The Last Time Providence Played Arizona:

The last time the Friars and Wildcats met, the two teams were battling for the right to advance to the 1997 Final Four in the NCAA Southeast Regional in Birmingham, Ala., on March 23, 1997. Down by seven with 1:15 to play, PC did not quit against the 15th-ranked Wildcats and Jamel Thomas' three tied the game at 85 with 14 seconds to play. Arizona turned the ball over giving PC a chance to win the game in regulation. Corey Wright received the in-bound pass with 3.9 seconds left and launched a three to win it all. Unfortunately it did not fall and PC was headed to overtime. PC eventually lost in overtime, 96-92, and Arizona went on to win the national championship. Providence's point guard in 1997, God Shammgod, currently serves as a graduate assistant for the Friars.

Cooley And Miller With USA Basketball: For the past three summers, Providence Head Coach Ed Cooley and Arizona Head Coach Sean Miller have coached together on the same staffs for USA Basketball. In 2013, they both assisted with USA U19 Team at the World Championships. In 2014, they both assisted with the USA U18 Team at the FIBA America Championships. Last summer, Miller was the Head Coach and Cooley was an assistant with the USA U19 Team at the World Championships.



Friars vs. Arizona: The Friars have posted a 2-3 mark all-time versus Arizona. In the last meeting versus the Wildcats, the Friars were defeated in overtime, 96-92, at the NCAA Tournament on March 23, 1997 in Birmingham, Ala. Providence's last victory versus Arizona was an 81-66 win on Dec. 22, 1992 in Providence, R.I.

Scouting the Wildcats: The No. 11/10 Arizona was picked first in the Pac-12 Preseason Poll for the fourth year in a row. The Wildcats finished last season with a 34-4 overall record after making it to the NCAA Elite Eight. Arizona finished first in the conference with a 16-2 conference record. The Wildcats are led by senior guard Gabe York, who is averaging 15 points per game. York has scored in double-digits in all five games for the Wildcats. Last season, York averaged 9.2 points per game and 2.1 rebounds per game. Senior forward Ryan Anderson is also chipping in with 14.5 points per game and 10.5 rebounds per game. Last season, Anderson sat out after transferring from Boston College to Arizona.

Friars vs. Pac-12: The Friars have posted a 10-10 mark all-time versus teams from the Pac-12 Conference. In their last game versus a team from the Pac-12 Conference, the Friars were defeated by Arizona in overtime, 96-92, at the NCAA Tournament on March 23, 1997 in Birmingham, Ala. Providence's last victory over a Pac-12 team was an 81-66 victory versus Arizona on Dec. 22, 1992 in Providence, R.I.

On Deck: The Friars will return to action on Sunday and will play Michigan State or Boise State in the Championship Game or the Third Place Game of the Wooden Legacy.

Friars In In-Season Tournaments: The Providence College Friars have posted an 87-59 (.596) record in in-season tournaments. Last season, the Friars participated in the Hall of Fame Tipoff Tournament at Mohegan Sun in Uncasville, Conn. The Friars posted a 4-0 record to win the tournament. Providence posted wins over Binghamton (66-45), Navy (88-51), Florida State (80-54) and Notre Dame (75-74).

Friars Defeat Evansville, 74-64: The Friars defeated Evansville, 74-64, in the first game of the Wooden Legacy tournament at the Titan Gym in Fullerton, Calif. It was Providence's first win over a team from the Missouri Valley Conference since they defeated Loyola (Chicago) 89-59 on Jan. 19, 2004. For the game, sophomore Ben Bentil (Wilmington, Del.) led-all in scoring with 24 points and also grabbed eight boards. Bentil's 24 points marked a career high, as he went 10-of-11 from the free throw line. Junior Kris Dunn (New London, Conn.) scored 18 points, had six rebounds, five assists, and three steals. Junior Lomomba (Montreal, Quebec) and freshman Ryan Fazekas (Chesterton, Ind.) scored in double-digits with 13 and 10 points, respectively. The Purple Aces got off to a quick start holding the Friars to three points, while going on a ten point run with 16:57 left in the first to hold a 10-3 lead. Evansville maintained the lead for most of the half, but the Friars cut the Purple Aces lead to one point with 7:49 left in the first, 22-21. Fazekas hit a three point shot with 7:01 left in the first to get the Friars' their second lead of the half, 24-22. The Friars continued to pressure the Purple Aces and went on a 12-2 run making the game 34-26 with 3:30 left in the first half. Bentil contributed six points in the Friars 12 point run. The first half ended with the Friars holding the lead, 40-32, with the largest lead of 11 points coming at the 45 second mark, 40-29. Bentil paced all in the first with 17 points and also added two rebounds. Following Bentil in scoring was Dunn with nine points. Also, Dunn had three steals, two rebounds, and two assists. The Friars went on an 11-point run and held Evansville off the scoreboard for the first five minutes of the second half. Dunn and Lomomba each contributed four points in the run. PC's lead grew to 19 points with 15:24 left in the game. The Purple Aces cut the Friars lead to 10 with 2:47 left in the second, 69-59, but was not able to close the gap further than 10 points as the Friars earned their fifth win of the season. For the game the Friars shot 23-of-25 (40%) and went 23-of-29 (79%) from the free throw line, while the Purple Aces were 27-of-53 (51%) from the field and 5-of-11 (46%) from the free throw line.

Friars All-Time Versus Top-25 Teams: The Friars have posted a 106-243 (.304) mark all-time versus top-25 teams, including a 1-5 record in 2014-15. In the Friars' first game versus a ranked squad last season, Providence was defeated at No. 1/1 Kentucky on November 28. In the team's second game versus a ranked team, the Friars won at No. 24/24 Georgetown, 74-71, on February 4. It was the Friars' first win over a Top-25 team on the road since 2004. In the team's third game versus a ranked squad, the Friars were defeated by No. 6/6 Villanova, 74-68, on February 11. On February 24, the Friars were defeated at No. 6/6 Villanova. On March 8, Providence was defeated by No. 21/21 Butler, 68-64. In the team's most recent game versus a ranked squad, the Friars were defeated by No. 4/4 Villanova, 63-61, in the BIG EAST Semifinals on March 13.




