Hard Edge Notes & Numbers

- » Arizona finishes out its regular season schedule with two consecutive road games for the first time since 2009.
- » The Wildcats carry a 3-1 record in road games, with the lone loss being at USC on Nov. 4 (game was tied 35-35 in 4th quarter).
- » Arizona has won five of its last six games, all coming against Pac-12 teams.
- » UA has scored 35+ points in six straight conference games, the longest active streak for any team against Power 5 teams.
- » Quarterback Khalil Tate is a semifinalist for the Maxwell and Davey O'Brien Awards.

» Tate, who has rushed for 1,207 yards the last six games, ranks No. 2 in the country with an average of 161.6 yards per game.

» Tate leads all FBS players with an average of 11.65 yards per rush and a clip of 10.61 yards on total offensive plays.

» Arizona has won five of its last six games, all coming against Pac-12 teams.

» UA's defense ranks 16th nationally with 21 takeaways this season, including 16 interceptions, which is third-most in FBS.

» Arizona's defense has forced two or more turnovers in seven of 10 contests in 2017.

» The Wildcats have five players with at least one 100-yard rushing game in 2017.

» The Cats have started five true freshmen on defense, second-most for any FBS team.

» Arizona is challenging its program records for scoring average and single-game rushing average.

The Bear Down Tradition

Arizona's most memorable athletic tradition is the slogan "Bear Down," given to Wildcat teams by John "Button" Salmon, student body president and varsity athlete, shortly before he died in 1926 following an auto accident. Button Salmon's last message to his teammates, spoken to J.F. "Pop" McKale, coach and athletic director, was, "Tell them... tell the team to bear down." The rally cry predates "Win One for the Gipper" by two years.

Some Game Themes: A key late-season conference battle looms Saturday when Arizona ventures north to face an Oregon program it last met in the 2014 Pac-12 Championship game. Neither of these teams are in contention for the conference title this time around, but plenty remains at stake. For the Wildcats, their 5-1 run sparked by the emergence of star quarterback Khalil Tate leaves numerous bowl options on the table with two weeks of play remaining. Meanwhile, the Ducks and first-year coach Willie Taggart still need one more victory to lock up bowl eligibility ... Playing in favor of Oregon is the home field: Autzen Stadium. The Ducks are 4-1 and average 43 points per game at the notoriously hostile venue. Arizona will bring with it the Pac-12's highest scoring offense, one that has notched at least 35 points in six consecutive games for the first time in school history ... The Wildcats have played well on the road this season, but suffered their first setback two weeks ago at USC. Should they bounce back with a win in the Emerald State, it would be the program's second straight victory in Autzen Stadium. One of Arizona's best all-time road wins was an upset of Marcus Mariota and No. 2 Oregon in October 2014, some two months before the Ducks found payback in the league title game ... A couple keys players from those 2014 meetings remain: senior running backs Nick Wilson and Royce Freeman. Wilson topped 100 yards for the second time in five games last Saturday against the Beavers, while Freeman leads the Ducks with a 1,200-yard season to date ... A couple new faces to this series: the Schoolers. Arizona's Colin Schooler is the second-leading tackler as a true freshman linebacker, while the Ducks' Brenden Schooler is a sophomore receiver with 17 receptions this season ... Oregon is rested coming off a bye week and the home game is welcomed following a difficult stretch that saw the webfoots play three of four (all losses) away from home. They close the year with consecutive home games, so turning around a 1-4 stretch of play is not out of the question ... What is in question: who will play quarterback for Oregon. The Ducks were markedly more consistent early in the year before Justin Herbert suffered a collarbone injury in the that has held him out since the end of September. His ability to push the ball down the field with his arm balanced out an otherwise run-heavy offense. Braxton Burmeister, a true freshman long committed to Arizona before signing with Oregon, has been the starter in recent weeks. Should he play, it presents a very intriguing storyline given his change of heart last winter ... Also in question: the weather. November brings the likelihood of cool and often wet weather in the Pacific Northwest, something the Cats haven't seen this season. So bring a jacket, buckle up and get ready for some faced-paced gridiron action.

Last Week: Arizona shook off its first loss in over a month by bouncing back with a Senior Night victory over Oregon State, 49-28, last Saturday at Arizona Stadium. The first half, in particular, was arguably Arizona's best football of the season in all three phases, and while the defense loosed up in the second half, it was an all-around convincing victory. Khalil Tate topped 200 yards for third time in six games to pace a three-headed monster rushing attack that set a school record with 534 yards on the ground. For Tate, it was his sixth straight contest in triple digits, while he was joined by J.J. Taylor (129 yards) and Nick Wilson (101 yards) for only the third occurrence of three 100-yard rushers in a game in school history. Not included were a pair of rushing touchdowns by punishing back Zach Green, a 27-yard touchdown run on a reverse by receiver Tony Ellison and four-yard score by backup quarterback Brandon Dawkins. When it was all said and done, the Cats had five players combine for seven rushing touchdowns. Tate's 71-yard run in the third quarter was perhaps the biggest highlight, and it was three more yards than he passed for on a night when he needed only seven attempts. Defensively, the Wildcats pitched a first-half shutout, something the program had not done in a conference game since 2010. Colin Schooler led the way with six solo tackles, including 3.0 for loss, 2.0 sacks and a pass breakup. But credit the Beavers, they made some adjustments and pounded away in the second half. Running back Ryan Nall finished just shy of 100 yards for the game, but helped move OSU into scoring position several times. Quarterback Darrell Garretson threw for four second-half touchdowns and totaled 209 yards with one late interception. UA's Lorenzo Burns picked off his team-leading fourth pass of the season late to seal the game and set the score at its final. For Arizona, it was the second straight win in Tucson over the Beavers. Additionally, the Cats picked up their fifth conference win of the year and finish 2017 on a three-game home win streak and a record of 4-2 at Arizona Stadium.

Series History: These teams have not met since the 2014 Pac-12 Football Championship game, which was won by the Ducks, 51-13, in Santa Clara, Calif., on Dec. 5, 2014. That was a redemptive effort for a top-five Oregon team, which was stunned by Arizona earlier in the year at Autzen Stadium (31-24) ... The Ducks own a 25-16 all-time advantage in the series, including a steady 13-5 mark when playing at home. However, the Wildcats have won the last two regular season meetings between these schools. In addition to the upset of No. 2 Oregon on Oct. 2, 2014, Arizona upended the fifth-ranked Ducks, 42-16, on Nov. 23, 2013, at Arizona Stadium ... Those two wins snapped a four-game win streak in the series for Oregon, which had won 16 of the previous 19 meetings from 1994-2012 ... The winning team has scored at least 31 points in each of the last 10 games. That 10-game stretch began with a 37-10 Wildcat victory on Nov. 18, 2006, which represents Arizona's most recent November win in Eugene. UA is 0-2 in its two November tries since, losing at Autzen in 2008 and 2010.

Redemption Tour: Picked to finish dead last in the Pac-12 South according to the preseason media poll, Arizona entered the season with a chip on its shoulder. After opening conference play with a six-point loss to Utah – a game in which the Cats turned the ball over five times – things were running a little hot in the Wildcats' locker room. The fuel to the fire that led to an offensive explosion in October was the emergence of Khalil Tate, and since Arizona is a 5-1 with Tate a national storyline seemingly each week. But the Cats' sudden rise doesn't happen without clear understanding of where they came from. Along the way, last year's frustrations have certainly motivated the Wildcats in their turnaround. Last season, UCLA, Washington State, Colorado and Oregon State combined to outscore Arizona by 133 points (205-72). This year, against those four same schools, the Wildcats own a 62-point advantage (199-137). Effectively, that's a 195-point turnaround. Looking at Arizona's Nov. 4 loss at No. 17 USC, there was similar progress. In 2016, the Cats lost at home, 48-14, to the Trojans. This year, they had the game tied 35-35 midway through the fourth quarter in the Coliseum before ultimately falling, 49-35.

Khalil's Opening sTATEment: A semifinalist for the prestigious Maxwell and Davey O'Brien Awards, sophomore quarterback Khalil Tate has made a national name for himself in a matter of six relatively short weeks. Some consider the dual-threat talent a contender to be a Heisman finalist, and his resumé is quite impressive even if he didn't start making headlines until the first week in October. For those that don't know, Tate, coming in as a backup, was hurt in the opening game of the season against NAU. He played briefly against Houston a week later, but was not near 100-percent healthy as he battled through a sprained throwing shoulder that eventually kept him out of games against UTEP and Utah. After a bye week closed out September, Tate was healthy enough to fully practice and was available to play at Colorado on Oct. 7. Arizona entered that contest with a 2-2 overall record and an 0-1 mark in conference play. The season, even at that early juncture, was firmly in the balance. On the opening possession of that game, starter Brandon Dawkins was hit late out of bounds and briefly shaken up. Tate was sent in and has never looked back. He set an FBS single-game rushing record for quarterbacks with 327 yards that evening in Boulder and went on to win four-straight Pac-12 Player of the Week honors. He's continued his outstanding play into November and is a legitimate contender for postseason honors in the Pac-12 and on the national stage should his performances continue these final two weeks. He leads all FBS players in rushing yards since Oct. 1 (1,207) and the Wildcats have gone 5-1 since he's assumed starting/primary quarterbacking duties these last two months.

Record-Chasing: As the regular season enters the closing stretch, Arizona's offense is in position to challenge two rather prominent records: scoring average and single-game rushing average. Through 10 games, Arizona is averaging 44.4 points per game (nearly 20 points better than the 24.8 average in 2016). The program record has long been held by Art Luppino & Co., who averaged 38.5 points in the 1954 season. Rich Rodriguez's first Arizona squad challenged that mark, posting a 38.2 clip in 2012. As far as the rushing average record, that 1954 squad that featured the Cactus Comet (Luppino) rolled up 276.5 yards per game on the ground. Currently, the Wildcats are averaging an astounding 347.7 yards per game. That means if the UA were to not rush for a single yard these final two weeks of the regular season, it would still be averaging 289.8 yards per game – some 12 yards ahead of the current record average. Sure, there's plenty of football to play, but we'll be keeping an eye on these marks – and others – the rest of the way.

What the Win Meant: Sometimes a 49-28 victory over a team that had a seven-game losing streak can be a ho-hum afterthought. But that shouldn't be the case. The Wildcats' victory over Oregon State atoned for a 42-17 drubbing from Oregon State a year earlier that was the last of an eight-game losing streak. This time around, the Wildcats improved to 7-3 overall and 5-2 in Pac-12 play. It's their most regular season wins since a 10-win campaign in 2014 and they are ensured of a winning conference record for only the fourth time in 19 seasons. The previous three occurrences were in 2014 (7-2), 2009 (6-3) and 2008 (5-4).

Bowl Bound: The Wildcats achieved bowl eligibility by the end of October and now, with seven wins, have two more regular season games to bolster their postseason prospects. It marks the fifth time in Rich Rodriguez's six seasons that the Wildcats have been bowl-eligible. Last season, an injury-riddled and depleted roster struggled to a 3-9 clip as Arizona missed out on a bowl berth for only the second time in nine seasons. Arizona's recent bowl trips include the 2008 Las Vegas Bowl (win vs. BYU), 2009 Holiday Bowl (loss vs. Nebraska), 2010 Alamo Bowl (loss vs. Oklahoma State), 2012 New Mexico Bowl (win vs. Nevada), 2013 AdvoCare V100 Bowl (win vs. Boston College), 2014 Fiesta Bowl (loss vs. Boise State) and the 2015 New Mexico Bowl (win vs. New Mexico).

Road Warriors: Despite their setback last Saturday at the Coliseum, the Wildcats are 3-1 away from home in 2017. They will have a chance to build on that success as the final two regular season games will be played on the road at Oregon and at Arizona State (Nov. 25). Arizona has not finished a regular season with consecutive road games since 2009, when a Holiday Bowl-bound squad defeated Arizona State and USC in consecutive weeks. Prior to that, UA's last back-to-back road swing to finish a season came in 1999 and previously 1993. So it's certainly not a common occurrence to do what this year's Arizona football team is about to do.

Smith Nominated for Broyles Award: Co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Rod Smith has been nominated for the 2017 Broyles Award, which honors the nation's top assistant coaches. Smith has tutored quarterbacks Khalil Tate and Brandon Dawkins into fine seasons. The two have combined for 3,369 yards of total offense (would rank fifth individually in FBS) and 31 touchdowns through the first 10 games of the season. They've teamed for 1,681 rushing yards and 18 touchdowns, while competing 62.4 percent of passes for 1,688 yards and 13 scores. Tate, a starter in the last five games, is a semifinalist for the Maxwell and Davey O'Brien Awards. The 56 nominees in this year's class were selected from approximately 1500 assistant coaches representing 129 Division One programs across the country. For the first time in the award's 22 year history, a committee representing the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) was also included in the Broyles Award selection process.

Havrisik Can Kick: True freshman kicker Lucas Havrisik, who has been Arizona's primary kickoff specialist this season, has seen his role expand the last two weeks. The lanky righty has been designated as the long-kick option much of the season and he's finally been called on to show his talents. On Oct. 28 against Washington State, Havrisik ended the first-half by drilling a 57-yard field goal, tying the two decade-old school record first set by Jon Prasuhn in 1995. The kick also stands as the longest made field goal in the FBS this season. A week later at USC, the rookie successfully booted 45 and 43-yard field goals. He's now 3-for-4 on field goals this season with all the attempts 43 yards or longer. His distance is a nice compliment to junior Josh Pollack, who is 10-for-14 on all field goal tries, including 8-for-10 inside 40 yards. Additionally, Havrisik has 51 touchbacks on 76 kickoffs (67.1 percent is No. 17 nationally), which is tied for fourth-most among FBS kickers.

Returns Turnaround: Sometimes overlooked in the age of prolific offensive numbers is how a team can gain an advantage in hidden yardage, notably through returns. After 10 games, Arizona has a 239-yard advantage when factoring in all returns (punts, kickoffs, fumbles and interceptions). The Wildcats, who have a 935-696 edge in return yards, have already surpassed their yardage total gained in 2016. Yes, a year ago UA was outgained by nearly as many yards (513) as they gained (582) on returns over 12 games. The 1,095-582 yardage disparity was yet another indicator of how lopsided the 3-9 season went. Plenty goes into the turnaround. Shun Brown has two punt return touchdowns, Tyrell Johnson averages over 27 yards has been close to breaking several kickoff returns, the Wildcats have returned two interceptions for scores and Lucas Havrisik has boomed 51 touchbacks (last year UA had only 20 touchbacks).

(Field) Positioned For Success: One very interesting correlation to Arizona's success – or its demise – in recent years has been where the opponents, on average, have started their offensive drives. The 2017 season has been, to this point, a perfect indicator of this. When the opponent has been limited to an average starting field position inside its own 30-yardline, the Wildcats are 7-0 this season. If the opponent has started at the 30 or better, the Wildcats are 0-3. Going back through the 2016 season, UA is 10-3 in games when opponent starts inside the 30-yardline and 0-9 when the opponent starts at the 30 or better. The last time the Wildcats won when their opponent had a starting field position at the 30 or better? How about the 2015 New Mexico Bowl when the Lobos' average drive start came at their own 32-yardline. Otherwise, dating to the start of the 2015 season, Arizona is 1-13 when that opponent starting field position is the 30-yardline or better.

That's More Like it: Prior to last season, Arizona had scored at least 435 points in every season under coach Rich Rodriguez. However, Arizona mustered just 297 points last year, and now find them with the second most points in the country this season behind Oklahoma State. Arizona's 19.6 point improvement from last year is the second-best improvement, behind Central Florida's 19.8.

Takeaway Trends: Arizona's defense ranks third nationally with 16 interceptions this season, while it checks in tied for 16th with 21 turnovers gained. The Cats are riding a streak of five straight games with at least one takeaway and they have forced multiple turnovers in seven of 10 games this season. A year ago, the Cats mustered only 14 takeaways in 12 games. When Arizona gains at least two turnovers in a game, it is 30-7 (.812) under Rich Rodriguez. That mark that improves to 16-1 (.941) if there are three or more takeaways in a game.

Points, Points and More Points: Through 10 games this season, Arizona has scored 444 points. That's the highest total for the Wildcats through 10 games in program history. The 444 points are more than the Wildcats scored in a full season in 13 of the past 17 seasons. Since 1950, Arizona has scored more than 400 points in a season just six times. The Wildcats failed to eclipse the 300-point mark in 12 games last season, scoring 297 points in 12 games. The most points the Wildcats have scored in a season in school history is 496 in 2012.

A New Streak Evolves: The Wildcats scored 45 or more points in four straight games for the first time in program history in October. The streak ended against USC, but Arizona still scored 35 points, establishing a new streak. The Wildcats then scored 49 against Oregon State, and Arizona has now scored 35 or more points in six straight games for the first time in program history as well. The five-game streak of 35 points or more was the longest streak by any team against Power 5 opponents this year. The Wildcats are also one of just five teams in the country to have 58 or more touchdowns on the season. The Wildcats are also third in the country in scoring at 44.4 points per game.

In a Rush: Through 10 games, Arizona is third nationally in rushing offense, averaging 347.7 yards per game. The Wildcats are behind traditional option teams Navy and Army. Perhaps more impressively, Arizona is averaging 7.34 yards per carry, which is the highest total in the country. Arizona is the only team in the country averaging more than seven yards per rush. The FBS record for rushing yards per carry for a season is 7.6 set by Army in 1945.

You Get a Touchdown, and You Get a Touchdown: Arizona has had 10 different players score at least one rushing touchdown this season, which is a new program record. The previous high was nine in 1990. Wide receiver Tony Ellison became the 10th Arizona player to score on a rushing touchdown when he scored on a 27-yard reverse in the second quarter Saturday against Oregon State. Khalil Tate leads the way with 11 rushing touchdowns this season. The others who have scored: Zach Green (nine TDs), Brandon Dawkins (seven), J.J. Taylor and Nick Wilson (four), Nathan Tilford (two), Tyrell Johnson (one), Brandon Leon (one) and Rhett Rodriguez (one). The Wildcats are the only team in the country who have 10 players with at least one rushing score.

Age Is Just a Number: Arizona's leading tackler this season is Tony Fields II, a starter in all 10 games at the Will linebacker position. Fields II, who enrolled in January and participated in spring drills, is a true freshman who has racked up 73 tackles, including five for loss and three sacks. He headlines a group of young top tacklers that have gained significant experience in a short time this season. Of Arizona's top six tacklers, four are freshmen, including redshirt Lorenzo Burns (61 tackles) and true freshmen Colin Schooler (63) and Scottie Young Jr. (37). All totaled, freshmen (including redshirts) account for nearly half (331 of 687) of all tackles this season. Furthermore, of Arizona's top 11 tacklers, seven are in their first year in the program. That extended list includes another true freshman in Kylan Wilborn (29 tackles) who happens to be the team's sack leader (6.5) and transfer Dereck Boles (35 tackles), who is UA's top tackler on the interior of the defensive front.

Getting off the Field: Arizona posted three three-and-outs Saturday versus Oregon State. The Wildcats now have 37 three-and-outs on the season through 10 games after having just 30 last season in 12 games. The Wildcats have 16 three-and-outs over the past five weeks, after having just one against Colorado to open October. Against Washington State, Arizona forced a three-and-out on four of the Cougars' seven drives to set the tone in the first half. The Wildcats then forced four turnovers in the second half. Arizona forced Oregon State to punt on its first five drives Saturday. But just one of those was a three-and-out.



A New Standard: Arizona has 3,477 rushing yards, which is a new program record for rushing yards in a season. The previous mark was 3,444 set in 2013 when Ka'Deem Carey led the nation in rushing with 1,929 yards. The 2013 season is the only other time the Wildcats have rushed for more than 3,000 yards. Arizona's 41 rushing touchdowns are also a new school record, besting the previous high of 36, also set in 2013.

Taylor Breaks Out: Redshirt freshman running back J.J. Taylor has two 100-yard rushing games in his last three contests, after rushing for 129 yards on 10 carries Saturday against Oregon State. In his last three games, Taylor has rushed for 333 yards on 36 carries. He's averaging 9.25 yards per carry over his last three. For the season, Taylor has 699 rushing yards and four touchdowns on 114 carries. His 114 totes lead the Wildcats. In Taylor's first seven games of the season, he had 366 rushing yards on 78 carries. Taylor, who rushed for 261 yards and two touchdowns last season, before suffering a broken ankle, is third all-time at Arizona for freshman rushing yards this season with his 699 rushing yards. He's behind Nick Wilson and Nic Grigsby.

Green Means Go: Redshirt senior Zach Green had 14 carries for 124 yards his first two seasons at Arizona, which totaled 19 games. In his past 20 games for the Wildcats, Green has more rush attempts -136- than he had yards in his first 19 games. Green has rushed for 678 yards on 136 carries since the start of his junior season. Green set career highs in the final game of last season when he rushed for 126 yards on 14 carries against Arizona State. He topped that this season against Cal. Green ran for 130 yards and two touchdowns on 20 carries to establish new career highs in yards gained and carries. Green has 296 yards on 59 carries, which is an average yard per gain of 5.0. Green had a one-yard touchdown run Saturday against Washington State for his sixth rushing touchdown of the season and then a three-yard touchdown at USC in the fourth quarter. The senior running back had two touchdowns Saturday against Oregon State on four carries. Green's seven touchdown rushes this season are the most by an Arizona running back and second overall to Khalil Tate.

Touchdown Tony: In his fourth year in the program, redshirt junior wide receiver Tony Ellison has emerged as a serious threat for the Arizona offense. Through 10 games, Ellison is tied for the team lead in receiving yards with 431. He has 25 catches, which is second on the team, and two touchdown catches, which is tied for the second-most on the Cats. Ellison, who had just three catches for 32 yards in his first two seasons with the Wildcats, has been a dangerous threat for Arizona, especially in the fourth quarter, with eight catches for 190 yards and a touchdown. Additionally, Ellison has been a big play threat, especially for Khalil Tate. Arizona has nine pass plays of 40 or more yards and Ellison has four of those. Ellison is averaging 17.2 yards per catch on the season, which leads the Wildcats. He's averaging 47.9 yards per game, which is tied for the team lead with Shun Brown. On Saturday against Oregon State, Ellison had the first rushing touchdown of his career, scoring on a 27-yard reverse for his third career touchdown.

Score from Anywhere: Through 10 games, Arizona has scored 12 touchdowns from 50 or more yards out. Last season, the Wildcats had just five such touchdowns in 12 games. The Wildcats have four touchdowns from 70-79 yards out, four from 60-69 yards out and three from 50-59 yards out. Of the 11 touchdowns, quarterback Khalil Tate has accounted for five of those, posting four rushing touchdowns from 58, 71, 75 and 76 yards out. He also hooked up with Shun Brown for a 56-yard touchdown pass against Cal. Of Arizona's 51 touchdowns this season, 27 have come from 20 or more yards out. Last year, Arizona had 13 touchdowns total from 20 or more yards out. The Wildcats have gained 1,471 yards this season on touchdowns alone and the team is averaging 28.8 yards per touchdown.

Big Play Shun: Khalil Tate isn't the only reason Arizona has had success scoring from anywhere on the field. Junior receiver Shun Brown has proven to be a big-play threat in his three seasons at Arizona. Against USC, Brown established a new career high in receptions with eight. He had eight catches for 78 yards and a touchdown. Brown now has eight receiving touchdowns in his career and has one score in three of his last four games. Of Brown's eight receiving touchdowns, six have come from 30 or more yards out, including Saturday's 30-yard touchdown catch from Tate. Including returns, Brown has 11 plays this season of 20 or more yards, including seven pass receptions. The Shreveport, Louisiana native is also averaging 16.2 yards per punt return with two return touchdowns on the season. He had a 63-yard punt return for a touchdown against UTEP and a 66-yard return touchdown against NAU. Brown owns the team lead with 32 receptions and leads the team with his five touchdown grabs. No other Arizona receiver has more than two. Four of five Brown's receiving touchdowns have come on the road. His 431 receiving yards are tied for the team lead with Tony Ellison.

Jumpin' Jace: Junior cornerback Jace Whittaker started his 17th straight game Saturday night versus Oregon State. Whittaker has three interceptions over his past five games. Whittaker had two interceptions against UCLA, and returned one for a touchdown. After notching a pass breakup against Cal, Whittaker picked off his third pass of the season against Washington State, and broke up another pass. The junior from Oceanside, Calif., leads Arizona with nine pass breakups this season. For his career, Whittaker has 24 career pass breakups, which is tied with Martin Rudolph for 15th all-time with 24 pass breakups. He's also third in the Pac-12 in passes defended with nine pass breakups and three interceptions for a total of 12 passes defended.

Fields' Field: True freshman linebacker Tony Fields II continues to be one of the most productive freshmen defenders in the country. Fields had four tackles, one tackle-for-loss and his first pass breakup of the season Saturday versus Oregon State. Fields leads the Wildcats with 73 total tackles this season. The next closest are Colin Schooler and Demetrius Flannigan-Fowles, who each have 63 tackles this season. Fields is 10th in the Pac-12 in tackles per game, at 7.3. He's the leading freshman tackler in the conference with his 73 total tackles. The next closest is Schooler with his 63 tackles.

A Dane-dy Weapon: Prior to the season, senior Dane Cruikshank moved positions, switching from the boundary cornerback spot to the "Spur" safety spot for the Wildcats. The position change agrees with Cruikshank, who started all 12 games for the Wildcats a year ago. Cruikshank picked off his second pass of the season against USC and now has four for his career. Cruikshank also tied his new career high for tackles with 10 against the Trojans. Against Oregon State on Saturday, Cruikshank had four tackles and a 1/2 sack, which is the first sack of any kind for the senior defensive back. The senior from Southern California also had eight tackles and a pass breakup against Washington State. Cruikshank has 57 tackles in 10 games for the Wildcats this season.

Can't Burn Him: Redshirt freshman Lorenzo Burns is enjoying the best stretch of his young career. In Arizona's last six games, Burns has five pass breakups and three interceptions. Burns now has four interceptions on the season, which is the most by an Arizona player since Tra'Mayne Bondurant also had four in 2013. No Arizona player has had five interceptions in a season since Trevin Wade in 2009. Burns is tied for second in the Pac-12 with his four interceptions, and is just one behind the leader. On the season, Burns is Arizona's fourth-leading tackler with 61 tackles. He has six pass breakups and 1 1/2 tackles-for-loss to go with his four picks.

All of the Starts: Experience certainly isn't an issue for the big boys up front for the Wildcats this season. The Arizona offensive line features six players who have started at least seven games each. All total, the Wildcats have 140 career starts and 177 games played among their top six linemen. Redshirt senior right guard Jacob Alsadek leads the way with 45 career games played and 43 starts. Senior left tackle Layth Friekh has 36 career games and 31 starts to his credit. Another senior, Gerhard De Beer, has played in 32 games over the past three seasons with 19 starts. Additionally, redshirt sophomore Nathan Eldridge started all 12 games at center last year, while fellow redshirt sophomore Cody Creason has 22 games and eight starts on his resume. Finally, redshirt junior Christian Boettcher has played in 22 games with 17 starts. The offensive line has helped pave the way for a rushing offense averaging 347.7 yards per game and has helped the Wildcats lead the Pac-12 in scoring offense at 44.4 points per game. Additionally, the offensive line has allowed just 10 sacks on the season, which is the best mark in the Pac-12 and tied for the fifth-best figure in the country.

School-er Zone: True freshman linebacker Colin Schooler had a career high three tackles-for-loss Saturday against Oregon State and also collected a multi-sack game for the first time in his career, picking up a pair against the Beavers. Schooler had six tackles, three tackles-for-loss, two sacks and one pass breakup. For the season, Schooler 63 tackles, 8 ½ tackles-for-loss, three sacks, two interceptions and a forced fumble on the season. Schooler returned an interception 66 yards for a touchdown earlier this season against Washington State. The 66-yard return was Arizona's longest interception return for a touchdown since Will Parks had a 69-yard return in the 2013 Advocate V100 Bowl versus Boston College. Schooler had seven tackles in Arizona's three nonconference games. In seven Pac-12 games, Schooler has 56 tackles, 7 ½ tackles-for-loss and one interception. He has 63 tackles on the season and is averaging 6.3 tackles per game, which ranks 22nd in the Pac-12.

Wallace's World: Redshirt freshman Jarrius Wallace saw the first extended playing time of his career against California, and then hasn't left the starting lineup since, earning starts against Washington State, USC and Oregon State. The Villa, La., native had nine tackles, two pass break-ups and a critical interception in the end zone to prevent a Golden Bears touchdown. Wallace picked off Cal quarterback Ross Bowers on third-and-four from Arizona's seven-yard line late in the second quarter. Cal had put together a 15-play, 75-yard drive and looked like it was going to cut the lead to 21-14. Instead, Wallace came up with the interception to thwart the drive. He followed that up with another strong performance against Washington State, collecting seven tackles and one pass breakup. Against USC, Wallace collected four tackles and split time with freshman Scottie Young Jr., who returned from injury. Wallace had six stops against Oregon State his last time out.

Wilborn Willpower: True freshman defensive end Kylan Wilborn, who has started all 10 games for the Wildcats this season, continues to have a banner debut season for Arizona. Wilborn leads all Power 5 freshmen in sacks with 6 1/2. Wilborn, from Northridge, California, had the finest performance of his young career two games ago against UCLA. Wilborn had four sacks, one forced fumble and five total tackles against the Bruins. All four of Wilborn's sacks came in the second half. His forced fumble came in the first quarter. Wilborn became the first Arizona player to have four sacks in a game since Joe Salave'a also had four against Arizona State in 1997. Wilborn had another sack and forced fumble against Washington State on Saturday. For the season, Wilborn has 8 1/2 tackles-for-loss, six sacks, four forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, one pass breakup and 29 total tackles. His four forced fumbles are the most by an Arizona player since Scooby Wright had six in 2014.

Bruno Battles: Senior defensive tackle Luca Bruno, a Southern California native, had his second career sack Saturday at USC. His other one came in 2015 versus UCLA. Often the man who draws double teams in the trenches, Bruno's production is less about stats and more about what he does to allow other players on the defense to make plays. But Saturday against USC, Bruno had three tackles, including his sack. On the season, Bruno has 19 tackles –second most for a defensive tackle behind Dereck Boles – to go with a sack and a pass breakup. Bruno has already been a three-time game captain this season and is one of coach Rich Rodriguez's most trusted leaders and players. Bruno is 10 tackles away from tying his career high in stops for a season, which is 29 set in 2015 as a redshirt sophomore.

Bole-ing Them Over: In his first year in the program, junior college transfer defensive lineman Dereck Boles has been a vital part of Arizona's defense. Boles has started all 10 games for Arizona this season at one of the defensive tackle positions, and has 35 tackles, two pass breakups and 1 ½ tackles-for-loss. Boles had a career high seven tackles Saturday against Oregon State, including his first solo tackle-for-loss on the season. Originally from Kingston, Jamaica, Boles began his career at Boise State, before transferring to Coffeyville Community College last season.

Up Next: Arizona closes the regular season slate in the annual battle for the Territorial Cup against rival Arizona State. The game is set for a 2:30 p.m. MST kickoff on the Pac-12 Network. Thereafter, the end-of-year team banquet should coincide with the official announcement date for the Pac-12 bowl berths on Sunday, Dec. 3.

SANTA CLARA, Calif. -- Marcus Mariota made a strong final impression in his bid for the Heisman Trophy, and No. 2 Oregon left no doubt about whether the Pac-12 champion will get a chance to play for the national title.

Mariota threw for 313 yards and two touchdowns and ran for a career-high three scores, and Oregon all but assured itself a spot in the first College Football Playoff by overwhelming seventh-ranked Arizona 51-13 in the Pac-12 title game Friday night.

"There are a bunch of big smiles, and I'm proud of that," Oregon coach Mark Helfrich said.

The Ducks (12-1, No. 3 AP) entered the week second in the CFP rankings and are expected to land in the Rose Bowl Game Presented by Northwestern Mutual semifinal.

On a rainy night in Silicon Valley, Oregon wiped out the Wildcats in front of a sparse but rowdy pro-Ducks crowd -- announced as 45,618 -- that sprinkled the red seats at the \$1.3 billion Levi's Stadium bright yellow and green. Mariota also boosted his credentials for college football's most prestigious award as the Ducks turned the patchy field into their personal playground.

Oregon outgained Arizona 640 to 224 yards. The Ducks ran for 324 yards and held the Wildcats to 111 on the ground.

"This is a huge accomplishment for us," Mariota said. "Now we need to continue to improve and get better for whoever comes next."

The victory avenged Oregon's only loss this season -- a 31-24 setback to Arizona on Oct. 2 in Eugene -- and a 42-16 loss in Tucson last year that kept the Ducks out of the conference championship game. Arizona coach Rich Rodriguez benched quarterback Anu Solomon -- and later backup Jesse Scroggins -- in the second half trying to find a spark. By then it was too late, and Rodriguez's scrunched face on the sideline exemplified his team's frustrations.

It was quite a turnaround from the previous meeting between these teams, when Arizona held the Ducks to a season-low 144 yards rushing. The Wildcats also sacked Mariota five times and forced two fumbles in that game. This time, Mariota completed 25 of 38 passes and ran for 33 yards on 10 carries. He extended his conference record to 53 touchdowns this season -- 38 passing, 14 rushing and one receiving.

As wide as the final margin was, it could have -- and probably should have -- been even wider.

Oregon settled for four field goal tries -- making three -- in the first half. The Ducks also finished with 13 penalties for 97 yards, including a holding penalty that erased Royce Freeman's 37-yard TD run and back-to-back false starts that pushed back the failed field goal attempt in the second quarter. Mariota made up for most of Oregon's errors, though, running for two TDs just before the break to give the Ducks a 23-0 lead. It was the first time Arizona was held scoreless in the first half since a 49-0 loss to Oregon on Sept. 22, 2012.

"We wanted to show people that we could play with Arizona and come out and show them how Oregon football is supposed to be played," said Freeman, who finished with 114 yards rushing on 21 carries. The Wildcats briefly broke through when Scroggins found a wide-open Cayleb Jones for a 69-yard TD pass with 9:34 remaining in the third quarter. Scroggins finished 3-for-11 passing for 79 yards and had an interception. Solomon completed six of 12 passes for 34 yards before third-stringer Jerrard Randall took over late, running for a 25-yard touchdown on the final play of the game.

The 2014 Pac-12 Coach of the Year, **Rich Rodriguez** begins his sixth season at the helm of the Arizona football program. He was introduced as the Wildcats' 30th head coach on Nov. 22, 2011.

Entering the 2017 season, Rodriguez carries a career record of 156-113-2 in 22 seasons, marked by Division I records of 60-26 at West Virginia, 15-22 at Michigan and 36-29 with the Wildcats. He began his head coaching career at Salem (W.Va.) University in 1988 and then coached at Glenville State (W.Va.) from 1990-96.

Rodriguez's third season with the Wildcats was highlighted by a 10-4 record, a Pac-12 South Championship, a Fiesta Bowl berth and winning the Territorial Cup game against ASU. Arizona finished the regular season with 10 wins for only the third time in program history as Rodriguez was named the 2014 Pac-12 Coach of the Year. The streak continued as Rodriguez and the squad defeated a top-10 ranked program for the third-straight campaign with a 31-24 road victory over No. 2 Oregon on Oct. 2.

Offensively, quarterback Anu Solomon became the first freshman ever to start a season opener for the school and went on to throw for 3,793 yards with 28 passing touchdowns and only nine interceptions. He owns the UA freshman records for passing yards, passing touchdowns, pass attempts (540) and pass completions (313). Freshman Nick Wilson collected seven games with 100+ yards and with his 1,375 markers on the season, he set the school freshman rushing record.

Linebacker Scooby Wright III was easily the nation's most prolific defender. Based on a vote of head coaches, media and college athletics personnel, he won the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, the Rotary Lombardi Award and the Chuck Bednarik Award, all given annually to the nation's top defender. Also the Pat Tillman Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year, he ranked in the top five among FBS players for total tackles (163), tackles for loss (29.0), sacks (14.0) and forced fumbles (6). Wright is UA's sixth all-time unanimous All-American.

In 2013, the Wildcats posted an 8-5 record with a bowl victory over the Boston College Eagles in the AdvoCare V100 Bowl in Shreveport, La. Arizona knocked off a top-10 ranked team with a 42-16 win over No. 5 Oregon on Nov. 23.

Running back Ka'Deem Carey earned consensus All-America honors for the second-straight season, was named the 2013 Pac-12 offensive Player of the Year and a Doak Walker Award finalist. He ended his three seasons in Tucson as Arizona's all-time career rushing leader (4,239 yards) and all-time all-purpose yardage leader (5,483). Carey recorded 16-straight games in which he eclipsed the century mark rushing, the longest streak in Pac-12 history and the longest for any FBS player in the last 10 seasons.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Brandon Dawkins accounted for three touchdowns and Arizona ran for 506 yards to open the season with a 62-24 victory over Northern Arizona on Saturday night.

Arizona struggled to slow the FCS Lumberjacks and sputtered on offense in the first quarter before coming alive.

Shun Brown sparked the Wildcats with a 66-yard punt return for a touchdown and Dawkins got their offense going with his arm and his legs. The junior ran for 92 yards and two touchdowns on seven carries, and threw for 89 yards and a score to help the Wildcats win their 17th straight home opener.

Arizona had six different players score rushing touchdowns and fell just short of the school record of 511 yards rushing set in the 2016 season finale against Arizona State.

Case Cookus threw for 306 yards on 21-of-38 passing for Northern Arizona, but also had three turnovers. Cory Young ran for 115 yards and two scores.

The Lumberjacks had a rough trip to Tucson two years ago, losing 77-13 as Arizona set school records for points, total yards (792) and rushing yards (499).

Northern Arizona was much better defensively at the start and had no trouble moving the ball against Arizona's young defense. The Lumberjacks broke off several long plays, including Young's 58-yard touchdown run, and out-gained the Wildcats in the first half.

The problem was turnovers.

Cookus lost a fumble when he was blindsided in the first quarter, setting up Wilson's 46-yard touchdown run.

Cookus later tried to squeeze a pass into coverage near the end zone that was picked off by Demetrius Flannigan-Fowles at the 1-yard line. Flannigan-Fowles had another pick late in the half, setting up a 10-yard scoring run by Dawkins that put Arizona up 34-14 at halftime.

Dawkins raced off for a 66-yard touchdown to open the second half and Arizona's defense, which gave up 203 yards in the first quarter, slowed the Lumberjacks before allowing a couple of late scores with the game out of reach.

THE TAKEAWAY

Northern Arizona proved it can move the ball on offense, but can't afford the turnovers, particularly against an FBS team.

Arizona did what it was supposed to against an FCS school, but there are still questions on defense.

UP NEXT

Northern Arizona faces Western Illinois next Saturday.

Arizona hosts Houston next Saturday in what should be a high-scoring game.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — After the Houston Cougars had to deal with a hurricane and devastating flooding in their home city, they finally got back to playing football Saturday night.

And gave Major Applewhite his first victory as a head coach.

Ex-Texas A&M quarterback Kyle Allen threw for 225 yards and a touchdown but was intercepted twice in his first game for Houston and the Cougars had to hold on to beat Arizona 19-16 in their week-delayed season opener.

"I'm really, really proud of our players. They've been through a lot," Applewhite said. "Fortunately, not many were affected by the flood but just the circumstances of being 19, 20, 21, 22 years old, just all the stuff they've been dealing with."

John Leday's 81-yard kickoff return set up Houston's go-ahead touchdown with 45 seconds left in the first half. Josh Pollack kicked three field goals for Arizona (1-1), the last, from 42, yards cut the lead to 19-16 with 8:32 to play.

Khalil Tate replaced Arizona quarterback Brandon Dawkins early in the fourth quarter and the Wildcats were at the Houston 32 when Garrett Davis' interception with 3:49 remaining preserved the win.

Dawkins, who returned for the final three minutes, fumbled the ball away twice, one for a safety, in the second half.

Arizona coach Rich Rodriguez said Dawkins "got a little nicked up. I am not going to elaborate. I'm not a doctor."

Asked how Dawkins played, Rodriguez said, "I don't know if anybody offensively played really well. I'll have to watch the film. It wasn't our best effort."

Allen, one of the nation's top recruits from suburban Phoenix in 2013, started 14 games and played in 20 for Texas A&M before transferring to Houston. He sat out last season as a redshirt. He said he didn't find out until Saturday that he would start.

"I've waited a year and a half, two years and it was just really good to get back out there," he said, "with a new squad, with a lot of guys I'm really close with, a lot of guys I trust a lot and really care about."

Allen said the issues that led to the interceptions are easily correctable.

Applewhite said he thought Allen "did fine."

"It was good to see him play," Applewhite said. "I hadn't seen him play in two years."

Rodriguez said his defense played better than it did a week ago against Northern Arizona.

Allen, who completed 25 of 32 passes, threw 49 yards to Keith Corbin to set up his first TD pass as a Cougar, five yards to Linell Bonner to put Houston up 10-3 with five minutes left in the half.

Arizona, helped by a pass interference penalty in the end zone, tied it 10-10 on Zach Green's 1-yard run 2:22 before halftime.

Leday took the subsequent kickoff and the last man who had a chance to stop him, Kwesi Mashack, tackled him at the Wildcats 16. Dillon Birden's 3-yard touchdown run with 45 seconds gave Houston its 17-10 halftime lead.

EL PASO, TEXAS (AP) — Brandon Dawkins scored six touchdowns -- three passing and three rushing -- to lead Arizona to a 63-16 win over UTEP on Friday night.

Dawkins, who played only one series in the fourth quarter, threw for 155 yards on 18-of-22 passing and ran for 143 yards on 13 carries.

Arizona came into the game as a 25-point favorite, but struggled in the first quarter against winless UTEP before scoring 28 unanswered points.

The Wildcats (2-1) scored on the first play of the second quarter when Dawkins found freshman J.J. Taylor for 2-yard TD on fourth-and-goal, capping a 12-play, 78-yard drive. Dawkins connected with Shun Brown on a 36-yard touchdown pass followed by a 5-yard Dawkins TD run three minutes later to push the lead to 28-0.

After UTEP (0-3) scored on a pass from Zack Greenlee to Tyler Batson with 2:50 remaining in the half, Dawkins scored his fourth touchdown on a 3-yard run as the Wildcats scored 35 second-quarter points to take a 35-9 lead. It was the first points allowed by the Wildcats in three quarters after holding Houston scoreless in the second half last week.

Arizona continued its offensive onslaught in the third, scoring two more touchdowns -- on Dawkins' 13-yard run and Bryce Wolma's catch.

"It just came down to execution," Dawkins said. "We executed a lot better, I executed a lot better and that's the kind of result you're going to get"

UTEP scored its lone second-half touchdown on Mark Torrez's 6-yard run in the third and Arizona closed with 21 unanswered points.

Arizona coach Rich Rodriguez was impressed with how Dawkins came back from last week's loss to Houston. "He showed me that he is the competitor I thought he always was," Rodriguez said. "That's one thing that will not change about Brandon. He is a competitive guy. He played well, he did a nice job and bailed us out a couple of times."

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — When Utah quarterback Tyler Huntley went down with a shoulder injury in the second quarter, the Utes had an experienced and reliable alternative ready.

Troy Williams, a senior who started 13 games last season, came on and guided the No. 23 Utes to a 30-24 victory over Arizona on Friday night in the Pac-12 opener for both schools.

“We’re in a good place quarterback-wise,” Utah coach Kyle Whittingham said. “Obviously we want Tyler back as soon as possible, but Troy won nine games for us last year, and he was ready.”

Not that was easy.

Chris Hart recovered Arizona quarterback Brandon Dawkins’ fumble at Utah’s 20-yard line with 2:33 left to preserve the victory.

Wildcats coach Rich Rodriguez didn’t think it was a fumble.

But, Dawkins said, “You’ve got to go with what the refs call and that’s what they called. I shouldn’t have made it close. I should have held the ball a little tighter and not let them get a late strip there. So that’s on me regardless.”

Utah (4-0) led throughout and was up 30-17 late in the fourth quarter, but Dawkins threw a 30-yard TD pass to Tony Ellison with 2:44 to play, cutting the lead to six. The subsequent onside kick attempt bounced downfield, and Arizona’s Shawn Poindexter recovered at the Utes’ 35.

On the next play, Dawkins ran 15 yards to the 20 but fumbled, and Hart recovered.

The Wildcats (2-2) committed five turnovers, including three interceptions by Dawkins.

Utah scored a touchdown on its first possession, and then Arizona twice cut the lead to three -- the last time at 20-17 on J.J. Taylor’s 7-yard TD run with 4:38 left in the third quarter.

But 2 1/2 minutes later, with Arizona deep in its own territory, Dawkins threw short over the middle and Javelin Guidry intercepted, returning it 14 yards for a touchdown that made it 27-17.

Huntley completed 8 of 9 passes for 98 yards before he left with an injured shoulder after being sacked by Tony Fields with 8:45 left in the half.

Taylor fumbled at Utah’s 1-yard line in the second quarter, and the Utes drove all the way to the Wildcats 8. Six plays into the long drive, Huntley was injured and Williams -- who started 13 games last season -- took over. On his first play, Williams connected on a 40-yard pass to Darren Carrington, helping to set up one of Matt Gay’s three field goals, this one from 26 yards, to put the Utes up 13-3 with 5:39 left in the half.

“I prepare like I’m the starter every week,” Williams said. “I’m working hard every day. When my number is called I make sure I’m ready to go in. (The play) got me into things. Got me in a groove a little bit. I wanted to play smart football. I didn’t want to force anything.”

Utah grabbed a quick 7-0 lead on its first possession with a six-play, 73-yard scoring drive. Huntley threw 8 yards to Samson Nacua for the touchdown.

- Arizona rushed for exactly 200 rushing yards Friday against Utah. Dating back to last season, Arizona has rushed for 150 or more yards in 10 straight games. It’s the longest streak since Arizona rushed for 150 or more in 11 straight over the final eight games of 2013 and the first three of 2014. Arizona has rushed for 200 or more yards in three of four games this season.

- Redshirt junior quarterback Brandon Dawkins rushed for 90 yards and a touchdown on 18 carries. Dawkins now has 1,464 rushing yards for his career, which is the most by any Arizona quarterback since at least 1958. Ronald Veal was Arizona’s previous leader in rushing yards by a quarterback with 1,419. Dawkins passed him Friday.

- The Wildcats allowed just 112 rushing yards Friday night, which is the fewest allowed against a conference opponent since Colorado rushed for 94 yards against Arizona in 2014.

BOULDER, Colo. -- AP — The Colorado coach had a simple request after the game.

"Could someone please tackle No. 14 for Arizona?" Mike MacIntyre said.

Too late. He's already gone.

Backup Khalil Tate rushed for 327 yards, an FBS record by a quarterback, and accounted for five touchdowns to help Arizona hold off Colorado 45-42 on Saturday night.

Tate entered the game after Brandon Dawkins took a late hit out of bounds on the opening drive. Dawkins stood on the sideline for the rest of the game with his helmet in his hand as Tate flawlessly orchestrated the offense.

The speedy Tate had TD runs of 58, 28, 47 and 75 yards. He also threw for 142 yards, including a 13-yard TD pass to Shun Brown, as the Wildcats (3-2, 1-1 Pac-12) won at Folsom Field for a third straight time on a night when both offenses combined for 1,118 total yards.

Tate was hardly touched all night -- if at all. Asked if he was tackled, he grinned and responded: "A couple of times." He's been previously hampered by a sprained shoulder. Once in the game -- and back to 100 percent -- Tate quickly made up for lost time by breaking the record by a QB on his final run of the evening -- a 31-yard scamper that also sealed the win. The mark was held by Northern Illinois' Jordan Lynch, who gained 321 yards rushing on Nov. 26, 2013.

What's more, it was the second-most ever in Arizona history. The Wildcats' record for yards rushing in a game is held by Ka'Deem Carey, who gained 366 in 2012 against Colorado. Tate averaged 23.4 yards on 14 carries.

"We didn't even know his number, to be quite honest," Colorado defensive back Ryan Moeller said.

The Buffaloes certainly do now.

"He should be national player of the week," MacIntyre said. "He's a phenomenal player."

Phillip Lindsay sparked the offense for Colorado (3-3, 0-3) with a career-high 281 yards rushing and three touchdowns on a school-record 41 carries.

Colorado was its own worst enemy in dropping a third straight conference game. The Buffaloes committed 12 penalties for 110 yards, including two late hits.

Despite all that, Colorado trailed 45-42 after Lindsay's 11-yard TD run with 5:04 remaining. But Tate picked up a big third-down conversion with his arm -- an 8-yard strike to Bryce Wolma -- and then clinched the game with his long third-down run with just over a minute remaining.

Tate was modest after his performance.

"Offense did a great job blocking," he said. "Receivers did a great job getting open."

Dawkins was momentarily dinged after taking a late hit out of bounds that was announced on linebacker Drew Lewis. He was looked at by the trainer as Tate jogged into the game. It was difficult to even entertain the notion of bringing Dawkins back in, though, given the way Tate was playing.

- Sophomore quarterback Khalil Tate rushed for 327 yards on 14 carries to establish a new FBS rushing record by a quarterback. Tate surpassed Northern Illinois' Jordan Lynch, who held the record previously with 321 yards, set in 2013.

- Tate averaged 23.4 yards per carry and scored four rushing touchdowns. The 23.4 yard per carry average establishes a new school record for at least 10 carries in a game. Trung Canidate held the previous record at 16 yards per carry. Tate is the fifth player in school history to rush for four touchdowns in a game.

- Tate became the first quarterback in Arizona history to rush for 200 or more yards in a game. TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Khalil Tate proved he wasn't a one-game wonder, giving the Arizona Wildcats another Saturday of big plays and another win.

Tate followed up last week's record-setting performance with another strong one, rushing for 230 yards and two touchdowns to lead Arizona over UCLA 47-30.

The sophomore quarterback, who took over for the injured Brandon Dawkins early in last Saturday's win over Colorado, set an FBS single-game rushing record for a quarterback with 327 yards in that game. Tate got the start on Saturday, and ran for a 45-yard touchdown on the fourth play of the game.

"Being more knowledgeable and the offensive line blocking the way they do, the receivers staying patient, it helps a lot," Tate said of his comfort level with the offense.

He added a 71-yard touchdown run in the third quarter for a 40-22 Arizona lead. The Wildcats had a season-high 605 total yards.

Tate passed for 148 yards, including a 53-yard bomb to Shun Brown that set up Nick Wilson's one-yard touchdown run late in the first quarter.

Wilson finished with 135 rushing yards and two scores. He has 13 career 100-yard games.

Tate hit Trevor Wood for a six-yard score with 11 seconds left in the first half, giving the Wildcats a 30-14 halftime lead.

"We did just enough with the turnovers (forcing four by UCLA) to give the offense a chance," Arizona head coach Rich Rodriguez said. "Just really proud of the way he (Tate) has kind of taken charge. When we needed a big play ... he was delivering."

UCLA's Josh Rosen, the nation's leader in passing yards and total offense entering the game, threw for 219 yards but was held without a TD pass for the first time since the 2015 season. His three interceptions hurt the Bruins, the first was picked off by Jace Whittaker in the end zone early in the second quarter and the second was returned 42 yards for a touchdown by Whittaker, also in the second.

The Wildcats sacked Rosen five times in the second half, four for freshman Kylan Wilborn.

"I just didn't play well at all," Rosen said.

Tate's 26-yard run set up Josh Pollack's second field goal of the game and gave Arizona 33-14 lead in the third quarter.

The Bruins cut the lead to 11, but Tate turned a broken play into his 71-yarder at the 3:36 mark of the third.

"That young man is dynamic," UCLA coach Jim Mora said. "He changes the game because you have to defend him on every play. ... We put all our energy into stopping him, and we didn't get it done."

UCLA got as close as 10 after Bolu Olorunfunmi's second touchdown run of the night late in the third. But the Bruins couldn't keep the Wildcats from adding to their lead.

BERKELEY, Calif. (AP) — Arizona running back Zach Green couldn't bring himself to watch California's two-point conversion attempt in overtime and instead stared at his helmet.

Tight end Bryce Wolma tried to look away, too, but forced himself to take a peek -- just in time to see freshman linebacker Colin Schooler's game-saving deflection.

"I was looking at the scoreboard throughout overtime when we were on defense," said Wolma, whose touchdown moments earlier put the Wildcats ahead. "The very last played I turned. I'm like, 'I have to watch this.' I'm glad I did."

Quarterback Khalil Tate ran for 137 yards and a touchdown and passed for two more, including a 22-yarder to Wolma in the second overtime, and Arizona held on to beat California 45-44 on Saturday night.

The two teams combined for 984 yards of offense but it was Schooler's defensive play that made the difference.

Green scored the Wildcats touchdown in the first overtime and had a 3-yard run to open the second extra period before Tate scrambled in the backfield to avoid a sack and found Wolma open near the goal line for the game-winner.

California answered with Vic Enwere's 1-yard touchdown run but came up short on the two-point conversion try when Schooler knocked away Ross Bowers' pass intended for Jordan Duncan near the back of the end zone.

"We felt like the overtime two-point was that our best chance to win," Cal coach Justin Wilcox said. "It was my call. We were playing to win the game and that's what I felt like was the best."

That the Bears went for two instead of trying to force a third overtime rankled some of the Wildcats defenders.

"We took it kind of personally how they thought that they could go for two when they didn't need to," Schooler said. "Luckily they didn't get it."

Bowers completed 29 of 49 throws for 301 yards and two touchdowns, one in the first overtime, but was intercepted twice.

The Wildcats (5-2, 3-1 Pac-12) wasted leads of 21-7 and 28-14 before holding off the Bears (4-4, 1-4).

That bodes well for coach Rich Rodriguez's team, which is heading into the meaty portion of its schedule. Arizona next plays No. 15 Washington State in Tucson followed by a road game at No. 11 Southern California on Nov. 4.

"The difference at the end just came down to making plays," Rodriguez said. "They had a good play called. We just had a freshman step up and make a big play."

Tate continued to give Arizona's offense a lift. The Wildcats sophomore quarterback has rushed for 694 yards and passed for 468 in three games since replacing Brandon Dawkins.

TUCSON, Ariz. – Khalil Tate did it again, and now he has the Arizona Wildcats in position to be taken quite seriously in the Pac-12.

In his fourth straight spectacular performance and the team’s fourth consecutive victory, Tate rushed for 158 yards and a touchdown and passed for 275 more and two scores, leading surprising Arizona to a 58-37 victory over No. 15 Washington State on Saturday night.

J.J. Taylor gained 157 yards on 13 carries for Arizona (6-2, 4-1 Pac-12), including touchdown runs of 79 and 3 yards after Washington State (7-2, 4-2) had rallied to take the lead in the third quarter behind backup quarterback Tyler Hilinski.

“It’s a great night to be an Arizona Wildcat,” coach Rich Rodriguez said.

The loss knocked Washington State out of a tie with Stanford for first place in the Pac-12 North. The Wildcats will play at USC next weekend with first place in the Pac-12 South at stake.

The Wildcats rolled up 310 yards rushing and 58 points against a Washington State team that had ranked third in run defense and second in points allowed in the Pac-12. Hilinski replaced Luke Falk late in the first half and ignited what had been a sputtering offense.

Leach said he initially pulled Falk out of the game to allow the quarterback “to see the field because we weren’t pushing the ball down the field. Then Hilinski was hot, so we stayed with Hilinski. The redshirt sophomore completed 45 of 61 passes for 509 yards and three touchdowns. He also ran for two scores but was intercepted four times, the last one returned 66 yards by Colin Schooler for a touchdown.

Tate was the first person to win three consecutive Pac-12 offensive player of the week honors. He had the kind of game Saturday night that might earn him a fourth.

Tate carried 12 times with a long run of 82 yards and an average of 11.2 per carry. He also completed 10 of 17 passes with one interception to go with his two scores.

Arizona needed two plays to regain the lead: Taylor’s 62-yard scamper, followed by his 3-yard touchdown run, and the Wildcats were back on top 30-27.

The most significant plays came on the next two possessions. Hilinski drove the Cougars to the Arizona 8-yard line and put them on the verge of regaining the lead. But, being chased to the sideline, he threw into the end zone and was intercepted by Jace Whittaker.

Two plays later, Taylor burst virtually untouched up the middle on a 79-yard touchdown run that boosted Arizona’s lead to 37-27, a potential 14-point turnaround.

Arizona: The Wildcats look to make it five wins in a row over Pac-12 foes at USC in a game that, believe it or not, will decide who is in first place in the Pac-12 South.

LOS ANGELES (AP) --When Khalil Tate and Arizona's offense erased their entire 22-point deficit with four touchdowns in roughly 11 minutes, Ronald Jones II and Sam Darnold knew they had to answer the Wildcats' big-play quarterback with a few memorable moments of their own.

Jones rushed for 194 yards and three touchdowns, and No. 17 USC overcame Tate's big second-half rally for a 49-35 victory over 23rd-ranked Arizona on Saturday night.

Darnold passed for 311 yards and two TDs for the Trojans (8-2, 6-1 Pac-12), who led 28-6 midway through the third quarter before Tate finally got the Wildcats (6-3, 4-2) rolling. Arizona evened it at 35 on Zach Green's TD run and a 2-point conversion with 8:23 remaining.

USC is alone atop the Pac-12 South after its 15th consecutive victory at the Coliseum. One victory in the Trojans' final two games against Colorado and UCLA will put them in the conference title game next month.

Tate, an Inglewood native and high school classmate of several Trojans, rushed for 161 yards and passed for 146 yards and two TDs. After being bottled up in the first half, he rushed for a 32-yard TD and threw a 30-yard scoring pass in the third quarter.

"We got a little momentum going, and our guys made some tremendous plays in the second half," Arizona coach Rich Rodriguez said. "It'll hurt for 24 hours, but we'll come back with a better plan."

Tate was sacked five times, and he threw two fourth-quarter interceptions to USC's Ajene Harris and John Houston as the Wildcats' four-game winning streak ended.

Jalen Greene returned a blocked punt for a touchdown in the first quarter for the Trojans. Tyler Vaughns and Steven Mitchell caught TD passes for USC, and Aca' Cedric Ware rushed for 122 yards and another score.

THE TAKEAWAY

Arizona: The charmed October is over, but the Wildcats played another exciting, high-scoring game. This loss won't do much to dampen the optimism around a program that appeared to be at a crossroads one month ago.

USC: The Trojans have been criticized all season long for not meeting this program's annual sky-high expectations, but they could wrap up the Pac-12 South title next week. If they earn a spot in the conference title game, they'll play it coming off a bye week, since USC doesn't play on Thanksgiving weekend. The Trojans' first conference title since 2008 has never been closer.

STILL LEARNING

Darnold went 20 of 26 and improved to 11-0 at the Coliseum as a starter, but only after throwing his 11th interception of the season in the end zone to kill a 97-yard drive in the first quarter. Darnold called the interception "one of the worst mistakes I've ever made on the football field."

HISTORIC RUNS

Jones broke a 52-yard run during the Trojans' final TD drive and became the first USC tailback with consecutive 1,000-yard rushing seasons since LenDale White in 2004 and 2005.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) -- Arizona quarterback Khalil Tate ran his streak of 100-yard rushing games to six, finishing with 206 yards and two touchdowns on 16 carries in the Wildcats' 49-28 win over Oregon State on Saturday night.

The Wildcats ran for a school record 534 yards, with three players going over 100 yards.

Tate's had a 19-yard second-quarter touchdown run in which he bowled over a would-be tackler in the open field on his way to the end zone. He also sprinted 71 yards for a touchdown early in the third quarter. The sophomore has a rushing touchdown in each of the last five games and a team-high 11 this season. Tate has four of the five longest touchdown runs for Arizona this season, and twice has run 71 yards for a score.

Arizona (7-3 overall, 5-2 Pac-12) and Tate hardly needed to throw the ball, as the ground game racked up 384 yards by halftime with Nick Wilson, Zach Green and receiver Tony Ellison running for touchdowns in the first half.

Green ran for a pair of scores, one in each half. J.J. Taylor rushed for 129 yards and Wilson, a senior playing in the final home game of his career, added 101. Tate accounted for 65 yards of an 11-play, 75-yard touchdown drive to open the game. The Wildcats have won five of six.

Oregon State (1-9, 0-7) has lost eight straight. The Beavers were held scoreless until the opening drive of the second half, which ended on Darell Garretson's 15-yard touchdown pass to Noah Togiai. Garretson threw two of his four touchdown passes in the third quarter and Ryan Nall led the Beavers with 88 yards rushing on 20 carries, adding a 44-yard touchdown catch in the fourth. Isaiah Hodgins and Timmy Hernandez caught scoring passes from Garretson, who had 209 yards passing.

Tate completed 5 of 7 passes for 68 yards and threw his sixth interception of the season. He completed his only pass attempt of the second half and was replaced by junior Brandon Dawkins, who began the season as the starter, early in the fourth quarter. Dawkins ran for a four-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter.

Trailing 35-14 late in the third quarter, Oregon State got the ball on offense but couldn't move it, and a 23-yard punt set up the Wildcats at the Beavers' 34-yard line. Green ran for a three-yard touchdown on that drive to give Arizona a 42-14 lead with 32 seconds left in the third.

TAKEAWAY

Oregon State: The Beavers have two more shots at a second win -- next Saturday at home against Arizona State and at Oregon in the Civil War rivalry on Nov. 25. Oregon State had shown improvement over the past three weeks, with two close losses.

Arizona: The Wildcats did what they had to do stay in second place in the Pac-12 South, and did so with a representative from the Valero Alamo Bowl on hand at Arizona Stadium. While a bowl game looks certain with seven wins, Arizona has two tough road games to finish the regular season, at Oregon next Saturday and at archrival Arizona State on Nov. 25. Holding onto second place in the South won't be easy, as both the Ducks and Sun Devils are vying for bowl berths.

- As a team, Arizona ran for 534 yards against Oregon State, establishing a new record for rushing yards in a game. The previous record was 511 yards set last season against Arizona State.

- The Wildcats have now gone over 500 yards twice this season, after having just one such game in program history entering the season. Arizona rushed for 506 yards in the season opener versus Northern Arizona.

- Sophomore quarterback Khalil Tate rushed for 206 yards against the Beavers. The 206 yards are tied with Ka'Deem Carey for the 15th best single-season rushing total in school history.
