### OPENING TIPS

- The youngest team in college basketball will try to snap the nation's longest active home winning streak when Bradley visits #12/10 Arizona Monday night.
- With a 12-man active roster that includes 10 freshmen, Bradley overcame an 8-point deficit in the final 6:30 Friday night to open its 112th season with a 54-53 home win against Ball State.
- The Pac-12 favorites, Arizona also opened its 112th season Friday night by earning a 79-61 win against Pacific for its 39th straight home win.
- While Arizona is starting its season by playing its first four games at McKale Center, Bradley is making the 1,664-mile trek to Tucson for its second game of the season and will follow with a 2,053-mile journey to Charleston, SC for three games Thursday, Friday and Sunday in the 2015 Gildan Charleston Classic.
- Monday's game will be the 11th meeting in the all-time series between Bradley and Arizona, but the teams have not squared off since the Wildcats pulled out an 85-83, triple-overtime thriller Feb. 3, 1965 in Tucson.
- Arizona boasts four seniors with 394 games of combined NCAA Division I playing experience, the most number of individual games played by a senior class this early in a season in program history.
- Bradley's 12-man active roster totals 136 total career games played, 128 from two players.

- While Monday's game will be the 11th in the history of the series, it has been 50 years since Bradley and Arizona faced off on the hardwood.
- That last meeting resulted in an 85-83 triple-overtime decision for Arizona, which equals the second-longest game in Bradley Basketball history.
- The three overtimes are topped only by the NCAA record 7-overtime marathon against Cincinnati Dec. 21, 1981 and were matched last season when Bradley lost a triple-overtime decision at Missouri State Feb. 25, 2015.

**PAC-12 SUCCESS**

- Bradley is 39-34 (.534) all-time against the current Pac-12 Conference membership.
- The Braves have played all 12 Pac-12 schools and has at least a .500 record against seven of the current members: Arizona (7-3), Cal (2-2), Colorado (4-1), Oregon (1-1), Stanford (3-2), USC (5-3) and Washington (1-1).

**ARIZONA HOME STREAKS**

- Arizona enters Monday's game riding the nation's longest active homecourt winning streak, ripping off 39 consecutive wins at McKale Center.
- The Wildcasts have not lost at home since Pac-12 rival Cal exited McKale Center with a 77-69 victory Feb. 10, 2012.
- Arizona has won 25 straight non-conference home games, a streak started after Bucknell earned a 65-54 victory against the Wildcats March 14, 2012 in the first round of the 2012 NIT.
- The non-conference home winning streak is the seventh-longest active streak in the nation.

**ROAD STRUGGLES**

- Bradley has dropped seven straight non-conference road games, dating back to a 63-62 win against Illinois-Chicago Feb. 23, 2013.
- The Braves are 2-23 in their last 25 true road games since that win at UIC.

**ROAD DEBUTS**

- Monday's game at Arizona will be the first Bradley road game for first-year Braves head coach **Brian Wardle**, the 14th head coach in program history.
- The first 13 Bradley head coaches combined for a 6-7 record in their first true road games.
- **Jim Molinari** was the last Bradley head coach to win his first road game with the Braves, earning a 63-53 victory at Saint Louis Nov. 23, 1991.

**AGAINST THE TOP 25**

- Arizona started the season ranked No. 12 in the Associated Press Top 25 preseason poll and No. 10 in the USA Today Coaches Poll.
- Bradley has dropped 15 consecutive games against Top 25 teams since a 68-58 win against #18 UNI Feb. 13, 2010.
- Bradley has dropped 10 consecutive road matchups against the Top 25 since a 72-71 win at #16 Drake Feb. 19, 2008.
- The Braves have not won a true road game against a Top 25 non-conference opponent since dumping #20 St. John's (71-66) Dec. 13, 1958, a drought of 14 consecutive losses.
- Bradley's last win against an opponent ranked among the top 12 was the 77-73 victory against #12 Kansas March 17, 2006 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Auburn Hills, MI.

**THE LAST TIME OUT**

**Friday, Nov. 13: at Bradley 54, Ball State 53**

- Facing a 45-37 deficit, Bradley came out of a media timeout with 7:29 remaining with five freshmen on the floor and the Braves rode those five rookies to a 54-53 victory in Friday's season-opener against Ball State at Carver Arena.
- The freshman quintet of **Callum Baker**, **Dwayne Lautier-Ogunleye**, **Joel Okafor**, **Ronnie Suggs** and **Luuk van Bree** played out the final 7:29 together.
- Okafor started a 13-2 surge in a span of just 3-minutes, 4-seconds by canning a 14-foot jumper with 6:22 remaining.
- After coming up with a pair of blocked shots on consecutive possessions on the defensive end, van Bree drained 3-pointers on consecutive Bradley possessions to complete the outburst, giving the Braves a 50-47 lead with 3:18 left.
- Bradley shot just 31.9 percent from the field, but limited Ball State to 36.4 percent and outrebounded the Cardinals, 43-40.
- Lautier-Ogunleye scored a game-high 18 points, grabbed eight rebounds and dished three assists, while Barker just missed a double-double with 14 points and nine rebounds.

**NATION'S YOUNGEST TEAM**

- Bradley is one of five teams in the country boasting a roster that includes at least 10 freshmen.
- Bradley's roster has the highest percentage of freshmen in the country, however, increasingly so if you do not count the team's two inactive upperclassmen, leaving the Braves with 10 freshmen among 12 (.833) active players.

**EXTREME YOUTH MOVEMENT**

- Bradley's 10 freshmen are the most first-year college players the Braves have suited up in a season since freshman eligibility was reinstated in 1972.
- In the last three years combined, Bradley had rostered only eight total freshmen: 2012-13 (3), 2013-14 (3) and 2014-15 (2).
- The quintet of Missouri Valley Conference rivals Evansville (1), Indiana State (3), Loyola Chicago (1), Missouri State (3) and Southern Illinois (2) combine to roster 10 true freshmen.
- Bradley's first two opponents - Ball State (3) and Arizona (4) - combine to total seven freshmen.
- Since freshman eligibility was reinstated in 1972, Bradley had rostered more than five true freshmen twice: 1984-85 (8) and 1990-91 (6).

**5 STARTERS, 5 COUNTRIES**

- In Friday's season-opener, Bradley's starting lineup included five players from five different countries.
- Just playing five players from five different countries is a Bradley Basketball first.
- Not only does Bradley's roster include players from five countries, but four continents are represented:

**Bradley's International Players**

- Callum Barker** (Australia)
- Dwayne Lautier-Ogunleye** (England)
- Joel Okafor** (Nigeria)
- Luuk van Bree** (The Netherlands)
- Lautier-Ogunleye was the last member of the 2015-16 Braves to arrive on campus after competing for Great Britain at the FIBA U20 European Championships July 7-19 in Italy.
- Okafor moved to Richmond, IN, to start high school and played four varsity seasons at Richmond High School.

**HEAD COACH BRIAN WARDLE**

- On the heels of back-to-back 24-win seasons at Green Bay, **Brian Wardle** begins his first season as Bradley's 14th head coach.
- Wardle compiled a 95-65 (.594) overall record in his five seasons at Green Bay, which culminated with three straight postseason appearances and included the 2013-14 Horizon League regular-season title.
- Wardle was the youngest head coach in NCAA Division I basketball when he took over the Green Bay program in 2010 at age 30.
- Prior to taking over as head coach at Green Bay, Wardle spent the previous five seasons (2005-10) as a Phoenix assistant and two years (2003-05) as Director of Ops at Marquette.
- As a player, Wardle scored 1,690 career points at Marquette, still good for seventh on the school's career scoring list.
- Led the Golden Eagles in scoring in each of his final three seasons (1998-01).

**FIRST-YEAR BRADLEY COACHES**

- Bradley's last three head coaches - **Jim Molinari** (7-23 in 1991-92), **Jim Les** (12-18 in 2002-03) and **Geno Ford** (7-25 in 2011-12) - have combined to average just 8.7 wins in their respective first seasons with the Braves.
- Only four of Bradley's 13 previous first-year head coaches have produced a winning record in their respective debut seasons, most-recently when **Stan Albeck** finished his first season with a 17-12 ledger in 1986-87.

**INTERNATIONAL HISTORY**

- Prior to this season, Bradley Basketball's all-time roster had included 15 international players.
- The roster featured three international players in 2002-03, 2000-01 and 1999-2000, but never as many as four international players at one time.
- Seven of the previous 15 international players hailed from Canada.
- Five-time Olympian **Marcel de Souza** (Brazil) was Bradley's first foreign player in 1975-76.
- Bradley's roster has featured at least one international player in 17 of the last 20 seasons since **Cameron Rigby** (Australia) joined the Braves for the 1996-97 campaign.

**RETURNING NUMBERS**

- Bradley's 12-man active roster includes just two returning players and senior guard **Ka'Darryl Bell** is the only active player on the team to play more than one season of college basketball.
- Sophomore forward **Donte Thomas** is the only other active Brave with previous college basketball experience.
- The duo of Bell and Thomas have combined for 482 career points, 243 rebounds, 135 assists, 96 steals and 18 blocked shots in 2120 career minutes.
- By comparison, each of Arizona boasts three players who each have more points than Bradley returned this season.
- As this season started, 16 individual players from around The Valley had scored more career points, 11 had corralled more rebounds, 11 had dished out more assists and 15 had blocked more shots than Bradley's total returning numbers to enter the season.

**LOOKING AHEAD**

- Bradley will make the 2,053-mile journey straight to Charleston, SC to participate in the 2015 Gildan Charleston Classic.
- The Braves will open the tournament Thursday (8:30 p.m. CT) versus #6 Virginia in the final game of the first round.
- Bradley's side of the 8-team tournament also includes Long Beach State and Seton Hall and the Braves will meet one of those two teams Friday evening.
- After an off day Saturday, the tournament will conclude Sunday, when Bradley will face either George Mason, Oklahoma State, Ole Miss or Towson.

**DAUNTING SCHEDULE**

- Ten NCAA Division I teams won at least 30 games during the 2014-15 season and Bradley's youthful team will play at least six games against four of those teams this year.

- Bradley's non-conference schedule also could feature two games against 2015 Southeastern Conference NCAA Tournament participant **Ole Miss** (21-13) - possibly Nov. 22 in the final round of the Charleston Classic and Nov. 28 at home - as well as a Dec. 20 visit to defending Mountain West Conference regular-season co-champion and NCAA Tournament participant **Boise State** (25-9).
- The Braves will host Big 12 Conference member **TCU** (18) Dec. 23 at Carver Arena and could face one of the Big 12's six 2015 NCAA Tournament teams, **Oklahoma State** (18-14), during the Charleston Classic.

**TOP 10 MATCHUPS**

- Two of Bradley's first three games will be played against teams that have opened the season in the top 10 of at least one of the two major college basketball polls.
- Arizona opens the season at No. 10 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 12 in the AP Top 25.
- Virginia checks in at No. 6 in both polls and is receiving one first-place vote in the AP Top 25.
- Bradley's 2015-16 schedule also includes two games against Valley rival Wichita State, which opens at No. 10 in the AP Top 25 and No. 12 in the Coaches Poll.

**CARVER ARENA**

- The Peoria Civic Center's Carver Arena has served as Bradley's primary home court since the start of the 1982-83 season.
- The Braves boast a 349-136 (.719) all-time record at Carver Arena, including a 193-92 (.677) record in Missouri Valley Conference games.

- When Bradley hosts longtime league rival Drake Feb. 20, it will be the 1,000th Missouri Valley Conference game in Braves history.

**MVC HALL OF FAMER**

- When **Anthony Parker** is enshrined into the Missouri Valley Conference Hall of Fame during the 2016 MVC Men's Basketball Championship, he will become the eighth former Bradley Basketball player and 10th overall representative of Bradley Athletics inducted into the Hall.
- Parker was the 1996 MVC Men's Basketball Player of the Year and he remains the ninth-leading scorer in program history with 1,683 career points.


