Story Lines

- This week's clash at Humboldt State is one of only two games between programs currently ranked in the Division II Top 25. The Great Northwest Athletic Conference now has a pair of Top 25 teams in the same poll for the first time since Azusa Pacific joined the GNAC in 2012.
- Azusa Pacific is one of just a dozen NCAA Division II programs which entered the 2016 season with a win percentage of .800 or better over its past 30 games, and the Cougars rank among Division II's top-10 winningest programs over its previous 38 games (see chart to right). The top four teams on that list (Northwest Missouri State, Minnesota State-Mankato, Colorado State-Pueblo, Shepherd) represent the past three national champions plus the 2014 and 2015 national runners-up.
- The Cougars are 31-7 in their last 38 games overall and 22-4 in their last 26 conference games. Both stretches date back to a 2012 Homecoming victory over Central Washington.
- Two Azusa Pacific alumni participated in NFL training camps this fall: two-time GNAC Offensive Player of the Year **Terrell Watson**, who was assigned to the Cleveland Browns practice squad, and former OT **Luke Marquardt**, who made the Detroit Lions' 75-man roster before he was released in the final round of roster cuts to 53-player active rosters. Watson was initially announced as part of the Browns' 53-player active roster, but he went to the practice squad as part of five Browns waiver claims. Azusa Pacific is also represented in the pros by one active CFL player (Edmonton DB **Tyler Thornton**).

HEAD COACH VICTOR SANTA CRUZ

Head coach Victor Santa Cruz took Azusa Pacific football to a new classification, and he has already established the Cougars as an NCAA Division II destination program.

Santa Cruz guided Azusa Pacific through its transition into NCAA membership by leading the Cougars to consecutive 10-win seasons and back-to-back Great Northwest Athletic Conference championships in 2013 and 2014, which were the program's second and third seasons of NCAA competition. In four years of NCAA Division II competition, Azusa Pacific is a GNAC-best 30-14 overall, winning 22 of its past 26 conference games entering the 2016 campaign.

In 2013, Santa Cruz took a Cougar team picked fifth in the GNAC preseason poll to a 9-1 league record before concluding the historic season with a dominant postseason win in the Victory Bowl, 67-0 over Greenville College, to give Azusa Pacific its third 10-win season in program history. For his efforts, Santa Cruz was named the 2013 GNAC and National Christian College Athletic Association Coach of the Year.

A year later, his team repeated the GNAC title with another 10-win campaign, this time starting the year with a thrilling nationally-televised 26-23 double-overtime win over Division II's all-time winningest program Grand Valley State in front of a school-record crowd of 6,199 plus the national TV audience.

The Cougars responded from the season's lone setback with a season-ending nine-game win streak, led by Terrell Watson, who was the NCAA's leading rusher (all divisions) with 195.7 rushing yards per game. The 10-1 campaign was the first time Azusa Pacific produced back-to-back 10-win seasons. In 2015, despite the departures of Watson and offensive tackle Cody Clay to NFL camps, the Cougars extended their streak of producing a 1,000-yard rusher to a fifth straight year, helping produce the program's third consecutive winning season by going 6-4 overall and 3-3 in the GNAC.

The outstanding coaching staff Santa Cruz has assembled includes NFL Hall of Famer Jackie Slater, who was instrumental in the development of former walk-on tight end Luke Marquardt into an NFL-caliber offensive lineman (currently with the Detroit Lions) and 2014 graduate Cody Clay, who also signed an NFL free agent contract with the Atlanta Falcons and participated in training camp with the Dallas Cowboys.

In addition, running backs coach Ben Buys helped develop Watson into the 2015 NFLPA Collegiate Bowl MVP, which led to a spot on the Cincinnati Bengals practice squad in 2015 and a new free agent deal with the Cleveland Browns in 2016.

For all his recent success on the field, Santa Cruz is just as proud of the impact he's made on the program by placing his emphasis on the transformation of young men who can achieve success after graduation. His focus on academics has resulted in landing a league-high 44 players from Azusa Pacific on the GNAC All-Academic team over the past four seasons while claiming four consecutive GNAC academic team championships.

"I'm a passionate guy," said Santa Cruz. "I'm passionate about Jesus Christ, my family and Azusa Pacific. Through competition on the field and in the classroom, I want to see young men exit this program with an understanding of effective process, a sense of self, and the vision to become successful husbands, fathers, employees and employers."

It's a philosophy that has delivered concrete results, as evidenced by Azusa Pacific's recent success both on and off the field. The Cougars used a four-game winning streak at the end of the 2012 season as a springboard into consecutive 10-win seasons and GNAC titles in 2013 and 2014 and a third straight winning season in 2015 as the program has piled up a 30-7 record since winning its Homecoming game in 2012. The first four years of Division II competition came on the heels of back-to-back playoff appearances which wrapped up the program's long-standing affiliation as an NAIA independent program, and Santa Cruz was recognized as the NAIA Independent Coach of the Year in 2010 and 2011.

The 2011 season, which was Azusa Pacific's final year competing in the NAIA, opened with a narrow 42-40 loss to University of San Diego in a wild shootout that featured 48 combined fourth-quarter points in front of 6,124 (school attendance record at the time). Despite the season-opening defeat, Santa Cruz guided his team to six straight wins by an average margin of 38 points. The only other regular-season loss was a 38-31 setback at Lindenwood, but a resilient set of Cougars regrouped and closed out the regular season with back-to-back blowout wins over fellow NAIA independents Southern Oregon and Menlo to earn a spot in the 16-team NAIA playoffs.

Azusa Pacific piled up 587 yards of total offense in a 49-26 first-round playoff win before traveling to Helena, Montana, for the second consecutive postseason, for a quarterfinal matchup with defending national champion Carroll College. The Cougars scored on the game's opening possession and didn't trail until late in the fourth quarter when Carroll chewed up over eight minutes of clock with an 18-play scoring drive to edge the Cougars, 17-14.

Santa Cruz's 2011 offense, led by two-time NAIA Independent Offensive Player of the Year QB John van den Raadt, rushed for a school-record 3,915 yards in 2011 (326.2 yards per game) and also set the program's single-season records for scoring (45.6 points per game) and total offense (496.4 yards per game). Van den Raadt, who started 40 consecutive games for Santa Cruz, ended up shattering the program's career record for total offense, finishing with 9,335 yards which included another program-record of 6,639 yards passing. He was the only QB in scholarship college football (non-NCAA Division III) to average 100 yards rushing per game, and he was the leading rusher for Santa Cruz's offense which led the NAIA in rushing (3,915 yards) and scoring average (45.6), and also ranked as college football's most productive rushing offense by averaging 7.6 yards per rush attempt, making Azusa Pacific the only four-year college football program at any level in 2011 to average over seven yards per rush.

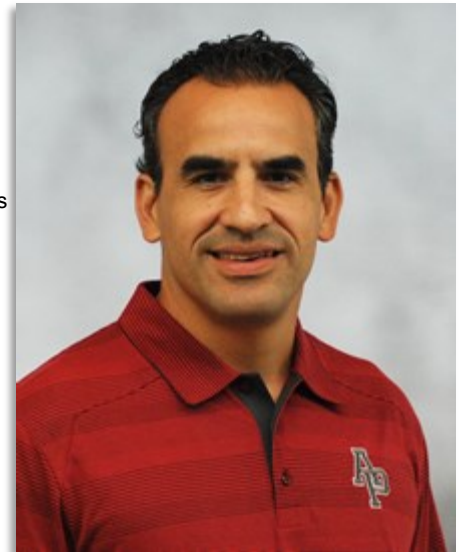
That final round of Cougar success in the NAIA was even more rewarding due to the process it took for an independent program to get there. Santa Cruz annually clashed with some of the nation's top programs, putting together schedules comprised primarily of top NCAA Division I FCS, Division II, and NAIA programs while traveling nationwide to play teams in Florida, Texas, Utah, Wisconsin, Oregon, Louisiana, Missouri, Washington, Montana, and Oklahoma.

Now in his 16th year on the Cougar coaching staff, Santa Cruz came to Azusa Pacific in 2001, serving five seasons as an assistant before taking over as head coach in 2006. During his first three seasons he served as the offensive coordinator, overseeing the development of the program's all-time leading passer (Luke Winslow) and the fourth-best all-time rusher (Ben Buys) at the time they graduated.

Santa Cruz played his collegiate ball at the University of Hawai'i, where he was a four-year linebacker for the Warriors, tallying 139 tackles (83 solo) during his career. He redshirted the 1990 season and then played in 46 games over the next four seasons (1991-94). As a 1992 sophomore, he played on the Rainbows' Western Athletic Conference championship team that beat Illinois in the Holiday Bowl.

The son of a former U.S. Marines major, Santa Cruz lived in Hawai'i, Arizona, Japan, Orange County and San Diego, where he became a prep standout at Rancho Buena Vista High School in Vista, Calif. He was the Palomar League Defensive Player of the Year while collecting All-CIF honors as a 1989 senior.

Santa Cruz graduated from the University of Hawai'i with a bachelor's degree in economics in 1995, and he completed a master's in organizational leadership from Azusa Pacific in 2010. Santa Cruz, who also teaches in the university's exercise and sport science department, lives in Rancho Cucamonga with his wife Jamie and their three children, Victor, Jr. (14), Izabella (13), and Levi (10).

VS. NCAA DIVISION II

Since 1996, Azusa Pacific is 43-30 vs. NCAA Division II teams. In 2010, the Cougars snapped a 10-game losing streak to D-II teams by defeating Lincoln (Mo.) University, 59-14, and in 2011 Azusa Pacific split a pair of road games against D-II foes in consecutive weeks, defeating future GNAC rival Dixie State, 48-19, before transitioning D-II program Lindenwood (Mo.) edged the Cougars by a 38-31 tally the following week.

Azusa Pacific joined Division II's Great Northwest Athletic Conference in 2012, going 4-6 that year against GNAC foes. The Cougars have faced at least two D-II opponents every season since 2003, when Humboldt State was the Cougars' lone D-II foe.

COUGARS REPEAT AS 17TH IN DIRECTORS CUP

Azusa Pacific's entrance into full NCAA Division II membership in 2014-15 was among the best first-year performances in Division II history, as the Cougars finished 17th in the Learfield Sports Directors' Cup program; the Cougars repeated 17th place last year in the program's second year of NCAA active membership.

The top-20 finish was the best performance by a first-year Division II program in the last 14 years; only two schools prior to that finished higher in the Directors' Cup standings in their first year of Division II membership.

The Learfield Sports Directors' Cup program awards points based on an institution's finish in up to 14 NCAA Division II championship sports (seven women's and seven men's). Prior to joining NCAA Division II, Azusa Pacific won an unprecedented eight consecutive NAIA Directors' Cup trophies (2005-12).

The best 2015-16 team finishes for Azusa Pacific were top-10 finishes from women's soccer and men's outdoor track and field. In all, 10 Cougar teams made NCAA Division II postseason appearances, an improvement over 9 teams advancing to the postseason in 2014-15.

COUGARS POSTSEASON HISTORY

Azusa Pacific qualified for the NAIA playoffs eight times, all since 1998, and the Cougars made a ninth post-season appearance with last year's invitation to the National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA) Victory Bowl. The Cougars are 10-7 all-time in postseason play. They won their first six NAIA playoff games, including all four in 1998 when they won the national championship in their first-ever postseason appearance.

2015 GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS & PREVIEWS

Sept. 3, 2015 (away), Azusa Pacific 27, West Texas A&M 24: Chad Jeffries threw for 269 yards and two TDs, completing 17-of-32 passes while spreading completions out to seven different receivers as the Cougars rallied from an early 21-0 deficit to beat one of NCAA Division II's perennial playoff programs in a hostile environment.

Sept. 12, 2015 (home), Humboldt State 62, Azusa Pacific 41: Humboldt State put together five first-half touchdown drives and went on to post a 62-41 win over No. 17-ranked Azusa Pacific in the Cougars' home opener. Ja'Quan Gardner rushed for 225 yards and three TDs, The Cougars scored on five consecutive drives to finish the game, as Jeffries threw for a career-high 319 yards, completing 22-of-35 with two TDs while Kurt Scoby rushed 13 times for 56 yards and two rushing TDs.

Sept. 19, 2015 (away), Azusa Pacific 16, Simon Fraser 10: Kurt Scoby's 84-yard TD run on Azusa Pacific's second offensive play sparked the Cougars to a 10-point first quarter, and Jeffries connected with Josiah Thropay three times including a 12-yard TD strike for the game-winning score in the fourth quarter of a 16-10 road win. Scoby rushed for 164 yards on 20 carries, while Jeffries completed 23-of-32 passes for 245 yards, and the Cougar defense came up with a pair of third-quarter turnovers and posted a second-half shutout.

Sept. 26, 2015 (away), Azusa Pacific 34, Dixie State 5: Azusa Pacific opened GNAC play with a 34-5 over Dixie State in which the Cougars ran for 340 yards as a team. Scoby led the effort with 162 rushing yards and two touchdowns, and quarterback Andrew Elffers ran in a 70-yard TD in the fourth quarter. The Cougars took the early lead with two passing touchdowns from Jeffries to Tarik Myles in the second quarter for a 14-0 halftime lead. Mykal Walker (seven tackles including a sack and an interception) helped the defense keep Dixie State out of the end zone for the first time this season.

Oct. 3, 2015 (home), Central Washington 24, Azusa Pacific 21: Azusa Pacific's last-second comeback attempt came up a yard short when Kurt Scoby took a desperation shovel pass from Chad Jeffries and scampered around and through the Central Washington defense to within a yard of the goal line, where he was pulled down after 77 yards as time expired in a 24-21 defeat. Jeffries threw for 319 yards and rushed for 74 more with two rushing TDs, and Scoby had 18 carries for a game-high 154 yards to lead Azusa Pacific's offense, which outgained Central Washington by a margin of 530-302.

Oct. 10, 2015 (away), Humboldt State 34, Azusa Pacific 16: No. 11-ranked Humboldt State pulled away in the fourth quarter for a 34-16 win. HSU was carried offensively by Ja'Quan Gardner, who rushed 36 times for a school-record 305 yards and three TDs. Jeffries was Azusa Pacific's rushing leader, carrying 22 times for 90 yards, and he completed 15-of-34 passes for 183 yards although he was held without a TD pass and threw two interceptions. Ethan Zeidler finished with game-highs of seven receptions for 113 yards, and redshirt freshman Kurt Scoby was held to 84 rushing yards on 18 carries, which snapped his three-game streak of rushing for at least 150 yards.

Oct. 17, 2015 (home), Azusa Pacific 61, Dixie State 14: Azusa Pacific scored on the ground, through the air, and on special teams in a convincing 61-14 non-conference win over Dixie State. The 61-point effort was the fourth-best scoring performance in program history, and it was the first time the Cougars had scored 60 points in a regular-season game since 2011. Sophomore QB **Andrew Elffers** made the most of his first collegiate start, completing nine-of-13 passes for 184 yards and two TDs while rushing 11 times for 82 yards. Freshman RB **Kurt Scoby** produced a game-high 146 rushing yards and four TDs on 17 carries, and junior LB **Sam Flemming** led Azusa Pacific's defensive effort with 12 tackles to help limit Dixie State to 275 yards of total offense. The Cougars forced two turnovers, turning both into touchdowns, and kept the Red Storm scoreless through its first seven possessions of the game.

Oct. 24, 2015 (home), Azusa Pacific 56, South Dakota Mines 27: Azusa Pacific entertained a Homecoming crowd of 6,039 with its best single-game offensive production this season in a GNAC game since the Cougars joined the league in 2012, piling up 573 yards including 381 rushing yards (both season highs). The Cougars' two-game scoring total of 117 points is the second-best two-game scoring total in program history. In addition to the team milestones, redshirt freshman RB **Kurt Scoby** surpassed 1,000 rushing yards on the season with 197 rushing yards on 18 carries. Scoby's effort was supplemented by 98 rushing yards from sophomore QB **Andrew Elffers**, who punched in three rushing TDs while completing six-of-13 passes for another 192 yards and two TDs in his second consecutive start under center.

Oct. 31, 2015 (away), Western Oregon 17, Azusa Pacific 14: Azusa Pacific rallied from a 17-0 halftime deficit with a pair of third-quarter touchdowns, but the Cougars' potential game-winning drive was halted in WOU territory with under a minute to play. The Cougar defense held Western Oregon to just 68 yards of total offense in the second half.

Nov. 14, 2015 (home), Azusa Pacific 38, Simon Fraser 17: Sophomore QB **Andrew Elffers** rushed for 118 yards and threw for 185 yards to lead Azusa Pacific to a 38-17 win over Simon Fraser in the regular-season finale. He became the first Cougar to rush and throw for over 100 yards in the same game since Nick Owens did so in the 2012 regular-season finale, which was also a home game against Simon Fraser.
