OFF THE TOP

- Arizona will look to defend its home court and its longest active home winning streak in the nation. The Wildcats have won 44 consecutive games at the McKale Center, including 30 straight wins against non-conference opponents. The current streak of 44 straight wins is the third longest in UA history. Arizona won 81 consecutive home games from 1945 to 1951 and 71 consecutive from 1987-92. Both of those previous streaks rank in the top ten in all-time NCAA history, which makes Arizona the only program in the nation with multiple home winning streaks in the top ten in college basketball history.
- Freshman Allonzo Trier enters Wednesday's game after winning Pac-12 Conference Player of the Week honors following the team's wins over Fresno State and Missouri. Going back to his play previous to that week, Trier is averaging 17.3 points per game on 24 of 33 shooting (.727) over the last four games. The guard's shooting efficiency is aided by his scorching-hot 5 of 9 (.556) shooting from behind the arc during that four-game span.
- UA will see a familiar face on the Northern Arizona bench. The Lumberjacks are coached by Jack Murphy who spent the better part of a decade (1998 to 2006) as a member of the Arizona staff. Murphy began his time with the Wildcats as a team manager under Lute Olson.
- The Wildcats are coming off an 88-52 win over Missouri on Sunday evening. The 36-point win is the largest margin of victory over a Power 5 conference program in non-conference play since defeating Kansas State 125-87 on Dec. 30, 1997. During that 18-year span, UA played 206 non-conference games with 71 coming against institutions from a Power 5 conference.
- Arizona posts an impressive 246-109 record against fellow NCAA Division I programs in the state of Arizona, which includes Arizona State, Grand Canyon and Northern Arizona. The Wildcats' winning percentage in those 355 games is 69.3 percent.

BENCH SCORING PUNCH

Head coach Sean Miller's bench has outscored opposing benches in all ten games this season to the tune of a 226 points to 131, which is good for a +9.5 points per game. Arizona is the only program in the Pac-12 to win the battle of bench points in every game this season.

TOLLEFSEN ON THE OFFENSIVE GLASS

Forward Mark Tollefsen is tied with Dusan Ristic for the second most offensive rebounds on the team this season at 18. Tollefsen's 18 offensive boards account for 48.6 percent of the senior's total rebounds.

ALLONZO TRIER: PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Freshman Allonzo Trier's efficient scoring in a pair of victories for No. 13/12 Arizona helped him earn his first career Pac-12 Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week award on Monday as voted upon by media who cover the conference.

The 6-4 guard from Seattle averaged 21.0 points on a scorching 72 percent (13-18) shooting, including 63 percent (5-8) behind the arc, and 4.0 rebounds to lead the Wildcats to a 2-0 week. He opened with a career-best outing of 27 points (8-11 FG, 3-5 3FG, 8-10 FT) and six rebounds in an 85-72 victory over Fresno State on Wednesday. His 27 points were the most for an Arizona freshman since Derrick Williams tallied 28 against UNLV in Dec. 2009.

On Sunday, Trier followed up with 15 points on 5-of-7 field goals, including 2-of-3 from three-point range, in an 88-52 rout of the SEC's Missouri Tigers, a victory which extended the Wildcats' NCAA Division I-leading home win streak to 44 consecutive games.

Trier is one of 10 Pac-12 freshmen averaging double-digit scoring at 13.2 points per game, including 17.3 points on 73 percent shooting (24-33) during Arizona's current four-game win streak.

His 27 points in the win over Fresno State surpassed notable freshman scoring performances by Aaron Gordon (23 points), Stanley Johnson (22 points), Nick Johnson (20 points), Brandon Ashley (20 points) and Rondae Hollis-Jefferson (18 points).

EFFICIENCY FROM TRIER AND TOLLEFSEN

According to KenPom.com, both Allonzo Trier (40th) and Mark Tollefsen (78th) of Arizona rank in the top 80 in the nation in two-point field goal percentage at 68.9 and 65.9 percent respectively. Trier and Tollefsen make UA the only Pac-12 school to have two players in the top 80 in the NCAA in two-point field goal percentage.

EXCELLENCE IN THE CLASSROOM

As the University of Arizona enters finals week, the NCAA released the latest round of Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores earlier this semester. Arizona posted a perfect score of 1,000. That score puts UA in the top ten percent of all NCAA Division I basketball programs.

POINT GUARD PLAY

Arizona point guards Kadeem Allen and Parker Jackson-Cartwright have combined to record 72 assists to just 33 turnovers. Allen (2.0) and Jackson-Cartwright (2.3) both rank in the top six of the Pac-12 Conference in assist-to-turnover ratio individually.

FLOCKING TO THE MCKALE CENTER

The McKale Center's crowds are legendary throughout the college basketball community, and the 2015-16 season has been no different. Arizona's average attendance in six home dates this season is **14,471**, which currently ranks in the top 15 in the nation. Arizona has sold out half of their first six home dates. That 14,471 average accounts for approximately **98.8 percent** of capacity. Only seven programs in the nation have a higher capacity average through six games.

THE WINNINGEST PROGRAM IN THE LAST TWO YEARS

Entering the weekend, there is not a team in America that has won more games than Arizona since the beginning of the 2013-14 season. Kentucky is tied with UA at 76 wins as the winningest program in the last 2+ seasons.

Forcing empty possessions and slowing opponents' scoring has been a staple in Arizona's play. The Wildcats held their last three opponents, Missouri, Fresno State, Boise State and Gonzaga, **a combined 62 points** below their scoring average without the services of Kaleb Tarczewski. Here's a look at how much UA has locked down opposing scoring.

The Wildcats are holding their opponents a total of **102.2 points** below their scoring average, which is good for an average of **10.2 less points per game.**

MISSING TARCZEWSKI

UA will be without the services of senior center Kaleb Tarczewski for four to six weeks following a stress reaction and strained muscle in his left foot suffered in the Wildcats' first game of the 2015 Wooden Legacy in Anaheim, Calif. on Thanksgiving Day. Tarczewski is 16 points shy of 1,000 for his career and 13 wins shy of becoming the winningest player in program history.

IN MEMORY OF MICHAEL

In memory of former Arizona Basketball player Michael Wright, who passed away last month at the age of 35, his former teammates, managers, coaches and team staff members established this endowment to provide scholarship support for a former Arizona student-athlete who has finished their NCAA eligibility and wants to return to the University of Arizona to complete their undergraduate degree. UA AGAIN AMONG ADJUSTED DEFENSIVE EFFICIENCY LEADERS

Bolstered by a defensive effort that ranked fourth nationally in field goal percentage defensive and sixth in scoring defense, UA ranked first nationally in adjusted defense two seasons ago. The Wildcats ranked third nationally in that department in 2014-15, allowing less points per 100 possessions less than last season's nation-leading average.

Arizona's harassment of opposing ballhandlers was one of the catalysts for its high-level defensive efficiency in 2014-15, and it continues thus far in 2015-16

LAURI MARKKANEN INKS NLI WITH WILDCATS

The Arizona Basketball program picked up a commitment from a future Wildcat during the early signing period this fall. UA signed Finnish forward Lauri Markkanen to a national letter of intent. The 7-foot forward will join the team as part of the freshmen class of the 2016-17 season.

Markkanen represented his country in both the FIBA U16 and U18 European Championships. He led all players in the 2015 U18 European Championships in scoring at 18.2 points game while also grabbing 6.3 rebounds per game. His play this past summer in Greece was highlighted by his 27-point, 10-rebound performance in Finland's win over the Ukraine. Lauri Markkanen is the son of Pekka Markkanen who lettered in basketball at Kansas University before playing professionally in Finland and on Finland's national team.

DEFENDING THE GLASS

Arizona finished the 2014-15 first in the nation in defensive rebounding percentage, securing 77.5 percent of available defensive rebounds. Defending the glass is something Arizona has done better than any other team over the course of the past three seasons. According to KenPom.com data, UA is the only program in the nation to rank in the top 15 in the NCAA in defensive rebounding percentage in each of the past seasons. The Wildcats are continuing their dominance on the glass in the early part of 2015-16 as well.

@APLAYERSPROGRAM TO THE NBA

Rondae Hollis-Jefferson (23rd overall pick, traded to Brooklyn) and Stanley Johnson (8th overall pick by Detroit) were both selected in the first round of the 2015 NBA Draft. The duo represented numerous NBA milestones for Arizona Basketball.

- 21 Arizona players have been selected in the first round of the NBA Draft
- 12 of Wildcats' last 14 first round selections have been lottery picks.
- The program, in the Sean Miller era, has produced seven NBA Draft picks.
- Arizona is one of just five programs in the nation to have three top-10 NBA Draft picks since 2011.
- 40 Wildcats have been selected in the NBA Draft since 1988, third most in the nation.
- Arizona Basketball has produced two first-round picks in the same year on three separate occasions.

WILDCATS CONTINUE TO BUILD ON RANKINGS STREAK

The Wildcats have been ranked in 65-consecutive AP polls and 68-straight coaches polls. Since the start of the 2012-13 season, Arizona has spent 52 weeks ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll. UA took over the No. 1 ranking in the AP poll on Dec. 9, 2013, marking its first top ranking since 2003 and the first time a Pac-12 team had garnered the top spot since 2006.

The Wildcats held the top spot for a program-record eight-straight weeks. Arizona was one of just 11 programs in the nation to appear in all 20 Associated Press polls in 2012-13, and one of just eight programs nationally to do so in 2013-14. UA was the only program in the nation to be ranked in the top 10 in every AP poll in the 2013-14 and the 2014-15 seasons.

ARIZONA: A FREQUENT HOME FOR MCDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS

Freshman Allonzo Trier joins the Wildcats as a 2015 McDonald's All-American. Trier becomes the 21st McDonald's All-American to join the Arizona Men's Basketball program. In the last four seasons, head coach Sean Miller and his staff have welcomed six McDonald's All-Americans to the program: Brandon Ashley and Grant Jerrett in 2012, Aaron Gordon and Rondae Hollis-Jefferson in 2013, Stanley Johnson in 2014 and Trier in 2015.

ARIZONA PLAYERS ARE A MODEL OF NBA SUCCESS

UA players have been far from content by just hearing their names called on draft night, however. As has been reported by various media outlets, the fraternity of Arizona's NBA players has exceeded the collective \$1 billion mark in career earnings in 2014. Collectively, the Wildcat players who have been drafted since 1988 are an accomplished group, having won 14 NBA championships and made six All-Star appearances.

The group also boasts a Rookie of the Year (Damon Stoudamire), a Sixth Man of the Year (Jason Terry) and a Most Improved Player (Gilbert Arenas), a NBA Finals MVP (Andre Iguodala) and a NBA All-Star Coach (Steve Kerr).

There have been at least eight former Wildcats in the NBA in each of the last 16 seasons.

ARIZONA IN THE LAST FIVE SEASONS

While Sean Miller and Co. arrived in Tucson for the 2009-10 season, the 2010-11 campaign effectively marks the beginning of the Miller Era. Five years ago, the Wildcats claimed their first conference championship under Miller and made a run to the Elite Eight that only ended at the hands of eventual national champion Connecticut.

While UA has led the nation in wins in the last two seasons, the last four seasons of Arizona hoops have been among the best in the nation as well.

THE LATEST ARIZONA CHAPTER IN TEAM USA HISTORY

One year after head coach Sean Miller and Stanley Johnson helped Team USA earn a gold medal at the 2014 FIBA U-18 Americas Championship, Miller and freshman Allonzo Trier added some more golden hardware. Miller coached Trier and the rest of Team USA to a gold medal at the FIBA U-19 World Championships.

Since 2013, players, coaches and staff with Arizona ties have combined to collect eight gold medals with USA Basketball. Aaron Gordon was named MVP of the FIBA U19 World Championships in 2013, while Stanley Johnson was named MVP of the FIBA Americas U18 Championship in 2014.

Andre Iguodala helped the United States capture gold in the 2010 FIBA World Championship and the 2012 London Olympics while former Wildcat Richard Jefferson was part of Team USA's bronze medal finish in the 2004 Athens Olympics.

Senior center Kaleb Tarczewski also earned a bronze medal for Team USA this summer in the Pan America games in Toronto.

A HISTORY OF GOLD MEDALS WITH TEAM USA AS A PLAYER AND A COACH

Sean Miller led Team USA to a gold medal to the 2015 FIBA U-19 World Championships as head coach with a roster that included Arizona Wildcat Allonzo Trier. This came one summer after he helped guide the U.S. U-18 National Team to a gold medal at the FIBA Americas Championship as an assistant coach.

MILLER AMONG NATION'S ELITE AT ADVANCING IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

Head coach Sean Miller has directed Arizona to its 17th Sweet 16 appearance in 2015, marking the program's third in a row and fourth in five years. He led Xavier to Sweet 16 appearances in 2008 and 2009, giving him six for his career.

Since 2008, Miller is one of four coaches nationally to lead a team to six or more Sweet 16 berths. He also has a 13-1 (.929) career record in the NCAA Tournament against lower-seeded teams, the best record in the history of the event.

Zeek Woodley had 14 points and 10 rebounds for the Demons (0-4), who had struggled offensively since losing senior point guard Jalan West to a season-ending knee injury.

Trier started in place of forward Ryan Anderson, who sat as a precaution after tweaking his right ankle Thursday against Boise State.

The Wildcats failed to find an offensive rhythm despite a big height advantage. A nearly five-minute scoring drought allowed Northwestern State to get within 10 points with 11:10 left.

York then had a driving layup and a 3 on consecutive possessions and Arizona slowly pulled away.

Picked to finish second in the Southland Conference, the Demons have been reeling since losing West in the final minute of their opener at Mississippi.

The Demons' high-paced offense looked lost at times without their 20-points-per-game scorer in the teams' first meeting.

But their defense kept them in it. Arizona shot 37 percent from the field.

Brownridge's seventh 3 tied the game for the last time at 73-44 with 32 seconds left after the Broncos committed two straight turnovers.

York got fouled and missed the first, but made the second to put the Wildcats ahead 74-73. The Broncos inbounced on the baseline, but K.J. Feagin stepped out of bounds running up the sideline with a second left.

Anderson got fouled and made the first for a 75-73 lead before missing the second. The Broncos inbounced again on the baseline, but Brownridge's desperation 3-pointer from midcourt missed at the buzzer.

Jarvis Pugh missed two free throws that could have won the game in regulation for Santa Clara. York's potential winning 3-pointer missed at the buzzer for Arizona, sending it to overtime tied 65-65.

The score was even at 54 before Arizona made five free throws and Tollefsen hit two baskets in a 9-3 spurt that gave the Wildcats a 63-57 lead. Santa Clara came right back and tied it 63-63 on six straight points, capped by Brownridge's 3-pointer.

Anderson scored and got fouled, but missed the free throw. Brownridge got fouled and made both for another tie at 65. Anderson missed a jumper with 6 seconds to go.

Brownridge sparked the Broncos, scoring eight points in a 13-4 spurt that tied the game at 54. Their defense was big, too. Feagin stole the ball from Allonzo Trier and scored on a fast-break layup, and Matt Hubbard blocked a shot by Anderson.

Ryan Anderson added 11 points and seven rebounds, and Gabe York and Mark Tollefsen added 10 points each for Arizona. The Wildcats (6-1) were upset by Providence 69-65 in the semifinals after narrowly escaping with a 75-73 overtime win against winless Santa Clara in the three-day event.

James Webb III led the Broncos (3-4) with 17 points and Nick Duncan added 10 before he fouled out late in the second meeting between the teams in 10 days. The Wildcats also beat the Broncos 88-76 in Tucson.

Both teams were plagued by foul trouble. Anderson and Tollefsen each fouled out for Arizona and Elliott Pitts had four fouls. Boise State lost Duncan, and Gabe York and Anthony Drmic each had four fouls.

Jackson and Duncan each hit 3-pointers for Boise State during Arizona's 22-12 run that gave the Wildcats their largest lead, 57-38. Seven different Arizona players scored in the run.

The Wildcats trailed by one before they closed the half on a 16-6 run to lead 35-26 at the break, their largest margin in the opening 20 minutes. Seven different Arizona players scored, with Trier leading the way with seven. The Broncos never led by more than three.

SPOKANE, Wash. (AP) — Sean Miller keeps a tally of how a game is going based around 4-minute segments and for one of the rare times, Arizona lost every one of those segments to Gonzaga in the first half on Saturday.

“Very seldom have we been 0-for-5. Usually you get one of them,” Miller said.

Thanks to the shooting of Gabe York and key contributions from freshman Allonzo Trier the 19th-ranked Wildcats won each of those segments in the second half and walked out of The Kennel with a 68-63 victory over the 13th-ranked Bulldogs.

York scored 14 of his 18 points in the second half, including an 11-point flurry in the first 6 minutes of the second half that gave the Wildcats (7-1) an opportunity to overcome a 10-point halftime deficit. Trier added 14 points, including two key baskets in the last 10 minutes that gave Arizona the lead then helped extend it.

Arizona became the first non-conference team to win in Spokane since Illinois in 2012 and handed Gonzaga just its 13th home loss overall since the McCarthy Athletic Center opened in 2004.

Kyle Wiltjer scored 33 points - second-most in his career - and Domantas Sabonis added 18 points and 16 rebounds but the Bulldogs (5-2) got little help from others in losing for the second time in eight days. No other Gonzaga player scored more than six points and the Bulldogs committed 16 turnovers.

Even with York getting hot early in the second half, the Wildcats still trailed 50-42 after Josh Perkins' three-point play with 14:42 to play. But the Wildcats outscored Gonzaga 26-13 the rest of the way. Arizona pulled even at 50 and after the teams scored on six straight possessions to stay tied at 56 and Trier finally gave Arizona its first lead since the opening minutes at 59-58 on a driving layup with 8:18 left.

Arizona extended the lead to 66-61 with 3 minutes left before Wiltjer followed his own miss and scored for what proved to be Gonzaga's final points. Anderson then scored in the lane with 20 seconds left to clinch the victory. Anderson finished with 13 points.

“I think our team took a step forward today in understanding if we're willing to work as hard as we can on the court and leave it out there the sky is the limit for this team,” York said.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Kadeem Allen poked the ball free, chased it down and headed toward the opposite end of the court. Glancing over his left shoulder, he saw Gabe York trailing with a clear path to the basket.

Instead of taking on the lone defender by himself, Allen flipped the ball toward the front of the rim, where York seemed to fly in from the rafters to throw down an alley-oop that brought the McKale Center crowd to its feet with a roar.

“I’ve been waiting for that for a long time,” York said after No. 13 Arizona rolled over Missouri 88-52 Sunday night.

York and his teammates have been waiting for a game like this, too.

Though they had lost just once, the Wildcats had yet to really put together a complete game, playing well for a half or in spurts to pull out victories.

Even with center Kaleb Tarczewski (foot) sidelined for the fifth straight game, Arizona (9-1) was at full force against Missouri, blowing out the Tigers before they knew what had hit them.

Arizona raced out to an 11-point lead in the opening minutes and pushed it to 19 by halftime. The Wildcats didn’t let up, either, stretching the lead in the second half to extend the nation’s longest home winning streak to 44 games.

It was Arizona’s largest non-conference win over a Power 5 conference school since beating Kansas State 125-87 in 1997.

“We strung two halves together, which in the past two games we really haven’t been able to do that,” Arizona coach Sean Miller said. “It’s not necessarily who we were playing, but who we were.”

Arizona shot 56 percent and had 20 assists on 31 field goals. Six players scored in double figures, led by Mark Tollefsen’s 17 points. York had 16 points, Allonzo Trier 15 and Ryan Anderson gave Missouri fits inside, scoring 14 points and grabbing nine rebounds.

The Wildcats overwhelmed the smaller Tigers inside all night, outscoring them by 16 in the paint and outrebounding them by 17.

Missouri (5-4) also had trouble with Arizona’s length on defense, shooting 30 percent and going 2 of 14 from 3-point range.
