" receivers in **Thomas Hennigan**, **Corey Sutton**, **Malik Williams** and **Jalen Virgil**. They've combined for 533 career catches for 7,097 receiving yards and 58 touchdowns. Williams had a career-high 123 yards vs. Elon, including 97 in the first quarter, and Sutton's 128 yards gave App State a pair of 100-yard receivers for the first time since the Coastal Carolina game in 2017.
- With 10 plays of more than 40 yards in his career, **Jalen Virgil** is No. 4 overall (No. 1 among offensive skill position players) on "The Freaks List" from The Athletic, marking the fourth straight year he's been named one of the most-gifted athletes in college football. At Miami, he scored on a 100-yard kickoff return for the second time in the last four games (adding to one at Georgia Southern late in 2020).
- Of the 190 catches by App State players in 2020, the 2021 roster includes players responsible for 181 of them, or 95.3 percent of the receptions (as well as 96.4 percent of the receiving yards).
- App State's new-look offensive line includes All-Sun Belt pick **Baer Hunter**, who moved to center during the spring after starting 31 straight games at right guard, right tackle **Cooper Hodges** (All-Sun Belt pick who now has 28 career starts) and left tackle **Anderson Hardy** (three starts there in 2020).
- Running behind the "Bulls" up front, App State has ranked among the nation's top 25 rushing teams in all seven of its FBS seasons: No. 6 in 2020 (264.9 yards), No. 16 in 2019 (231.4), No. 14 in 2018 (240.3), No. 22 in 2017 (223.6), No. 10 in 2016 (250.9), No. 6 in 2015 (271.5) and No. 18 in 2014 (241.8).

## DEFENSE

- **Jerry Moore** is App State's winningest head coach with a 215-87 record in 24 seasons. Through 24 years as an App State assistant, many alongside Moore, defensive coordinator **Dale Jones** has been part of 223 wins. He coached at Louisville with **Scott Satterfield** in 2019 following a 23-year run at App State, where he was the defensive coordinator from 2010-12 and co-defensive coordinator in 2018.
- App State has held the opposing offense to less than 30 points in 16 straight games dating back to 2019. It has allowed 10 points or less 30 times since moving to the FBS ranks in 2014.
- Linebacker **D'Marco Jackson** leads the Sun Belt with 31 tackles through three games, after becoming the first FBS player since 2014 and first-ever Sun Belt player to record at least 13 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks in the same game. In 2020, he was the only FBS player with at least 90 tackles (91), 6.5 tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks, two interceptions and eight passes defended (he had six PBUs), leading him to be called one of the nation's most versatile players by ESPN.
- **T.D. Roof** posted 2.0 sacks among seven tackles from his OLB position in his first career start at Miami, leading to him being named the Sun Belt's Defensive Player of the Week by The Draft Network, and he added a 90-yard interception return from the visiting end zone in the win against Elon.
- A preseason All-American (honorable mention) from PFF College as well as a member of the watch lists for the Walter Camp Player of the Year, Bednarik Trophy, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Ted Hendricks Award, **Demetrius Taylor** entered this season with 113 career tackles, 19.5 sacks (now No. 6 among active FBS players), 35.5 tackles for loss, 20 quarterback hurries and five forced fumbles.
- **Caleb Spurlin**, who paired a blocked field goal with a career-high seven tackles at Miami, has been named to the watch list for the Paul Hornung Award because of his versatility. Last season, as a starting defensive end who contributed at defensive tackle and as a fullback/H-back, he was the only FBS player (and just the third since 2000) with at least 2.5 sacks and two receiving TDs in the same year.
- Based on a Wins Above Average metric from PFF College, linebacker **Brendan Harrington** was named the fifth-most valuable defender in college football in 2020, and he recorded two sacks in the 2021 opener. Last season, he had 48 tackles, a team-leading four interceptions that produced 95 return yards, six pass breakups, 4.0 tackles for loss and four QB hurries.
- **Shaun Jolly** has received All-America recognition in each of his first two years as a starting cornerback, with PFF College naming him a second-team All-American to end a five-interception campaign in 2019 and Phil Steele naming him an Honorable Mention All-American in 2020.
- With 102 INTs from 2015-20, App State was the only FBS program to reach triple digits in that span. Four defensive backs who attended App State were with NFL franchises at the start of training camp: **Shemar Jean-Charles** (Packers draft pick, after leading the nation in PBUs and being named a first-team All-American in 2020), **Josh Thomas** (Bills), **Doug Middleton** (Panthers) and **Tae Hayes** (Cardinals).
- With NFL draft pick **Shemar Jean-Charles** as the only departed starter from 2020, players responsible for 91.0 percent of the tackles last season are still with the Mountaineers this year.

- Assistant **Brian Haines** again directs a unit with returning starters at kicker (**Chandler Staton**), punter (**Xavier Subotsch**), long snapper (**Christian Johnstone**) and holder (**Clayton Howell**).
- Chandler Staton**, who made three field goals and scored 14 points against Elon, is the Sun Belt's career scoring leader with 376 points. In the school record books, he is No. 3 in points (No. 1 among kickers), No. 2 in field goals made (50) and No. 2 in extra points made (226). In his career, he has a make from 53 yards and is 18-for-20 from between 40 and 49 yards.
- With 16 kickoff returns since the start of the 2019 season, **Jalen Virgil** has two 100-yard kickoff returns for TDs in the last five games (at Miami, at Georgia Southern in 2020 regular-season finale) plus a 57-yard return that set up App State's final touchdown in a 20-15 win at South Carolina in 2019.
- Xavier Subotsch**, a candidate for the Ray Guy Award, had a 2020 net punting average of 40.3 yards to lead full-time starters in the Sun Belt, and he has a 37.4 net average this season. Last season, App State ranked No. 11 nationally (and No. 1 the Sun Belt) by allowing 2.2 yards per punt return.
- Michael Hughes**, a freshman who has been handling the kickoffs, attended the same high school as Mountaineers head coach **Shawn Clark**: George Washington High School in Charleston, W.Va.

APP STATE RECORD AT KIDD BREWER STADIUM SINCE 2003: 104-19

In addition to boasting one of the most picturesque settings for college football with App State's campus and the natural beauty of the High Country serving as a backdrop, Kidd Brewer Stadium also stakes claim to being one of the toughest venues in the nation.

Early in its 60th season in the venerable stadium, which opened as Conrad Stadium on Sept. 15, 1962, App State boasts a 258-77-5 record.

With the construction of the \$50 million north end zone facility and installation of new turf, The Rock has a new look in 2021, as the end zone facility opened for fans before the Nov. 14, 2020 game vs. Georgia State. Last weekend, Hall of Fame coach Jerry Moore was honored with a plaza and statue in his name before a Boone opener that drew an above-capacity crowd of 30,224 fans.

The facility houses a new football locker room, weight room, offices and team areas, as well as 1,000 club level seats, athletic training spaces, retail and dining service facilities.

App State led the Sun Belt Conference in home attendance in 2016, 2017 and 2019, averaging 25,787 fans in Boone during the 2017 season, 23,351 fans per regular-season home game in 2018 and 23,806 fans per home game during a 13-1 season in 2019.

Kidd Brewer Stadium's seating capacity is 30,000, and Wake Forest's visit to Boone in 2017 attracted a record crowd of 35,126. The record was broken just one year after Miami's visit to The Rock drew a crowd of 34,658.

Kidd Brewer Stadium is part of the of the Mark E. Ricks Athletics Complex. Thanks to philanthropic funding through A Mountaineer Impact, the video board display in 2017 increased to three times the size of the previous board.

# SHAWN CLARK

Less than four years after coming back to Boone to coach at his alma mater, Shawn Clark not only became App State's head coach, but he began his tenure with a record-breaking bowl victory and a nine-win debut season.

Clark was hired as the 22nd head football coach in App State history on Dec. 13, 2019 and improved his career record to 10-3 by capping a 9-3 season in 2020 with a Myrtle Beach Bowl championship. He was the only first-year FBS head coach in 2020 to win at least nine games.

His five-year contract runs through the 2024 season, and he made his official head coaching debut while leading the Mountaineers to a 31-17 victory against UAB in the 2019 R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl eight days after his introductory press conference. Ranked 18th in the final Amway Coaches Poll, App State went 13-1 to become the first Sun Belt team and the first FBS team from North Carolina to win 13 games in a season.

In 2020, while playing in the nation's No. 5-ranked league, App State was one of 13 teams nationally with at least nine victories. It was the outright leader in wins by an FBS program in North Carolina for the third straight year.

Working for title-winning programs at Louisville and Eastern Kentucky before being part of a bowl win for Big Ten member Purdue and coaching at Kent State, Clark has been a vital part of App State's historic success. He played at App State from 1994-98 and had served as an assistant in Boone since 2016.

In each of Clark's four seasons coaching App State's offensive line, with the Mountaineers earning four straight Sun Belt titles, the line ranked in the top 25 nationally in both rushing yards per game and fewest sacks allowed.

Clark graduated from App State with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice in 1998 and earned a master's degree in education from Louisville in 2003.

His wife, Jonelle, was a standout softball student-athlete at Eastern Kentucky and was inducted into ECU's Athletics Hall of Fame in 2008. The Clarks have two children: a daughter, Giana, and a son, Braxton.

- Ranks second in the Sun Belt at 91.7 rushing yards per game, and teammate Nate Noel is No. 3 at 83.3 rushing yards per game

- Helped App State finish 2021 opener with two 100-yard rushers
- Has ranked among the nation's top 25 rushing teams in all seven of its FBS seasons, including No. 6 nationally in 2020 (264.9 yards)
- App State's offense has ranked in the top 16 nationally in rushing yards per game in each of the previous three years under three different coordinators
- Baer Hunter, an Outland Trophy and Rimington Trophy candidate, moved to center in 2021 after starting previous 31 games at RG

## APP STATE/MARSHALL HISTORY

Longtime football rivals App State and Marshall renewed their rivalry last year, with Marshall winning 17-7 in Huntington, W. Va., and after this week's game in Boone, they have agreed to play two more times: a 2022 game in Huntington (Sept. 17) and a 2029 game in Boone (Sept. 8).

App State, which has gone 6-0 in bowl games in its six postseason-eligible seasons, and Marshall, which has earned bowl berths in seven of the last eight seasons, have squared off 23 times on the gridiron, with 21 of those matchups coming when the Mountaineers and Thundering Herd were both members of the Southern Conference from 1977-96. App State holds a 14-9 advantage in the all-time series.

Marshall was the top-ranked Division I-AA team in 1994 when No. 24 App State secured a 24-14 upset. The next year, the No. 2 Mountaineers went on the road to defeat the No. 3 Thundering Herd 10-3 during App State's perfect 11-0 regular season.

"I fondly remember our games against Marshall during my playing days," said App State head coach Shawn Clark, a West Virginia native who was a four-year starting offensive lineman for the Mountaineers from 1994-98. "It was an incredible rivalry then, and we are excited to renew the rivalry now."

Scheduled to play for the second time as FBS opponents, after last year's first FBS matchup, App State and Marshall are two of the standard-bearers for successful transitions to the top level of college football.

Marshall lost its bowl debut as an FBS newcomer during the 1997 season and won bowl games each of the next five seasons,

contributing to its overall FBS bowl record of 12-4.

In 11 of the teams' 13 contests from 1985-96, at least one squad was ranked in the NCAA Division I-AA top 25. Both teams were nationally ranked eight times during that 13-game stretch.

Perhaps the most memorable games in the series were played in 1994 and 1995.

### 1994: #24 APP STATE 24, #1 MARSHALL 14

On Oct. 22, 1994, App State upset top-ranked Marshall during a steady downpour at Kidd Brewer Stadium. College Football Hall of Famer Dexter Coakley led a dominant defensive performance with 15 tackles.

Former App State head coach Scott Satterfield, making only the second start of his career at quarterback, threw for 113 yards and rushed for 30 yards and a touchdown to pace the offense in the Mountaineers' first-ever win over a No. 1 team.

Johnny Smith, who spent his first three years at fullback, returned an interception 70 yards for fourth-quarter TD to help seal the win.

### 1995: #2 APP STATE 10, #3 MARSHALL 3

On Oct. 21, 1995, the teams squared off at what was then known as Marshall Stadium in Huntington, and Satterfield's 5-yard touchdown run with 4:18 to go lifted App State.

Once again, Coakley was the game's most dominant performer with 21 tackles, two tackles for loss, two quarterback hurries, three pass breakups and a forced fumble. Mark Ivey chipped in with five tackles, a tackle for loss, a sack, three QB hurries and a pass breakup.

That was the seventh game during an 11-0 regular season for App State, which won its first playoff game before losing to No. 5 Stephen F. Austin.

### 2020: MARSHALL 17, #23 APP STATE 7

After a highlight-reel touchdown grab by Jalen Virgil helped tie the game to conclude App State's first drive, Marshall kept the 23rd-ranked Mountaineers from scoring again, even though they advanced inside the Thundering Herd's 10-yard line on their first two fourth-quarter possessions.

App State had won its last seven games against Conference USA opponents.

Mountaineers Envelop ECU in Uptown Charlotte

CHARLOTTE, N.C. — Country music star and App State alum Luke Combs was in town for his upcoming performance at The Rock, with fans filling Kidd Brewer Stadium for his highly anticipated concert.

Consider his song-leading cameo in a triumphant App State locker room at Bank of America Stadium a memorable warmup.

"I'm pretty parched right now," App State head coach Shawn Clark said to open his postgame press conference. "Had a chance to sing with Luke Combs in the locker room, so I enjoyed that."

No App State hearts were broken by how the home team looked in its 2021 debut.

Playing at the home of the NFL's Carolina Panthers, the Mountaineers had mayo-flavored mojo on their side as they went on a roll to claim a big lead and post a 33-19 victory against East Carolina of the American Athletic Conference. A record-setting crowd of 36,752 was on hand as App State used a 33-3 run to build a 33-9 lead in the Duke's Mayo Classic.

Chase Brice was nearly flawless through three quarters, throwing for 259 yards with touchdowns to Thomas Hennigan (114 receiving yards) and Corey Sutton, who each increased their career totals to 18 TD catches apiece. A new-look offensive line paved the way for two App State backs to surpass 100 rushing yards, as Nate Noel had 126 on 15 carries and Camerun Peoples scored twice on a 14-carry, 100-yard night.

Defensively, Ryan Huff came up with a key interception and the Mountaineers had four sacks, including two from Brendan Harrington. Nick Hampton and Tim Frizzell had back-to-back sacks leading up to Huff's pick and D'Marco Jackson led App State with eight tackles.

A 68-yard pass to Hennigan set up a third-quarter TD to Sutton, Noel had a 46-yard run to set up Peoples' second TD, and App State had an opportunity to increase the lead from 33-9 to 40-9, as Anderson Castle recovered a fumbled kickoff following big hits from Logan Dublin and Tyler Bird, but the team's lone turnover was an end-zone interception.

**GAME NOTES**

App State lost for the first time against a "Power Five" opponent since a 45-38 overtime defeat at No. 9 Penn State that started the 2018 season. The Mountaineers defeated both North Carolina and South Carolina in 2019.

In App State's last seven games against Power Five teams, the two Miami games are the only ones that didn't come down to the final play having a chance to win or tie the score, but the go-ahead score did come in the final two minutes of this game.

With Jalen Virgil's 100-yard kick return, App State scored a non-offensive touchdown in its fourth straight try against a Power 5 opponent. The others were Darrynton Evans' kick return at Penn State in 2018, Demetrius Taylor's scoop-and-score at North Carolina in 2019 and Nick Ross' pick six at South Carolina in 2019.

The Mountaineers fell to 0-8 against top-25 ranked opponents since moving up to FBS in 2014. The program's lone win against a top-25 team remains the historic upset of No. 5 Michigan in 2007.

This was App State's first game in the state of Florida since visiting the Gators in 2010 and just the second in the last 58 years.

Making the first starts of their App State careers were DB Madison Cone and OLB T.D. Roof

Malik Williams secured his 11th career touchdown reception on a 3-yard catch that gave the Mountaineers a 23-22 lead with 5:40 left in the game. The touchdown capped three straight connections from Chase Brice to Williams that made up 50 of the 80 yards in the scoring drive.

The App State defense racked up eight tackles for loss and held the Hurricanes to 5 of 16 on third downs.

App State Rallies Late, Falls Short Vs. #22 Miami

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. — App State's visit to Miami turned into a track meet.

The speed of Jalen Virgil, a ball-hawking defense and the Mountaineers' entire team stood out on a steamy south Florida night against the high-powered Hurricanes, but 22nd-ranked Miami used a 43-yard field goal from Andres Borregales with 2:04 left to erase a one-point deficit and claim a 25-23 victory at Hard Rock Stadium.

Trailing 22-17 midway through the fourth quarter, App State (1-1) delivered an eight-play, 75-yard touchdown drive, highlighted by Chase Brice's deep completion to Malik Williams for a 41-yard gain to the Miami 9. A 6-yard catch by Williams then set up his 3-yard, go-ahead touchdown in the back of the end zone with 5:48 remaining.

The Hurricanes (1-1) answered with a 10-play, 55-yard drive to move back ahead, and App State advanced to its own 43-yard line before a fourth-and-6 pass fell incomplete with 55 seconds left.

"Very proud of our football team," App State head coach Shawn Clark said. "It's a hard, fun fact — in 24 hours, the sun's going to come up and we'll make App Nation proud when we get back to The Rock next Saturday. Looking forward to seeing all our fans next Saturday. Again, sorry we couldn't get it done, but very proud of our guys' effort."

Just like he did nine months ago, Virgil turned a deficit into a lead with a 100-yard kickoff return. Brice threw for 199 yards, and Camerun Peoples' 95-yard rushing performance included a 28-yard touchdown.

D'Marco Jackson led App State's defense with 10 tackles, T.D. Roof posted 2.0 sacks and Caleb Spurlin added a blocked field goal to go along with his seven stops.

App State's defense came up big in the first half, as Miami's first nine points came from a 6-yard touchdown drive after a turnover and a safety resulting from a special teams miscue.

The Mountaineers' special teams bounced back, with Spurlin's blocked field goal following the 100-yard return from Virgil.

GAME NOTES
It was App State's eighth straight win in a Kidd Brewer Stadium season debut. The Mountaineers are 33-5 in games at Kidd Brewer since 2015.
App State claimed its eighth straight victory over an in-state opponent, dating back to 2018.
Making his first career start was DB Ronald Clarke at free safety.
Seven players made their App State debuts: Austyn Chestnut, Troy Everett, Justin Isler, Elijah Johnson, Jayden Ramsey, Jahmir Smith and Seth Williams.
The announced attendance of 30,224 was the eighth-biggest crowd in the history of Kidd Brewer Stadium. .
Chase Brice completed 19 of 25 passes for 293 yards, the most passing yards by a Mountaineer since Zac Thomas threw for 326 yards against Troy in 2019. Brice threw one touchdown and rushed for his first score as a Mountaineer.
It was the first game in which multiple Mountaineers had 100+ receiving yards since the 2017 Coastal Carolina game (Jalen Virgil 186, Ike Lewis 106).
Watauga High School alum Anderson Castle scored his first collegiate touchdown with a fourth-quarter, 8-yard rush to give the game its final 44-10 margin.
App State has held the opposing offense to less than 30 points in 16 straight games dating back to the 2019 season.
It was the 30th time that App State has allowed 10 points or less since moving to the FBS ranks in 2014.
T.D. Roof's 90-yard INT return was the Mountaineers' sixth interception return of 90+ yards in school history.

App State Handles Elon In Front Of Sellout Crowd

BOONE, N.C. — A rainbow descended toward Kidd Brewer Stadium's new north end zone facility.

With an above-capacity crowd of 30,224 gathered for App State's first Boone-based home game with no crowd-size restrictions in 651 days, a 44-10 victory against Elon included a rich mix of gold and black at the end of The Rock's rainbow — along with a throwback white logo.

T.D. Roof's 90-yard interception return set up a third-quarter TD that gave the Mountaineers (2-1) a 27-3 lead on a day they honored Hall of Fame coach Jerry Moore by unveiling a statue and dedicating a plaza bearing his name. Black helmets with colorful stripes and white 'A' logos even paid tribute to Moore's first team in 1989.

Thirty-two years later, Moore was on hand as one of his mid-90s stars, Shawn Clark, coached in a full Kidd Brewer Stadium for the first time.

"We have the best fans in college football who are very passionate," Clark said. "It was exciting to come back to The Rock in our new \$50 million complex with a sold-out crowd. Our fans were here, they were behind us, and we appreciate that."

D'Marco Jackson delivered a career-high three sacks among his career-high 4.5 tackles for loss and career-high 13 stops to lead a stout defense. He's the first FBS player since 2014 and the first Sun Belt player ever with at least 13 tackles, 4.5 TFLs and 3.0 sacks in the same game.

Offensively, quarterback Chase Brice had a rushing touchdown to go along with a 19-of-25 passing effort for 293 yards and one more touchdown. Malik Williams produced the first score with a 47-yard touchdown on his way to a career-high 123 receiving yards on four catches, and Corey Sutton caught seven passes for 128 yards.

Roof's end-zone interception return off a tipped pass set up the first of two touchdown runs from Camerun Peoples, who finished with 80 yards on 11 rushes, and Nate Noel contributed 73 yards on 17 carries.
