Postgame Notes

- Senior Zach Green scored on a two-yard rushing touchdown in the third quarter Saturday to give him 10 rushing scores this season. That ties him for 10th at Arizona on the single-season rushing touchdown list. Green is tied with six others: Brandon Dawkins, Keola Antolin, Clarence Farmer, Trung Canidate, Vance Johnson and Jim Upchurch.
- As a team, Arizona had three rushing touchdowns and now has 44 on the season. The Wildcats had already established a school record for rushing touchdowns in the season. The previous school record was 36 rushing touchdowns.
- Redshirt junior receiver Tony Ellison tied a career high with six receptions Saturday. Ellison also had six catches earlier this season against Utah. Ellison also had his third touchdown reception of the season Saturday.
- Freshman linebacker Colin Schooler tied a career high with three tackles-for-loss in Saturday's game. Schooler also had three TFLs the previous game against Oregon State and has six tackles-for-loss over his last two games. Schooler led Arizona with 12 tackles. It was Schooler's third double-digit tackle game of the season and second in three games.
- Junior Jace Whittaker had his team-leading 10th pass breakup in Saturday's game, giving him 26 for his career. He's now tied with James DeBow (1985-88) for 13th all-time at Arizona. He's one away from tying Kelvin Hunter and Chris McAlister for 11th all-time.
- Sophomore quarterback Khalil Tate had 32 rushing yards and upped his season total to 1,325 yards. He passed Art Luppino (1,313 yards) for sixth all-time on Arizona's single-season rushing list. Luppino had 1,313 yards in 1955. Luppino is also sixth on the list with 1,359 yards, which he rushed for in 1954. Tate will pass him with 35 more yards.
- Arizona rushed for 167 yards Saturday and has now rushed for at least 150 yards in 17 straight games dating back to last season. It's the longest streak in coach Rich Rodriguez's tenure at Arizona.
- Senior safety Dane Cruikshank registered his third interception of the season, establishing a new career high. Cruikshank had two interceptions last season as a junior. Cruikshank's 64-yard return was the longest of his career.
- With its three rushing touchdowns Saturday, Arizona now has multiple rushing touchdowns in nine straight games and at least one in all 11 games this season. The Wildcats have at least one rushing touchdown in 14 straight games dating back to last season.
- Khalil Tate's 35 pass attempts Saturday established a new career high for the sophomore. His previous high was 31 earlier this season against Washington State. Tate was 18 for 35 for 159 yards Saturday.
- With Cruikshank's interception, Arizona has forced at least one turnover in six straight games. It's the 15th turnover forced in eight Pac-12 games for the Wildcats. Cruikshank has an interception in two straight road games.
- Freshman Kylan Wilborn registered his eighth sack of the season, giving Arizona at least one sack in nine straight games this season.
- Arizona had 27 first downs, which is tied for the most in a Pac-12 game this season.
