STORYLINES

- Gonzaga is 2-0 vs. the Pac-12 this season, taking wins over Washington and Washington State.
- The Arizona game marks GU's third of four games vs. the Pac-12 this season - GU faces UCLA on 12/12/15.
- GU is coming off of a third-place showing at the Battle 4 Atlantis in the Bahamas, including a defeat of in-state rival Washington and then No. 18 UConn. It marked the ninth straight time in which the Zags have finished third or better at an early season tournament.
- Kyle Wiltjer averaged 19.7 ppg and 7.3 rpg to earn B4A All-Tournament honors and subsequently WCC Co-Player of the Week honors.
- Gonzaga's top three big men - 7-1 Przemek Karnowski, 6-11 Domantas Sabonis and 6-10 Kyle Wiltjer - combine to score 41.6 points per game, amounting to 53 percent of the offense.
- Senior center Przemek Karnowski (back) missed his first career game due to injury vs. Washington State.

ABOUT GONZAGA

- Gonzaga has had a higher field goal percentage than all six opponents and outrebounded five of six opponents this season.
- Domantas Sabonis is averaging nearly a double-double at 13.5 points and 9.5 rebounds/game while shooting .642 (34-53) from the floor.
- Sabonis missed his second double-double of season by just one rebound with nine both games in wins over Washington and UConn, then missed it by one point against Washington State when he had nine points and 14 rebounds.
- Gonzaga is 4-0 when Sabonis scores double figures, and 1-1 when he scores less than 10 points.
- Kyle Wiltjer leads the team in scoring at 19.3 points per game, and has had 20-plus three times this season and double figures in all six.
- Wiltjer had double-double by halftime of Washington game, ended with 24 points, 11 rebounds in win.
- Head coach Mark Few is the winningest active coach in NCAA Division I by percentage at .810 (443-104).
- Gonzaga was picked to win the WCC regular season title by the league's coaches receiving all nine possible first-place votes.
- Gonzaga has won at least 20 games for 18 consecutive seasons.

ABOUT ARIZONA

- Head coach Sean Miller is 169-53 in his seventh season at the helm of the program, including four NCAA appearances and three Elite Eights.
- Arizona is allowing just 62.9 points per game and ranks second in the nation in defensive rebound pct at 82.8.
- Ryan Anderson is averaging a double-double at 16.0 points and 10.2 rebounds per game for the Wildcats.
- Two others average double figures in Gabe York (13.6) and freshman Allonzo Trier (10.6).
- A familiar face to Gonzaga in former San Francisco forward Mark Tollefson suits up for UA after transferring, averaging 8.0 points per game.

JUST WIN

Gonzaga consistently ranks among the nation's top programs when it comes to its win total over any span of seasons in the last 15 years, but even more so recently. Since the start of the 2011-12 season, GU has racked up 152 wins, the seventh-highest total and just one game out of a tie for fourth with Saturday's opponent Arizona, Louisville and Wichita State. Over the last two-plus seasons, Gonzaga is tied for the fourth-highest win total of 69 with Villanova and behind only Kentucky, Wisconsin and Arizona.

VS. THE PAC 12 AND RANKED OPPONENTS

Gonzaga is already 2-0 on the season against the Pac-12 Conference, defeating Washington at the Battle 4 Atlantis and Washington State on the road on Dec. 2. The Zags, who will also face UCLA (12/12) this season, went 3-1 last season against the Pac-12 and have won nine of the last 11 meetings with Pac-12 opponents. Gonzaga is 30-67 all-time against ranked opponents, including a 6-12 mark at home.

HE'S ON FIRE

Senior Kyle Wiltjer had one of the hottest streaks of his high-scoring career at Gonzaga against Washington State. In the first 10:00 of the game, he poured in 20 points, including four three-pointers. He had 20 of the first 27 Gonzaga points in the game and had GU out to a 27-14 lead to open the game. During the span, Wiltjer made 8-of-11 from the field and 4-of-5 from downtown.

PERKINS AND MELSON COMING OF AGE

Redshirt freshman Josh Perkins and sophomore Silas Melson have put up solid numbers despite being the youngest of Gonzaga's usual backcourt. Alongside seniors Kyle Dranginis and Eric McClellan, it's been the younger pair of Perkins and Melson who have carried the scoring load for the backcourt. Perkins had a career-high 16 in a road win over Washington State for his third double-digit scoring effort of the season, while Melson added 12 in the same game for his fourth double-figure scoring effort of the season. Perkins also leads the team in steals (8) and is second in assists (18), while Melson is second in steals (7) and fourth in assists (9). Perkins has shot the ball well from deep with a .474 clip (9-19) from three, while Melson is second on the team in free-throw percentage at .824 (14-17).

REBOUNDING AND DEFENSE

Gonzaga's keys to winning lie in its defense and rebounding, which is evident in its NCAA Statistical rankings.

ALL ABOUT THAT DEFENSE

For the second straight season, Gonzaga ranks in the top 30 in both field goal percentage and field goal percentage defense. The Zags were one of four teams to end the 2014-15 season ranked in the top 30 in both categories and currently rank that way in both this season. GU is 29th in FG percentage (.496) and 10th in FG percentage defense (.356). A large part of that is perimeter defense where Gonzaga ranks No. 1 in the nation in three-point FG percentage defense (.213).

BACK-TO-BACK WCC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

On Monday, Kyle Wiltjer was named WCC Co-Player of the Week for averaging 19.7 points and 7.3 rebounds per game while the Zags went 2-1 at the Battle 4 Atlantis. Wiltjer shot. 500 (21-42) for the week and scored 20-plus for the second time this season. That came one week after sophomore forward Domantas Sabonis earned the same honor averaging 20.5 points and 10.5 rebounds while making 19-of-23 field goals. In a 91-52 win over Northern Arizona, Sabonis scored a career-high 26 points on 12-of-13 shooting, while pulling down seven rebounds (four offensive) and adding one block.

1,000 POINT CLUB FOR KARNOWSKI

In Gonzaga's win over Washington to open the Battle 4 Atlantis, senior center Przemek Karnowski became the 39th player in program history to top 1,000 points for his career. The big man also stands just 19 rebounds shy of becoming the 14th player in GU history with at least 600 rebounds. The combination of 1,000 points and 600 rebounds is even more elite as only eight players in school history have accomplished that feat.

JACK OF ALL TRADES

Senior Kyle Dranginis will be relied upon for leadership and his ability to fill up the stat sheet, and no example was more telling than his Battle 4 Atlantis line. In three games in the Bahamas, Dranginis averaged a team-best 8.0 rebounds and a team-best 4.0 assists to go along with 6.2 points per game and 1.0 steals per game. He also had one of the biggest buckets of the tournament for Gonzaga when he tipped in a miss inside the last minute against UConn to give Gonzaga a three-point lead. Coming off the bench in '14-15, the Nampa, Idaho, native was third in the team in blocks (15), fourth in steals (23), fifth in assists (63) and sixth in rebounding (2.6/game).

ASSOCIATED PRESS POLL HISTORY

Since first appearing in the Associated Press Top 25 poll in 2000, Gonzaga has appeared in 195 polls, which is the 10th-highest total in that span. GU has appeared in a current streak of 23 consecutive polls dating back to the preseason poll to start the 2014-15 season. The Zags achieved the first No. 1 ranking in program history on March 4, 2013.

LAST TIME OUT...**No. 13 MBB Downs Washington State 69-60**

PULLMAN, Wash. (AP) Kyle Wiltjer scored 22 points and No. 13 Gonzaga beat stubborn Washington State 69-60 on Wednesday night.

Josh Perkins added 16 points, and Silas Melson had 12 for Gonzaga (5-1), which did not put the game away until the closing minutes.

Que Johnson scored 18 points for Washington State (4-1). Ike Iroegbu added 17.

Washington State took an early lead, but Wiltjer hit four 3-pointers in the span of 4 minutes to key a 19-4 run as Gonzaga took a 21-10 advantage. Wiltjer had 20 points in the opening 10 minutes, on 8-of-11 shooting, to help Gonzaga build a 29-14 lead.

Que Johnson scored five points during a 9-0 run that cut Gonzaga's lead to 36-30.

Gonzaga led 38-30 at halftime, after holding the Cougars to 37 percent shooting.

Gonzaga opened the second half with an 8-2 run for a 46-32 lead.

Washington State scored six straight points, but the Bulldogs replied with five of their own to maintain a 13-point lead.

The teams traded baskets through the middle portion of the second half, with Gonzaga maintaining a double-digit lead.

Ny Redding had a steal and layup to cut Gonzaga's lead to 57-48 with eight minutes left.

Iroegbu's layup cut Gonzaga's lead to 59-53 with 5:14 left.

Perkins replied with a 3-pointer for Gonzaga, and the Bulldogs held off Washington State the rest of the way.

Neither team shot well in the contest between two high-scoring clubs. Gonzaga shot 49.9 percent and Washington State just 40 percent.

Washington State's Josh Hawkinson, who came in averaging 18 points and 9.7 rebounds, was held to four points and six rebounds.

TIP-INS

Gonzaga: Mark Few leads all active Division I coaches with an .810 winning percentage. Domantas Sabonis is averaging 14.4 points and 8.6 rebounds per game. Gonzaga plays four Pac-12 teams, Washington, Washington State, Arizona and UCLA, this season.

BENCH PRODUCTION

Gonzaga's bench has been huge this season, led by Domantas Sabonis' 13.5 and Silas Melson's 9.7 ppg. The Zags' bench has outscored opponents by a total of 164 to 81, including a 49-9 mark against Northern Arizona. Sabonis had 26 vs. NAU and 15 vs. MSM, while Melson had 10 vs. NAU and 15 vs. MSM. GU also outscored UW's bench 26-13, UConn's bench 24-16 and WSU's bench 14-2. The Zags are 5-0 when outscoring the opponent's bench with the only loss coming to Texas A&M. The Aggies' bench won that battle 13-7.

ZAGS TO TRAVEL FAR AND WIDE

In its first month of the season, Gonzaga made the 5,900-mile (one way) trip to Okinawa, Japan, to take on Pitt at the Armed Forces Classic on November 13. After returning home on Nov. 14, the Zags jumped back on the plane on Nov. 22 and traveled to Paradise Island, Bahamas, for the Battle for Atlantis. That trek amounted to nearly 2,700 miles one way. All-told, between the two roundtrips, the Zags traveled more than 17,000 miles in the season's first three weeks. Now Gonzaga won't leave the state of Washington until Dec. 31.

SABONIS DOMINATES NORTHERN ARIZONA

Despite playing only 18 minutes in GU's season opener vs. the Lumberjacks, Domantas Sabonis racked up an incredibly efficient 26 points on 12-for-13 shooting from the field. He added seven rebounds, including four on the offensive end. Sabonis led the Zags last season in field goal percentage at .668 and is off to an even better start after the first five games, shooting .714.

WILTJER LIGHTS IT UP IN EXHIBITION

Senior Kyle Wiltjer racked up 33 points and added 14 rebounds to lead GU to a 90-58 exhibition win over Eastern Oregon on Saturday, Nov. 7. Five Zags scored in double figures in all, including Wiltjer, Przemek Karnowski (13), Eric McClellan (12), Josh Perkins (10), and Ryan Edwards (10).

REGULAR SEASON OPENER CANCELED AT HALF

Gonzaga's matchup with Pitt at the Armed Forces Classic ended abruptly at halftime when officials deemed the playing surface too slippery to continue. In a hot and humid environment on the U.S. Marine Base Camp Foster in Okinawa, Japan, the Camp Foster Fieldhouse filled up with 3,000 troops and their families, but condensation on the floor made the conditions tough for both teams. Players slipped often in the first half, but Pitt held a 37-35 lead. Kyle Wiltjer had a game-high 15 points for the Zags, although the win-loss results and stats will not count toward official game and career records.

BIG ATTENTION ON BIG MEN

Gonzaga's returning trio of big men in 7-1 Przemek Karnowski, 6-11 Domantas Sabonis and 6-10 Kyle Wiltjer has warranted national pundits to call it the "best frontcourt in America." In the first full game of the season, the trio combined for 58 points on 23-of-31 from the field (.742) and pulled down 23 rebounds. They also combined to go 11-for-13 from the free-throw line against NAU. Last season, that group combined to average 37.4 points and 19.1 rebounds per game, while shooting a combined .594 (566-953).

WILTJER NAMED PRESEASON NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CBSSports.com named Kyle Wiltjer its preseason national player of the year. Last season, he led the team with 16.8 points per game and shot a team-best .466 from behind the arc while making 68 three-pointers. He led the team in scoring 18 times and had a team-best 30 games with double-digit points and 11 with more than 20. His highest-scoring game came at Pacific on Feb. 19 with 45 points, the third-highest single-game total ever at GU. He became the seventh Zag named WCC Newcomer of the Year and was also a USBWA and NABC Second Team All-American, AP Third-Team All-American, First Team All-WCC selection and WCC Tournament Most Outstanding Player.

THE BIG KARNOWSKI

Center Przemek Karnowski returns for his senior season after averaging 10.9 points and 5.8 rebounds and earning All-WCC First Team honors in '14-15. The Poland native was first on the team in blocks with 39 and second on the team with a .622 field goal percentage. Karnowski also spent the latter part of the summer and early fall with the Polish National Team playing in the European Championships, advancing out of the group stage.

SABONIS: YEAR TWO

Often called the top NBA prospect on the team, 6-11 Domantas Sabonis enters his second season after leading the team with a .668 field-goal percentage as a freshman, including seven perfect shooting games. He also led the team in rebounding at 7.1 per game and scored 9.7 points per game, while earning All-WCC Second Team honors. Sabonis hit double figures in scoring 20 times and rebounding six times. He also played for the Lithuanian National Team in the European Championships, helping his squad advance to the title game, which also earned the team berth in the 2016 Summer Olympic Games.

PERKINS BACK ON COURT

Gonzaga's most heralded freshman last season, was forced from action in just the fifth game in '14-15 after a freak collision left him with a broken jaw. In those five games, Perkins averaged 5.0 points and 3.4 assists while shooting .500 (9-18) from the field and .400 (4-10) from behind the arc.

As part of the event, the Bulldog men's basketball team wore turquoise uniforms against NAU, which is a color symbolic of friendship and harmony in Native American cultures. N7 is Nike's long-time commitment and mission to inspire and enable two million Native American and Aboriginal youth in North America to participate in sport and physical activity. The N7 philosophy embraces the Native philosophy: "In every deliberation we must consider the impact of our decisions on the next seven generations."

GONZAGA RECRUITING CLASS RANKED NO. 12 BY 247Sports.com

Zach Collins, 7-0, Center, Las Vegas, Nev. (Bishop Gorman)

Collins brings size and experience playing in big games from one of the most successful high schools in Nevada, Bishop Gorman. He's been a part of three state championships for BGHS and played in the FIBA U-18 3-on-3 World Championships for Team USA this past summer. Collins is ranked No. 32 nationally by Rivals.com and No. 57 nationally by ESPN Top 100, while also ranking as the No. 1 player in Nevada by ESPN. This summer at Adidas Uprising, he ranked tied for fourth in rebounds at 9.4 per game and in blocks at 3.0 per game.

Zachary Norvell, 6-5, Guard, Chicago, Ill. (Simeon)

Norvell comes to Gonzaga from a basketball-rich high school in Chicago, Simeon Career Academy, which has graduated players like Derrick Rose and Jabari Parker in recent years. He's a left-handed shooting guard that has shown a combination of range and athleticism. This summer, the No. 76-ranked recruit nationally by ESPN Top 100 wowed onlookers at an AAU game in Las Vegas in which he put up 53 points, including 14 three-pointers with 11 in the first half.

Killian Tillie, 6-8, Forward, Antibes, France (INSEP)

Tillie, along with fellow signee Larsen, follows in the footsteps of current Zags Domantas Sabonis (Lithuania) and Przemek Karnowski (Poland), crossing the Atlantic Ocean to play for Gonzaga. On the way to winning MVP honors and helping his team to the title at the 2013 FIBA U16 Division A European Championships, he averaged 14.3 points and 9.6 rebounds and a tournament-leading 63.4 field-goal percentage. Tillie also led his country to a bronze medal at the 2015 FIBA 3-on-3 U18 World Championships.

Jacob Larsen, 6-10, Center, Holte, Denmark (SISU Copenhagen)

Larsen, like Tillie, continues the long line of international big men to make their way to Gonzaga. The Denmark native helped his country win the 2013 FIBA U16 Division B European Championship, earning MVP honors. He averaged 20.0 points and 12.1 rebounds, while shooting a tournament-best 67.4 percent from the field. Larsen posted 24 points and 16 rebounds in the championship game victory. For his efforts, Eurobasket.com named him the U16 Division B Best Player and Best Center.

Rui Hachimura, 6-7, Forward, Sendai, Japan (Meisei High School)

Hachimura burst onto the basketball scene in Japan last year, due in large part to his breakout performance at the FIBA U17 World Championships in Dubai in August 2014. He averaged a tournament-best 22.1 points per game. Hachimura also led Meisei High School to a second straight winter All-Japan High School Tournament title, averaging 28.0 points in five games. Hachimura would be only the fifth Japanese-born male to play NCAA Division I college basketball.

MARK FEW

HEAD COACH - 17TH YEAR - 27TH OVERALL AT GONZAGA

Gonzaga University head coach Mark Few has established himself as one of the most successful coaches in NCAA Division I basketball annals in his 16 seasons at the helm. He served as an assistant coach at GU for 10 seasons prior to take the reins of the program.

Few has put together one of the most dominating runs in NCAA history, especially in the West Coast Conference. The Zags have won or shared 15 regular season league titles in his 16 seasons (all but the 2011-12 season) and taken home the conference tournament championship 12 times. The Bulldogs won or shared 11 straight West Coast Conference regular-season titles from 2000-11, which was the longest current active streak in the nation at the time and the second-best streak all-time in the NCAA Division I ranks behind UCLA's 13 Pac-10 Conference titles from 1967-79.

Few has led Gonzaga to an Elite Eight appearance (2015) and five Sweet 16 appearances (2000, '00, '06, '09, '15), coached 10 All-Americans, six Academic All-Americans, 70 all-conference selections, 11 WCC Players of the Year, six league newcomers of the year and six league defenders of the year. Few has also cultivated NBA talent, including current NBA players in Kelly Olynyk, Austin Daye, Rob Sacre and Ronny Turiaf. He also helped recruit and develop Dan Dickau, Richie Frahm, Adam Morrison, Jeremy Pargo and Elias Harris, all NBA players. Morrison became the highest-drafted player in GU history when he was taken No. 3 overall by the Charlotte Bobcats in 2006.

Entering the 2015-16 Season, Few:

- Is the winningest active coach by percentage at .810 (438-103), leading legendary coach Roy Williams of the University of North Carolina at .788 percent (750-202 in 27 years).
- Tied for 17th for fastest to 100 wins in Division I, accomplishing the feat in 126 games
- Third fastest to 200 wins, reaching the milestone in 247 games
- Tied for sixth fastest to 300 wins, achieving his 300th win in his 347th game
- Fifth fastest to 400 wins, achieving the milestone in 499 games
- Ranks ninth in winning percentage after five seasons at .806 (133-32) and six seasons .811 (159-37); sixth after seven seasons at .821 (188-41); seventh after eight seasons .802 (211-52); seventh after 10 seasons .800 (264-66); sixth for 11 seasons .799 (291-73); ninth after 12 seasons .792 (316-83); ninth after 13 seasons .792 (342-90), fourth after 14 seasons at .801 (374-93) and sixth after 15 seasons at .801 (403-100)
- Ranks second for most wins after two seasons (52-16); fourth for three seasons (81-20); third for four seasons (105-29) and five seasons (133-32); second for six seasons (159-37); first for seven seasons (188-41); fourth for eight seasons (211-52) and nine seasons (236-60); third for 10 seasons (266-64), 11 seasons (291-73) and 12 seasons (316-83); second for 13 seasons (342-90), 14 seasons (374-93) and 15 seasons (403-100); first for 16 seasons (438-103)
- Is in the Top 15 among active D-I coaches for most 20-win seasons with 16, never having won less than 20 games in a season
- Is tied for fifth for most consecutive 20-win seasons for active coaches with 16

The Bulldogs made a 17th straight trip to the NCAA Tournament in 2015, a streak that started when Few was an assistant coach in 1999 and currently ranks the Zags tied for fourth among current active streaks behind Kansas, Duke and Michigan State. When Dan Monson departed for the University of Minnesota following that Elite Eight season, Few was named head coach and has continued the streak the past 16 years.

In 2015, Gonzaga took full advantage of that 17th consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament, making a run to the Elite Eight, before falling to eventual national champion Duke. The Zags won a school-record 35 games last season, including a record 22-game win streak, and WCC regular season and tournament titles. Few was named WCC Coach of the Year in a sweep of league individual awards -- Kevin Pangos, Player of the Year; Gary Bell Jr., Defender of the Year, Kyle Wiltjer Newcomer of the Year. In addition, Pangos and Wiltjer each earned multiple All-America honors, including Third Team accolades from the Associated Press. Following the season, Few also threw out the first pitch at a Seattle Mariners game on June 6, and coached the USA Team that earned a bronze medal at the Pan-Am Games.

In 2013-14, Few's Bulldogs again reigned supreme in the West Coast Conference, sweeping the WCC regular season and conference tournament titles for the 11th time in his tenure. GU put together a record of 29-7, including a 15-3 league mark before falling to top-seeded Arizona in the NCAA Tournament Round of 32.

Gonzaga finished the 2012-13 season 32-3, hitting the 30-win plateau for the first time in school history, and marking the 11th time in Few's 13 years as head coach the Bulldogs had single-digit losses. The Bulldogs finished the regular season ranked No. 1 and received a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament before falling in the Third Round.
