THE PRINCIPALS: While Arkansas State is playing its third consecutive Sun Belt Conference game, Troy will be third straight team to open their conference slate with the Red Wolves. The Red Wolves picked up their first victory last week against ULM, while Troy has dropped its last two games after picking up a season-opening win over Bowling Green. The game features the Sun Belt Conference's top two ranked offenses early in the season with Troy averaging 470 yards per game and A-State 432.

HEAD COACH STEVE ROBERTS: Arkansas State head coach Steve Roberts is in his ninth year at Arkansas State after leading the Red Wolves to the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Championship and to bowl eligible seasons three of the last five years. During his first eight seasons as the Red Wolves' head coach, he guided ASU to 41 wins for its most over an eight-year span at the school since 1985-1992. Roberts was named the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year. Under Roberts, the Red Wolves have had 70 All-Sun Belt Conference selections, a Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year, SBC Offensive Player of the Year, two SBC Defensive Players of the Year and an SBC Newcomer of the Year.

DOUBLE DUTY: A-State head coach Steve Roberts is one of just 12 coaches in the FBS that in addition to handling responsibilities as a head coach, also works as a position coach. Roberts has coached special teams since his arrival at ASU in 2002. Below is a list of head coaches in the FBS who also are position coaches:

ROBERTS CLIMBING VICTORIES LADDER:

Through his first eight-plus seasons as the Red Wolves head coach, Steve Roberts already has the fifth most victories among ASU's 26 all-time head coaches with 42 wins. Larry Lacewell (1979-89) holds the record for victories with 69 and is followed by Bennie Ellender (1963-70) with 52 wins, Bill Davidson (1971-78) with 51 and Forrest England (1946-53) with 49.

ROBERTS AND ASU STADIUM: Arkansas State head coach Steve Roberts has led the Red Wolves to a 30-10 record at ASU Stadium over the last eight years for .750 winning

percentage. Not only that, the Red Wolves are 21-5 at ASU Stadium over the last six seasons . . . Arkansas State is 15-4 in home conference games since 2005, its only setbacks coming against Troy in 2007 and 2009, Middle Tennessee in 2006 and Louisiana-Lafayette in 2009. The Red Wolves are 21-8 in home conference games all-time under Roberts.

17 AND UNDER: Arkansas State holds a 19-4 record under head coach Steve Roberts when holding its opponents to 17 points or less. The Red Wolves have won 16 of their last 18 games when holding their opponent to 17 or fewer points and have won 28 straight games when holding their opponents to 10 or fewer points.

THE ARKANSAS STATE-TROY SERIES: Arkansas State leads the all-time series with Troy 5-4. The Red Wolves and Trojans first met back in 1951 when ASU picked up a 39-0 road victory. The two teams split a pair of

games in 1991 and 1992 in Jonesboro, but have played the last six games as Sun Belt Conference foes. The Red Wolves won the first three games as SBC opponents, but the Trojans have bounced back to win the last three meetings that includes a 30-27 road victory last season in both team's Sun Belt opener.

THE LAST TIME vs. THE TROJANS (Jonesboro, Ark. - Sept. 26, 2009): Troy wide receiver Cornelius Williams hauled in an 8-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Levi Brown with 7:53 to play for the go-ahead score, and the Trojans kept the ball away from Arkansas State over the final 5:52 to secure a 30-27 victory in the Sun Belt Conference opener for both teams at ASU Stadium. Williams' score came on the heels of an Arkansas State fumble following a Troy punt, and the Red Wolves' miscue set the Trojans up with just 25 yards to go for what proved to be the winning touchdown.

The Troy touchdown wiped out an Arkansas State rally that saw the Red Wolves bounce back from a 23-10 second-half deficit to take a 27-23 advantage.

Following Williams' touchdown, the Troy defense held the ASU offense without a first down on the next Red Wolves possession, and when Arkansas State punted with 5:52 to play, the Trojans held the ball for the remainder of the game.

Brown completed 33-of-46 passes for 355 yards and two touchdowns, while ASU senior quarterback Corey Leonard connected on 12-of-24 attempts for 190 yards and a score.

Troy and Arkansas State went into the game as the 1-2 picks, respectively, in most SBC preseason polls.

Arkansas State put points on the board on its first two possessions to jump out to an early 10-0 lead. Troy, however, reeled off 20 unanswered points before halftime and took a 23-10 lead with 13:02 remaining in the third quarter.

Arkansas State countered with a 17-point outburst to take a 27-23 lead that held until Williams scored to put the Trojans back on top.

ARKANSAS STATE vs. THE SUN BELT CONFERENCE: Arkansas State is 60-60-1 all-time against current members of the Sun Belt Conference. Since the league's inaugural football season in 2001, the Red Wolves are 31-33 against all opponents that have been a member of the league. Against current members of the conference, ASU is 26-29 since 2001. The Red Wolves hold their most all-time victories against Louisiana-Lafayette with 17, while its most victories against a Sun Belt opponent since 2001 is Louisiana-Monroe with six. The Red Wolves have defeated every team in the Sun Belt Conference since the football league was formed in 2001.

APLIN EARNS SBC HONOR FOR SECOND STRAIGHT WEEK: Sophomore quarterback Ryan Aplin was named the Sun Belt Conference Co-Offensive Player of the Week on

Monday, marking the second straight week he has earned the league's offensive honor. Aplin recorded 318 yards of total offense with a rushing and passing touchdown against ULM, while he threw for a school-record 438 yards and two touchdowns the week prior against Louisiana-Lafayette.

RIVAL.COM RECOGNIZES APLIN: Rivals.com recognized sophomore quarterback Ryan Aplin for his play against ULM last week, naming him its Sun Belt Conference Player of the Week.

JENNINGS AMONG CFPA WEEKLY WINNERS: Senior safety M.D. Jennings has been selected a national Honorable Mention Defensive Back of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) for his outstanding play in the Red Wolves' 34-20 victory over Louisiana-Monroe last Saturday. Jennings recorded six tackles and a career-high two interceptions against ULM. Jennings' six tackles were the third most on the team and he returned his two interceptions a career-best 62 yards.

JENNINGS TAKES WEEKLY SBC AWARD: Senior safety M.D. Jennings was named the Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 6 for his performance against nationally-ranked Auburn. Jennings posted double-figure tackles (11), including a career-high 1.5 tackles for loss, in a game for the fourth time of his career. He also recorded his second career forced fumble, fourth fumble recovery of his career and his third career sack.

ANOTHER TV GAME: The Arkansas State Athletic Department announced Monday that ESPN has selected the Arkansas State-Louisville football game scheduled for 6:00

p.m., Oct. 2 at ASU Stadium to be televised exclusively on ESPN3.com. The addition of the Louisville game gives the Red Wolves an ASU record-tying eight televised games during the 2010 season and sets a new record for five consecutive games televised.

NCAA HIGH: Ryan Aplin's school-record 438 passing yards against Louisiana-Lafayette remains the most by any NCAA FBS player this season. T.J. Yates of North Carolina has the second highest total with 412 yards passing against LSU on Sept. 4. Aplin's 438 yards not only broke the ASU single-game record, but also tied UCF's Daunte Culpepper's total in 1998 for the most ever by an opponent at Cajun Field.

APLIN NOTABLES: Ryan Aplin is ranked first in the Sun Belt Conference in passing yards (319.7 ypg) and total offense (338.7 ypg). He is also ranked fourth in the nation in passing yards and fifth in total offense. Aplin has thrown for at least 243 yards in every game this season and has posted a completion total that ranks among the top 10 in school history at both Auburn (28, tied for 3rd most) and ULL (25, tied for sixth most).

BIG BLOCK: Sophomore defensive end Tim Starson recorded a career-high three blocked kicks against ULM to tie the most in school history for a single game. Starson blocked two extra points and a field goal to tie Stacy

Price's total against UT Arlington in 1981 and Clevon Johnson's total against UT Martin in 1980.

300-PLUS: Arkansas State posted at least 366 yards of total offense in each of its first three games, marking the first time since its last three games of the 2008 season that it posted over 300 yards in three straight games (during the same season). The last time A-State posted over 300 yards of total offense in four straight games was the last four games of the 2008 season as well. The Red Wolves recorded over 300 yards of offense in six games last season. ASU is currently ranked second in the SBC and 31st in the nation in total offense with 432 yards per game.

NICE CROWD: The crowd of 23,176 in attendance for ASU's home opener against ULM was the ninth largest ever at ASU Stadium. Out of the 17 crowds of over 20,000 all-time at ASU Stadium, 12 have been played within the last 10 years. The top three attendance averages at ASU Stadium for a single season have all been set over the last four seasons.

AMONG THE LEAGUE LEADERS: Senior safety M.D. Jennings is ranked among the top 20 players in the conference in six statistical categories, including interceptions (2nd), fumbles forced (T9th), fumbles recovered (T10th), sacks (T12th), tackles for loss (T13th) and tackles (T14th).

RUNNING WILD: ASU recorded a season-high 234 rushing yards and had four players (Aplin, Lawson, Butterfield, Frampton) post an individual season-best rushing total last week against ULM. A-State also posted 3 rushing TD's to surpass its season high of 2 originally set at Auburn.

BIG BOOT: While Dean Gericke has just four punts this season, he has made the most of his opportunities. Gericke is averaging 47.5 yards per punt, which is the second highest average in the Sun Belt Conference and seventh highest in the NCAA FBS. However, Gericke does not have the minimum number of punts to show up on the SBC and NCAA stats. Two of Gericke's four punts have traveled at least 52 yards with a long of 64 against ULL.

HOLMES POSTS CAREER-BEST NUMBERS: Sophomore defensive back Tausean Holmes recorded a season-high eight tackles last game against ULM, which tied linebacker Nathan Herrold for the team high as well. Holmes posted seven tackles in the season opener at Auburn. Despite not posting a single tackle against ULL, Holmes is still ranked among the top 35 players in the conference in tackles.

ZALUD STEPPING UP: True freshman kicker Bobby Zalud is ranked third in the Sun Belt Conference in scoring by kick despite not attempting a single extra point or field goal in the Red Wolves' season opener. However, Zalud is 7-of-7 on extra point attempts and 3-of-5 on field goal attempts over the last two games to give him 16 points. His average of 8 points over those two games would be the second highest in the conference for scoring by kick.

IN THE ZONE: The Arkansas State offense is almost perfect in the red zone, scoring on 12 of 13 opportunities for a 92.3 percentage. That percentage is ranked third in the SBC, but the two teams ahead of ASU have had no more than five scoring opportunities inside the red zone. ASU is ranked 25th in the nation in red zone offense.

IN THE ZONE (PART II): The Arkansas State defense is ranked first in the Sun Belt Conference and 12th in the nation in red zone defense, holding opponents to a 61.5 scoring percentage. A-State's three opponents this season have turned eight of their combined 13 red zone opportunities into points (6 TD, 2 FG).

RETURN THREAT: A-State newcomer Rod Hall led ASU in total kickoff returns and return yards in each of the Red Wolves' first three games and is ranked third in the Sun Belt Conference and 39th in the nation in kickoff return average at 24.9 yards per return. Hall

posted 81 yards on three returns vs. Auburn with a long of 40, 98 yards on four returns with a long of 30 yards against ULL, and 70 yards on three returns with a long of 27 against ULM.

BIG PLAY: Arkansas State has ran 16 plays (5.3 per game) this season that have covered at least 20 yards, including five last week against ULM and a season-high nine against Louisiana-Lafayette. The Red Wolves have already ran four plays that covered at least 53 yards with a long play of 65 yards (Ryan Aplin pass to Taylor Stockemer) against ULL.

BIG DAY FOR MUSE: Allen Muse recorded five receptions for 133 yards, both career highs, against Louisiana-Lafayette. Muse's 133 receiving yards were the 21st most in school history for a single game. The last time an A-State player recorded more receiving yards was in 2000. The last time an ASU player recorded 100 or more receiving yards was Sept. 20, 2008 when Jarriel Norman posted 108 yards against Middle Tennessee. Muse had a 61-yard reception that tied his previous career long, originally set against Auburn the week prior.

EARLY START TO CONFERENCE PLAY: Prior to this season, the earliest A-State had ever played a Sun Belt Conference opponent was the third game of the season (Troy in 2009). A-State has not played three of its first four games against league foes since the 1995 season when it was a member of the Big West Conference. ASU's first three SBC games include outings against two of the top four teams in the conference's preseason coaches poll (UL Lafayette, 4th; Troy, 2nd).

NEW FACES: Twenty-three players competed in their first career game at A-State over the last two games, including four true freshmen, eight redshirt freshmen, two sophomores, seven junior-college transfers (all juniors) and two juniors Additionally, 10 players started their first career game at ASU, including Dorvus Woods (DL), Justin Robertson (DE), Walter Moody (CB), Darron Edwards (CB), Tim Starson (DE), Greg McCall (DL), Najel Byrd (LB) and Tausean Holmes (DB) on defense and Anthony Robinson (WR) and Dwayne Frampton (WR) on offense.

96th SEASON UNDER WAY: Arkansas State kicked off its 96th season of football on Sept. 4 at nationally-ranked Auburn. ASU holds a 413-445-37 record since the inaugural 1911 season and has played in seven bowl games. A-State did not field a football team from 1942-44 due to World War II. ASU also didn't have a team in 1918 as World War I was ending.

HOME OPENERS: With a 34-20 win over ULM last week, Arkansas State improved to

8-1 in home openers at ASU Stadium under head coach Steve Roberts. A-State has now won its last six home openers. In addition to ULM, Roberts' teams have also won home openers over Mississippi Valley State (61-0 in 2009), Texas Southern (83-10 in 2008), SMU (45-28 in 2007), Tulsa (21-19 in 2002), Tennessee-Martin (63-6 in 2003 and 56-7 in 2005) and Army (14-6 in 2006).

STRESSING ACADEMICS: The Arkansas State football team won the Sun Belt Conference Team Academic Award for the 2009-10 academic year, marking the seventh time over the last eight years it has accomplished the feat.

THE TOP 25: Auburn was the 12th ASU opponent ranked among the nation's top 25 teams at the time of a game with the Red Wolves under head coach Steve Roberts. Following is a list of ranked opponents that ASU has played under Roberts:

PRESEASON ALL-SBC ACCOLADES: Three Arkansas State football players were tabbed Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference, including Defensive Player of the Year **Bryan Hall**, offensive lineman **Derek Newton** and linebacker **Demario Davis**.

PRESEASON PREDICTIONS: The Red Wolves are predicted to finish third in the conference according to the league's 2009 pre-

season coaches poll, announced July 19 as part of the Sun Belt Conference Media Days. ASU received 53 points, while first-place Middle Tennessee won the vote with 75 points.

STRONG D: Arkansas State has ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the Sun Belt Conference and among the top 50 teams in the nation each of the last four years in total defense. Below is a break down of ASU's defensive statistical rankings for the last four years:

NATIONAL COVERAGE: Arkansas State will play at least two nationally televised games for the second consecutive year in 2010. The Red Wolves will catch Middle Tennessee at home on Nov. 2 in a game televised by ESPN2 and Navy on the road on Nov. 20 in a game televised by CBS College Sports. Prior to last season, the last time ASU had played a nationally televised game was in the 2005 New Orleans Bowl.

TELEVISION TIME: Arkansas State currently has eight televised games scheduled for the regular season, tying the most in school history. A-State played eight regular-season games on television last season as well. The Red Wolves have four league games (UL Lafayette, ULM, Troy, FAU) televised on the Sun Belt Network, while the Auburn game was carried by Fox Sports South. The Louisville game will be carried by ESPN3.com, while the Middle Tennessee game by ESPN2 and the Navy game by CBS College Sports.

TURF INSTALLATION COMPLETED: Installation of a new and state-of-the-art field turf surface inside ASU stadium was completed as scheduled after a final inspection of the project was conducted in late July. The field is in practice and playing condition for the beginning of the Red Wolves fall camp today. The new GeoSurfaces field turf is slightly thicker than the previous product, which was installed when ASU originally transitioned from a grass field to an artificial playing surface prior to the 2006 season. The field also has a sand base for the first time in addition to the "no fly-out" rubber installed. The field also has a new look with two new Red Wolves logos, white Sun Belt Conference logos and black trim around the outside of the playing field.

HEAD FOOTBALL COACH STEVE ROBERTS



Not long after leading Arkansas State to the 2005 Sun Belt Conference championship and New Orleans Bowl, head coach Steve Roberts continues to make ASU a dominant force in the Sun Belt Conference and has ASU on track for continued success in the upcoming years.

When the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year took over the program in December 2001, he impressed everyone with his wide-eyed enthusiasm and limitless energy. And, most of all, they believed that Roberts would bring success to the ASU football program. Roberts has been the driving force behind ASU's recent success, leading the football program to its most victories over an eight-year span since 1985-92.

Roberts came to Arkansas State University and brought with him a fresh enthusiasm, energy, and an "I Will" philosophy that has been adopted by everyone associated with the program.

"I Will" became the rallying cry as Roberts and his staff charged ahead through a grueling 13-game schedule in 13 weeks with no open date in his inaugural season and came within 11 points of winning the Sun Belt Conference championship and playing in the Sun Belt Conference prize—the New Orleans Bowl.

ASU ended the season with a record of 6-7 and finished third in the league rankings. That tied the most wins since rejoining Division I-A in 1992. The Red Wolves finished in the top ten turnarounds by Division I-A football schools for improving football records after finishing 2-9 in 2001.

Under Roberts' direction, ASU continues to add to the achievements that began upon his arrival. Not only did ASU represent the Sun Belt Conference in the 2005 New Orleans Bowl, it claimed its first league championship since 1986. Arkansas State went undefeated at home that season and is now 29-10 all-time at ASU Stadium under Roberts. The bowl appearance was ASU's first since playing in the 1970 Pecan Bowl.

ASU has been bowl eligible three of the last five seasons and the last four Roberts' coached teams backed up the 2005 Sun Belt championship with non-conference victories over teams such as Army, Memphis, SMU and Texas A&M. The Red Wolves' 2008 win over the Aggies was one of the biggest wins in school history as ASU picked up its first victory over a BCS conference school since joining the FBS.

The Red Wolves have finished among the top three teams in the Sun Belt Conference four times, but ASU has also been competitive during Roberts' tenure against the nation's elite teams. ASU fell to then-ranked No. 25 Memphis by just 12 points in 2004, No. 4 Texas by eight points in 2007 and No. 13 Iowa by three points in 2009.

In addition to the 2002 and 2008 teams, the 2005 and 2006 squads both posted six wins to mark the first time since the 1986 and 1987 seasons the Red Wolves recorded at least six victories in back-to-back seasons. Roberts already holds the fifth most wins among ASU's 26 all-time head and needs just 12 more victories to move into second on the list.

The 2008 Roberts' coached team holds the all-time school record for single-season offense and the ASU defense has ranked

No. 1 or No. 2 in the Sun Belt Conference each of the last four seasons.

Over the last eight years, ASU has picked up 70 all-conference selections, including at least 10 four of the last five years. ASU had 11 players named all-conference in 2008, its most ever as a member of the SBC. The Red Wolves placed 10 players on the list in 2002, 2005 and 2006, and nine in 2007.

Roberts has coached a Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year, Offensive Player of the Year, two Defensive Player of the Year winners and a Newcomer of the Year.

The Red Wolves have had four NFL draft picks under Roberts, including David Johnson in 2009, Tyrell Johnson in 2008, Oren O'Neal in 2007 and Corey Williams in 2004. Johnson was a second-round selection and the third highest drafted player in ASU history. Alex Carrington, the 2008 Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Year, is also expected by many experts to be a high draft selection in 2010. Additionally, 13 ASU players have either been drafted or signed NFL free agent contracts since Roberts' first season in 2002.

With five Sun Belt Conference Team Academic Awards, Roberts has made academics a priority as well for the Red Wolves. ASU consistently places a large number of players on the ASU Athletic Director's Honor Roll and Sun Belt Conference Academic Honor Roll. The most recent ASU AD's Honor Roll saw 45 football players make the list.

Attendance has show significant improvement during the Roberts era. ASU has drawn a crowd of over 20,000 in 15 games all-time at ASU Stadium and six of those have come over the last nine games. Of those 15 games, 11 have been played with Roberts as head coach.

A stadium-record crowd was of 30,427 was on hand to watch ASU play Memphis in 2004, and ASU set the best average attendance mark of 21,105 in 2008.

During his tenure, ASU has upgraded its facilities with a new training room, weight room, locker room, recruiting room and state-of-the-art ProGreen turf on the field.

Roberts was named Arkansas State's 26th head football coach on December 21, 2001, to bring full circle his coaching odyssey from his home state through Louisiana and back. But, the trek has been a successful one, including an 8-4 record and national ranking in Division I-AA in 2000 at Northwestern (La.) State.

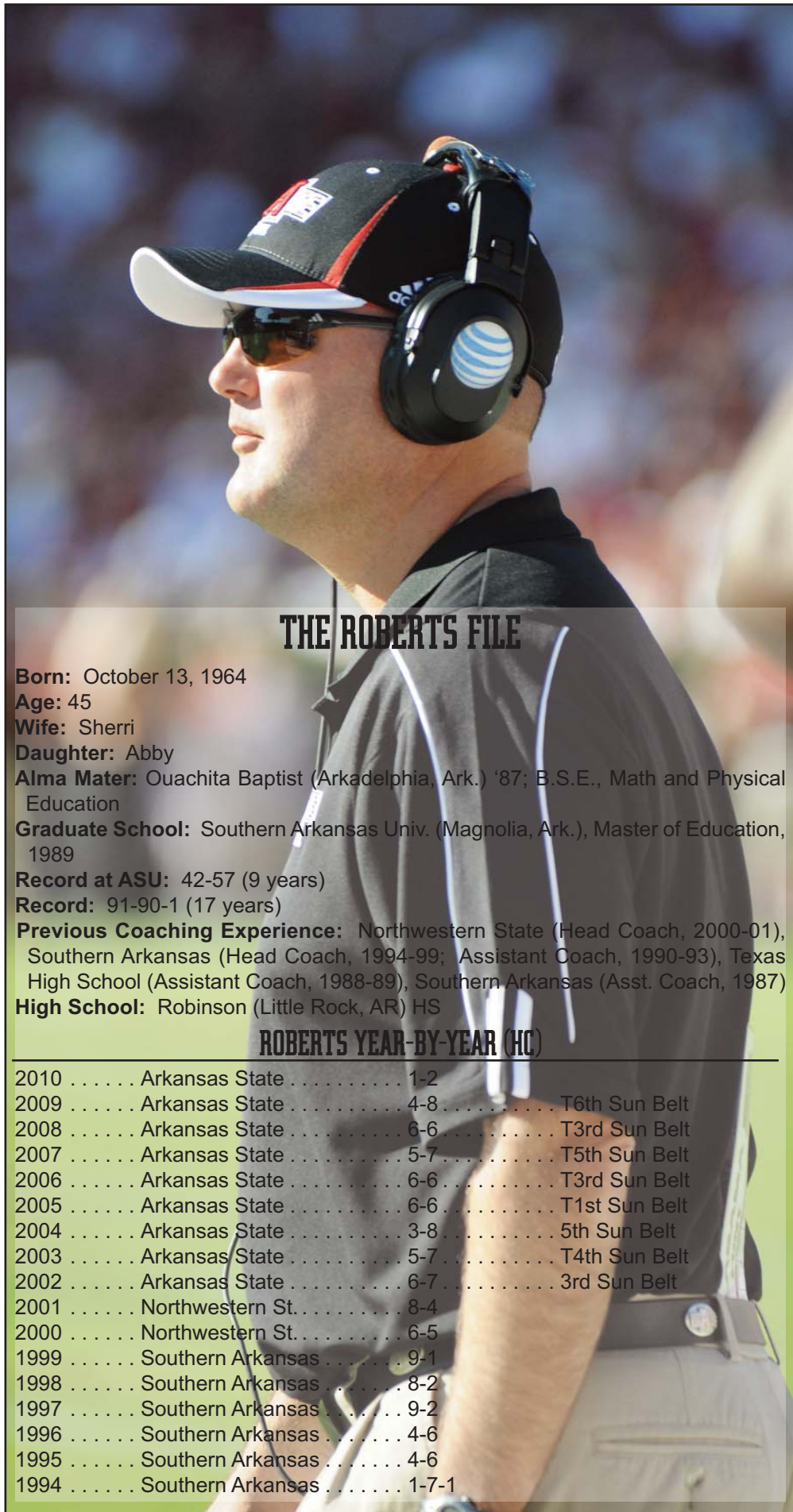
Roberts spent two seasons at NSU, where he and his staff and team took on a tough schedule which included a 27-24 overtime upset at TCU. While at NSU, Roberts was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award. Prior to going to NSU, Roberts served as the head coach and defensive coordinator at Southern Arkansas University in Magnolia from 1994-99. While there, his 1997 team won the Gulf South Championship, earning him Gulf South Coach of the Year honors. The Muleriders finished with a cumulative record of 26-5 from 1997-99, including 9-1 in 1999, 8-2 in 1998 and 9-2 in 1997.

During that span, his teams enjoyed top conference rankings in scoring offense, scoring defense, total offense and total defense. At SAU, he also served as the defensive secondary coach and recruiting coordinator from 1990-94 before being named head coach. Academically, his program ranked first in academic achievements in the Gulf South Conference three seasons.

Roberts, an avid fisherman, graduated from Robinson High School in Little Rock. A 1987 graduate of Ouachita Baptist University, where he was an Academic All-American, Roberts received his masters from SAU in 1989. He and his wife Sherri have one daughter – Abby (14).

- 2005 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year.
- Under Roberts, ASU has been bowl eligible three of the last five seasons.
- Holds non-conference victories over teams such as Tulsa, Army, SMU, Memphis and Texas A&M. The 2008 victory over the Aggies was one of the biggest wins in school history as ASU picked up its first victory over a BCS conference school since joining the FBS.
- Led ASU to the 2005 Sun Belt Conf. Championship, the Red Wolves' first league championship since 1986.
- The Red Wolves were undefeated at home in 2005 and are 30-10 at ASU Stadium under Roberts.
- ASU's 2005 New Orleans Bowl appearance was the first for ASU since the 1970 Pecan Bowl.
- Under Roberts the Red Wolves have picked up 70 all-conference selections, including at least 10 three of the last five years. ASU had 11 players named all-conference in 2008, its most ever as a member of the SBC. ASU placed 10 players on the list in 2002, 2005 and 2006 and nine in 2007.
- Roberts has coached a Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year, Offensive Player of the Year, two Defensive Player of the Year winners and a Newcomer of the Year. In 2006, he coached two players that were named to at least one Freshman All-America team.
- The Red Wolves finished in the top 10 turnarounds by a Division I-A school his first season at the helm, going from 2-9 in 2001 to 6-7 in 2002.
- The Red Wolves have won the Sun Belt Conference Team Academic Award seven of eight years under Roberts.

AUBURN, Ala. (09/04/10) - Arkansas State sophomore quarterback Ryan Aplin passed for 278 yards and a touchdown, but the 22nd-ranked Auburn Tigers countered with 363 yards of total offense and five total scores from junior quarterback Cameron Newton and defeated the Red Wolves 52-26 before a crowd of 83,441 at Jordan-Hare Stadium in the season opener for both teams.

Aplin connected on 28 of his 42 passes on the night to seven receivers, with junior wide receiver Dwayne Frampton hauling in eight passes for 74 yards and a touchdown, and safety M.D. Jennings led the ASU defense with 11 tackles, including two for loss, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

Arkansas State got on the board first when Aplin passed complete across the middle to Frampton from 10 yards out for a Red Wolves touchdown at the 5:18 mark of the first quarter. The scoring strike was set up when Aplin found wide receiver Allen Muse alone down the right sideline for a 61-yard

gain on the first play of the drive, which covered 82 yards in six plays.

Auburn answered with a six-play 58-yard drive on its next possession that ended with a three-yard touchdown run from senior wideout Kodi Burns with 1:51 to go in the first quarter. Senior Wes Bynum added the extra point for the Tigers, giving Auburn a 7-6 lead after the extra point attempt following ASU's touchdown was no good.

Less than a minute later, Auburn made it 14-6 when Newton passed complete for a 36-yard touchdown to senior running back Mario Fannin with one minute to play in the opening quarter.

Auburn added a two-yard touchdown run from Newton with 9:43 remaining in the second quarter to stretch its lead to 21-6, but the Red Wolves answered with a 55-yard drive that ended with junior running back Jermaine Robertson's 13-yard touchdown run with 6:46 to go in the first half.

The Tigers used the big play to put two more touchdowns on the board before the break, getting a 48-yard scoring pass from Newton to wide receiver Quindarius Carr and a 71-yard touchdown run from Newton. A 26-yard field goal from ASU freshman Bryan Davis following Auburn's Newton-to-Carr touchdown left the Tigers with a 35-16 lead at the break.

Arkansas State's Nick Nelms recovered an Auburn fumble on the second half kickoff to set up an Arkansas State touchdown that pulled the Red Wolves trimmed the deficit 35-23. Nelms' recovery set up the Red Wolves offense at the Auburn 27, and ASU needed just five plays to find the end zone, scoring on an eight-yard touchdown run from junior running back Derek Lawson.

Auburn answered with a 38-yard touchdown pass from Newton to Fannin and a 24-yard field goal from Bynum on the final play of the third quarter to take a 45-23 lead into the final period of play.

Auburn's final score came on a two-yard touchdown run from freshman Michael Dyer midway through the fourth, and Davis added a 41-yard field goal for the Red Wolves with 4:16 remaining in the game to set the final score at 52-26.

In addition to the numbers from Aplin and Frampton, the Red Wolves also got 80 yards on four catches from Muse and six catches for 58 yards from sophomore Taylor Stockemer. Lawson tallied 45 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries to lead the ASU rushing effort. Holmes added seven tackles, including one for loss and forced a fumble for the A-State defense.

LAFAYETTE, La. (09/11/10) - A 31-7 fourth-quarter deficit proved to be too much to overcome as the Arkansas State Red Wolves suffered a 31-24 loss to the Ragin' Cajuns of Louisiana-Lafayette at Cajun Field in the Sun Belt Conference opener for both teams.

The Red Wolves trailed by 24 points early in the final period before reeling off 17 straight, but the rally fell short when ULL safety Maurice Rolle intercepted ASU sophomore quarterback Ryan Aplin with 1:59 remaining in the game to end A-State's final drive.

Aplin passed for a school-record 438 yards in the loss, completing 25 of 45 passes with two touchdowns passing and one rushing. Aplin's 438 yards also tied a Cajun Field record, matching former Central Florida quarterback Daunte Culpepper's mark set against ULL during the 1998 season. Sophomore wideout Alan Muse hauled in five passes for 133 yards from Aplin, the most yards for an ASU player since the 2000 season.

A pair of first-quarter scores from the Cajuns handed A-State an early 10-

point deficit.

Louisiana-Lafayette tailback Kevis Streater went 69 yards on the Cajuns' first play from scrimmage to put ULL on the board early in the game, and a turnover deep in ASU territory set up the second Ragin' Cajun score. After ULL defensive back Melvin White recovered a Red Wolves fumble at the A-State 17, the Cajuns used a 27-yard field goal from Tyler Albrecht to take a 10-0 lead with 3:09 remaining in the first quarter.

Arkansas State answered on its next play from scrimmage when Aplin found wide receiver Taylor Stockemer alone across the middle for a 65-yard touchdown that cut the ULL lead to 10-7, but the Cajuns countered with three unanswered touchdowns to build a 31-7 cushion into the third quarter.

The Ragin' Cajuns took advantage of Arkansas State's second turnover to increase their lead to 17-7 midway through the second quarter. Louisiana-Lafayette took over at the ASU 32 following a fumbled punt return and got the touchdown on a six-yard pass from quarterback Chris Masson to tight end Ladarius Green with 7:11 remaining in the half.

A 47-yard touchdown pass from wide receiver Javone Lawson to wideout Andrew Joseph stretched the ULL lead to 24-7 with just over four minutes to play before the break.

Masson broke free for a 60-yard touchdown run late in the third quarter that gave the Ragin' Cajuns a 31-7 advantage before A-State freshman Bobby Zalud made it 31-10 with a 39-yard field goal with 13:24 remaining in the game.

Aplin scored on a five-yard touchdown run with 7:42 remaining that cut the ULL lead to 31-17, then passed for an 11-yard touchdown to wide receiver Anthony Robinson with 3:27 to play that trimmed the deficit to a touchdown, but Rolle's interception ended the Red Wolves' rally.

Defensively, the Red Wolves were led by linebacker Javon McKinnon's nine tackles, which was two short of his career high. Defensive lineman Bryan Hall added five stops, including one quarterback sack.

JONESBORO, Ark. (09/18/10) - Led by 318 total yards and two touchdowns from sophomore quarterback Ryan Aplin, the Arkansas State Red Wolves (1-2, 1-1) opened their 2010 home schedule with a 34-20 Sun Belt Conference victory over the Warhawks of Louisiana-Monroe (0-2, 0-1) Saturday night before 23,176 fans at ASU Stadium.

Aplin led a balanced ASU offense that finished with 474 yards on the night, with the Red Wolves gaining 234 yards on the ground and 240 through the air. Aplin completed 20 of 32 passes for 243 yards and a touchdown, while adding 75 more yards and a score on the ground. Safety M.D. Jennings intercepted two passes and logged six tackles to lead the Red Wolves' defensive effort.

Arkansas State churned out 180 yards in the opening quarter to put its two touchdowns on the board. The Red Wolves put together two 70-yard drives in the first period, capping the possessions with a 4-yard touchdown run from Aplin midway through the quarter and a 12-yard scoring run from tail-

back Derek Lawson with just over a minute remaining. Aplin accounted for 158 of the Red Wolves' yards in the first quarter, passing for 125 while rushing for an additional 33.

Arkansas State added another touchdown on its first possession of the second quarter, driving 80 yards in 10 plays and scoring when Aplin hooked up with wide receiver Dwayne Frampton from 34 yards out. Kicker Bobby Zalud added his third extra point of the night to give the Red Wolves a 21-0 advantage with 7:59 remaining before halftime.

The Warhawks got on the board three minutes later when ULM wrapped up a 77-yard drive with a 33-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Kolton Browning to wideout Brent Leonard. Arkansas State's Tim Starson blocked the Warhawk extra point attempt, leaving the Red Wolves with a 21-6 advantage that held until halftime, but ULM answered the second half bell with an 80-yard drive that ended in a four-yard touchdown run from quarterback Zach Rhodes. Browning passed complete to wide receiver Anthony McCall on the two-point conversion attempt to cut the A-State lead to 21-14 at the

10:49 mark of the third quarter.

Arkansas State responded with a 75-yard drive that ended in quarterback Phillip Butterfield's one-yard scoring run. Butterfield's touchdown gave the Red Wolves a two-touchdown cushion at 28-14 with just over five minutes to play in the third period.

Louisiana-Monroe drove deep into ASU territory on its next possession, but A-State stopped the drive when safety M.D. Jennings snagged his second interception of the night, picking off the Browning pass at the ASU goal line and returning it 20 yards to give the Red Wolves possession. Arkansas State capitalized on the turnover with a 37-yard field goal from Zalud with 9:31 remaining in the game.

The Warhawks added a touchdown at the 5:38 mark to trim the ASU advantage to 31-20. Browning connected with wide receiver Luther Ambrose on the scoring pass, but Starson again came up with the block on the extra point attempt, leaving ULM with the 11-point deficit.

Zalud added his second field goal of the night, this time from 24 yards out with 2:25 remaining to set the final score at 34-20.

Frampton hauled in a team-high eight passes for 83 yards and a touchdown, Lawson rushed for 52 yards on 10 carries and Butterfield added 49 yards on eight carries to go along with Aplin's offensive statistics. Linebacker Nathan Herrold and defensive back Tausean Holmes each added eight tackles for the ASU defense.
