Carroll McCray, Governors Head Football Coach

Carroll McCray begins his fourth season as Austin Peay head coach as the man who is leading the Governors football program in its transition back to scholarship play and the Ohio Valley Conference..

McCray knows he faces a difficult task in APSU's one season as a Division I-AA independent before rejoining the OVC in 2007.

But APSU knew McCray was the type person who could handle such challenges when he was named APSU's 16th head coach on Jan. 20, 2003.

After spending 14 years as a Division I-A/I-AA coach, the veteran coach ascent to his first head-coaching position was a natural one. And in doing so, became APSU's second coach in the non-scholarship era.

In fact, the Gobs four wins last season against a demanding schedule represented the sixth most by a first-year Governors coach. The Gobs also finished in a second-place tie in the PFL South, marking the first time the Gobs had finished above third place. APSU also won its first homecoming of the new century under McCray.

Prior to arriving at APSU, McCray spent his two previous seasons as an assistant at Mississippi State, coaching centers and offensive guards.

"Carroll McCray is a very knowledgeable and skilled football coach," APSU athletics director Dave Loos said. "He is a man of great integrity who will have the best interests of our student-athletes at heart.

"Carroll is someone who has a strong presence in the community and has built additional interest in this program."



"We as the McCray family and we as a football family—our coaching staff—are appreciative of the confidence that Dr. (Sherry) Hoppe (APSU president) and Coach Loos have in us in our transition from a I-AA independent back to the OVC,"

No truer words could have been spoken. No sooner was he named, McCray was a guest at local and area services clubs and other public gatherings. His never-ending energy was not lost on the APSU and Clarksville communities.

McCray brought 19 seasons of coaching experience to Clarksville. Prior to his hiring, he was brought to Starkville by then-offensive coordinator Sparky Woods. McCray previously served five seasons (1988-93) under Woods when the latter was head coach at South Carolina. He coached the offensive line, tight

ends, h-backs and special teams during that tenure in helping the Gamecocks in their transition to the Southeastern Conference. He coached offensive tackle Ernest Dye, the school's first all-SEC performer.

He also helped tutor three players who earned spots in the Senior Bowl and two in the Blue-Gray and East/West Shrine games.

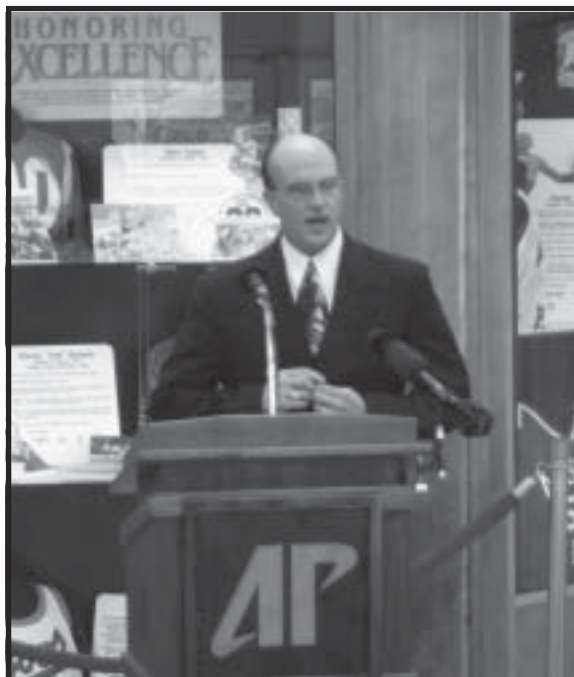
In between the two stints working with Woods, McCray worked seven seasons (1994-00) as the offensive line coach under Pete Hurt at Samford University.

While with the Bulldogs, McCray's offensive lines ranked among I-AA's best. In 2000, McCray's unit paved the way to a school-record 3,439 yards rushing and 41 touchdowns. Just one year prior, Samford averaged more than 300 yards rushing per game, the fourth highest total in Division I-AA. During his seven-year stint in Birmingham, McCray's offensive lines helped lead the way for 11 Samford running backs to gain more than 500 single-season rushing yards.

McCray began his coaching career with Woods at Appalachian State, where he served two years as a graduate assistant, working with the tight ends and tackles, and three years as an assistant in charge of the inside linebackers. While at Appalachian State, the Mountaineers compiled a 38-19-2 record. Appalachian State advanced to the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs in 1986 and again in 1987, advancing to the semifinals the latter year after eliminating defending national champion Georgia Southern.

McCray enjoyed a stellar playing career for Gardner-Webb College, an NAIA powerhouse, as an offensive lineman, earning three letters. Coincidentally, Gardner-Webb also produced Morehead State football coach Matt Ballard, a soon-to-be Pioneer Football League coaching opponent. Prior to beginning his career at Gardner-Webb, McCray was a standout lineman for Parkwood High School in Monroe, N.C.

McCray is married to the former Angel Allen. They have two children, a son, Trey, age 19, who plays football and basketball at Rossview High School, and daughter Meredith, age 14.

GRANVILLE EASTMAN — Defensive coordinator/Secondary

Granville Eastman is in his fourth season as an Austin Peay assistant, his second as defensive coordinator.

When Steve Haywood elected to return to offensive side of the football in after the 2004 season, it was only natural that APSU head man Carroll McCray elevate Eastman, the Governors secondary coach who had served two years as Haywood's right arm on the defensive staff.

In addition, Eastman again will work with the Gobs special teams, an area that has displayed marked improvement in his two seasons.

The energetic assistant came to APSU in Spring 2003 from Tiffin (Ohio) University, where he served as a defensive assistant for four seasons.

McCray and Haywood were so impressed with Eastman in the interview process, they delayed spring practice so proper paperwork could

be finalized in the hiring process for the Toronto, Canada native.

Eastman was afforded increased responsibility in each of his four years at Tiffin. A year later, he was elevated to defensive coordinator in charge of the defensive line while continuing to serve as recruiting coordinator. In 2001, again he served as defensive coordinator while working with the secondary

During Summer 2002, he served an internship with the NFL's Detroit Lions and he did the same in Summer 2004 with the Arizona Cardinals, learning more about special teams play.

With APSU hosting the Tennessee Titans training camp this summer on campus, Eastman also arranged a third NFL internship with

the Nashville-based club, working with former Gobs assistant Everett Withers with the secondary.

Eastman was a two-time all-city defensive back at Leacock High School in Toronto before attending Saint Mary's University, Halifax, Canada).

There, he was a three-year letterman as a defensive back. Twice Saint Mary's played in national title games while he was there.

Eastman served one year as a volunteer coach at York University in Toronto before deciding to pursue a coaching career. From 1996-98, he served as graduate assistant at Arkansas State (1995-98) before going to working at Tiffin in 1999.



BRENDAN GREGORY — Defensive line/Strength & Conditioning

Brendan Gregory, a former defensive lineman on two Ohio Valley Conference championship teams at Eastern Kentucky, is the new defensive line coach and strength and conditioning coordinator for Austin Peay's football program.

Gregory came to Austin Peay in the spring from Taylor County High School in Perry, Fla., where he served one year as defensive line coach, head strength and conditioning coach and physical education instructor.

The Barbourville, Ky., native received both his bachelor's and master's degree from Eastern Kentucky. He played four seasons, from 1989-93, as a Colonels defensive lineman. In addition to being part of two OVC title teams, he also was a

member of two EKV football teams that played in the I-AA playoffs.

Initially after graduating from EKV, Gregory worked as a fitness specialist and personal trainer. He also coached high school in his native Barbourville. In August 1999, he served as a volunteer in the Tampa Bay Buccaneers strength and conditioning program. A year later he spent a month as football operations intern with the Cleveland Browns.

Gregory returned to Eastern Kentucky from August 1999 to January 2001, completing his master's while serving as the program's assistant strength and conditioning coach. From there he served a seven-month internship with the University of Louisville before being hired by the Univer-

From there, Gregory spent more than a year working with Velocity Sports Performance before returning to high school at Taylor County last August.

Gregory is a certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist (CSCS) and has certification as a USAW Weightlifting Club Coach.

Assistant Coaches

BOB ATECA — Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks

Bob Ateca is in his second season as offensive coordinator, ascending to that position in 2005. Previously, he served as the Governors quarterbacks and wide receivers coach for two seasons.

After spending nearly 10 head-coaching years at the high school level, Ateca joined the Governors coaching staff in summer 2003 and proved to be a valuable addition to the Gobs staff.

After handling running backs in 2003, he took over as quarterbacks and wide receivers coach in 2004.

Owning a longtime dream to coach at the college level, Ateca came to APSU after spending eight years at Clarksville High School, the

last seven as head coach. He directed the Wildcats to a pair of playoff appearances. His 2000 Wildcats finished 10-2 followed by a 7-4 mark in 2001. He continues to teach in the local school system while working with the APSU football program.

Prior to that he coach five years at Houston County, his final two as head coach, including a state playoff appearance.

The Gobs offensive coordinator built an outstanding reputation in the local area with his respective schools, turning both into respectable programs.

In fact, he coached former APSU All-America running back Jay Bailey

at Clarksville High School.

Ateca is a Jacksonville, Fla., native where he played linebacker at Forrest High School. He later transferred to Hendersonville where he graduated in 1983.

Ateca attained his bachelor's degree in health and physical education from Austin Peay in 1989.

STEVE HAYWOOD — Offensive line/Recruiting Coordinator

Steve Haywood begins his second season in his second tenure as APSU offensive line coach after moving back to the area where he gained playing recognition.

After serving four seasons as APSU's defensive coordinator, he initiated the move back to offensive line a year ago. The transition proved smooth. The former Governors offensive tackle-guard served as offensive line coach when he returned to campus in 2000, after serving one season as offensive line coach at Cumberland College (Williamsburg, Ky.).

In 2001, his career took a dramatic turn when he accepted the challenge as the Gobs defensive coordinator.

In a short period of time, he helped develop in the APSU's strength. He also assumed many other duties in

his full-time coaching tenure and was named assistant head coach in Summer 2002. He served as director of football operations prior to McCray's hiring.

When Carroll McCray was hired in Winter 2003, he saw Haywood's indispensable attributes and retained him as the program's defensive coordinator.

The Huntingdon, Tenn., native has spent a lot of time in Clarksville. He first came to APSU in 1993 starting at tackle as a freshman. A year later he was shifted to his more natural guard position, where he started on the right side for the next three (1994-96) years. He earned second-team All-OVC honors as sophomore and honorable mention his senior season. He also was voted team captain as a senior.

After completing his eligibility in

1996, he remained at APSU as a student assistant offensive line coach in 1997 and then became graduate assistant a year later, working with the defensive line, giving him a different perspective on line play.

Haywood received his bachelor's degree in health and human performance in 1997 and his master's the following spring.

A two-way lineman at Huntingdon High School, he was a two-time all-district and all-West Tennessee offensive line selection.

Assistant Coaches

MARCUS GILDERSLEEVE — Receivers/Special Teams

One of the finest Clarksville-area football players in the last 15 years is back in his hometown, serving as an assistant football coach.

Marcus Gildersleeve, who starred at Northeast High School before playing his at Virginia Tech (1996-98), came to APSU a year ago as cornerbacks coach after serving two seasons as wide receivers coach at Nebraska-Omaha. He will return to the offense this season, coaching APSU receivers.

After receiving his bachelor's in Family Child Development (2000), he began his coaching career as the wide receivers and specials teams coach at the University of the South,

working with his former prep coach, Rick Butler. In fact, while at Sewanee in 2001 and 2002, his specials set an NCAA Division III single-game record by returning three blocked punts for touchdowns.

Gildersleeve entered coaching after a solid career at Virginia Tech, mostly as a wide receiver. The Hokies played in five bowl games while he was there, including the 1999 national championship game.

His best season came in 1997 when he caught 17 passes for 286 yards (16.8 ypc) and three TDs. As a junior, he was involved in two of Tech's three special teams TDs, recovering one blocked punt for a TD and block-

ing another for a score.

Gildersleeve earned his way to Virginia Tech after a terrific prep career. As a senior at Northeast, he rushed for 1063 yards and 21 TDs, including one game where he rushed seven times for 256 yards and five TDs.

He is married to the former Letisha Turner. They have three children, Jayla, 5; Myla, 4; and Marcus Jr., 2.



VERNON WRIGHT — Linebackers

Former Govs linebacker Vernon Wright returns to Austin Peay as a graduate assistant after spending a year as high school special education teacher and coach at his alma mater, Kenwood High School.

Wright will work with the APSU linebackers after playing two Governors seasons at the position. As a junior in 2003, Wright was credited with 74 tackles, starting all 11 games on defense. He enjoyed perhaps his

best contest against Jacksonville, when he was credited with 11 tackles. He followed 2004 season with a 41-tackle senior campaign.

Wright attended school for two years at APSU before electing to play the sport in which he enjoyed tremendous success in high school.

At Kenwood, he played linebacker and fullback for Terry Arrington. He was a three-time all-area and all-region linebacker. He

earned all-state honors as a senior as well as being named All-Area Defensive Player of the Year.

He was team captain as a senior and graduated with honors. He was a member of the school's National Honor Society.



JOSH ROBERTS — Running backs

Josh Roberts returns to his hometown to serve as graduate assistant for the Governors football team. Roberts will work with the offense, coaching specifically the running backs.

Roberts comes to APSU after a strong football career at Lambuth where he played three offensive positions—fullback, tight end and H-back, lettering all four seasons. Known as an outstanding blocking

back, his best two seasons came in 2003, when he caught 10 passes for 148 yards, and in 2004, when he hauled in 11 passes for 88 yards.

At Lambuth, Roberts was honored with the Athletic Committee Sportsmanship Award. He also served as a male student athlete representative to the university's athletic committee. Roberts was named to Who's Who Among American Colleges and Universities.

In addition, he served as a Fellowship of Christian Athletes Huddle Leader.

The Northeast High School graduate played outside linebacker and tight end for the Eagles, earning all-area, all-region and all-state honors as a senior.
