QUICK NOTES

- Arizona is 11-21 all-time in Pac-10/12 home openers and is looking for its first Pac-12 home opening win since Jan. 5, 2012 when Arizona knocked off UCLA.
- The Wildcats are looking for their first win over Stanford since Feb. 8, 2015.
- JaLea Bennett has been a scoring machine for Arizona as she averages a team-high 16.8 points per game, which is fifth in the Pac-12. Over her last eight games, the senior is scoring 19.3 ppg.
- Sam Thomas recorded the first double-double for any Wildcat this season with 13 points and 10 rebounds against NAU (12/7). She is the first freshman since LaBrittney Jones to record a double-double. Against Southern Utah, Thomas grabbed a career-high 15 rebounds, which is the most for any Wildcat since Jones had 15 on Dec. 15, 2013. Thomas was one rebound away from her second double-double against Colorado (12/31) as she had 18 points and nine rebounds.
- Kat Wright had her breakout game against Southern Utah (12/20) as she poured in a season-high 18 points on 7-13 shooting with four made three-pointers. At the end of double-overtime, Wright drilled the game-winning three-pointer to put the Cats up by two points.

Scouting the Cardinal

Stanford had an uncharacteristic non-conference slate as they began the year with a 6-6 record, although five of the six losses were to ranked teams. However, the Cardinal's top player Brittany McPhee played only three of the first 12 games due to injury, but returned to action for the start of Pac-12 play. Unsurprisingly, Stanford swept UCLA and USC. Through five games, McPhee averages 21.4 points and 5.6 rebounds. Alanna Smith and DiJonai Carrington were Stanford's top players during the non-conference season as they averaged 14.1 and 10.5 points per game, respectively. Smith and Carrington are also Stanford's top rebounders (8.6 and 6.8 rebounds per game). Arizona has beaten Stanford just one time since 2004.

We See Ya JaLea

JaLea Bennett is one of the two seniors on the team (Kat Wright) and will be looked upon as a leader for the young group of Wildcats this year. Along with Destiny Graham, they are the two remaining student-athletes that played for former head coach Niya Butts. Bennett has turned up the scoring this year as she averages 16.8 points per game, which would be a huge career-high should she maintain and is currently fifth in the Pac-12. The senior has already set a new career-high in total points scored with 218 points. Her previous career-high was 187 total points in 2016-17. Davellyn Whyte was the last player to average at least 16 points per game for a season when she scored 16.8 back in the 2012-13 season. The senior has scored in double-figures 12 times this season and 11-straight, which are both career-highs, after scoring 16 against Utah. Over the last eight games, Bennett averages 19.3 points per game and has led the team in scoring all eight of those games.

Thomas Does It All

Through the first 13 games of her career, Sam Thomas has been rather impressive on the floor. All while playing a team-high 37.2 minutes per game, she averages 10 points, 8.8 rebounds, 2.3 assists, 2.0 blocks and 1.8 steals. After recording the first double-double of the season for any Wildcat against NAU (12/7), she became the first freshman since LaBrittney Jones (2014) to finish the game with a double-double. She is also the first freshman and player since Erica Barnes (2011) to have three double-figure rebounding games in the first eight games of the season. Her 15 rebounds against Southern Utah is the most since Jones grabbed 15 on Dec. 15, 2013 and her 49 minutes are the third-most in school history. In the Pac-12, Thomas is second in minutes played (37.2 mpg), third in blocked shots (2.0 bpg), fourth in rebounding (8.8 rpg), fifth in free throw percentage (79%) and seventh in steals (1.8 spg). She is the top freshmen in the categories mentioned in the previous sentence.

Thomas is the only player in the Pac-12 to be in the top 10 in rebounding, blocks and steals. For the first time all season, Thomas didn't block a shot against Colorado (12/31). Additionally, Thomas is fourth in the country in rebounds and fifth in the country in blocks per game among all freshmen. Thomas has a shot to break a couple freshman records, and below is a look at where Arizona's top freshmen stood through the first 13 games of their respective careers.

Marlee Gets Buckets

Freshman Marlee Kyles is Arizona's second leading scorer through the first 12 games of the season by averaging 10.6 points per game off the bench while playing 25.5 minutes per game, which is the sixth-fewest on the team. She scored 17 in the season opener against Iona (11/10), had 18 against Loyola Marymount (11/22) and had a career-high 19 against Long Beach State (11/28). Kyles is third amongst all freshmen in scoring in the Pac-12 and has seven double-figure games.

Buenos Dias, Lucia

It's hard to believe, but Lucia Alonso is already the third-longest tenured Wildcat on the 2017-18 roster as a sophomore. Alonso has been outstanding from beyond the arc as she is shooting a team-high 46% (20-44), which is fifth in the Pac-12. Additionally, Alonso third in minutes per game (35.8) and 11th in steals (1.6). Against Hawaii (12/17), Alonso had a terrific game with a career-high 21 points on 8-17 shooting and 3-6 from beyond the arc.

It's Her Destiny

Destiny Graham has stepped up her game so far in 2017. She is scoring 9.4 points per game to go along with 5.9 rebounds per game, which is second on the team and are both career highs. Graham recorded her first-career double-double against Southern Utah with 15 points and a career-high 12 rebounds in a career-high 37 minutes. The junior has done a good job of getting to the line and making her free throws as she is 37-44 (84%) from the charity stripe, which is first in the Pac-12. Coming into the 2017 season, Graham had scored in double-figures just three times and has already scored in double-figures six times this season.

Your Newest WildKAT

After visiting campus this past April, Kat Wright decided to finish out her college career at the University of Arizona. A transfer from Florida Atlantic University, Wright has 158 career made three-pointers, which would be sixth all-time in Arizona history. Wright was forced to sit out the 2016-17 season due to injury, but during her junior year in 2015-16, Wright lit it up as she made 87 trey balls on 40% shooting while scoring 11.7 points per game. To put that into perspective, only one Wildcat has made more than 82 three-pointers in one season, and that was Lisa Griffith who made 92 in the 1996-97 season. The highlight of her career came on Jan. 30, 2016 when she drained 11 three-pointers against Charlotte, which is the second-most made three-pointers in NCAA history in a single game. She had her breakout game against Southern Utah as she dropped a season-high 18 points, which is the most she has scored since her 33-point game, and nailed the game-winning three-pointer in double-overtime with eight seconds left on the clock. Wright ranks 12th in made triples per game in the Pac-12 (1.7).

Sammy Gets Her Chance

Coming into the San Diego State game (12/3), Sammy Fatkin hadn't played more than eight minutes in a game and hadn't scored since the Utah State game (11/17). However, against the Aztecs, she played 18 minutes and scored 11 points with three made three-pointers.

Dynamic Freshmen

There is only one team in the Pac-12 that has two freshmen averaging double-figure points, and that team is Arizona. Marlee Kyles (10.6 ppg) and Sam Thomas (10.0 ppg) are Arizona's second and third-leading scorers and the only freshman pair to average at least 10 points per game.

Barnes vs. Stanford as a Player

Adia Barnes has a record of 1-7 vs. Stanford as a player and averaged 17.1 points and 6.4 rebounds per game. Her best game against the Cardinal came on Mar. 6, 1997 when she scored 29 points and brought down seven rebounds. Arizona's lone win while Barnes was a student-athlete came on Jan. 12, 1998 when Barnes scored 22 points and had seven rebounds in a 91-90 victory over the 11th-ranked Cardinal. Reshea Bristol made a buzzer-beating game-winning bucket that day.

They're Called Free Throws for a Reason

Arizona has done a good job of converting their free throws this season as they are shooting at an 76% clip, which is third in the Pac-12. Destiny Graham ranks first in the Pac-12 in free throw percentage (84%).

A Scoring Barrage

Arizona scored 83 points on Dec. 14 against New Mexico State. The last time the Wildcats scored 80+ points in a game was on Jan. 8, 2017 vs. Utah when Arizona had 81. 83 points is also the most points scored in a game for Arizona since Jan. 13, 2013 when the Wildcats hit 100 vs. Oregon. The 39-point victory is Arizona's largest win since Feb. 16, 2012 when they beat Washington State by 39.

Lots of New Faces

Of Arizona's 13 players on the roster, 10 of them are newcomers. Those newcomers include Kat Wright, Sam Thomas, Sammy Fatkin, Markee Kyles, Kiana Barkhoff, Ali Reese, Lindsey Malecha, Aarion McDonald, Dominique McBryde and Tee Tee Starks. Thomas, Fatkin, Kyles, Barkhoff and Reese are incoming freshmen, Wright, McDonald, McBryde and Starks are transfer students and Malecha was added as a walk-on, but is an incoming junior. Ten newcomers is the most in the Pac-12 this season. The last time Arizona had at least five freshmen was the 2008-09 season.

Valley Teams Up with Barnes (again)

As soon as there was an opening on Barnes' coaching staff, she looked no further than Morgan Valley. During the 2015-16 season, Barnes and Valley were assistant coaches at Washington, where they made a historic run to the Final Four on the backs of Kelsey Plum and Chantel Osahor. All Valley knows is winning as she has been a part of five Final Fours, four of them as a player at UConn in which she won three National Championships playing for Geno Auriemma. She is just one of two Division I assistant coaches to have played in four Final Fours and three National Championships.

Barnes Loves the Season Openers

Adia Barnes is the third head coach in Arizona history to win her first two season openers. The other two were Lois Sheldahl (72-73) and Nancy Trego (74-75).

Where Barnes Sits in UA History

With 14 wins last season, head coach Adia Barnes won the second-most game of any other first-year coach at Arizona. Wendy Larry had a record of 19-9 in the 1985-86 season. Niya Butts holds the record for the most wins in a second season as a head coach as the Wildcats won 14 games in 2009-10. Barnes needs to lead the Wildcats to 16 wins this season to tie the record for most wins through two years as a head coach.

Barnes is Back

Adia Barnes is back in Wildcat Country, and this time it's as the head coach of the University of Arizona. Barnes is known as one of, if not the best women's basketball player to come through Tucson. As a player, she is the program's leading scorer as she finished with 2,237 career points (18.5 ppg). She is also second all-time in career rebounds (921). During Barnes' freshman year in the 1994-95 season, the Cats finished with a record of 11-19. The next three years were a complete turnaround as the Wildcats won at least 22 games in each season and made a three-straight postseason appearances. Over those three years, Arizona was 68-23, which is still the best three-year stretch in Arizona history.

#MadeForIt

This season, and for future seasons to come, you will see the words 'Made For It' associated with the Arizona women's basketball team. Similar to 'A Players Program' for the men's team, 'Made For It' is the women's team's mantra for the program.

Down on the Ranch

From Sept. 29 – Oct. 1, the coaching staff and players ventured off to the White Stallion Ranch, which is located in the northwestern part of Tucson, for a team retreat. Activities consisted of horseback riding, corralling cattle and other team building exercises.

Last year, the women's basketball program won the Athletic Director's Cup for Community Service at the inaugural CATSYs Awards, which is given to the program with the most community service ours. It's a Family Affair

When Adia Barnes was deciding who she would hire for her three assistant coach spots, she looked no further than her husband Salvo Coppa, who has coached all over the world. Some of his coaching stops include Italy, Thailand, Sicily, Malta, the Seattle Storm and Montana State. Coppa is a certified FIBA coach and is also fluent in English, Spanish, French and Italian. He is the son of legendary international coach Santino Coppa, who founded and coached the club Trogylos Priolo, who has won two Italian league titles and one European Cup. Barnes and Coppa also have a two-year old son, Matteo.

The coaching staff has made it a point of emphasis to recruit overseas. Staffers have traveled to Italy, Spain, Australia and Canada looking for the newest Wildcats. Assistant coach Salvo Coppa has coached overseas for quite some time, so he is taking full advantage of the relationships that he has formed since he began his coaching career.

Arizona Signs No. 5 Class in the Country

Adia Barnes and the Arizona women's basketball team have completed their 2018 class as they received five National Letters of Intent from Bryce Nixon, Semaj Smith, Cate Reese, Shalyse Smith and Valeria Trucco. ProspectsNation.com ranks Arizona as the fifth-best recruiting class in the country and first in the Pac-12, which is the highest ranked class Arizona has ever signed.

Bryce Nixon

Nixon, a Phoenix, Ariz. native is rated as a four-star guard by ProspectsNation.com. She has consistently been an Arcadia High School standout as she averages 19.2 points, 5.7 assists, 4.4 steals and 3.7 rebounds per game leading Arcadia to a 10-1 record so far this season. She was named First-Team Division II All-Arizona while averaging 20 points, five assists, four rebounds and three steals per game during her junior season. She scored in double-figures in each game and had a season-high of 31 points twice (back-to-back games). The 5'10" guard made over two three-pointers per game, had seven 7+ assist games and had eight steals in one game twice last year.

Cate Reese

Reese is tabbed as a five-star recruit and the fourth-best post player in the country by ESPN. Coming in as the 14th-best prospect in the country, Reese will be the highest ranked prospect Arizona women's basketball has ever signed as she averages 27.9 points, 14.4 rebounds and 2.2 steals per game this year. The Cypress, Texas native was named TABC 6A All-State two times during her high school career at Cypress Woods High School. Last year, the 6'3" forward scored 22.3 points per game and grabbed 13.2 rebounds per game. She scored over 30 points three times with a season-high of 36. Additionally, she had a stretch of 13-straight double-doubles and had one 20/20 game where she scored 27 points and had 20 rebounds. Reese had three such games where she grabbed 20 rebounds with a season-high of 22. Reese Not only is Reese a standout on the basketball court, but she is also a force on the volleyball court.

Semaj Smith

Semaj Smith, a native of Long Beach, Calif., is rated as a five-star recruit and the No. 9 post player in the country as well as the No. 52 prospect. Smith, the tallest player in the class at 6'5", helped lead St. Anthony High School to the semifinals of the 2017 CIF 1AA Playoffs last year by dominating in the post. She averaged an impressive 15.9 points, 15.2 rebounds and 5.7 blocks last year as a junior.

Shalyse Smith

Shalyse Smith was the first to commit to Arizona in the class of 2018. She is rated as a four-star forward by ProspectsNation.com as well as the No. 7 forward and the No. 48 player in the country. The Tacoma, Wash. native was named USA Today Honorable Mention All-Western Washington at Bellarmine Prep last year as she averaged 15.8 points, 11.3 rebounds, two steals and 1.6 blocks per game, helping her team to a third-place finish in the 4A State Tournament. The 6'1" exceptionally athletic forward recorded 15 double-doubles last season with eight games of 20+ points and a season high of 24 (twice). One game stood out last year for Smith on the glass as she grabbed 25 rebounds with 13 of them on the offensive end.

Valeria Trucco

Trucco is rated as a five-star post player by ProspectsNation.com out of Torino, Italy. The 6'4" forward is arguably one of the top young players to come out of Europe in 2018. She currently plays for the Torino Basketball Club and has been a member of the U16, U17 and U18 Italian National Teams. During her time playing with Italian National Teams, she won a Silver Medal with the Italian U17 World Championship team and competed on both the U16 and U18 Italian European Championship teams.

Adia BARNES

HEAD COACH

SECOND YEAR | ARIZONA, '98

Adia Barnes was introduced as Arizona's head women's basketball coach on April 4, 2016. The leading scorer in Arizona women's basketball history and a WNBA Champion, Barnes came to Tucson after serving as an assistant coach at the University of Washington for five seasons.

Barnes led the Wildcats to a 14-16 record in her first year at the helm with a 5-13 Pac-12 record. 14 wins is the most since the 2011-12 season and five conference wins is the most in the Pac-12 era for the Wildcats.

Under her direction, five Wildcats averaged their career-high in scoring, including LaBrittney Jones, who was named All-Pac-12 by averaging 15.6 points, 6.8 rebounds and 2.1 blocks per game. Jones is the first Wildcat to be named to the All-Pac-12 team since Davellyn Whyte made the 2013 team.

Throughout the season, the Wildcats showed that they never gave up, which is a trait that Barnes instilled in the team. A perfect example was at the end of the season when the Wildcats were on a seven-game losing streak, but were able to finish off the season 3-3.

On Feb. 17, 2017, the Wildcats broke a four-game losing streak to rival Arizona State as they beat the Sun Devils by a score of 62-58. It was also special because at the time, Barnes had never lost to Arizona State as a player or coach at the time.

Known as a stellar recruiter, Barnes brought in five recruits for the 2017 class, which was ranked 30th in the country. Those five include Kiana Barkhoff, Sam Fatkin, Marlee Kyles, Sam Thomas and Mallory Vaughn. Of those five signees, four of them were rated three stars by ESPN.com and Thomas was rated four stars. Four of the five signees were named Player of the Year in their respective states.

Prior to bringing on five 2017 signees, Barnes had to work quickly as she brought in guards Lucia Alonso and Bria Rice to the team in 2016. Alonso started 27 games at the point guard position and shot 43% from three, which is the second-highest single-season three-point percentage in school history.

Additionally to her success on the court and in recruiting in 2017, Barnes made it a point to get better in the classroom and in the community. The Wildcats had their best academic semester in a decade and also led the athletic department in community service hours.

Barnes joined the staff at Washington in 2011 and helped boost the Huskies profile in the Pac-12 and nationally, culminating in a trip to the Final Four this year. After three seasons on staff, Barnes was promoted to recruiting coordinator, where she handled all aspects of recruiting including budget, compliance and planning, in addition to her role in player development.

Prior to Barnes arrival for the 2011-12 season, Washington hadn't posted a 20-win season in six years. Since then, the Huskies have posted five straight, including a 26-win season this year.

While at Washington, Barnes coached Kelsey Plum, who was Washington's first ever WBCA All-American in the 2015-16 season. She led the conference and was fourth in the nation as she scored 25.9 points per game during the 2015-16 season and led the country in free throws made with 266. Plum became the fastest player in the Pac-12 and the seventh-fastest player in NCAA history to reach 2,000 points.

As a sophomore, she was named a Wooden Top-15 Nominee as she averaged 22.6 points per game and set a Washington school record as she scored 45 points on Nov. 14, 2015. Plum set the Washington single-season and Pac-12 record for points with 712 and was named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year.

Barnes also coached Chantel Osahor, who became a star in the 2016 NCAA Tournament. As a junior, she started every game and averaged a double-double with 10.1 points and 11.3 rebounds per game. She broke the Washington single-season record with 417 boards in 2015-16. Osahor was named the NCAA Lexington Region MVP as she averaged 14.5 points and 15 rebounds per game. She dominated in the Regional Final as she scored 24 points and grabbed 18 boards.

A three-time all-conference selection and '98 graduate of Arizona, Barnes was voted USBWA first-team All-American and Pac-10 player of the year in 1997-98. Her 2,237 career points currently rank ninth on the Pac-12's all-time scoring list. Following her collegiate career, Barnes played professionally for 12 seasons in the WNBA and overseas.
