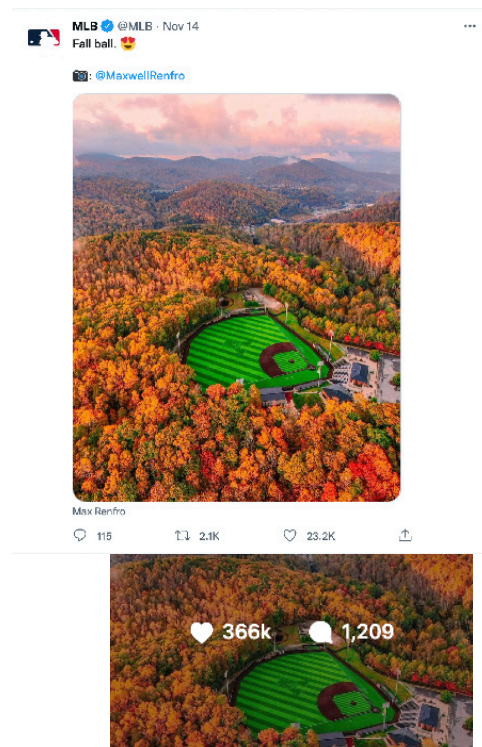

JIM AND BETTIE SMITH STADIUM

A MODERN FIELD OF DREAMS

Located atop of App State's campus off of Bodenheimer Drive, Beaver Field at Jim and Bettie Smith Stadium has been the home of App State Baseball since 2007.

App State is one of the few teams in the country to have a pitching laboratory at its facility. The lab, which opened in the fall of 2023, utilizes state of the art technology to maximize pitching performance and minimize injury risk.

In 2022 the stadium was enhanced with a batters eye in center field, a state of the art video board, and a new adirondack chair seating area on the newly constructed first base terrace.

Before the 2020 season, a new AstroTurf Diamond Series playing surface, a new black wall padding, a fan deck in right-center field and new dugout benches were added, helping Smith Stadium win the Ultimate AstroTurf Fan Favorite D1 honors in August 2021.

Max Renfro's viral drone shot of fall foliage surrounding Smith Stadium

garnered nearly a million combined views and interactions on App State's baseball social platforms alone.

The stadium was also featured on the official MLB social networks and a MLB.com story that declaring "Appalachian State's baseball stadium is paradise."

Before the 2019 season, Adirondack chairs accompanying fire pits down the first-base line were a part of a new viewing area for fans, and the pre-season installation of TrackMan Baseball technology now provides App State's coaches and players with valuable hitting, pitching and other analytics.

Amenities include the Beaver Clubhouse, the Don and Pat Phillips Indoor Hitting and Pitching Facility, chairback seating for 827 fans, fire pits with Adirondack chairs and a Fan Deck with more Adirondack chairs behind the wall in right-center field. On April 16, 2013, a record-setting crowd of 1,116 witnessed the Mountaineers battle Georgia Southern.

PROFESSIONAL SUCCESS



After having his contract selected by the Padres on Sept. 30, 2023, Chandler Seagle entered as a pinch hitter for San Diego in the ninth inning against the Chicago White Sox, making his Major League debut in the penultimate game of the 2023 regular season.

Seagle becomes the eighth player in App State baseball history to make the Major Leagues, joining Don Cardwell, Ron Hodges, John Pychea, Mike Ramsey, Coakler Triplett, Jeffrey Springs and Jaylin Davis. The 27-year-old catcher from New Bern, N.C. was selected by the Padres in the 30th round of the 2017 first year player's draft. He has since played in 287 Minor League games across six seasons in the Padres organization.

After agreeing to a four-year, \$31 million contract extension with the Rays last off-season, Jeffrey Springs was dominant to begin the 2023 season, going 2-0 with a 0.56 ERA in three starts for the Rays. He struck out 24 batters in 16 innings of work. Unfortunately Springs exited his start on April 13, and it was later determined that he had suffered a UCL injury and would need season-ending Tommy John Surgery.

Springs enjoyed a career year on the mound for the Tampa Bay Rays in 2022. The lefty was inserted into the starting rotation for the first time in his career, posting a 9-6 record and a 2.46 ERA in 25 starts. Springs flashed his signature changeup on his way to recording 144 strikeouts in 135.1 innings on the mound, while walking just 31 batters on the year.

Jaylin Davis has played in the Major Leagues in four of the last five seasons, totalling 18 career hits, including two home runs, across 38 MLB games. The outfielder made his MLB debut for the Giants in 2019 before being acquired by the Red Sox in 2022.

Xander Hamilton was drafted by the Minnesota Twins in the 14th round of 2023, becoming the 46th player in App State History to be selected in the First Year Player's Draft.

Hamilton (right) went on to pitch 5.1 scoreless innings with the Single-A Fort. Myers Mighty Mussels, striking out nine batters, while allowing just six baserunners.

Chandler Seagle, who made his MLB debut in September, began the season with the Double-A, San Antonio Missions, before being promoted to Triple-A, El-Paso in August. He played 16 games with the Chihuahuas prior to making his debut.

Jack Hartman pitched for the Single-A Charleston RiverDogs in 2023, after being acquired by the Rays in a trade with the Pirates, who drafted Hartman in 2020. In 43 outings, Hartman went 4-3 with three saves, posting a 3.38 ERA and striking out 61 batters in 63.1 innings of work.



Kaleb Bowman posted a 2.77 ERA for High-A Wisconsin in 2023, earning a promotion to Double-A Biloxi midway through the season. Bowman was signed by the Milwaukee Brewers in 2022 following successful international stints in Germany, Australia and Canada, as well as part of a season playing independent ball in the US in 2022.

2023 YEAR IN REVIEW

App State enjoyed its most successful season in a decade last season, posting 30 wins for the first time since 2013, en route to a Sun Belt Tournament semifinals appearance.

CJ Boyd led the offense batting .364 and tied the App State single-season home run record, belting 17 on the season. Boyd was named a First Team All-Sun Belt selection as well as being named to the All-Sun Belt Tournament Team.

On the mound, Xander Hamilton set the single-season strikeout record with 115 on the campaign, winning eight games for the Black & Gold, and earning First Team All-Sun Belt Honors before being drafted by the Minnesota Twins in the 14th round.

As a team, App State defeated a pair of ranked opponents on the season, beating No. 7/8 Coastal Carolina in Conway on May 5, and later knocking off No. 16 Southern Miss in the Sun Belt tournament on May 27.

App State finished 88th in RPI, the highest mark under Head Coach Kermit Smith, who earned his 600th career win at Georgia Southern on April 14.

KERMIT SMITH
HEAD COACH
8th SEASON AT APP STATE
ALMA MATER: PFEIFFER UNIVERSITY





The 2024 season will be the 8th season at App State for Head Coach Kermit Smith, who was named the 13th coach in program history when he was hired on July 14, 2016.

In the 2023 season, Smith led the Mountaineers to two ranked wins, one against No. 16 Southern Miss, and the eighth ranked Coastal Carolina, where the Mountaineers defeated the Chanticleers 11-0, their highest ranked win since 2013.

In the 2023 season, Smith led the Mountaineers to 30 wins, the most since 2013. In the process, Smith recorded his 600th career win against Georgia Southern, while also moving into third on the App State wins list with 141. The Mountaineers finished with 16 Sun Belt wins, six series wins and three tournament wins, all program records. Both Xander Hamilton and CJ Boyd received 1st Team All-Conference selections, joining the 2015 team as the only teams with multiple 1st team selections. Smith led the Mountaineers to a six win improvement in Sun Belt conference play, the most by any Sun Belt member this season, while also winning multiple games in the post-season for the first time since 2013.

Smith has led the Mountaineers to Sun Belt tournament victories in three consecutive seasons, including an appearance in the quarterfinals in 2022.

In 2022 App State pitching recorded 432 strikeouts, good for third-most in program history, including a ballgame in which they punched out 16 against UNCW to tie a Smith Stadium record. Individually, Infielder Austin St. Laurent was named the Sun Belt freshman of the year, marking the first time an App State baseball player received that distinction. He was also named a Freshman

All-American by Collegiate Baseball. Catcher Hayden Cross was also named second team All-Conference. Under Smith's leadership, the 2022 season was the most attended App State baseball campaign since 2012. Following the 2022 campaign, Smith was selected as an assistant coach with Team USA Baseball's Prospect Development League in Cary, N.C.

In 2021, App State went 11-10 in Sun Belt Conference regular season games to post the sixth-best record in the 12-team league. It was the program's first winning record and best Sun Belt finish since joining the league in 2015. The Mountaineers also earned their first-ever Sun Belt tourney win with a 1-0 victory against Texas State this year, shortly after they closed the regular season with a series win against league champion South Alabama.

In 2021, App State was also recognized with multiple first-team All-Sun Belt picks for the first time, tying for the second-highest total in the league. Three players received All-Sun Belt recognition.

In 2020, Smith led his team to six straight victories and nine victories over the last 10 games (with only a 15-inning loss in that stretch) to close out a season shortened by the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. The Mountaineers finished the 2020 campaign at 11-6, recording series victories over UNCG, Charleston Southern and Siena. Smith also notched his first win over a ranked Power Five opponent when App State defeated No. 24 Wake Forest 11-9 in Winston-Salem. The win was Smith's second victory over a Power Five opponent in as many years.

App State's six-game winning streak to end the season was its longest since 2012. The streak also pushed the Mountaineers to five games over .500 for the first time since 2013.

The Mountaineers, who finished No. 62 in the final RPI poll in 2020, had two hitters that batted over .300 in 2020. Three times in a span of four seasons, App State had a player picked in the top 13 rounds of the MLB Draft, including Jack Hartman's fourth-round selection to the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2020.

In 2019, Smith completed his third season as the head coach of the Mountaineers, who set a program record for Sun Belt Conference victories. App State started 11-9 in league play before finishing 13-16, earning its first Sun Belt Championship tournament appearance and going 22-31 overall. That schedule included canceled road or neutral games against Gardner-Webb, North Carolina Central and Western Carolina.

With two recruiting classes in place — 32 of the 36 players on App State's roster were entering

their first or second years in the program — some season highlights included a road win against Conference USA regular-season champion FAU, a three-game home sweep of then-first-place UTA, a 2-0 home weekend against ULM and a road series victory against Louisiana.

App State boasted three .300 hitters, including a team-best .337 from 2019 freshman Luke Drumheller, and 2019 freshman Tyler Tuthill tied for the team lead with six pitching victories.

The strong start to Sun Belt play followed an 8-7 run to close the league schedule in 2018. App State posted 18 overall victories after winning 19 games in Smith's debut season. A 5-2 victory against eventual NCAA qualifier Troy on April 6, 2018, gave Smith the 500th win as a college head coach, as he left both Division II Lander and Belmont Abbey as the winningest coach in the history of those programs.

With 18 newcomers on the 2018 roster and freshmen batting in the second, third and fourth spots late in the year, App State showed promise in many areas related to pitching, hitting and defense. The team had an ERA of 4.93 (lowest since 2013), totaled 430 strikeouts from its pitching staff (third-best in program history), posted a fielding percentage of .969 (fourth-best in program history) and recorded 93 doubles (most since 2013). Its 7-4 stretch in Sun Belt play (including a road series win against ULM and road series sweep of UTA) was App State's best in four seasons as a league member.

Friday mound starter Colin Schmid was selected in the 13th round of the Major League Baseball Draft by the St. Louis Cardinals, giving App State three junior-year draft picks in Smith's two seasons with the program. Matt Brill was also taken in the first 400 picks in 2017, going in the 12th round to the Arizona Diamondbacks, and Chandler Seagle was drafted by the San Diego Padres.

In Smith's first year, the Mountaineers finished with 19 wins, including a road victory against nationally ranked Louisiana. App State improved in many facets of the game in its first year under Smith, posting the most home runs and drawn walks since 2012.

Before arriving in Boone, Smith went 244-134 in seven seasons at Lander from 2010-16 and 229-225-1 in eight seasons at Belmont Abbey from 2002-09, with nine winning records in his last 10 seasons at the Division II level.

At Lander, he was the winningest coach in program history. He took the Bearcats to three NCAA tournaments over his final five years. With 16 signees overall, Smith had 12 student-athletes sign contracts with MLB affiliates while at Lander, including a program-record four in 2016. Smith was inducted into the Lander Athletics Hall of Fame in December 2021.

The Bearcats advanced to the NCAA Division II College World Series in Cary twice in his last three seasons, including a second time in 2016, finishing with a 44-16 record. The Bearcats ended the season ranked No. 3 in the Collegiate Baseball poll, the highest finish in program history, and Smith was named ABCA/Diamond Southeast Regional Coach of the Year.

Smith helped Lander set a program record for single-season wins in 2014, when the Bearcats finished 52-8 overall and ended the season with a No. 4 ranking in the Collegiate Baseball poll. They had the nation's most prolific offense, leading Division II in home runs and runs scored. The Bearcats won the Southeast Regional and advanced to their first College World Series.

Among the highlights of the 2014 season, the Bearcats finished 27-3 on their home field (Dolny Stadium) and Smith was awarded PBC Coach of the Year and Atlantic Region Coach of the Year. Freshman pitcher Brandon White was named PBC Freshman of the Year.

The Bearcats posted back-to-back 30-win campaigns in 2012 (38 wins) and 2013 (35 wins) for the first time since the 2005-06 seasons. Under Smith in 2012, junior pitcher Chris Thomas won the PBC Pitcher of the Year award, becoming the first Bearcat to ever receive a postseason conference award. In addition, Smith's 38 wins during the 2012 season broke the program record at the time for wins in a season, and he led the team to its first appearance in the NCAA tournament.

In just his second season at the helm of the Bearcats, Smith won 29 games, at the time the most for the program since 2006, and took Lander to the PBC tournament for the first time since the 1998 campaign.

Prior to Smith's tenure at Lander, he spent eight years as Belmont Abbey's head coach and nine seasons overall with the Crusaders, starting with a one-year stint as an assistant during the 2001 season. Much like in his time at Lander, Smith became the winningest coach in program history on March 5, 2008. While at Belmont Abbey, he claimed two Conference Carolinas regular-season championships, a 2009 tournament championship and a 2009 NCAA Division II Southeast Regional Championship that led to an appearance at the 2009 NCAA Division II College World Series.

Smith led the Crusaders to their first World Series berth that year, finishing the season with a 40-26 record. He was named South Atlantic Region Coach of the Year.

Following a trip to the 2008 NCAA Division II South Atlantic Regional, Smith's pupil, second baseman Alex Castellanos, was drafted in the 10th round of the MLB Amateur Draft by the St. Louis Cardinals. Castellanos last appeared in the Major Leagues with the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2013.

Smith served as the chair for the Conference Carolinas coaches while also being the chair for the Belmont Abbey coaches' council. He was an active member of the community and served as the head coach of the Gaston Braves American Legion team from 2002-07, guiding them to a 99-62 record.

Smith graduated from Pfeiffer University in 2000 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in sports management and a Bachelor of Science degree in business administration. He played one season at Pfeiffer for former App State baseball coach and current Duke University coach Chris Pollard. Smith also earned a master's degree in sports management from California University of Pennsylvania in 2007.

He is a native of Arcadia, Fla., and is the son of Sue Ellen and the late George Kilpatrick Smith. Smith and his wife, Rebecca, are the proud parents of two sons, Maddox Kilpatrick and Beckett Thomas, and a daughter, Georgia Grace.

Jim Leggett joined the App State baseball staff in September 2023 as the Director of Baseball Operations – Pitching Performance, and promoted to the program's pitching coach in January 2023.

Once a player and an assistant coach under Kermit Smith, Leggett now reunites with his mentor following nine seasons as a pitching coach at three Division II programs.

Leggett most recently served as the pitching coach at Trevecca Nazarene in Nashville, Tenn., where he helped lead the Trojans to three consecutive 30-win seasons, including a 2021 Division II College World Series berth, followed by a 37-win campaign the following season. In 2023, the Trojans claimed another division title, with two of Leggett's weekend starters earning all-conference recognition with sub-3.00 ERAs.

During his four full seasons at Trevecca Nazarene, Leggett developed 10 all-conference pitchers, including a pair of all-region honorees and one All-American. His 2021 staff boasted a team ERA of 4.30, which led the conference, and ranked as high as eighth nationally during the season.

A native of Rocky Mount, N.C., Leggett was an all-state pitcher and state champion at Rocky Mount High School before beginning his college career in 2009 under Smith at Belmont Abbey, which made it to the Division II College World Series.

Leggett then transferred to Pitt Community College, where he again made a College World Series as a pitcher the following year. Leggett received his associate's degree from Pitt Community College in 2011 and went on to earn his bachelor's degree from East Carolina in 2014.

In 2015, Leggett began his coaching career as a volunteer assistant and pitching coach in Greenwood, S.C., at Lander on a staff with Smith as the head coach and Britt Johnson as an assistant. Leggett helped Lander's pitchers post a 3.98 ERA that led the Peach Belt in 2016 on the way to a College World Series appearance and a program-record third-place finish in the national rankings.

Leggett went on to become a full-time pitching coach at Francis Marion in Florence, S.C., from 2017-18, helping the Patriots to an 18-2 start during the 2017 season, their best start in program history.

Leggett now lives in Banner Elk, N.C., with his wife, Kate.

The 2024 season will be Britt Johnson's eighth with the Mountaineers, following his hire on Aug. 9, 2016.

In 2023, the Mountaineers finished with 30 wins, the most since 2013. While guiding the infielders and defense, Johnson aided the Mountaineers to a .971 fielding percentage, the best since 2021 and 4th all-time. While being a vital part of the recruiting process, newcomers such as CJ Boyd (East Carolina transfer) has 17 home runs, tied for first all-time at App State. Freshman Jackson Steensma also has made his mark, with 7 saves, which is eighth all time.

Under Johnson's tutelage in 2022, infielder Austin St. Laurent was named the Sun Belt Freshman of the Year, becoming the first Mountaineer to earn that distinction. Catcher Hayden Cross was also named second team All-Conference.

Working with App State's infielders and defense, the Mountaineers have posted a team fielding percentage ranking inside the top-15 in program history during all six years of Johnson's tenure. The 2021 team had a fielding percentage of .976, a program record for a full season, after recording a .981 percentage during a 2020 season cut short by the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic after 17 games.

Filling in as the acting head coach in 2019, Johnson helped App State close out road victories against Arkansas State and Coastal Carolina. He also directed App State to a league win over Little Rock in 2018.

Johnson joined Appalachian after spending six years with head coach Kermit Smith at Lander University. He started as a volunteer coach and then was promoted after three years to a full-time assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. Johnson also coached infielders and assisted with hitters while spending time as third-base coach. Johnson was with Smith during Lander's two Division II College World Series trips in 2014 and 2016.

In his time as recruiting coordinator at Lander, it had seven student-athletes drafted in Major League Baseball and two sign free agent deals. He helped bring in six All-Americans and 13 Peach Belt All-Conference selections, including eight infielders. In 2014, Johnson's entire infield was named to the all-conference team.

Prior to Lander, Johnson spent two years as an assistant baseball and football coach at Nash Central High School in Rocky Mount, N.C. He also acted as the strength and conditioning coach for all varsity sports.

He graduated in 2007 from East Carolina University with a bachelor's degree in exercise sports science. While at ECU, Johnson played football as the Pirates' long snapper under head coach Skip Holtz.

Johnson grew up in Rocky Mount, N.C., where he played both baseball and football in high school. He joined the App State family with his wife, Samantha Vickers Johnson.

In late January of 2018, they became parents of twin boys: Cade Royster and Dax Ficklen. Johnson left a 2021 series at East Carolina to join his wife for the birth of their third child and first daughter: Teegan Gail.

Seth McLemore joined the App State Baseball staff as an assistant coach in February 2023.

After joining at the beginning of the 2023 season, offensive-minded McLemore helped lead the Mountaineers to 67 home runs (fourth all-time), 555 hits (ninth all-time), 111 doubles (tenth all-time) and 410 runs scored (seventh all-time), while getting to the 30 win mark for the first time since 2013. McLemore guided CJ Boyd to a 1st Team All-Conference selection, where Boyd finished with 17 home runs (tied first all-time), 54 RBI and 141 total bases.

McLemore was most recently an assistant coach at Milligan University, an NAIA program in Elizabethtown, Tenn. He helped lead the Buffaloes to a 36-21 record, including two victories in the conference tournament. Under his tutelage, a program-record four Milligan players earned all-conference recognition. The 36 wins were the most for the program since 2009.

McLemore arrived at Milligan after a one-year stop at NCAA Division I Murray State. During the 2021 season, the Racers set a program record with 18 OVC wins to secure the second seed in the Ohio Valley Conference tournament. Murray State reached the OVC title game for the first time since 2003 and finished the season with 33 wins, the fifth most in program history.

He spent the 2019 and 2020 seasons as an assistant at Central Methodist University. In 2020, the Eagles were ranked No. 10 in the NAIA Baseball Coaches' Top 25 poll before the season was canceled due to the covid-19 pandemic. In 2019, Central Methodist earned an at-large bid to the NAIA Baseball National Championship Opening Round and finished with a 35-15 record.

McLemore also has experience coaching the Spearfish Sasquatch (Expedition League) and found success as a head coach and general manager in the Beach Collegiate Baseball League.

McLemore played two years at Southwest Tennessee Community College and finished his college career at Central Baptist College in Arkansas. A standout third baseman, McLemore earned all-conference and NCCAA All-America status as a senior at Central Baptist. In 2016, the Mustangs captured the program's first AMC conference title and set a program record with 45 wins.

A native of Pulaski, Tenn., McLemore earned a Bachelor of Science degree in history from Central Baptist.

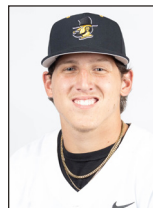

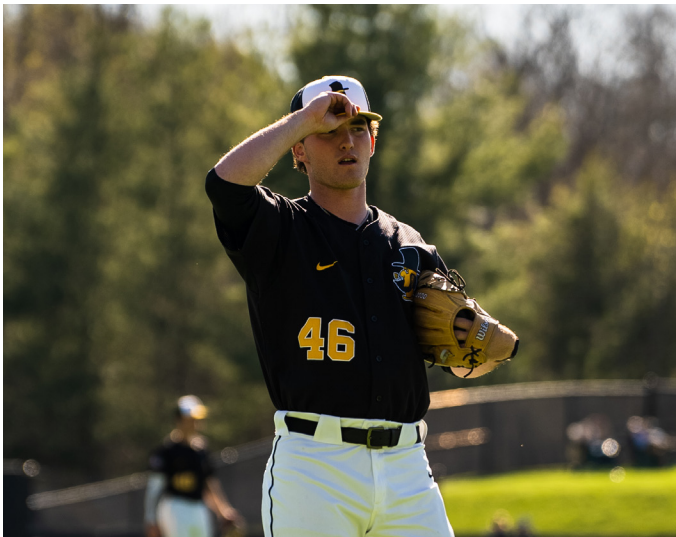
