Postgame Notes

- Arizona was shutout in the first quarter for just the third time this season (at Stanford, vs. Washington State). The 14 points surrendered in the opening quarter is tied for the most Arizona has given up in any first quarter this season (vs. UCLA, vs. Washington State).
- Cam Denson's pick-six on the second play of the second quarter marked his first career touchdown and Arizona's second pick-six of the season. (Anthony Lopez recorded a 23-yard interception return for a touchdown in first quarter of opener vs. UTSA).
- Denson's pick-six also marked the Wildcats' third defensive score of the season (Lopez 23-yard interception return, Allah 22-yard fumble recovery- both vs. UTSA in opener)
- The Wildcats have now scored 17 non-offensive touchdowns, including six last season and four so far this year. The defense has accounted for 13 of the touchdowns. Today marked Arizona's first loss when scoring a defensive touchdown (9-1) during that span, while UA is now 11-2 when scoring a non-offensive touchdown.
- Brandon Dawkins was inserted at quarterback in the second quarter on Saturday. He completed 16 of 30 passes for 305 yards and two touchdowns. He also ran for 78 yards on 21 carries, while rushing for a touchdown. All of those were career highs, while the 305 yards thrown for is the second most yards any UA quarterback has thrown for this year.
- Darrell Cloy Jr. recorded his first career catch in the second quarter on Saturday.
- The Wildcats forced multiple turnovers for the second straight game after not recording any multi turnover games in the seven previous contests. Arizona falls to 21-4 when forcing two or more turnovers in a game under head coach Rich Rodriguez.
- Brandon Dawkins 95-yard touchdown pass to Trey Griffey in the third quarter goes down as the second longest passing play in Arizona history. Jason Johnson's 99-yard pass to Brandon Marshall against Idaho on Sept. 8, 2001 is the only pass play longer. The reception also goes down as the third longest overall offensive play in school history. Trung Canidate's 96-yard run against San Diego State on Oct. 4, 1997 along with the Johnson/Brandon connection are only plays longer.
- Trey Griffey hauled in two receptions for a career-high 138 yards and a touchdown on Saturday.
- Arizona has now boasted a 100-plus yard receiver in seven games so far this season.
- Casey Skowron accounted for 13 of Arizona's 37 total points, as he booted through three field goals for the second straight week (22, 37, 46).
- Drew Riggleman's four punts landing inside the opponent's 20-yard line equals a career high.
- With the loss, Arizona falls to 48-40-1 all-time against Arizona State, while it is now 18-21-1 all-time in Tempe or Phoenix. UA and ASU are 2-2 over their last four meetings in Tempe.
- The home team has now won the last three meetings in the series.
- Arizona falls to 4-17 when trailing at the half under head coach Rich Rodriguez.
