

Arizona vs. Boise State Notes

- Parker Jackson-Cartwright and Gabe York combined to score 27 of UA's 44 first-half points (61.4 percent) on a combined 10 of 12 shooting from the field. Jackson-Cartwright's 12 points in the half set a new career high.
- After Gabe York opened the game with a pair of three-pointers, the Wildcats connected on just one of their next nine shots from deep.
- Arizona shot five free throws in the first half after shooting 52 in Monday night's win over Bradley.
- UA closed out the first half on a 6-0 run in the final 1:35
- Allonzo Trier missed a free throw in the second half against Boise State, which snapped a streak of 19 consecutive makes at the charity stripe going back to the season opener against Pacific.
- Parker Jackson-Cartwright set a new career high in points with 14 points on an efficient 5 of 6 from the field (2 of 2 3FG's). Gabe York also set a new career high with 23 points. York and Jackson-Cartwright were a combined 6 of 9 from beyond the arc while the rest of the Wildcats shot 4 of 12.
- Ryan Anderson's 15 defensive rebounds were the most in a game since Ray Owes had 16 defensive boards against Houston on Dec. 8, 1994.
- The win against the Broncos on Thursday night extended UA's NCAA-best active home winning streak to 41 games. McKale Center has been sold out for 33 of those games (80.4% percent)
