TOP STORYLINES

- A four-game series between App State and East Carolina concludes with Saturday's matchup in Greenville. The first two games of the series were officially home games for App State, which won 33-19 in Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium in 2021 and 43-28 at Kidd Brewer Stadium in Boone in 2023. The Mountaineers erased a 16-0 deficit in a 21-19 victory at ECU in 2024.
- The Mountaineers improved to 2-0 in season openers under head coach **Dowell Loggains**, winning 55-3 vs. Maine to give the program its largest margin of victory since a 72-7 win vs. Gardner-Webb in 2018. App State started 4-2 in 2025, and four of the five regular season losses after that fast start were by a combined 14 points: 45-37, 24-21, 25-23 and 30-29.
- App State's first five games include three home games and two in-state road trips (to East Carolina on Sept. 12 and NC State on Sept. 27). The Mountaineers will play outside North Carolina for the first time on Oct. 16, when Coastal Carolina hosts App State for a Friday night game on ESPN2.
- For the fifth consecutive year, App State has sold out of football season tickets. The top five single-season average home attendance marks in App State and Sun Belt history have been those reached in 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024 and 2025 at The Rock, which has been named one of the top 25 stadiums in all of college football by ESPN, The Athletic and CFB Campus Tour.
- The first full signing class for **Dowell Loggains** was the highest-rated class in App State and Sun Belt history via 247Sports, which had the Mountaineers with a top-60 national ranking on signing day. App State's class ranked higher than 10 programs from Power Four conferences.
- App State's roster features 74 newcomers, including 44 transfers and 30 freshmen. Of the 44 transfers, 41 are from four-year schools and three came from the JUCO ranks. Of the 41 transfers from four-year schools, 26 were at FBS programs last season and 11 were at FCS schools.
- The 2026 coaching staff includes seven new faces: **Mike Anthony** (OC), **Tyler Zielenske** (special teams), **Aaron Fierbaugh** (safeties), **Justin Harper** (WRs), **Antonio James** (DL), **Tyler Kelley** (RBs) and **Ryan Pugh** (OL).
- QB **Malachi Singleton** (offense), LB **Colton Phares** (defense) and DB **Ammo Robinson** (special teams) were voted team captains before the start of fall camp. Singleton completed 22 of 24 passes for three TDs and 291 yards in less than three full quarters of work against Maine in his first collegiate start, after he appeared in 11 games for Purdue in 2025 and five games as a redshirt freshman for Arkansas in 2024.
- Colton Phares** (LB), **Aiden Benton** (DL) and **Tyriq Poindexter** (OL) received preseason All-Sun Belt recognition from the league. A former safety who moved to linebacker midway through the 2024 season, Phares recorded a sack and picked off a pass in his 2026 debut after standing out in 2025 as one of just three FBS players (along with Texas Tech's Jacob Rodriguez and Central Michigan's Jordan Kwiatkowski) to post at least 100 tackles, 9.0 tackles for loss and three interceptions.
- Since 2015, when App State became a postseason-eligible FBS member, it is tied for 11th nationally with 99 wins. The only teams ahead of App State on that list are Alabama, Ohio State, Georgia, Clemson, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, Michigan, Boise State, Oregon and Penn State.

MORE STORYLINES

- The 2026 season will include the 20-year anniversary of the 2006 FCS national championship team, which was in the middle of a title three-peat from 2005-07. The 2006 squad went 14-1, following a season-opening loss at NC State with 14 straight wins, including a 13-0 mark with freshman **Armanti Edwards** as the starting quarterback. The Mountaineers outscored their opponents 528-223, using a dominant defense to allow just 14.9 points per game. App State held six opponents to 10 points or less and capped a 4-0 run through the playoffs with a 28-17 victory against UMass in the national championship game.
- The 2026 roster has 10 players who were on the Mountaineers' 2024 roster, including scholarship recruits **Kanye Roberts** (App State freshman in 2022), **Colton Phares** (App State freshman in 2023), **Cayden Sweatt** (App State freshman in 2023) and **Nick Campbell** (2024 arrival from NC State). Other team members who were on the 2024 team are **Carter Everett** (App State freshman in 2022), **Daniel Davis**, **Randy Marion III**, **Danny Stevens**, **Luke Lair** and **DaRon Wilson**.
- In 2022, QB **Malachi Singleton** committed to an Arkansas staff that included **Dowell Loggains**, who ended up departing for South Carolina shortly before Singleton enrolled at Arkansas. Loggains was introduced as App State's head coach on Dec. 9, 2024, and Singleton (who had decided to leave Arkansas after the 2024 season) traveled to Boone four days later for the first set of official recruiting visits for the new coach. Singleton instead chose Purdue and played for the Boilermakers in 2025 before re-entering the portal, but he couldn't take another official visit to Boone (per NCAA rules) despite again having strong interest in the Mountaineers. Singleton did visit Tulane, which made the College Football Playoff following the 2025 regular season, but he committed to App State this time and has reconnected with Loggains as well as new offensive coordinator **Mike Anthony** (an Arkansas quality control coach from 2020-22) and run game coordinator/TEs coach **Ryan Yurachek** (an Arkansas grad assistant from 2020-21).
- App State quarterback **Henry Hasselbeck**, who had a 75-yard TD run on his first collegiate snap wiped out by a penalty vs. Maine, is the son of former NFL quarterback **Matt Hasselbeck**. Matt played for the Tennessee Titans in 2011-12, when **Dowell Loggains** was the Titans' passing game coordinator and QBs coach. Hasselbeck, a four-star lacrosse recruit as a midfielder and three-star football recruit as a quarterback in Massachusetts, initially committed to Maryland's lacrosse program in 2022 before committing to UCLA's football program the following winter. He spent the 2024 and 2025 seasons at UCLA.
- Of the six scholarship running backs on App State's roster, five dealt with significant injuries last season. App State returners **Kanye Roberts** (season-ending injury in the 2025 preseason after missing the final three games of 2024) and **Max Guest** (made FBS debut in the 2025 bowl game as a true freshman after rehabbing a high school injury during a redshirt year in Boone) did not have a carry last season. Florida transfer **Treyaun Webb** dealt with injuries late in the 2024 season and didn't appear in any games last season, while Arkansas State transfer **Ja'Quez Cross** suffered a season-ending injury after the first game of 2025. An injury limited Houston transfer **J'Marion Burnette's** availability early in the 2025 season.
- Treyaun Webb** scored App State's first touchdown of the season on his first game carry since Sept. 21, 2024, and it was his first touchdown since he reached the end zone as a Florida back against Miami on Aug. 31, 2024. **Kanye Roberts**, meanwhile, returned to the field for the first time since Nov. 2, 2024 and gained 19 yards on his first carry against Maine.
- Offensively, App State returns none of its passing yards from 2025, 640 of its 1,659 rushing yards (38.6 percent) and 549 of its 3,336 receiving yards (16.5 percent). The Mountaineers scored 36 TDs last season, and the eight TDs from returning players were produced by **Jaquari Lewis** (six rushing), **Sam Mbake** (one receiving) and **Alexander Sanchez** (one receiving).
- Aside from a 22-yard run by **Juan Berchal** on a fake punt, the other 140 carries via a returning player came from **Jaquari Lewis**. And aside from **Colton Phares'** 23-yard reception on a fake punt, the other 70 receptions via a returning player came from **Lewis** (32 for 192 yards), **Mbake** (24 for 207 yards), **Sanchez** (nine for 91 yards), **Doopah Coleman**, **Dillon Galloway** and **Jackson Grier**.
- Five App State tight ends combined to make 12 catches for 164 yards and one touchdown against Maine. In addition to **Darrin Fugitt** hauling in a touchdown during a four-catch, 47-yard effort, four-star recruit **Jamel Howse** had a 37-yard touchdown overturned to become a 35-yard reception to the 2-yard line on his first collegiate catch. He finished with four catches for 53 yards, **Dillon Galloway** had a 49-yard reception and **Luke Douglas** (who converted from high school QB to collegiate TE during his first stop at Florida State) had two catches for 16 yards.
- Defensively, **Colton Phares** is back after recording a team-high 101 tackles in 2025, and the next-best total from a returner was the 41 from **Aiden Benton**, who ranked 11th on the team. App State returns 23.1 percent of its 962 tackles, as Phares accounted for 10.5 percent of the team's tackles, and nine teammates combined for the other 121 tackles from a returning player.
- App State returners were responsible for 9 of the 28 sacks and 4 of the 13 interceptions in 2025.
- The primary offensive starters from 2025 who have returned are offensive linemen **Cayden Sweatt** and **Trent Ramsey** (who started the first seven games before suffering a season-ending injury). Defensively, **Colton Phares** and **Aiden Benton** were primary starters who have returned. **Ja'Den McBurrows** started the first three games before suffering a season-ending injury.
- Tyriq Poindexter**, a redshirt senior on the 2025 roster, started the season opener at right tackle but missed the rest of the year as he recovered from injury. He played in 26 games as a member of VMI's program from 2021-24 and made the All-SoCon first team in 2024.

APP STATE RECORD AT KIDD BREWER STADIUM SINCE 2003: 127-26

Kidd Brewer Stadium stakes claim to being one of the toughest but also most picturesque college football venues in the nation.

After “The Rock” was voted the top Group of Five stadium in the country by CFB Campus Tour in 2023 and 2024, ESPN named Kidd Brewer Stadium one of the top 25 stadiums in all of college football, and The Athletic did the same in 2025.

Now in its 65th season in the venue, which opened as Conrad Stadium on Sept. 15, 1962, App State has a 281-84-5 all-time record at The Rock.

The top five single-season average home attendance marks in App State and Sun Belt Conference history have been those reached by Mountaineer fans at The Rock in 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024 and 2025.

App State set single-season school and Sun Belt records with an average home crowd of 34,734 in 2023.

With a \$50 million north end zone facility, removal of the track and installation of new turf, The Rock had a new look in 2021, as the end zone facility opened for fans before a 2020 game vs. Georgia State. Hall of Fame coach Jerry Moore was also honored before the 2021 opener with a plaza and statue in his name.

Kidd Brewer Stadium’s official seating capacity was 16,650 in 2007, but several expansion projects have almost doubled the capacity.

DOWELL LOGGAINS

A respected offensive play-caller at both the NFL and college levels, Dowell Loggains was named the head coach of App State on Dec. 7, 2024.

Hired at the age of 44, Loggains (pronounced LOGG-ins) became the 23rd head football coach in program history. His five-year contract runs through the 2029 season.

Before serving as South Carolina's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach during the 2023 and 2024 seasons, Loggains was an assistant for two years at his alma mater, Arkansas, after spending 16 years in the NFL. That includes his time as an offensive coordinator or quarterbacks coach for the Tennessee Titans (2010-13), Cleveland Browns (2014), Chicago Bears (2015-17), Miami Dolphins (2018) and New York Jets (2019-20).

During his decade-plus as an NFL coordinator and quarterbacks coach, he mentored the likes of Sam Darnold, Jay Cutler, Vince Young, Matt Hasselbeck, Mitchell Trubisky and Brian Hoyer at quarterback, as well as running backs Chris Johnson, Kenyan Drake and Jordan Howard.

In his head coaching debut, App State won 34-11 against Charlotte in Bank of America Stadium. The Mountaineers started 4-2 and closed the season with a JLAB Birmingham Bowl appearance. After his debut season, he led the efforts for App State to sign the highest-rated recruiting class in Sun Belt Conference history.

Loggains' offense during the 2024 season helped the Gamecocks reach the brink of the College Football Playoff with a 9-3 regular-season record that included wins over Oklahoma, Texas A&M, Missouri and Clemson. South Carolina had the third-best rushing offense in the SEC during the regular season.

He developed redshirt freshman LaNorris Sellers into one of college football's most dangerous dual-threat quarterbacks. Under Loggains' watch, Sellers threw for 2,274 yards with 17 touchdowns while also rushing for 655 yards and seven scores against one of the country's toughest schedules. He ranked 20th nationally in passing efficiency, 14th in yards per attempt, 25th in yards per completion, 28th in total offense and 35th in completion percentage.

Loggains also found success utilizing Raheim "Rocket" Sanders, one of the SEC's best rushing backs, to form a dynamic rushing attack.

In his first season in Columbia, Loggains turned future NFL quarterback Spencer Rattler and a future NFL first-round draft pick, wide receiver Xavier Legette, into one of the most lethal pass-and-catch combinations in the country.

Loggains spent the 2021 and 2022 seasons as the Arkansas Razorbacks' tight ends coach, earning a reputation as a top-25 national recruiter there.

A native of Abilene, Texas, Loggains graduated from the University of Arkansas with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology in 2003 and a master's degree in education in 2005. He walked on to the Razorback football program in 2000 as a quarterback and holder before earning a scholarship and becoming a four-year letterman, appearing in 50 games.

Before returning to his alma mater of Arkansas, Loggains served as the New York Jets' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2019 and 2020. During his first season with the Jets, he guided an offense that was among the league's most proficient on opening drives, scoring 40 first-possession points. Darnold's numbers improved from his rookie campaign, increasing his completion percentage, passing yards, touchdown passes and passer rating while also lowering his interceptions.

Loggains oversaw a Miami offense that averaged 4.68 yards per rush in 2018, the NFL's ninth-best mark. The Dolphins also ranked second in the league with 14 passing touchdowns of 20-plus yards.

Loggains began a three-year stint in Chicago in 2015 as the Bears' quarterbacks coach, where he mentored Cutler to a career season.

He worked as the Cleveland Browns quarterbacks coach in 2014 under offensive coordinator Kyle Shanahan. He helped Hoyer to a career season, as the six-year veteran won seven games (in 13 starts) and threw for over 3,000 yards.

Loggains began his coaching career with Tennessee in 2006 and spent eight seasons with the Titans in a variety of roles, ultimately serving as the offensive coordinator for part of 2012 and all of 2013. He joined the Titans as a coaching administrative assistant (2006-07) and quality control coach (2008-09) before spending the next three seasons as the quarterbacks/passing game coordinator, helping Young achieve a career-high passer rating in 2010 and garner a Pro Bowl appearance.

Loggains' first professional experience came with the Dallas Cowboys as a scouting assistant in 2005.

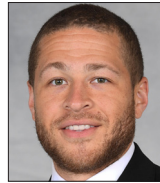

GAME NOTES
App State won its season opener for the seventh time in the last eight years (and the second straight under head coach Dowell Loggains) to move to 54-39-3 all-time in season openers.
The Mountaineers won their home opener for the fourth straight year and improved to 72-21-2 all-time in home openers. The only such loss since 2014 was the 63-61 shootout against North Carolina in 2022.
The 52-point margin of victory was App State's biggest since a 72-7 win against Gardner-Webb in 2018.
App State improved its all-time record against Maine to 1-2 ... There are now no visiting teams that have played more than once in Boone and have an undefeated record. The Black Bears have the only program with a winning record in Boone in more than one visit.
The Mountaineers won against an FCS opponent for the 11th straight time and have not lost such a contest since 2014.
This was App State's 99th win since it became a postseason-eligible FBS member in 2015, tied for the 11th-most nationally in that span.
Attendance for the 16th sellout in the last 18 games at Kidd Brewer Stadium was 33,664.
App State's offense scored its most points since putting up 55 against Georgia Southern in 2023 and compiled its most yards (647) since the 2022 season opener against North Carolina.
In his first collegiate start after playing as a backup at Arkansas and Purdue, Malachi Singleton completed 22 of 24 passes for 291 yards with three TDs and no interceptions. His performance marks the third-best completion percentage in school history (.917) by a passer with more than 10 completions.

Mountaineers Roll Over Maine in Season Debut

BOONE, N.C. — App State opened the 2026 season with a dominant home win over Maine, recording a 55-3 victory in front of a sold-out crowd of 33,664 at Kidd Brewer Stadium.

Beginning their second season under the direction of head coach Dowell Loggains, with 73 newcomers on the roster, the Mountaineers posted the program's largest margin of victory since a 72-7 win against Gardner-Webb in 2018.

App State shut out Maine (1-1) until the final minute of the third quarter, building a 38-0 lead as Malachi Singleton completed 22 of 24 passes for 291 yards and three TDs in less than three full quarters of work.

App State's 10 possessions resulted in a turnover-capped march to the Maine 5-yard line on the opening series and then nine straight scoring drives, with seven touchdowns and two James London field goals. Sam Pickett III followed a Darrin Fugitt touchdown reception with two scores of his own, and the Mountaineers' four rushing touchdowns came from Treyaun Webb, Jaquari Lewis, Nate Branch and Jackson Grier. Branch and Grier, both receivers, scored on runs of 36 and 28 yards.

Caleb Sandstrom produced App State's first sack of the season right before edge rusher Caleb Pitts intercepted a pass that he tipped to himself late in the first half, setting up a touchdown drive that led to a 31-0 halftime advantage, and Colton Phares came down with another interception early in the third quarter. Phares also added a sack thanks to his pressure on a penalty for intentional grounding, part of the Mountaineers' eight tackles for loss.
