STARTING FIVE

- 1. THE GAME:** Boise State men's basketball (1-1) hits the road for a marquee matchup Thursday, at No. 12/10 Arizona (2-0). Tipoff is at 6:30 p.m., and will be televised on the Pac-12 Network.
- 2. DOUBLE-DOUBLES:** Chandler Hutchison and James Webb III each recorded a double-double Monday, against Northern Arizona. It was the first of Hutchison's career and ninth for Webb. It marked the first time since 2009, two Broncos had a double-double in the same game.
- 3. vs ARIZONA:** Thursday marks the first all-time meeting between Boise State and Arizona. The Broncos are 8-29 all-time against Pac-12 opponents, including a 2-21 mark on the road.
- 4. SEE YOU SOON?:** The Bronco-Wildcat matchup is officially a nonbracketed game in the DirecTV Wooden Legacy. Boise State and Arizona will both spend Thanksgiving weekend in Southern California. The teams are on opposite sides of the bracket, but could meet on the final day.
- 5. VOLUME SCORER:** Anthony Drmic started the season with back-to-back 20-point games, the first time Drmic has hit the plateau in consecutive games since December 2013. Drmic has extended such a streak to three games three times in his career, most recently in November 2013.

DYNAMIC DUO

PRESEASON ALL-MW: Anthony Drmic and James Webb III were selected to the preseason All-Mountain West First Team. Drmic was also picked to the preseason All-MW First Team prior to last season. He has twice made the All-Mountain West Second Team at year's end. Webb, a redshirt junior, is the only non-senior on the preseason all-conference team. He was a second-team All-MW pick last season as well as the conference's newcomer of the year and an all-defensive team selection. Boise State is the only school with two representatives on the five-member preseason all-conference team.

BLENDING TOGETHER: Despite the heaps of individual accolades and this marking the third season Anthony Drmic and James Webb III have been together at Boise State, the duo enters the season having only been on the floor at the same for 41:18 of regular season game action. Drmic and Webb have never played together at home in the regular season.

SENIOR YEAR, TAKE TWO: Anthony Drmic was granted a fifth year of eligibility after his 2014-15 campaign was cut short by injury. Drmic played in just seven games during his fourth campaign as a Bronco before undergoing season-ending ankle surgery. Doctors performed reconstructive surgery on his left ankle Jan. 15, and Drmic is still recovering. He has been a full participant in practice since September.

SCORING LEADER: Anthony Drmic was Boise State's leading scorer each of his first three seasons. Drmic averaged 12.0 points per game as a freshman, 17.7 as a sophomore and 15.9 as a junior. He joined Tanoka Beard (1990-93) and Abe Jackson (2000-02) as the only Broncos in school history to lead the team in scoring three seasons. Beard is the only four-time scoring leader.

COMIN' FOR THAT NO. 1 SPOT: Anthony Drmic has 1,573 career points, seventh all-time. He is 371 points shy of Tanoka Beard's all-time record (1,944). If Drmic plays every game the rest of the season he would need to average 12.4 points per game to break the record. If he averages 14.3 points over 30 more games he would become the first 2,000-point scorer in program history.

CRASHING COBY'S CLUB: Anthony Drmic is on pace to join an exclusive club at Boise State. Drmic has eclipsed the 1,500-point plateau as well as hitting 200 assists, and is on the verge of a few more milestones. He is nearing 500 rebounds and 100 steals for his career. If Drmic achieves them all, he will join Coby Karl as the only Broncos in program history to score 1,500 points, grab 500 rebounds, dish 200 assists and swipe 100 steals. Only two players in Mountain West history have achieved those numbers; Lee Cummard (BYU, 2005-09) and Wink Adams (UNLV, 2005-09).

GOOD OMEN: James Webb III is the third Bronco to win a conference's Newcomer of the Year Award and the first since 1996. Previously, Arnell Jones (1987) and Joe Wyatt (1996) earned the honor in the Big Sky Conference. In their next season, both Jones and Wyatt were named first-team all-conference. Jones was the 1988 Big Sky Player of the Year.

NIKE BASKETBALL ACADEMY: James Webb III was one of 26 college basketball players to attend the invitation-only Nike Basketball Academy June 26-30, in Santa Monica, Calif. The camp featured instruction from current NBA stars such as LeBron James, Kobe Bryant, Kevin Durant, James Harden and Anthony Davis, as well as Hall of Famers Scottie Pippen and Gary Payton. Webb was widely lauded for his performance at the camp with many analysts noting his shooting ability and athleticism. Hall of Fame basketball writer Frank Burlison called Webb the second-best jump shooter at the event.

BIG PLUS: In 2014-15 MW play, Boise State outscored its opponents by 211 points while James Webb III was on the floor, the largest margin of any Bronco. Opponents averaged just 56.9 points per 40 minutes with Webb on the floor, while Boise State averaged 71.7.

TAKING HIS OPPORTUNITY: James Webb III took his opportunity and ran with it. Webb did not score in Boise State's first five contests, seeing the floor in just three of them and playing a combined 13 minutes. In the Broncos' sixth game, he led Boise State in scoring at North Carolina State (12 points) after not playing the first 26 minutes. Over the final 29 games, Webb averaged 12.4 points and 8.8 rebounds per game. He started 27 games, scored in double figures 20 times and recorded eight double-doubles.

MW COACH OF THE YEAR: Leon Rice was named the 2014-15 Mountain West Coach of the Year, in a vote of fellow conference coaches. It is the sixth time a Boise State coach has been named conference coach of the year and Rice is the fourth different Bronco head man to earn the honor. He was also selected coach of the year in a separate vote by MW media members.

DISTRICT HONOR: The United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) named Leon Rice the 2014-15 District VIII Coach of the Year. District VIII encompasses all Division I schools in Wyoming, Utah, Idaho, New Mexico, Colorado, Nevada and Montana. Rice is the first Boise State head coach to earn the distinction from the USBWA. Greg Graham earned the NABC District 13 Coach of the Year Award in 2007-08. NABC districts are determined by conference.

BRONCOS BOUNCE BACK: Two weeks into the conference slate, Boise State left Laramie, Wyo., 0-3 in league play, a half game ahead of last place and three and a half games behind first place. The Broncos responded with eight straight wins, and closed the regular season winning 14 of 15 to claim a share of the regular season conference championship. Boise State also earned the No. 1 seed in the Mountain West Championship by virtue of a season sweep over San Diego State.

WINNING WHEN IT MATTERS: Boise State won a school-record eight straight conference games from Jan. 13 to Feb. 11, then finished the regular season on another six-game conference win streak. The previous record of seven consecutive conference wins was accomplished three times while the Broncos were members of the Big Sky. This is the 15th different season in which the Broncos have won at least four consecutive conference games, in 10 of the previous 14 seasons the feat was accomplished, the Broncos advanced to the postseason.

20 WINS AGAIN: Boise State hit the 20-win plateau for the third year in a row and the fourth time in Leon Rice's first five years. It is just the second time in school history the Broncos have won 20 games in three consecutive seasons. Head coach Bobby Dye and guard Chris Childs led the Broncos to at least 20 wins in 1986-87, 1987-88 and 1988-89. Since becoming a four-year institution (1968-69), the Broncos have recorded 12 20-win campaigns, including 11 such years since joining Division I (1970-71).

25 WINS: Boise State matched the school record with 25 wins last season. The only other Boise State team to record 25 wins was the 2007-08 squad which also finished with a 25-9 overall record.

100 WINS: Leon Rice picked up his 100th win as Boise State's head coach, March 4, at San José State. Rice became the fourth Bronco head coach to reach 100 wins at the school and the first to do so in just five seasons. He accomplished the feat in his 161st game at the helm. Bobby Dye (1983-1995) is the fastest to 100 wins, earning the milestone victory in his 160th game as head coach. Rod Jensen (1995-2002) and Greg Graham (2002-2010) also won 100 games at Boise State, reaching the triple digits in their 182nd and 178th games, respectively.

CONFERENCE WINS: Boise State won a school-record 14 conference games during the 2014-15 season. The previous record was 13, accomplished twice in the Big Sky. The Broncos went 13-3 in consecutive seasons in 1987-88 and 1988-89.

TAKING IT ON THE ROAD: Boise State matched the school record with six conference road wins. It is the fifth time the Broncos have won six league games away from home in one season and the first since 2007-08.

BREAKING BARRIERS: Boise State recorded eight road wins last season, including victories at New Mexico (Jan. 18) Utah State (Feb. 3), UNLV (Feb. 18) and San Diego State (Feb. 28). Prior to this year, the Broncos were 0-3 at New Mexico, 0-18 at Utah State, 0-4 at UNLV, and 0-4 at San Diego State. Boise State has now won a conference road game at every MW venue.

GETTING DEFENSIVE: Boise State held a school-record nine opponents to fewer than 50 points last season, including five in its last 11 games. The Broncos limited a school-record six conference foes to fewer than 50 points, including twice doing so to consecutive opponents. The last time the Broncos held consecutive conference opponents in the 40s was 1999. Boise State has held an opponent under 50 points 15 times in the Leon Rice era. The Broncos are 14-1 overall in those games.

BRONCO 3-POINT BARRAGE: With Leon Rice at the helm, Boise State has become one of the top three-point shooting teams in the country in both volume and percentage. Last season the Broncos made a school-record 297 triples shooting at a 39.2 percent clip. There were nine games last season the Broncos made fewer than seven three-pointers. Only 100 NCAA teams averaged seven made three-pointers per game last season. Boise State has made at least 227 three-pointers in each of Rice's first five seasons, claiming five of the top eight single-season marks in school history.

They Said It...

"Has anyone done a better coaching job this season than Leon Rice? Boise State began the month so far off our radar we didn't even consider it. Throughout his career, senior guard Derrick Marks has been the embodiment of a high-usage gunner who racked up numbers but failed to do so efficiently. This season, his top-10 usage rate (32.8 percent) and top-five shot rate (36.2 percent!) have come with 52 percent shooting on 2-pointers and 48 percent shooting on 3-pointers. And not only is Rice coaxing a dream season from Marks, he's doing this without wing Anthony Drmic, a 3-point threat who lost his season to injury in December. Seriously, who has done a better job than Rice?"

#BRONCOHOOPS NOTES

BRONCOS PICKED SECOND: Boise State men's basketball was picked to finish second in the Mountain West in a preseason poll of media members from the league's 11 markets. The Broncos picked up two first-place votes and tallied 234 points in the poll. San Diego State led the preseason poll with 272 points and 22 of the 25 first-place votes.

REIGNING CHAMPS: Boise State is the defending Mountain West regular-season champion and the nonconference schedule reflects that. The Broncos will take on the defending regular-season champion from three leagues in nonconference play (Big Sky, Big West, Pac-12), the most in the Mountain West.

BETTER WITH AGE: Boise State enters the season with one of its oldest teams in recent memory. The Bronco roster includes four redshirt seniors, a redshirt junior and two freshmen who did not enroll immediately after high school. As of the first day of official practice (Oct. 2), the average age of student-athletes on the Boise State roster was 20.97 years or 7,659 days.

DEEP THREATS: Four Broncos on the 2015-16 roster have made at least six three-pointers in a Division I game. Nick Duncan leads the group with a high-water mark of eight made triples last season against New Mexico in Boise. James Webb III also torched the Lobos last year in Albuquerque, shooting a perfect 7-for-7 from beyond the arc. Boston College transfer Lonnie Jackson made seven three-pointers in one game as a freshman for the Eagles. Anthony Drmic, who may become the most prolific three-point shooter in Bronco history, has twice made six triples in a game.

ON A SCREEN NEAR YOU: Boise State had at least 25 games this season picked up for production and distribution by media rights holders. Of those 25, 10 will be carried by the ESPN Family of Networks, six on CBS Sports Network, four on ROOT Sports, one on the Pac-12 Networks and up to four by Campus Insiders. A handful of the remaining road games could still be picked up and any additional games at the MW Championship would be televised.

PLAYING THE PAC: Boise State will play at least two games against Pacific-12 Conference foes. The Broncos play at Arizona Nov. 19, and host Oregon Dec. 12. Boise State could see a rematch with the Wildcats at the DirecTV Wooden Legacy. It is just the fourth time in program history Boise State has had multiple Pac-12 teams on the schedule in the same season and the first time since 1997-98.

RENEWED PAC-10 HISTORY: When the Broncos host Oregon Dec. 12, it will mark just the 11th time a member of the former Pacific-10 Conference has visited Boise State. The Broncos are 4-6 all-time in home games against schools from that group, with Oregon State the most frequent visitor at four appearances (2-2). The Ducks have visited once previously (1996) and the most recent home game against a Pac-10 foe was 2007, against then-No. 9 Washington State.

MARQUEE MEETING: Boise State's home game against Oregon, Dec. 12, will mark just the fourth time in program history the Broncos have hosted a nonconference game between two teams returning from the NCAA Tournament. Previously: Dec. 10, 1988 vs Oregon State; Dec. 10, 1994 vs Pepperdine; and Dec. 14, 2013 vs Saint Mary's.

AT THE POLLS: Boise State received votes in the preseason editions of both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Polls. The Broncos were ranked No. 25 in the March 9 AP Poll, the first time in school history the Broncos broke into the rankings. Boise State received 30 points in the March 9 USA Today Coaches' Poll, the second team outside the top 25. Boise State has never been ranked by the coaches.

PRESEASON BRACKETS: Boise State is featured in the preseason NCAA Tournament bracket projections by CBS Sports (No. 7 seed), ESPN (No. 10 seed) and USA Today (No. 8 seed).

HOLDING COURT: Boise State is 63-15 at Taco Bell Arena under head coach Leon Rice, including a 34-2 mark in nonconference games. Boise State has won 42 of its last 48 overall at home.

70 THE MAGIC NUMBER: Under Leon Rice, Boise State's recipe for success has been to score 70 points. The Broncos are 81-16 when scoring at least 70, and 22-48 when failing to reach that mark.

THREE-POINT PROGNOSTICATION: Under Leon Rice, Boise State's success in the win-loss column can be traced to its three-point shooting. In Rice's six years, the Broncos are 66-23 when making at least eight three-pointers in a game. They are 37-41 when hitting fewer than eight.

SCORING MORE THAN THEM: It's the name of the game and Boise State was historically good at it last year. In conference play, the Broncos posted an average scoring margin of +10.9 points per game. That is the fifth-highest mark in conference history, and the most by a team with four losses. Boise State won nine MW games by double digits.

PASSING FOR SUCCESS: Over the last four seasons, Boise State is 33-1 when tallying at least 15 assists in a game.

HUTCHISON START: Boise State freshman Chandler Hutchison made the first start of his career against UNLV (Jan. 13). Boise State has lost just once since Hutchison entered the starting lineup (15-1). Hutchison became the second true freshman to start a game this season for the Broncos (Wacker).

GROWING UP FAST: David Wacker became the third Bronco freshman in the last 10 years to start a season opener. Wacker joins current teammates Anthony Drmic and Igor Hadziomerovic (2011-12) as the only freshmen to start an opener for Boise State since Coby Karl in 2003-04.

VS RANKED OPPONENTS: Boise State has won three road games against teams ranked in the top 25 of the AP Poll in school history. Two of those wins have come under Leon Rice. The Broncos won at No. 24 San Diego State Feb. 28, 2015. The other such win under Rice came Nov. 28, 2012, at No. 11 Creighton.

CHALLENGE ACCEPTED: Boise State has played 20 games against top-25 opponents since Leon Rice took over as head coach. The Broncos played 15 ranked teams in the 17 years prior to Rice's arrival.

#BRONCOHOOPS NOTES

POWER PLAY: Boise State is 2-37 all-time on the road against schools currently in the "Power 5" conferences. The Broncos have lost 15-straight such road games. Their last win came at Oregon State, Dec. 30, 2003. The other victory was at Washington State, Dec. 12, 1973. Under Leon Rice, Boise State is 0-11 in road games against "Power 5" schools, but 5-1 in home or neutral-site games.

NOVEMBER SUCCESS: Boise State is 27-5 in the month of November, under fifth-year head coach Leon Rice. The Broncos are 18-0 at Taco Bell Arena in such games.

UPPING THE OFFENSE: Boise State has been renowned for its offensive prowess ever since Leon Rice arrived. In Rice's first five seasons, the Broncos have led their conference in scoring three times, including pacing the Mountain West twice. In 2013-14, the Broncos hit a Rice-era high with 76.2 points per game, the second-highest in the last 38 years at Boise State (81.4 in 2007-08).

TAKING CHARITY: Boise State has been one of the best free throw shooting teams in the country, under Leon Rice. The Broncos have ranked in the top 25 nationally twice under Rice, including 2013-14 when Boise State shot 74.9 percent from the strip to set a single-season school record. The mark bettered the 2012-13 team's 74.7 clip. Four of the top six single-season free throw percentages in school history have been established during Rice's tenure as head coach.

WOODEN LEGACY: Boise State will play in the 2015 DirecTV Wooden Legacy Nov. 26, 27 and 29, in Southern California. The Broncos will be joined by Arizona, Boston College, Evansville, Michigan State, Providence, Santa Clara and Boise State's first-round opponent UC Irvine. The Wooden Legacy is owned and operated by ESPN Events. The group also runs the Diamond Head Classic, where the Broncos were runners-up in 2013. The appearance at the Diamond Head Classic was Boise State's first major early-season tournament appearance since the 2000 Pearl Harbor Classic.

RUNS IN THE SPJUTE FAMILY: Freshman Cody Spjute is the son of former Bronco Craig Spjute (1984-86). The elder Spjute played the final two years of his collegiate career at Boise State after transferring from Ricks Junior College. Craig Spjute was arguably the first three-point threat in program history. Before the NCAA adopted the three-point shot, the Big Sky instituted the arc for conference games beginning in 1982-83. In his two seasons, Craig Spjute made 45 of Boise State's 88 three-pointers. The next closest Bronco in the same two years made 10. Craig Spjute was 45-for-109 (.413) from beyond the arc in his career, still No. 7 in Boise State history.

LOCAL FLAVOR: Boise State men's basketball has two student-athletes who graduated from Idaho high schools on the roster at the same time for the first time since 2006-07. Malek Harwell (Pocatello; Century HS) and Cody Spjute (Boise; Borah HS) are the first such duo since Matt Bauscher (Caldwell; Vallivue HS) and Steve Tracy (Nampa; Bishop Kelly HS). Spjute is the first Boise School District product to make the Bronco roster since Booke Nabors (2000-04). Nabors was also a Borah High graduate.

BACK TO THE WELL: Freshman walk-on Collin Landry hails from Jesuit High School in Portland, Ore. The same Jesuit High School that produced former Bronco walk-on star, turned scholarship leader Jeff Elorriaga. In his four seasons Elorriaga made 221 three-pointers, third-most in Boise State history. His 42.7 percent three-point clip is also third in Bronco lore.

THE YEAR OF THE BRONCO: In 2014-15 Boise State was the school from the Football Bowl Subdivision that claimed a conference title (regular season or tournament) in football, men's basketball and women's basketball.

ON HARDWOOD AND GRIDIRON: Boise State captured a share of the Mountain West regular-season championship in both football and men's basketball in 2014-15, just the sixth time since the inception of the league that one school claimed both titles in the same year. Boise State is the only current MW school to have accomplished the feat. Utah did it in 1999-2000, 2004-05 and 2008-09. BYU did it in 2006-07 and 2007-08.

RARE ACCOMPLISHMENT: Boise State men's and women's basketball both advanced to the 2015 NCAA Tournament. It marked just the second time in school history both Bronco men and women advanced to the Big Dance in the same year (1994).

#BRONCOHOOPS NOTES

► **NICK DUNCAN**

PLAYING SMALL: Boise State saw its greatest success in 2014-15 with a small lineup. The Broncos were 20-7 when Nick Duncan started at center, including an 8-2 mark when Duncan scored double figures in those games.

THREE-POINT THREAT: Nick Duncan is a career 39.2 percent three-point shooter, making 121 in his first two seasons- already No. 13 in school history. Duncan recovered from an early slump in 2014-15 to shoot 38.4 percent on the year. He shot 46.5 percent from deep in the final 13 games of the season, helping Boise State to the NCAA Tournament.

ON THE WORLD STAGE: A native of Sydney, Australia, Nick Duncan once again represented his home country this summer. Duncan took part in the 2015 World University Games. He previously played in the U17 and U19 World Championships.

► **CHANDLER HUTCHISON**

FINDING HIS PLACE: Chandler Hutchison arrived at Boise State as the highest-ranked recruit in school history. The first ESPN top-100 prospect to sign with the Broncos, Hutchison played just 87 minutes during the nonconference season with most of his minutes coming against Division II opponents. After logging just one combined minute in the first three conference games, Hutchison was inserted in the starting lineup against UNLV (Jan. 10). The Broncos would win their next eight games and Hutchison remained in the starting five. With him in the lineup, Boise State went 15-3 and earned a spot in the NCAA Tournament. In two games at the MW Championship, Hutchison averaged 6.5 points and 3.5 rebounds.

RARE START: Chandler Hutchison became just the second Bronco freshman to start an NCAA Tournament game. Hutchison played 18 minutes, scoring four points and adding an assist. Steve Shepherd started as a freshman in the 1994 NCAA Tournament.

► **LONNIE JACKSON**

GRADUATE TRANSFER: Lonnie Jackson joins Boise State men's basketball after four years at Boston College. Jackson played in 96 games with 55 starts, before his senior year (2014-15) was cut short due to a lower leg injury. He was granted a medical hardship and fifth year of eligibility. Jackson can play immediately as a result of graduating from Boston College in June.

EMPHASIS ON THE SHOOTING: Before arriving at Boise State, shooting guard Lonnie Jackson made his mark on the Boston College record book. Jackson ranks No. 9 all-time at Boston College with 175 made three-pointers. As a sophomore in 2012-13, Jackson ranked sixth in the Atlantic Coast Conference making 2.0 three-pointers per game. His single-game career high is seven.

► **PARIS AUSTIN**

SHINING AS A SENIOR: After signing with Boise State in November, Paris Austin exploded on the prep basketball scene. Austin and Bishop O'Dowd High School played in numerous national events throughout the season, culminating in a CIF Open Division State Championship. Austin put up 21 points, seven rebounds and seven assists in the title game as the Dragons finished 28-4.

RANKINGS ROUNDUP: Paris Austin jumped into the top 100 of Scout.com's final rankings for the class of 2015. Austin was a consensus four-star prospect and top-20 point guard in the class of 2015.

A NIGHT TO REMEMBER: Amid a senior year of incredible performances, Paris Austin had one individual feat that stood above the rest. Austin set Bishop O'Dowd school records with 43 points and 12 made three-pointers Jan. 21, against Piedmont High.

ALL-STAR AUSTIN: Paris Austin played in the 2015 Ballislife All-American Game May 2. Austin gained internet fame for a posterizing dunk caught on camera during a practice session prior to the game.

► **ZACH HANEY**

BIDDING HIS TIME: Zach Haney signed with Boise State in April 2014, out of Atascocita High School near Houston. Haney redshirted during his first season on campus and will now look to contribute as a freshman with a full year of practice and strength and conditioning under his belt.

FOLLOW HIS LEAD: While Zach Haney was redshirting in 2014-15, James Webb III was coming off his redshirt season and emerging as a potential star for Boise State and taking home Mountain West Newcomer of the Year honors. Haney saw firsthand the impact a redshirt season can have and hopes to follow in the footsteps of Webb who also earned All-MW Second Team and All-MW Defensive Team honors last year as a redshirt sophomore.

VERSATILITY: While sitting out in 2014-15 and preparing to play during this offseason, Zach Haney has been praised by Boise State coaches for his versatility and athleticism at his size. Haney will be looked to as someone to stretch the defense at both forward positions and protect the rim defensively. His ability to knock down three-point shots and run the floor make him a perfect fit at the center position for Boise State, which thrives on mismatches.

QUICK START: Mikey Thompson is averaging 16 points per game off the bench through the first two games of the season. Thompson scored 15 in the season opener at Montana (Nov. 13) and backed that up with 17 in the home opener against Northern Arizona (Nov. 16). It is the first time Thompson has scored in double figures in back-to-back games since November 2014.

AND EFFICIENT: Through two games, Mikey Thompson has 32 points on 11-of-15 shooting from the floor (73.3 percent). Thompson shot 27.4 percent in his 17 games after the calendar turned to 2015 last year.
