INTERVIEWS

All interview requests should be submitted at least 24 hours in advance to the Austin Peay Athletics Communications Office.

- **HEAD COACH:** Head coach Roland Fanning typically will be available during the week for interviews, preferably Mondays, as arranged through the Athletics Communications Office.
- **STUDENT-ATHLETES:** All interviews with student-athletes will be scheduled to occur before or after practice to accommodate student-athletes' academic schedules. No interviews will be granted on the day of a game. Student-athletes should not be contacted directly by the media.

PRESEASON NODS

- Infielder Ray Velazquez enters the season as the preseason favorite to win the Atlantic Sun Conference's Player of the Year honor. The league's head coaches along with D1Baseball.com tapped him for the preseason honor as well. Velazquez ranks as the No. 6 third basemen across Division I baseball, according to D1Baseball.com, and first amongst mid major programs. Velazquez joins Cody Airington, Trevor Conley, Cole Johnson, and Kyler Proctor on the preseason All-ASUN team. The coaches of the ASUN Gold Division picked the Governors as the league's preseason favorite in the coaches poll.

COACH FANNING - AKA "ZERO"

- For the second-straight season, the third-year head coach was named the league's Coach of the Year following a Gold Division title and the best conference (26-4) and overall record (45-14) in the ASUN in 2025. Fanning led the Governors to their second Atlantic Sun Conference regular season title, as this year's team rewrote the record book after becoming the fastest team to reach both the 30 and 40-win marks. He becomes the fourth head coach to lead his team to a 40-win season. The Gobs also became the first in program history to win 43 games in a single regular season.
- The 2025 team recorded a program-record nine series sweeps, while also becoming the winningest team in conference play in Austin Peay history. The Governors had the second-fewest losses at home after going 26-4 at Raymond C. Hand Park. In addition, the team was inside the top five of multiple offensive categories across all Division I teams.
- Fanning also reached the 100 career wins milestone, becoming the fastest head coach in program history to reach the mark, doing so in just 164 games. The Coalgate, Oklahoma native is the first head coach in program history to be named the league's Coach of the Year in back-to-back seasons.

ALL-ASUN HAUL

- After piecing together one of the best seasons across Division I baseball last season, Austin Peay State University's baseball team matched a program-record 14 postseason awards following the end of the regular season.
- Joining Cameron Nickens and Cole Johnson on the First Team All-ASUN Team was catcher Trevor Conley, second baseman Kyler Proctor, third baseman Ray Velazquez, and outfielder John Bay. Second team honorees included starting pitcher Gavin Braunecker, starting pitcher Lyndon Glidewell, and first baseman Gus Freeman. The third team included shortstop Andres Matias.

FIVE ALL-ASUN BATS ARE BACK

- Cole Johnson, a native of Austin, Texas, finished the 2025 regular season as the best freshman in the league, earning Freshman of the Year honors, as well as First Team All-ASUN honors as the top designated hitter in the league. The redshirt freshman finished the regular season leading all freshmen in the ASUN with a .356 batting average, a .582 slugging percentage, a 1.023 OPS, 48 runs scored, 74 hits, 18 doubles, nine home runs, and 67 RBI. He is just the third Governor in program history to be named the league's Freshman of the Year, and the first since Garrett Spain in 2019.
- The Mt. Carmel, Ohio native, Conley earned All-ASUN honors for the first time in his three-year career at Austin Peay. After starting the first two weeks of the 2025 season batting just .040, Conley showed grit throughout the remainder of the season, finishing the regular season batting .312 overall, and .378 in ASUN play, which ranked seventh in the league. Conley was named to the Buster Posey National Catcher of the Year Award Midseason Watchlist (April 25) after raising his offensive stats rapidly. He ranked ninth in league play with a .610 slugging percentage and a .470 on-base percentage. He also ranked seventh in league play with a 1.080 OPS. Conley started 40 games behind the plate last season and fielded .988 on the year, with 326 putouts, which ranked eighth in the ASUN.
- Proctor, a native of Silo, Oklahoma, earned First Team All-ASUN honors following an outstanding first season at Austin Peay after transferring from Oklahoma State. Playing in all 59 games at second base, the sophomore second baseman finished the season batting .320 overall and .314 in league play. He ranked third in the league with 81 hits, which included 14 doubles, a pair of triples, and six homers out of the leadoff spot. His speed also showed on the bases, where he took 14 bases in 19 attempts. Defensively, he ranked second in the league with 141 assists and tied for seventh in the league with 28 double plays.
- The junior native of Lowell, Massachusetts, Velazquez was one of the best bats in the country after the midseason point of the year. He finished the season with a .364 batting average, which ranked fourth in the league. He was third in the ASUN with a .728 slugging percentage, which ranked 15th in the nation. His .479 on-base percentage - which ranked fifth in the league - helped him reach a 1.207 OPS. That ranked third in the league and was 15th in the nation. He also ranked in the top 10 in the league with 54 runs scored, 57 RBI, and 18 home runs. Fourteen of his home runs came during league play, which led the ASUN.
- The native of Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic, Matias was named to his first career All-ASUN Team, making the third team. The senior shortstop finished the season with a .307 batting average, a .495 slugging percentage, and a .399 on-base percentage. Out of the bottom of the order, he was very productive as he drove in 43 RBI and scored 48 times. He was also a great situational hitter, laying down five sacrifice bunts, which tied for sixth in the league.

RAY "DIESEL" VELAZQUEZ

- Redshirt-junior infielder Ray Velazquez, known by his teammates as "Diesel", was a First Team All-ASUN selection in 2025 in his first season as a Governor. The Lowell, Massachusetts native was ranked the No. 1 third basemen in division I amongst all mid-major programs, and 6th across all Division I programs, according to D1Baseball.com. He was also named a Fourth Team Preseason All-American by the NCBWA on Feb. 6. He is the fifth Gov in program history to earn the honor, and first since APSU Hall of Famer Parker Phillips in 2018. Last season, he hit a scorching .364, which ranked fourth in the ASUN. He ranked inside the top 10 of seven ASUN offensive categories, including a .728 slugging percentage (3rd), a .479 on-base percentage (5th), a 1.207 OPS (3rd), 54 runs scored (9th), 57 RBI (5th), and 18 home runs (T-2nd). 14 of his home runs came in ASUN play, which led the league.

"BIG TEX" RAKES

- Redshirt sophomore, Cole Johnson - "Big Tex", returns to the Governors lineup after being named the 2025 ASUN Freshman of the Year, a First Team All-ASUN selection, a ABCA/Rawlings Second Team All-Southeast Region selection, and First Team Freshman All-American by the NCBWA. He led all freshmen in the ASUN with a .356 batting average, a .587 slugging percentage, a 1.205 OPS, 50 runs scored, 80 hits, 23 doubles, nine home runs, and 70 RBI.

REPLACEMENT BATS ON TAP

- Austin Peay returns roughly 59 percent of its offensive numbers from the totals of the 2025 season. Of the nine hitters with 100 or more at-bats last season, five return. Two power bats in the 2025 ASUN Player of the year, Cameron Nickens, and John Bay both leave Austin Peay after graduating and signing with professional teams. Nickens was drafted by the St. Louis Cardinals in the 17th round on Day Two of the 2025 MLB Draft (July 14). Three days later, Bay signed a free agency deal with the New York Mets (July 17). Of the projected 2026 Opening Day starting lineup, just two players are first-year APSU student-athletes. One of which is a transfer from a Division I institution.

DOMINATING THE ASUN

Austin Peay's offense ranked among the nation's best once again, and that is reflected in the ASUN individual ranks where the Gobs made up at least four of the Top 10 in nine offensive categories last year.

- 5 of 10: Slugging Percentage, OPS, Runs Scored, RBI, and Home Runs.
- 4 of 10: Batting Average, On-Base Percentage, Hits, and At-Bats.

JUST WHAT THE PROCTOR ORDERED

- Junior infielder Kyler Proctor returns to the lineup in 2026 after a huge first season with the Gobs a season ago. Proctor started every game for the Gobs in 2025 at second base, where he had the second-most assists (141) in the ASUN. He also led the order out of the leadoff spot, where he batted .320, with six home runs, 14 doubles, a pair of triples, and 42 RBI.

"FOFO" MATIAS

- Last year's lineup was known for its long ball presence, with players like Cameron Nickens and John Bay, who combined for 40 of the Governors' home runs through the season. But don't forget about the bottom of the order. Graduate Andres "FoFo" Matias was a threat in the nine-spot in the order. He finished the season with a .307 batting average, with eight homers, 12 doubles, and 43 RBI. He played in 56 games a year ago, starting 55.

THE CON MAN

- Graduate Trevor Conley was named to the Buster Posey National Collegiate Catcher of the Year Award Watchlist in 2025 after going on a tear at the plate. He started 40 games behind the dish, and Finished the season with a .303 batting average, 13 doubles, a triple, and three home runs. Conley had the longest hitting streak on the Gobs' roster at 19 games, spanning from March 1 to April 18, going 27-for-64 (.422) with three homers, eight doubles, and 21 RBI.

LEADING THE NATION

- In 2025, Austin Peay set the stage by making themselves a national threat offensively. The Governors ranked first in the nation in Division I baseball for batting average (.359), home runs per game (2.61), slugging percentage (.661), on-base percentage (.455) and scoring (10.9).

LIGHT TOWER POWER

- A season ago, Austin Peay hit a total of 112 home runs, which was the second-most in a season in program history. The Gobs were 34 pumps shy of their record of 146, which was set by the 2024 team. The Governors return 40.2 percent of its home run total from last year. With this year's additions to the squad, it would be no shock if they reach the triple-digits again in 2026.

THE ZION EFFECT

- An outfielder out of Atlanta, Georgia, who joins the Governors after spending the '25 season at the University of Mobile. Taylor had a standout junior season for the Rams, where he batted .437 with nine home runs and 60 RBI over 47 games. In the Governors' series at Cincinnati in week three, Taylor went 3-for-5 with a career-high three doubles in game two of the series (Feb. 28).

THE MAN OF WISDOM

- A utility player out of Kansas City, Missouri, Wisdom joins the Governors after spending his freshman and sophomore seasons

at Kansas. There, he played in 57 games, starting 34, and finished his time with the Jayhawks with a .246 batting average, five home runs, and 21 RBI.

FROM RICHMOND TO CLARKSVILLE

- Junior and senior transfers from Eastern Kentucky are the duo of Elijah Underhill and Ryker Walton.
- Underhill, a native of Cadiz, Kentucky, joins the Governors after spending his freshman and sophomore seasons at Eastern Kentucky as a two-way player. Underhill appeared 15 times on the mound in 2025, starting 10 games, finishing the season with a 1-9 win-loss record and a 12.38 ERA over 37 innings of work.
- Walton, a senior coming out of Potosi, Missouri, who joins the Governors after spending his junior and senior seasons at Eastern Kentucky, where he finished with a 7.13 ERA over 120 innings of work. The right-hander collected 114 strikeouts in his two seasons at EKU and held batters to a .289 batting average.

THE FRESHMEN TRIO

- The Governors' 2026 roster includes three true freshmen, in Mason Pickering, Dillon Adkins, and Houston Hebert.
- Pickering, a catcher out of Muskogee, Oklahoma, who prepped at Hilldale High School, bats from the left side and has a lot of upside.
- Adkins, a two-way lefty in the outfield and on the bump out of Madison, Alabama, where he prepped at Bob Jones HS under head coach Jared Smith. Adkins was an All-State and All-Area selection and helped his team to a state championship and semifinals appearance in 2024 & 25, respectively.
- Hebert, a Clarksville native who was a multi-sport athlete at Rossview HS, playing football, basketball, and baseball. He played under head coach Parker Holman in his baseball prep, hitting 23 career home runs and tallying 110 RBI. He joins the Governors as a two-way player on the infield.

CLARKSVILLE – Austin Peay State University’s baseball team is set to face Conference USA opponent Western Kentucky in midweek action, starting at 6 p.m., Wednesday, at Nick Denes Field in Bowling Green, Kentucky.

LEADING OFF

Austin Peay (20-20, 10-8 ASUN) is coming off a weekend sweep over Bellarmine at home to move into a three-way tie for second place in the Atlantic Sun Conference Gold Division. The Governors are now tied with Central Arkansas and Lipscomb, who they will face in their conference series next weekend.

The Governors broke their four-game losing streak in midweek contests when they defeated Tennessee Tech last Tuesday in walk-off run-rule fashion, when redshirt junior Ray Velazquez ripped a two-RBI double down the left field line.

Velazquez, who is the home run leader for the Governors with 12 so far this season, had back-to-back walk-off hits when he opened the conference series against Bellarmine with his seventh-inning blast to run-rule the Knights 16-6. It was the first walk-off home run by a Governor since Matthew Joslin’s grand slam against Southern Illinois on April 16, 2019.

Western Kentucky (20-20, 7-11 CUSA) comes into Wednesday tied for seventh in the CUSA standings after taking one of three games from Missouri State last weekend. 54 runs were scored in total by both teams, as the Toppers went through 12 arms during the weekend series.

PITCHING PROBABLES

Starting pitchers for both teams have not been announced.

SERIES HISTORY

Western Kentucky leads the all-time series, which dates to 1933, 98-66-1. The Governors won the first meeting 14-7, before winning the second that same year, 4-3. The Hilltoppers got their first win the next year in '34, 17-4, before winning four-straight until the year 1938.

The last time these two teams met was on March 12, 2024, when WKU defeated Austin Peay 12-9 in Clarksville.

2025 ASUN BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

The 2025 Atlantic Sun Conference Baseball Championship was played at Melching Field at Conrad Park, the home of the Stetson University Hatters.

The top four teams from each division qualified for the 2025 ASUN Baseball Championship.

The No. 1 seed from each division played the No. 4 seed from opposing divisions, while the No. 2 seeds from each division played the opposite divisions No. 3 seed for the opening round on Tuesday.

The tournament was in a double-elimination format, with the Championship Game taking place on Sunday.

Florida Gulf Coast beat Stetson 6-5 in a six-inning Championship Game after being called due to inclement weather to force an if necessary game. The championship would not be completed due to the weather. FGCU and Stetson were named co-champions, and Stetson was awarded an automatic qualifier.

The Hatters would move on to an NCAA Regional at Auburn, where they would go 1-2, and be eliminated by NC State 17-12 on June 1.

2026 ASUN BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

The 2026 Atlantic Sun Conference Championship will be held in DeLand, Florida, at Stetson University.

The top teams of each division will be the No. 1 and 2 seeds, and will have an automatic bye to Thursday's double elimination round, where they will face the winners of games 3 and 4, respectively.

The second place team in each division will be the No. 3 and 4 seeds, with the third place teams as the No. 5 and 6 seeds, and so on. The No. 3 through 8 seeds will play single elimination games the first two days of the tournament, before moving to double elimination format beginning Thursday.

Entering his fourth season in Clarksville, Roland Fanning was named Austin Peay's 12th head baseball coach, on May 29, 2022.

In his first season, Fanning brought in a Division I record 27 newcomers, and finished with a 26-win season, APSU's first appearance in the Atlantic Sun Conference tournament, and a victory in that tournament.

Fanning brought 15 seasons of experience as an assistant coach to Austin Peay, including eight combined seasons at Oklahoma State and Kentucky. While he was on the Cowboys and Wildcats staffs, those programs posted four 40-plus win campaigns.

The Coalgate, Oklahoma native also has developed top-caliber athletes, with three conference Player of the Year award winners and 23 All-American Selections. He has seen 70 athletes selected in the MLB Draft, with four chosen in the first round and seven reaching the major leagues.

And yet, the athletes Fanning has coached also have excelled off the field, with over 300 athletes earning academic honors during his coaching career.

Prior to taking over at Austin Peay, Fanning completed his third season in his second turn as an Oklahoma State baseball staff member, most recently serving as the Cowboys' Director of Player Development. In 2021, the Cowboys posted 36 wins and appeared in the NCAA Baseball Tournament at the Tuscon Regional. In 2022, OSU finished with 42 victories and hosted the Stillwater Regional.

Fanning's collegiate playing career included stops at Carl Albert State College, Northern Oklahoma-Enid, and Southeastern Oklahoma. He was inducted into the Coalgate High School Hall of fame in 2019.

Fanning and his wife, Beverly, have two daughters, Emery Jo and Eastyn Rowe.

FANNING'S CAREER SUMMARY

AUSTIN PEAY (2023-CURRENT)

2025: For the second-straight season, Fanning led Austin Peay to a banner year as the Governors captured the Atlantic Sun Conference Baseball Gold Division title, marking the Governors' 17th title in program history. The Gobs finished the regular season with the best conference (26-4) and overall record (45-14) in the ASUN Conference. At the conclusion of the regular season, he was named the ASUN Coach of the Year for the second-straight season. He is the second head coach in program history to be named Coach of the Year in multiple seasons, and the first to earn the honor in consecutive seasons. The honor was well deserved after seeing his team reach the 30 and 40-win marks faster than any Governor team. He became the fourth head coach in program history to lead APSU to a 40-win season, and the first to reach 43 wins in the regular season. The Gobs recorded a program-record nine series sweeps while becoming the winningest team in conference play in Austin Peay history. The Governors had the second-fewest losses at home in program history after going 26-4 at Raymond C. Hand Park. In addition, his team was inside the top five of multiple offensive categories across all Division I teams. The Gobs ranked second in the NCAA with a team batting average of .333, third with 141 doubles, fifth with 670 hits, fourth with a .443 on-base percentage, third with 567 runs scored, third in scoring with 9.6 runs per game, and second with a .585 slugging percentage. Fanning also reached the 100-win mark in his career during the 2025 season, becoming the fastest head coach in program history to reach the milestone, accomplishing such in just 164 games. Fanning had 10 players named ASUN All-Conference selections, including six First Team All-ASUN honorees. Leading the charge in major ASUN awards, Cameron Nickens was named the league's Player of the Year after tying the program's single-season hit record. Nickens was named an All-American by D1Baseball, the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association, and Perfect Game after being tabbed to the American Baseball Coaches Association Southeast All-Region Team. He was also one of four finalists for the Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Award. Paired with Nickens, Cole Johnson was named the ASUN Freshman of the Year after leading all freshmen in the league in batting average, slugging percentage, OPS, runs scored, hits, doubles, home runs, and RBI. The redshirt freshman landed on the NCBWA Freshman All-American Team after also being named to the ABCA Southeast All-Region Team. Joining the pair on the All-ASUN roster for 2025 included Trevor Conley, Kyler Proctor, Ray Velazquez, John Bay, Gavin Braunecker, Lyndon Glidewell, Gus Freeman, and Andres Matias. Bay was named an All-American by the NCBWA and landed on the Academic All-ASUN Team with Brody Szako. Braunecker was named to the All-Tournament Team following his win over Jacksonville in the second round of the ASUN Championship. Braunecker also joined Jacob Weaver on the College Sports Communicators Academic All-District Team.

2024: Fanning led his team to the program's 16th Conference Championship in his second season as the Governors head coach. This is the first time since 2012 the Gobs have won the title. Austin Peay ranked first nationally in batting

average (.359), home runs per game (2.61), slugging percentage (.661), on-base percentage (.455), scoring (10.9 runs per game), and second in doubles per game (2.79). In doing so and leading his team to a 35-win season, Fanning was named the 2024 ASUN Coach of the Year while a program-record 10 Governors were named All-ASUN selections. Leading the charge in major ASUN awards, the dynamic two-way Lyle Miller-Green was named ASUN Player of the Year after setting the program record for home runs in a season with 30. Jon Gazdar ranked nationally as the fourth toughest batter to strike out, averaging a strikeout every 16.9 at-bats. Gazdar was also superb defensively and was named ASUN Defensive Player of the Year. Miller-Green and Gazdar also earned All-American honors as members of the ABCA/Rawlings All-American Team. This was the first time since 2013 that a pair of Gobs have earned All-American honors in the same season. The remainder of the Gobs record-breaking All-ASUN roster for 2024 included Ambren Voitik, Brody Szako, Andrew Devine, Harrison Brown, John Bay, Clayton Gray, Gus Freeman, and Jaden Brown. Miller-Green, Gazdar, and Bay were all named to ABCA All-Southeast Region Teams. Jacob Weaver, Miller-Green, and Gazdar were also named to the 2024 Academic All-ASUN Team, with Miller-Green being the league's Scholar-Athlete of the Year. The Governors also excelled in the classroom, earning a cumulative team GPA of 3.32 in the fall and a 3.25 in the spring semester, placing Miller-Green, Gazdar, Gray, and Weaver on the CSC Academic All-District Team. At the conclusion of the season, four Governors were selected in the MLB Draft, including Miller-Green (Chicago White Sox), Gazdar (St. Louis Cardinals), Titan Kennedy-Hayes (Philadelphia Phillies), and Tyler Hampu (Colorado Rockies), who were all selected in the 20-round draft. In November 2024, Clayton Gray signed as a free agent with the Colorado Rockies.

2023: Fanning oversaw a complete overhaul of the roster in his first season as the Governors head coach by bringing in a Division I record 27 newcomers, including 22 transfers. That effort led to the program's most significant season-to-season improvement since 2016, as Fanning led APSU to a 26-win campaign that was seven victories more than the year prior to his arrival. Austin Peay was picked 12th in the ASUN Conference's Preseason Coaches' Poll and finished eighth after briefly ascending to the top of the conference standings in late April. The Gobs played 17 games against teams that finished the 2023 season ranked among the NCAA RPI Top 100, winning two games and losing four by one run. Austin Peay saw three student-athletes named to the All-ASUN roster: outfielder Garrett Martin, pitcher and designated hitter Lyle Miller-Green, and outfielder Clayton Gray. In addition, shortstop Jon Jon Gazdar was named to the ASUN All-Academic Team. The Governors set a program record with a 3.56 grade-point average during the fall and followed that with a 3.40 GPA during the spring, with 34 student-athletes earning academic recognition from the department or university. Following the season, Martin was signed as a free agent by the New York Yankees.

Since 1970, Austin Peay’s baseball team has made its home on the northwest corner of the Austin Peay campus. Originally called Governors Park, it was renamed Raymond C. Hand Park in 1993 in honor of the late Clarksville business and civic leader Raymond C. Hand, a great baseball enthusiast. In 2019, APSU athletics renamed the playing surface Joe Maynard Field to recognize the significant contributions of Joe and Cathi Maynard to Austin Peay’s baseball and softball programs.

The Governors have made Raymond C. Hand Park a nightmare for visiting teams, winning more than 58 percent of their home contests in their current location. Austin Peay enjoyed a streak of 12 consecutive winning home seasons from 2002-13 and, in 2019, posted its 36th winning campaign in 53 seasons at its current home.

Austin Peay has significantly improved the facility and its surroundings since the end of the 2019 season. Before the start of the 2020 season, Austin Peay baseball operations moved into a new facility with the completion of the Doug Downey Baseball Clubhouse and Operations Center that overlooks the park. Inside the new structure, student-athletes have access to an expansive locker room and a player lounge, while coaches have a separate area for their offices.

Alumnus and former Major League Baseball pitcher Shawn Kelley generously donated funds to complete the Kelley “K Club” inside the facility. This area serves as a team meeting room and converts into a premium seating area during Governors’ home baseball games.

Then before the 2022 season, Austin Peay again

made improvements to the seating area to improve the fan experience and safety. The athletics department installed a new net in front of the seating area that stretches from dugout to dugout and is 30 feet high. In addition, it replaced the chairback seating to provide more space for fans to enjoy Governors baseball.

In 2023, Austin Peay changed the dimensions at Hand Park for the first time since moving into the facility in 1970. Most notably, the center field wall was moved inward 17 feet to 375 feet from home plate. Meanwhile, the right field corner was moved in 21 feet and is now 300 feet from home plate. Protecting the new center field dimension is a 30-foot tall wall – triple the height of the previous wall. Meanwhile, right field will become the home of a new student-centered seating area. Austin Peay installed new padding around the field’s perimeter in conjunction with the new dimensions.

In addition to the on-field changes, Austin Peay significantly improved the home bullpen during the preseason. The previous natural surface was replaced by artificial turf, providing Governors’ pitchers with a three-lane facility to work throughout the year.

DOWNEY BASEBALL OPERATIONS CENTER AND CLUBHOUSE

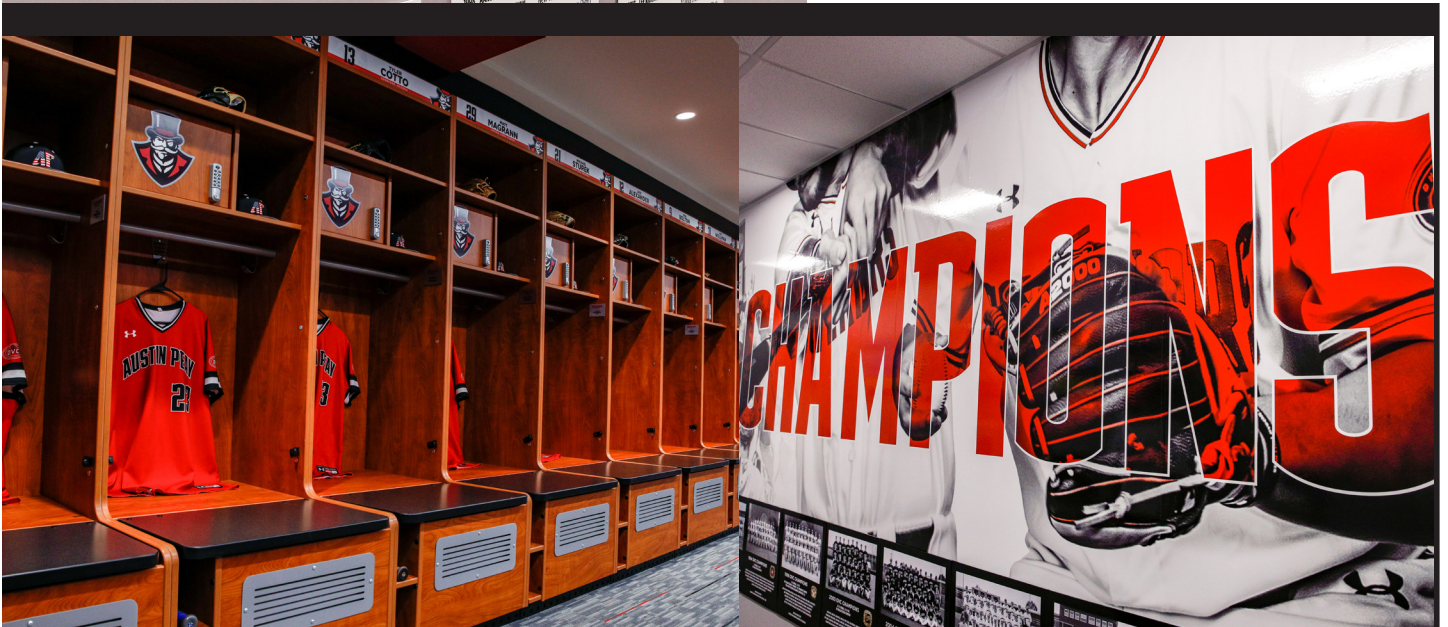


The Downey Baseball Operations Center and Clubhouse is the latest step in providing top-notch facilities for Austin Peay's baseball student-athletes and coaching staff. The center, which officially opened in October 2020, was made possible by the generous support of Austin Peay donors and alumni, including a lead gift by Doug ('79) and Linda Downey.

The more than 5,000-square foot facility includes updated locker room space and team lounge for the Governors baseball student-athletes. In addition, the Governors coaching staff will have use of new and larger office spaces as well as a meeting room.

Within the facility, Austin Peay recognizes its impressive baseball history, with areas in the entry and main hallway displaying the Governors' championship teams, All-America team honorees, conference award winners as well as recognition for past and present alumni playing in Major League Baseball.

In addition, the facility includes The Shawn Kelley "K Club" which provides a team meeting area for the Governors throughout the season and is available as a premium viewing opportunity for fans during games.

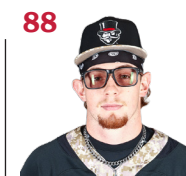
