

Arizona-Long Beach State Notes

- Arizona held the 49ers to just 24 points in the first half on Wednesday, setting a new season-best defensive scoring first half. The Wildcats' previous best was 27 first-half points allowed versus CSU Bakersfield. UA was allowing an average 38.3 points per first half entering its game with Long Beach State
- The Wildcats held an 18-4 advantage in fastbreak points over LBSU for the game. The +14 mark in tempo points matched the team's best mark of the season (25-11 fastbreak points over UMBC).
- UA's top three scorers; Allonzo Trier (15 points), Deandre Ayton (13 points) and Parker Jackson-Cartwright (12 points) combined to shoot 17 of 20 (.850) for the game.
- Arizona advanced its program record non-conference winning streak to 44 games with the 35-point victory over the 49ers.
- The Cats had six players score ten or more points in Wednesday's win, marking the first game of such a feat since the program's win at UCLA on Jan. 21, 2017.
- The starting big men tandem for Arizona, Deandre Ayton and Dusan Ristic, each grabbed nine rebounds. They grabbed a total of 18 rebounds compared to LBSU's 25 rebounds as a team.
- After shooting a combined 10 of 54 (.185) from beyond the arc in last week's three games in the Bahamas, Arizona finished Wednesday evening 12 of 22 (.545) from deep.

On Deandre Ayton...

- Finished the first half with nearly a double-double of 10 points and eight rebounds and would go on to finish his night with 13 points and 9 rebounds.

On Parker Jackson-Cartwright...

- Tallied five assists to just one turnover in the win over LBSU on Wednesday. Paired with the previous game versus Purdue, Jackson-Cartwright has 12 assists and just two turnovers in his last two games.

On Brandon Randolph...

- Entered Wednesday's game on the heels of a breakout 17-point game against Purdue, Randolph scored 10 points versus Long Beach State. The freshman has now scored 27 points in his last two games after scoring only six in his first four games.
