OFF THE TOP

- Arizona and Gonzaga will meet for the seventh time ever on Saturday afternoon in what will be the Wildcats' first-ever game at "The Kennel" in Spokane, Wash. Of their six head-to-head meetings, two have come in the NCAA Tournament, two in Tucson and two in neutral site games. The closest meeting to Spokane came in a neutral site non-conference match-up in the 2011-12 season in the "Battle in Seattle", played at Key Arena some 285 miles away.
- Head coach Sean Miller and company will come into Spokane on the heels of another successful November. UA's 6-1 record last month gives the program a November mark of 36-6 (.857) in the Miller era, including 24 wins in the last 25 games played in the month.
- The Cats are coming off two wins in three games in the 2015 Wooden Legacy over Thanksgiving in California. UA was led by Ryan Anderson in scoring, rebounding and free throw shooting. The senior averaged 18.3 points, 10.0 rebounds, 1.0 assists and 1.0 blocks per game in the tournament while shooting 20-39 (.513) from the field and 14-18 (.778) from the free throw line.
- The Wildcats enter Saturday's game as one of the nation's best defensive rebounding teams. According to KenPom.com, Arizona ranks fourth in the nation in defensive rebounding percentage at 82.8 percent. It's a continuation of the program's dominance of the glass as the Wildcats have ranked in the top ten in defensive rebounding percentage in three of the previous four seasons.
- Arizona and Gonzaga have agreed to continue their home-and-home series with dates in the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons. Arizona will welcome Gonzaga to the McKale Center in Tucson on Saturday, Dec. 14, 2019 before heading to Spokane on Saturday, Dec. 5, 2020.

ACCEPTING THE CHALLENGE OF TOUGH VENUES

Arizona has not been shy about playing true road games against great programs like Gonzaga. During the Miller era, the Wildcats have played non-conference games at Oklahoma, San Diego State, NC State, Florida, Michigan, UTEP, UNLV and Clemson among others.

THE ROAD WARRIORS

On top of owning the longest active home court winning streak in the nation at 42 wins, UA has a record of **74-42 (.637)** away from the McKale Center since the 2009-10 season. That record improves to **47-16 (.746)** in the past three seasons. Arizona is **8-4 (.666)** in true road games in non-conference play under Sean Miller.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

The Wildcats won an overtime thriller, 66-63, against the Zags in front of a sellout McKale Center crowd (14,655) after T.J. McConnell scored six of his twelve points in the overtime period. Brandon Ashley led the Wildcats in scoring with 14 points as Kyle Wiltjer tallied a game-high 15 points for Gonzaga.

UA AGAIN AMONG ADJUSTED DEFENSIVE EFFICIENCY LEADERS

Bolstered by a defensive effort that ranked fourth nationally in field goal percentage defensive and sixth in scoring defense, UA ranked first nationally in adjusted defense two seasons ago. The Wildcats ranked third nationally in that department in 2014-15, allowing less points per 100 possessions less than last season's nation-leading average.

Arizona's harassment of opposing ballhandlers was one of the catalysts for its high-level defensive efficiency in 2014-15, and it continues thus far in 2015-16

TOLLEFSEN VERSUS GONZAGA

One Wildcat who is no stranger to the Zags is Mark Tollefsen who has faced Saturday's opponent seven times in his career at San Francisco before transferring to Arizona. In his last two games against GU, the forward has averaged 19.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 1.0 assists and 1.5 steals per game on a combined 14 of 22 shooting (.636).

MISSING TARCZEWSKI

UA will be without the services of senior center Kaleb Tarczewski for four to six weeks following a stress reaction and strained muscle in his left foot suffered in the Wildcats' first game of the 2015 Wooden Legacy in Anaheim, Calif. on Thanksgiving Day. Tarczewski is 16 points shy of 1,000 for his career and 13 wins shy of becoming the winningest player in program history.

DEFENDING THE GLASS

Arizona finished the 2014-15 first in the nation in defensive rebounding percentage, securing 77.5 percent of available defensive rebounds. Defending the glass is something Arizona has done better than any other team over the course of the past three seasons. According to KenPom.com data, UA is the only program in the nation to rank in the top 15 in the NCAA in defensive rebounding percentage in each of the past seasons. The Wildcats are continuing their dominance on the glass in the early part of 2015-16 as well.

LAURI MARKKANEN INKS NLI WITH WILDCATS

The Arizona Basketball program picked up a commitment from a future Wildcat during the early signing period this fall. UA signed Finnish forward Lauri Markkanen to a national letter of intent. The 7-foot forward will join the team as part of the freshmen class of the 2016-17 season.

Markkanen represented his country in both the FIBA U16 and U18 European Championships. He led all players in the 2015 U18 European Championships in scoring at 18.2 points game while also grabbing 6.3 rebounds per game. His play this past summer in Greece was highlighted by his 27-point, 10-rebound performance in Finland's win over the Ukraine. Lauri Markkanen is the son of Pekka Markkanen who lettered in basketball at Kansas University before playing professionally in Finland and on Finland's national team.

VERSUS THE WCC AND AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

UA is 56-35 (.615) against current WCC members with a mark of 5-3 (.625) during the Sean Miller era. Gonzaga is the first UA opponent this season to be ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 rankings, which marks the 52nd consecutive season the Wildcats have faced at least one nationally-ranked opponent. Arizona is 12-11 (.522) versus ranked opponents under Miller while winning four of their last five games against opponents ranked in the AP Top 25.

THE WINNINGEST PROGRAM IN THE LAST TWO YEARS

Saturday's game will be a head-to-head meeting between two of the winningest programs in the nation in the past two seasons. Arizona posted back-to-back 30-win seasons for the first time in program history in 2013-14 and 2014-15 with a 6-1 start to 2015-16. Arizona trails only Kentucky for the most wins in the nation since the beginning of the 2013-14 season.

It's just part of the winning culture instilled on the Arizona Basketball program since the arrival of head coach Sean Miller. In Miller's six seasons in Tucson, UA has averaged 27.2 wins per season. Since the start of the 2010-11 season, the Wildcats have a 153-38 (.801) record, both the most wins and best winning percentage in the Pac-12.

DOMINATING THE GLASS

As of Thursday, Arizona led the Pac-12 Conference in rebounding margin by a full rebound at +13.4. The advantage on the glass ranks ninth in the nation as the Wildcats have out-rebounded their opponent in each of their seven games this season. UA has posted a double-digit rebounding advantage in four of those games.

GUARDS GETTING IN ON THE BLOCKS

Blocks have come as a group effort this season for the Wildcats. In particular, UA guards are doing their part in shot rejections. The guard quartet of Gabe York (2), Allonzo Trier (1), Kadeem Allen (4) and Parker Jackson-Cartwright (2) have combined to record nine blocks, which accounts for 36.0 percent of the team's 25 blocks through seven games this season. By comparison, guards accounted for 21 of the team's 131 blocks last season (16 percent).

THE LATEST ARIZONA CHAPTER IN TEAM USA HISTORY

One year after head coach Sean Miller and Stanley Johnson helped Team USA earn a gold medal at the 2014 FIBA U-18 Americas Championship, Miller and freshman Allonzo Trier added some more golden hardware. Miller coached Trier and the rest of Team USA to a gold medal at the FIBA U-19 World Championships.

Since 2013, players, coaches and staff with Arizona ties have combined to collect eight gold medals with USA Basketball. Aaron Gordon was named MVP of the FIBA U19 World Championships in 2013, while Stanley Johnson was named MVP of the FIBA Americas U18 Championship in 2014.

Andre Iguodala helped the United States capture gold in the 2010 FIBA World Championship and the 2012 London Olympics while former Wildcat Richard Jefferson was part of Team USA's bronze medal finish in the 2004 Athens Olympics.

Senior center Kaleb Tarczewski also earned a bronze medal for Team USA this summer in the Pan America games in Toronto.

WILDCATS CONTINUE TO BUILD ON RANKINGS STREAK

The Wildcats have been ranked in 63-consecutive AP polls and 66-straight coaches polls. Since the start of the 2012-13 season, Arizona has spent 52 weeks ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll. UA took over the No. 1 ranking in the AP poll on Dec. 9, 2013, marking its first top ranking since 2003 and the first time a Pac-12 team had garnered the top spot since 2006.

The Wildcats held the top spot for a program-record eight-straight weeks. Arizona was one of just 11 programs in the nation to appear in all 20 Associated Press polls in 2012-13, and one of just eight programs nationally to do so in 2013-14. UA was the only program in the nation to be ranked in the top 10 in every AP poll in the 2013-14 and the 2014-15 seasons.

@APLAYERSPROGRAM TO THE NBA

Rondae Hollis-Jefferson (23rd overall pick, traded to Brooklyn) and Stanley Johnson (8th overall pick by Detroit) were both selected in the first round of the 2015 NBA Draft. The duo represented numerous NBA milestones for Arizona Basketball.

- 21 Arizona players have been selected in the first round of the NBA Draft
- 12 of Wildcats' last 14 first round selections have been lottery picks.
- The program, in the Sean Miller era, has produced seven NBA Draft picks.

ARIZONA: A FREQUENT HOME FOR MCDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS

Freshman Allonzo Trier joins the Wildcats as a 2015 McDonald's All-American. Trier becomes the 21st McDonald's All-American to join the Arizona Men's Basketball program. In the last four seasons, head coach Sean Miller and his staff have welcomed six McDonald's All-Americans to the program: Brandon Ashley and Grant Jerrett in 2012, Aaron Gordon and Rondae Hollis-Jefferson in 2013, Stanley Johnson in 2014 and Trier in 2015.

ARIZONA PLAYERS ARE A MODEL OF NBA SUCCESS

UA players have been far from content by just hearing their names called on draft night, however. As has been reported by various media outlets, the fraternity of Arizona's NBA players has exceeded the collective \$1 billion mark in career earnings in 2014. Collectively, the Wildcat players who have been drafted since 1988 are an accomplished group, having won 14 NBA championships and made six All-Star appearances.

The group also boasts a Rookie of the Year (Damon Stoudamire), a Sixth Man of the Year (Jason Terry) and a Most Improved Player (Gilbert Arenas), a NBA Finals MVP (Andre Iguodala) and a NBA All-Star Coach (Steve Kerr).

There have been at least eight former Wildcats in the NBA in each of the last 16 seasons.

ARIZONA IN THE LAST FOUR SEASONS

While Sean Miller and Co. arrived in Tucson for the 2009-10 season, the 2010-11 campaign effectively marks the beginning of the Miller Era. Five years ago, the Wildcats claimed their first conference championship under Miller and made a run to the Elite Eight that only ended at the hands of eventual national champion Connecticut.

While UA has led the nation in wins in the last two seasons, the last four seasons of Arizona hoops have been among the best in the nation as well.

Coniel Norman (1972-73), Eric Money (1972-73) and Mike Bibby (1996-97) are the only UA freshman to score 20 or more points in their collegiate debuts. A HISTORY OF GOLD MEDALS WITH TEAM USA AS A PLAYER AND A COACH

Sean Miller led Team USA to a gold medal to the 2015 FIBA U-19 World Championships as head coach with a roster that included Arizona Wildcat Allonzo Trier. This came one summer after he helped guide the U.S. U-18 National Team to a gold medal at the FIBA Americas Championship as an assistant coach.

The pair of gold medals he has earned as a coach are team with a third that he won one as a player at the 1991 World University Games in England.

MILLER AMONG NATION'S ELITE AT ADVANCING IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

Head coach Sean Miller has directed Arizona to its 17th Sweet 16 appearance in 2015, marking the program's third in a row and fourth in five years. He led Xavier to Sweet 16 appearances in 2008 and 2009, giving him six for his career.

Since 2008, Miller is one of four coaches nationally to lead a team to six or more Sweet 16 berths. He also has a 13-1 (.929) career record in the NCAA Tournament against lower-seeded teams, the best record in the history of the event.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Ryan Anderson had 18 points and 12 rebounds in his Arizona debut, lifting the 12th-ranked Wildcats to a season-opening 79-61 victory over Pacific on Friday night.

Arizona coach Sean Miller shuffled his lineup around all night in an effort to determine which combinations work well on this rejiggered team. No matter who the Wildcats had out there, they had no trouble against Pacific, building a 17-point lead by halftime.

Anderson, a transfer from Boston College, hit 5 of 8 shots and Gabe York had 13 points. Kadeem Allen added 13 points, five assists and four rebounds in his first game as the Wildcats' point guard.

Arizona extended its home winning streak to 39 straight games, including 25 straight in nonconference, and moved to 8-0 in season openers under Miller.

T.J. Wallace had 19 points and eight rebounds to lead Pacific, which shot 36 percent.

Arizona went to its second straight Elite Eight last season, but lost Stanley Johnson, Rondae Hollis-Jefferson, T.J. McConnell and Brandon Ashley from that team.

The Wildcats still have the sharpshooting York, 7-foot center Kaleb Tarczewski and point guard Parker Jackson-Cartwright to go with a talented group of new players, making them again the favorites in the Pac-12.

York and Allen were the catalysts early against Pacific.

A streaky shooter who had some big games last season, York was aggressive to start his senior season, confidently stroking in 3-pointers and driving hard to the basket. He had 10 points on 4-of-7 shooting by halftime.

Allen, the 2013-14 national JUCO player of the year, had no trouble getting into the lane, leading to easy baskets for himself or teammates. He had nine points and four assists, setting up Mark Tollefson along the baseline for a layup in the closing seconds of the first half to put Arizona up 41-24.

Pacific had trouble with Arizona's length and athleticism on defense, hitting 7 of 27 shots in the first half, including 1 of 10 from 3-point range.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Allonzo Trier scored 22 points and made all 14 of his free throws, helping No. 12 Arizona pull away for a 90-60 win over Bradley on Monday night. The gifted freshman was on target against Bradley, playing confidently while hitting four of five shots and grabbing five rebounds.

The Wildcats (2-0) needed a lift after laboring through the first half against the scrappy Braves. Arizona pulled away in the second to extend its home winning streak to a nation-best 40 games, including 26 straight in non-conference action.

Ryan Anderson added 15 points for the Wildcats, who shot 54 percent.

Bradley (1-1), college basketball's youngest team, held its own at one of the most difficult road venues in the country before fading in the second half.

Ronnie Suggs had 17 points to lead the Braves, who shot 2 for 14 from 3-point range.

Arizona rolled over Pacific 79-61 in its opener Friday night, though it could have been much more.

Wanting to get his young players early-season experience, coach Sean Miller put them all in the game at the same time late. When the Tigers made a run, Miller put the starters back in with about 90 seconds left, vowing never to use the same lineup again.

The Wildcats didn't have nearly the same flow against Bradley, no matter who was out there.

Arizona struggled from the perimeter — 1 for 9 from 3-point range — and never seemed to get into much of a rhythm in a foul-filled first half that featured 38 combined free throws, allowing the young Braves to hang around.

Bradley, which has 10 freshmen, had some success against Arizona's defense, particularly Suggs, who had 13 points in the first half to keep the Braves within six.

Trier was one of the lone bright spots for the Wildcats offensively. The freshman had 11 points by halftime, including a three-point play after a lose-the-defender crossover.

Arizona began to wear down the Braves with its size and athleticism in the second half, going up 55-42 after Trier lost another defender on a crossover and hung in the air for a three-point play. Gabe York later hit consecutive 3-pointers, pushing the Wildcats' lead to 20.

Bradley missed all 11 of its 3-point attempts in the second half.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Gabe York scored 18 points and Dusan Ristic nearly posted a double-double with nine points and 10 rebounds as No. 12 Arizona beat Northwestern State 61-42 on Sunday night.

Allonzo Trier added 10 points for the Wildcats, who overcame a subpar shooting effort to extend the nation's longest active home winning streak to 42 games. They also moved to 4-0 for the sixth straight season.

York hit two 3-pointers, a nifty layup in traffic and two free throws in a 12-4 run that put Arizona ahead 54-36 with 5 minutes left.

Zeek Woodley had 14 points and 10 rebounds for the Demons (0-4), who had struggled offensively since losing senior point guard Jalan West to a season-ending knee injury.

York then had a driving layup and a 3 on consecutive possessions and Arizona slowly pulled away.

Picked to finish second in the Southland Conference, the Demons have been reeling since losing West in the final minute of their opener at Mississippi.

The Demons' high-paced offense looked lost at times without their 20-points-per-game scorer in the teams' first meeting.

But their defense kept them in it. Arizona shot 37 percent from the field.

FULLERTON, Calif. (AP) — Gabe York scored seven of his 11 points in overtime, and No. 11 Arizona escaped with a 75-73 victory over winless Santa Clara on Thursday night in the opening round of the DirecTV Wooden Legacy.

Ryan Anderson led the Wildcats (5-0) with 17 points and 11 rebounds. Mark Tollefsen added 13 points before fouling out in overtime, and Kaleb Tarczewski had 12 points and eight rebounds.

Jared Brownridge scored a career-high 44 points for the Broncos (0-6), hitting seven 3-pointers and making all 15 of his free throws.

Brownridge's seventh 3 tied the game for the last time at 73-44 with 32 seconds left after the Broncos committed two straight turnovers.

York got fouled and missed the first, but made the second to put the Wildcats ahead 74-73. The Broncos inbounced on the baseline, but K.J. Feagin stepped out of bounds running up the sideline with a second left.

Jarvis Pugh missed two free throws that could have won the game in regulation for Santa Clara. York's potential winning 3-pointer missed at the buzzer for Arizona, sending it to overtime tied 65-all.

The score was even at 54 before Arizona made five free throws and Tollefsen hit two baskets in a 9-3 spurt that gave the Wildcats a 63-57 lead. Santa Clara came right back and tied it 63-all on six straight points, capped by Brownridge's 3-pointer.

Anderson scored and got fouled, but missed the free throw. Brownridge got fouled and made both for another tie at 65. Anderson missed a jumper with 6 seconds to go.

Brownridge sparked the Broncos, scoring eight points in a 13-4 spurt that tied the game at 54. Their defense was big, too. Feagin stole the ball from Allonzo Trier and scored on a fast-break layup, and Matt Hubbard blocked a shot by Anderson.

ANAHEIM, Calif. (AP) — Allonzo Trier and Kadeem Allen scored 13 points each and No. 11 Arizona beat Boise State 68-59 in the third-place game of the DirecTV Wooden Legacy on Sunday.

Ryan Anderson added 11 points and seven rebounds, and Gabe York and Mark Tollefsen added 10 points each for Arizona. The Wildcats (6-1) were upset by Providence 69-65 in the semifinals after narrowly escaping with a 75-73 overtime win against winless Santa Clara in the three-day event.

James Webb III led the Broncos (3-4) with 17 points and Nick Duncan added 10 before he fouled out late in the second meeting between the teams in 10 days. The Wildcats also beat the Broncos 88-76 in Tucson.

Both teams were plagued by foul trouble. Anderson and Tollefsen each fouled out for Arizona and Elliott Pitts had four fouls. Boise State lost Duncan, and Webb, Jackson and Anthony Drmic each had four fouls.

Jackson and Duncan each hit 3-pointers for Boise State during Arizona's 22-12 run that gave the Wildcats their largest lead, 57-38. Seven different Arizona players scored in the run.

The Wildcats trailed by one before they closed the half on a 16-6 run to lead 35-26 at the break, their largest margin in the opening 20 minutes. Seven different Arizona players scored, with Trier leading the way with seven. The Broncos never led by more than three.
