

THIS IS AUSTIN PEAY...

Austin Peay State University is a comprehensive, state-assisted university with a distinguished tradition in liberal and professional education. The institution is named in honor of Austin Peay, Tennessee's governor from 1924 until 1927, the year APSU was founded.

The university is located in Clarksville, Tenn., just 45 minutes northwest of Tennessee's capital, Nashville, on Interstate 24. One of the South's most historic cities, Clarksville also is Tennessee's third-fastest growing city behind only Memphis and Nashville.

Situated on gently rolling terrain near picturesque downtown Clarksville, Austin Peay's main campus consists of 65 buildings on 160 acres. The classical Georgian architecture of the Austin Peay campus is combined with newer buildings. This blend provides a link with the past while reflecting the academic excellence and dignity of an institution of higher learning.

The newest building additions to the main campus are the Sundquist Science Complex and the new Morgan University Center, both opening for use during the 2001-02 school year. The Sundquist Complex is one of the South's premier science education facilities and represents the largest capital appropriation ever in Tennessee for a single classroom building. The new Morgan University Center is located in the heart of the campus and features a cybercafe, meeting rooms, a food court, coffee shop, ballroom and lounges for Austin Peay students.

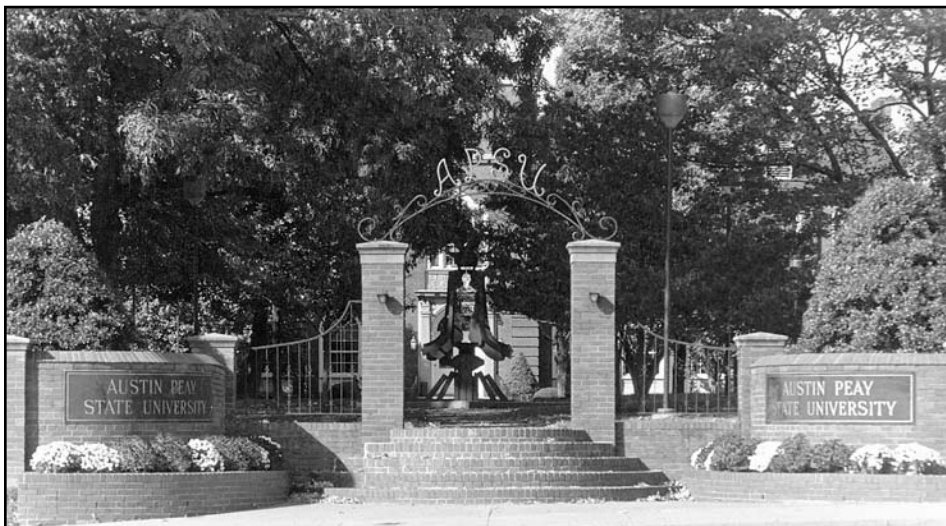
Austin Peay's campus has been the site of seven educational institutions since 1806. The campus was occupied by Southwestern for 50 years until 1925 when the school moved to Memphis. Austin Peay was founded two years later as a two-year normal school to train teachers for the region. Austin Peay has grown over the years to take its place among the finest mid-sized four-year universities in the nation.

Austin Peay Normal School became a four-year college in 1941-42, and university status was conferred Sept. 1, 1967.

Austin Peay State University currently enrolls more than 8,000 students from every region of Tennessee, most of the 50 states and several foreign countries.

Austin Peay offers more than 50 majors in associate, bachelor's, master's and education specialist's degrees with additional areas of concentration. Courses are offered in arts and sciences, business, education, engineering technology, nursing and human services. Graduate studies also are offered in several areas. In addition, numerous online courses are offered each semester.

A state leader in public service, Austin Peay State University has more than 750 employees. Engaged in the most modern teaching techniques and research are nearly 300 full-time faculty members, 91 percent of whom hold the earned doctorate or appropriate terminal degrees in their disciplines.

ABOUT BACON...

At Austin Peay: *As a sophomore,* Bacon played in all 28 games, including 16 starts... averaged 8.5 points and 2.0 three-point field goals made per game... among OVC players, ranked fourth in three-point field goals made per game (2.04) and three-point field goal percentage (.377)... opened season making just 10-of-45 (.222) of her three-point field goals prior to the Christmas break... after the break, made 70-of-169 (.414) of her attempts... made three or more three-point field goals in eight of the 19 games after the break... Lady Govs were 3-0 when she led the team in scoring... set personal scoring mark twice in one week, scoring 19 points against Winthrop, Dec. 30, followed by 22-point performance against Jacksonville State, Jan. 5... reset her scoring mark with a 23-point effort against Tennessee State, Feb. 4.

As a freshman, Bacon missed the season's first four games due to an injury and then played sparingly... finished season playing in 12 games, averaging 1.5 minutes per game... scored eight points against Tennessee State, Jan. 27, making all three field goal attempts, including a three-point field goal, and went 1-for-2 at the free-throw line.

At Millington Central HS: Under head coach Patrick Swanson, Bacon was named to Memphis Commerical-Appeal's Class AAA 2003-04 Best of Preps/All-Metro Team... 2004 Associated Press honorable mention All-State... was the leading scorer in District 14-3A in 2002-03, averaging 16.5 points a game while leading Millington Central to a 21-10 mark... selected candidate for 2004 Shelby Suburban Athlete of the Year... joined former Millington Central teammate Alicia Watson.

ABOUT BENFORD...

At Austin Peay: *As a junior,* Benford came off the bench to play in all 28 games... the Lady Gavs sixth-woman, she averaged the most minutes per game (17.0) of any player off the bench... averaged 3.6 points and 2.5 rebounds... grabbed career-high seven rebounds against Eastern Illinois, Feb. 7... scored career-high 11 points against Murray State, Feb. 12.

As a freshman, Benford played in 25 of the Lady Gavs 27 games, averaging 2.3 points and 2.1 rebounds during her 9.6 minutes per game... scored season-high eight points at Southeast Missouri, Jan. 22, making 3-of-8 field-goal attempts... finished season with six-point, seven-rebound performance at Eastern Kentucky, Feb. 26... recorded a point in eight consecutive games off the bench from Jan. 8 to Feb. 3.

Saundra L. Hale is the daughter of John and Michele Hale... born April 22, 1985... is the youngest of five children – three brothers: Eddie (31), B.J. (29) and Stanley (22) and a sister, Gwenita (29)... psychology major.

ABOUT HALE...

At Austin Peay: *As a senior,* Hale is a pre-season second-team All-OVC selection.

As a junior transfer, Hale was named to the OVC All-Newcomer team... led the league and ranked 46th nationally in steals per game (2.54 spg)... also led the team and was second among OVC players in assists, dishing out 3.96 assists per game... was a scoring threat, averaging 13.3 points per game, which was second-best on the team and 11th best among OVC players... transfer was thrust into point guard's role after starting point guard Ashlee McGee was injured in season-opener at Troy... scored then-career-high 23 points against Morehead State, Dec. 8... made career-best five three-point field goals against Winthrop, Dec. 30... posted career highs in assists (8) and steals (6) at Murray State, Jan. 12... made biggest impact in February, averaging 15.8 points per game while recording four 20-plus point efforts during the month... scored a then-career-high tying 23 points against Murray State, Feb. 2... added a 22-point effort at Eastern Kentucky, Feb. 9... became first APSU player since Brooke Armistead to score 30 or more points, posting a career-high 31 points against Tennessee Tech, Feb. 18... added a 21-point performance at Eastern Kentucky, Feb. 23.

At Sinclair CC: Under head coach Jeff Dillon, was team co-captain her sophomore year during which she ranked among top-10 in the Ohio Community College Athletic Conference in scoring (15.2 ppg, 6th) and assists (5.2 apg, 2nd) while adding 5.0 rebounds per game... was a first-team All-OCCAC selection and named to the all-district tournament team and was a NJCAA All-Region XII selection.

At Purcell-Marian HS: Under head coach Mike Peddicord, she was a team captain for three years... left as Lady Cavaliers all-time assists leader (823 assists) and ranks third on the school's all-time scoring list (889 points)... as a senior, led Purcell-Marian to a No. 1 ranking in the Greater Cincinnati Division II poll and a district championship – both program firsts.

ABOUT DANIELS...

Carrie Daniels, a member of the 1996 Austin Peay State University women's basketball team – which participated in the University's first NCAA tournament – and a seven-year assistant at Western Kentucky, was named women's basketball head coach, June 16, 2006.

Daniels' 10 years of coaching experience – all as a Division I assistant – have given her a clear perspective of the program she wants to establish at her alma mater.

"My vision for this program and its future is for every player that comes through to have a positive and fun experience," said Daniels. "I want each player to have the opportunity to compete for championships year in and year out. Most importantly I want quality student-athletes that will work hard in the classroom, earn their degree and be successful in life."

Daniels, a 1996 graduate of Austin Peay, was an assistant coach at Western Kentucky the past seven seasons (1999-06) and worked primarily with the team's guards, prepared the program's defensive strategy and coordinated recruiting efforts. She served as an assistant with three different coaches at Western Kentucky and was a member of post-season appearances in each of her seven seasons, including NCAA tournament appearances following the 1999-00 and 2002-03 seasons and a WNIT semifinal appearance in 2005-06.

During her time in Bowling Green, she helped the Lady Toppers amass a 146-78 (.652) win-loss mark. Included in that tally were four 20-win seasons, four Sun Belt East Division titles, one Sun Belt tournament championship, two NCAA tournament appearances (2000 and 2003) and five WNIT tournament appearances (2001, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2006).

It is her success as a player and assistant coach that brought her back to her alma mater.

"My love and desire to see Austin Peay succeed attracted me to this job," said Dan-

iels. "Austin Peay helped mold me into the person I am today and my experiences as a player have helped me cope and deal with situations I face still today. Austin Peay is where I got my start and I feel indebted to give back to a school that has given me so much."

As a former Ohio Valley Conference player and as an assistant who coached against OVC teams, she understands and relishes the opportunity to again leave her mark on the APSU program.

"The challenges with this job are never ending, but that's why we do it," Daniels said. "It's a challenge to win within the OVC, it's such a competitive conference with great rivalries that it's anyone's game on any given night. The coaches bring their teams and compete each game and when the buzzer sounds and off the court the relationships among the coaches is something

very special.

"I believe the opportunities as head coach at Austin Peay are something that can be very special and rewarding. It is a program that over the past 15 years has evolved into a strong contender each year and I hope I can help bring many championships to add to the already established tradition."

The 33-year old Daniels joined the Western Kentucky coaching staff after serving three seasons (1996-99) as an assistant coach and director of basketball operations at the University of Nevada-Las Vegas. She began her tenure with former APSU head coach LaDonna Wilson-McClain, who left

Austin Peay for UNLV after the 1995-1996 season, and continued her tenure with current UNLV head coach Regina Miller. She was a member of the coaching staff which led the Lady Rebels' to Division I's most improved record in 1998-99, turning a 4-23 record into a 17-11 mark, a 12½-game improvement.

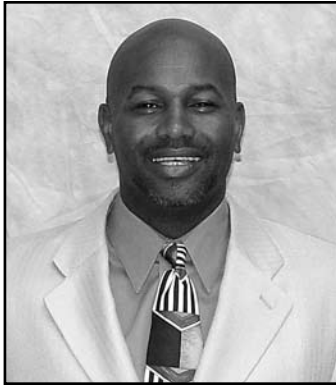
Daniels entered the coaching ranks after a brilliant collegiate career at Austin Peay, where she was a four-year starter (1991-1996) while playing under her maiden name, Carrie Thompson. At the time of her graduation, she was only the second player in school history to compile 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 200 assists and 200 steals during her career. Daniels is one of only 10 APSU women's basketball players to score 1,000 points, finishing with 1,118 points. Ten years after her career ended, she remains ranked among the career top 25 in 15 statistical categories.

She earned the 1996 Joy Award given to the top senior athlete at Austin Peay, after helping lead the Lady Govs to their first NCAA Tournament appearance as a senior in 1996. Daniels averaged 10.3 points and 3.6 rebounds per game during the 1995-1996 campaign. She scored a team-best 14 points in the Lady Govs NCAA Tournament first-round game at Clemson.

In 1995, she received the National Association of Academic Advisors for Athletics Wilma Rudolph Award, a national award presented to honor student athletes who have overcome great personal, academic, and/or emotional odds to achieve academic success while participating in intercollegiate athletics, after missing most of the 1994-1995 season after receiving a medical redshirt for a heart ailment.

A stellar prep player at Scottsburg (Ind.) High School, Daniels earned All-America recognition from Women's Basketball News Service after averaging 17 points, 6.3 assists and 3.8 rebounds per game as a senior.

Marcus Payne, an assistant coach for the 1996 Austin Peay State University women's basketball team – which participated in the University's first NCAA tournament – and formerly an associate head coach at Missouri-Rolla, was named assistant coach for the women's team, Aug. 8, 2006.

"I was looking for the right coach to work with at the Division I level and joining Carrie at Austin Peay was a great fit," said Payne. "This is where my career got started and I coached Carrie during the 1994-96 seasons. For me to have the opportunity to work for a former player of mine, for whom I have the utmost respect, is something I can treasure for life. Her hiring me shows she respected and trusted me as her coach when she was a player that she wanted me to be a part of her staff at Austin Peay.

"My expectation is to get out and find the right student-athletes to fit the style of play we want to run here. I also want to bring back the family atmosphere that we had when Carrie played here and to put this program in a position to win conference championships."

In his previous stint as an Austin Peay assistant coach, Payne was a coach on the team Daniels helped lead to the 1996 NCAA tournament as a player. He spent two years at Austin Peay before joining then-head coach LaDonna Wilson-McClain at Nevada-Las Vegas, where he spent the next two seasons.

"I searched long and hard while hiring an assistant coach and the one thing with Marcus I go back to is trust and loyalty – the two most important things in my opinion," said Daniels at the time of his hiring. "I know I'm going to get both of those from him. He's very experienced – he has almost 20 years experience in this field – and that will be beneficial for our program. Also, he has always coached post players and I was looking for someone who could come in and develop our post players."

The last five seasons Payne was an assistant coach and associate head coach at NCAA Division II member Missouri-Rolla, a tenure which culminated with the Lady Miners posting their best win-loss mark in a decade (17-11) during the 2005-06 season. He returned to the coaching ranks at UMR after a two-season hiatus during which he worked in private enterprise. Prior to that, Payne spent the 1998-99 season at Barton County (Kan.) Community College. The Cougars posted a 29-2 mark that season and won the Jayhawk

Conference Western Division title.

Payne spent four seasons as an assistant coach at NCAA Division I programs, beginning with Austin Peay from 1994-96 and extending to a two-season stint at UNLV (1996-98). His coaching career began in 1987 at Southwestern (Kan.) College, his alma mater, where he spent six seasons wearing different hats. Payne began as an assistant men's basketball coach, serving in that capacity for five seasons (1987-92). Also at that time, he began his current affiliation with women's basketball becoming the women's head coach in April 1991 and later adding duties as Director of Intramurals in August 1992. While serving as the women's head coach, Payne led his team to the NAIA District 10 playoffs for the first time in more than 10 seasons. Following his successful stint at Southwestern, Payne spent one season at Brown Mackie College in Kansas.

Payne earned his bachelor's degree in physical education, health and recreation in 1986 from Southwestern. Payne also has an associate's degree from Neosho County (Kan.) Community College where he earned two letters in basketball.

ABOUT WHITAKER

Camryn Whitaker, a former star point guard at Western Kentucky, was hired as assistant women's basketball coach, July 13, 2006. She followed head coach Carrie Daniels, who recruited Whitaker to Western Kentucky in 2000-01.

"I am so excited and thrilled that Camryn has chosen to be a part of this staff," said Daniels. "In five years as a student-athlete I saw her mature into a professional young woman and I know what she can bring to the program. From the basketball side of it, she is a fierce competitor and owns a champion attitude.

"I don't think I am going to find anyone who is going to work any harder. She is a quick learner—I have no doubt she will learn the system and run with it. She has a great personality. I think she is going to very valuable in recruiting and getting to know these young ladies who hopefully will be our future student-athletes.

"Knowing Camryn and knowing what I am going to get out of her – the loyalty factor, the trust factor—is so important."

This will be the first coaching opportunity for Whitaker, who will be heavily involved in recruiting as well as guard development, team travel and scouting. She spent the last year in the corporate business sector.

"I am excited to be here," Whitaker said. "I was out of school for a year and missed basketball terribly. I'm just thankful for the opportunity to coach and fortunate that Coach Daniels wants me to be here. I am excited about this opportunity. This program and this University has a lot to offer. I am going to work my hardest to make Austin Peay No. 1 in the OVC year after year.

"As far as Coach Daniels is concerned, it is easy to be an assistant coach for her because she is such a great person and an honest person who wants the best for Austin Peay. I just hope that I can provide the assistance she needs. Carrie, Marcus and I will work together, become a family, build a team and win championships."

The Cynthiana, Ky., native (Harrison High School) enjoyed a terrific Lady Toppers career. Despite being troubled by knee problems (she missed the 2002-03 season after knee surgery), she left the school ranked third all-time in games played, fifth in minutes played per game, 10th in steals and second in assists behind the legendary Clemette Haskins.

Whitaker started 117 games out of 126 during her career. In fact, as a freshman, she ranked second in the Sun Belt in assists (5.15 apg). In doing so, she shattered the freshman assists record (170) that season. Overall, she averaged 3.9 assists and 1.3 steals per game during her career along with 5.8 points per game.

Whitaker was a part of great Lady Toppers success. In her five seasons, Western Kentucky won 97 games and appeared in the post-season five times. Whitaker played in three WNIT tournaments. She missed the 2004-05 WNIT game against Xavier after having arthroscopic knee surgery. She was a medical redshirt in 2002-03 when the Lady Toppers advanced to the NCAA tournament.

Coaching is in the Whitaker blood. Her father, Mac Whitaker, a former All-Ohio Valley Conference (1975) outfielder at Morehead State, owns one of the Kentucky's top prep baseball programs at Harrison County. He also coached his daughter in basketball, where she was a second-team All-State selection and set the Kentucky-Indiana All-Star game record for assists (14). In addition, her grandfather, Woodie Crum, was a longtime prep basketball coach.

Krystal Gardner joins the Austin Peay women's basketball coaching staff after a four-year playing career at Western Kentucky.

During her four years at Western Kentucky, Gardner played in 127 games – ninth most in school history – and started 64 contests. She averaged 5.3 points and 3.8 rebounds in 21.7 minutes per game during her career. She made an impressive 44.5 percent of her shots and in 2004-05 was ranked ninth among Sun Belt Conference players in field-goal percentage, making 47.7 percent (92-of-193) of her shots.

Gardner was a member of teams that advanced to the postseason each of her four years: reaching the NCAA Tournament in 2002-03, the WNIT quarterfinals in 2003-04, returning to the WNIT tournament in 2004-05 and advancing to the WNIT semifinals in 2005-06.

She received her bachelor's degree in Physical Education from Western Kentucky in 2006.

THE OHIO VALLEY CONFERENCE

Entering its 57th year, the Ohio Valley Conference embarks on a new era while continuing to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference. In 2003, the OVC extends its geographical footprint into Alabama for the first time, expanding the league's membership to a record 11 institutions with the addition of Jacksonville State University and Samford University.

The OVC's proud past dates back to 1948, but seeds for the new league were actually planted in 1941. It was then that Roy Stewart, the athletics director at Murray State, Charles (Turkey) Hughes, the athletics director at Eastern Kentucky, and Kelly Thompson, the public relations director at Western Kentucky, first broached the idea of forming a new conference. Discussions were put on hold by World War II, but reemerged Feb. 27-28, 1948 at the Kentucky Hotel in Louisville as the three original institutions combined with Morehead State, Louisville and Evansville to form the OVC.

In the 1950's, the OVC became a pioneer on a much more significant scale socially. During times of racial segregation, league member Morehead State became one of the first non-traditionally black mid-southern institutions to accept a black student. In 1958, Marshall Banks earned athletically-related aid at Morehead, which signed a second black athlete, Howard Murphy, a year later. In 1961, Murphy earned all-conference recognition as a halfback in football. With racial barriers broken, the rest of the institutions in the league began to provide educational and athletic opportunities to African-Americans.

In the late 1970's, women's athletics began somewhat of a rebirth on the national scene as the NCAA began sponsoring and marketing women's sports. Recognizing the need to provide increased opportunities for female athletes, the OVC established women's championships in the sports of basketball, tennis and track in 1977, with cross country and volleyball added over the next four years. Those sports were initially governed by the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women, but the overall strength of women's programs in the league was demonstrated by the automatic bids the OVC instantly received when the NCAA became the governing body in 1982.

Through the early years of the league, administrators wrestled with fan behavior due to the close proximity of the conference members and the intense rivalries which developed. Just as it did decades ago, the OVC took the leadership role on what has become a national issue. In 1995, the OVC implemented a first-of-its-kind "Sportsmanship Statement", a policy which promotes principles of fair play, ethical conduct and respect for one's opponent. The statement has become a model

for others to follow across the nation, and has answered the challenge of the NCAA Presidents Commission to improve sportsmanship in collegiate athletics.

Over its 55 years, OVC teams have garnered national championships and bowl games in football, along with national team or individual titles in the sports of rifle, cross country, track and golf.

The OVC has also produced several Olympic athletes, while some of the greatest players in professional sports were educated at OVC institutions. The list includes former greats such as basketball's Clem Haskins (Western Kentucky) and Bubba Wells (Austin Peay), football standout Phil Simms and two-sport star Steve Hamilton (Morehead State) to present-day standouts like basketball players Popeye Jones (Murray State) and Trenton Hassell (Austin Peay), football players Chad Bratzke (Eastern Kentucky), Marquis Walker (Southeast Missouri), Chris Watson (Eastern Illinois) and Brent Alexander (Tennessee State), baseball players Brandon Berger (Eastern Kentucky), Kirk Reuter (Murray State), Kerry Robinson (Southeast Missouri) and Jamie Walker (Austin Peay) and professional golfer Jeff Sluman (Tennessee Tech).

The playing field isn't the only place where OVC athletes are working hard. The league also recognizes excellence in the classroom. The prestigious OVC Academic Achievement Banner is awarded annually to the league school whose athletes produce the highest grade point average when compared to the general student body. Also, six Scholar-Athlete Awards are presented yearly to male and female athletes, while others are commended for their academic success by being Medal of Honor recipients or earning a spot on the Commissioner's Honor Roll. Additionally, the Steve Hamilton Sportsmanship Award, in honor of the former Morehead State student-athlete, coach and athletics director, is presented annually to a junior or senior student-athlete with significant athletic contributions who best exemplifies the characteristics of sportsmanship and citizenship.

The vision of leadership demonstrated by the Founding Fathers in 1948 remains alive today as the Ohio Valley Conference prepares for the future. One example is in regard to the current trend in collegiate athletics administration for increased involvement of university presidents in setting policies and making rules. The presidents of OVC institutions, however, have always governed the Conference, long before presidential governance became a national theme.

The Ohio Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis and track for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track and volleyball for women. In addition, the OVC also spon-

sors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.

Over the last decade, the league has grown, not only in the number of athletics opportunities it provides for students, but in terms of the number of institutions in the conference. In 2003, Jacksonville State University and Samford University became the newest members of the OVC, joining Southeast Missouri State University (1991), the University of Tennessee at Martin (1992) and Eastern Illinois University (1996) as the league's most recent additions. Other current representatives include charter members Eastern Kentucky University, Morehead State University and Murray State University, along with Austin Peay State University, Tennessee State University and Tennessee Technological University.

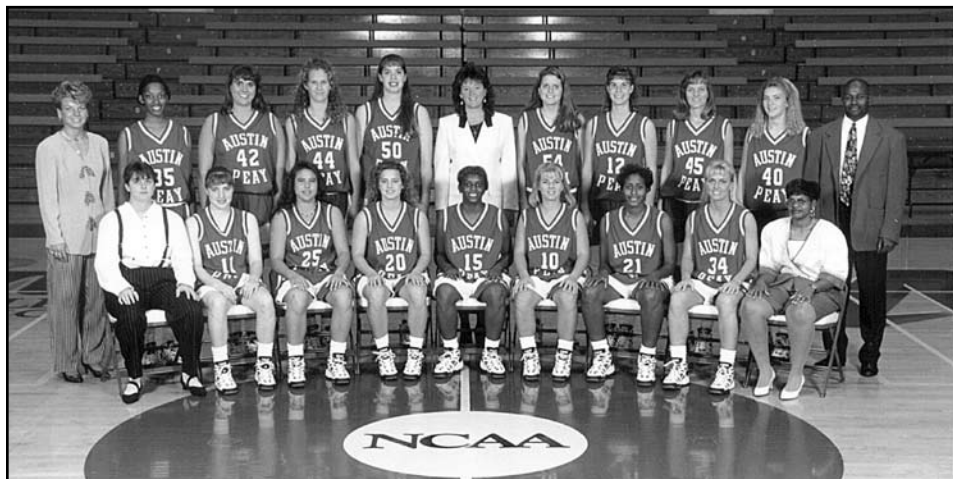
