TOP STORYLINES

- After opening Sun Belt Conference play with a loss at West Division opponent Southern Miss on Sept. 13 and playing the final two games of its nonconference schedule, App State travels to Atlanta to begin a streak of six consecutive Sun Belt games against East Division foes.
- App State's 11-0 record against Georgia State includes a 5-0 record in Atlanta, with a 4-0 mark in the Panthers' current home stadium.
- Head coach **Dowell Loggains'** staff has a combined 93 years of NFL experience, including 16 from Loggains, 27 from associate head coach **Clyde Christensen** and 18 from senior defensive assistant **Bob Sanders**. A two-time Super Bowl champ, Christensen has coached the likes of **Tom Brady, Peyton Manning, Andrew Luck, Marvin Harrison, Jameis Winston** and **Drake Maye**, with Manning and Brady ending the 2006 and 2020 seasons as Super Bowl MVPs.
- App State's final two nonconference games featured a 1,900-mile trip home from Boise State and an Oct. 4 home game against Oregon State, which traveled more than 2,200 miles to Boone. The Mountaineers' 27-23 victory against Oregon State was their first home win against a team from the ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12 or SEC.
- App State led 17-0 after one quarter and 27-21 entering the fourth vs. winless Oregon State, whose first five opponents have a combined record of 23-4. Oregon State's three fourth-quarter drives ended via an end-zone INT on a third-and-goal pass from the 6, a goal line stand with three straight run stops from the 1 following a first-down run from the 3 and finally a last-minute INT that followed a sack on a first-and-10 play from the App State 25. On the second play after the goal line stand, App State fumbled the ball but fell on it in the end zone for a safety and free kick.
- App State ranks second in the Sun Belt in rushing defense (87.0 yards allowed per game, 15th nationally) and second in the Sun Belt in tackles for loss (8.0 per game, T-16th nationally).
- RB **Rashod Dubinion** has rushed for at least 95 yards in every game and ranks 5th nationally with 122.2 rushing yards per game. He's rushed for 111, 194, 95, 113 and 98 yards after having two 100-yard games (both 112) and three games of at least 95 yards at Arkansas from 2022-24.

- QB **JJ Kohl** (Iowa State transfer) and WR **Davion Dozier** (Arkansas transfer) performed well against Oregon State in their first career starts. Starting in place of sidelined **QB AJ Swann** (LSU and Vanderbilt transfer), Kohl threw for 218 yards with one touchdown, rushed for a touchdown and committed no turnovers — he even fell on a teammate's late fumble back into the end zone to make the result a safety instead of an Oregon State touchdown with App State ahead 27-21.

- Sidelined by injury early in the season, WR **Davion Dozier** didn't catch at pass in his App State debut at Boise State, but he had four catches for 140 yards and a touchdown against Oregon State. He had a 28-yard touchdown, and an early 68-yard gain set up an App State touchdown.

STORYLINES (CONTINUED)

- The App State family has been mourning the Sept. 21 passing of **Shawn Clark**, who played for the Mountaineers as an offensive lineman from 1994-98 and coached in Boone from 2016-24, serving as the head coach from the 2019 bowl game through 2024. Clark wore No. 61 during his collegiate career, and the Mountaineers wore helmet stickers with the No. 61 during their Sept. 27 road game. In the first home game since his passing, in addition to the helmet stickers, "61" was painted on the southeast hill of Kidd Brewer Stadium, and the crowd participated in a moment of celebration.
- The Mountaineers' roster has 56 newcomers, including 37 transfers, and five fifth-year players who were App State true freshmen in 2021: LB **Kyle Arnholt**, DB **Jordan Favors**, TE **David Larkins**, OT **Jayden Ramsey** and WR **Dalton Stroman**. Four of those players have started multiple games this season.
- Of App State's 56 newcomers, eight of 11 offensive starters and five of 11 defensive starters in the opener vs. Charlotte were newcomers via the transfer portal, with special teams including a transfer punter and two true freshmen (at kicker and long snapper).
- Those 16 newcomer "starts" were among the 36 players who made their App State debuts in the opener: 27 transfers, six true freshmen, two redshirt freshmen and one redshirt sophomore.
- The Sept. 27 game fell on the one-year anniversary of Hurricane Helene's devastating arrival in western North Carolina. It was the deadliest hurricane to hit the U.S. mainland since Katrina in 2005. App State's first home game after the storm was a 33-26 victory against Georgia State on Oct. 26, 2024.
- Since 2015, when App State became a postseason-eligible FBS member, the Mountaineers rank 10th nationally with 96 wins. The only teams ahead of App State on that list are Alabama, Clemson, Ohio State, Georgia, Oklahoma, Notre Dame, Michigan, Boise State and Penn State.
- After starting his career at Vanderbilt and spending last season at LSU, **AJ Swann** set a record for passing yards in his App State debut by completing 31 of 46 passes for 368 yards, three TDs and no INTs vs. Charlotte. He added two more TDs and 294 yards in the win vs. Lindenwood, then threw for 217 yards before leaving the Southern Miss game with a second-quarter injury. With **JJ Kohl** sidelined, true freshman **Noah Gillon** and senior **Billy Wiles** also saw time at quarterback in relief of Swann at Southern Miss and at Boise State.
- Before quiet games against Boise State and Oregon State, **Dalton Stroman** and **Jaden Barnes** ranked among the FBS receiving leaders for an offense that was averaging 357.7 passing yards per game. Barnes was averaging 8.0 catches (T-No. 4 FBS) and 112.3 yards (No. 5 FBS) per game, while Stroman was averaging 98.3 yards (No. 12 FBS).
- RB **Rashod Dubinion** rushed for 194 yards vs. Lindenwood, posting App State's best individual total since **Camerun Peoples** set a school record with 317 yards in the 2020 Myrtle Beach Bowl.

BOONE, N.C. — A hardened football team reunited with its hungry fan base, eager to entertain a community with a long recovery effort ahead in the aftermath of Hurricane Helene.

A rainbow can be a reminder that storms end, giving way to hope for a brighter future. As a crowd of 33,783 departed Kidd Brewer Stadium following App State's 33-26 win, an actual rainbow appeared above The Rock. Excuse the Mountaineers for maybe being too eager to reconnect with their fans — Shawn Clark accepted blame for the wall-climbing celebration with students on Miller Hill following App State's first Boone touchdown in 37 days — but this was a long time coming.

With App State (3-4, 1-3) seeking its first Sun Belt victory following the back-to-back road losses that had occurred since a Sept. 28 home date with Liberty was canceled because of the storm damage from Helene, the Mountaineers scored a go-ahead touchdown on Joey Aguilar's 4-yard pass to Kanen Hamlett with 1:51 left and then made a defensive stand.

Aguilar passed for 299 yards and three TDs during an interception-free performance



that included seven receptions for 121 yards by Kaedin Robinson. Aguilar threw for 245 yards in the first half, with Robinson going over the century mark before the break. Ahmani Marshall rushing for 115 yards with one score. He accounted for App State's first eight points thanks to an early safety on a blocked punt.

Similar to the first home game following Hurricane Katrina for the New Orleans Saints, who scored an early touchdown on a blocked punt, App State opened its first home game after the storm with a blocked punt that Marshall swatted through the back of the end zone for a safety.

The famous Steve Gleason block for the Saints against a team from Atlanta occurred with 13:30 remaining in the first quarter. Marshall's block gave App State a 2-0 lead with 13:27 remaining in the first quarter.

DOWELL LOGGAINS

A respected play-caller at both the NFL and college levels, Dowell Loggains was named the head coach of App State Football on Dec. 7, 2024.

Hired at the age of 44, Loggains (pronounced LOG-ins) became the 23rd head coach in program history. His five-year contract runs through the 2029 season.

Before serving as South Carolina's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach during the 2023 and 2024 seasons, Loggains was an assistant for two years at his alma mater, Arkansas, after spending 16 years in the NFL. That includes his time as an offensive coordinator or quarterbacks coach for the Tennessee Titans (2010-13), Cleveland Browns (2014), Chicago Bears (2015-17), Miami Dolphins (2018) and New York Jets (2019-20).

Loggains' offense during the 2024 season helped the Gamecocks reach the brink of the College Football Playoff with a 9-3 regular-season record that included wins over Oklahoma, Texas A&M, Missouri and Clemson. South Carolina had the third-best rushing offense in the SEC during the regular season at 188.9 yards per game while ranking top 50 in the country in scoring, yardage, rushing, first downs and completion percentage.

He developed redshirt freshman LaNorris Sellers into one of college football's most dangerous dual-threat quarterbacks. Under Loggains' watch, Sellers threw for 2,274 yards with 17 touchdowns while also rushing for 655 yards and seven scores against one of the country's toughest schedules. He ranked 20th nationally in passing efficiency, 14th in yards per attempt, 25th in yards per completion, 28th in total offense and 35th in completion percentage.

Loggains also found success utilizing Raheim "Rocket" Sanders, one of the SEC's best running backs, to form a dynamic rushing attack.

In his first season in Columbia, Loggains turned future NFL quarterback Spencer Rattler and a future NFL first-round draft pick, wide receiver Xavier Legette, into one of the most lethal pass-and-catch combinations in the country.

Loggains spent the 2021 and 2022 seasons as the Arkansas Razorbacks' tight ends coach, earning a reputation as a top-25 national recruiter there.

During his decade-plus as an NFL coordinator and QBs coach, he mentored the likes of Sam Darnold, Jay Cutler, Mitchell Trubisky, Brian Hoyer and Vince Young at QB, as well as running backs Chris Johnson, Kenyan Drake and Jordan Howard.

Loggains graduated from the University of Arkansas with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology in 2003 and a master's degree in education in 2005. He walked on to the Razorback football program in 2000 as a quarterback and holder before earning a scholarship and becoming a four-year letterman, appearing in 50 games.

Loggains and his wife, Beth, have four children: daughters Reese, Aven and Conner, and son, Ryne.

In Columbia, Rattler set a school record by completing 68.9 percent of his pass attempts for 3,186 yards, the third-highest single-season total in school history. Legette caught 71 passes for 1,255 yards, the second-highest receiving yards mark in the South Carolina record books.

Before returning to his alma mater of Arkansas, Loggains served as the New York Jets' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2019 and 2020. During his first season with the Jets, he guided an offense that was among the league's most proficient on opening drives, scoring 40 first-possession points. Darnold's numbers improved from his rookie campaign, increasing his completion percentage, passing yards, touchdown passes and passer rating while also lowering his interceptions.

Loggains oversaw a Miami offense that averaged 4.68 yards per rush in 2018, the NFL's ninth-best mark. The Dolphins also ranked second in the league with 14 passing touchdowns of 20-plus yards.

Loggains began a three-year stint in Chicago in 2015 as the Bears' quarterbacks coach, where he mentored Cutler to a career season.

He worked as the Cleveland Browns quarterbacks coach in 2014 under offensive coordinator Kyle Shanahan. He helped Hoyer to a career season, as the six-year veteran won seven games (in 13 starts) and threw for over 3,000 yards.

Loggains began his coaching career with Tennessee in 2006 and spent eight seasons with the Titans in a variety of roles, ultimately serving as the offensive coordinator for part of 2012 and all of 2013. He joined the Titans as a coaching administrative assistant (2006-07) and quality control coach (2008-09) before spending the next three seasons as the quarterbacks/passing game coordinator, helping Young achieve a career-high passer rating in 2010 and garner a Pro Bowl appearance.

Loggains' first professional experience came with the Dallas Cowboys as a scouting assistant in 2005.

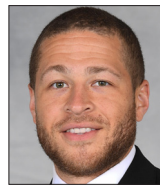

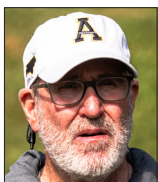

The Mountaineers improved to 2-0 at Bank of America Stadium (both in Duke's Mayo Classic games) and improved to 4-0 all-time against the Charlotte 49ers.
First-time starters for the Mountaineers included QB AJ Swann, RB Rashod Dubinion, WR Jaden Barnes, WR William Fowles, TE Izayah Cummings, LG Shamarr Jackson, C Will Flowers, RG Trent Ramsey, RT Tyriq Poindexter, DT Rondo Porter, DT Dylan Manuel, LB Jaelin Willis, LB Colton Phares, DB Ja'Den McBurrows and DB Emory Floyd.
With Dowell Loggains directing the offense, App State racked up 586 total yards (404 passing, 182 rushing) for its highest yardage output since racking up 629 against Georgia Southern in 2022.
Swann's 368 passing yards rank as the seventh-highest total for a game in App State's FBS history, and his 31 completions are tied for eighth place in App State's single-game records.
Swann and JJ Kohl spread the ball to 10 different receivers on the night.
App State scored on all five of its red-zone chances, went 7-for-15 on third downs and 2-for-2 on fourth downs.
Kevin Abrams-Verwayne was constantly creating havoc in the backfield and was credited with four tackles, half a TFL, two pass breakups and a hurry.
App State's six TFLs came from Zyeir Gamble, McBurrows, Hasz, Brayshaw Littlejohn, Bucci Farmer (half) and Abrams-Verwayne (half).
In his first game, true freshman kicker Dominic De Freitas cashed in both of his field-goal attempts.

Mountaineers Dominate 49ers in Loggains' Debut

CHARLOTTE, N.C. — New starting quarterback AJ Swann completed 31 of 46 passes for 368 yards with three TDs and no interceptions to lead a balanced effort in head coach Dowell Loggains' debut, as App State posted a 34-11 victory on a Friday night in front of 35,718 fans in the Duke's Mayo Classic at Bank of America Stadium.

Jaden Barnes (134 yards on six catches), Kanen Hamlett and true freshman Alex Sanchez caught TD throws from Swann, who set a record for the most passing yards by a quarterback in his App State debut. Dalton Stroman added a career-high eight catches for an offense that totaled 586 yards, including 111 yards and a Wildcat-style touchdown on 22 carries from Rashod Dubinion (142 total yards thanks to five catches).

Defensive coordinator DJ Smith's group limited the 49ers to three points through three quarters and forced two big turnovers, starting with Ja'Den McBurrows' diving interception that followed Barnes' 10-yard touchdown reception and contributed to a 10-point outburst in the final 36 seconds of the first half.

True freshman Dominic De Freitas' 47-yard field goal on his first career attempt extended what was a 7-3 lead late in the half to a 17-3 margin at the break, and he added another field goal before Swann's touchdown pass to Hamlett pushed the advantage to 27-3 in the third quarter.

That score remained the same into the fourth quarter thanks to App State safety Dylan Hasz's forced fumble on a first-and-goal carry from the App State 3, with linebacker Kyle Arnholt scooping up the loose ball.

The Mountaineers held Charlotte to 218 offensive yards, including just 76 rushing yards on 29 attempts. McBurrows and Zyeir Gamble led the defense with six tackles apiece, and Colton Phares contributed five.

Charlotte took its only lead at 3-0 on a 42-yard field goal to close a drive that began at the 49ers' 20 following a touchback on a fumble recovery that occurred when Barnes fumbled right before crossing the end zone for what would have been a 59-yard touchdown. The Mountaineers went ahead for good on Dubinion's 2-yard keeper.

GAME NOTES

App State won its home opener for the third straight year and improved to 71-21-2 all-time in home openers. The only such loss since 2014 was the 63-61 shootout against North Carolina in 2022.

The Mountaineers won for the fourth time at the FBS level when committing four turnovers, a feat last accomplished at ULM in 2023 (41-40 victory). The other games were in 2021 (31-7 vs. South Alabama) and 2015 (34-27 at South Alabama).

App State held a 20-6 lead when it committed its fourth turnover with less than 10 minutes left, and an improbable TD resulted from a hail-mary-style heave on a fourth-and-14 play. The Lions recovered the onside kick with 3:28 left, but Elijah Mc-Cantos picked off another desperate heave on a fourth-and-7 play from the App State 43.

Rashod Dubinion's 25 carries for 194 yards gave him the 10th-best single-game yardage total in App State's FBS era.

Dalton Stroman improved his career total to 11 receptions of at least 40 yards thanks to gains of 72 and 47 yards.

App State's defense was dominant against Lindenwood, holding the Lions to 216 total yards, -1 rushing yards and 3-of-17 on third downs.

The Mountaineers had most recently held an opponent to negative rushing yards in 2001 (-14 vs. West Virginia Tech).

The Mountaineers' eight sacks marked the highest total in the program's FBS era. The last time an App State team racked up eight sacks was in 1997 against Western Carolina.

Colton Phares led all Mountaineer tacklers with a career-high eight.

Dominic De Freitas went 2-for-2 on field goals for the second straight game.

App State Starts Fast, Hangs On In Home Opener

BOONE, N.C. — An exhilarating start and a high-anxiety finish bookended App State's home opener in a sold-out Kidd Brewer Stadium.

In head coach Dowell Loggains' first game at The Rock, before a crowd of 34,921, the Mountaineers used a 20-13 win against FCS program Lindenwood to improve to 2-0 for the first time since 2019.

App State scored a long touchdown on the first play from scrimmage and held a 14-0 lead after one quarter, but four turnovers kept the Lions within striking distance, and a series of wild plays over the last four minutes enabled Lindenwood to have possession in App State territory with a chance to tie the game or even take the lead.

Elijah Mc-Cantos intercepted a fourth-down heave at the App State 16 with less than two minutes left, and one offensive first down sealed a win in which the Mountaineers finished with a 503-216 advantage in total yards, including minus-1 rushing yards from the Lions (0-2).

App State's defense recorded eight sacks — the highest total in the program's FBS era — and 16 TFLs, with Mc-Cantos and DJ Burks (first-quarter INT, plus a forced fumble that Lindenwood recovered) accounting for takeaways. Kevin Abrams-Verwayne, Aiden Benton and Caleb Sandstrom had 1.5 sacks apiece, while Thomas Davis (3.0 TFLs), Dylan Manuel (2.0 TFLs) and Brayshaw Littlejohn had one sack apiece.

Offensively, Dalton Stroman's 72-yard touchdown on the opening play of the game and a 47-yard gain on a near-touchdown a few minutes later were part of a career-high 142 yards on three connections with AJ Swann. Rashod Dubinion's 25 carries for 194 yards gave App State its best individual rushing total in a game since Camerun Peoples set a school record with 317 yards in the 2020 Myrtle Beach Bowl.

App State didn't score a TD over the final 48 minutes, settling for short, second-half field goals of 29 and 24 yards from Dominic De Freitas.

The Mountaineers won for the fourth time at the FBS level when committing four turnovers, a feat last accomplished at ULM in 2023. Those turnovers came in the form of two fumbles in the running game, one interception and, similar to a play early in the Charlotte opener, a fumble moments before the receiver crossed the goal line on a potential touchdown.

App State Drops Sun Belt Opener At Southern Miss

HATTIESBURG, Miss. — App State hit the road for its Sun Belt Conference opener and suffered a 38-22 loss at Southern Miss.

Despite falling behind 24-7, with three first-half interceptions on plays inside the Southern Miss 10, including a 99-yard return for a touchdown, the Mountaineers (2-1, 0-1) pulled within 24-14 when true freshman running back Jaquari Lewis took a handoff from true freshman quarterback Noah Gillon and scored his first touchdown.

Elijah Mc-Cantos recovered an onside kick, but a 49-yard field goal aimed at making it a one-score game sailed wide. Southern Miss then broke the game open by scoring TDs on each of its next two possessions.

AJ Swann completed 15 of 23 passes for 217 yards but was helped off the field after his third INT and didn't return. Gillon, a Mississippi native, completed 11 of 24 passes for 109 yards in his first career game appearance before giving way to former USM QB Billy Wiles.

App State's first-half INTs were on snaps from the USM 4, 4 and 7.

The first miscue — stopping a productive opening drive — was an end-zone pick that followed a low snap from the 4 and a rushed throw. The Mountaineers did take the lead on Dubinion's 2-yard TD run on the next series, but Southern Miss scored the next 24 points.

The Golden Eagles answered App State's score with a TD drive and took the lead on a field goal early in the second quarter. App State quickly marched back down the field, and Swann's third-and-goal pass from the 4 sailed toward an open Dubinion. A lunging Dubinion tried to corral the pass, but as his momentum carried him down to the ground, the ball popped up into the air and into the hands of safety Ian Foster, who had no one near him as he started his 99-yard return.

App State again moved inside the 10 on the next drive. On a third-and-goal pass from a 7, USM picked off a forced pass into the end zone. Swann and OT Jayden Ramsey had to be helped off the field in the aftermath.

Boise State Pulls Away From App State On Blue Turf

BOISE, Idaho — A second-half touchdown drew App State within striking range, but Boise State responded with a dominant stretch of play to pull away in a 47-14 victory at sold-out Albertsons Stadium.

Trailing by 17 early in the third quarter, App State (2-2) forced a Boise State punt and delivered two big plays to pull within 24-14, but the Broncos (3-1) put up 23 more points over the next 15-plus minutes, capping the run with their second pick-six interception return.

Rashod Dubinion totaled 113 yards on 17 carries to lead the App State offense, which committed four turnovers, gave up five sacks and was held to 65 yards passing after averaging 357.7 through the first three games.

Trailing 21-0, with a 26-yard INT return included in that, App State responded with a 14-play, 75-yard touchdown drive that ended with a Dalton Stroman score in the final 80 seconds of the half. Boise State did respond with a quick march into scoring range to kick a field goal.

A big special teams play early in the third quarter produced some short-lived momentum for the Mountaineers.

The Broncos punted toward the front-right pylon, but returner Jaden Barnes drew several defenders his way by acting like he was going to catch the ball on the other half of the field. Juan Berchal, who had run down the field toward the pylon as the play was unfolding, caught the punt and sprinted 45 yards down the sideline.

Dubinion gained a season-long 39 yards on a second-down rush to the Broncos' 3, and Jaquari Lewis scored on the next play.

Boise State answered with a drive that produced a 40-yard field goal for a 27-14 lead and scored three more touchdowns, capped by linebacker Boen Phelps' 33-yard interception return.

App State won a Saturday home game for the 14th straight time.
It was the 13th straight sellout at The Rock. The attendance of 35,021 was the sixth-largest in stadium history.
App State won the turnover battle (3-0), snapping a three-game streak of turning the ball over more than its opponent.
JJ Kohl engineered scoring drives in each of his first three drives as App State's starting quarterback – the first a field goal followed by back-to-back touchdowns.
In his first collegiate start and second App State appearance, Davion Dozier had four catches for 140 yards (35-yard average) and a touchdown. He set up one touchdown with a 68-yard gain and also had a 28-yard touchdown.
App State's defense produced three takeaways (two interceptions, one fumble recovery) and allowed Oregon State to score on only two of five red-zone chances.
For the third time in five games, the Mountaineer defense held its opponent under 100 rushing yards (98).
Colton Phares led the team with a career-high 10 tackles, including 1.5 TFLs, and was instrumental in the defense coming up with a string of huge plays to curb Oregon State's late comeback attempt.
In addition to his late stops near the goal line, Myles Farmer set up an early touchdown by forcing a fumble on a kickoff return. Ronnie Porter recovered the fumble.

App State Stands Up To Late Oregon State Challenges

BOONE, N.C. — No opponent has ever traveled farther to face App State at The Rock. The Mountaineers’ defense made sure Oregon State didn’t go the distance at any point during a dramatic, stifling set of red zone stands in the fourth quarter.

Welcoming a Pac-12 opponent that crossed the continent to play in the High Country, App State built an early lead and never trailed despite being challenged by three late scoring threats from the Beavers in a 27-23 victory with a sold-out crowd filling Kidd Brewer Stadium.

The Mountaineers (3-2) held a 27-21 lead when Colton Phares came down with an end-zone interception on a third-and-goal pass early in the fourth quarter. The Beavers regained possession after a three-and-out punt and had a first down at the App State 3 before being stuffed on four straight runs from Anthony Hankerson. The officials initially ruled a touchdown on the third-and-goal Wildcat carry from the 1 with 1:58 left, but a review showed that Ronnie Porter and Myles Farmer had stopped Hankerson short of the goal line. Hankerson took another direct snap on fourth down, and Farmer tripped him up behind the line before Phares finished off the play for a 2-yard loss.

Disaster nearly struck when the Beavers forced a fumble on a second-down carry. With the ball unclaimed in the end zone, starting quarterback JJ Kohl jumped on it to prevent Oregon State (0-6) from scoring a go-ahead touchdown. Instead, the Mountaineers allowed a safety that still left them with a four-point lead and the ability to execute a free kick from the 20-yard line.

The Beavers moved into scoring range and had a first down at the App State 25 before Rondo Porter’s sack for a 13-yard loss backed up Oregon State with 25 seconds left. Maalik Murphy hit Trent Walker in stride on a crossing route, but Juan Berchal jarred the ball loose by delivering a shoulder-led hit to Walker’s chest. The ball popped into the air, and Gamble bobbled it four times before securing the INT.

Making his first start at QB, Kohl had a hand in two TDs, while Davion Dozier had four catches for 140 yards and one score.
