AT THE KICKOFF

PRESEASON ALL-OVC

■ Senior running back **Kentel Williams** and redshirt senior **Kyle Anderton** earned recognition on the Preseason All-OVC Team. It is the second straight year Anderton has earned the distinction and the first for Williams.

A NEW LEADER AT THE HELM

Veteran head coach Mark Hudspeth enters his first season at the reins of the Governors' football program. Austin Peay football's 20th head coach brings 14 years of head coaching experience in the NCAA, leading then-Division II North Alabama for seven seasons and Louisiana-Lafayette for another seven. Last week, he picked his seconds win as APSU head coach.

RIVAL RANKINGS

■ For the third time since 2009, multiple ranked foes have visited Fortera Stadium, with Southeast Missouri joining Jacksonville State and Central Arkansas as ranked opponents hosted by the Govs. With its wins against JSU and SEMO this season, the Govs have defeated multiple ranked foes in the same season for the first time in pogram history.

STRENGTH VS. STRENGTH

Saturday's meeting pits the league's top two offenses against one another, with the OVC-leading Governors against the No. 2-ranked Skyhawks. In OVC play, the Govs lead the league in scoring (38.0 ppg) and yardage (435.4 ypg) while the Skyhawks are ranked second in both categories (32.0 ppg/405.7 ypg).

PROTECTORS OF THE REALM

■ The Govs offensive line has done its job consistently this season, surrendering just six sacks in nine games. APSU's front line is ranked No. 4 among FCS teams in sacks allowed. That protection also has allowed the Govs to post the FCS' No. 37 ranked passing efficiency rating – a 141.15 rating that would eclipse the program record set in 1994 (139.07).

THE WAY FORWARD

The Govs are searching for their first appearance in the FCS Playoffs after narrowly missing out in 2017. Austin Peay is in control of its own destiny regarding the 2019 OVC championship. If the Govs win their three remaining OVC contests, they would claim at least a share of the title and, importantly, would win any tiebreaker for the league's automatic bid to the FCS playoffs.

BY THE NUMBERS

0.67	Kordell Jackson enters this week with six interceptions in nine games and is No. 3 among FCS defenders in picks per game (0.70). No other OVC defender has more than three interceptions this season.
9	DeAngelo Wilson, who caught three touchdown passes against North Carolina Central in Week 1, is No. 9 among FCS receivers (2nd in the OVC) with nine touchdown receptions in 2019. Only four APSU receivers have caught more touchdowns in a season.



FACING THE SKYHAWKS

LAST TIME OUT

■ For the second time in three weeks, Austin Peay faced an opponent on a soggy gridiron, as rain steadily fell to the earth, and at times, it came down in sheets. The Governors took the lead into halftime, but could not hold off a second-half rally from UT Martin in a 37-7 defeat, last season, at Graham Stadium.

LEAGUE-LEADING SKYHAWKS

■ UT Martin enters this week's matchup as the OVC leader by virtue of their 5-1 league mark, one win ahead of the Govs and Southeast Missouri. When the Skyhawks play the Govs, Saturday, they will complete a three-game guantlet of the OVC's top teams. They defeated Jacksonville State last weekend after losing to Southeast Missouri the week before.

UT MARTIN ON OFFENSE

■ Offensively, UT Martin is a spitting image of the Govs: a talented passer (John Bachus vs. JaVaughn Craig) supplemented by a big run threat (Peyton Logan vs. Kentel Williams). Bachus is the OVC's No. 2 rated passer with 145.3 rating that trails only Craig (167.1). Logan is the league's No. 2 runner (94.7 ypg) ahead of Williams at No. 3 (75.5 ypg).

UT MARTIN ON DEFENSE

■ UT Martin does hold an edge against Austin Peay defensively in league play. The Skyhawks have held OVC foes to 16.8 points and 321.3 yards per game in six outings this season, first and second among league teams, respectively. All that thanks to a defensive unit that has recorded an impressive 23 sacks (3.8 per game). Senior linebacker Cecil Cherry (4.0 sacks) leads a group of six Skyhawks with at least 1.5 sacks in OVC play this season.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

After winning their first Sgt. York Trophy, presented by Delta Dental of Tennessee, in 2017 by sweeping their in-state rivals, the Govs successfully defended that title in 2018. The trophy (founded in 2007 by the Nashville Sports Council and OVC) goes to the winner of the quadrangular season football series between the four OVC football-playing schools located in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In 2019, the trophy gained another presenting partner in Farm Bureau Health Plans. The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted soldier of World War I. As a corporal in the 2nd battalion, 328th Infantry, in the Battle of the Meuse River-Argonne (Oct. 8, 1918), York and seven other soldiers captured 132 prisoners, was promoted to sergeant and received the Distinguished Service Cross, the French Croix de Guerre, the French Legion of Honor, the Croce di Guerra of Italy and the War Medal of Montenegro. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor.

ANOTHER 4,000, MAYBE 5,000

Entering its Week 11 contest against UT Martin, the Governors have amassed 3,870 offensive yards and are well within sight of their fourth straight 4,000-yard season (and fifth overall). With the rare 12-game schedule in place the Govs are on pace to surpass 5,000 offensive yards this season thanks to a 430.0 per game clip that would set the program record.

POSSESSION IS THE LAW

The Govs did not surrender possession via a fumble through their first eight games and 587 plays of 2019 but were charged a fumble lost on their opening drive at Eastern Kentucky, Nov. 2.

BIG PLAY GOVS

Austin Peay has been a master of the big play in 2019 with 50 rushes going for more than 10 yards each and another 34 passes gobbling up more than 25 yards each. Kentel Williams leads the rushing effort with 19 of his 126 carries going for 10-plus yards, including a season-best 55-yard carry versus JSU. Among receivers, DeAngelo Williams has taken 19 of his 52 receptions for more than 25 yards.

CRAIG CAPERS

JaVaughn Craig hasn't missed a beat - and neither has the Austin Peay offense - since the senior took over midway through the Central Arkansas game. His latest feat saw him become just the seventh APSU quarterback to pass for 3,000 career yards, joining teammate Jeremiah Oatsvall who reached the milestone last season.

WILSON ROLLING ALONG

Three of Austin Peay's first four games outings saw DeAngelo Wilson surpass triple digits in receiving yards. He's the first player since at least 1996 (which began Austin Peay's reliable game-by-game record-keeping) to accrue three 100-yard receiving games in his first four contests. Now with five

100-vard outings to his credit, he has amassed 966 receiving yards. He has three games remaining to break the Govs single-season record of 1,101 receiving yards.

DYNAMIC DUOS

Keenan Barnes and DeAngelo Wilson were everywhere at once against Mercer in Week 3. Barnes finished with 105 yards receiving, while Wilson led the way with 107, becoming the first pair of Governors receivers with 100-yard receiving yards in the same game since the 2006 season (Lanis Frederick and Kevin Carter at Dayton).

HARLEY'S HOUSE OF HIGHLIGHTS

When the Govs needed a big play in the first two weeks, it was provided by Baniko Harley. In Week 1, he tossed a 40-yard bomb to DeAngelo Wilson for a touchdown. In Week 2 his 76-yard catch-and-run for a score at Mercer was the longest reception by a Gov since... his 73-vard catch against Tennessee State, Oct. 6, 2018. This season against the Tigers, he averaged 18.2 yards per catch, including two field-flipping plays of more than 40 yards.

OFFENSIVE LIGHTS

The offense opened the season with an electric performance against North Carolina Central, racking up 563 yards total offense (272 rushing, 291 passing). The total was the sixth-highest mark in program history and second-most in a season opener, behind only the 1994 contest against Kentucky Wesleyan.

WILSON RED LINING

Game 1 was a night to remember for DeAngelo Wilson. The Bowling Green native made six catches for 106 yards and three touchdowns - all in the first half. It marked the second 100-yard outing of his Austin Peay career and marked the fourth time since 2016 a Gov had three touchdown receptions in a game - a mark achieved just seven other times in the previous 78 years of Austin Peay football.

SHUTDOWN CENTRAL

The Govs opened 2019 by holding three straight opponents to less than 100 yards on the ground, with an average of 42.6 ypg during that time. The 32 rushing yards the Govs surrendered in Week 2 against Central Arkansas was the fewest rush yards allowed by the Govs since Culver-Stockton needed 27 carries to gain 10 yards on Nov. 3, 2012.

WHAT'S GONNA GIVE

Three times this season, the Govs defense (#13 in FCS at 317.8 yards allowed per game) has squared off against a foe averaging more than 400 offensive yards per game. Tennessee Tech entered the Week 10 matchup No. 50 in the FCS with 401.9 yards per game and were held to 352 yards. When the Govs met Jacksonville State in Week 6, the Gamecocks were ranked No. 34 at 432.3 yards per game and were held to 363 yards (176 of that coming in the fourth quarter); in Week 8, a Tennessee State outfit averaging 445.7 yards gained just 336 yards.

KJ FIELD DAY

Kordell Jackson's twin pick-six effort against Mercer in Week 2 didn't just set the Austin Peay record for interceptions returned for a touchdown in a single game – it was the 33rd time in FCS history a player had returned two interceptions for a score in the same game. His second pick-six, a 69-yarder, also is the fourth-longest interception return in Austin Peay history. After picking off a pair of passes against Jacksonville State, he's one of only four Division I players with more than one multi-INT game in 2019.

BACK FIELD IN MOTION

Twice in the first three games, the Govs collected 10 or more tackles for loss, indicative of the pressure the front-seven is getting for Austin Peay. This season, Josephus Smith leads the way with 12.0 TFL while Shaun Whittinghill, Matthew Gayle and John Whiteside have each posted five or more TFL. The Govs rank 48th among FCS teams with 6.6 TFLs per game this season.

E-I-E-I-OLB

So far, it has been a seamless transition for Jack McDonald back to linebacker. The former linebacker-turned-tight end-returned to linebacker collected six tackles in his first career start, adding a tackle for loss and a quarterback hurry. With the start of OVC play, he has hit a higher gear, ranking second with 47 tackles in OVC play, including three double-digit tackle outings.

THIRD-AND-GONE

Austin Peay saw Eastern Kentucky convert on 7-of-19 third-down opportunities (36.8 percent) in its Week 10 overtime victory, and the Colonels went 4-for-10 on 3rd-and-long (seven yards or more). APSU has allowed a 34.6 percent third-down conversion rate (51-of-147) this season, 31st best in the FCS. The Govs have forced 3rd-and-long 80 times this season and have allowed only 17 conversions (21.3 percent) in those situations.

SPECIAL BOOT

Logan Birchfield in one of only 32 FCS kickers to convert 10 or more field goals this season. With three games remaining, he is five field goals away from tying the program record set by Tom McMillian in 1987. In Week 3 at Mercer, his six PATs moved him past Justin Deardorff into the all-time lead in program history for PATs.

KICKING UP YARDS

Devin Stuart became only the seventh Austin Peay putner with 7,000 career yards, reaching the milestone against Eastern Kentucky, Nov. 2; his career average of 39.48 yards per punt remains the top mark in program history.

TRICKY, TRICKY

Perhaps it was a play born of necessity – trailing in the fourth quarter and backed up inside its own red zone – but Austin Peay got a quality fake punt attempt on 4th-and-10 against Central Arkansas

On his 41 punts this season, he leads the OVC in punts downed inside the 20-yard line (15) and punts fair caught (27). Opponents have only 12 yards on four punt against Stuart this season.

AROUND THE LEAGUE THIS WEEK

With three weeks to play in the regular season there are three teams with one Conference loss in Austin Peay, Southeast Missouri and UT Martin...Two of those teams, APSU and UTM, will play on Saturday in Clarksville...Jacksonville State lost its third OVC game of the season which most likely ends its chances to win a sixth-straight OVC Championship...It will mark the first time since 2011 a team not named Eastern Illinois or Jacksonville State will win the OVC title...UT Martin's win over JSU was its first over the Gamecocks since 2012 and was the 86th all-time win for head coach Jason Simpson, the most in school history...UT Martin senior Terry Williams returned his second punt for a touchdown of the season in the win over JSU; he is the only Division I player (FBS or FCS) with multiple punt return scores this season...Southeast Missouri topped Tennessee State 32-13 at Hale Stadium on Saturday; it marked SEMO's first win over TSU in Nashville since 1996...SEMO WR Kristian Wilkerson caught his 30th career touchdown pass, moving him into sixth place in league history, five away from tying the all-time record; Wilkerson also ranks sixth in OVC history in career receiving yards (3,021)...Austin Peay topped Eastern Kentucky 28-21 in overtime, marking the program's first extra period win since November 3, 2007 at Southeast Missouri; it marked just the third win in program history as a ranked team (APSU was No. 25 in the Coaches Poll last week, No. 24 this week)...Tennessee Tech won its third road game of the season, the most since it won four road games during its 2011 OVC Championship season; between 2012 and 2018 the program won only six total road games...Tennessee State senior Chris Rowland now ranks seventh in OVC history in single-season receiving yards (1,234) and eighth in receptions (89)... OVC play continues with four games this weekend (Murray State has a bye)...Three games will air on ESPN+ and one game is on ESPN3...This season 69 of 72 total OVC football games will air on ESPN Networks, including 52 on ESPN+ and 12 on ESPN3.....This year marks the 150th anniversary of the first college football games.

Mark Hudspeth was announced as the 20th head football coach in Austin Peay program history on Dec. 11, 2018.

Hudspeth comes to Austin Peay after spending the 2018 season as the associate head coach and tight ends coach at Mississippi State. The Bulldogs finished the regular season 8-4 and ranked No. 18 in the College Football Playoff poll.

Hudspeth has 16 years of head coaching experience at the FBS, NCAA Division II and high school levels, and his teams went a combined 142-60 with him at the helm.

Prior to joining Joe Moorhead's staff at Mississippi State, Hudspeth spent seven seasons (2011-17) as the head coach of the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns. In each of his first four seasons, the Ragin' Cajuns finished 9-4, with victories in the New Orleans Bowl in each of those seasons. The 2011 victory in the New Orleans Bowl was the

program's first bowl appearance since 1970. The Cajuns appeared in the New Orleans Bowl again following the 2016 season.

The 2013 Ragin' Cajuns were co-Sun Belt Champions after finishing tied atop the regular-season standings, and finished in the top three of the conference standings in each of his first four seasons.

In 2014, Louisiana running back Elijah McGuire was voted as the Sun Belt Player of the Year and Offensive Player of the Year after accumulating more than 1,700 yards from scrimmage and 16 touchdowns. In total, 47 players earned All-Sun Belt honors during Hudspeth's tenure, and three players - Alonzo Harris (2011), McGuire (2013) and Joe Dillon (2016) – were each named as the league's Freshman of the Year, with McGuire and Dillon also earning Freshman All-America honors.

Six players from Hudspeth's Louisiana teams were selected in the NFL Draft, including Tracy Walker, who went 85th overall to the Detroit Lions in the 2018 NFL Draft – the first player from Louisiana selected in the Draft's first three rounds since 2011.

Prior to turning around a Louisiana program that was 3-9 before his arrival, Hudspeth made his first coaching stop in Starkville, serving as the passing game coordinator and wide receivers coach at Mississippi State for two seasons (2009-10). During his tenure, he tutored wide receiver Chad Bumphis, who would go on to set the MSU record in career receiving yards.

Hudspeth had tremendous success as head coach at then-NCAA Division II North Alabama, leading the Lions to a 66-21 record in seven seasons (2002-08). During his time at the helm of the program, UNA won two Gulf South Conference championships and competed in the Division II Championship five times.

In his second season, Hudspeth led the Lions to the 2003 Gulf South Conference title with a 9-0 conference record, and all the way to the national semifinals. He was named the Gulf South Coach of the Year while also being voted the NCAA Division II Region 2 Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association.

In 2005, the Lions went 11-3 and advanced to the national semifinals for the second time in three seasons. The 2006 campaign saw even greater success, as Hudspeth led the team to an unblemished conference record and another Gulf South Conference championship and national quarterfinal appearance. After finishing the season 11-1, Hudspeth was again named Gulf South Coach of the Year and NCAA Division II Region 2 Coach of the Year.

Ultimately, the Lions won double-digit games in four consecutive seasons: the 2007 squad finished 10-2 and made the nation quarterfinals, and the 2008 team went 12-2, and made a third appearance in the national semifinals under Hudspeth.

Hudspeth earned a bachelor's degree in health and education from Delta State in 1992. A four-year letterwinner, he was a starting safety as a junior before moving to starting quarterback in his final season. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Central Arkansas and earned a master's degree in secondary school administration from UCA in 1993.

Hudspeth's first full-time coaching position came at Nicholls State, where he served as wide receivers and tight ends coach in 1994 and running backs coach in 1995.

He returned to his high school alma mater – Winston Academy in Louisville, Miss. – in 1996, and led the program to a 25-1 record in two seasons after it had just one win in the two years prior to his arrival. He led the 1997 squad to the Mississippi Private School Association Class A state title.

Before his extremely successful tenure as the UNA head coach, Hudspeth returned to UCA in 1998 as defensive backs coach, and then returned to Delta State as offensive coordinator (1999-2000). He spent the 2001 season as the offensive coordinator of Navy.

Hudspeth is married to the former Tyla McConnell and is the father of four sons: Gunner, Captain, Major and Rocky; and one daughter, Carley.

FORTERA STADIUM





For nearly eight decades, Fortera Stadium has served as the home of Austin Peay State University football along with the University's track and field teams.

Clarksville and Governors athletics received a boost in 1946, when the city of Clarksville opened its new Municipal Stadium at the then-edge of the former Austin Peay State College. The stadium became the home field for local schools and APSC for football games and track events.

The city maintained its ownership and operation of the Municipal Stadium until 1970. In that year, as a result of a cooperative agreement between Austin Peay, the county officials and the city officials, the city conveyed title to one-third of the stadium to the State of Tennessee for the university. The other one-third went to Montgomery County.

Austin Peay, Montgomery County, and the city of Clarksville were authorized to appropriate funds to the newly created Stadium Authority for constructing, remodeling and operating the stadium, including adding east side seating. The members of the Stadium Authority were appointed by the county and by the university.

In addition, the natural grass surface—because it was being used by the local schools and Governors alike—was replaced by Astroturf and the east side two-level press box was constructed in 1979.

The stadium was in desperate need of a new turf in the early 1990s. However, the Clarksville-Montgomery County school system, which was amidst growth and expansion, indicated it could not afford to be a part of the turf replacement. As a result, Austin Peay agreed to purchase Municipal Stadium from the Stadium Authority in 1993.

Stadia Turf replaced the AstroTurf, which was placed by the Stadium Authority, before 1993 season's start. The playing surface was changed again in 2004, when Polytan surfaces were installed on the football field (Mega Grass) and track (Polytan WSS 15).

Other than a new scoreboard being erected for the 2007 season, those were the last major upgrades until plans were announced Aug. 20, 2012 to all but replace Governors Stadium when \$16 million was approved by the state for new construction.

A ceremonial demolition of Governors Stadium began following the seasonending Nov. 19 contest against Southeast Missouri. Despite the coldest winter in recent memory, including ice conditions that shut down the University for three days, the construction crew lost just one day of work.

A 3-foot-by-5 foot sinkhole that opened up into a 40-foot crater in May could not deter the project's conclusion.

What resulted is a \$19 million facility that has four levels on its west side. On the lower level is the player locker room, featuring new dark wood lockers with nameplates to recognize some of the donors that made them possible. Also on that level is a players lounge; athletic training room and equipment room.

Fans on levels 3 and 4 find the amenities of club seating and skyboxes – new features to the stadium. The skyboxes, which feature a sports-bar like atmosphere, feature tiered stadium-type seating with up to 22 seats per viewing room. In addition, each skybox has a bar with locations for bar stools, tables and chairs to seat four to six people.

The Governors Stadium skyboxes have sliding glass at the front of the viewing rooms, a push button to control a public address speaker and two television monitors.

The main concourses feature enhanced concession stands along with sport murals created to honor memorable Govs players and teams, with the hopes more will be created for future stars. The conference champions from 1948 and 1977 have walls spaces as well as the program's only back-to-back eight-win seasons in 1964 and 1965.

Meanwhile, the field itself has been replaced with its fourth artificial turf, Field-Turf XT, manufactured by FieldTurf, a Tarkett Sports Company. The turf, includes the new Governors logo at midfield.

Outside the southwest corner of the stadium, the Hendricks Fox Walk in the Blake Jenkins Plaza lists the names of all lettermen to wear the red and white.

The new stadium also created a revamped tailgating experience in a more central location outside the stadium.

In April 2016, following the Spring Game, a ceremony was held outside the stadium to celebrate its rechristening into Fortera Stadium. Country singer Maggie Rose performed before fans enjoyed a fireworks show.

In March 2017, construction completed on a new weightroom project inside Fortera Stadium. The state-of-the-art facility will service not only Austin Peay football but a host of the department's programs. The new space will free up the weight room in the Dunn Center and houses racks, free weights and treadmills in the facility.

In 2018, additions to the athletic training facility were completed to better care for the student-athetes.
