

Arizona vs. Northern Arizona Notes

- Arizona's 101-67 win over NAU pushed Arizona's non-conference home winning streak to 41 consecutive games, which matches a program record. UA won 41 consecutive home games from 1972 to 1978.
- The win by the Wildcats on Friday night pushed the program's record to 9-0 in season openers under head coach Sean Miller.
- By defeating the Lumberjacks in the 2017-18 season opener, UA has now downed NAU in 32 consecutive games.
- McKale Center was sold out on opening night at a capacity crowd of 14,644.

On Allonzo Trier

- Trier scored 22 points in the first half against NAU, which was a new career high for points in a half. He scored 16 in a half as a freshman and as a sophomore.
- The junior finished the game with a new career high of 32 points on an efficient 10 of 13 shooting (.769) from the field and 10 of 11 (.909) shooting at the free throw line. Trier's previous career best was 28 points versus UCLA in the home finale last season.

On Deandre Ayton

- Deandre Ayton tallied 19 points and 12 rebounds in the win over NAU. He became the fourth Wildcat to record a double-double by a freshman in his NCAA debut. The 19 points were the seventh-most by a UA freshman in his first NCAA game and the 12 rebounds the third-most.
- Ayton's three blocks were one fewer than the Arizona freshman debut record of four by Aaron Gordon versus Cal Poly on Nov. 8, 2013.

On Dusan Ristic

- Matched his career high with 20 points against NAU with his previous 20-point game coming against UNLV on Dec. 19, 2015.
- Ristic's 20 points went along with his 10 rebounds for his first 20-point, 10-rebound game of his career. The 10 rebounds gave him his third double-double of his career.
