GOVS BY THE NUMBERS

6	Quarterback Mike DiLiello is tied for the FCS lead with six passing touchdowns this season. DiLiello tossed a pair of touchdowns in the season opener at WKU before firing a career-best four touchdown passes against Presbyterian.
14	Drae McCray leads the FCS with 14 receptions this season after making seven catches in each of the first two games. The sophomore receiver also ranks second in the FCS with 203 receiving yards and 260 all-purpose yards.
43	Austin Peay has intercepted a pass and forced a fumble in its first two games and now has 43 turnovers gained since the start of the 2020 season – which is tied for the fourth most in the FCS during that stretch.
683	Head coach Scotty Walden was hired on Oct. 27, 2020. 683 days later he will coach his 20th game and the third of his third season at Austin Peay, despite not having been the head coach for two full calendar years.

AT THE KICKOFF

GOOD DIRECTIONS

In the past five seasons, Austin Peay's 35 victories are tied for the 15th most in the FCS and are the most in a five-year stretch in program history. Awaiting the Governors in the ASUN Conference are three other teams that rank in the top 15 in the FCS in wins during the past five seasons – Kennesaw State (49, 3rd), Jacksonville State (42, t-7th), and Central Arkansas (35, t-15th).

FRESHMAN MONOPOLY

A week after kicker Maddux Trujillo and wide receiver Kam Thomas were named the ASUN Special Teams Player of the Week and Freshman of the Week, respectively, Jevon Jackson became the second-straight Governor to earn ASUN Freshman of the Week honors. Jackson rushed for a career-best 167 yards and a touchdown against Presbyterian and his rushing total was the best single-game mark by a Governor since Brian Snead ran for 227 yards against Tennessee State (2/28/21).

WALDEN; OR, LIFE AT AUSTIN PEAY

In his first 390 days at Austin Peay, Scotty Walden coached the Gobs through 17 games in a 273-day span. His ten wins during that time are tied with Watson Brown (10-7, 1979-80) and only College Football Hall of Fame coach Boots Donnelly (11-6, 1977-78) has more wins through his first 17 games at Austin Peay. After picking up his 11th win against Presbyterian, Walden has a chance to secure the third-most wins by an Austin Peay head coach in their first 20 games with a win against Mississippi Valley State.

PRESEASON PROPAGANDA

In the inaugural ASUN Football Preseason Coaches Poll, Austin Peay received a first-place vote but was tabbed to finish fifth in the league with 15 points. Kennesaw State was picked atop the league with four first-place votes and 34 points, while Central Arkansas – who received a single first-place vote – and Eastern Kentucky were tied for second with 25 points. Fourth-place Jacksonville State received 19 points and North Alabama rounded out the poll with 8 points.

THE GANG GETS PRESEASON ALL-ASUN HONORS

Sophomore wide receiver Drae McCray, graduate transfer defensive lineman Chukwuemeka Manning Jr., junior defensive back Shamari Simmons, and sophomore kicker Maddux Trujillo were all named to the inaugural ASUN Football Preseason All-Conference team at Media Day in Atlanta. McCray and Trujillo earned First Team and Second Team All-OVC honors, respectively, last season, while Simmons' four-interception, 50-tackle, and 10-PBU season somehow didn't earn All-OVC recognition. Manning was a Third Team All-MEAC selection in 2021 after racking up 5.0 TFL and 2.0 sacks in his final season at North Carolina Central.

NEW KIDS IN STACHEVILLE

50 newcomers and 25 players that redshirted a season ago combine with 40 returning letterwinners to make up the 2022 Austin Peay football roster. The 50 newcomers are made up of 23 transfers – with nine players having Group of Five experience and a pair of players having Power Five experience – and 27 true freshmen.

LAST TIME OUT

Austin Peay improved to 7-1 in home openers at Fortera Stadium when it routed Presbyterian, 63-0, in the second-biggest shutout win in program history. The Governors' 63-point margin of victory was the largest against another Division I team this season. The shutout was the first of the Scotty Walden Era and was the first since the Gobs shutout Presbyterian, 24-0, in 2018.

UP NEXT

Austin Peay hits the road for its second-consecutive game against the SWAC when it travels to Alabama A&M for a 2 p.m., Sept. 17 contest at Louis Crews Stadium in Huntsville, Alabama. The first-ever meeting between the Governors and Bulldogs will serve as Austin Peay's final tuneup before they host Eastern Kentucky for their first ASUN Conference game.

NOTING THIS WEEK'S GAME

DENOTING THE DELTA DEVILS
PRESEASON OUTLOOK

MVSU finished fifth in the SWAC's East Division after going 4-7 overall and 3-5 in the conference last season. This season, the Delta Devils were tabbed to finish sixth in the league's east division after receiving just 35 points in the SWAC's preseason poll, which is five points less than Texas Southern, who was picked last in the West Division.

OFFENSIVE OPTIONS

MVSU returns their leading passer, leading rusher, and leading receiver from 2021 in QB Jalani Eason, RB Caleb Johnson, and WR Jacory Rankin. But the Delta Devils ranked 10th in the SWAC in total offense (311.1 yards) and 11th in scoring offense (19.6 ppg) last season. Eason threw for 1,533 yards and 10 touchdowns last season, with 682 yards and four touchdown grabs going to Rankin.

DEFENSIVE DEFINITION

The Delta Devils led the SWAC and ranked 26th in the FCS with 13 interceptions last season. Kenneth Martin and Caleb Brunson lead the returners on defense with two picks in 2021. MVSU also ranked 12th in the FCS with 7.4 TFL per game last season and will return the trio of Jalen Bell (9.5 TFL), Ronnie Thomas (8.0), and Deione Reed (7.0). Thomas, Bell, and Brunson are all preseason All-SWAC selections.

PLAYER TO WATCH

After rushing for a league-leading 1,018 yards and eight touchdowns last season, MVSU running back Caleb Johnson was named a preseason First Team All-SWAC selection by the league's head coaches and SIDs, HBCU Sports, and Phil Steele. Also a BOXTOROW HBCU Preseason All-American, Johnson rushed for 78 yards and a touchdown in the season opener against Tarleton. The redshirt junior averages 14.8 carries per game, which ranks 10th among active players in the FCS.

LOOKING BACK



The last time Austin Peay played a team from Mississippi, **CJ Evans Jr. (#23)** 🏈 led the Gobs with 74 rushing yards and a 40-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter at Ole Miss. Evans averaged 10.6 yards per carry on seven rushes. Drae McCray added 87 yards on six catches while Koby Perry and Shamari Simmons both made a team-best 11 tackles on the defensive side, with Simmons also forcing and recovering a fumble.

THE FIRST-MEETING, NOTABLY

APSU-MVSU

- This is the first-ever meeting between Austin Peay and Mississippi Valley State.

VERSUS THE SWAC

- This is the Governors' first-ever game against a team from the Southwest Athletic Conference.
- Austin Peay will play its second game against the SWAC when it travels to Alabama A&M next week.

VERSUS THE MAGNOLIA STATE

- This is the first time the Gobs have hosted a team from Mississippi since they beat Delta State, 20-0, on Oct. 10, 1953.
- The Gobs are 1-1 against teams from Mississippi in games played in Clarksville, with both games against Delta State.
- The Governors are 2-4 all-time against teams from Mississippi, with a 2-2 record against Delta State and a loss to both Ole Miss and Southern Miss.
- Austin Peay has six players that call the 20th state home – Jalen Armstrong, Gavin Campbell, Ryan Melton, Aaron Odom, KT Owens, and Kam Ruffin.

ON THIS DATE

SEPTEMBER 10

- Saturday's game will be the fifth time the Governors have played on Sept. 10.
- The Gobs are 2-3 on this date all-time and last won on this day during the 2005 season when they beat Cumberland, 24-15, in Clarksville.
- The Governors are 1-2 on this date in games played in Clarksville.
- Austin Peay lost its last game on this date in 2016, falling to Tennessee Tech, 41-7, at Fortera Stadium in Clarksville.
- The last time the Gobs played on Sept. 10, Timarious Mitchell threw for 128 yards and a touchdown, which was caught by Marvin Franklin, but that was the only time the Gobs were able to find the endzone against the Golden Eagles. Gunnar Scholato led the defense with 11 tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss.

OFFENSIVE OUTPUT

FIREWORK SHOW

Austin Peay's 63 points scored in a shutout win against Presbyterian were the fourth-most points scored in a single game in program history. The Governors also racked up 609 yards of total offense, which is the seventh-best single-game mark in program history and the eighth-best total in the FCS this season. The Govs ran 93 plays on offense against the Blue Hose, which is the second-most in program history only behind a 97-play outing against UT Martin (11/10/97). The Govs also rushed for 308 yards against Presbyterian, which is the eighth-best mark in the FCS this year.

MIKE D THE QB

Austin Peay quarterback Mike DiLiello is tied for the FCS lead with six passing touchdowns and 48 points responsible for this season. DiLiello ranks seventh in the FCS with 377 passing yards and he ranks 16th in the country in completion percentage (.681) and passing efficiency (169.1). Last time out, DiLiello completed 18 passes for 254 yards and four touchdowns while also running for 26 yards and a touchdown, despite just playing the first 34:07 of the contest against Presbyterian. DiLiello is the first APSU quarterback to throw for four touchdowns in a game since Draylen Ellis against Tennessee Tech (11/20/21).



THE DRAE MCCRAY SHOW

A HERO Sports Freshman All-American and First Team All-OVC selection last season, sophomore Drae McCray leads the FCS with 14 receptions and ranks second in the country in receiving yards (203) and all-purpose yards (260) -- he also leads the ASUN Conference in all three categories. The Preseason All-ASUN Conference selection has led the Governors in receiving in both games this season, with seven catches for 90 yards and two touchdowns against Western Kentucky and then seven catches for 113 yards against Presbyterian. The 100-yard performance against Presbyterian marked the third time in his last five games that McCray has topped the century mark in receiving yards.

JJ AND CJ

The duo of Jevon Jackson and CJ Evans Jr. rushed for 167 and 106 yards, respectively, against Presbyterian, making them the first Austin Peay tandem to rush for 100-plus yards in the same game since Ahmaad Tanner and Brian Snead ran for 134 and 133 yards, respectively, at Murray State in 2021. Evans Jr. found the endzone twice in the contest and Jackson punched it in once.

DOUBLE DEUCE

Jevon Jackson was named the ASUN Freshman of the Week, Sept. 5, after running for a career-high 167 yards and a touchdown against Presbyterian. Jackson's 167 yards on the ground was the most by a Gov since Brian Snead ran for 227 yards against Tennessee State (2/28/21). Before the game against PC, Jackson had run for just 35 yards and a touchdown in three career games.

BIG PLAY CJ

Few players have had a better start to their college football career than running back CJ Evans Jr., who exploded for a 75-yard touchdown run on the first play from scrimmage in the 2020 FCS Kickoff Classic against Central Arkansas in Montgomery. Now a junior, Evans put together his best game as a Gov against Presbyterian, running for a career-high 104 yards and two touchdowns. It was the second time in his career he has run for multiple touchdowns in a game.

ALL THE GOVERNORS' RECEIVERS

Four players in the ASUN have caught a league-leading two touchdowns this season and three of them play for Austin Peay. Drae McCray hauled in a pair of touchdowns to open the season at Western Kentucky and then Josh DeCambré and Trey Goodman each caught a pair of touchdowns against Presbyterian. Eastern Kentucky's Dakota Allen is the only player in the ASUN with multiple touchdown grabs that does not play for the Governors.

JOSH SAMUEL REVENGE TOUR

Austin Peay is the only team in college football that has both Western Kentucky and Jacksonville State on the schedule this season. That matters because graduate transfer running back Josh Samuel began his career at Western Kentucky, where he rushed for 658 yards and a touchdown in 16 games, before transferring to Jacksonville State, where he rushed for 1,487 yards and 14 touchdowns with another 479 yards and two touchdowns coming through the air. In his first game as a Governor against Western Kentucky, Samuel rushed 20 times for 77 yards and caught two passes for seven yards.

AND HE CAN PASS

Aside from catching two passes for 11 yards, sophomore wide receiver Trey Goodman completed a 39-yard pass to James Burns on a wide-receiver pass in the season opener against Western Kentucky. Goodman is the first non-quarterback to complete a pass for the Govs since Baniko Harley completed an 18-yard pass to DeAngelo Wilson against Tennessee State (2/28/21). Harley was also the last Governors' non-QB to throw a touchdown pass, finding Wilson for a 40-yard score against North Carolina Central (8/29/19). Goodman, like Harley, played quarterback during his prep career before moving to wide receiver.

HEIR APPARENT

Kyrin Moore. D.J. Montgomery. DeAngelo Wilson. Baniko Harley. And now Drae McCray. The 5-9 receiver from Tallahassee, Florida is the heir apparent to what has become quite the wide receiver tradition at Austin Peay. McCray was the Governors' leading receiver as a true freshman with 53 catches for 882 yards -- the eighth-best single-season mark at APSU -- and eight touchdowns -- the seventh-best single-season mark in program history. McCray wrapped up his freshman season with a 15th-place finish in the Jerry Rice Award voting, which is presented to the national freshman player of the year in the FCS.

DEFENSIVE STANDS

NO POINTS FOR YOU

Austin Peay recorded its first shutout of the Scotty Walden Era when it beat Presbyterian, 63-0, in Week 1. The shutout was the first by the Governors since they blanked Presbyterian, 24-0, in the 2018 home opener. The Gobs also held their opponent without a touchdown for the first time since they beat Furman, 42-6, in the opening round of the 2019 FCS Playoffs at Fortera Stadium.

STUFFING THE RUN

In 17 FCS games under the Walden-Kappas regime, Austin Peay has not allowed an opponent to rush for more than 200 yards. The Gobs have held an opponent to fewer than 100 yards seven times, including a 51-yard rushing day for Tennessee State (11/13/21) and an 89-yard rushing day for Presbyterian last week. Against FCS foes, Austin Peay has not allowed more than the 197 yards it surrendered to Southeast Missouri in Week 6 of the 2021 season, when the Redhawks ran the ball 56 times and averaged just 3.5 yards per carry. The Governors are allowing just 98 rushing yards per game this season, which is the best mark in the FCS of any team that has played more than once this season.

THIRD-AND-GONE

The Austin Peay defense did its job in getting the high-powered Western Kentucky offense off the field in the season opener, forcing five three-and-outs and holding the Hilltoppers to just a 35.7 percent (5-14) conversion rate on third downs. The Governors again were solid on third down against Presbyterian, forcing four three-and-outs and holding the Blue Hose to a 20 percent (3-15) conversion rate. The Gobs' defense leads FCS teams that have played more than once with a 27.6 third-down conversion percentage (8-29), despite having faced the second-most third-down attempts in the FCS.

THE ANT-MAN

After recording five tackles and his first-career sack in the home opener against Presbyterian, linebacker Antoine Williams leads the ASUN in tackles (19) and ranks second in the league in solo tackles (9) this season. Williams made the most of his first career start at Western Kentucky, racking up a team-leading 14 tackles with eight solo stops. The 14 tackles against the Hilltoppers were the most by an Austin Peay player since the 2021 Ohio Valley Conference Defensive Player of the Year Koby Perry made 16 tackles at UT Martin (10/31/21). Prior to the Week Zero game against the WKU, Williams had recorded just nine tackles in 13 games played as a Governor.

RUDOLPH WRECKS IT

Austin Peay linebacker Josh Rudolph ranks third in the ASUN with 16 total tackles and leads the league with 13 solo stops this season – he is the only player in the conference with double-digit solo tackles. Rudolph made a then career-high seven tackles with six solo stops in the season opener against Western Kentucky before besting that effort with a nine-tackle, seven-solo tackle outing against Presbyterian in the home opener.



STONE-COLD TAKEAWAYS

In 2021, Austin Peay led the Ohio Valley Conference and ranked fifth in the FCS with 27 turnovers gained, intercepting 19 passes and recovering eight fumbles. The Governors' 19 turnovers gained by interceptions alone were more than four OVC team's total turnovers gained last season. After intercepting a pass and recovering a fumble in the first two games of 2022, the Gobs have forced 43 turnovers in the past three seasons – 39 of which have come in the 19 games under the Walden-Kappas regime – which is tied with Central Arkansas for the fourth-most in the FCS, only Stephen F. Austin (50), South Dakota State (47), and James Madison (44) have forced more turnovers during that stretch.

J-McCRAY CLEARS THE WAY

East Carolina transfer J'Vian McCray had a career day against Presbyterian, posting career-highs with four tackles – including three solo stops – and two tackles for loss – the first two TFLs of his collegiate career. The 6-0, 323-pound defensive lineman also added a quarterback hurry and set the Governors' offense up at the Presbyterian seven-yard line when he forced and recovered a fumble late in the third quarter.

SHAMARI SHUTDOWN

Last season, defensive back Shamari Simmons recorded 50 tackles, four interceptions, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery, and an OVC-leading 10 pass breakups. Now a Preseason All-ASUN Conference selection, Simmons has recorded five tackles, an interception, and two pass breakups – which is tied for the most in the ASUN – to start the 2022 season.

THE TACKLING TRANSFER

A two-time Second Team All-SoCon selection at VMI, graduate transfer defensive back Ethan Caselberry recorded 270 tackles, 12 tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks, 23 pass breakups, and 2 interceptions in four seasons as a Keydet. After making five tackles in his first two games as a Governor, Caselberry ranks sixth among active FCS players with 275 tackles and 145 solo tackles.

THAT'S STONE COLD'S MUSIC

For the first time since Oct. 2, 2021, Austin Peay failed to intercept a pass when they played Presbyterian. The Governors had intercepted a pass in a program-record seven-straight games and had multiple interceptions in five-straight games against FCS opponents. The Gobs racked up 16 picks during that seven-game stretch, including a program-record six interceptions in a 42-26 win over Eastern Illinois (11/6/21) at Fortera Stadium.

SPECIAL TEAMS HIGHLIGHTS

ANT WITH THE BLOCK

Redshirt sophomore linebacker Antoine Williams made an impact on special teams against Presbyterian, blocking a punt on the first play of the second quarter to set the offense up on PC's 20-yard line. The Governors threw a 20-yard touchdown pass two plays later to take a 28-0 lead. Williams' blocked punt is the first by a Gov since Drae McCray blocked a punt and then returned it 20 yards for a touchdown at Tennessee State (11/13/21).

MATT RIGNEY'S DAY OFF

Eighty-three players took the field for Austin Peay in Saturday's 63-0 blowout win against Presbyterian in the home opener at Fortera Stadium... but punter Matt Rigney was not one of them. The redshirt junior's services were not needed and he was held off the field for the first time in his APSU career.

RIGNEY IS THAT GUY

Redshirt junior Matt Rigney was named to the 2022 FCS Punter of the Year Preseason Watchlist, the Augusta Sports Council announced in August. A Second Team All-OVC selection last season, Rigney averaged 40.73 yards per kick – the fifth-best mark in program history – while becoming just the third Gov to average 40 yards per punt in a season. Rigney started the 2022 season with five punts at Western Kentucky, averaging 43.4 yards per kick with no touchbacks and one punt downed inside the 20-yard line.

RILEY LIFTS OFF

Riley Stephens made kick-coverage duties pretty simple for the Governors in the season opener, blasting all six kickoff attempts deep into or through the end zone for touchbacks at Western Kentucky. Against Presbyterian, Stephens had just four touchbacks on 10 kickoffs, but he had three kicks that pinned the Blue Hose inside their own 25-yard line. Stephens has now recorded 44 touchbacks on 85 career kick off attempts at Austin Peay.

KAM CAN FLY

Kam Thomas played in just four games in 2021 due to a season-ending injury but still managed to lead the Govs in kick (120) and punt (65) return yards. In the 2022 season opener, the redshirt freshman picked up right where he left off and broke a 33-yard punt return that set the Govs up on Western Kentucky's 41-yard line and led to three points. Thomas earned ASUN Conference Freshman of the Week honors for Week Zero due to his impact in the return game.

STREAKING MADDUX

Maddux Trujillo's nine-game streak with a made field goal came to an end when he went 0-for-1 against Presbyterian. Trujillo's nine-straight games with a made field are a program record and included the first nine games of his APSU career.



AUTO-MADDUX

Sophomore kicker Maddux Trujillo (#91) 🏆 earned ASUN Special Teams Player of the Week honors for Week Zero after going 2-for-2 on field goals and 3-for-3 on PATs. Trujillo's career-long 49-yard field goal against Western Kentucky was the longest by a Gov since Logan Birchfield connected on a 49-yarder against North Carolina Central (9/29/19). In the home opener against Presbyterian, Trujillo missed his only field goal attempt but was a perfect 9-for-9 on PATs, which is the second-best single-game mark in program history behind Birchfield's 10 PATs against Morehead State in 2018.

SQUAD'S BACK

Five of the six specialists who took the field for the Governors last season are back with kickers Maddux Trujillo and Riley Stephens, long snappers Ethan Myers and Will Spain, and punter Matt Rigney all returning for the 2022 season. Rigney was the only specialist with collegiate experience on Austin Peay's two-deep at the start of last season, but that is not the case this season with all but one kickoff attempt returning to the special teams unit.

TRUE-JILLO

Last season, Second Team All-OVC selection Maddux Trujillo broke a pair of Austin Peay records that had been standing longer than the then true-freshman kicker had been alive. Trujillo went 14-for-18 on field goals, posting a 77.8 field-goal percentage that topped David Young's 71.4 percent clip from the 1994 season as the best mark in program history. The 14 made field goals also matched Tom McMillan's 1987 season for the best single-season total in program history. Trujillo also ranked 28th among FCS kickers and third among freshman kickers in field-goal percentage during the 2021 season.

SCORING LEADER AS A FRESHMAN

Maddux Trujillo made an immediate impact as a true freshman, going 14-for-18 on field goals and 36-for-38 on PATs to lead the Governors with 78 points scored last season. Trujillo's 78 points were tied for the eighth-best single-season mark in Austin Peay history while leading all OVC kickers and ranking second among FCS freshman kickers during the 2021 season.

FIFTY-FIFTY...

Coin tosses are supposed to be a 50/50 chance and after losing 9-of-11 opening coin tosses during the 2021 season, Austin Peay is 1-1 at the opening coin toss this season with a win against Western Kentucky and a loss against Presbyterian. Austin Peay is 8-11 at the opening coin toss during Scotty Walden's career and has six wins when it losses the coin toss and just five wins when winning the toss.

DIPLOMA IN ONE HAND

Despite 78 of the 115 student-athletes on Austin Peay's 2022 football roster being underclassmen (redshirt sophomores and younger), there are 15 Governors that have a bachelor's degree in hand and are pursuing post-graduate degrees or a second bachelor's degree. Austin Peay is one of 25 teams in the FCS with 15 or more graduates on its roster this season and the Govs' 15 graduates are tied for the 22nd most in the FCS. The 15 graduate students are denoted with a 🎓 on the roster.

UNITY IS THE SECRET

Along with team captains, the Govs selected 20 student-athletes that stood out as leaders to represent each class and position group on the Unity Council. The members of the Unity Council are redshirt junior offensive lineman Jalen Armstrong; redshirt junior defensive back Cedarius Doss; junior running back CJ Evans Jr.; freshman defensive back Mike Evans; sophomore wide receiver Trey Goodman; senior defensive lineman Ray Horton; junior linebacker Sam Howard; redshirt freshman running back Jevon Jackson; redshirt sophomore quarterback Jake Johnson; junior tight end Brandon Lanier; sophomore wide receiver Drae McCray; graduate offensive lineman Conner Parsons; freshman offensive lineman Ian Poe; redshirt junior punter Matt Rigney; redshirt junior linebacker Darryl Rogan; sophomore linebacker Josh Rudolph; graduate defensive back Kam Ruffin; redshirt junior defensive back Shamari Simmons; redshirt sophomore kicker Riley Stephenson; and graduate defensive lineman Kwame Sutton.

THERE SHOULD BE A CAPTAIN IN THERE SOMEWHERE

Prior to the season opener, head coach Scotty Walden named five season-long captains: graduate defensive back Ethan Caselberry, sophomore wide receiver Trey Goodman, junior linebacker Sam Howard, sophomore wide receiver Drae McCray, and sophomore linebacker Josh Rudolph. Austin Peay will supplement its season-long captains with weekly game captains.

NFL CONNECTION

Six members of the Governors have ties to the National Football League:

- Redshirt freshman Aaren Alexander: Uncle Kendall Simmons played eight seasons in the NFL winning two Super Bowls (XL, XLIII) with Pittsburgh.
- Junior safety Kory Chapman: Father Kory (Indianapolis, 2005)
- Sophomore DeTeras Glover: Uncle Lary Smith played six NFL seasons with Jacksonville and Green Bay.
- Assistant Akeem Davis played for five teams (Washington, New Orleans, Seattle, Indianapolis, and Jacksonville) in the NFL, finishing his career with 11 tackles and a forced fumble in 21 games played.
- Assistant Ryan Stancheck signed with Atlanta as an undrafted free agent in 2009.
- Assistant Ryan Yurachek signed with Oakland as an undrafted free agent and spent the 2018 season on the practice squad. He then signed with Dallas for the 2019 preseason before beginning his coaching career.

SMART GOVS

For the third-straight year and fourth time in program history, the Austin Peay football team earned the OVC Team Academic Achievement Award, which is given to the team in each conference-sponsored sport with the greatest percentage of its eligible student-athletes that achieve a 3.25 grade-point average or higher. Austin Peay's fourth OVC Team Academic Achievement Award in football surpassed Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech for the most in league history. The Govs posted a program-record 3.279 GPA during the spring semester to secure a program-record 3.227 GPA for the 2021-22 academic year.

**THE RETURN OF SWERVE**

After missing the final three weeks and playoffs in the 2021 season and the first 11 weeks of 2022 with a knee injury, Austin Peay alumnus Kyran Moore returned for his fourth season with the Saskatchewan Rough Riders of the CFL on Aug. 26. In his return, Moore made three catches for 35 yards and returned two punts for 20 yards against British Columbia. In his second game back, Moore added 7 catches for 58 yards against Winnipeg. In his CFL career, he has caught 184 passes for 2,149 yards and 10 touchdowns while adding 650 yards and two touchdowns on punt returns and 141 yards on kickoff returns.

GO D.J.

Austin Peay alumnus D.J. Montgomery signed with the NFL's Indianapolis Colts on Aug. 3 and made two catches for 35 yards in two preseason appearances before being waived on Aug. 22. The 6-1, 201-pound wide receiver spent the 2021 season with the New York Jets, catching three passes for 36 yards in three appearances. Montgomery signed with Cleveland as an undrafted free agent in 2019 and spent his rookie season on the Browns' Injured Reserve List.

SCOTTY WALDEN

Head Coach • Third Season at Austin Peay

Career Record: 19-14 (3 seasons)

Alma Mater: Sul Ross State, 2012

Innovative and energetic are two words Austin Peay State University Director of Athletics Gerald Harrison used to describe his hiring of Scotty Walden as the university's 21st head football coach in November 2020.

Walden, who was the youngest head coach at the Division I level when he was hired, has led the Governors to 10 wins in his first two seasons as head coach – a two-season span that occurred in less than 280 days due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Prior to joining Austin Peay, Walden served as head coach at Southern Miss to start the 2020 season. He was named the Golden Eagles' head coach after the opening game of the 2020 campaign after three seasons on the USM staff, including one season as co-offensive coordinator.

Considered one of the youngest and brightest offensive minds in collegiate football, the American Football Coaches Association tabbed Walden as a Top 35 coach under 35 years of age in 2019.

Prior to his move to Southern Miss, Walden was the head coach at East Texas Baptist during the 2016 season. Promoted following Joshua Eargle's departure to join Austin Peay's coaching staff as offensive line coach and run game coordinator, he was the youngest head coach (26 years old) at any NCAA school that season. He led the Tigers to a 7-3 mark in his lone season at the ETBU helm, and they led all Division III teams in scoring offense (49.9 points per game) while finishing second in total offense (564.3 yards per game) and sixth in passing offense (365.3 yards per game).

In his three years as offensive coordinator at ETBU, Walden's offense re-wrote the program's record book for individual, single game, and season records while being nationally known for passing and scoring. In his time as an assistant, ETBU football student-athletes broke a combined 26 individual and team records.

A highly regarded offensive innovator, Walden has shared his philosophies on the national level with his peers. In summer 2015, he was a special speaker at the Spread Offense Football Clinic in Chicago. His first national speaking engagement came when he was a special speaker at the 2012 Nike Coach of the Year Clinic in Dallas.

HEAD COACH

WALDEN'S CAREER SUMMARY

AUSTIN PEAY (2020-CURRENT)

2021: Became only the third head coach in program history to record double-digit wins in their first 18 games. His 10 wins trailed only College Football Hall of Fame coach Boots Donnelly (12 wins, 1977-78) and Watson Brown (11). Gavs tied a program record with seven First Team All-OVC selections and the team's 14 All-OVC picks set a record with six underclassmen recognized. In addition, defensive backs Johnathan Edwards and Koby Perry became the first Austin Peay teammates to be named Consensus All-Americans in the same season. Perry also was named OVC Defensive Player of the Year, the first APSU athlete to earn that honor since 1978.

2020: Named Austin Peay head coach on Nov. 2, 2020 and led the Governors during a six-game Ohio Valley Conference schedule that was played in Spring 2021. APSU posted a 4-2 record in his first league campaign and had nine players earn All-OVC honors. Individually, wide receiver DeAngelo Wilson and quarterback Draylen Ellis were the league's offensive and newcomer of the year, respectively.

SOUTHERN MISS (2017-20)

2020: Named head coach prior to Week 2 contest after Jay Hopson announced his resignation. USM won his debut, defeating North Texas, and he was head coach for four games before taking over at Austin Peay.

2019: Elevated to co-offensive coordinator prior to the season while continuing role as wide receivers coach. Wide receiver Quez Watkins was a First Team All-Conference USA selection after leading all conference receivers with 64 receptions and 1,178 receiving yards (17th in FBS), while his 107.1 receiving yards per game ranked sixth among FBS receivers. Watkins was selected in the sixth-round of the 2020 NFL Draft by the Philadelphia Eagles. Southern Miss was selected to play in the 2019 Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl.

2018: Continued duties as wide receivers coach. Wide receiver Quez Watkins earned his first First Team All-CUSA honors after leading USM with 72 catches for 889 yards while his 6.5 receptions per game led all C-USA receivers.

2017: Hired by Southern Miss as wide receivers and tight ends coach. Coached wide receiver Allenzae Staggers to 44 receptions and 471 yards during his rookie season. Southern Miss played in the Walk-On's Independence Bowl.

EAST TEXAS BAPTIST (2013-16)

2016: Named head coach at ETBU following Joshua Eargle's departure to join Austin Peay's coaching staff under Will Healy. Was the youngest head coach (26 years old) at an NCAA football program that season. In his lone year at the ETBU helm, the Tigers led all NCAA teams in scoring offense (49.9 points per game) while finishing second in total offense (564.3 yards per game) and sixth in passing offense (365.3 yards per game). Wide receiver Chase Sojka finished the season with 83 receptions for 1,074 yards and Richard Johnson added 911 yards on 52 receptions.

2015: Member of staff that led Tigers' to share of the 2015 American Southwest Conference championship, the program's first title since 2003. His offense produced four All-ASC first-team selections that season, two of whom also received D3football.com All-Region awards, and two were USA Football Network All-American team picks. Wide receiver Tyler Bates recorded 1,251 yards on 74 receptions that season as quarterback Josh Warbington passed for 2,180 yards and finished 28th among Division III passers with a 157.5 pass efficiency rating.

2014: Coached Warbington to 2014 Gagliardi Trophy semifinalist honors after he passed for a program-record 3,580 yards, and his Division III-leading 358.0 passing yards per game. The Tigers offense also produced two 1,000-yard receivers as Stephen Alfred finished the season with 1,210 yards on 84 receptions while Tyler Bates posted 1,156 yards on 59 receptions. ETBU led all Division III teams in total passing offense (368.1 ypg) while finishing second in total offense (566.1 ypg) and 11th in scoring offense (42.3 ppg). Walden was a special speaker at the 2015 Spread Offense Football Clinic in Chicago.

2013: Hired as Tigers offensive coordinator by Joshua Eargle. ETBU's offense finished his first season ranked 27th among Division III programs with 455.0 yards per game and 16th in passing offense (295.0 ypg). Jarmain Sherman posted 1,084 receiving yards on 73 receptions and Warbington passed for 1,876 yards in his first season under center.

SUL ROSS STATE (2012)

2012: Began his collegiate coaching career in spring 2012 while still an undergraduate at Sul Ross State. That fall, the Lobos named him their offensive coordinator, and in his rookie season, the SRSU offense led all of NCAA with 581.9 yards and 48.8 points per game. His offense produced two D3Football.com All-Americans and six All-ASC products. Sul Ross State broke 16 overall offensive school records, including most single-game marks in offensive yards (800) and points (75). Due to his success as a rookie offensive coordinator, Walden coached the quarterbacks at the National Bowl Game in December 2012, which included a pair of Sul Ross State student-athletes. His first national speaking engagement came when he was a special speaker at the 2012 Nike Coach of the Year Clinic in Dallas.

COLLEGIATE PLAYING CAREER

An NCAA Division III product, Walden was the starting quarterback at both Dordt College (2008) and Sul Ross State University (2011), sandwiching two seasons at Hardin-Simmons (2009-10). In his senior season (2011), he was the team captain and team Leadership award recipient. Walden was a two-time All-ASC academic winner and started his freshman season at Dordt College. During his two seasons at Hardin-Simmons (2009-10), he played as both a quarterback and defensive back.

GAME ONE RECAP | AT WESTERN KENTUCKY

RECAP

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. – Quarterback Mike Diliello threw a pair of touchdowns and ran for another but Austin Peay State University's football team could not overcome a four-turnover day and dropped the 2022 college football season opener to FBS foe Western Kentucky, 38-27, Saturday at Houchens-Smith Field.

Austin Peay (0-1) put together its best scoring performance against an FBS opponent since the 2017 season with its 27 points against WKU, which were its second-most against FBS competition in program history – trailing only the 33 points scored in 2010 against Middle Tennessee and matched in a 33-point outing against Central Florida in 2017.

The Governors showed their mettle against WKU, scoring on back-to-back possessions in the first quarter. Diliello's 44-yard pass to McCray with 1:35 left in the quarter gave Austin Peay a 10-7 after one frame.

Western Kentucky (1-0) scored the game's next two touchdowns. The first came after an 8-play, 75-yard drive capped by Austin Reed's 11-yard touchdown pass to Malachi Corley for a 14-10 lead. Austin Peay's second turnover resulted in another quick Hilltoppers' score, as Upton Stout picked off a pass and returned it 34 yards for a 21-10 lead.

Austin Peay would fight back to within a point thanks to scoring the next 10 points. Diliello capped an 11-play, 60-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown run to end the first half with APSU trailing 21-17. The Gavs then scored the third quarter's only points when Maddux Trujillo hit a career-long 49-yard field goal to narrow the deficit to a single point, 21-10, with 8:12 remaining in the third.

The Hilltoppers struck back with touchdowns on their next two drives. Reed marshaled the Hilltoppers down the field for a 7-play, 71-yard touchdown drive finishing with a 48-yard touchdown strike to Daewood Davis. WKU then forced a turnover on the ensuing Governors drive and Reed needed just three plays to convert the takeaway into points for a 35-20 lead.

Austin Peay got a touchdown to close within a single possession again, but Western Kentucky scored a field goal in response to set the final score. The Governors fumbled the ball on the final kickoff return of the game and Western Kentucky ran out the clock to end the game.

Diliello led the charge with his two touchdown passes – both to wide receiver Drae McCray – and his one touchdown run as he finished with 187 total yards in his Governors' debut. McCray finished the game with six receptions for 90 yards and two touchdowns.

Reed completed 20-of-34 passes for 280 yards and four touchdowns to pace WKU. Three of his touchdown passes went to Corley, who finished with 61 receiving yards on five receptions. David caught six passes for 124 yards and a touchdown.

Austin Peay returns to Clarksville to prepare for its home opener – a 6 p.m., Saturday contest against Presbyterian. It will be Faith & Family Night at Fortera Stadium with discounted group tickets available prior to the game.

SCORING RECAP

APSU 0, WKU 7 – After neither team's opening drive resulted in points, Western Kentucky took advantage of the Gavs first turnover and turned in a seven-play, 51-yard drive for a touchdown. Daewood David rushed for 15 yards on the first play of the drive and quarterback Austin Reed found Malachi Corley in the middle of the Gavs defense for a 16-yard touchdown play.

APSU 3, WKU 7 – On the ensuing Austin Peay drive the Gavs marched down the field going 51 yards in 12 plays. Drae McCray's 17-yard rush kept the drive alive on an early 3rd-and-4 and they converted on 3rd-and-2 later on the drive. But an intentional grounding after the Gavs got inside the WKU 20-yard line stalled the drive. Maddux Trujillo converted a 41-yard field goal for the Gavs' first points.

APSU 10, WKU 7 – The Gavs defense held WKU to a three-and-out on the drive following the Trujillo field goal. Diliello opened the drive with a 20-yard rush then found Drae McCray on a slant route and the Gavs wideout made the turn and dashed up the field for a 44-yard touchdown reception and an Austin Peay lead.

APSU 10, WKU 14 – The lead would not survive the next WKU possession as the Hilltoppers went 75 yards in eight plays for a touchdown. WKU's Reed connected on three consecutive passes of 28, 19, and 11 yards – the later pass again finding Malachi Corley – to cap the scoring drive.

APSU 10, WKU 21 – Western Kentucky added to its lead courtesy of its second interception of the game as a Diliello pass was intercepted by Upton Stout who returned the pick 34 yards for a touchdown.

APSU 17, WKU 21 – Austin Peay closed the half with another extended scoring drive. After a kickoff out of bounds set the Gavs up on their own 40-yard line, Diliello used an 11-play, 60-yard drive to score again. Josh Samuel provided a big 24-yard run to get the ball deep into WKU territory. On 4th-and-1, Diliello converted on a quarterback sneak to keep the drive alive and on the next play he threw a fade to Drae McCray deep in the end zone. McCray was interfered with on the play and the Gavs got a new set of downs at the WKU two-yard line, Diliello converted with a one-yard burst to get APSU within four at the break.

APSU 20, WKU 21 – The Gavs' defense forced another three-and-out and Kam Thomas' 33-yard punt return set the Gavs up in WKU territory. Austin Peay would get to the WKU 28-yard line before a holding penalty pushed them back. Diliello found James Burns for a six-yard reception to set up a long field goal try. Trujillo proved true again, converting the career-long 49-yard field goal.

APSU 20, WKU 28 – The Gavs field goal was the lone scoring in the third quarter as WKU wrapped up a seven-play, 71-yard drive in the fourth quarter. The Hilltoppers drive pattered along with short plays until a pass interference penalty set them up at the APSU 25-yard line. After a rush for no gain, Reed found Corley for a third touchdown connection to extend the lead to eight points.

APSU 20, WKU 35 – Western Kentucky set up its second drive of the fourth quarter on its own 49-yard line after forcing an Austin Peay fumble. After an incompletion and a rush for three yards, Reed connected with Daewood Davis for a 48-yard touchdown reception, extending the lead to two possessions for the first time in the game.

APSU 27, WKU 35 – Austin Peay's first interception of the day – by Shamari Simmons – saw the Gavs start a drive at their own 10-yard line. After a seven-yard pass to start the drive, Diliello lateraled to Trey Goodman who found James Burns down the WKU sideline for a 39-yard completion and a personal foul on the tackle put the Gavs on the WKU 24-yard line. Diliello converted on the next play, finding McCray down the middle for a 24-yard touchdown and the Gavs were back within a possession.

APSU 27, WKU 38 – On the ensuing WKU drive, they drove 70 yards on 11 plays only to see the drive stall at the Gavs 5-yard line. On 3rd-and-10 at the APSU 27, a WKU pass went incomplete but interference was called placing the ball at the APSU 12-yard line. The Gavs defense held the line at the right moment, denying the Hilltoppers a first down and forcing a 23-yard field goal.

GAME TWO RECAP | VS. PRESBYTERIAN

RECAP

CLARKSVILLE, Tenn. – Austin Peay State University scored on each of its first six possessions and rolled to a 63-0 shutout victory of Presbyterian, Saturday, in nonconference action at Fortera Stadium.

Austin Peay (1-1) was nearly perfect in the opening half as quarterback Mike DiLillo led the Governors to touchdowns on each of its first six possessions. The Governors finished the half with 351 offensive yards – 138 rushing and 213 passing – while breaking out to a 42-0 halftime lead.

The Governors scored on three of six second-half drives, with DiLillo leading the first scoring drive of the half before departing the game. Quarterback Sheldon Layman entered the contest and led the Gobs' second scoring drive of the half before Bryce Robinson led the charge for APSU's final scoring drive.

Presbyterian (0-1) could not get on track with only three of its 13 drives entering Austin Peay territory. The Blue Hose got to the Austin Peay 14-yard line midway through the fourth quarter after Nate Hayden found Dominic Kibby for a 50-yard completion, but the Governors' defense held firm and forced a turnover on downs inside the Austin Peay 20-yard line, sealing the Governors' first shut-out of the Scotty Walden era.

DiLillo, who ran for a touchdown on Austin Peay's first drive, finished the game completing 18-of-27 passes for 254 yards and four touchdowns in 35 minutes of play. Wide receiver Drae McCray caught seven passes for 113 yards – his fourth career 100-yard receiving outing – while wide receiver Trey Goodman and Josh DeCambre each caught two touchdowns.

On the ground, CJ Evans Jr. had 15 carries for 104 yards and two touchdowns before giving way to Jevon Jackson, who had the majority of the second-half carries. Jackson finished the game with 167 yards on 24 carries and a touchdown that capped the night's scoring.

Austin Peay amassed 609 offensive yards – seventh most in program history – while maintaining its balanced attack with 301 passing yards and 308 rushing yards. The 63 points were the second most in a shutout in program history.

Meanwhile, the Gobs' defense limited the Blue Hose to 221 yards of total offense, including just 91 on the ground on 35 carries. Hayden finished the game 9-of-21 passing for 130 yards.

Austin Peay continues nonconference play when it hosts Mississippi Valley State (0-1) in a 3 p.m., Saturday outing at Fortera Stadium. The Governors invite their fans to wear red as part of their "Red Out" against the Delta Devils. In addition, it's Family Weekend and Teacher Appreciation Day, with special group ticket offers to be announced.

SCORING RECAP

APSU 7, PC 0 – Austin Peay elected to receive the opening kickoff, and Kellen Stewart opened the game with a big 20-yard return to set the Gobs up at their own 23-yard line. The Gobs faced a three-and-out, but CJ Evans Jr. converted a 4th-and-1 with a five-yard run. Five plays later, Austin Peay converted a 3rd-and-12 at the Presbyterian 40-yard line, and Mike DiLillo found Drae McCray for a 17-yard completion. CJ followed with a 13-yard catch to get the ball to the Blue Hose's 10-yard line, and two plays later, DiLillo kept the ball on the read-option for an eight-yard touchdown run.

APSU 14, PC 0 – The Governors' second drive was a sequence of big plays. Mike DiLillo ran for 13 yards, tallied completions of 15 and 17 yards to Drae McCray, then found James Burns in the end zone for a 14-yard touchdown. The seven-play, 66-yard drive took just 1:52 off the clock to put the Gobs ahead by two scores.

APSU 21, PC 0 – Austin Peay kept the scoring going with a touchdown on its third drive of the game. James Burns set the Gobs up in Presbyterian territory with a 38-yard punt return. Starting on the Blue Hose's 29-yard line, the Gobs needed six plays to find the end zone. Jevon Jackson's 20-yard run did the biggest damage, putting the Gobs on the one-yard line. Three rushes later, Mike DiLillo found Joshua DeCambre in the corner of the end zone for the touchdown.

APSU 28, PC 0 – If starting at the Presbyterian 29-yard line wasn't close enough, Austin Peay did even better to start its fourth drive thanks to Antoine Williams' blocked punt, setting the Gobs up at the Presbyterian 20-yard line. On the second play of the drive, Mike DiLillo connected with Trey Goodman for a 20-yard touchdown pass.

APSU 35, PC 0 – Austin Peay pieced together a methodical 11-play, 65-yard drive for its fifth touchdown in as many drives. On 3rd-and-1 at the Presbyterian 43-yard line, Mike DiLillo found Trey Goodman for a four-yard gain to keep the drive alive. CJ Evans Jr. ran on four of the drive's final five plays, and his one-yard dash up the middle capped the drive with a touchdown.

APSU 42, PC 0 – The Governors started near midfield on their sixth drive of the night and needed just three plays to cover 53 yards for the touchdown. Jevon Jackson opened the drive with a 21-yard run. Two plays later, Mike DiLillo found Trey Goodman for a 30-yard touchdown pass.

APSU 49, PC 0 – Austin Peay faced its worst starting field position of the game in its first drive of the second half. A penalty pushed the Gobs back to their own 16-yard line. Facing a 3rd-and-9 at their own 17-yard line, Mike DiLillo kept the drive alive with a 12-yard completion to Drae McCray to put the Gobs' receiver over 100 yards. Mike DiLillo then found tight end Jordan Goco for a 20-yard reception, his first as a Governor. The Gobs would get to 3rd-and-1 at the Presbyterian 29-yard line, and Mike DiLillo handed the ball to CJ Evans Jr., who shook a handful of would-be tacklers for a 29-yard touchdown burst, pushing him past 100 yards on the night.

APSU 56, PC 0 – Sheldon Layman took over under center and led Austin Peay to a touchdown on his second drive of the game. Running back Jevon Jackson did the bulk of the work with six carries for 39 yards, but Layman connected with Joshua DeCambre along the Governors' sideline for a 13-yard touchdown pass.

APSU 63, PC 0 – Bryce Robinson quarterbacked a drive in the fourth quarter and led the Gobs to a touchdown on a six-play, 30-yard drive. Jevon Jackson rushed four times for all 30 yards of the drive, weaving through traffic for a five-yard touchdown run.

ASUN AND WAC RENEW FOOTBALL ALLIANCE

ATLANTA, Ga. – The ASUN Conference and Western Athletic Conference have agreed to renew their football alliance for the 2022 fall football season.

Originally presented as the ASUN-WAC Challenge in 2021, the agreement allowed for seven institutions—three ASUN members and four WAC members—to build a new AQ (automatic qualification) opportunity for the 2021 NCAA FCS Playoffs. The renewal includes all eight FCS playoff-eligible teams in the combined ASUN-WAC membership. The ASUN five include Austin Peay, Central Arkansas, Eastern Kentucky, Kennesaw State, and North Alabama; the WAC three include Abilene Christian, Southern Utah, and Stephen F. Austin.

Both the ASUN and the WAC reached the pivotal six-team AQ eligibility threshold with expansion announcements this past academic year. That changed with the November announcement that Jacksonville State (ASUN) and Sam Houston (WAC) would be transitioning to the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and joining Conference USA. Both institutions are now ineligible for the FCS Playoffs under NCAA rules.

"The ASUN and the WAC made history this past year with the creation of a new AQ through a collaborative partnership," said ASUN Commissioner Ted Gumbart. "Extending it to ensure the AQ opportunity we created is available to all the partners that helped build it makes great sense, especially under the primary ASUN Beam: Students First. The WAC has outstanding football and we look forward to extending our ASUN-WAC partnership."

The coming season will be the first for a full ASUN Football schedule. Both the ASUN and the WAC will play a full season among their own members, and both will have their own honors, awards, and championship hardware. One of the two group winners will earn the ASUN-WAC AQ. Final policy to govern the AQ recipient will be determined in the coming weeks.

The 2022 fall season will be the first in which ASUN member North Alabama will be eligible for an AQ, having completed the four-year reclassification process. The WAC has two members, Utah Tech (formerly Dixie State) and Tarleton State, entering year three of the reclassification process. While the ASUN and WAC are both strong supporters of extending AQ eligibility to third-year reclassifying schools - such as Bellarmine in the ASUN - the ASUN recognizes this outcome would not change the ASUN-WAC FCS AQ status for this coming fall.

ATLANTA, Ga. – With the ASUN Conference and Western Athletic Conference having agreed to renew their football alliance for the 2022 fall season, the ASUN and WAC announced their AQ (automatic qualification) recipient policy for the FCS Playoffs.

The renewal includes the eight FCS playoff-eligible teams in the combined ASUN-WAC membership. The ASUN five include Austin Peay, Central Arkansas, Eastern Kentucky, Kennesaw State, and North Alabama; the WAC three include Abilene Christian, Stephen F. Austin, and Southern Utah.

This season marks the first for a full ASUN Football schedule. Both the ASUN and the WAC will play a full season among their own members, and both will have their own honors, awards, and championship hardware. Each conference will choose its representative for AQ consideration within the alliance with the decision made based upon the agreed-upon criteria including the ASUN-WAC Power Rating calculated by bracketologist Warren Nolan.

The ASUN-WAC Power Rating rankings will be shared weekly with the public following the fifth week of competition this season.

ASUN-WAC AQ Determination Formula

1. Each conference shall nominate its regular season champion (by the conference's own formula) for AQ comparison.
2. If the regular season champion is a reclassifying team, the conference shall nominate the team finishing highest in the regular season standings that is eligible for an FCS AQ. Tiebreaker formulas are to be set by each conference and may include the use of the ASUN-WAC Power Ranking after the conclusion of regular season play.
3. If the two nominated teams have the same W-L record in Countable Games, and they met during the regular season, the head-to-head winner shall be the AQ recipient.
4. If item No. 3 above is not applicable, the team with the higher ASUN-WAC Power Ranking will be declared the AQ recipient.

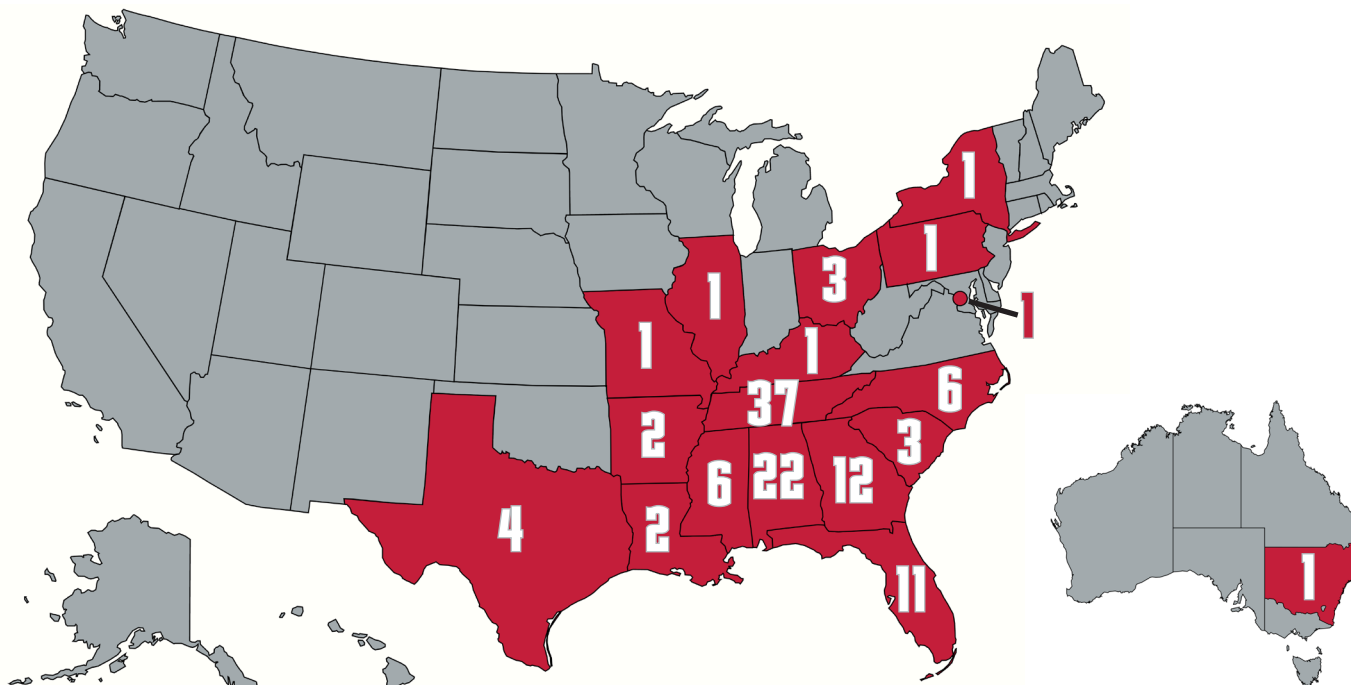

The Legion Hybrid Synthetic Turf was installed by Shaw Sports Turf in 2022 and is the same state-of-the-art turf that is used by a number of major college football programs.

BILL DUPES LOCKER ROOM

Another change at Fortera Stadium in 2022 is the completely renovated Bill Dupes Locker Room. The \$750,000 project features completely customized and state-of-the-art lockers from Wenger Lockers, brand-new carpet, multi-colored LED lights, a new sound system, and new branding and signage around the locker room. The top-of-the-line facility will provide Austin Peay student-athletes a premier place to prepare for and celebrate their success on the gridiron.

HOME SWEET HOME

Austin Peay football has proudly been located on the corner of Marion and Henry Streets since 1946. Recent renovations have allowed the Governors to establish a strong home-field advantage in one of the premier stadiums in all the FCS. Since 2017, Austin Peay has compiled a 19-6 home record, with a winning record at Fortera Stadium in each of the last five seasons.

FORTERA STADIUM RISES

Following the 2015 season, the Austin Peay State University embarked on the biggest construction project dedicated to football in its history. What resulted is a \$19-million facility that has four levels on its west side. On the lower level is the player locker room, players lounge, athletic training room, equipment room, weight room, and nutrition room. The top two floors provide a premier fan experience with the Echo Power Club Level on the third floor and private suites on the fourth floor. The facility was officially named Fortera Stadium to begin the 2016 season.

HEAVY LIFTING ENABLED

In March 2017, construction was completed on a new weight room inside Fortera Stadium. The state-of-the-art facility will serve not only Austin Peay football but also a host of the athletics department's programs. The new space houses racks, free weights, and treadmills in the facility.

HISTORY LESSON

The original Municipal Stadium's construction was finished prior to the 1946 season as a joint project between the City of Clarksville, Montgomery County, and Austin Peay State College. The city-owned and operated the facility that housed APSC's football and track teams along with local schools' sporting events.

In 1970, the city conveyed the title to one-third of the stadium to the state of Tennessee for the university and Montgomery County, who then formed the Stadium Authority that was in charge of the stadium's operations.

The university purchased Municipal Stadium from the Stadium Authority and Montgomery County in 1993 and renamed it Governors Stadium.

In April 2016, Austin Peay and Fortera Credit Union entered a 25-year sponsorship agreement, rebranding the historic Governors Stadium to Fortera Stadium.
