Postgame Notes

- As a team, Arizona ran for 534 yards against Oregon State, establishing a new record for rushing yards in a game. The previous record was 511 yards set last season against Arizona State.
- The Wildcats have now gone over 500 yards twice this season, after having just one such game in program history entering the season. Arizona rushed for 506 yards in the season opener versus Northern Arizona.
- Sophomore quarterback Khalil Tate rushed for 206 yards against the Beavers. The 206 yards are tied with Ka'Deem Carey for the 15th best single-season rushing total in school history. Tate owns three of the top 15 marks now. In just six career starts, Tate has three 200-yard rushing games, which is tied with Trung Canidate for second-most in school history. Ka'Deem Carey owns the record with four 200-yard games.
- Tate now has 1,293 rushing yards on the season, which is the seventh-highest single-season total in school history. Tate entered Saturday's game 14th on the list, but surpassed seven different players with his performance Saturday. Tate needs 21 yards to pass Art Luppino (1955) for sixth all-time. The school record for rushing yards in a season is 1,929 set by Ka'Deem Carey in 2012.
- Tate scored two rushing touchdowns Saturday, and is now tied with Trung Canidate for eighth in single-school history with 11 rushing touchdowns. Canidate scored 11 rushing touchdowns in 1999. B.J. Denker and Nic Grigsby are tied for sixth with 13 rushing scores.
- Running backs J.J. Taylor (129 yards) and Nick Wilson (101 yards) both went over the 100-yard rushing mark with Tate to give Arizona three 100-yard rushers for the second time under coach Rich Rodriguez.
- The other occurrence came in the season finale last year versus Arizona State, where Brandon Dawkins, Samajie Grant and Zach Green all went over the 100-yard mark. It's just the third time since 1993 that Arizona has had three 100-yard rushers in the same game.
- Taylor now has 699 rushing yards on the season, which is the third-best mark by a freshman in school history. With six more yards, he'll pass Nic Grigsby for second. Nick Wilson is the freshman record holder with 1,375 yards.
- Redshirt junior wide receiver Tony Ellison scored on a 27-yard rush Saturday. It was just the second rush of his career and first rushing touchdown. Arizona now has 10 different players who have at least one rushing touchdown this season.
- The 10 players with at least one rushing touchdown is the most by an Arizona team since at least 1997. The previous high was eight set in 1999.
- Arizona has 41 rushing touchdowns this season, which is the most by the Wildcats in the Pac-10/Pac-12 era. The previous school record was 36 set in 2014.
- Junior defensive lineman Dereck Boles set a new career high in tackles with seven. Boles also had the first solo tackle-for-loss of his career in Saturday's win. All seven of Boles' tackles were solo stops.
- Freshman linebacker Colin Schooler collected the first two-sack game of his career Saturday. Schooler had two sacks and three tackles-for-loss, which is also a career high. Schooler also registered his first pass breakup of the season.
- Arizona finished with 10 tackles-for-loss as a team, which is the most since also registering 10 against Northern Arizona in 2015. It's the most in a conference game since collecting 15 tackles-for-loss against Arizona State in 2014.
- Redshirt freshman Lorenzo Burns collected his fourth interception of the season, which leads the team. The four interceptions are the most by an Arizona player in a season since Tra'Mayne Bondurant also had four in 2013.
- Freshman Kylan Wilborn now has nine tackles-for-loss on the season, which is the most by an Arizona player since Scooby Wright had 29 in 2014.
- Arizona entered the game having scored at least 35 points in five straight games, which was the longest streak by any Power 5 team this season. The Wildcats extended their streak to six games Saturday. The Wildcats had never scored 35 or more in five straight prior to this current run.
