

Arizona-UMBC Notes

- Arizona conceded 23 points on 7/10 shooting from the floor to UMBC's Jairus Lyles in the first half before slowing him down to eight points on 3/11 (.272) shooting in the second half.
- UA used explosive offensive runs in each half to build a lead on the Retrievers. The Cats went on a 24-3 run in a span of six minutes in the first half before stringing together a 19-3 run in six minutes in the second half.
- The Wildcats finished with 103 points on Sunday evening following their 101 points in the season-opening win over NAU. It marks the first time since the 2002-03 season that Arizona has opened a season with back-to-back 100-point games.
- Arizona finished with 25 assists as a team with 20 coming from the trio of Parker Jackson-Cartwright (9), Alex Barcello (6) and Emmanuel Akot (5).

On Allonzo Trier

- Trier scored 30 points versus UMBC, giving him back-to-back 30-point games to start the season. Sunday's performance against UMBC, coupled with his 32 points versus NAU in the opener, are the two highest-scoring games of his career.
- The junior became the seventh Wildcat in program history to score 30 or more points in consecutive games and the first since Jerryd Bayless in the 2007-08 season.
- He scored his 31.0 points per game in the opening weekend on efficient shooting performances from all three zones; 76.5 percent from inside the arc, 50.0 percent from deep and 83.3 percent at the foul line on 18 attempts.
- Trier is the second UA player ever to score 30 or more points in the first two games of the season. Michael Dickerson also scored 31 points in back-to-back games to open the 1996-97 season.

On Deandre Ayton

- Followed up his season-opening double-double with another one as he tallied 19 points and 13 rebounds versus UMBC. He became only the second UA freshman to record a double-double in his first two career games, joining Aaron Gordon in 2013-14.

On Parker Jackson-Cartwright

- After a flawless night of eight assists and zero turnovers in the season opener, Jackson-Cartwright finished the second game of the season with nine assists and three turnovers. The total of 17 assists versus UMBC and NAU is the second highest two-game total of his career. PJC tallied 18 assists in wins over the Washington schools during his sophomore season of 2015-16.
