TOP STORYLINES

- App State returns to The Rock to close the regular season with two straight home games, starting with the 28th matchup between the Mountaineers and Marshall. In addition to Black Saturday and Heroes Day themes, App State's 2005 FCS national championship team will be celebrated.
- Twenty-one of the top 24 crowds in Kidd Brewer Stadium history have occurred since the start of 2022, and all 22 crowds in that span have topped 30,000, with 34,921 for the 2025 home opener against Lindenwood, 35,021 for Oregon State, 33,862 for Coastal Carolina and 31,876 for a Thursday night game against Georgia Southern.
- Twenty-one of the first 27 matchups between App State and Marshall occurred when they were both members of the Southern Conference from 1977-96, and at least one squad was ranked in the FCS top 25 in 11 of the teams' 13 contests from 1985-96. Both teams were nationally ranked eight times in that 13-game stretch.
- The home team won the App State-Marshall game in each of the five previous seasons, including matchups as Sun Belt counterparts in 2022 (at Marshall), 2023 (in Boone) and 2024 (at Marshall).
- Twenty years ago, App State's streak of three consecutive FCS national championships from 2005-07 began with a breakthrough triumph from a 12-3 team that claimed an outright SoCon title before completing a 4-0 postseason run with a 21-16 victory against Northern Iowa on Dec. 16, 2005 in Chattanooga, Tenn. Head coach **Jerry Moore**, now a member of the College Football Hall of Fame, led the Mountaineers to their first title during his 17th season in Boone.
- The Mountaineers reached their first national title game thanks to a 29-23 home victory in a semifinal showdown with Furman, which had handed App State its only regular season loss against FCS competition (in addition to losses against FBS programs LSU and Kansas). Six days later, App State trailed 16-7 at halftime vs. Northern Iowa in the national title game before rallying to win with assists from the inspiring return of hobbled QB **Richie Williams** and **Jason Hunter's** 15-yard, go-ahead fumble return for a touchdown off **Marques Murrell's** strip sack.
- App State's 2025 roster has 55 newcomers, including 35 transfers, and 24 newcomers have started at least one game this season (counting specialists). There are five fifth-year players on the roster who were App State true freshmen in 2021: LB **Kyle Arnholt**, DB **Jordan Favors**, TE **David Larkins**, OT **Jayden Ramsey** and WR **Dalton Stroman**.
- App State LB **Colton Phares**, who moved from safety to linebacker midway through the 2024 season and has gained 40 pounds since enrolling, is one of only two FBS players this year with at least 70 tackles, 9.0 TFLs and 2 INTs. The other is Texas Tech LB **Jacob Rodriguez**.
- With 12 pass breakups this season, CB **Ethan Johnson** is tied for No. 3 nationally behind only Cal's **Brent Austin** and Colorado State's **Lemondre Joe**, who each have 13. Johnson has one interception and 26 PBUs in 44 career games (including 36 starts).
- Jeff Crosby's** special teams units have performed well and had several trick plays, including an onside kick at Southern Miss, **Juan Berchal's** deceptive 45-yard return of a Boise State punt, Berchal's 22-yard run on a fake punt vs. Coastal and **Ian Ratliff's** 23-yard pass to **Colton Phares** on a fake punt at ODU. Phares was a two-way HS standout who also excelled as a returner and kicked FGs.

STORYLINES (CONTINUED)

- Head coach **Dowell Loggains**' staff has a combined 93 years of NFL experience, including 16 from Loggains, 27 from associate head coach **Clyde Christensen** and 18 from senior defensive assistant **Bob Sanders**. A two-time Super Bowl champ, Christensen has coached the likes of **Tom Brady**, **Peyton Manning**, **Andrew Luck**, **Marvin Harrison**, **Jameis Winston** and **Drake Maye**, with Manning and Brady ending the 2006 and 2020 seasons as Super Bowl MVPs.
- The App State family has been mourning the Sept. 21 passing of West Virginia native **Shawn Clark**, who played for the Mountaineers as an offensive lineman from 1994-98 and coached in Boone from 2016-24, serving as the head coach from the 2019 bowl game through 2024. Clark wore No. 61 during his collegiate career, and the Mountaineers are wearing helmet stickers with the No. 61. Also, "61" is painted on the southeast hill of Kidd Brewer Stadium.
- Since 2015, when App State became a postseason-eligible FBS member, the Mountaineers are tied for 11th nationally with 97 wins. The only teams ahead of App State on that list are Alabama, Ohio State, Georgia, Clemson, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, Michigan, Boise State, Oregon and Penn State.
- In his first three starts, QB **JJ Kohl** (Iowa State transfer) threw 7 TD passes, rushed for a TD and had no INTs against Oregon State, Georgia State and Coastal Carolina. The 6-foot-7 Kohl, who joined Georgia State's **TJ Finley** as the tallest FBS QBs to start this season, entered the JMU game in the fourth quarter and directed a touchdown drive.
- After starting his career at Vanderbilt and spending last season at LSU, **AJ Swann** set a record for passing yards in his App State debut by completing 31 of 46 passes for 368 yards, 3 TDs and no INTs vs. Charlotte. After starting the first four games, he returned to that role against Georgia Southern and completed 34 of 51 passes for 348 yards and 2 TDs. Swann started again at James Madison last weekend but left that game with a lower-body injury.
- WR/PR **Jaden Barnes** ranks No. 2 in the Sun Belt among non-QBs or RBs with 8 TDs this year. He has 7 TD catches, and his 77-yard punt return for a touchdown against Coastal Carolina was App State's first punt return for a score since **Clifton Duck** had one vs. Gardner-Webb in 2018.
- Arkansas alum **Dowell Loggains** was a Razorbacks assistant from 2021-22, and two Arkansas transfers have been offensive standouts for App State: WR **Davion Dozier** (recruited by Loggains before spending 2023-24 at Arkansas) and RB **Rashod Dubinion** (at Arkansas from 2022-24). After briefly playing in his App State debut at Boise State, Dozier caught a TD pass in the next four games (including his first three starts) and now has five receiving TDs. Dubinion rushed for at least 95 yards in each of the first five games and was the nation's No. 5 rusher through six games.
- App State Athletics' 2025 Hall of Fame Class included three football alums: defensive coordinator **DJ Smith** (LB, 2007-10), **Dexter Jackson** and **Pete Camelo**. Smith earned All-America recognition three times and was a four-time All-SoCon honoree while helping App State win four league titles.

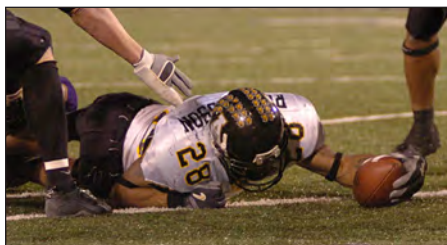

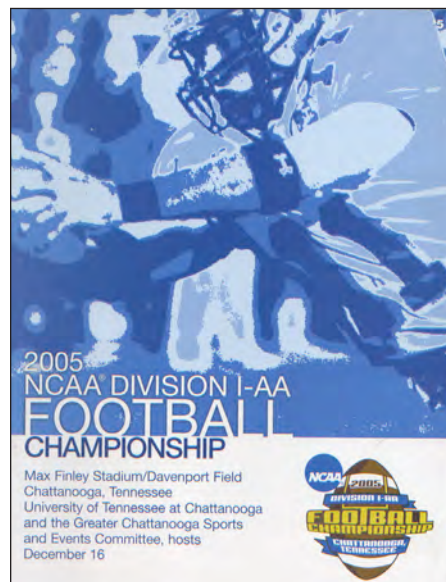

Longtime football rivals App State and Marshall renewed their series with nonconference games 2020 and 2021, then became Sun Belt counterparts in 2022.

Twenty-one of their 27 matchups to date occurred when the Mountaineers and Thundering Herd were both members of the Southern Conference from 1977-96. The 2023 game was App State's first conference home game against the Thundering Herd since 1996.

In 11 of the teams' 13 contests from 1985-96, at least one squad was ranked in the FCS top 25. Both teams were nationally ranked eight times in that 13-game stretch.

Arguably, the most memorable games in the series were played in 1994 and 1995.

Marshall was the top-ranked Division I-AA team in 1994 when No. 24 App State secured a 24-14 upset. The next year, the No. 2 Mountaineers went on the road to defeat the No. 3 Thundering Herd 10-3 during App State's perfect 11-0 regular season.

1994: #24 APP STATE 24, #1 MARSHALL 14

On Oct. 22, 1994, App State upset top-ranked Marshall during a steady downpour at Kidd Brewer Stadium. College Football Hall of Famer Dexter Coakley led a dominant defensive performance with 15 tackles.

Former App State head coach Scott Satterfield, making only the second start of his career at quarterback, threw for 113 yards and rushed for 30 yards and a touchdown to pace the offense in the Mountaineers' first-ever win over a No. 1 team.

1995: #2 APP STATE 10, #3 MARSHALL 3

On Oct. 21, 1995, the teams squared off at what was then known as Marshall Stadium in Huntington, and Satterfield's 5-yard touch-down run with 4:18 to go lifted App State.

Once again, Coakley was the game's most dominant performer with 21 tackles, two tackles for loss, two quarterback hurries, three

pass breakups and a forced fumble. Mark Ivey chipped in with five tackles, a tackle for loss, a sack, three QB hurries and a pass breakup.

That was the seventh game during an 11-0 regular season for App State, which won its first playoff game before losing to No. 5 Stephen F. Austin.

2021: APP STATE 31, MARSHALL 30

Chandler Staton hit a go-ahead field goal from 45 yards out with 5:45 left, and Nate Noel's open-field running clinched the win in front of 28,377 fans on a Thursday in Boone.

The Mountaineers climbed out of a nine-point hole in the win. Noel had gains of 11, 14, 41 and 22 yards on the final drive, smartly going down short of the end zone in the final two minutes to prevent Marshall from possibly regaining possession with an eight-point deficit.

2023: APP STATE 31, MARSHALL 9

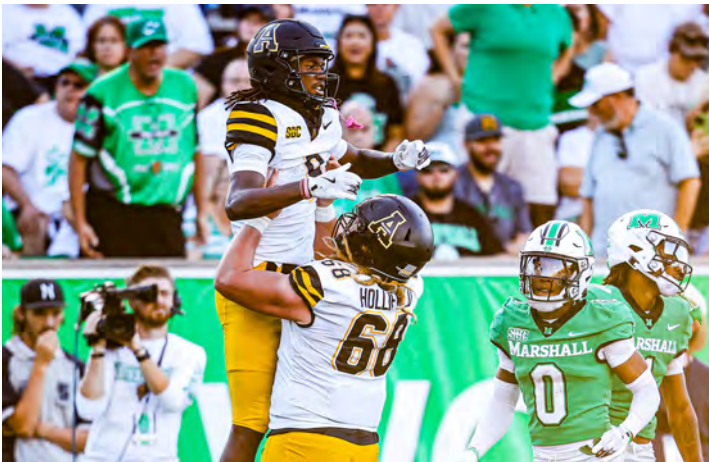
The Mountaineers held a 28-3 lead midway through the third quarter thanks to three TD passes from Joey Aguilar, with the first App State TDs by receivers Michael Hetzel (16 yards) and Makai Jackson (29 yards) following a 24-yard scoring reception from Kaedin Robinson.

The Mountaineers' defense intercepted three passes and recorded three sacks.

It was App State's third-largest margin of victory in the series and the largest since a 40-0 win in 1985.

App State outgained Marshall in total yards, 473-365, and in first downs, 32-21. But the Mountaineers committed 15 penalties for 158 yards and lost the turnover battle, 2-0. The penalties and penalty yards were both third-most in a single game in school history.

Marshall's 52 points were the most allowed by App State to a Sun Belt foe since a 52-45 loss at ULM in 2017.

App State's losing streak at Marshall extended to four straight. The home team has won six straight contests in the series dating back to 2002.

The Mountaineers' opponent scored a touchdown on its first series for the fourth straight game.

App State fell to 0-2 in Sun Belt play for the first time since 2014, its first year in the league. That season, the Mountaineers went on to win their final six league games.

There were a lot of bright spots for App State's offense, including season highs in rushing yards (180), first downs (32), rushing touchdowns (three - tied) and passing touchdowns (two - tied). The offense was 6-for-6 on fourth-down conversions and 4-for-4 scoring in the red zone.

Joey Aguilar completed 26 of 44 passes for 293 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions, while rushing 10 times for a team-high 55 yards. He has either thrown or rushed for a touchdown in 17 of 19 games as App State's quarterback, including in 13 straight regular-season contests.

On his first career attempt, redshirt freshman kicker Jackson Moore nailed a 42-yard field goal for App State's first score of the contest. Moore was filling in for injured starter Michael Hughes. Moore finished the game 1-for-2 on field goals and 4-for-4 on PATs, while Cash McVay also kicked off once.

App State Falls At Marshall In Return To Competition

HUNTINGTON, W.Va. — Playing for the first time in 16 days, and just a little more than a week removed from the devastating arrival of Hurricane Helene in western North Carolina, App State lost 52-37 at Marshall.

Days of rains in advance of Helene's arrival, coupled with the storm's wide-ranging impact, led to the cancelation of a Sept. 28 home game against Liberty. With the long recovery process starting for many in Boone, Watauga County, the western part of the state and several surrounding states, the Mountaineers hit the road for Huntington on Friday. Several coaches wore "Mountain Strong" shirts during the game.

Joey Aguilar threw two touchdown passes to Dalton Stroman, and Ahmani Marshall had a pair of 2-yard touchdown runs in the final seven minutes. The offense went 6-for-6 on fourth-down conversions, but the Mountaineers committed 15 penalties for 158 yards.

App State (2-3, 0-2 Sun Belt) won the toss and elected to receive, but a three-and-out punt preceded an opening series touchdown drive from Marshall (3-2, 1-0 Sun Belt) — the fourth straight game an opponent had scored a touchdown on its first series.

The Mountaineers took a 10-7 lead thanks to a 42-yard field goal on the first career attempt from Jackson Moore, a redshirt freshman filling in for the sidelined Michael Hughes, and a 10-yard touchdown run from Kanye Roberts to open the second quarter.

Marshall regained the lead for good as back Jordan Houston scored a 75-yard touchdown after catching a short swing pass on the second play of the next series, and the Thundering Herd scored again 12 seconds later when a bobbled swing pass on the first play of the next possession resulted in a 13-yard interception return for a touchdown.

APP STATE RECORD AT KIDD BREWER STADIUM SINCE 2003: 125-24

Kidd Brewer Stadium stakes claim to being one of the toughest but also most picturesque college football venues in the nation.

After “The Rock” was voted the top Group of Five stadium in the country by CFB Campus Tour in 2023 and 2024, ESPN named Kidd Brewer Stadium one of the top 25 stadiums in all of college football, and The Athletic did the same this year.

In the 64th season in the venue, which opened as Conrad Stadium on Sept. 15, 1962, App State has a 279-83-5 all-time record at The Rock.

The top four single-season average home attendance marks in App State and Sun Belt Conference history have been those reached by Mountaineer fans at The Rock in 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024.

App State set single-season school and Sun Belt records with an average home crowd of 34,734 in 2023.

With a \$50 million north end zone facility, removal of the track and installation of new turf, The Rock had a new look in 2021, as the end zone facility opened for fans before a 2020 game vs. Georgia State. Hall of Fame coach Jerry Moore was also honored before the 2021 opener with a plaza and statue in his name.

Kidd Brewer Stadium’s official seating capacity was 16,650 in 2007, but several expansion projects have almost doubled the capacity.

DOWELL LOGGAINS

A respected play-caller at both the NFL and college levels, Dowell Loggains was named the head coach of App State Football on Dec. 7, 2024.

Hired at the age of 44, Loggains (pronounced LOG-ins) became the 23rd head coach in program history. His five-year contract runs through the 2029 season.

Before serving as South Carolina's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach during the 2023 and 2024 seasons, Loggains was an assistant for two years at his alma mater, Arkansas, after spending 16 years in the NFL. That includes his time as an offensive coordinator or quarterbacks coach for the Tennessee Titans (2010-13), Cleveland Browns (2014), Chicago Bears (2015-17), Miami Dolphins (2018) and New York Jets (2019-20).

Loggains' offense during the 2024 season helped the Gamecocks reach the brink of the College Football Playoff with a 9-3 regular-season record that included wins over Oklahoma, Texas A&M, Missouri and Clemson. South Carolina had the third-best rushing offense in the SEC during the regular season at 188.9 yards per game while ranking top 50 in the country in scoring, yardage, rushing, first downs and completion percentage.

He developed redshirt freshman LaNorris Sellers into one of college football's most dangerous dual-threat quarterbacks. Under Loggains' watch, Sellers threw for 2,274 yards with 17 touchdowns while also rushing for 655 yards and seven scores against one of the country's toughest schedules. He ranked 20th nationally in passing efficiency, 14th in yards per attempt, 25th in yards per completion, 28th in total offense and 35th in completion percentage.

Loggains also found success utilizing Raheim "Rocket" Sanders, one of the SEC's best running backs, to form a dynamic rushing attack.

In his first season in Columbia, Loggains turned future NFL quarterback Spencer Rattler and a future NFL first-round draft pick, wide receiver Xavier Legette, into one of the most lethal pass-and-catch combinations in the country.

Loggains spent the 2021 and 2022 seasons as the Arkansas Razorbacks' tight ends coach, earning a reputation as a top-25 national recruiter there.

During his decade-plus as an NFL coordinator and QBs coach, he mentored the likes of Sam Darnold, Jay Cutler, Mitchell Trubisky, Brian Hoyer and Vince Young at QB, as well as running backs Chris Johnson, Kenyan Drake and Jordan Howard.

Loggains graduated from the University of Arkansas with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology in 2003 and a master's degree in education in 2005. He walked on to the Razorback football program in 2000 as a quarterback and holder before earning a scholarship and becoming a four-year letterman, appearing in 50 games.

Loggains and his wife, Beth, have four children: daughters Reese, Aven and Conner, and son, Ryne.

In Columbia, Rattler set a school record by completing 68.9 percent of his pass attempts for 3,186 yards, the third-highest single-season total in school history. Legette caught 71 passes for 1,255 yards, the second-highest receiving yards mark in the South Carolina record books.

Before returning to his alma mater of Arkansas, Loggains served as the New York Jets' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2019 and 2020. During his first season with the Jets, he guided an offense that was among the league's most proficient on opening drives, scoring 40 first-possession points. Darnold's numbers improved from his rookie campaign, increasing his completion percentage, passing yards, touchdown passes and passer rating while also lowering his interceptions.

Loggains oversaw a Miami offense that averaged 4.68 yards per rush in 2018, the NFL's ninth-best mark. The Dolphins also ranked second in the league with 14 passing touchdowns of 20-plus yards.

Loggains began a three-year stint in Chicago in 2015 as the Bears' quarterbacks coach, where he mentored Cutler to a career season.

He worked as the Cleveland Browns quarterbacks coach in 2014 under offensive coordinator Kyle Shanahan. He helped Hoyer to a career season, as the six-year veteran won seven games (in 13 starts) and threw for over 3,000 yards.

Loggains began his coaching career with Tennessee in 2006 and spent eight seasons with the Titans in a variety of roles, ultimately serving as the offensive coordinator for part of 2012 and all of 2013. He joined the Titans as a coaching administrative assistant (2006-07) and quality control coach (2008-09) before spending the next three seasons as the quarterbacks/passing game coordinator, helping Young achieve a career-high passer rating in 2010 and garner a Pro Bowl appearance.

Loggains' first professional experience came with the Dallas Cowboys as a scouting assistant in 2005.

App State won its season opener for the sixth time in the last seven years to move to 53-39-3 all-time in season openers.
The Mountaineers improved to 2-0 at Bank of America Stadium (both in Duke's Mayo Classic games) and improved to 4-0 all-time against the Charlotte 49ers.
First-time starters for the Mountaineers included QB AJ Swann, RB Rashod Dubinion, WR Jaden Barnes, WR William Fowles, TE Izayah Cummings, LG Shamarr Jackson, C Will Flowers, RG Trent Ramsey, RT Tyriq Poindexter, DT Rondo Porter, DT Dylan Manuel, LB Jaelin Willis, LB Colton Phares, DB Ja'Den McBurrows and DB Emory Floyd.
With Dowell Loggains directing the offense, App State racked up 586 total yards (404 passing, 182 rushing) for its highest yardage output since racking up 629 against Georgia Southern in 2022.
Swann's 368 passing yards rank as the seventh-highest total for a game in App State's FBS history, and his 31 completions are tied for eighth place in App State's single-game records.
Swann and JJ Kohl spread the ball to 10 different receivers on the night.
App State scored on all five of its red-zone chances, went 7-for-15 on third downs and 2-for-2 on fourth downs.
Kevin Abrams-Verwayne was constantly creating havoc in the backfield and was credited with four tackles, half a TFL, two pass breakups and a hurry.
App State's six TFLs came from Zyeir Gamble, McBurrows, Hasz, Brayshaw Littlejohn, Bucci Farmer (half) and Abrams-Verwayne (half).
In his first game, true freshman kicker Dominic De Freitas cashed in both of his field-goal attempts.

Mountaineers Dominate 49ers in Loggains' Debut

CHARLOTTE, N.C. — New starting quarterback AJ Swann completed 31 of 46 passes for 368 yards with three TDs and no interceptions to lead a balanced effort in head coach Dowell Loggains' debut, as App State posted a 34-11 victory on a Friday night in front of 35,718 fans in the Duke's Mayo Classic at Bank of America Stadium.

Jaden Barnes (134 yards on six catches), Kanen Hamlett and true freshman Alex Sanchez caught TD throws from Swann, who set a record for the most passing yards by a quarterback in his App State debut. Dalton Stroman added a career-high eight catches for an offense that totaled 586 yards, including 111 yards and a Wildcat-style touchdown on 22 carries from Rashod Dubinion (142 total yards thanks to five catches).

Defensive coordinator DJ Smith's group limited the 49ers to three points through three quarters and forced two big turnovers, starting with Ja'Den McBurrows' diving interception that followed Barnes' 10-yard touchdown reception and contributed to a 10-point outburst in the final 36 seconds of the first half.

True freshman Dominic De Freitas' 47-yard field goal on his first career attempt extended what was a 7-3 lead late in the half to a 17-3 margin at the break, and he added another field goal before Swann's touchdown pass to Hamlett pushed the advantage to 27-3 in the third quarter.

That score remained the same into the fourth quarter thanks to App State safety Dylan Hasz's forced fumble on a first-and-goal carry from the App State 3, with linebacker Kyle Arnholt scooping up the loose ball.

The Mountaineers held Charlotte to 218 offensive yards, including just 76 rushing yards on 29 attempts. McBurrows and Zyeir Gamble led the defense with six tackles apiece, and Colton Phares contributed five.

Charlotte took its only lead at 3-0 on a 42-yard field goal to close a drive that began at the 49ers' 20 following a touchback on a fumble recovery that occurred when Barnes fumbled right before crossing the end zone for what would have been a 59-yard touchdown. The Mountaineers went ahead for good on Dubinion's 2-yard keeper.

GAME NOTES

App State won its home opener for the third straight year and improved to 71-21-2 all-time in home openers. The only such loss since 2014 was the 63-61 shootout against North Carolina in 2022.

The Mountaineers won for the fourth time at the FBS level when committing four turnovers, a feat last accomplished at ULM in 2023 (41-40 victory). The other games were in 2021 (31-7 vs. South Alabama) and 2015 (34-27 at South Alabama).

App State held a 20-6 lead when it committed its fourth turnover with less than 10 minutes left, and an improbable TD resulted from a hail-mary-style heave on a fourth-and-14 play. The Lions recovered the onside kick with 3:28 left, but Elijah Mc-Cantos picked off another desperate heave on a fourth-and-7 play from the App State 43.

Rashod Dubinion's 25 carries for 194 yards gave him the 10th-best single-game yardage total in App State's FBS era.

Dalton Stroman improved his career total to 11 receptions of at least 40 yards thanks to gains of 72 and 47 yards.

App State's defense was dominant against Lindenwood, holding the Lions to 216 total yards, -1 rushing yards and 3-of-17 on third downs.

The Mountaineers had most recently held an opponent to negative rushing yards in 2001 (-14 vs. West Virginia Tech).

The Mountaineers' eight sacks marked the highest total in the program's FBS era. The last time an App State team racked up eight sacks was in 1997 against Western Carolina.

Colton Phares led all Mountaineer tacklers with a career-high eight.

Dominic De Freitas went 2-for-2 on field goals for the second straight game.

App State Starts Fast, Hangs On In Home Opener

BOONE, N.C. — An exhilarating start and a high-anxiety finish bookended App State's home opener in a sold-out Kidd Brewer Stadium. In head coach Dowell Loggains' first game at The Rock, before a crowd of 34,921, the Mountaineers used a 20-13 win against FCS program Lindenwood to improve to 2-0 for the first time since 2019.

App State scored a long touchdown on the first play from scrimmage and held a 14-0 lead after one quarter, but four turnovers kept the Lions within striking distance, and a series of wild plays over the last four minutes enabled Lindenwood to have possession in App State territory with a chance to tie the game or even take the lead.

Elijah Mc-Cantos intercepted a fourth-down heave at the App State 16 with less than two minutes left, and one offensive first down sealed a win in which the Mountaineers finished with a 503-216 advantage in total yards, including minus-1 rushing yards from the Lions (0-2).

App State's defense recorded eight sacks — the highest total in the program's FBS era — and 16 TFLs, with Mc-Cantos and DJ Burks (first-quarter INT, plus a forced fumble that Lindenwood recovered) accounting for takeaways. Kevin Abrams-Verwayne, Aiden Benton and Caleb Sandstrom had 1.5 sacks apiece, while Thomas Davis (3.0 TFLs), Dylan Manuel (2.0 TFLs) and Brayshaw Littlejohn had one sack apiece.

Offensively, Dalton Stroman's 72-yard touchdown on the opening play of the game and a 47-yard gain on a near-touchdown a few minutes later were part of a career-high 142 yards on three connections with AJ Swann. Rashod Dubinion's 25 carries for 194 yards gave App State its best individual rushing total in a game since Camerun Peoples set a school record with 317 yards in the 2020 Myrtle Beach Bowl.

App State didn't score a TD over the final 48 minutes, settling for short, second-half field goals of 29 and 24 yards from Dominic De Freitas.

The Mountaineers won for the fourth time at the FBS level when committing four turnovers, a feat last accomplished at ULM in 2023. Those turnovers came in the form of two fumbles in the running game, one interception and, similar to a play early in the Charlotte opener, a fumble moments before the receiver crossed the goal line on a potential touchdown.

App State Drops Sun Belt Opener At Southern Miss

HATTIESBURG, Miss. — App State hit the road for its Sun Belt Conference opener and suffered a 38-22 loss at Southern Miss.

Despite falling behind 24-7, with three first-half interceptions on plays inside the Southern Miss 10, including a 99-yard return for a touchdown, the Mountaineers (2-1, 0-1) pulled within 24-14 when true freshman running back Jaquari Lewis took a handoff from true freshman quarterback Noah Gillon and scored his first touchdown.

Elijah Mc-Cantos recovered an onside kick, but a 49-yard field goal aimed at making it a one-score game sailed wide. Southern Miss then broke the game open by scoring TDs on each of its next two possessions.

AJ Swann completed 15 of 23 passes for 217 yards but was helped off the field after his third INT and didn't return. Gillon, a Mississippi native, completed 11 of 24 passes for 109 yards in his first career game appearance before giving way to former USM QB Billy Wiles.

App State's first-half INTs were on snaps from the USM 4, 4 and 7.

The first miscue — stopping a productive opening drive — was an end-zone pick that followed a low snap from the 4 and a rushed throw. The Mountaineers did take the lead on Dubinion's 2-yard TD run on the next series, but Southern Miss scored the next 24 points.

The Golden Eagles answered App State's score with a TD drive and took the lead on a field goal early in the second quarter. App State quickly marched back down the field, and Swann's third-and-goal pass from the 4 sailed toward an open Dubinion. A lunging Dubinion tried to corral the pass, but as his momentum carried him down to the ground, the ball popped up into the air and into the hands of safety Ian Foster, who had no one near him as he started his 99-yard return.

App State again moved inside the 10 on the next drive. On a third-and-goal pass from a 7, USM picked off a forced pass into the end zone. Swann and OT Jayden Ramsey had to be helped off the field in the aftermath.

App State lost the turnover battle (4-0) for the third straight game.
The Mountaineers committed three turnovers in the fourth quarter, when AJ Swann, Noah Gillon and Billy Wiles all took snaps at quarterback.
Wide receivers Jaden Barnes and Dalton Stroman entered the game averaging a combined 13 catches for 210.7 yards per contest, but the only successful connection was Stroman's TD catch in the second-quarter. Izayah Cummings led App State with 20 receiving yards.
Defensive linemen DeNigel Cooper and Caleb Sandstrom made their first starts as Mountaineers.
Among AJ Swann's 11 completions was a 2-yard pass to himself after a Boise State defensive lineman batted the ball in the air.
Jose Leon snagged his first three career catches in his collegiate debut.
The Mountaineer defense made nine tackles for loss, including 2.5 by Joseph Bakhole and one each by Emory Floyd, Brayshaw Littlejohn, Jordan Favors and Kevin Abrams-Verwayne. Bakhole and Abrams-Verwayne produced the team's two sacks in the game.
Jaelin Willis led the team with 10 tackles, his most as a Mountaineer.
Ian Ratliff punted seven times for a 47.4-yard average, including two punts of 50+ yards. Boise State returned only one of them for no gain.
In a game that featured two of the country's best teams over the last decade, Boise State earned its 97th win during that span, while App State remained at 95 wins.

Boise State Pulls Away From App State On Blue Turf

BOISE, Idaho — A second-half touchdown drew App State within striking range, but Boise State responded with a dominant stretch of play to pull away in a 47-14 victory at sold-out Albertsons Stadium.

Trailing by 17 early in the third quarter, App State (2-2) forced a Boise State punt and delivered two big plays to pull within 24-14, but the Broncos (3-1) put up 23 more points over the next 15-plus minutes, capping the run with their second pick-six interception return.

Rashod Dubinion totaled 113 yards on 17 carries to lead the App State offense, which committed four turnovers, gave up five sacks and was held to 65 yards passing after averaging 357.7 through the first three games.

Trailing 21-0, with a 26-yard INT return included in that, App State responded with a 14-play, 75-yard touchdown drive that ended with a Dalton Stroman score in the final 80 seconds of the half. Boise State did respond with a quick march into scoring range to kick a field goal.

A big special teams play early in the third quarter produced some short-lived momentum for the Mountaineers.

The Broncos punted toward the front-right pylon, but returner Jaden Barnes drew several defenders his way by acting like he was going to catch the ball on the other half of the field. Juan Berchal, who had run down the field toward the pylon as the play was unfolding, caught the punt and sprinted 45 yards down the sideline.

Dubinion gained a season-long 39 yards on a second-down rush to the Broncos' 3, and Jaquari Lewis scored on the next play.

Boise State answered with a drive that produced a 40-yard field goal for a 27-14 lead and scored three more touchdowns, capped by linebacker Boen Phelps' 33-yard interception return.

In addition to his late stops near the goal line, Myles Farmer set up an early touchdown by forcing a fumble on a kickoff return. Ronnie Porter recovered the fumble.

App State Stands Up To Late Oregon State Challenges

BOONE, N.C. — No opponent has ever traveled farther to face App State at The Rock. The Mountaineers' defense made sure Oregon State didn't go the distance at any point during a dramatic, stifling set of red zone stands in the fourth quarter.

App State built an early lead and never trailed despite being challenged by three late scoring threats from the Beavers in a 27-23 victory in a sold-out crowd filling Kidd Brewer Stadium. It was the Mountaineers' first-ever home victory against a team from the ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12 or SEC.

The Beavers traveled more than 2,200 miles to Boone, only to repeatedly be stopped a yard short.

The Mountaineers (3-2) held a 27-21 lead when Colton Phares came down with an end-zone interception on a third-and-goal pass early in the fourth quarter. The Beavers regained possession after a three-and-out punt and had a first down at the App State 3 before being stuffed on four straight runs from Anthony Hankerson. The officials initially ruled a touchdown on the third-and-goal Wildcat carry from the 1 with 1:58 left, but a review showed that Ronnie Porter and Myles Farmer had stopped Hankerson short of the goal line. Hankerson took another direct snap on fourth down, and Farmer tripped him up behind the line before Phares finished off the play for a 2-yard loss. Disaster nearly struck when the Beavers forced a fumble on a second-down carry. With the ball unclaimed in the end zone, first-time starting quarterback JJ Kohl jumped on it to prevent Oregon State (0-6) from scoring a go-ahead touchdown. Instead, the Mountaineers allowed a safety that still left them with a four-point lead and the ability to execute a free kick from the 20-yard line.

The Beavers moved into scoring range and had a first down at the App State 25 before Rondo Porter's sack for a 13-yard loss backed up Oregon State with 25 seconds left. Maalik Murphy hit Trent Walker in stride on a crossing route, but Juan Berchal jarred the ball loose by delivering a shoulder-led hit to Walker's chest. The ball popped into the air, and Zyeir Gamble bobbled it four times before securing the INT.

App State Rolls To Lopsided Victory At Georgia State

ATLANTA, Ga. — A complete team effort propelled App State to a dominant road win in its first game against a Sun Belt East opponent.

The Mountaineers posted a 41-20 victory at Center Parc Credit Union Stadium, building a 31-0 lead and improving their series record against Georgia State to 12-0. App State (4-2, 1-1 SBC) evened its league record after not winning a Sun Belt road game last season.

JJ Kohl needed to play only three quarters in his second consecutive start, as his fourth touchdown pass gave the Mountaineers a 38-6 advantage over the Panthers (1-5, 0-2). Scoring connections with Davion Dozier, Jaden Barnes, Dalton Stroman and Izayah Cummings contributed to Kohl completing 21 of his 32 passes for 309 yards.

Ten players caught a pass from Kohl, with tight ends accounting for 161 of the 309 yards, highlighted by Cummings' six receptions for 94 yards. Rashod Dubinion and Jaquari Lewis both rushed for more than 50 yards, and Lewis reached the end zone during a second-half flurry that turned a 17-0 halftime lead into a one-sided affair.

An interception early in the second half from linebacker Colton Phares began that flurry, as the Mountaineers held Georgia State scoreless for the first 40 minutes of game action. Thomas Davis, Aiden Benton and Caleb Sandstrom recorded sacks, while Ronnie Porter made a key fourth-down stop in the first half for a defense that limited the Panthers to 54 rushing yards.

Dominic De Freitas drilled two field goals, including a 46-yarder, and an early special teams play prevented App State from ever trailing. DeNigel Cooper's head-first helmet block of a 28-yard field goal stopped Georgia State from ending its second drive with points.

Coastal Carolina Rallies to Top App State at The Rock

BOONE, N.C. — App State led most of the way in a Sun Belt showdown at Kidd Brewer Stadium, but Coastal Carolina moved ahead for the first time in the final four minutes and prevailed 45-37.

Wearing throwback “Flying Yosef” helmets with many of the 33,862 fans in attendance dressed in gold, the Mountaineers (4-3, 1-2) held a 31-17 advantage after Elijah Mc-Cantos’ interception set up a half-ending field goal and Jaden Barnes returned a punt 77 yards for a TD early in the third quarter, but Coastal (4-3, 3-1) limited App State to a pair of field goals the rest of the way. The Chanticleers rallied to a comeback victory in which they averaged 6.0 yards per carry.

Forcing a 23-yard field goal after a short throw toward an open receiver fell incomplete at the end zone, meaning that App State possessed a 37-31 advantage instead of a two-score lead with 9:03 remaining, Coastal Carolina moved ahead for the first time with 3:19 remaining by scoring a touchdown to cap a 13-play, 75-yard march.

The Mountaineers didn’t record a first down on their next series, getting stopped short on a fourth-and-7 completion, and Coastal scored another touchdown with 1:56 left to take a 45-37 lead. JJ Kohl completed four straight passes to move the ball to the Chanticleers’ 32. The next pass was completed to the 27, but a call of offensive pass interference for a pick backed the Mountaineers up 15 yards, and Coastal recovered the loose ball on a third-and-25 sack.

App State punted one time and led 14-3, 21-10, 31-17 and 34-24.

App State's Fourth-Quarter Rally Falls Short At ODU

NORFOLK, Va. — App State followed a pair of fourth-quarter stands with two touchdowns to keep its comeback hopes going, but Old Dominion recovered a late onside kick to close out a 24-21 home win.

AJ Swann directed two fourth-quarter drives and threw two touchdown passes, leading possessions that followed a Zyeir Gamble interception near the end zone and a missed 39-yard field goal from the Monarchs. Kanen Hamlett scored on a 35-yard touchdown reception after the takeaway, and Davion Dozier hauled in a 34-yard touchdown pass with 1:35 remaining, but the Mountaineers (4-4, 1-3 Sun Belt) had only one timeout left when ODU (5-3, 2-2) recovered the onside kick.

The Mountaineers trailed 10-7 at halftime despite facing adversity from every direction, but the first four drives for each team in the second half resulted in one App State first down and two ODU touchdowns.

The Monarchs nearly got a third touchdown in that stretch, reaching the App State 1 after making a fourth-down stop at the Mountaineers' 34, but Gamble came down with an INT after Rondo Porter tipped a third-and-goal pass. Swann, who had missed the previous three games while being sidelined by injury, absorbed two roughing-the-passer penalties before capping a 91-yard drive with his 35-yard TD pass.

That score cut App State's deficit to 24-14 with 9:26 remaining, and ODU chewed up six minutes before missing a 39-yard field goal. Swann completed seven of his nine pass attempts on a 79-yard touchdown drive, capped by Dozier scoring for the fourth straight game.

The Mountaineers stayed within striking distance in the early going even though a long ODU touchdown immediately followed an App State takeaway wiped out by a flag and an ODU interception in the end zone immediately followed an App State touchdown wiped out by a flag.

A flag for roughing the passer and targeting on Myles Farmer's hit of Colton Joseph negated a INT by DJ Burks, and ODU threw a 70-yard TD pass on the next play. The Mountaineers were set to tie the game thanks to starter JJ Kohl's 5-yard touchdown pass to Dalton Stroman, but a flag for offensive interference on a pick backed App State up 15 yards, and that third-and-20 pass was intercepted in the end zone.

In his return to the starting lineup after starting the first four games of the year, AJ Swann completed 34-of-51 passes for 348 yards with two touchdowns and one interception. It was his most completions and attempts as a college quarterback and his second-highest yardage total behind a 368-yard effort in the season-opening win against Charlotte.

App State's two sacks in the game were from Dylan Manuel (his second as a Mountaineer) and Colton Phares (the first of his career).

Mountaineers' Second-Half Rally Comes Up Short

BOONE, N.C. — App State rallied for three touchdowns over the final 20 minutes, with one more score needed to complete a comeback win, but Georgia Southern was able to run out the clock in a 25-23 victory.

App State's red zone defense made a comeback possible by forcing the Eagles to kick field goals from 21, 26, 23 and 24 yards during the Thursday night rivalry game that drew a crowd of 31,876. The Mountaineers (4-5, 1-4) trailed 19-0 when Dominic De Freitas made a 36-yard field goal to put points on the board as the first half ended, and they were behind 22-3 before scoring touchdowns with 4:51 left in the third quarter (David Larkins' 1-yard reception) and 13:50 remaining in the fourth quarter (Jaquari Lewis' 27-yard run).

The Eagles (4-5, 2-3) pushed a six-point lead to nine with their final field goal at the 9:05 mark, and AJ Swann's 16-yard TD pass to Jaden Barnes with 1:56 left prolonged the comeback bid. Georgia Southern recovered the onside kick, but App State had all three timeouts remaining. The Eagles had an 11-yard run on the first play and sealed the game by converting a fourth-and-1 run from the 27 with 34 seconds left.

Barnes totaled 13 catches for 160 yards and a score, posting App State's highest reception total since Sean Price had 13 catches for 167 yards against Illinois State in 2012, and Swann threw for 348 yards with two scores in his return to the starting lineup. He completed 34 of 51 passes on a night when the Mountaineers rushed 23 times for 77 yards.

Larkins tipped the ball to himself on his score that cut Georgia Southern's lead to 22-9 in the third, and Colton Phares' sack forced Georgia Southern to punt from its 32. Barnes made a diving grab for 6 yards on a fourth-and-1 throw from the App State 40, and Lewis rushed for 15 yards to the Eagles' 27 before scoring untouched on the next play.

Georgia Southern needed just six plays to go from its own 28 to the App State 6 on the next series to set up a field goal, and the Mountaineers reached the Georgia Southern 23 on their next series, but an interception at the 1 halted the effort to make it a two-point game with ample time remaining.

GAME NOTES
App State lost its fourth straight game for the first time since 2014, its first year at the FBS level.
With JMU ranked No. 24 in the AP poll, App State dropped to 3-12 against ranked opponents since 2014, including a 2-3 mark against top-25 Sun Belt foes.
It was the Mountaineers' most lopsided loss since falling 66-13 to Virginia Tech in the 2011 season opener. The worst loss in program history was a 72-14 loss to Chattanooga in 1978, followed by a 56-0 loss to NC State in 1990.
DJ Burks topped all tacklers with 11, followed by Colton Phares with eight.
Dalton Stroman led the receiving corps with three catches for 74 yards.
Through three quarters, App State's only offensive play in JMU territory was a pass that was intercepted shortly after the Mountaineers produced a takeaway of their own.
Through three quarters, JMU had a 472-29 advantage in total offense, with App State having 12 rushing yards on 14 attempts and 17 passing yards on four completions (on 20 attempts).
JMU's 627 ranks are the third-highest total allowed by App State at the FBS level, behind Clemson's 712 in 2024 and WKU's 642 in the 2021 bowl game.
Ian Ratliff punted a career-high nine times for a 45.2-yard average.
Dominic De Freitas made a 48-yard field goal to put App State on the board in the fourth quarter. It was his fifth make of 45+ yards this season.
Trae Nickelson III made his collegiate debut and returned three kickoffs for a 24-yard average.

Mountaineers Fall in Road Finale at No. 24 JMU

HARRISONBURG, Va. — App State wrapped up its 2025 road schedule with a 58-10 loss at No. 24 James Madison at Bridgeforth Stadium.

The Mountaineers fell to 3-4 in their last seven games against ranked opponents, getting their first points on a 48-yard field goal in the fourth quarter from Dominic De Freitas, who has four conversions from more than 45 yards this season. Davion Dozier hauled in a 19-yard touchdown pass in the final two minutes from backup quarterback JJ Kohl, who entered the lineup after starter AJ Swann was transported off the field with a lower-body injury.

Caleb Sandstrom's early tip of a pass triggered the first takeaway of the game, an INT by Dylan Manuel, while Sandstrom, Rondo Porter and Colton Phares all had one sack apiece for App State (4-6, 1-5 Sun Belt).

Shortly after Manuel's interception, DJ Barksdale brushed off two block attempts and intercepted a wide receiver screen in JMU territory to precede a four-play, 46-yard touchdown drive.

The Dukes (9-1, 7-0) added a 42-yard field goal in the second quarter and extended their lead to 17-0 with a six-play, 62-yard touchdown drive highlighted by Knight's 41-yard run to the 1. JMU moved ahead 24-0 with 1:26 remaining on Alonza Barnett III's sneak.

The Dukes regained possession 22 seconds later via a three-and-out punt and added a 38-yard field goal as time expired, taking a 27-0 lead to the locker room as App State was shut out in a first half for the first time since it trailed 17-0 in a 23-20 win at Idaho in 2017.

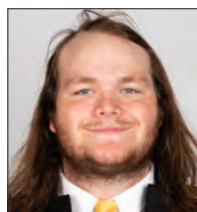

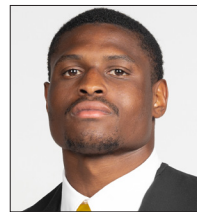
