QUICK NOTES

- The theme of year two of the Adia Barnes era will certainly be the amount of new faces on the team. After losing nine letterwinners due to graduation and transfer, Barnes and the rest of her staff went out and brought in 10 newcomers. Four freshmen, four transfers and two walk-ons.
- With the addition of all the newcomers, the Wildcats will lean heavily on the three returners (Lucia Alonso, JaLea Bennett and Destiny Graham. Kat Wright, a grad transfer, will also be looked upon as she has three years of experience at the DI level while playing at FAU. Bennett averaged 27 points, 8.5 rebounds and four steals in the two exhibition games.
- Barnes won the second-most games in school history for a first-year head coach (14) last season. The record for a second-year head coach is also 14 games. Additionally, Wendy Larry holds the record for most wins by a head coach in the first two seasons with 30, so Arizona will need to win at 17 games to break that record.
- The Wildcats will have three transfers sitting out this season (Dominique McBryde, Aarion McDonald and Tee Tee Starks). All three come from power five conferences and will look to make a huge impact in seasons to come. McDonald transferred from Washington, where she played for current Arizona assistant coach Morgan Valley. She was also recruited by Barnes when she was an assistant coach at Washington.

Fantastic Freshmen

After being held scoreless in her first collegiate game, albeit it an exhibition game, freshman guard Marlee Kyles has found her groove. She scored 18 points in the second exhibition and then poured in 17 points against Iona in the season opener while grabbing six rebounds. Kyles' 17 points against Iona is the most for a true freshman in a season opener since Davelyn Whyte scored 22 on Nov. 14, 2009 as a true freshman in her first game, which was also against Iona. Her fellow freshman Sam Thomas was the definition of efficiency against Iona as she scored 10 points on 3-6 shooting while pitching in seven rebounds, three blocks and two steals in 39 minutes.

It's Her Destiny

Junior Destiny Graham was very effective in the scoring department against Iona as she dropped a career-high 15 points on 5-8 shooting while knocking down five of her seven free throws. Last year, she scored in double-figures just one time and that was when she had 11 in January against Utah.

We See Ya JaLea

JaLea Bennett is one of the two seniors on the team (Kat Wright) and will be looked upon as a leader for the young group of Wildcats this year. Not only do they look to her for leadership, but Bennett has been a good source of energy during the preseason. Bennett, the leading returning scorer, scored 6.9 points per game last season is certainly looking to up that number this year as she has the athletic ability to get to the rim with the best of them. Along with Destiny Graham, they are the two remaining student-athletes that played for former head coach Niya Butts. Bennett went nuts in the two exhibition games as she scored 35 points, grab 10 rebounds and had four steals against Eastern New Mexico and followed that up with 19 points, seven rebounds and four steals against Western New Mexico. She played 24 minutes in the season opener against Iona and scored 10 points

Buenos Dias, Lucia

It's hard to believe, but Lucia Alonso is already the third-longest tenured Wildcat on the 2017-18 roster as a sophomore. The Leon, Spain native scored 5.3 points, dished out 2.4 assists and shot 43% (25-58) from downtown (top mark on the team) during her freshman campaign. Her 29.6 minutes per game were also second on the team as she started 27 of Arizona's 30 games, which is the fifth-most any UA freshman as started. Alonso played all 40

minutes against Iona and scored four points, had four rebounds, dished out four assists and had three steals.

Your Newest WildKAT

After visiting campus this past April, Kat Wright decided to finish out her college career at the University of Arizona. A transfer from Florida Atlantic University, Wright comes in with 145 career made three-pointers, which would be sixth all-time in Arizona history. Wright was forced to sit out the 2016-17 season due to injury, but during her junior year in 2015-16, Wright lit it up as she made 87 trey balls on 40% shooting while scoring 11.7 points per game. To put that into perspective, only one Wildcat has made more than 82 three-pointers in one season, and that was Lisa Griffith who made 92 in the 1996-97 season. The highlight of her career came on Jan. 30, 2016 when she drained 11 three-pointers against Charlotte, which is the second-most made three-pointers in NCAA history in a single game. Wright is 381 points away from 1,000 career points, meaning she would need to average about 13 points per game through 30 games to reach that mark. Wright knocked down two triples against Iona and made all seven of her free throws.

Lots of New Faces

Of Arizona's 13 players on the roster, 10 of them are newcomers. Those newcomers include Kat Wright, Sam Thomas, Sammy Fatkin, Markee Kyles, Kiana Barkhoff, Ali Reese, Lindsey Malecha, Aarion McDonald, Dominique McBryde and Tee Tee Starks. Thomas, Fatkin, Kyles, Barkhoff and Reese are incoming freshmen, Wright, McDonald, McBryde and Starks are transfer students and Malecha was added as a walk-on, but is an incoming junior. Ten newcomers is the most in the Pac-12 this season. The last time Arizona had at least five freshmen was the 2008-09 season.

Valley Teams Up with Barnes (again)

As soon as there was an opening on Barnes' coaching staff, she looked no further than Morgan Valley. During the 2015-16 season, Barnes and Valley were assistant coaches at Washington, where they made a historic run to the Final Four on the backs of Kelsey Plum and Chantel Osahor. All Valley knows is winning as she has been a part of five Final Fours, four of them as a player at UConn in which she won three National Championships playing for Geno Auriemma. She is just one of two Division I assistant coaches to have played in four Final Fours and three National Championships.

Barnes Loves the Season Openers

Adia Barnes is the third head coach in Arizona history to win her first two season openers. The other two were Lois Sheldahl (72-73) and Nancy Trego (74-75).

Where Barnes Sits in UA History

With 14 wins last season, head coach Adia Barnes won the second-most game of any other first-year coach at Arizona. Wendy Larry had a record of 19-9 in the 1985-86 season. Niya Butts holds the record for the most wins in a second season as a head coach as the Wildcats won 14 games in 2009-10. Barnes needs to lead the Wildcats to 16 wins this season to tie the record for most wins through two years as a head coach.

Barnes is Back

Adia Barnes is back in Wildcat Country, and this time it's as the head coach of the University of Arizona. Barnes is known as one of, if not the best women's basketball player to come through Tucson. As a player, she is the program's leading scorer as she finished with 2,237 career points (18.5 ppg). She is also second all-time in career rebounds (921). During Barnes' freshman year in the 1994-95 season, the Cats finished with a record of 11-19. The next three years were a complete turnaround as the Wildcats won at least 22 games in each season and made a three-straight postseason appearances. Over those three years, Arizona was 68-23, which is still the best three-year stretch in Arizona history.

#MadeForIt

This season, and for future seasons to come, you will see the words 'Made For It' associated with the Arizona women's basketball team. Similar to 'A Players Program' for the men's team, 'Made For It' is the women's team's mantra for the program.

Down on the Ranch

From Sept. 29 – Oct. 1, the coaching staff and players ventured off to the White Stallion Ranch, which is located in the northwestern part of Tucson, for a team retreat. Activities consisted of horseback riding, corralling cattle and other team building exercises.

#CatsInTheCommunity

Last year, the women's basketball program won the Athletic Director's Cup for Community Service at the inaugural CATSYs Awards, which is given to the program with the most community service ours. It's a Family Affair

When Adia Barnes was deciding who she would hire for her three assistant coach spots, she looked no further than her husband Salvo Coppa, who has coached all over the world. Some of his coaching stops include Italy, Thailand, Sicily, Malta, the Seattle Storm and Montana State. Coppa is a certified FIBA coach and is also fluent in English, Spanish, French and Italian. He is the son of legendary international coach Santino Coppa, who founded and coached the club Trogylos Priolo, who has won two Italian league titles and one European Cup. Barnes and Coppa also have a two-year old son, Matteo.

Lights, Camera, Action

13 of Arizona's 18 conference games will be televised by Pac-12 Networks this season. Among the scheduled television games: home contests with Stanford, California, Colorado, Utah, Washington State, Arizona State, Oregon State and Oregon.

Worldwide Recruiting

The coaching staff has made it a point of emphasis to recruit overseas. Staffers have traveled to Italy, Spain, Australia and Canada looking for the newest Wildcats. Assistant coach Salvo Coppa has coached overseas for quite some time, so he is taking full advantage of the relationships that he has formed since he began his coaching career.

Arizona Signs No. 4 Class in the Country

Adia Barnes and the Arizona women's basketball team have completed their 2018 class as they received five National Letters of Intent from Bryce Nixon, Semaj Smith, Cate Reese, Shalyse Smith and Valeria Trucco. ProspectsNation.com ranks Arizona as the fourth-best recruiting class in the country and first in the Pac-12, which is the highest ranked class Arizona has ever signed. Bryce Nixon

Nixon, a Phoenix, Ariz. native is rated as a four-star guard by ProspectsNation.com. She has consistently been an Arcadia High School standout as she was named First-Team Division II All-Arizona while averaging 20 points, five assists, four rebounds and three steals per game during her junior season. She scored in double-figures in each game and had a season-high of 31 points twice (back-to-back games). The 5'10" guard made over two three-pointers per game, had seven 7+ assist games and had eight steals in one game twice last year.

Semaj Smith

Semaj Smith, a native of Long Beach, Calif., is rated as a five-star recruit and the No. 9 post player in the country as well as the No. 52 prospect. Smith, the tallest player in the class at 6'5", helped lead St. Anthony High School to the semifinals of the 2017 CIF 1AA Playoffs last year by dominating in the post. She averaged an impressive 15.9 points, 15.2 rebounds and 5.7 blocks last year as a junior.

Gate Reese

Reese is tabbed as a five-star recruit and the fourth-best post player in the country. Coming in as the 14th-best prospect in the country, Reese will be the highest ranked prospect Arizona women's basketball has ever signed. The Cypress, Texas native was named TABC 6A All-State two times during her high school career at Cypress Woods High School. Last year, the 6'3" forward scored 22.3 points per game and grabbed 13.2 rebounds per game. She scored over 30 points three times with a season-high of 36. Additionally, she had a stretch of 13-straight double-doubles and had one 20/20 game where she scored 27 points and had 20 rebounds. Reese had three such games where she grabbed 20 rebounds with a season-high of 22.

Shalyse Smith

Shalyse Smith was the first to commit to Arizona in the class of 2018. She is rated as a four-star forward by ProspectsNation.com as well as the No. 7 forward and the No. 48 player in the country. The Tacoma, Wash. native was named USA Today Honorable Mention All-Western Washington at Belarmine Prep last year as she averaged 15.8 points, 11.3 rebounds, two steals and 1.6 blocks per game, helping her team to a third-place finish in the 4A State Tournament. The 6'1" exceptionally athletic forward recorded 15 double-doubles last season with eight games of 20+ points and a season high of 24 (twice). One game stood out last year for Smith on the glass as she grabbed 25 rebounds with 13 of them on the offensive end.

Valeria Trucco

Trucco is rated as a five-star post player by ProspectsNation.com out of Torino, Italy. The 6'4" forward is arguably one of the top young players to come out of Europe in 2018. She currently plays for the Torino Basketball Club and has been a member of the U16, U17 and U18 Italian National Teams. During her time playing with Italian National Teams, she won a Silver Medal with the Italian U17 World Championship team and competed on both the U16 and U18 Italian European Championship teams.

Clear Bag Policy

Arizona Athletics is a new clear bag policy for all of its venues. The policy limits the size and type of bags that may be brought into our venues. The following is a list of bags that will be accepted for entry:
 Bags that are clear plastic or vinyl and do not exceed 12" x 6" x 12"
 One-gallon clear plastic freezer bags (Ziploc bag or similar)
 Small clutch bags, approximately the size of a hand, after being searched

Exceptions will be made for medically necessary items after proper inspection, including but not limited to oxygen tanks, diabetes kits, allergy pens, etc.

Prohibited bags include but are not limited to:

- Purses larger than a clutch
- Briefcases
- Backpacks
- Fanny packs
- Diaper bags
- Cinch bags
- Luggage of any kind
- Long golf umbrellas
- Cooler bags
- Computer bags
- Camera bags

Non-approved seat cushions including large traditional seat cushions that have pockets, zippers, compartments or covers
 Any bag larger than the permissible size, unless credentialed personnel carrying such belonging have been thoroughly searched.

This is not a restriction on items that have been allowed into our venues; it is only a restriction on the type of container used to carry items. Souvenir cups, unopened water, Kleenex and personal items will all be permitted into the arena if carried in one bag that meets the criteria listed above.

Personal items may be enclosed in a small clutch bag, approximately the size of a hand. These small bags will be searched.

Adia BARNES

HEAD COACH

SECOND YEAR | ARIZONA, '98

Adia Barnes was introduced as Arizona's head women's basketball coach on April 4, 2016. The leading scorer in Arizona women's basketball history and a WNBA Champion, Barnes came to Tucson after serving as an assistant coach at the University of Washington for five seasons.

Barnes led the Wildcats to a 14-16 record in her first year at the helm with a 5-13 Pac-12 record. 14 wins is the most since the 2011-12 season and five conference wins is the most in the Pac-12 era for the Wildcats.

Under her direction, five Wildcats averaged their career-high in scoring, including LaBrittney Jones, who was named All-Pac-12 by averaging 15.6 points, 6.8 rebounds and 2.1 blocks per game. Jones is the first Wildcat to be named to the All-Pac-12 team since Davellyn Whyte made the 2013 team.

Throughout the season, the Wildcats showed that they never gave up, which is a trait that Barnes instilled in the team. A perfect example was at the end of the season when the Wildcats were on a seven-game losing streak, but were able to finish off the season 3-3.

On Feb. 17, 2017, the Wildcats broke a four-game losing streak to rival Arizona State as they beat the Sun Devils by a score of 62-58. It was also special because at the time, Barnes had never lost to Arizona State as a player or coach at the time.

Known as a stellar recruiter, Barnes brought in five recruits for the 2017 class, which was ranked 30th in the country. Those five include Kiana Barkhoff, Sam Fatkin, Marlee Kyles, Sam Thomas and Mallory Vaughn. Of those five signees, four of them were rated three stars by ESPN.com and Thomas was rated four stars. Four of the five signees were named Player of the Year in their respective states.

Prior to bringing on five 2017 signees, Barnes had to work quickly as she brought in guards Lucia Alonso and Bria Rice to the team in 2016. Alonso started 27 games at the point guard position and shot 43% from three, which is the second-highest single-season three-point percentage in school history.

Additionally to her success on the court and in recruiting in 2017, Barnes made it a point to get better in the classroom and in the community. The Wildcats had their best academic semester in a decade and also led the athletic department in community service hours.

Barnes joined the staff at Washington in 2011 and helped boost the Huskies profile in the Pac-12 and nationally, culminating in a trip to the Final Four this year. After three seasons on staff, Barnes was promoted to recruiting coordinator, where she handled all aspects of recruiting including budget, compliance and planning, in addition to her role in player development.

Prior to Barnes arrival for the 2011-12 season, Washington hadn't posted a 20-win season in six years. Since then, the Huskies have posted five straight, including a 26-win season this year.

While at Washington, Barnes coached Kelsey Plum, who was Washington's first ever WBCA All-American in the 2015-16 season. She led the conference and was fourth in the nation as she scored 25.9 points per game during the 2015-16 season and led the country in free throws made with 266. Plum became the fastest player in the Pac-12 and the seventh-fastest player in NCAA history to reach 2,000 points.

As a sophomore, she was named a Wooden Top-15 Nominee as she averaged 22.6 points per game and set a Washington school record as she scored 45 points on Nov. 14, 2015. Plum set the Washington single-season and Pac-12 record for points with 712 and was named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year.

Barnes also coached Chantel Osahor, who became a star in the 2016 NCAA Tournament. As a junior, she started every game and averaged a double-double with 10.1 points and 11.3 rebounds per game. She broke the Washington single-season record with 417 boards in 2015-16. Osahor was named the NCAA Lexington Region MVP as she averaged 14.5 points and 15 rebounds per game. She dominated in the Regional Final as she scored 24 points and grabbed 18 boards.

A three-time all-conference selection and '98 graduate of Arizona, Barnes was voted USBWA first-team All-American and Pac-10 player of the year in 1997-98. Her 2,237 career points currently rank ninth on the Pac-12's all-time scoring list. Following her collegiate career, Barnes played professionally for 12 seasons in the WNBA and overseas. She won a WNBA Championship with the Seattle Storm in 2004, was named to the Storm's All-Decade Team, and also played for Cleveland, Minnesota and Sacramento. Her overseas career included stops in the Ukraine, Israel, Turkey, Russia and Italy.

In addition to her playing and coaching career, Barnes has been extremely active in the community through the Adia Barnes Foundation, which mentors under-served youth and conducts charitable events and community service projects such as school supply drives. Barnes spent 10 years as the Seattle Storm's TV analyst for NBA TV and FOX Sports Northwest and also spent time as the color commentator for Storm radio broadcasts.

A native of San Diego, Calif., Barnes is married to Salvo Coppa, who coached for 14 seasons, including 10 professionally in Italy and with three separate national teams. She is also the mother of one son, Matteo.
