AT THE KICKOFF

WALDEN'S WORLD

Scotty Walden was hired as Austin Peay State University's 21st head football coach in November 2020. Walden, who at age 31 is the youngest head coach at the Division I level, takes over in Clarksville after serving as the head coach at Southern Miss to start the 2020 season. Considered one of the brightest young offensive minds in collegiate football, the American Football Coaches Association tabbed Walden as a Top 35 coach under 35 years of age in 2019.

HOUSE CALLS

Playing at home for just the second time this season, Sunday's game against UT Martin is also Austin Peay's penultimate home game of the 2020 football season. The Govs have just three games scheduled at Fortera Stadium this season, which marks the fewest games Austin Peay will play in Clarksville in a single season in program history.

SERVING THE YOUTH

Austin Peay's Draylen Ellis and Elijah Culp became the first ever freshmen teammates to be named the Ohio Valley Conference's Offensive and Defensive Player of the Week in the same week.

OWNING THE OVC ACCOLADES

In weeks that Austin Peay has played, the Governors have picked up seven of the 14 Ohio Valley Conference weekly awards. Freshman quarterback Draylen Ellis has twice been named Newcomer of the week, Ellis and running back Brian Snead have also both been named Offensive Player of the week once. On the other side of the football, Jack McDonald and Elijah Culp have both been named Defensive Player of the week once.

NATIONAL NOTORIETY

Two weeks after Brian Snead rushed for 227 yards and three touchdowns against Tennessee State to earn STATS Perform FCS National Offensive Player of the Week honors, Austin Peay freshman quarterback Draylen Ellis was named the STATS Perform FCS National Freshman of the Week. Ellis tossed for 262 yards and a program-record six touchdowns in the Govs double-overtime win at Southeast Missouri.

UP NEXT

After Sunday's Homecoming game against UT Martin, Austin Peay will hit the road again for a 2 p.m., March 28 contest at No. 8 Jacksonville State. Last season, the Govs picked up their first win over the Gamecocks since JSU joined the OVC in 2003. After the trip to Alabama, Austin Peay will return home for the final time this season when they host a 2 p.m., April 3 game against Murray State.

BY THE NUMBERS

2	Elijah Culp had two interceptions last week at Southeast Missouri. The freshman cornerback is tied for second in the OVC in interceptions this season and is tied for the fourth-best single-game total in program history.
6	Draylen Ellis threw an Austin Peay record six touchdown passes at Southeast Missouri. Ellis' six touchdown tosses against the Redhawks is tied for the best single-game performance in the FCS this season.
16	The Austin Peay defense is tied for the OVC lead with 16 sacks this season. 11 different Governors have recorded a sack this season, led by Terrell Lucas, who ranks second in the OVC with 3.5 sacks..
87	Averaging 87 yards per game, Brian Snead ranks second in the OVC in rushing yards this season. Snead is averaging 144.7 yards per game over the past three contests and has scored four touchdowns during that stretch.

FACING THE SKYHAWKS

YORK TROPHY TREATISE

- Austin Peay's final Sgt. York Trophy contest for the 2020-21 season will be UT Martin's first; the Skyhawks have shared the title with the Govs each of the last two seasons.

OFFENSIVE OPTIONS

- UT Martin signal-caller John Bachus has one of the league's deepest stables of pass catchers, with Colton Dowell (6.0 rpg, 55.0 ypg), Rodney Williams (4.3 rpg, 45.7 ypg), Peyton Logan (45.3 rpg) and Donnell Williams (58.0 ypg) among the league's top-10 in either receptions per game, receiving yards per game or both. Dowell was a STATS Preseason All-American

DEFENSIVE DOMINANCE

- While JaQuez Akins and Austin Pickett were preseason All-OVC, it's been the exploits of Deven Sims and Takeem Young that have led the way this spring. Sims leads the team with 28 tackles and four pass break-ups, while Young's 3.5 tackles for loss leads the Skyhawks.

WINN AND IN

- Former quarterback Dresser Winn has moved into a new role as punter and is starring within that framework. March 1, he was named OVC Specialist of the Week after averaging 42.7 yards per punt on seven attempts against Murray State, with three over 50 yards; he also engineered a late scoring drive with his career's fifth rushing score.

LAST MEETING, NOTABLY

NOV. 9, 2019 ■ APSU 38, UT MARTIN 24

- This Homecoming opponent also served as the last Homecoming opponent for the Govs, who toppled UT Martin in a 38-24 affair, Nov. 9, 2019.
- The Govs raced out to a 17-3 lead at halftime thanks to touchdowns from Baniko Harley and Kentel Williams less than 90 seconds apart.
- Williams ran for 188 yards and three scores and DeAngelo Wilson took the top off the Skyhawk secondary with six catches for 126 yards.
- The Govs got deep into the backfield with six sacks, including two from Josephus Smith and another from Kordell Jackson, who also secured Austin Peay's lone interception. Shaun Whittinghill had a sack, shared a tackle for loss and broke up two passes while also earning credit for four quarterback hurries.

FLYING INTO THE FORT

CLARKSVILLE AND THE SKYHAWKS

- This will be Austin Peay's 39th time hosting UT Martin in Clarksville, with the centennial anniversary of the first meeting less than a decade away.
- Austin Peay has won the last two meetings at home against UT Martin; prior to those wins, the Govs hadn't won back-to-back home games against the Skyhawks since the mid-1980s.
- The 2017 meeting was a 7-0 Austin Peay win in a slugfest which featured the Governors first win against a ranked opponent since 2009, its first shut out of a Division I foe since 1986 and its first shutout in regulation since 1980.

THE LEAGUE

VERSUS THE OVC

- For the first time since 1978, Austin Peay is beginning its season as the defending Ohio Valley Conference champion.
- Both Eastern Kentucky and Jacksonville State are scheduled to depart for the Atlantic Sun after Spring 2021. EKV also opted instead to play a full fall schedule last fall rather than compete for a league title this season.
- Prior to the home opening win against Tennessee State two weeks ago, Austin Peay's last league win was its biggest to date—a 35-7 win against Eastern Illinois on Senior Day 2019 to help the Govs secure the league title.
- After winning just two league games from 2012-16, Austin Peay is 18-8 in league play since the start of 2017. Two of those campaigns have seen the Govs finish above .500 in league play—Austin Peay's previous two years at .500 or better in the OVC were 2007 and 1984.

LOOKING BACK



UT Martin must have thought the Govs interior line had at least this many people on every down in the 2019 meeting, when Austin Peay held the Skyhawks to minus-25 rushing yards in a 34-24 Homecoming win. Zak Wallace led the way for the Skyhawks with five rushing yards; Austin Peay had 20 carries that went for at least five yards against the Skyhawks.

ELEGANT ELLIS

Draylen Ellis was already turning heads with his early season performance, but he took it to another level against Southeast Missouri. The Olive Branch native tossed a school-record six touchdown passes against the Redhawks—four to Baniko Harley and one each to Jay Parker and Eugene Minter Jr.—on his way to STATS FCS National Freshman of the Week and OVC Offensive Player of the Week and Newcomer of the Week honors. He also was the first Gov to attempt at least 40 passes in a game since 2012 (Jake Ryan).

SNEAD WAGES WAR

On his first three touches against Tennessee State, Brian Snead made a house call—first, from 75 yards, then 67 yards, then 44 yards. He set an FCS single-quarter record with 204 yards on the ground and finished with 227 for the game, easily earning OVC Offensive Player of the Week, Newcomer of the Week and STATS FCS Offensive Player of the Week.

FAST FROSH

Every snap taken by an Austin Peay quarterback this spring has been taken by a freshman. Draylen Ellis and Bryce Robinson both threw their first collegiate touchdown pass against Tennessee Tech, Feb. 21, and Ellis has handled the snaps since then.

HOUSE OPENING

Freshman running back C.J. Evans made an immediate impression in front of a national audience. On his first touch – the Govs first touch from scrimmage – he broke off a 75-yard touchdown run. Evans finished two yards shy of his first 100-yard outing.

LEADING THE PACK

Wide receiver DeAngelo Wilson was named the Ohio Valley Conference's 2020 Preseason Offensive Player of the Year in July. He was a Second Team All-OVC pick in 2019 after he caught 89 passes (the ninth-most in OVC history) for 1,564 yards (first nationally and the second-most in OVC history) and 15 touchdowns (fifth-most in OVC history). Already, he's making those predictions look good, after posting 100-yard receiving games in his first two OVC outings, including posting 114 of Austin Peay's 118 yards through the air against Tennessee State.

WATCH OUT FOR WR2

The Govs might have the FCS' most potent 1-2 punch among receiver corps. Baniko Harley, who also was a Preseason First Team All-OVC selection, he set career highs in receptions (53) and yards (839) last season. Against Southeast Missouri, March 14, he tied a longstanding program record held by Red Roberts (twice) and Ron Blair with four touchdown receptions.

REVAMPED RUNNING BACK CORPS

Austin Peay saw three of its top four runners in 2019 depart the team due to graduation. Senior Ahmaad Tanner is the Govs top returning rusher after rank-

ing third on the team with 408 yards and five touchdowns last season; through six games, Snead is already at 522 rushing yards and four scores.

WILSON SETS SIGHTS ON RECORD

Thanks to his record-breaking 1,564 yards last season, Wilson (2,291 career receiving yards) is one of four APSU receivers with at least 2,000 career receiving yards. In his senior season, he needs 709 yards to break the APSU record held by APSU Hall of Fame member Harold "Red" Roberts (1967-70), who had 2,999 receiving yards.

HARLEY'S HOUSE OF HIGHLIGHTS

Baniko Harley proved to be a jack of all trades in 2019, with touchdowns as a passer (1), runner (4) and receiver (7). In a season filled with highlight-reel moments, he added another at Sacramento State, running for two touchdowns and catching another, including a 45-yard dash for a touchdown on a direct snap with the Govs facing 4th-and-1, which capped a drive that started with his own on-side kick recovery. He was up to his old tricks in the 2021 OVC opener, hauling in a 22-yard touchdown reception on a perfect back-shoulder fade by Draylen Ellis, then hauling in the aforementioned four scores against Southeast Missouri, along with passing for a two-point conversion to Brian Snead. Through six games, Harley's 30 points leads all Governor scorers.

OFFENSIVE LIGHTS

Twice last season, Austin Peay's offense churned out more than 500 yards in a game. The Govs opened the season with a 563-yard effort against North Carolina Central, August 29. Two months later, Tennessee Tech bore the full brunt of the Govs offensive capabilities, watching the Govs post 614 offensive yards – the fifth time since 1996 APSU has recorded 600-plus yards per game.

DEFENSIVE STANDS



FILL THE CULP

In his first start as a Governor, Elijah Culp snared two first-quarter interceptions against Southeast Missouri, the first Gov since 2019 (Kordell Jackson) with multiple picks in a game. Those interceptions, along with a half-tackle for loss, amp pass break up and six total tackles, helped Culp to earn OVC Defensive Player of the Week honors.

RARE RUSH

Austin Peay was in rare form in the league opener against Tennessee Tech, dropping Bailey Fisher for a program-record seven sacks in Cookeville. The Govs were in the backfield early and often, dropping the Golden Eagles behind the line 16 times and holding them to 50 rushing yards.

AT YOUR PERIL

Austin Peay held both Tennessee Tech and Tennessee State below 100 yards on the ground as a team to open the 2020-21 conference schedule; it marks the fifth time in eight games Austin Peay's league opponents have earned less than 100 yards on the ground, with an average of 95.5 yards given up during that time. Last season against UT Martin, the Govs crushed the run defense game against the Skyhawks, holding them to negative-25 yards on the ground.

JACK MAC IS BACK

Jack McDonald had a career day against Tennessee State with 11 tackles, 3.5 stops for loss, 1.5 sacks and the game-clinching pass break up on the game's final play in Austin Peay's win against the Tigers. He led an Austin Peay defense that limited Tennessee State to 98 rushing yards on 45 carries, with 13 total tackles behind the Tennessee State line of scrimmage.

PASS DENIALS

After recording four or more pass breakups five times in 2019, Austin Peay opened 2020 with an impressive five pass breakups and two interceptions in the opener against Central Arkansas. Junior cornerback Nathan Page and junior linebacker Jack McDonald each recorded an interception while junior safety Isiah Norman was credited with two breakups.

THIRD-AND-GONE

The Govs held Central Arkansas to 4-of-16 on third-down conversions in the season opener. After a 7-of-18 day on third down by Tennessee State, opponents are 31-of-85 on third down this season (36.5 percent).

- The Govs are even stingier on 3rd-and-long, with their first six opponents going just 10-of-46 (21.7 percent). Austin Peay limited opponents to 22.0 percent on 3rd-and-long (7-plus yards) opportunities in 2019.

DEFENDING THE PACK

After a Unanimous All-America campaign in 2019, nickelback Kordell Jackson returns to torment offenses again in 2020. The OVC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year had a hand in 10 of the Govs 25 turnovers gained and returned three of those for touchdowns (2 pick-sixes and a scoop-and-score). He was named to both the Athlon Sports and HERO Sports Preseason All-America Teams and picked up his season's first interception two weeks ago against Tennessee State.



ACTION JACKSON

After blocking a punt—the first of his career—at Southeast Missouri, Kordell Jackson is the most recent Gov with a blocked punt, an onside kick recovery and an interception returned for a touchdown; if the ball hits his hands, something good is happening for the Govs.

SHUTDOWN CENTRAL

The Govs held an opponent to fewer than 100 rushing yards in eight of its 15 games last season, including in its FCS Playoff Round 2 victory at Sacramento State (99 yards/19 carries). Austin Peay flexed its defensive credentials against UT Martin, limiting the Skyhawks to negative-25 rushing yards. It was the lowest rushing total by an APSU opponent since the Govs held Morehead State to an OVC-record minus-88 yards in 1983.

BACKFIELD MARAUDERS

Austin Peay has reocurred double-digit tackles for loss in three-straight games to start the spring portion of the 2020 football season. The Governors made a season-high 16 tackles for loss in the spring opener at Tennessee Tech, Feb. 21, which is tied with Central Arkansas for the best single-game total in the FCS this season.

- Thirteen different Governors earned at least a half-tackle for loss in the OVC opener at Tennessee Tech, led by Jackson with 3.0. Jackson, Elijah Shepard, Matthew Gayle, Jack McDonald and Troy Henderson Jr. each had multiple stops behind the line of scrimmage.
- Twenty-one different Governors have posted at least a half-tackle for loss this season. Kordell Jackson has picked up a team-best 7.5 tackles for loss, Jack McDonald (7 TFL), Terrell Lucas (5.5 TFL), and Troy Henderson Jr. (4.5 TFL) are the other Governors with more than 3 TFLs this season.
- The Govs are averaging 9 tackles for loss per game, which is tied with UT Martin for the 12th-best mark in the FCS and the OVC lead.

NO LANDING ENDZONE

Austin Peay punters have not punted into the end zone in 22 consecutive games. The Govs last touchback on a punt came off the foot of Jeremiah Oatsvall on Nov. 3, 2018 against Eastern Kentucky. Since that touchdown, APSU punters have 126 punts without a touchback, averaging 35.4 yards per punt – 48 of those boots have stayed inside the 20-yard line.

LONG SNAPPER SHORTAGE

Unfortunately, none of the Govs three long snappers by trade made the trip to Central Arkansas. Instead, linebacker Cameron Miller and defensive back Johnathon Edwards were called upon to handle the long snapping duties.

RIGNEY BLASTS OFF

In his second game as a Gov, Matthew Rigney became the first Gov since Ben Campbell in 2014 with a 10-punt game; one of those was a 65-yard blast that ended inside the Tennessee State 20-yard line, it was the first 60-yard boot by a Gov since Devin Stuart against Jacksonville State in 2018.

GOVERNORS GUIDE



PLENTY OF NEW FACES

In its season-opening outing against Central Arkansas, Austin Peay utilized 11 first-time starters. Six of those new faces came on offense and included freshman running back C.J. Evans, who took his first touch to the house – a 75-yard touchdown run on the first play from scrimmage. In all, 17 first-year Govs have made at least one start this season.

DIPLOMA IN ONE HAND

Last May, two members of the Governors – Senior defensive end Matthew Gayle (BBA, Management) and senior safety Rodney Saulsberry Jr. (BBA, Marketing) – received their bachelor's degree and have returned to play in 2020. In addition, three transfers joined the Govs after earning degrees at their previous stops: Linebacker Troy Henderson Jr., quarterback Vito Priore and tight end William Wilcox.



NFL CONNECTION

Two of the Governors incoming freshmen have familial ties to the NFL

- Freshman safety Kory Chapman: Father Kory (Indianapolis, 2005)
- Freshman wide receiver Manny Scott: Father Freddie (Atlanta and Indianapolis, 1996-98) and grandfather Freddie Sr. (Baltimore and Detroit, 1974-93)

LOOKING BACK AT 2019...

ALL-OVC DOMINANCE

A program-record 11 Austin Peay football players – 7 first-teamers, 2 second and 2 all-newcomer – earned postseason honors from the Ohio Valley Conference, befitting their status as league champions for 2019. The seven first-team selections tied the program record set in 1965. The nine first and second team honorees combined set the program record as did the 11 picks across all squads.

DROUGHT EXTINGUISHED

The Govs 2019 OVC title they ended the FCS' second-longest drought between conference titles. Austin Peay's 1977-2019 drought is only eclipsed by Columbia's Ivy League active title drought which began in 1961.

HOME IS WHERE THE WINS ARE

Austin Peay finished 2019 with a 6-1 record at Fortera Stadium, including its FCS Playoffs' Round 1 victory against Furman. It is the third consecutive year the Govs have lost just one regular-season home game. Austin Peay is 15-3 at Fortera Stadium over the last four seasons.

GOVS VS. RANKED FOES

- For the third time since 2009, multiple ranked foes visited Fortera Stadium. In 2019, Furman was the fourth ranked opponent to visit Fortera this season.
- The Govs have defeated at least one ranked foe in each of those seasons with multiple ranked visitors: No. 11 Jacksonville State, No. 20 Southeast Missouri and No. 16 Furman this season, No. 18 UT Martin in 2017 and No. 20 Eastern Kentucky in 2009.
- For the first time since 2009, an OVC member played ranked opponents in three consecutive home games.

JOINING AN ELITE GROUP OF GOVS

The Govs football team became the latest Austin Peay team to win an NCAA tournament contest, joining the men's basketball and baseball programs. AP-SU's men's basketball team famously downed Illinois in the 1986 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship. The Govs baseball team picked up wins in both the 2012 and 2013 NCAA Baseball Championships.

LAST ONE IN

Austin Peay was the last active OVC member to make an FCS Playoff appearance. With their appearance every current member of the OVC has appeared in the postseason at least once. The Govs are first-time playoff participants along with Sacramento State, their appearances reducing the number of active FCS teams that have not made a playoff appearance to 27.

SUCCESSFUL DEBUT

With its opening round win against Furman, the Govs became the first OVC member to win their debut in the FCS Playoffs since 2000 (Western Kentucky) and only the fourth to do so in league history.

TWO IN HAND

With its win over Sacramento State in the second round of the FCS Playoffs, Austin Peay became just the 10th team in OVC history to win multiple playoff games in the same season.

TWO-FER DEBUTS

The Govs followed up their winning debut by picking up a second win in their first FCS Playoff appearance. They became the 20th team in FCS Playoff history to win two or more games in their first playoff appearance – and only the second since the bracket expanded to 24 teams in 2013, joining the 2017 Kenesaw State team that saw its campaign end in the quarterfinal round.

SCOTTY WALDEN

Head Coach • First Season

Career Record: 9-7 • Sul Ross State, 2012

Innovative and energetic are two words Austin Peay State University Director of Athletics Gerald Harrison used to describe his hiring of Scotty Walden as the university's 21st head football coach in November 2020.

Walden, who at age 30 is the youngest head coach at the Division I level, takes over at Austin Peay after serving as head coach at Southern Miss to start the 2020 season. He was named the Golden Eagles' head coach after the opening game of the 2020 campaign after three seasons on the USM staff, including one season as co-offensive coordinator.

Considered one of the youngest and brightest offensive minds in collegiate football, the American Football Coaches Association tabbed Walden as a Top 35 coach under 35 years of age in 2019.

Prior to his move to Southern Miss, Walden was the head coach at East Texas Baptist during the 2016 season. Promoted following Joshua Eargle's departure to join Austin Peay's coaching staff as offensive line coach and run game coordinator, he was the youngest head coach (26 years old) at any NCAA school that season. He led the Tigers to a 7-3 mark in his lone season at the ETBU helm, and they led all Division III teams in scoring offense (49.9 points per game) while finishing second in total offense (564.3 yards per game) and sixth in passing offense (365.3 yards per game).

In his three years as offensive coordinator at ETBU, Walden's offense re-wrote the program's record book for individual, single game, and season records while being nationally known for passing and scoring. In his time as an assistant, ETBU football student-athletes broke a combined 26 individual and team records.

A highly regarded offensive innovator, Walden has shared his philosophies on the national level with his peers. In summer 2015, he was a special speaker at the Spread Offense Football Clinic in Chicago. His first national speaking engagement came when he was a special speaker at the 2012 Nike Coach of the Year Clinic in Dallas.

Walden and his wife Callie have a son, Luca.

MONTGOMERY, Ala. – In a game that simmered along for 56 minutes, Austin Peay's football team and Central Arkansas brought the game to a rolling boil by trading touchdowns in the final four minutes, with the Governors falling by a 24-17 margin in the Guardian Credit Union FCS Kickoff, Saturday, at the Cramton Bowl.

The game's first two touchdowns came in the opening moments of each half. Austin Peay got the game's first score when freshman running back C.J. Evans dashed for a 75-yard score on the game's opening play from scrimmage. After the teams traded field goals the rest of the half, Central Arkansas took the lead in the first minute of the second half on Kierr Crossley's 34-yard run.

But Austin Peay got the ball with four minutes left and quarterback Jeremiah Oatsvall mustered the offense to a seven-play, 60-yard scoring drive for a 17-16 lead. On the ensuing drive, Central Arkansas Breylin Smith responded by leading the Bears to a 6-play, 78-yard drive that needed just 1:06 to regain the lead and a two-point conversion set the final score.

Oatsvall completed 14-of-31 passes for 181 yards and a touchdown. Evans, in his first game as a Governor, had 10 carries for 98 yards and a touchdown. Junior linebacker Jack McDonald had eight tackles and an interception to pace the APSU defense.

CINCINNATI – Running back CJ Evans broke off his second big touchdown run of the fall campaign and Austin Peay's football team put up double digits against No. 13 Cincinnati, falling 55-20, Saturday at Nippert Field.

Unlike the previous week, the Austin Peay (0-3) pieced together a trio of drives lasting more than 10 plays and scored on each of the drives. The Governors went 62 yards in 14 plays on their first drive, with kicker Grant Paulette hitting a 30-yard field goal. On its opening drive of the second half, Austin Peay used 15 plays to cover 63 yards and setup Paulette's second field goal – this one a 29-yarder.

But a fourth-quarter drive showed the promise of an upcoming spring slate as quarterback Jeremiah Oatsvall and wide receiver Baniko Harley connected twice for big plays to convert third-down opportunities. A 16-yard completion was followed by a 49-yarder to get the Govs deep in Cincinnati territory. From there CJ Evans carried the ball in for a touchdown.

But Evans reminded fans of his 75-yard season-opening score when he found a seam through the defense late in the fourth quarter and dashed 64 yards for a touchdown.

No. 13 Cincinnati (1-0) opened its season by scoring on each of its first four drives with Gerrid Doaks scoring three touchdowns in the opening span as Cincinnati took a 28-3 lead into halftime. Doaks would tack on his fourth touchdown – via a reception – late in the third quarter to stave off a potential Govs threat.

COOKEVILLE – In the first game of the Scotty Walden Era for Austin Peay football, the Govs dropped a 27-21 decision despite more than doubling up Tennessee Tech in total yardage in a Sunday afternoon battle at Tucker Stadium.

The story of the game was the short fields battled by the Govs defense – seven TTU drives started in Austin Peay territory, including five inside the Austin Peay 25-yard line.

With Tennessee Tech taking over on the Austin Peay 18-yard line following an interception, the Governor defense stood tall and a Jack McDonald sack on third down ended any chance of a touchdown and led to a 25-yard field goal.

On the first drive of the second quarter the Govs faced a third-and-long, but the down and distance wound up not mattering when Draylen Ellis placed a perfect back-shoulder fade into the hands of Baniko Harley from 22 yards away.

On third-and-nine after forcing TTU to punt to start the second half, Ellis hit DeAngelo Wilson for 11 yards and a first down, then scrambled for 13 and 20 yards on back-to-back plays to take the Govs into TTU territory. Two plays later, it was an Ellis-to-Wilson connection that once again brought the Govs inside the 20. On the next play Ellis called his own number, made a couple of players miss and rolled into the end zone 16 yards later for his first career rushing score.

The fourth quarter began with TTU on the Austin Peay 10-yard line for a second-and-three. On a third-and-goal situation, Gist took a direct snap and found paydirt to give the Golden Eagles their first lead since the first quarter. With 10:15 left to play, another direct snap to Gist from three yards out made it a 24-14 game. A fourth-quarter 32-yard field goal added to TTU's final tally.

The Govs mounted a late rally when Bryce Robinson marched the offense down the field and found Wilson for a 14-yard touchdown strike. The Govs pulled off the recovery on Ashton Dodd's onside kick, but Robinson's final hail mary attempt on the last play was unsuccessful.

CLARKSVILLE – The first win of the Scotty Walden era is in the books. The Govs used another outstanding defensive effort and an incredible early rushing performance by Brian Snead to fight through a first-half downpour and take down Tennessee State in a 27-20 OVC victory from Fortera Stadium.

On Snead's first three carries of the first quarter, the redshirt sophomore back ran for 186 yards and a trio of touchdowns. At the end of the first quarter, Snead racked up 204 yards on the ground – the FCS record for a single quarter – and three scores to give the Governors a 20-0 lead.

Tennessee State got its first real scoring opportunity early in the second quarter when a blocked punt put the Tigers deep in Austin Peay territory to start the drive. After holding Tennessee State out of the endzone on three-straight plays, a chip-shot Antonio Zita field goal attempt in the driving rain was mis-hit and the Govs kept the Tigers off the board for another drive. But, eventually the Tigers broke through with a Deveon Bryant-to-Vincent Perry 19-yard strike late in the second quarter.

A third-quarter field goal brought the Tigers within 10 points but Austin Peay quickly made it a three-score game again late in the frame. On Austin Peay's first down two drives later, freshman quarterback Draylen Ellis lofted a beautiful throw to DeAngelo Wilson for 48 yards to the Tennessee State 14. Two CJ Evans Jr. rushes later and the Govs were once more in the end zone.

After a Kordell Jackson interception, the Govs fumbled to give the ball back to Tennessee State. Zita hit from 29 yards on TSU's ensuing drive to draw the contest closer, and the Tigers forced a three-and-out and drew within a score after Isaiah Green hit Cam Wyche from six yards out with 6:48 remaining.

With a 1:32 left in the game, Tennessee State's third quarterback of the day marched the Tigers down the field, but Jack McDonald broke up a pass at the goal line to secure the win for Austin Peay on the field play of the game.

CLARKSVILLE – Austin Peay pulled out another heart-stopper in a visit to Houck Stadium toppling SEMO 49-42 in a double-overtime affair thanks to record-breaking performances by Baniko Harley and Draylen Ellis.

After the Govs blocked a punt, Brian Snead bounced outside, broke a tackle and raced 41 yards to the end zone. Then Elijah Culp's first interception of the day set up the Govs near midfield and a 4-yard pass from Ellis to Harley on third and goal had the Govs in the endzone again.

After SEMO's first score in the second quarter, Ellis threw a 71-yard touchdown to Jay Parker. But SEMO scored the half's final 14 points and led 21-20.

After a scoreless third quarter, Ellis threw a 28-yard touchdown strike to Eugene Minter and Govs converted the two-point conversion, but SEMO responded quickly and the game was tied at 28.

AUSTIN PEAY FOOTBALL FORTERA STADIUM



For nearly eight decades, Fortera Stadium has served as the home of Austin Peay State University football along with the University's track and field teams.

Austin Peay has played football in its current location since 1946. However, following the 2015 season, the university embarked on the biggest construction project dedicated to football in its history.

What resulted is a \$19-million facility that has four levels on its west side. On the lower level is the player locker room, featuring new dark wood lockers with nameplates to recognize some of the donors that made them possible. Also on that level is a players lounge; athletic training room and equipment room.

Fans on levels 3 and 4 find the amenities of club seating and skyboxes – new features to the stadium. The skyboxes, which feature a sports-bar like atmosphere, feature tiered stadium-type seating with up to 22 seats per viewing room. In addition, each skybox has a bar with locations for bar stools, tables and chairs to seat four to six people.

The Governors Stadium skyboxes have sliding glass at the front of the viewing rooms, a push button to control a public address speaker and two television monitors.

The main concourses feature enhanced concession stands along with sport murals created to honor memorable Govs players and teams, with the hopes more will be created for future stars. The conference champions from 1948 and 1977 have wall spaces as well as the program's only back-to-back eight-win seasons in 1964 and 1965.

Meanwhile, the field itself has been replaced with its fourth artificial turf, FieldTurf XT, manufactured by FieldTurf, a Tarkett Sports Company. The turf, includes the new Governors logo at midfield.

Outside the southwest corner of the stadium, the Hendricks Fox Walk in the Blake Jenkins Plaza lists the names of all lettermen to wear the red and white.

The new stadium also created a revamped tailgating experience in a more central location outside the stadium.

In April 2016, following the Spring Game, a ceremony was held outside the stadium to celebrate its rechristening into Fortera Stadium. Country singer Maggie Rose performed before fans enjoyed a fireworks show.

In March 2017, construction completed on a new weight room project inside Fortera Stadium. The state-of-the-art facility will service not only Austin Peay football but a host of the department's programs. The new space will free up the weight room in the Dunn Center and houses racks, free weights and treadmills in the facility.

In 2018, additions to the athletic training facility were completed to better care for the student-athletes.

The original Municipal Stadium was constructed in time for the 1946 season as a joint project between the City of Clarksville, Montgomery County and then what was Austin Peay State College. The stadium became the home field for local schools and APSC for football games and track events.

The city maintained its ownership and operation of the Municipal Stadium until 1970. In that year, as a result of a cooperative agreement saw the city convey title to one-third of the stadium to the State of Tennessee for the university. The

other one-third went to Montgomery County.

Austin Peay, Montgomery County, and the city of Clarksville were authorized to appropriate funds to the newly created Stadium Authority for constructing, remodeling and operating the stadium, including adding east side seating. The members of the Stadium Authority were appointed by the county and by the university.

In addition, the natural grass surface—because it was being used by the local schools and Governors alike—was replaced by AstroTurf and the east side two-level press box was constructed in 1979.

The stadium was in desperate need of a new turf in the early 1990s. However, the Clarksville-Montgomery County school system, which was amidst growth and expansion, indicated it could not afford to be a part of the turf replacement. As a result, Austin Peay agreed to purchase Municipal Stadium from the Stadium Authority in 1993.

Stadia Turf replaced the AstroTurf, which was placed by the Stadium Authority, before 1993 season's start. The playing surface was changed again in 2004, when PolyTurf surfaces were installed on the football field (Mega Grass) and track (PolyTurf WSS 15).

Other than a new scoreboard being erected for the 2007 season, those were the last major upgrades until plans were announced Aug. 20, 2012 to all but replace Governors Stadium when \$16 million was approved by the state for new construction.

A ceremonial demolition of Governors Stadium began following the 2015 season-ending Nov. 19 contest against Southeast Missouri. Despite the coldest winter in recent memory, including icy conditions that shut down the University for three days, the construction crew lost just one day of work.
