OFF THE TOP

- Arizona enters Thursday night's game with the longest active home winning streak in the nation at 40 games. It's the third-longest streak in program history, which includes 81 games (1945-51) and 71 games (1987-92). UA's top two streaks make it the only program in the nation with multiple home winning streaks in the top ten in all-time NCAA history.
- Included in the Wildcats' 40-game home winning streak is a 26-game non-conference home winning streak, the nation's sixth longest.
- UA head coach Sean Miller is two wins from tying Fred Snowden (1972-82) for third place in career wins in UA coaching history at 167 victories, trailing only Lute Olson (589 wins) and Fred Enke (509).
- Senior Kaleb Tarczewski is 39 points from the 1,000-point mark in his career. He would become the 50th player in UA history to surpass 1,000 career points and the fifth Wildcat to achieve the feat under Coach Sean Miller.
- The Wildcats will look to carry over their improved shooting from beyond the arc in the second halves of games this season. UA is 4 of 18 (.222) from three-point range in the first half this season while connecting on 7 of 16 (.438) from deep in the second half.
- Thursday evening marks the first-ever meeting between the Wildcats and the Broncos. Arizona has faced 19 programs for the first time in program history during the Sean Miller era (2009 to present), posting a record of 18-1 in those games.

TRIER AND FRESHMEN 20-POINTERS

Allonzo Trier became the fastest freshman to score 20 points in a game in the Sean Miller era of Arizona Basketball at two games. Coniel Norman (1972-73), Eric Money (1972-73) and Mike Bibby (1996-97) are the only UA freshman to score 20 or more points in their collegiate debuts.

ARIZONA'S FREE THROW PERFORMANCE

In addition to Allonzo Trier's 22-point performance, there were some notable statistics at the free throw line

- Arizona attempted 52 free throws as a team, which was a new McKale Center record. The previous high was 51 free throws attempted against Washington (1-29-2009). The program record is 56 attempts versus Illinois in the Elite Eight of the 2001 NCAA Tournament.
- Allonzo Trier's perfect 14 of 14 performance at the charity stripe tied Nick Wise (vs. Washington 1-29-2009) for the second best performance at the line in UA history. Trier was just two short of the all-time record of a perfect 16 of 16 at the line by Jerryd Bayless vs. Stanford (2-16-2008)

TARCZEWSKI NAMED TO WOODEN AWARD WATCH LIST

Senior center Kaleb Tarczewski has been named to the 2016 John R. Wooden Award Watch List. Chosen by a preseason poll of national college basketball experts, the list is comprised of 50 student-athletes who are the early front-runners for college basketball's most prestigious individual honor.

Tarczewski is on pace to become the winningest player in program history after three decorated seasons as the everyday starting big man for the Wildcats. An integral part of Arizona's back-to-back appearances in the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament, the seven footer is also approaching 1,000 points and 700 rebounds for his career.

The Wooden Award is not the first national recognition for the 7-footer from Claremont, N.H. He was also named to the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Watch List earlier this fall as one of the nation's best big men. Tarczewski, who previously received Academic All-Pac-12 honors, is currently finishing his Business degree in the prestigious Eller College of Management at the University of Arizona.

THE WINNINGEST PROGRAM IN THE LAST TWO YEARS

Arizona has posted back-to-back 30+ win seasons. A win on Thursday night puts UA in a tie with Kentucky for the most wins in the NCAA since the start of the 2013-14 season. Three members of this list suffered a loss earlier this week; Wichita State, Duke and Virginia.

It's just part of the winning culture instilled on the Arizona Basketball program since the arrival of head coach Sean Miller. In Miller's six seasons in Tucson, UA has averaged 27.2 wins per season. Since the start of the 2010-11 season, the Wildcats have a 148-37 (.800) record, both the most wins and best winning percentage in the Pac-12.

ARIZONA AGAINST THE MOUNTAIN WEST

Arizona is 164-101 all-time against Mountain West programs, good for a winning percentage of 61.9 percent. The Wildcats have won five of their last six meetings against MW foes, following five straight losses. Those losses inclue two games versus BYU, which was a member of the MW through 2012. LAURI MARKKANEN INKS NLI WITH WILDCATS

The Arizona Basketball program picked up a commitment from a future Wildcat during the early signing period this fall. UA signed Finnish forward Lauri Markkanen to a national letter of intent. The 7-foot forward will join the team as part of the freshmen class of the 2016-17 season.

Markkanen represented his country in both the FIBA U16 and U18 European Championships. He led all players in the 2015 U18 European Championships in scoring at 18.2 points game while also grabbing 6.3 rebounds per game. His play this past summer in Greece was highlighted by his 27-point, 10-rebound performance in Finland's win over the Ukraine. Lauri Markkanen is the son of Pekka Markkanen who lettered in basketball at Kansas University before playing professionally in Finland and on Finland's national team.

KALEB TARCZEWSKI CLIMBING THE RECORD CHARTS

Senior center Kaleb Tarczewski wrapped up his 2014-15 season as the most winningest active junior in the country, compiling 92 wins in three seasons. Tarczewski is currently 16 victories away from becoming the program's all-time leader in wins.

SENIOR CLASS EXPERIENCE

The senior quartet of scholarship players of Kaleb Tarczewski, Gabe York, Ryan Anderson and Mark Tollefsen have combined to play in 390 Division I games entering their final season of eligibility. That is the most games of any Arizona class entering its senior season in recorded history. It is also the most among current senior classes in the Pac-12.

WILDCATS CONTINUE TO BUILD ON RANKINGS STREAK

The Wildcats have been ranked in 61-consecutive AP polls and 64-straight coaches polls. Since the start of the 2012-13 season, Arizona has spent 52 weeks ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll. UA took over the No. 1 ranking in the AP poll on Dec. 9, 2013, marking its first top ranking since 2003 and the first time a Pac-12 team had garnered the top spot since 2006.

The Wildcats held the top spot for a program-record eight-straight weeks. Arizona was one of just 11 programs in the nation to appear in all 20 Associated Press polls in 2012-13, and one of just eight programs nationally to do so in 2013-14. UA was the only program in the nation to be ranked in the top 10 in every AP poll in the 2013-14 and the 2014-15 seasons.

MORE ON HOME COURT WINNING STREAKS

Arizona was 17-0 at home in 2014-15, marking the program's third unblemished home slate under head coach Sean Miller and the 12th in the history of McKale Center. UA is 93-11 (.894) at McKale Center with Miller at the helm.

The Wildcats' current 40-game home winning streak is the third-longest in program history. UA's 81 and 71-game home winning streaks currently rank fifth and 10th in NCAA history, respectively. UA's 40-game streak is the longest active run of consecutive home wins in the nation. Arizona is the only program in the nation with multiple home winning streaks in the top ten in NCAA history.

THE LATEST ARIZONA CHAPTER IN TEAM USA HISTORY

One year after head coach Sean Miller and Stanley Johnson helped Team USA earn a gold medal at the 2014 FIBA U-18 Americas Championship, Miller and freshman Allonzo Trier added some more golden hardware. Miller coached Trier and the rest of Team USA to a gold medal at the FIBA U-19 World Championships.

Since 2013, players, coaches and staff with Arizona ties have combined to collect eight gold medals with USA Basketball. Aaron Gordon was named MVP of the FIBA U19 World Championships in 2013, while Stanley Johnson was named MVP of the FIBA Americas U18 Championship in 2014.

Andre Iguodala helped the United States capture gold in the 2010 FIBA World Championship and the 2012 London Olympics while former Wildcat Richard Jefferson was part of Team USA's bronze medal finish in the 2004 Athens Olympics.

Senior center Kaleb Tarczewski also earned a bronze medal for Team USA this summer in the Pan America games in Toronto.

GOLDEN STATE WILDCATS: NBA CHAMPIONS

The Golden State Warriors claimed the 2014-15 NBA championship, and there were Arizona fingerprints all over the latest Larry O'Brien Championship trophy. Three coaches and the Finals MVP were all Arizona alumni.

Rondae Hollis-Jefferson (23rd overall pick, traded to Brooklyn) and Stanley Johnson (8th overall pick by Detroit) were both selected in the first round of the 2015 NBA Draft. The duo represented numerous NBA milestones for Arizona Basketball.

- 21 Arizona players have been selected in the first round of the NBA Draft
- 12 of Wildcats' last 14 first round selections have been lottery picks.
- The program, in the Sean Miller era, has produced seven NBA Draft picks.
- Arizona is one of just five programs in the nation to have three top-10 NBA Draft picks since 2011.
- 40 Wildcats have been selected in the NBA Draft since 1988, third most in the nation.
- Arizona Basketball has produced two first-round picks in the same year on three separate occasions.

MCKALE CENTER: A CATHEDRAL OF COLLEGE BASKETBALL

The home court of the Arizona Wildcats continues its legacy as one of the most hallowed venues in college basketball. The McKale Center has led the Pac-12 in attendance in each of the past 31 consecutive seasons going back to the mid 1980's. Arizona has posted 17 seasons of an average home crowd over 14,000 fans since 1994. The dedicated fans help fuel UA's overwhelming home record. The Wildcats have an all-time record of 546-102 (.842) in the building. That mark is even higher during the Sean Miller era at Arizona (2009 to present) with the program notching a 93-11 (.894) record at home under Miller.

ARIZONA: A FREQUENT HOME FOR MCDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS

Freshman Allonzo Trier joins the Wildcats as a 2015 McDonald's All-American. Trier becomes the 21st McDonald's All-American to join the Arizona Men's Basketball program. In the last four seasons, head coach Sean Miller and his staff have welcomed six McDonald's All-Americans to the program: Brandon Ashley and Grant Jerrett in 2012, Aaron Gordon and Rondae Hollis-Jefferson in 2013, Stanley Johnson in 2014 and Trier in 2015.

ARIZONA PLAYERS ARE A MODEL OF NBA SUCCESS

UA players have been far from content by just hearing their names called on draft night, however. As has been reported by various media outlets, the fraternity of Arizona's NBA players has exceeded the collective \$1 billion mark in career earnings in 2014. Collectively, the Wildcat players who have been drafted since 1988 are an accomplished group, having won 14 NBA championships and made six All-Star appearances.

The group also boasts a Rookie of the Year (Damon Stoudamire), a Sixth Man of the Year (Jason Terry) and a Most Improved Player (Gilbert Arenas), a NBA Finals MVP (Andre Iguodala) and a NBA All-Star Coach (Steve Kerr).

There have been at least eight former Wildcats in the NBA in each of the last 16 seasons.

ARIZONA IN THE LAST FOUR SEASONS

While Sean Miller and Co. arrived in Tucson for the 2009-10 season, the 2010-11 campaign effectively marks the beginning of the Miller Era. Five years ago, the Wildcats claimed their first conference championship under Miller and made a run to the Elite Eight that only ended at the hands of eventual national champion Connecticut.

While UA has led the nation in wins in the last two seasons, the last four seasons of Arizona hoops have been among the best in the nation as well.

DEFENDING THE GLASS

Arizona finished the 2014-15 first in the nation in defensive rebounding percentage, securing 77.5 percent of available defensive rebounds. Defending the glass is something Arizona has done better than any other team over the course of the past three seasons. According to KenPom.com data, UA is the only program in the nation to rank in the top 15 in the NCAA in defensive rebounding percentage in each of the past seasons. The Wildcats are continuing their dominance on the glass in the early part of 2015-16 as well.

THE LATEST ARIZONA CHAPTER IN TEAM USA HISTORY

One year after head coach Sean Miller and Stanley Johnson helped Team USA earn a gold medal at the 2014 FIBA U-18 Americas Championship, Miller and freshman Allonzo Trier added some more golden hardware. Miller coached Trier and the rest of Team USA to a gold medal at the FIBA U-19 World Championships.

Since 2013, players, coaches and staff with Arizona ties have combined to collect eight gold medals with USA Basketball. Aaron Gordon was named MVP of the FIBA U19 World Championships in 2013, while Stanley Johnson was named MVP of the FIBA Americas U18 Championship in 2014.

Andre Iguodala helped the United States capture gold in the 2010 FIBA World Championship and the 2012 London Olympics while former Wildcat Richard Jefferson was part of Team USA's bronze medal finish in the 2004 Athens Olympics.

Senior center Kaleb Tarczewski also earned a bronze medal for Team USA this summer in the Pan America games in Toronto.

UA AGAIN AMONG ADJUSTED DEFENSIVE EFFICIENCY LEADERS

Bolstered by a defensive effort that ranked fourth nationally in field goal percentage defensive and sixth in scoring defense, UA ranked first nationally in adjusted defense in 2013-14.

The Wildcats ranked third nationally in that department in 2014-15, allowing less points per 100 possessions less than last season's nation-leading average.

Arizona's harassment of opposing ballhandlers was one of the catalysts for its high-level defensive efficiency in 2014-15, as UA ranked second in the Pac-12 with an average of 7.2 steals per game.

Sean Miller led Team USA to a gold medal to the 2015 FIBA U-19 World Championships as head coach with a roster that included Arizona Wildcat Allonzo Trier. This came one summer after he helped guide the U.S. U-18 National Team to a gold medal at the FIBA Americas Championship as an assistant coach.

The pair of gold medals he has earned as a coach are team with a third that he won one as a player at the 1991 World University Games in England.

MILLER AMONG NATION'S ELITE AT ADVANCING IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

Head coach Sean Miller has directed Arizona to its 17th Sweet 16 appearance in 2015, marking the program's third in a row and fourth in five years. He led Xavier to Sweet 16 appearances in 2008 and 2009, giving him six for his career.

Since 2008, Miller is one of four coaches nationally to lead a team to six or more Sweet 16 berths. He also has a 13-1 (.929) career record in the NCAA Tournament against lower-seeded teams, the best record in the history of the event.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Ryan Anderson had 18 points and 12 rebounds in his Arizona debut, lifting the 12th-ranked Wildcats to a season-opening 79-61 victory over Pacific on Friday night.

Arizona coach Sean Miller shuffled his lineup around all night in an effort to determine which combinations work well on this rejiggered team. No matter who the Wildcats had out there, they had no trouble against Pacific, building a 17-point lead by halftime.

Anderson, a transfer from Boston College, hit 5 of 8 shots and Gabe York had 13 points. Kadeem Allen added 13 points, five assists and four rebounds in his first game as the Wildcats' point guard.

Arizona extended its home winning streak to 39 straight games, including 25 straight in nonconference, and moved to 8-0 in season openers under Miller.

T.J. Wallace had 19 points and eight rebounds to lead Pacific, which shot 36 percent.

Arizona went to its second straight Elite Eight last season, but lost Stanley Johnson, Rondae Hollis-Jefferson, T.J. McConnell and Brandon Ashley from that team.

The Wildcats still have the sharpshooting York, 7-foot center Kaleb Tarczewski and point guard Parker Jackson-Cartwright to go with a talented group of new players, making them again the favorites in the Pac-12.

York and Allen were the catalysts early against Pacific.

A streaky shooter who had some big games last season, York was aggressive to start his senior season, confidently stroking in 3-pointers and driving hard to the basket. He had 10 points on 4-of-7 shooting by halftime.

Allen, the 2013-14 national JUCO player of the year, had no trouble getting into the lane, leading to easy baskets for himself or teammates. He had nine points and four assists, setting up Mark Tollefson along the baseline for a layup in the closing seconds of the first half to put Arizona up 41-24.

Pacific had trouble with Arizona's length and athleticism on defense, hitting 7 of 27 shots in the first half, including 1 of 10 from 3-point range.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Allonzo Trier scored 22 points and made all 14 of his free throws, helping No. 12 Arizona pull away for a 90-60 win over Bradley on Monday night. The gifted freshman was on target against Bradley, playing confidently while hitting four of five shots and grabbing five rebounds.

The Wildcats (2-0) needed a lift after laboring through the first half against the scrappy Braves. Arizona pulled away in the second to extend its home winning streak to a nation-best 40 games, including 26 straight in non-conference action.

Ryan Anderson added 15 points for the Wildcats, who shot 54 percent.

Bradley (1-1), college basketball's youngest team, held its own at one of the most difficult road venues in the country before fading in the second half.

Ronnie Suggs had 17 points to lead the Braves, who shot 2 for 14 from 3-point range.

Arizona rolled over Pacific 79-61 in its opener Friday night, though it could have been much more.

Wanting to get his young players early-season experience, coach Sean Miller put them all in the game at the same time late. When the Tigers made a run, Miller put the starters back in with about 90 seconds left, vowing never to use the same lineup again.

The Wildcats didn't have nearly the same flow against Bradley, no matter who was out there.

Arizona struggled from the perimeter — 1 for 9 from 3-point range — and never seemed to get into much of a rhythm in a foul-filled first half that featured 38 combined free throws, allowing the young Braves to hang around.

Bradley, which has 10 freshmen, had some success against Arizona's defense, particularly Suggs, who had 13 points in the first half to keep the Braves within six.

Trier was one of the lone bright spots for the Wildcats offensively. The freshman had 11 points by halftime, including a three-point play after a lose-the-defender crossover.

Arizona began to wear down the Braves with its size and athleticism in the second half, going up 55-42 after Trier lost another defender on a crossover and hung in the air for a three-point play. Gabe York later hit consecutive 3-pointers, pushing the Wildcats' lead to 20.

Bradley missed all 11 of its 3-point attempts in the second half.
